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### THE CONDITIONS OF REAL ESTATE INVESTMENT.

To the late William B. Astor has been attributed the remark that "it requires the highest order of courage to invest in and carry real estate, as periods of depression are certain to occur in its history when it is utterly unsalable—can scarcely be given away—when the revenue derived from it barely suffices to pay its current expenses; but, notwithstanding, in the course of twenty years the permanent increase in its value more than compensates for these temporary drawbacks." This pithy sentence epitomizes the whole subject of land investment and lays bare as with a master's hand the deepest intricacies of this vexatious and baffling problem.

It behoves us to ponder well this deliberately uttered conviction of one of the most sagacious and successful managers of estates that our city has ever produced. In the light of its compact wisdom we can readily discern the qualities which should distinguish the successful real estate investor, namely—courage, capital and endurance. Courage guided by clear foresight and restrained by sound judgment; capital in ready money sufficient for the investment, and in reserve to protect the investment when made; endurance, or grit to stand undismayed the shock of panics and revulsions.

In the nature of the case, real estate is such a stolid and immobile commodity, that we wonder it is ever deemed a fit subject of quick speculation, and is not always regarded in its true character as a fixed and rarely negotiable investment. Its system of titles is intricate and obscure; a puzzle and a mystery to the ordinary lay mind, necessitating invariably the employment of a sort of legal mid-wife to insure its safe delivery. Conveyances in their simplest forms are clothed with such an array of solemn ceremonial and costly preliminaries as to utterly bewilder the untutored investor. The hypothecation of these titles for the purpose of loans is made so tedious, uncertain, and withal so frightfully expensive, that one experience usually suffices for the prudent man of business. Methods of negotiation for its ultimate disposal or sale are so tortuous, unreliable, and difficult of successful consummation, that an active and brisk market in real estate is the exception and not the rule. These inseparable conditions unmistakably characterize and determine real estate as a permanent investment. In this light we now propose to regard it, and to deduce from our study and reflection, the conditions which we regard as fundamental and cardinal in its successful cultivation.

1. *Lowness of Cost.*—Whoever invests in real estate at high prices courts disaster from the beginning. The corner-stone on which successful real estate investors must stand, is that of *actual lowness of cost*. We draw a distinction here be-

tween actual and relative lowness. Relative lowness is thus defined: When Fifth avenue lots were selling at \$60,000 and \$80,000 a-piece a deduction of twenty-five per cent. would then have been deemed a tempting inducement, and have constituted relative lowness of price; but it cannot be denied, in the light of subsequent events, that even such an ample reduction would have failed to render the investment pecuniarily successful. We therefore propose to draw a deep line of demarcation between relative lowness, which depends upon ephemeral conditions of the market, or upon the fleeting basis of personal opinion, and actual lowness which is founded in the immutable nature of things.

In the case of improved property, this actual lowness will consist in such a purchase price that the rents likely to be derived therefrom for a period of some ten or twenty years, allowing for all the vicissitudes of business, will constitute a fair income or return upon the money invested.

In the case of vacant property, this actual lowness means such a price as will admit of carrying the property until ready for improvement, and to which may be added a moderate annual increment of profit—along with the usual charges for taxes and assessments, and still result in no greater aggregate of value than a prudent builder would be willing to pay in the light of his business experience, or as would enable the owner, after improving the property, to derive from it an adequate and remunerative income. In determining the line between this actual and relative lowness of value, shrewd and subtle judgment and extensive knowledge are required, and in its determination nothing short of the amplest experience and most careful reflection will serve.

2. *Freedom from Mortgage Debt.*—We do not here propose to enter into any disquisition on the nature of mortgage debts, or upon the perils and disadvantages of the credit system; these subjects are now being too vividly and painfully exemplified in events of daily occurrence in the real estate market. "Live within your means," "Pay as you go," "Owe no man anything" and other kindred maxims are being enforced, with emphasis, just now, upon the minds of all classes of business men. We simply wish to consider this topic in connection with successful land investment. We are prepared to lay down as another fundamental principle, that, to be a source of satisfaction and comfort, as well as profitable income, real estate should be absolutely free from mortgage debt; or, if encumbered at all, it should be for so small a percentage of its real value, that under all conditions and circumstances the mortgage could be replaced, without difficulty or embarrassment. The investor of margins, over and above excessive mortgage loans, is taking a bond of fate, and invoking the malign influence of an interest account, which will eat like a canker.

