The shaking up which insurance companies have received during the last few years has not been unproductive of good results, evidence of which is shown by the steps recently made by the managers of the Equitable Life. A policy is now contestable after three years from its date, and this concession not only applies to all policies hereafter to be issued, but to those already issued and now in force.

### LEGAL DECISIONS.

#### EXCAVATIONS—ADJOINING OWNERS.

The Court of Appeals has decided that where an owner of property desires to deepen the cellar of his house and rebuild the cellar walls, and in so doing it becomes necessary to excavate below the existing foundation walls of an adjoining house, and more than ten feet below the street curb, he must assume the risks of injury resulting from such excavation to the wall of an adjoining owner. The burden is on the builder to protect it.

The fact that the owner of the property on which the excavation takes place enters into a contract with a third person (a contractor) to do the work, does not exempt him as owner from the performance of the duty imposed upon him by law. The owner of adjacent property must, however, afford the necessary license to the person causing the excavation to be made, to enter on his land in order to support the same.

#### REAL ESTATE IN CO-PARTNERSHIP—TITLE IN ONE DEFICIENCY JUDGMENT.

The same Court (of Appeals) has decided the following. Two persons entered into an oral agreement to purchase real estate and to take the title in the name of one who was to and did execute a mortgage for a part of the purchase money. Upon foreclosure of this mortgage a deficiency occurred. Held, that only the person named in the deed as grantee could be held liable for the deficiency, although a community of interest, and in some sense a partnership, existed between the grantee and his associate. That the name of the one grantee cannot stand or be regarded as the name of the firm, or that it represented anyone but himself upon the bond.

#### TAX SALE—HOW VACATED.

The Supreme Court, General Term, this week rendered a decision holding that the owner of land sold by the city for non-payment of taxes may move by petition, instead of going to the expense and trouble of a suit, to have the sale set aside where the proceedings upon which the sale was based are irregular and void. It is not necessary to give notice of the application to vacate the sale to the purchaser at the tax sale; a notice to the city being sufficient.

In the course of the opinion, the Court say—"The owner of the land has no relations arising from the proceedings of the character mentioned with any other person than the corporation of the city of New York. It is that body that undertook to sell the land, and the lessee must seek such remedy as he may have for injury sustained by him against it growing out of their unauthorized assumption of authority. It would be unjust to impose upon the owners of the land the obligation of resorting to a more formidable and expensive remedy, involving the pursuit of the unlawful lessee to remove an unjust and unlawful cloud upon their title. The buyer of property upon a sale for taxes and assessments must look to it that the sale is authorized by the law of the land, otherwise he buys it at his peril."

#### RIGHT OF CITY TO TRANSFER AWARD TO PAY ASSESSMENTS.

The Superior Court decides that the city has a right to transfer an award made to an owner of property for damage done by change of the grade of a street, to the payment of assessments which thereafter become due on the property. That the lien upon the property in respect to which the assessment was made is in the nature of a mortgage. Unless the lien was discharged it could be enforced by the city in default of payment and the premises sold, and for any deficiency after applying the proceeds of the sale the city could have execution against the owner.

### MARKET REVIEW.

#### REAL ESTATE MARKET.

No transactions of any magnitude occurred at the Exchange Salesroom during the week, the offerings being confined exclusively to foreclosure sales. The only noteworthy thing being that from the property sold, several parcels were to parties not in interest. Several important private sales have been consummated during the week. Messrs. E. H. Ludlow & Co. have sold eighty lots, belonging to the estate of the late Wm. T. Garner, situated on the east side of Sixth avenue, between One Hundred and Thirty-fifth and One Hundred and Thirty-seventh streets, to Henrietta Constable, for \$200,000. Sixteen of these lots are avenue lots, and the remaining ones, street lots. George Ehret has purchased from the Germania Life Insurance Company thirty lots in the block bounded by Eleventh and Riverside avenues, Ninety and Ninety-first streets, consideration, \$80,000. This property was sold under foreclosure in 1876 by the Germania Life Insurance Company to satisfy a mortgage, with interest and cost, amounting to \$89,000. The block, with the exception of four lots on Ninetieth street, north side, 200 feet west of Eleventh avenue, which were bought by J. B. Hyde for \$8,200, was bought in by the plaintiffs for \$67,150, and a deficiency judgment was filed for \$13,500. From this it will be seen that the transaction has been anything but a profitable one for the Insurance Company. Four lots (100 x100.5), on the southeast corner of Madison avenue and Sixty-fourth street, have been sold for \$60,000.

