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RISKS OF BUILDING LOANS.

Building loans may be framed so as to be free from risk or relatively so. No mercantile transactions are entirely free from risk, but a well-considered, judiciously-planned and honestly-conceived scheme of building loan should involve as little serious risk as is permissible in business affairs.

When a discreet and fair-minded capitalist has the good fortune to meet with an honest and competent builder, possessed of a moderate share of capital, the business relations of such parties are likely to be of the most satisfactory kind. Whether the emolument of the capitalist is great or small, in such cases he derives his share of the pecuniary benefit of the transaction in such a simple, natural and easy way, that he is inclined to felicitate himself upon his happy lot.

A business, however, in which there is but one case of ultimate success to ninety-nine of failure, must contain beneath its surface elements of risk which it were well if possible to explore and define.

The risks of building loans, as far as they relate to the capitalist, take root in the character or the solvency of the builder; personal qualities which it behooves the capitalist to examine and test. The alluring feature of the transaction is that it appears to guarantee to the capitalist a profit in advance of the result of the venture. In other words, the capitalist is allowed to realize his profit on paper long in advance of the possibility of his realizing it in money, and the intermediate steps between the two stages are apt to be so masked and concealed as to entirely escape the scrutiny and consideration of the capitalist when he embarks. The sale of lots at a stipulated price, with covenants as to the loaning of money, all properly arranged and defined in a written contract, seems as plain and clear as a bill of sale or articles of a charter party. In practical working these transactions are not nearly so simple or smooth as they at first seem.

If the builder is an unscrupulous, cunning, low fellow he will probably try to lead on the capitalist until the first payments on the contract are secured, and until the capitalist has become so far committed to the work that retreat or even hesitation becomes impossible. When this point has been reached, the builder commences a systematic course of bulldozing and intimidation, threatening to stop the work or to delay it, or, perhaps, pleading poverty and inability to proceed according to the conditions defined in the contract, and begging for a new deal. No description of the

ordeal through which the capitalist is compelled to pass in the exigencies of an insolvent or fraudulent building scheme would adequately reproduce the reality. The details of this experience must be learned from those who have already gone through it.

Two risks or alternatives are here presented to the capitalist. He may, in the first place, take his stand firmly and refuse to waive or exceed the terms of the contract. Then, in case of the failure or refusal of the builder to proceed, he may assert his reserved rights by foreclosing and acquiring the property. If the capitalist is unwilling to proceed to these extreme measures, or is dissuaded from it by counsel or friends, his purse-strings are apt to be unloosed or his bank account thrown open to the free incursions of the builder. The demands for money become persistent and importunate, and the threats of evil consequences more intimidating.

The wanting of loans to the extent of fifty per cent. in excess of the covenant amount would be a favorable issue, because in many cases the excess reaches 10 or 150 per cent. If the builder has originally agreed to take a loan equal to one-half the cost of building, he may manage to extract from the capitalist double that amount, or the whole cost of the building, and sometimes an amount in excess of the cost.

If the market is buoyant, and prices are advancing, these liberal loans may be reimbursed; but, as too often happens, the capitalist finds himself at the end of the job with premises pledged as security for his advances, whose negotiable market value represents only a fraction of the sum loaned. Of these two methods of dealing with defaulted building loan contracts, the former is the safer and therefore preferable one. However formidable its consequences may seem, a strict and severe interpretation of the penalties of the contract is the only safe, regular and practicable method for the capitalist to adopt. Leniency in these cases merely affords the builder a license, which he is apt to abuse to the great loss and detriment of the capitalist. When the latter finds he has made a bad bargain, he must reinstate himself without delay in a position of absolute control. There are cases where the bargain has been made, contract entered into, work begun, and, after the receipt of one or more payments, the builder deliberately abandons the job and perhaps absconds. This presents a risk different from the other and equally embarrassing. The capitalist, a professional man or merchant, perhaps, is totally unacquainted with the details of building, and is forced to get possession of the property as promptly as possible, and then set to work to complete the improvements already begun. To do this speedily and easily, he is apt to find himself at the mercy of the original contractors, who are creditors of the builder, and disposed to seek such liberal margins of profit from the new owner as will cover the losses which they have already sustained on the job. If the capitalist is obliged to seek new contractors, through whom he may effect the completion of the work, he finds himself involved in an annoying and harassing business, and one that will make extraordinary demands upon his time, patience and purse. In a word, however uncon-

genial or unexpected the employment may be, he finds he must become, in spite of his prejudices a builder and owner of property rather than a mere capitalist and handler of money. Instead of realizing his capital by the prompt negotiability of the premises, the capitalist is often obliged to make a permanent investment of the property with which he has thus become entangled.