In the case of vacant, unproductive property, it is altogether unaccountable by what sort of delusion or hallucination men can be induced to give out their mortgages, usually bearing the highest rate of interest, with any expectation that the increment in value can possibly keep

pace with the accruing interest of the mortgage. If men would pause for a moment's reflection, before entering into these peculiar contracts, they would comprehend that it is a rare and exceptional investment which can be made to pay as much as seven per cent., annual interest.

When improved property is heavily mortgaged, it usually results in the owner becoming the mere agent or manager for the mortgagee and for the city corporation, having little or nothing out of the rental income left in his hands, after paying the cost of necessary repairs, interest on his mortgage and the claims of the city, in the way of taxes and assessments. To enjoy its highest advantages, and to derive its fullest benefits, it is necessary to hold real estate, whether improved or unimproved, absolutely free and clear from mortgage indebtedness.

3. *Freedom from Arrears of Taxes and Assessments.*—It is sufficient commentary upon the negligent habits investors are apt to contract to say, that the last legislature was called upon to enact a special statute, having a limited effect in mitigating the burdens which have fallen upon delinquent investors in the accumulation of unpaid taxes and assessments. That so large a number should have found themselves in arrears, and so pressed in this particular as to require the interposition of the strong arm of the law for their relief, is a sad criticism upon the unfitness of many who essay the task of real estate investment. The law referred to, arbitrarily postpones the collection of certain taxes and assessments beyond the term within which, otherwise, payment might be compelled; and also reducing the rate of interest on these arrears from twelve and fourteen per cent. to seven and eight per cent., provided advantage is taken of the leniency and grace which the statute extends. A superficial insight into the books of the various collectors of taxes and assessments, would furnish sufficient elucidation of this topic, and enforce the principle as one of paramount importance, that for satisfactory and successful investment, real estate must be kept clear of taxes and assessments. Besides the heavy burden, which several years aggregate of these charges amount to, they ordinarily carry a default penalty of twelve and fourteen per cent., per annum, thus swelling the total of arrears with a rapidity and volume which are scarcely realized, or conceived of, by the delinquents. There are but few properties in the city which would not be heavily encumbered by the failure to pay these charges, say for a period of five years.

4. *Permanence of Holding.*—In our present view of the subject, we must dismiss from our minds all idea of quick turns in real estate. If those persons, who enter upon real estate ventures, as they seek Wall street for a flyer or a flip in stocks, would pause to contemplate the possibility of having to wait a number of years for a return of their capital, and extrication from the speculation, we doubt not they would be deterred from embarking. It is altogether foreign and inimical to the true nature of real estate investment, that it should be contemplated as of short duration; ordinarily the very fact of a sale having been recently effected in real estate, will avert shrewd and wary buyers from seeking to

purchase the same property, knowing that in all likelihood an advance upon the price paid would be demanded; and on the other hand regarding the price already paid as representing, for the time being, the top of the market. Investments in real estate should be sought in no other light, and under no other conviction, than that the property purchased will remain in the possession of the buyer for a term of years.

*5. Outside Resources.*—As our concluding principle, we assert that the investor in real estate should be possessed of funds or resources other than those which are used in making the investment. For an investor to place the whole of his capital in a single venture would be not only unwise and imprudent, but we had almost said criminal, as resembling in some of its aspects a case of false pretence. He avowedly enters into a contract, which he knows he does not possess the ability to carry out, in strict justice to those who unite with him in the undertaking. Aside from the moral aspect of such a case there is the practical and altogether selfish consideration, that investments made without due forethought, and in the absence of other available funds can be made to produce no other results than disappointment, disaster and loss.

We therefore enunciate these five rules as the prime conditions which control and determine satisfactory investments in real estate. We can imagine that we shall be met at the very outset of our propositions with the objection that this standard of requirements is altogether too high, exceptional and impracticable, that if all real estate transactions were made to conform to such rules, business would be extremely limited, in fact, that there would be little or no real estate market at all.