The New York Loan & Improvement Company has purchased the charter for the construction of the tunnel under the Hudson River. It is understood that the plans contemplate the building of a tunnel large enough to accommodate the traffic of every line of railroad now terminating in Jersey City. It will be well for real estate operators to take into consideration the effect which the completion of this stupendous work may have on real estate values, both in this and our Jersey suburbs.

Plans, embracing fifty-eight buildings, to be erected at an estimated cost of \$462,000, have been filed during the week. Fifty of said buildings will be erected east of Third avenue, between Sixty-sixth and Eighty-sixth streets.

Attention is directed to the advertisement on the second page of the partition sale of valuable property in the Second, Seventh, Tenth, Fourteenth and Nineteenth Wards. This sale was advertised last week to take place July 1st, but, owing to the illness of the auctioneer, the sale was adjourned. The title to this property is undoubted. To purchasers of fine residence property, the two houses on Seventy-third street, between Fifth and Madison avenues, offers unusual inducements, as it is probable that they can be bought at this sale for a much less price than it would be possible to buy the vacant lots and erect residences of equal value. The valuable water front on Avenue A and Sixty-second street should bring a good price. Investors in business property should by all means look into this property.

## BUILDING MATERIAL MARKET.

**BRICKS.**—Owing to the holiday this has naturally been a short and broken week with business somewhat irregular. A portion of the buyers were anxious to anticipate their wants to some extent and others preferred waiting until next week, but, on the whole, the actual demand was fair and the greater portion of the offering found sale without much difficulty. Receipts were somewhat reduced also as most captains and crews of vessels in the trade reside along the river and they were, as a rule, anxious to be at home during the "Fourth" and postponed trips accordingly. On prices the tone remained steady for all grades and full former figures may be considered as well supported with a small fractional advance in some cases obtained. The accounts from manufacturing points continue much the same a great many of the yards being without a full complement of hands and the production claimed to be even smaller than was really intended by the combination. Fronts are in good average demand and values rule steady at previous figures. We quote Pale, \$1.50@2.75; Hards, Jerseys \$1.50@5.00; Up-Rivers, \$5.00@6.25; Haverstraw Bay, \$5.37@6.5.75; favorite brands, \$6.00; Fronts, Croton-Brown, \$7.50@9.00; dark, \$8.00@9.00; red, \$9.00@\$9.12½; Philadelphia, \$36.75; Trenton, \$24@29; Baltimore, \$31@33. Yard prices, delivery included, \$2.00@3.00 higher on ordinary and \$5.00@6.00 on fronts.

**HARDWARE.**—No change of a decided character can be advised on the general situation of this market. A few of the dealers are filling up an invoice or so of considerable size, but most of the demand comes in the form of small orders, and business in the aggregate is not active. Very little, however, could be expected this week, and it will probably be well on toward the close of the month before business picks up again to any noticeable extent. The list of discounts on Edge Tools given in our last was that of the Barton Tool Company not the "Boston" as the type had it. There is now some overhauling of lists, but not many radical changes are expected. At recent meeting of manufacturers they resolved upon a new list for Vises and Tools, with the following discounts.—Solid Box Vises, 35 per cent., Vise Boxes and Screws, 10 per cent., Mattocks, Hoes and Picks, 40 per cent., Sledges, Hammers, &c., 40 per cent., Cast Vises 25 per cent., and Rapid Transit Vises 15 per cent.

**LATH.**—Receivers still appear to entertain a fair amount of confidence in the general situation of the market, and are hopeful of the future according to expressed views. They have not made many remarkable gains of late, however, and it has been demonstrated that one or two extra-sized cargoes continue to form a surpluseage of stock afloat through which buyers are very likely to gain an advantage. The consumption is quite as promising as ever and there is not much of an accumulation in second hands, but dealers generally seem quite satisfied when they have stock enough to carry them through immediate wants and will not anticipate. On the sales most recently reported quotations remain at \$1.35@1.40 per M.