The legal delays and expenses involved in recovering possession of the title is a risk which must also be allowed for in the outset of these undertakings.

Unsuccessful and disastrous building loans are generally founded in gross fictions, and represent efforts to work palpable miracles, to perform impossibilities. The capitalist is either deluded by others or deludes himself into the belief that the building business is capable of producing marvellous and prodigious results, whereas under the most favorable circumstances legitimate building is productive of only moderate profit. Building loan schemes are entered into recklessly and often with a dishonest purpose. A fabulous and exhaustive bonus is ostensibly guaranteed in advance to the capitalist, and the builder hopes through monied assistance to twist and wriggle his way through the job, intending in any event to take good care of himself. The disaster which overtakes the transaction earlier or later in its progress may seem like a surprise to the bewildered capitalist, while in reality it may be a result deliberately anticipated by the builder, and certainly foreseen by any intelligent person conversant with the details of the undertaking, the critical and undetermined point being merely as to when the final catastrophe would happen.

It is the avowed experience of capitalists who have exploited these schemes, that there is no profit ordinarily attainable in them that will offset the risk, hardship and inconvenience that inseparably attend defaulted building loan transactions. It is indispensable to commercial comfort and success in these transactions that the capitalist should bestride an easy-going horse not vicious or fractious or liable to break down.

MARKET REVIEW.

REAL ESTATE MARKET.

During the month of July 481 deeds, excluding those affecting property in the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards, were filed for record in the office of the Register of the City of New York, being ninety-nine less than the number filed during the month of June. The aggregate consideration expressed in such deeds amounts to \$1,890,912, against \$5,244,769 the amount expressed in the whole number of deeds filed during the month of July, 1877. The number of mortgages filed for record during last month is 477, representing the sum of \$3,424,585, against \$3,476,687 for the month of June; 229 mortgages bear interest at 6 per cent., aggregating the sum of \$1,685,076. The total number made in favor of trust and insurance companies is fifty, representing \$653,500.

At the Exchange Salesroom the entire interest was again centered in foreclosure sales, full details of which are given below.

In the Building Department no plans worthy of special notice have been filed since our last report. The total number of plans filed is ten, embracing twenty-two buildings, the estimated cost of which is \$120,200.

BUILDING MATERIAL MARKET.

BRICKS.—Hards have as a rule remained in very much the same general situation last noted. A pretty good demand prevails frequently to the extent of cleaning up current offerings and leaving a few buyers to wait over for fresh arrivals, and this has naturally had a tendency to give receivers some little advantage through which former rates were maintained. No positive advance, however, could be secured, and up to the close it was difficult to discover much inclination to buoyancy. About \$3.75 on "Up-Rivers," and \$4.50 on Haverstraw are average top rates, but now and then exceeded by extra fine lots, as really attractive stock is not over plenty. Local consumption is still very good and promises to increase, affording a reasonably cheerful outlook, but even against known early wants it is rare that buyers can be found to operate, preferring to simply take stock as they use it up from time to time. All accounts agree that the production has been curtailed, the estimate ranging from 25 to 50 per cent falling off, and this must have its influence should demand develop any greater life. Pale brick continue slow at about former rates. Fronts are in good average demand and ruling steady all around. Some few calls for export are made but nothing to amount to anything.

We quote Pale, # M., \$2.00@2.25; Hards, Up-rivers, \$3.50@4.00; Haverstraw bay, \$4.00@4.50; favorite brands, \$4.75@5.00; Fronts, Croton—brown, \$1; dark, \$2; red, \$3; Philadelphia, \$2.65@2.85; Trenton, \$2@2.90; Baltimore, \$3@3.80. Yard prices, delivery included, \$3@3 higher on ordinary and \$5.00@6.00 on fronts.

