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MARKET REVIEW.

REAL ESTATE MARKET.

The real estate market presented few if any features of interest during the past week. Below will be found a complete resume of sales at the Exchange during the past week.

Riverside Park property holders have picked up renewed courage of late, owing to the attitude of both the workingmen and the Department of Parks, and the scene at Commissioner Martin's office the other day, when capitalists, property owners and workingmen agreed upon a united policy how to compel Comptroller Green to abandon his opposition to the long called for improvement, shows that the embryo park has still many friends, who may succeed after all, sooner than was anticipated, in accomplishing what has been so long and so perseveringly demanded by many West-side property holders.

BUILDING MATERIAL MARKET.

BRICK.—Some new work has been commenced, and contracts under way are in several cases requiring rather larger amounts of stock, but a number of jobs have also nearly or quite reached cover, and on the whole the increase of consumption, if any, is small. Buyers too continue the old policy of simply taking enough for early wants, and very seldom are supplies piled up much beyond what the workmen will require to keep them going for a week or so. Manufacturers in the meantime are using their efforts to keep shipments in this direction down to a small compass, and are to a certain extent successful, though since our last the management was poor somewhere, and quite a little accumulation hung over the market for several days. This, of course, gave buyers an advantage, and the turn of prices was easier, with a great many sales made at equal to about 25c, shading from last week. Holders have offered supplies to the full extent of the call, but without any great pressure, and some are hopeful that a firmer tone may soon be infused. It is calculated that most of the boats and barges are now at this end of the route, and with reduced facilities for transportation and the absence of necessity for taking extra pains to get stock through, smaller receipts are calculated upon. About \$4.50@5.25 is the general range for Haverstraws, with some very good lots sold at \$4.75@5 per M. "Up-rivers" worth about \$4@4.50 per M. Pale brick continue in comparatively small supply, with a good fair demand, and prices steady at \$2.50@3 per M. Fronts are generally quoted "without change," most dealers in the fine grades meeting with a fair business, and obtaining former rates. We quote: Pale, per M, \$2.25@3; Hards, Up-river, \$4@4.50; Haverstraw Bay, \$4.60@5.50; Fronts, Croton—brown, \$10; dark, \$11; red, \$12; Philadelphia, \$23@27; Baltimore, \$34@38. Yard prices, delivery included, \$2@3 higher on ordinary, and \$5@6 on fronts.

CEMENT.—So far as the local demand is concerned there does not appear to be much change on the market for Rosendale. About the regular buyers make their appearance, order sufficient for temporary necessities and withdraw, resisting all efforts to induce them to increase their orders. The shipping call, however, is very fair, including a somewhat increased movement on Eastern account, and this, with deliveries on contract, keeps a fair amount of stock in motion. The regulation rates remain at \$1.10 on "Creek," and \$1.20 here; but rumors are again current of "outside" stock selling lower. Manufacturers of "patent" and special makes report a fair but not remarkably encouraging business. Foreign has been moderately active, and remains about steady for all the leading grades, though now and then slight indications of a desire to force matters are noticeable among sellers. About 1,500 bbls. Portland have recently changed hands at \$3.45@3.75 from pier and yard. We quote from pier and yard and according to brand, as follows: Portland, \$3.40@4; Roman, \$3.50@4; Keene, \$7.75@8 for coarse, and \$11.75@12 for fine; Martin's, \$7@7.25 for coarse, and \$11@11.25 for fine; La Forge, Portland, \$4.10@4.25; and Lime of Teil, \$2.85@3.

GLASS.—The demand for French window glass, or for that matter for all kinds, continues moderate, and the market generally has a dull, flat tone. All the usual outlets appear to be either closed or requiring an unusually small amount of stock, and show no indications of increasing the movement at present. Holders and manufacturers, however, are comparatively firm in their views; indeed many assert that they have "got their backs up" and do not propose making any important concessions. Still, on a flat market the buyer always has more or less advantage, and to good customers a little "easing off" occasionally takes place. On the French list the discount remains at about 60 and 20@80 and 25 per cent.