**LIME.**—Demand has continued sufficient to about exhaust all the stock of desirable quality as it became available and on a basis of former rates, the position ruling nominally steady. The small shipments making in this direction, however, and the gradual distribution of the stocks held by dealers are two elements which appear to be working for the formation of a better market, and we note an undertone of greater confidence in the near-by future. Up to the closing of this report, no change on prices is announced.

**LUMBER.**—Some showing of irregularity is made, but it appears to be principally upon goods dependent upon an "outside" demand. So far as the run of standard styles, sizes and qualities adapted to local consumption is concerned the movement continues pretty free, and the market in the cheerful condition to which we have before alluded. The few recent gains made on value are very well sus-

tained with a promise of further addition in some cases, and the sales of desirable offerings are close up to the amount available, with an outlet for more. Naturally, business has been somewhat broken this week, but enough was done to indicate a good, general status for the market. Export movements on the whole are fair, with recent advices from South America encouraging, but West India accounts somewhat doubtful. As an indication of the change for the better on our lumber market we notice that some of the old fogey, so-called commercial papers are waking up to the fact that such a market does exist, and regale their readers with some wonderful stories of the condition of affairs present and to come. As a matter of course they have fallen into the traps of the speculative inclined portion of the trade, and take a very buoyant view of values.

Spruce continues to favor the selling interest as a general thing. The supply in yard is not large, some dealers being short of the amount required to meet their contracts, and must needs replenish as soon as possible, while others, probably the majority, have enough faith in the future consumption of the present season, to negotiate with some freedom on desirable offerings. It has been a bad week to place randoms, and some concessions, it is said, took place. There is nothing, however, to warrant a change on the general line of values. We quote at \$10.50@11.25 for random, possibly \$11.50@11.75 for choice lengths in small cargoes, and \$12.00@13.00 for specials, the extreme for extra difficult.

White pine is somewhat more plenty, delayed parcels having come to hand and more recent purchases under promise of quick shipment and delivery, giving dealers a fair stock. None have accumulated liberally, however, and some of the parcels here are understood to be consignments held on a limit above present possibilities. The home movement is small, but a few very good shipping orders were closed. We quote at \$14.25@15.00 per M for West India shipping board; \$17.50@21.00 for South American do.; 14@15 for box board; \$16@17 for do. wide and sound, and timber to order at \$38@50 per M.

Yellow Pine retains a good, firm market, and dealers are quite confident. The new contracts making at the moment are not very large, owing to the additional cost asked and the uncertainty of delivery, but buyers are interested and in many cases must ultimately close on the terms of sellers. As before noted, freight charges are now very full, beside which the approach of the cotton season always diverts many vessels, and some captains and crews refuse the southern voyage entirely during the warm weather, which would seem to indicate a continued scarcity of transportation facilities. Deliveries on contract have of late been fair. We quote random cargoes at about \$18@22 per M.; ordered cargoes, \$22@24 do.; green flooring boards, \$20@21 do., and dry do. \$20@23. Cargoes at the South \$13@14.50 per M.; hewed timber, \$7.50@14.

Shingles remain about steady in price, and the general movement has been fair. The export demand will not as a rule take very large invoices, but the number of small ones under contract is sufficient to make a good showing, and home orders are if anything rather more plenty. Cypress are selling at about \$6 for saps and \$8.50@9.00 for hearts; pine shipping stocks, \$4 for 18-inch, and Eastern saw grades at \$8.50@14.50 for 16-inch, as to quality and quantity. Machine dressed cedar shingles quoted as follows: For 30 inch, \$16@22.25 for A and \$28.75@33.25 for No. 1; for 24-inch, \$6.50@16 for A and \$16.75@23 for No. 1; for 20-inch, \$5@10.50 for A, and \$11.25@15.75 for No. 1.