CEMENT.—The demand for domestic continues about the same, covering a fair amount on local account for current consumption and some few shipping orders, but not reaching a point of much positive activity. Supplies available have proven quite equal to all wants and could have been easily increased if necessary, as the capacity of the producers has not been severely taxed this season. Prices show great irregularity according to brand, size of order, place of delivery, etc., etc., but the average advantage has been in buyers favor. Some of the agents, however, appear to think that greater uniformity is to be looked for, as weak manufacturers have withdrawn, and competition and undercutting are reduced.

HARDWARE.—Demand without much animation, or many indications that any immediate free additions to the call are likely. The movement, however, even of the small lots called for, takes out a fair amount of stock, and there is evidence of an undertone of considerable hope among most of the leading dealers. Local business is very good, and especially so in standard descriptions of builders hardware. On values the following announcements have been made. Russell, Erwin & Co. will issue a list on locks, knobs, etc., with discount of 70 per cent. The pump manufacturers have adopted the following: Pitcher and Cistern, 55 per cent. discount; Drive Well Yard, Set Length Lift, and Set Length Force, 50 do.; Brass Cylinder Cistern and Pitcher, Iron and Brass Cylinder Force, either single or double acting for hand use, including Hand Boiler Pumps, 40 do. do.; Hydraulic Rams, 40 do. do.; Garden Engines, 30 do. do.

LATH.—A considerable amount of stock has been on the market during the period intervening since our last, and after more or less irregularity and fluctuation the gain proves slightly in buyers favor. At first the tone was steady with a few apparently anxious calls, but these becoming satisfied, and some pretty full cargoes reaching port, receivers experienced greater difficulty in placing their stock, and finally had to shade. This brought the cargo rate to \$1.30 per M. and is the latest we learn of up to present writing. Receivers tell us they do not expect many additional supplies for some time, as anxious manufacturers have, it is claimed, forwarded all they care to realize upon for the present.

LIME.—Supplies of Eastern have not greatly burdened receivers, and offerings generally were pretty closely sold up without much difficulty. Former rates remain current with a steady tone all around. There was some talk of a slight advance on finishing, but the rumor was not confirmed. On the whole the position seems to be in a trifle better shape than last week, but by no means brilliant or encouraging. The State lime continues to sell slowly, and mostly at 50c per bbl. in the ordinary wholesale way, though some small lots range as high as 60c. Ground lime is held steadily, with 70c an inside rate.

LUMBER.—Business has only a moderately active tone at the West, and there is nothing very liberal or encouraging in the form of demand as now shown. For current, buyers appear to have secured about all the stock required, and cannot be induced to anticipate the future, which, with offering supplies ample, and in some cases showing an excess over the outlet, keeps values down to the former level. We do not, however, hear of any further concessions granted, and the rates in many instances, at least, have reached a point at which sellers show more decided combativeness than for a long time past. The wants on home account for building purposes show a tendency to increase, but from manufacturers, etc., calls are few and uncertain, and exporters still fail to give many large or encouraging orders. Considerable of the stuff recently forwarded and now loading is in execution of old contracts.

Eastern spruce remains at about the same rates last quoted. Quite a little fleet came to hand at about the time of publication of our last report, and formed another surplus of which several cargoes still remain in the stream unsold. This, however, was to be expected in view of the previous large amounts having about satisfied buyers immediately in want of stock, and receivers now incline to carry rather than concede further. About \$11.00 per M. is the rate for good, serviceable random, though poor schedules, and forced sales are at lower figures. We quote at \$10.25@\$11 for random, possibly \$11.25@\$11.37½ for choice lengths in small cargo, and \$12.00@\$13.00 for specials, the extreme for extra difficult.

White Pine continues to sell in a slow and uncertain manner on both the home and foreign outlets, and while quoted about as before, prices are to some extent nominal. Buyers do not appear to object much to the cost, but simply have no use just now for supplies beyond what they purchase, and refuse to anticipate their wants. We quote at \$15.00@\$17.00 per M. for West India shipping boards; \$20.00@\$21.00 for South American do.; \$15.00@\$16.00 for box boards; \$17.00 for do. wide and sound; and timber to order at \$30@\$40 per M.