In answer to all such criticisms, we would say that we are now contemplating *successful* real estate investments, not that hazardous and speculative sort, which at the present day have brought so many men to grief. We insist that our synopsis of conditions presents the mere common-sense of real estate investment, and that wherever widely departed from, undue risk, if not certain disaster, is likely to be entailed. We are prepared furthermore to deny the allegation that these conditions are rarely to be met in practice. We can point to scores of investors, belonging to the class of those only moderately well off, thrifty prudent house-holders who look to judicious investments in real estate and careful management of them to furnish their principal means of support, and we will venture to say that in every one of these cases strict regard has been paid to the full requirements which are herein laid down; not as a mere lucky thought or accident, but by sagacity and insight into affairs, the true laws which should govern such enterprises, have been apprehended and duly acted upon.

Furthermore, it is needless to state that the colossal fortunes which have given a world-wide reputation to a number of our citizens, and of which landed property constitutes the great bulk, are the results of accumulations begun twenty-five or fifty years ago—whose slow and deliberate process would be found, upon investigation, to conform to, and illustrate the principles herein advocated. The mammoth estates of Astor, Goelet, Rhinelander, Stuyvesant and a host of others are illustrious exponents, and may be said to owe their very existence to the faithful and undeviating observance of the letter and the spirit of the conditions herein set forth.

#### CITY CHATEAUX OR VILLAS.

Among a certain class of citizens, who undertake the office of soothsayers with reference to the future of our city, the belief is entertained that in the near future a residence development

awaits us altogether different from the prevailing one; that it will assume the form of detached houses, with more or less extensive grounds surrounding them, such as may be classified under the generic term of chateaux or villas. This belief is based upon the theory that our men of wealth will gradually weary of residences located in the heart of the city, and ranged shoulder to shoulder after the fashion of pigeon-houses, in dingy and monotonous rows of uniform exterior, and of the same general interior arrangement. It is believed that a taste will be developed for roomy and spacious houses, detached and isolated, commanding unobstructed views and distinguished by peculiar architectural types and forms; that a regard for landscape gardening will accompany this development, or perhaps precede it, and be its germinating force; that extensive grounds beautifully laid out, choice flower beds and velvety lawns will be sought after as desirable and indispensable adjuncts to the residence of the man of wealth. In a word, it is confidently asserted that these favorites of fortune are already feeling cramped and oppressed in their limited city residences, and long for ampler scope and verge wherein they may exemplify their taste and wealth, and enjoy a degree of aeration which is impossible within their present confined quarters.

We feel disposed to pay the highest respect to this wise and plausible prognostication, as we are ever on the alert to catch new ideas, and to present them to our readers in their most attractive and sensible garb. We have given this subject in its length and breadth a vast amount of consideration with a view of determining its *rationale*; its prospect of speedy and general adoption, or even of its experimental adoption. We must confess that the idea fails to commend itself to our better judgment, as we are unable to discover sufficient grounds whereon to base the prognosis. We are led to the conclusion that advocates of this theory are guilty of an anachronism. That they are mistaking for an ultimate development of our city growth what really belongs to a past and nearly obsolete period. We think these prophets will find in the few remaining detached villas, which serve to remind us of this bygone age, the only living or likely illustrations of their idea; and these, we are sorry to say, are so fast falling into decay and disuse as to furnish very little ground for the expectations that this system will be once more revived among us. We refer, of course, to the mansions already standing on Lexington avenue at the corner of Thirty-sixth street, which were formerly the country residences of the Coster family, and to the group of similar mansions which until recently lined the bank of the East River—homesteads of the Beekman, Delafield and Rhinelander families. It is within the recollection of many, who are still young, that notable and conspicuous villas existed along the line of what is now known as the Boulevard, stretching out to Fort Washington and King's Bridge, where this peculiar system at the present finds its fullest development and illustration. A regard for the true facts of history compels us to say that, as the city has grown and advanced, the disposition has been to sweep away these representatives of a mere provincial and commodious life, and replace them with the solid brown stone front, built in rows of adjoining houses. The whole tendency of city construction, in fact the principle upon which city life is founded, is that of concentration and compactness. The city is sought after for its close contact, for its near neighbors, for its sociability.