HARDWARE.—So far as business accomplished is concerned the market remains dull, and the distribution of goods is moderate. A great many dealers, however, seem to consider the outlook as encouraging for a good fall trade. Western buyers have commenced "looking

around." Advances from the South and Southwest indicate that supplies will be wanted, and the probabilities strongly favor a better market for standard goods. Builders' and plumbers' hardware will have a proportionate share of the demand, but on mechanics' tools there is some doubt. It is feared that the poverty of workmen throughout the country will prevent them from purchasing, except as a matter of the most absolute necessity, while in many cases "kits" will be sold for want of use, and thus make a sort of second-hand trade to interfere with new tools. The general stocks and assortments on hand are now in good shape for any ordinary call. Few changes are reported, but we notice that the blacksmiths' bellows of Newcomb Bros. are quoted at a discount of 25 per cent., instead of 40 per cent., as heretofore, and extra do. 10 per cent.; and also that the Old Colony Iron Company have fixed their discount on shovels and spades at 25 per cent., instead of 20 per cent., as formerly. The American Screw Company are now quoting flat head iron and brass wood screws 52½¢ per cent. discount, and round do., 40. The Russell & Erwin Manufacturing Co. have also advanced their prices on flat head iron wood screws to 55 and 7½¢ per cent. discount.

LATH.—"Nothing new" is about the sum and substance of the information tendered reporters in search of "points" to write up on the lath market. Receivers and manufacturers continue to keep in close correspondence in order to regulate the supply as near as may be to the wants of the market, while buyers give little or no attention to matters until they actually require stock, then, figuring amounts down to just about as close a point as possible on what they know they can use to early advantage, come forward, make their purchase as soon as they can, pay whatever the market rate may be, and withdraw, resisting all attempts to induce them to operate with greater freedom. On Saturday last a cargo was sold at \$1.45 per M, under a sort of pressure to realize, the owner being anxious to quit stock, and striking a bad market day; but since then there has been nothing offered under \$1.50, and this appears to be about the rate at present writing.

LIME.—The general volume of business continues slow and unsatisfactory, and somewhat behind expectations. Most of the arrivals of Eastern are placed soon after arrival, as great care is taken to prevent, if possible, more coming out than can be handled to advantage. The quantity required, however, is discouragingly small and with the unremunerative rates current manufacturers and agents generally seem quite disgusted over the ruling condition of affairs. Just at the moment there appears to be a scarcity of lump in yard, and a somewhat increased offering could probably be placed to advantage. State lime shows no change, the demand running moderate, and prices as before. The production is kept low, and this prevents an accumulation of stock. We quote nominally as follows: Rockland, 85c. per bbl. for common, and \$1.25 for finishing; North River, 60@65c. per bbl. for common, and \$1@1.25 for finishing.

LUMBER.—To a moderate extent the market in a wholesome way has probably been more encouraging for some dealers than last week, but there is no general or positive improvement, and in a great many instances we hear continued grumbling, loud and deep. Grumbling to be sure, has to a certain extent become a chronic affection with the lumber trade, and force of habit brings complaint to the lips of numbers who are getting their full share of whatever is going on; but even at its best, and on the reports of those who may be considered the most sanguine, the business actually accomplished in aggregate is only fair. Buyers adhere to settled habits, those operating on home account taking just the nicely-calculated quantities required for known necessities and "no more for the present," while shippers confine themselves absolutely to the limits of orders in hand. As a general thing values show no quotable change, and are nominally steady, but no well-secured or cash buyer would experience much difficulty in obtaining concessions from so-called market rates. Stocks and assortments are ample and attractive, or where any thing may be short it can soon be made good, and about the only thing lacking is a good, uniform outlet for what dealers have to offer.