Yellow Pine continues to sell slowly, and no positively new features are reported. Local wants are small, exporters somewhat indifferent about engaging many cargoes for direct shipment from the South, and though freights are likely to advance, buyers refuse to enter into contracts. We quote random cargoes at about \$18.00@\$22.00 per M.; ordered cargoes \$22.00@\$24.00 do; green flooring boards, \$20@\$21 do.; and dry do. do. \$20@\$23. Cargoes at the South, \$14@\$15.50 per M.; heavy timber, \$7.50@\$14.

Hardwoods sell to some extent, and rumors are again current of a call from exporters, but the movement is not an encouraging one, and some holders would be pleased to see their stocks diminishing more rapidly. About former figures are asked, but the position is a nominal one to a large extent. We quote at wholesale rates by car load about as follows: Walnut, \$77@\$87 3/4 M. ash, \$33@\$36 do; oak, \$35@\$40 do; maple, \$30@\$35; chestnut, 1st and 2d, \$30@\$35 do.; do., culls, \$18@\$20 do cherry, \$45@\$75 do; white wood, 3/4 and 5/8 inch, \$25@\$27.50 and do. inch, \$33@\$35 do; hickory, \$25@\$30 do. for Western, and \$40@\$50 for good near-by stock.

At the yards an ordinary distribution is taking place both as to quantity and form, and "nothing new"

covers about all the information to be gleaned. We notice an increase of accumulation in some instances with evidences of a careful selection having been made.

STATE.

The Argus reports the Albany market to July 30th as follows:

Trade in pine lumber during the week has been rather quiet, although no change in prices is reported. A sale has been made of 300,000 feet of common box at \$11.57 1/2 per M., which is below our quotations.

Coarse lumber continues in good stock, with a fair demand at unchanged prices.

The canal week, not closing until to-morrow, we have no additional report of receipts of lumber.

Canada lumberers are hopeful that the improving condition of trade in Great Britain may bring about a better trade and better prices for their product.

The following figures, giving the shipments of lumber from Whitehall by canal, from the opening of navigation in the years of 1877 and 1878, though showing but little change in the aggregate movement, exhibit in the items marked falling off in pine and a large increase in coarse lumber:

THE WEST.

SAGINAW VALLEY.

Lumberman's Gazette Office:

BAY CITY, Monday, July 22, 1878.

The past week has been one of stagnation and general apathy, which may be attributed in a large measure to the extremely hot weather that has prevailed. There have been no sales to speak of, although the shipments have been fair, approximating closely to those made during the corresponding time last year. Manufacturers as a rule are holding firm at our pres-

ent quotations, and there is but little disposition to sell at less than the highest prices quoted, although occasionally we hear of the sale of small lots of inferior stuff at a shade off. A short time back there was a feeling that there would be a decline in prices before fall, but this sentiment has naturally changed in the knowledge that the shortage will be fully 25 to 35 per cent., and the anticipated demand early in the fall. Logs are stiff at from \$6 to \$10, the better quality of logs readily commanding from \$9 to \$10, and scarce at that. With logs at this price the market must certainly advance. Information from the Wisconsin and Minnesota lumber districts stimulates the stiffness that Saginaw dealers feel disposed to apply to their backbone, and warrant the statement that prices are more likely to be better within the next thirty days.

Freights, though dull, have undergone no change since our last issue, and shingles and lath are substantially the same.

Editorially the *Gazette* says:

During the past week the railroads leading from the Saginaw Valley have reduced the rates on lumber \$8 per car to New York, Philadelphia, Boston and other points East. The old rates as compared with the new, on car lots of 8,000 feet green lumber, are as follows:

Being, as observed, a reduction of \$8 per car. Notwithstanding, there is a very material discrimination in favor of other points. The rates from Grand Rapids and Chicago to New York and other Eastern points are \$10 less than those from the Saginaw Valley (Bay City and Saginaw being the same), and from Detroit they are as follows: To New York, \$30 per car; Philadelphia, \$26; Boston, \$40, showing that the local rate from Saginaw to Detroit is \$16 per car. It would seem that our local dealers ought to have sufficient influence to do away with this discrimination against the Valley, which will have a tendency to destroy our retail trade.

The following from the *Lumberman and Manufacturer*:

MINNEAPOLIS, MINN., July 25, 1878.