Hardwoods are well supported in price where quality is good, and the demand may also be called quite encouraging. Manufacturing of all kinds, but especially cabinet work, etc., in its various branches, is consuming a considerable amount of stock, and seeks a fair proportion of it here, the experiment of buying direct from the primary not having been as successful with many manufacturers as they had anticipated. The wants of our market, however, cannot be supplied with second and third rate stuff, and interior shippers who endeavor to crowd such in, may expect very cold treatment from the prevailing demand. Export lots continue to pass through to a fair extent. We quote at wholesale rates by car load about as follows: Walnut \$7@85 per M.; ash, \$33@36 do.; oak, \$35@40 do.; maple, \$30@35; chestnut, 1st and 2d, \$30@35 do. do., culls, \$18@20 do.; cherry, \$45@75 do.; white wood, 1½ and 2½ inch, \$25@27.50, and do. inc. \$33@35 do.; hickory, \$35@45 do. for Western, and \$45@75 for good nearby stock.

At the yards there has not been a very heavy movement this week, and no new features of special interest to advise. The accumulations are small, but in some cases commence to fill up.

## GENERAL LUMBER NOTES.

## STATE.

## ALBANY LUMBER MARKET.

The *Argus* reports for the week ending July 1, 1879:

There has been a fair trade throughout the District in pine lumber since our last report. To-day we have had a good attendance of buyers, including parties from New York, from Brooklyn and from the down river towns. Among the sales of round lots of pine lumber recently made we notice one made to-day to a Philadelphia party covering 400,000 feet dry clear lumber on p. t. but understood to be at the top of the market. The stock of clear dry lumber is running low. Orders in this market from Philadelphia, which has almost all of its supplies by rail, points significantly to the fact that Albany is now their best market. The receipts of lumber at Albany for the last week in June were the largest of any week this season, and foot up over 17,000,000 feet. Stocks, save of dry clear, are ample and fairly assorted.

Coarse lumber is still in moderate receipt with a good trade at steady prices.

The Saginaw *Gazette* of a recent date says: Nothing has occurred during the week to disturb the steady tone of the market on the river and no combination of circumstances seems likely to be effected which can reduce prices. The choice dry lumber has mostly all been picked up, and green is being sold at a pretty lively rate. No change in prices is looked for until after the heated term, when a slight advance is anticipated. Green lumber remains steady at \$5, \$10 and \$25 for good stocks. A little more has to be paid for extra good, while inferior stock can be bought at 25 to 50 cents less on upper grades. Dry ranges from \$5.25, \$10.25 and \$25 to \$5.50, \$10.50 and \$25. The shipments by water for the past week have been very large, aggregating nearly 33,000,000 feet. Sales six lots ranging from 100,000 to 500,000 feet at \$5, \$10 and \$25 for green; 2,400,000 feet to Albany at \$5, \$10 and \$25.

At Ottawa on the 29th ult. lumber trade pretty lively; demand very good; shipments brisk.

The receipts at Chicago from January 1st to June 21st are 412,700,000 feet of lumber, against 333,919,000 feet for a corresponding period in 1878. The shipments, 283,726,000 feet, against 215,133,000 feet.

The receipts of lumber at Tonawanda during the week have been 12,131,000 feet; the shipments therefrom by canal, 7,999,000 feet, almost all to Albany. The receipts at Buffalo for the week by Lake, 10,129,000 feet and 49 cars by the Lake Shore Railroad.

At Oswego the week's receipts of lumber by lake are reported at 2,844,000 feet; the shipments by canal were 2,460,000 feet.

The receipts at Albany by canal, from the opening of navigation to July 1st, are:

Freights from Bay City to Tonawanda are placed at \$1.50 per M. feet; from Tonawanda to Albany, \$1.75; from Oswego to Albany, \$1.45. Lake Ontario freights to Oswego, 6c. From Ottawa to Whitehall, \$1.90, and from Whitehall to Albany, 85c.

The heavy importation of lumber this season from Canada is telling finely on the Champlain Canal revenues received at Whitehall. Collector Wilkins's report for the week ending June 21st: Boats cleared, 183; tolls received, \$1,201.71. Last year: Boats cleared, 109; tolls collected, \$651.72. Total tolls this season to that date, \$5,109.98; last year, \$4,996.70. At Fort Edward, Collector Satterlee reports for week ending June 22d: Boats cleared, 64; tolls collected, \$305.73. Last year: Boats cleared, 83; tolls collected, \$333.13.