Eastern spruce does not appear to have changed much on the general condition of affairs from reports made for some time past. Now and then receivers are to be found talking a little upish, but it is as a rule soon discovered that they are likely to have some stock in, and naturally desire to pave the way. The test of actual sales, however, develops about the old range of values, on which \$12@14 may be named for good fair random to prime special, with sometimes \$1 off the inside figure for common, and possibly slight additions to the extreme for something extra choice and difficult.

White pine on home account continues in dull, uncertain demand, the distribution being in small parcels and

of a spasmodic character, with some dealers getting the lion's share of trade, more through good luck than anything else. Prices are somewhat irregular, but in the main favorable to the buying interest. Exporters buy a little and throw out "fealers" for more stock, but exhibit no anxiety, and it can hardly be said that the foreign outlet affords much relief at present. We quote at \$18@19 M for shippers, 10-inch and upwards; \$15@17 do. for do., 10 and 12-inch, and \$13.50@15 $\frac{3}{4}$ box, 8 and 12-inch. Building timber, \$30@35.

Yellow pine on random cargo is not wanted, and receivers are very careful to keep such off the market. Agents, however, are obtaining now and then a few fresh special orders, in part for "up river" or Eastern delivery, and report about former rates current. We occasionally meet a buyer, however, who claims to be able to purchase at less than published quotations, and prices named are probably full high. Hewn timber is much neglected at present. We quote random cargoes at \$18@20 M; ordered cargoes, \$21@25 do.; green flooring boards, \$23@24 do.; and dry do., \$25@26; step plank, as set plank, at \$25@26 M. Cargoes at the South, \$14@16 M.

Hardwoods are without change or improvement of a decided character. Some manufacturers have been "looking around," but those whose trade would be desirable exhibit no hurry to buy, while those who want considerable amounts and are willing to take them quickly do not seem prepared to offer an equivalent acceptable to sellers. We quote: Wholesale value by car-load at about \$72@80 M for the finest walnut; \$35@60 do. for common do.; \$35@40 do. for ash; \$38@40 do. for white wood; \$35@38 for oak; and \$55@65 for cherry; \$50@65 for butternut, and \$35@40 for hickory.

Among the yards there is a fair trade for the standard run of stock, but as before the movement is almost entirely in small odd lots calculated to satisfy temporary wants. Offerings in quantity and assortment are good, and holders willing operators, with prices nominally unchanged, but the turn in favor of all good customers.

Among the recent lumber charters we note the following: An Am. schr., 335 tons, from Richibucto to Gloucester, E., deals, 79s.; one, 475 tons, from Magdalene Islands (River St. Lawrence) to Liverpool, timber, 39s. $\frac{3}{4}$ load, and deals 82s. 6d. $\frac{3}{4}$ standard; a new Am. ship, about 1,200 tons, from Bangor to Liverpool, deals, 73s.; an Am. ship, 1,050 tons, from Miramichi to Liverpool or Bristol Channel, deals, 75s. 6d.; an Am. brig, 271 tons, from Brunswick to Cienfuegos, lumber, \$14 Spanish gold; an Am. bark, 340 tons, from Pensacola to Havana, lumber, at or about \$13; an Am. bark, 244 tons, hence to Port-au-Prince, lumber, \$10 gold; a schr., 200 M re-sawed lumber, from Fernandina to Bermuda, \$7 gold and port charges; a schr., 170 M lumber, from Jacksonville to New York, \$7.25; a brig, 240 M do., from Pensacola to Norfolk, \$8.50; a schr., 125 M lumber, from Brunswick to Boston, \$7.50; one, 121 tons, hence to Jacksonville and back, \$9.25 on lumber for the round; two, 150 and 200 M lumber, from Jacksonville to New York, \$7.25; one, 160 M do., from Brunswick to New York, \$6.50; one, 160 M do., from Bucksville to Calais, \$8; one, 250 M dressed flooring boards, from Pensacola to New York, \$8.50.