Hot weather and harvest have had as little influence on trade as could have been anticipated. Chicago for the week ending July 22d shipped 10,307,000 feet, making a total of 288,258,732 feet since January 1st. While the receipts for the week were 41,770,000 feet and for the year 472,617,259 feet. At Dubuque 87 cars were shipped last week and at Minneapolis 222 cars. Shipments reported fair at Hannibal and St. Louis, but amounts not given; this is encouraging. The curious and inexplicable thing is the reported shading of prices at various markets, every one claiming that some other points are to blame and each individual satisfied that they were the last to break prices in their own market. A few of even the "bears" of Chicago are now willing to concede that she will not see anything like the amount of lumber this year which was handled there in 1877. The events of the month have been the storms on the Black and Chippewa rivers giving them a hope for a general drive and scaring the bottom out of the market. The rise was confined to the lower Black and Eau Claire rivers and did not extend to the upper Chippewa or Wisconsin rivers. The highest amount on the Wisconsin is reported at Mosinee at eighteen inches and thirty inches at Chippewa Falls. At Black River Falls the flood was seven feet and the logs run freely on Wednesday night, but a jam soon formed and the water dropped almost as suddenly as it came. The amount of logs which will be got out of these streams though, perhaps, important to many individuals can not effect general shortage and ought not to have any influence on prices anywhere.

The report of a decline in prices at Clinton which we noted last week as brought about by railway discrimination in favor of Chicago is confirmed. The struggle of Chicago to control the trade of Western Iowa and Nebraska by the assistance of the railways of Iowa is the great demoralizing element of the lum-

her business of the whole West, and will probably continue to be until the Canadian millennium shall come and the Michigan forests are no more. This keeps the West irritated because they cannot forget that it is only because they have to pay more for carrying freight a given distance over the railways of their own States than outsiders do, and for that reason have to surrender the business.

Logs worth from \$10 to \$13 and common lumber at from \$13 to \$14 on the Mississippi and Chicago shipping lumber through to Yankton and beyond is a volume in itself.

FOREIGN.

The London *Timber Trades Journal* of July 20th reports generally dull markets and concludes its London summary as follows:

With regard to the present tendency of trade we need say no more here than to refer our readers to the reports subjoined. There is no doubt a species of panic existing among large holders of timber in the London Docks, and if the foreign firms who have caused are desirous to allay it, let them keep their consignments as far as practicable out of the public sales. But better still would it be to refrain altogether from speculative shipments till our market exhibits a more favourable opportunity.

LIVERPOOL, July 17th, 1878.

Notwithstanding the moderate import that has reached this port, the market continues to become gradually weaker from day to day. The decline in many cases cannot well be generalized, nor the lower quotations made in figures, but the feeling is that it is prudent only to buy for present wants, and that the best way to protect one's own interest is not to reach out the hand further than it can safely be withdrawn. Shortly, the position is that few, if any, buyers have confidence in the present state of trade sufficient to justify transactions other than those made on the spot, and the more deeply this fact can sink into the hearts of shippers and manufacturers abroad, the better it will be for their peace of mind if they are able to withstand the pressure to make sales. Some late sales that have been made here would show that "consignment" spells "ruin," and this can best be illustrated by the fact that a parcel of New Orleans oak, 100 feet average, sold by auction, "without reserve," at an average of 17d. per foot. Spruce deals in the cargo may be quoted to-day at about 2*£* per standard for St. John, and other shipments in proportion.

The Canadian imports, which are few in number, have arrived to merchant's account, and sales have been confined to retail operations only, at prices which can barely cover cost. In pitch pine there is little doing, the import having expired for the season, and stock on hand being sufficient for the probable demand to the time of the next season.

GLASGOW.

The state of the market has not been improving lately, and shippers will no doubt find it advisable to keep their consignment on a very moderate scale till a better demand springs up.

Mr. James Brownlee, City Saw Mills, Port Dundas, held a public sale of timber, &c., at Greenock, on the 4th inst. The following is note of prices obtained:

Quebec waney boardwood, 1,300 feet per page, 2*s* per cubic foot; Quebec yellow pine timber, 1,000 feet per page, 1*s* 0*d* per cubic foot; Quebec red pine timber, 600 and \$60 feet per page, 1*s* 0*d* and 1*s* 2*d* per cubic foot.