## THE WEST.

## Special correspondence of THE REAL ESTATE RECORD.

CHICAGO, July 1, 1879.

The cargo market opened up very quietly this week, and there has yet been no improvement in the situation. Yesterday's arrivals aggregated upwards of 12,000,000 feet, a goodly proportion of which is now lying at the Franklin street docks for sale. This week, for obvious reasons, is considered about the worst in the whole season for sellers, and with the large supply they have on their hands they do not find the outlook very encouraging. There are no country buyers in town to speak of, and local operators are not very well represented on the market.

Lumber to day is weaker than it has been for several weeks. Standard dimension, though nominally held at \$6.25, has been selling for some time at \$6.12 $\frac{1}{2}$ , and it is said by some buyers that purchases were made this morning as low as \$6.00. The commission men, as is their habit, refuse to quote such sales, for fear that they will have a tendency to make the market weaker, but it is impossible, notwithstanding, to conceal the fact that the actual selling prices of lumber are lower than the published quotations. Inch lumber is very dull and weak, though prices remain nominally without change. The supply is almost wholly of the common grades, which being in limited request sell slowly. There is a fair demand for shingles and lath, and with moderate offerings prices remain as previously given. There has been no dry stock of any account on the market since last report, and there are therefore no prices to quote. The dry lumber arrivals as far as they are made up of lumber wintered over at the mills, are about over for this season, nearly all of this kind of stock having been sold.

I append corrected quotations, which, as in the case of all those lately given, will have to be taken with some allowance:

Nothing can be said definitely regarding the future. For the present week, anyway, the market is certain to be exceedingly dull and weak, and how long such a condition will hold it is impossible to say. Judging from present appearances, the chances are that the situation, if it changes at all, will not change for better. The receipts are already more than 100,000,000 feet in excess of the same to this date last year, and there is no ground for any hope that the production will drop off. It is to be feared, I think, that the worst of the season has yet to come.

The shipments of lumber from the city continue to run largely ahead of previous years, in spite of the complaints made by dealers that their orders from the country are falling off. The excess over last year is already over 45,000,000 feet, and it is increasing every day. However, this figure, large as it is, lacks nearly 50 per cent. of telling the whole truth. Actually, the gain is much nearer 70,000,000 feet, which fact, I submit, shows a very marked improvement in the volume of business. The supply of dry stocks is much smaller than ordinarily, many operators claiming that they cannot fill a common order without calling largely on their neighbors for assortments. The monthly statement of stock in hand, for this reason, is looked for with more than usual interest, it being the general impression that the showing will be an exceedingly favorable one for this market. It is rumored that a move will soon be made looking toward an advance in yard prices, but nothing definite regarding it has yet transpired. It cannot be said that any such action is likely to be taken, desirable though it would be, the fact that western producing sections are heavily stocked with logs that are almost certain to be manufactured and sent to market this season forming an obstacle in the way which it will be well nigh impossible to surmount.

The Chicago *Inter-Ocean* of June 30th has the following:

A few days since we stated that recent figures and estimates from the lumber districts of the Mississippi and tributaries were such as to materially lower the former estimates as to the supply of lumber to be produced in those quarters the current year. That statement is nearing additional confirmation from letters received from there during the past twenty-four hours. A gentleman well known in lumber circles here, but at present a resident of the chief lumber points on the Chippewa, writes that the supply from that river will fall 200,000,000 feet below the estimate of a month or six weeks ago. The Black River, which early in the season was put down as good for 375,000,000 feet, is now reduced to 125,000,000 feet. The falling off is partly due to a lack of water, which prevented many of the logs banked from being rafted. The early estimates were also partly based on the first scalings of logs that have been "hung up" for two or three years. These logs, when cut, are found to be greatly deteriorated; hence there is a great waste in sawing, and the discrepancy between the scaling and actual product of lumber is very large. The large increase in the population by immigration to the country which draws its chief supply of lumber from those sources will also add materially to the consumption, and this will, in the end, prove an important factor in influencing prices.

The following from the *Lumberman and Manufacturer*:

MINNEAPOLIS, MINN., June 26, 1879.

The demand for lumber continues large, especially for timber and heavy dimension, which the mills of the Northwest are turning out as rapidly as they can reach the logs fit to make it of. The demand for this class of goods is unprecedented. There are no changes in prices at any western point, and but little if any cutting on current quotations.