General Lumber Notes.

—The Bay City *Lumberman's Gazette* has had a "head put on it," which materially improves the appearance of the first page. The *Gazette* is just entering upon its fifth year, and seems to be firmly established as the representative lumber journal of the section in which it is published. Its market reports are carefully prepared, and evidently determinedly impartial. From its columns we clip the following:

BAY CITY, Wednesday, July 26, 1876.—To give the proper coloring to the condition of the valley market at the present time is a rather difficult thing to do, for everything seems to be done in such a quiet, undercurrent sort of a way that it is a hard matter to arrive at the exact status of the trade; still, from existing indications, we think matters are gradually coming into more satisfactory shape. The number of buyers who have been upon the ground from Chicago, Albany, Cleveland, Buffalo, Tonawanda, and other distributing places contiguous to this producing section, has been larger than for some weeks past, which in one sense is an encouraging indication, as it shows that there is a growing demand for lumber, if only it can be bargained for at satisfactory figures, which is quite an improvement over the times when it seemed as though it would be a difficult matter to find a buyer who would do a seller the kindness to take his stock for love or money. But dealers are now willing to negotiate if they can only get offerings low enough to suit them, which, by the way, is a very difficult matter to do at present, from the fact that manufacturers feel that their lumber ought to bring them a very fair price, while distributors cling tenaciously to the belief that prices are to rule lower than ever. By reason of this difference in opinion several buyers have come and gone without contracting for anything, except, perhaps, a few small cargoes to fill out assortments and keep home trade along until matters take a more definite shape—though, by the way, there were a very few sales which aggregated from one to two million feet, all p. t., however. The reticence which dealers manifest shows not only that they are moving with great caution, but also that they are rather speculating as to what trade is to be later in the season, and not bargaining on the strength of what it now is. It is, therefore, a little too early in the season for them to be making positive moves, as the harvests and political excitements have not begun to display their effects upon the tone of the market as yet. Still, as we said before, the fact that buyers are coming to our market in larger numbers than common is a hopeful sign. But there is one drawback to this hope, in that where sales are made, even for small

lots, they are in many cases p. t., and the seller the party who is particularly anxious that the terms be kept private, thus showing that the tendency is to shade present rates instead of their stiffening up, as had been so confidently contended would be the case in July or August. Still, the present peculiar condition of the market may be deceptive and attributable largely to the quiet workings of the "bulls" and "bears," and thus not occasioned by the real law of supply and demand, as may at first appear. There is always a certain amount of talking and feeling around to be done before fall trade sets in, and more of that portion of the programme than actual business is upon the taps just now, consequently a little longer time will be required to determine what the tone of late summer and fall market is to be.

Freights are still down to bottom figures, and collections are moderately good for this season of the year. Among the actual sales we note the following: 800 M from river to Buffalo parties at \$5-10-30; do., 1,000 M at current prices, which doubtless means no higher than \$5-10-30; 2,500 M for Chicago parties, at from \$4.50-9-28 to \$5-10-30—a coarse lot from logs that would not bring more than from \$5 to \$6; 384 M choice stock, sides, for New York market, \$6-12-34. There are also other sales of 500 M and 1,000 M lots, but p. t. was the restriction, as buyers and sellers appear to be very shy of reports, just now.

—The *Gazette* also says:

The raftsmen are at last beginning to complain of low water somewhat. The cry is heard not so much upon our streams as from other sources, for here the volume has held out extremely well, though low water is gradually manifesting itself in this State. In Minnesota and Wisconsin, however, rafting and driving are being considerably retarded, though there is but little doubt but that as many logs as are required for the good of the trade will find their way to the mills.