Moreover, the arbitrary divisions of city blocks afford insufficient dimensions for the elaboration of the chateau idea, affording space enough to be conspicuous and isolated, but not enough to realize the true ideal of villa life. It is merely repeating

what is well known to say that the great majority of our men of wealth already possess their villas, chateaux and country homes along the Hudson north of Spuyten Duyvil, at Newport, at Long Branch and in Western Massachusetts. Is it then reasonable to believe that having thus provided themselves with opportunities for the enjoyment of country life away from the city, that they will desire to re-enact that same method of living within our municipal precincts? We claim that the idea is chimeraical and utopian, and all but impracticable on any scale that would be likely to give satisfaction to its projectors. The nearest approach to anything of this kind that has been attempted are the Italian villas on Fourth avenue, between Eighteenth and Nineteenth streets, and those formerly located on the site of Chickering Hall, all which may be set down as building failures, serving as monuments of singularity and obliquity in architectural taste and residence accommodation. They could be hired in their palmiest days for the most moderate rent that was known in the city, and it is sufficient criticism upon the utility or attractiveness of them to say that their model has never been duplicated.

No doubt the desire exists on the part of men of wealth to secure the most commodious city dwellings within their means, and we have illustrations of this proclivity, but on a totally different scale, embodying altogether a different conception from that set forth by the advocates of the chateau system, we refer of course to the palaces of Mr. Stewart, Mr. Stevens and Mr. Fisk on Fifth avenue, of Mr. Libby on Park avenue, and of Mr. Morgan on Eighth avenue.

The prominent fashionable builders, Messrs. Duggin & Crossman, startled the building fraternity not many years ago by the erection, for speculative sale, of residences on Fifth avenue having a frontage of 42 feet, on Fifty-seventh street with a frontage of 35 feet, and a large number elsewhere having widths ranging from 28 to 30 feet. Yet all these bold undertakings were crowned with such complete success, in the matter of prompt and ready sale, as to furnish a complete demonstration that wealthy citizens demand for their city residence a frontage greatly exceeding the standard dimensions of 25 feet. But we have no idea that this desire for greater accommodation will eventuate in a demand for the city chateau or villa. On the contrary, we think that all our up-town blocks, even those most desirably located, and commanding the most superb views, will with rare exceptions continue to be improved according to the standard method of city construction; that is, with houses built shoulder to shoulder, but of varying widths, as furnishing more of the desiderata required in a city residence—such as proximity of neighbors, protection from the elements, compactness and concentration, in contradistinction to those qualities which peculiarly mark the summer houses of the wealthy, viz., isolation and extensive area of land.

## BUILDING MATERIAL MARKET.

**BRICK.**—The wholesale market has been practically closed, as the ice shut off communication with the points of supply and only small offerings were made. A few barge loads remain here afloat, but they do not appear to be offering. The demand, however, has proven extremely moderate from all quarters, and dealers think that even if they had stock to offer it would have been a very difficult matter to secure customers. The condition of the weather has been such as to interfere with outdoor work, and most consumers still have a little stock piled up in front of their buildings in progress, so that the demand would naturally run small at the best. On prices, under the circumstances, there has naturally been no great

change, and we retain former rates, with the tone somewhat nominal, though the tendency is toward more or less firmness, and much of an increase of the outlet would, of course, give sellers the advantage. There is no "Up-River" here, and Haverstraw mostly worth \$5.50@6 p. M., with 25@50c. more for choice makes. Pales are without change worthy of notice, with no stocks offering that we can learn of. Fronts quiet and about steady, but trade mostly in small lots from yard. We quote: Pale, per M. \$2.75@32; hards, Up-Rivers, \$4.75@5.25; Haverstraw, bay, 5.25@6.00; fronts, Croton—brown, \$8 dark, \$9; red, \$10; Philadelphia, \$23@27; Baltimore \$24@32. Yard prices, delivery included, \$2@3 higher on ordinary, and \$5@6 on fronts.

**CEMENT.**—Rosendale is without new features. A fair sort of general demand prevails, but certain favorite brands appear to be getting the lion's share of the business, and only on these can the claim of steady prices be sustained. Sellers ask the regulation rates and get them when they can, but are not hard upon good customers, and, in one way or another, manage to grant allowances calculated to prove attractive. We quote at \$1.20 per bbl. here. Foreign stock rules about steady, in a jobbing way, and former rates are asked for wholesale parcels, though competition is likely to give buyers some advantage. Continued small sales are reported at \$3.75 for Portland.

**GLASS.**—French window of desirable size is not plenty, and, though the demand proves only fair, sellers have an advantage, and proclaim and insist upon full rates. We quote at 50 and 10@50 and 10 and 5 discount. American in demand and firm, with manufacturers, however, in some cases, catching up on back orders. We quote at 60 and 10 per cent discount from French list.