The pressure at Chicago begins to tell in spite of the indomitable courage and large trade of its lumbermen, the receipts being nearly one hundred and thirty million feet in excess of the reported shipments, and seemingly on the increase. The reports from there, from day to day, are about all of the same tenor, a sample of which we take from the *Inter-Ocean* of the 25th:

"The receipts to-day were only fair, not excessive. The demand, however, was light, city buyers being more or less deterred from buying by reports that the lumber 'shovers' were about to strike for an advance in wages. The country demand was also limited, only a few buyers being present. The sales, so far as reported, were at about Saturday's prices. The demand heretofore noted for good grades of any lumber still continues, indicating that the stock is wanted for immediate consumption. Advice from east shore ports report Eastern buyers in those markets, and dry stock becoming scarce. There is, however, no reason to look for an improvement in cargo prices here so long as the supply continues to exceed the demand. High grades and dry stock will also be first to feel the effect of a change for the better, from the fact that they are likely to be scarce for some time to come. Current prices were as follows: Menominie and Ludington piece stuff, \$6.25@6.50 per M. for green, \$7.25@7.50 for fairly dry, and \$7.75@8.00 for extra dry; White Lake at \$6.12 $\frac{1}{2}$ @6.25 for green, \$6.75@7.25 for fair to extra dry; coarse and irregular green, \$6. green cull boards at \$6.50@7.00. Business at the yards was fair and prices unchanged, high grades and dry stock being firmly held, and common to fair green, weak."

The great dams on the Chippewa were shut down last week, and came near drying up the river. The logs were all rafted out of Beef Slough last Friday, and operations were suspended until more logs could be floated down from the upper river. The company are confident they can do this at any stage of water. The Eau Claire mills on the Chippewa have a month's stock of logs now on hand.

The Black River is too low to handle logs in until there comes more rain. The Wausau mills are turning out 3,000,000 feet of lumber per week, and all the other mills on the Wisconsin are running to their capacity. Some trouble is brewing between mill men on the river below and the Wausau boomers over the turning out of logs, and an action has been commenced to vacate the charter.

The St. Croix is selling quite an amount of logs at fair prices, especially for long stuff. The drives on this river, with the exception of Snake River, are in, and the water keeps at a fair stage, enabling the boom company to turn out rapidly.

#### FOREIGN.

The recent mail advices from Rio de Janeiro reported as follows:

Pitch Pine Deals.—There have been no arrivals. The market remains firm with a good demand, and \$35,000 per dozen is being offered for cargoes to arrive.

White Pine Lumber.—Our market is almost bare, there having been no arrivals since April 23d. The latest cable advices from the United States, however, report heavy shipments on the way.

On the spot, 120 reis per foot would be obtainable.

METALS.—COPPER.—Ingots have again sold slowly and principally in small parcels, as wanted for immediate and positive use. Stocks, however, appear to be under pretty close and careful control, and holders, firm. We quote at 16 $\frac{1}{2}$ @16 $\frac{1}{2}$ ¢ per lb. cash for Lake. Manufactured Copper, is in fair average demand and steady at combination rates. We quote as follows: Brazier's Copper, ordinary size over 16 oz. per sq. foot, 24¢ per lb.; do. do. do. 16 oz. and over 12 oz. per sq. foot, 26¢ per lb.; do. do. 10 and 12 oz. per sq. foot, 28¢ per lb.; do. do. lighter than 10 oz. per sq. foot, 30¢ per lb.; circles, less than 81 inches in diameter, 25¢ per lb.; do. 81 inches in diameter and over, 30¢ per lb.; segment and pattern sheets, 27¢ per lb.; locomotive fire box sheets, 24¢ per lb.; Sheathing Copper, over 12 oz. per sq. foot, 22¢ per lb., and Bolt Copper 24¢ per lb. Iron—Scotch Pig is held with steadiness, but owners do not care to advance the price, owing to a fear of drawing increased importations upon the market. We quote at \$19,000@21.50 according to brand and quantity handled. American Pig has found a better demand both for immediate and future delivery, and the market generally gains tone and character. Some of the companies are sold a long way ahead, and will not listen to present prices. We quote at \$17.50@19.00 for No. 1 per ton, \$16.50@17.50 for No. 2, and \$15.50@16.00 for Forge. Rails have found increased orders, some of them extending into next year, and the market retains an extremely firm tone all around. Sellers, however, meet the call readily so far. We quote at \$31,000, \$36.00 for new iron, and \$11.00@16.00 for steel, according to delivery. Old Rails \$23.00@21.00 per ton; scrap, \$23.00@21.50. Manufactured iron not selling very freely owing to the unsettled condition of the market. An attempt has been made to increase the cost, but competition was too sharp for success. Common merchant bar quoted in round lots at 17¢, and Refined at 19¢, but for ten-ton lots from store, 17 $\frac{1}{2}$ ¢ and 2¢ are respectively asked. Common