—The *Northwestern Lumberman* has the following:

CHICAGO, July 27, 1876.—At the wholesale wharves during the past week trade has been moderately active for this season. The weather has been more favorable than for several weeks back, and buyers have shown more of a willingness to take hold at the ruling rates. Monday last, it is stated, was one of the liveliest days that has been experienced on the market this season. The north wind which commenced blowing on Saturday brought a large number of vessels to the docks on Monday morning, and there being, fortunately, a good attendance of buyers, the business for a few hours was quite brisk, so that only about twenty cargoes out of some forty or fifty remained at the close of the day's transactions. Since then the business has been confined to working off the remainder of Monday's fleet and the few cargoes arriving, which has been readily done without special effort. As to prices, there is at present no change to record, though the commission men are of opinion that the light receipts will enable them to advance the figures a trifle by the first proximo.

Cargo Quotations.—Good joist and scantling, \$7.75@8. Common to fair joist and scantling, \$7.25@7.75. Common to fair boards and strips, \$8@10. Good boards and strips, \$10.50@11.50. Lath, \$1.15. Shingles, \$2@2.25.

—The *Lumberman*, in referring to a letter recently published in these columns, remarks editorially:

In Mr. William Little's communication last week he placed the stock of logs cut during the winter of 1875-6 in the States of Michigan, Wisconsin and Minnesota at 2,900,000,000 feet. He ultimately ciphers out 201,000,000 feet more consumed in 1875 than we will have to manufacture in 1876 the country over. On the main streams in those States there was over 3,000,000,000 feet of logs put afloat, all of which will probably get to the mills. If the railroad mills and various interior points produce only one-half as much as in 1875, 600,000,000 feet more at least must be added to the above. This would throw the balance of Mr. Little's problem some 700,000,000 feet on the other side—i. e., the production of 1876, assuming his other figures to be correct, would be nearly three-quarters of a billion feet in excess of the consumption of 1875. We will have some details to offer in support of this argument shortly.

—The *Timber Trades Journal* of London has the following on the same subject:

THE REAL ESTATE RECORD of July 1st brings the long-promised letter of Mr. William Little, addressed to the editor of that journal, in which he draws a very sad picture of the present state of affairs, while his sketch of the future is almost too horrible to contemplate. Mr. Little has long been an enthusiast on the subject of the preservation of timber, and we should be glad indeed if his continued efforts in that direction should tend to a more careful fostering of the supplies of this precious commodity, which is undoubtedly becoming scarcer every year.

—The *Darien (Ga.) Gazette* says:

By the following quotations it will be seen that timber is low down in this market, owing to the fact that there is but little demand for it. A small lot only came in this week, and sold very cheap. There seems to be quite a want of vessels in port, particularly that class engaged in the coasting trade, consequently the stock has increased, causing a depression in the market which can only be relieved by shipments. Two of our mills have stopped, and others are scarcely able to saw for want of wharf room. For the coming season we can scarcely venture a prediction, but incline to the opinion that it will be a prosperous one for all:

—The *London Timber Trades Journal* reports as follows:

LONDON, July 21, 1876.—The state of the markets here remains unaltered since our last. Prices continue firm, but the demand is so limited that it is questionable whether any decline on the sellers' part would induce speculation. Shippers display an equal amount of indifference, and while they can afford to do so we need not look for lower prices.

LIVERPOOL, July 20, 1876.—We have little, if any, notable change in our market, either as increasing or decreasing demand, and consequently quotations, speaking generally, remain without change. In some articles there are indications of an upward tendency in price, though they are as yet not sufficiently marked to warrant alterations in figures. The present low price of pitch pine timber is forcing it into consumption; to the detriment of the commoner qualities of Canadian pine, whilst the improved manufacture of the late importations tends to render it a more attractive article to the builder and dealer, although to the former the greater amount expended upon it in working, as compared with Quebec yellow pine, must be a matter of some consideration. Spruce deals of all descriptions remain without material change from those quoted in your last issue, and Quebec yellow pine deals are in about the same position. No auction sales of importance have been held during the last fortnight.