The following mail advices (A. C. Nathan & Co.) are at hand from Rio Janeiro to July 5, 1878:

Pitch Pine Deals.—An advance of Rs. \$3000 per dozen was established on 15th ult., by the sale, to arrive, at \$3500 of two cargoes, viz.: 250,561 feet per Carrie Purrington from Wilmington, and 251,101 feet per Continental from Brunswick, both since arrived.

The further arrivals have been 398,088 feet per George Peake from Darien, sold at \$35000; 293,906 feet per Yubas and 255,735 feet per John Wesley from Brunswick, both consisting in the main portion of sleepers on order by our tram roads, the small surplus being sold at \$35000 for the former and \$36000 to-day for the latter.

The market continues very firm and a further advance in prices seems probable.

The cargo of a 150,000 feet just arrived per Pepillo from Fernandina via Pernambuco is not yet sold.

White Pine Lumber.—Has also improved and the only lot arrived, viz.: 99,261 feet per Lorena from New York, was sold at 90 reis per foot.

We quote 90 to 100 reis per foot according to quality.

NAILS.—Demand has in some cases been more active and it is likely that taken altogether, the distribution of stock increased somewhat. Business, however, lacks sufficient spirit to induce buoyancy, and values do not greatly improve. Indeed pretty much every seller adjusts price to suit the current situation, and there is more or less irregularity extant. The trade buy at about \$2.25 to \$2.30 for 10d., to 6d., but the regular card rates remain "nominally unchanged." We quote nominally: 10d. to 6d., common fence and sheathing per keg, \$2.40; 8d. and 9d., common do, per keg, \$2.65; 6d. and 7d., common do., per keg, \$2.90; 4d. and 5d., common do., per keg, \$3.15; 3d. and 4d., light, per keg, \$3.90; 3d., fine, per keg, \$4.65; 2d., per keg, \$4.65. Cut spikes, all sizes, \$2.85. Floor casing and box, 75c. above the same sizes of common. Finishing, \$1 above and fine finishing \$1.25 above.

OILS.—Business continues without unusual animation, but a steady call on the ordinary run of regular jobbing orders moves a fair amount of stock into consumption. Rates remain low but with a more steady tone. We quote: Linseed, about 56*c*. 58*c*. 2*p* gallon; lard, 55*c*. 57*c*. for winter; 51*c*. 53*c*. for No. 1, and 45*c*. 50*c*. for No. 2; crude cotton seed, 33*c*. 37*c*. and refined sunflower yellow, do., 48*c*. 49*c*.

PAINTS.—There does not appear to be many, if any, really new features on the general market. The importer and the manufacturer complain of a dull trade on pretty much all lines of goods, but admit an occasional order of fair magnitude, with reasonable prospects of more to come. Among the jobbers, however, the expression is a little more cheerful, and while operations are not on a liberal scale, they seem to be growing on most outlets. Stocks and assortments are equal to the calls made upon them, either as regards domestic or foreign goods, but the care shown on production and importation has prevented any heavy accumulation.

PITCH.—A slow sort of market continues, with little or no change on the general status of the position. Stocks are not full, but appear to be quite equal to all wants of the market, and owners willing to part with them at former rates. We quote at \$2.12*c*. 2*p* bbl. for city delivered.

SPIRITS TURPENTINE.—Operations in a wholesale way continue uncertain, and values fluctuate somewhat. For jobbing parcels a good fair demand has prevailed and on a pretty uniform line of cost, but wholesale parcels were offered with greater freedom and on easier terms. At the present writing the quotations stand at about 28*c*. 31*c*. according to quantity of stock handled.

TAR.—A good fair average distribution is reported on the regular outlets for jobbing and retail parcels, at a steady range of prices. The wholesale market, however, is uncertain, and, to some extent, nominal, though holders ask a little more. We quote at \$2.12*c*. 2*p* for Newbern and Washington, and \$2.25*c*. 2*p* for Wilmington.

CONVEYANCES.

Wherever the letters Q. C. and C. a. G. occur, preceded by the name of the grantee, they mean as follows: 1st—Q. C. is an abbreviation for *Quit Claim deed*, i.e., a deed in which all the right, title and interest of the grantor is conveyed, omitting all covenants or war-rants.

2d—C. a. G. means a deed containing *Covenant against Grantor only*, in which he covenants that he hath not done any act whereby the estate conveyed may be impeached, charged or incumbered.