**HARDWARE.**—Business on nearly all kinds of both the domestic and foreign production remains dull, and no revival can now be looked for until after the turn of the year. Dealers look for a fair trade, however, with the opening of the season, as stocks held by retailers, etc., are small, and the rates at which they can replenish, under the revisions of lists now going on, are likely to prove attractive. The export business is fair, and beside former outlets manufacturers' locks, latches, etc., are now receiving orders from England. No changes on prices worthy of note have been announced since our last.

**HAIR.**—Like all other articles in the line of building material proper, the market for plasterers' hair is very dull, and far from encouraging. The stocks are ample, well assorted and freely offered on comparatively easy terms, but fail to attract buyers beyond jobbing parcels for early consumption. The wholesale rates per bushel of 7 lbs. are 10c. for cattle, and 12½c. for goat.

**LATH.**—The advance indicated in our last was realized, and at \$2 the market has since remained quite firm, with further sales at this figure. We find receivers still very confident generally, and allowing for the natural tendency to optimism among this portion of the trade, their case seems to be a good one. As before noted, the supplies in yard are small, there is nothing known to be piled out in first hands, and even was stock on pier ready for shipment at the points of production—which it is not, or likely to be—it could not be brought forward in quantity at this season. Consumption is small and demand slow, to be sure, but this is considered as fully neutralized by the limited supply.

**LIME.**—A quiet and more or less nominal market may be reported without new features of interest that we can discover. There has not up to the present writing been any arrivals of Eastern that we can learn of, and values are quoted "about as before." State sells now and then in a small way and commands full former rates, with holders not over-anxious to operate and giving precedence to regular customers.

**LUMBER.**—The general demand is still quite moderate and uncertain, and, so far as the home wants are concerned, there is not much of an indication of improvement until after the first of the year, at least. A portion of the trade are still more or less hopeful of increased orders for shipment, especially to South America, and recent mail advices seem to give basis for such anticipations, but the development thus far has been rather slow. The tendency of prices is, as a rule, toward strength, and, on the comparatively small supplies, holders would not be likely to offer any great concessions at present, yet all full bids would receive immediate attention without an attempt to force buyers higher. Regarding the next log crop, we find few of the trade showing much interest at present, but wherever an opinion is expressed it favors the belief that enough will be cut and all of them run that circumstances will permit.

Eastern spruce is scarce in second hands, and the arrivals are also small, so that the advantage remains principally with the selling interest, and any free demand would afford a basis for much strength. Buyers, however, are not very plenty, and generally refuse to bid above former figures, and the sale of specials has thus far proven moderate by the few dealers who are prepared to accept orders. We quote at \$11.50@12.50 for random, possibly \$14 for choice lengths, in small cargo; and \$13.50@15 for specials, the extreme for extra difficult.

White pine is now held with a reasonable amount of

firmness, and there is no open offering of supplies seeking an unwilling market. Holders, however, would be pleased to find a larger attendance of interested buyers, and the condition of business is, by no means, satisfactory. We quote nominally at \$17@19 p. M. for shippers 10 inch and upwards; \$15@17 do. for do., 10 and 12 inch, and \$13.50@15 for box, 8 and 12 inch. Building timber, \$30@35.

Yellow pine on random cargo has no market, except at decidedly unprofitable rates, and with only a few specials wanted, the movement on city account does not amount to much. Agents, however, can occasionally negotiate a sale for the Eastward or for export from the Southern ports, and manage to preserve about the old range of values. We quote random cargoes at \$18@20 p. M.; ordered cargoes, \$22@25 do.; green flooring boards, \$24@25 do; any dry do. do., \$25.50@27, step-plank, as step-plank, at \$27@28 p. M. Cargoes at the South, \$15@16 p. M. Hard woods are not meeting with much demand, and the market is void of interest. The supply coming to hand is quite moderate, and covers only a few small lots on special contract. We quote: Wholesale value by car load at about \$70@72.50 p. M. for the finest walnut \$35@60 do. for common do., \$35@40 do. for ash \$38@40 do. for white wood, \$35@38 for oak, and \$35@65 for cherry, \$50@65 for butternut, and \$35@40 for hickory.

