ALBANY LUMBER MARKET.

The Albany Argus for the week ending July 30, 1872, reports as follows:—

Compared with last year receipts show a falling off of about 44,000,000 feet. Taking into account the lateness of the season and the difficulty of moving lumber, it is doubtful if last year's receipts can be caught up with.

Lake and canal freights will rule high during the fall. Shipments will be lessened by the scarcity of barges and schooners on the lakes. Less than three months now remain to make shipments from the mills.

Lower prices this season seem entirely out of the question. A firm market with an advancing tendency may, we think, be counted on; with a falling off in production caused by the strikes at the mills in Michigan and Pennsylvania, and with the high cost of lumber, anything like an active demand must put up prices.

This market has already improved and buyers have begun to look out for their supplies. Large sales are now being made weekly. All kinds of dry lumber are scarce and will soon be picked up. During the past week some of the lots of it have been sold at full prices.

The strike at Williamsport, Pa., still continues and has assumed a serious phase. At Saginaw the strike has come to an end and the mills are running, though some of them are short-handed. The loss in production in consequence of the strike is estimated at 60 M feet. A private letter from Saginaw states that there are strong indications that Chicago parties will seek a portion of their supplies at Saginaw; some have already bought freely; the supply on the west banks of the State will be short of the demand. A demand from Chicago affects Saginaw market more perceptibly than one from any other source.

The scarcity of spruce and pine deals in Canada will prevent any concession in prices. There has been a slight advance in prices at Chicago, and the prevailing feeling out west is that higher prices will rule as the season advances.

Northern manufacturers are of opinion that the decline in spruce and hemlock will not last long, and that an advance will shortly be established.

We make some changes in our quotations of shingles and laths. The fourth Canal week having closed, we have no figures to add to those of last week; though the receipts so far may be estimated at 138,000,000 feet against 181,000,000 feet last year.