LEITE, July 19, 1876.—My report for the last fortnight shows forty arrivals, viz.: 6 from Quebec, 2 from Pensacola and Darien, and 3 Baltic timber, 14 deals and bat'tens, 4 pit props, 2 sleepers, 9 various. We have had three sales, viz.: Imperial saw mills, being mostly sawn wood, which brought very fair prices. Messrs. W. Thomson & Co.'s cargo of Annie Laurie off Quebec, being the first sale of new importations, brought forward a good company, and prices obtained were: Pine, 2s. 5d. to 2s. 8d.; birch, 2s. 2d. to 2s. 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ d.; ash, 2s.; wainscot, one lot, 4s. 3d.; oak, 2s. 8d. to 3s.; a few pieces pitch pine hewn, 1s. 4d. The entire cargo of the Annie Laurie was nearly cleared out; her cargo was landed and sold on the fifth day after her arrival. Messrs. James Duncan & Co. had a sale to-day, which was very fairly attended, but a great difficulty was experienced in making sales.

METALS.—COPPER.—Ingot continues to sell moderately; the offering, both on spot and to arrive, larger, and prices weak. We quote at 19 $\frac{1}{2}$ @20c. for Lake. Manufactured copper is selling to ordinary outlets at about former rates, and remains nominally steady. We quote: Yellow metal sheathing, 20@21c.; do. bolts, 28@29c.; nails, 21@22c.; braziers' copper, ordinary sizes, over 16oz. per square foot, 32c.; sheathing copper, over 12oz. per square foot, 36c.; bolt copper, 32c.; old copper, 16@20c., as to quality. IRON.—Scotch pig is in buyers' favor, with offerings in excess of the outlet, which is very small. We quote at \$27@30 as to brand and delivery. ALBANY LUMBER MARKET.

[From the Argus of August 2, 1876.]
The market has been rather quiet since our last, though within a few days one or two round lots come in box have been sold below our quotations. Notwithstanding this, quotations may be said to rule steady. The tone of the market for the rest of the season will, it is generally thought, be established within the next forty days; whether it will result in giving us a stronger market or one weaker than the present remains to be seen. The most favorable feature in the trade is the numerous inquiries made from abroad for round lots mostly of pine, but of coarse lumber.
The canal receipts for the week, especially by way of the Champlain, have been light; still the aggregate receipts of the season keep ahead of those of last season. Stocks of pine lumber are light, but at no time has the assortment been better than it now is. The demand runs mainly on the common grades of pine, the good dry stock of which is getting very scarce.
The stock of coarse lumber is good, but all will be wanted; the dry weather has checked the running of logs to the mills as well as the sawing; in the absence of any pressing demand this works well for our dealers. The question raised in Canada as to the employment of the trade in Michigan in manufacturing deals for the English market, of which the Argus spoke some weeks ago seems to be no longer doubted. It is now expected, by Canada parties too, that the manufacture this season will reach the large figure at which we placed it, viz.: 40,000,000 feet. Whether "the refuse" can be used as advantageously in Michigan as in Canada will probably depend on the continuance of the trade. But this change in the manufacture of Michigan lumber has, we understand, raised another question, viz.: whether Canada deals cannot be taken from Canada by our canals to New York, and thence, at a cheaper cost, to Great Britain, than by the St. Lawrence route? This is now engaging the attention of Canadian producers.
The receipts at Oswego for the week were 3,410,000 feet, with \$2 1/2 M feet by canal to Albany.
The receipts at Buffalo for the week were 5,099,000 feet by lake; by rail, 66 cars. This seems to be a fixed number. Canal freights to Albany, \$2.55 @ 275 M feet on pine and \$3.25 @ 3.50 on hard wood.
At Chicago the receipts from January 1 to July 25 are 412,673,000 feet; the shipments, 259,624,000 feet, against 467,618,000 feet receipts and 285,693,000 feet shipped a year ago.