From the yards a little stock is going out to supply regular trade wants, and about the ordinary selection is made. As yet the supply and assortment has been found equal to the call made upon it, but desirable lots of piece stuff are not plenty, and those who have such under control are firm at full former rates, though generally prices are steady.

Among the recent lumber charters we note the following: A schr., 390 M. lumber, from Pensacola to New York, \$7.50; two schrs., 110 and 210 M. lumber, from Pensacola to Providence, \$8; one, 175 M. lumber, from Jacksonville to New York, \$7; one, 194 tons, from Pascagoula to Corpus Christi (three trips) lumber, \$8 for dressed and \$8 for resawed; one, 160 M. lumber, from Brunswick to Porto Rico, \$8; silver; one, 115 M. lumber from Bucksburg to Port Spain (two trips), \$10 gold; one, 130 M. lumber, from Jacksonville to the Windward, \$8.50 gold; one, 250 M. lumber, from Savannah to New York, \$6.25; one, 180 M. lumber, from St. Marys to Baltimore, \$6.50; one, 250 M. lumber, from Port Royal to Baltimore, \$6.50; one, 120 M. lumber, from Jacksonville to New York, \$7; one, 168 tons, from Cedar Keys to New York, cedar, 10c. p. cubic foot.

The two following articles are also from the columns of the *Gazette*: Judging from the evidences presented at this writing, there is but little ground to hope for any appreciable curtailment in the coming crops. Most of the heavy operators who have managed their business judiciously have made money, even at existing prices, and as long as they can dispose of their stocks at an appreciable advance on cost of production, just so long will they continue to bank full stocks. Many of them feel as did a leading Chicago operator with whom we conversed a short time ago. When interrogated as to his respective cut, he said: "Our firm will cut at least five million more this winter than usual. I can't tell you why, only that we have the timber, mill capacity, abundance of available labor, and more than all we have a demand for the lumber. These are the only reasons I can give for increasing our cut. There is no use talking about curtailing as long as the timber holds out and there is so much saw mill capacity in the country to use." There are, in his opinion, only two ways out of the difficulty: Consumption must either grow to the capabilities of the mills to produce, or a sufficient number of operators be broken down by reason of over-production to allow the remainder better remuneration for their capital invested. "Retrenchment," he added, "is very difficult in lumber matters. Mill operators have large amounts invested in lands, mills and chattels, with heavy taxes and, in many cases, heavy indebtedness, which must be paid through their yearly operations, and what is still more important, in all our lumber sections large numbers of laboring people have been attracted thither by reason of the lumbering operations, and they look to mill owners for support. It is, therefore exceedingly difficult to make anything of a reduction in operators, since if done at all it must be at the expense of our laboring classes." This view of the case is entertained by many of our heaviest producers.

## REAL ESTATE RECORD

## THE OUTLOOK.

The logging season is now fairly under way, and the question that is being propounded on every hand is: "What shall the harvest be? Will there be an extensive cut, or have operators seen the folly of overstocking the market, and concluded to retrench?" As to the query, all we can say is, present indications are that there will be a large supply put in—a full average stock, to say the least, and with a favorable winter, excessive in many parts. In some portions of Wisconsin and Minnesota sales have been rather dull and profits meager, so that loggers have not been able to make as extensive preparations as they otherwise would, which may occasion an appreciable falling off in some localities, but this is mostly confined to jobbers and smaller operators, while most of the heavy mill men will put in enough more to nearly bring up the deficiency. Thus those two States may be relied upon for a fair supply next season, granting a reasonably favorable winter. Still we are inclined to think that the spirit of retrenchment is more deeply felt from that quarter than in our own State. Here prospects are very promising for a large stock of logs. The fall has been an especially fine one for making preparations, such as cutting out roads, putting in camps and toting supplies, so that the work is now well advanced, many jobbers having from one to three millions on the skids ready to be banked at the first fall of snow.

Owing to the unfavorable winter one year ago Michigan lumbermen feel very well warranted in making calculations upon a good-sized supply this season, since the available logs of the State are limited, and even with a more than ordinary yield it is thought that not more than enough for a medium cut can be run down to the mills. Especially is this the case here in the Valley, where the booms are nearly all empty and the new cut cannot be made available until about the middle of June. This fact has much to do in causing operators here to go in heavier than they otherwise would, for it is very desirable to have enough logs left over to keep the mills operating until the fresh stock can be run out.