sheet, 2 60 $\frac{1}{2}$ .8¢, and best R. G. American, 31 $\frac{1}{2}$  4.8¢, from store. Lead—Domestic Pig has found a very good demand, and while there was stock enough for the outlet holders manifested no hurry to part with it, except at fall figure which are now somewhat higher. We quote at 47 $\frac{1}{2}$  4.8¢. The manufacturers of lead are steady and quoted: Bar 5¢, Pipe 5¢, and Sheet 6¢, less the usual discount to the trade; and Tin-lined Pipe 12¢, Block Tin Pipe 30¢, on same terms. Tin—Pig setting in the main on small jobbing orders, and not going out to a heavy aggregate. Former rates obtained, however, and prices ruling steady. We quote at 17.50@18¢ for Bancu, 15 $\frac{1}{2}$  15.5¢ for Straits, 15.5@16.5¢ for English refined, and 14 $\frac{1}{2}$  15¢ for do. common. Tin Plates have been dull, and without new features of a decided character. Spelter rather slow but under good control and firm at 47 $\frac{1}{2}$  5¢, according to quantity, brand, etc. Sheet Zinc steady and fairly active at 60 $\frac{1}{2}$  3¢ for lots from store.

NAILS.—Business has rather a quiet tone and to a large extent, is confined to the ordinary run of jobbing trade orders. A few calls came to hand from the interior and there is a light export demand, but they make no important addition to the general movement. The Supply is full enough for all wants and value nominally unchanged. We quote on a basis of \$2.25 per keg for 10d to 60d.

OILS.—A limited demand prevails with no new features of special interest. On first hand parcels a little irregularity in price is occasionally shown but jobbers carry the position about steady. We quote at 47 $\frac{1}{2}$  6¢ for linseed oil.

PAINTS.—Distribution is moderate and confined principally to small purchases on local account or through mail orders for standard goods. The condition of affairs, however, is seasonable and dealers having adjusted their stocks to the situation retain fair control and preserve a steady tone on values.

PITCH.—Operations are slow and somewhat uncertain with very little life shown on the general market. Stocks are not pressing for an outlet, however, and are held for about former cost. We quote at \$1.75@1.87 $\frac{1}{2}$  per lb. for city delivered.

SPIRITS TURPENTINE.—Demand has been somewhat irregular in a wholesale way and comparatively light for jobbing parcels, though probably as much as usual doing for the season. Prices hardly so firm, but without positive change. As this report is closed the quotations stand about 27 $\frac{1}{2}$  28¢ per gallon, according to the quantity of stock handled.

TAR.—The demand has a moderately active tone, but is without features of unusual interest. Supplies equal most calls, though not full enough to cause pressure, and are held steadily for pretty much former rates in all cases. We quote at \$1.40@1.75 per lb. for Newberne and Washington, and \$1.60@1.87 for Wilmington, according to size of invoice.

## CONVEYANCES.

Wherever the letters *Q. C. and C. a. G.* occur, preceded by the name of the grantee, they mean as follows: *1st—Q. C.* is an abbreviation for *Quit Claim deed*; i.e., a deed in which all the right, title and interest of the grantor is conveyed, omitting all covenants or warrents.

*2d—C. a. G.* means a deed containing *Covenant against Grantor only*, in which he covenants that he hath not done any act whereby the estate conveyed may be impeached, charged or incumbered.