From Canada we also receive advices which go to show that logging will be quite extensive upon most of the pine producing streams, despite the fact that trade was more than ordinarily dull the greater portion of the past season; but the bright flurry just before winter had set in had a buoyant effect upon the logging prospects of that section, occasioning many to contract more extensively than they had otherwise intended.

Thus, taken all in all, we think the outlook is favorable for an average cut, to say the least, in most of the so-called lumber-producing regions.

Among the pines in the vicinity of Muskegon, Manistee and Ludington a specialty will be made of prime logs for deal sawing, and in some portions of Wisconsin some considerable regard will be had for timber to be similarly used, which goes to show that manufacturers must have done very well on their deal contracts.

The lumber shipments from Miramichi to the United Kingdom and Europe for the season just closed (the last vessel having sailed) amounted to about 116,000,000 feet, or in the vicinity of 12,000,000 feet more than was shipped during the season of 1875. The following is a comparative table of the lumber shipments to Europe from the port of Chatham for the seasons of 1875 and 1876:

The Tonawanda Herald of the 16th inst. has the following:

It has been thought, heretofore, that the freezing up of the canal suspended the shipping of lumber eastward from Tonawanda until its opening again in the spring; but it seems that a new era has dawned upon us, and that we shall hereafter ship lumber in the largest quantities at all times regardless of cold or ice.

Early this morning fifteen New York (Central Railroad) cars, from the large lumber docks of Messrs. Wm. H. Gratwick & Co., in Tonawanda, containing in the aggregate one hundred and fifty thousand feet of pine lumber, valued at \$6,000, left town en route for New York city, where the lumber is to be reshipped direct to a South American port.

METALS.—COPPER.—Ingot shows no greatly changed features since our last. Holders do not offer with much freedom, and the general stock seems to be fairly controlled, but buyers indifferent and only to be reached by offering an easy range of values. We quote at 19@20c. cash, for lake. Manufactured copper neglected, but the combination rates are maintained. We quote: Yellow metal sheathing, 19@20c. do.; bolts, 26@29c.; nails, 19@20c.; braziers copper, ordinary sizes over 16oz., per square foot, 32c.; sheathing copper, over 12 oz., per square foot 36c.; bolt copper, 32c.; copper, 16@20c., as to quality. Iron—Scotch pig is without much animation, and jobs out in small lots at about former figures. We quote at \$26@29, according to brand and quantity. American pig greatly neglected, and though the production is low there is enough and to spare for all present wants. We quote: No. 1 at \$21 per ton, No. 2 at \$19, and forge, \$18@19. Rails have been more active and are steady at \$38@42 for new iron, and \$50@53 for new steel; old rails, \$30@32 per ton; scrap iron worth about \$25@27 per ton. Manufactured iron is selling moderately.—LEAD.—Foreign remains very quiet, with holders asking about 6@6½c. gold. Domestic has sold to some extent, but the demand is freely met and prices kept easy on a range of 6@6½c. currency. The manufacturers of lead are quoted: Bar, 8¾c.; pipe, 9c., and sheet 9½c. less the usual trade discount.

TIN.—Pig has sold moderately in small lots at some-

what irregular rates, but made no improvement. We quote at 19¾@20c. for Banca; 17¾@18 for Straits; 17½@18 for English refined, and 17½@17¾ for L. and F. Tin plates not very active on spot, but there is said to have been considerable business doing in parcels to arrive at full rates. Spelter quiet, though some contracts for future have been made on a basis of current prices. We quote at 6¾@6½c., currency. Zinc in average jobbing demand and steady. We quote at 8¼@8½c. gold for foreign, and 8½@9c. currency, for domestic.

PITCH.—The demand not active and confined, in the main, to small trade orders. Holders offer stocks to the extent of the market's wants and accept former rates. We quote at \$2.87½@2.62½ per bbl. for city.

SPIRITS TURPENTINE.—The demand has been somewhat irregular, but, on the whole, fair, and holders, in most cases, retain strength and confidence even at the higher rates obtained. We quote at 47@49c., as to quantity.

TAR.—About the same general tone current, a moderate demand prevailing from regular sources, and prices ruling steady on a well controlled stock. We quote \$2.87½@3 for Washington, and \$3@3.25 for Wilmington.
