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LEGAL DECISIONS.

CITY—WHEN ESTOPPED FROM DENYING CONTRACT  
BY REASON OF MERE IRREGULARITY.

The Court of Appeals has decided the following case. An action was brought against the city for work, labor and services and materials furnished, under a contract. The defense among other things, claimed that the resolution, authorizing the improvement was not published in all the newspapers shown to be employed by the corporation as was required by law. The Court in its opinion say: "Individuals dealing with municipal authorities may, without incurring extra hazard, assume that the acts of the general governing body within their general powers, which are published, represented, and held out as valid, with invitations to individuals to enter into engagements and expend money and labor on the faith of them, are in fact as represented, and to deal upon the faith of such assumption, and the corporation having received the fruits of engagements entered into on the faith of such representations should be estopped from alleging a mere irregularity to avoid them." \* \* \* It is not allowable for a municipal corporation to perpetrate a fraud upon those contracting with it upon the faith of its laws and ordinances apparently valid and represented as such, by repudiating them upon the allegation of some technical and formal irregularity in their adoption, an omission of some collateral act, some formality prescribed by statute, not of the substance of the power or jurisdictional in its character."

ENDORSEMENT OF PROMISSORY NOTE BY MARRIED WOMEN.

The same Court (of Appeals) has decided that where a married woman endorses the note of her husband, as follows, "I hereby charge my separate and personal estate for the payment of the within note," and the note so endorsed is delivered to a national bank, the endorsement is not a mortgage in any sense, and does not conflict with the national banking act, which prohibits a national bank from taking a mortgage on real estate to secure a loan made on the faith thereof. The endorsement did not have the effect of conveying any property, or of giving any specific or general lien upon any property, but merely created against the married woman a liability which could be enforced as if she were a *feme sole*.

CHATTEL MORTGAGE—HOW PROPERTY TO BE SOLD.

The Supreme Court of Minnesota has decided the following:

Where a mortgagee of chattels forecloses under a power of sale contained in the mortgage, he stands, with respect to the mortgagor's right in the property, in the position of a trustee, and is held to the exercise of good faith and proper care and diligence to avoid any sacrifice of those rights not necessary to the reasonable enforcement of his own.

Although the mortgage covers much more property than is necessary to his security, he may, under his mortgage for his security, take possession of the whole; but if, without prejudice or great inconvenience to himself, he can satisfy his debt by a sale of part, he is, if the interests of the mortgagor requires it, bound so to sell. If he unnecessarily sells the whole of the mortgaged property, he is liable to the mortgagor for the

damages sustained by him through such oppressive use of the power of sale.

LANDLORD AND TENANT—WHAT NOT SUFFICIENT  
TO CONSTITUTE SURRENDER.

In an action for rent, under a lease, the tenant alleged that he had removed before the end of the term, and that the landlord thereupon took possession of the premises, made certain repairs, and built a new bath room, a new porch, new range, and certain other repairs which could not have been made while the house was occupied by a tenant, and the landlord also advertised the house to rent. Held, by the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania that all these acts were done in the interest and for the benefit of the tenant, and do not discharge him from his covenant to pay rent.

REAL ESTATE MARKET.

At the Exchange Salesroom, transactions during the week have been few in number and unimportant in character. For the coming week, thirteen foreclosure sales are announced, which is the smallest number it has been our duty to report for some years. The following private sales have been made:

Since our last report a large number of important assessment lists have been received for collection in the Bureau of Assessments, and also assessment lists which have been received by the Board of Assessors from the Commissioner of Public Works, details of which will be found in our columns.

Nineteen plans, embracing twenty-eight buildings, cost \$643,972, have been filed with the Superintendent of Buildings. Among the plans filed is one for the erection of the Union League Club House, 84x165, on the northeast corner of Fifth avenue and Thirty-ninth street, cost \$350,000. At No. 8 East Fourteenth street, a five-story iron store will be erected, cost \$15,000; and on the west side of Lexington avenue, between One Hundred and Fifth and One Hundred and Sixth streets, the City of New York will erect a four-story brick school, cost \$53,632.

BUILDING MATERIAL MARKET.

BRICKS.—The general condition of the market for Common Hards remain much the same as last week. Demand is good and quick from all quarters, and not only exhausts but anticipates the supply, while values continue on a steady upward turn throughout. Manufacturers still appear unable to bring their production up to a point sufficient to meet current consumption, and, according to reports made to us, a great many more cargoes could be placed than are likely to become available for some time ahead. Indeed, so difficult has it been at times to secure stock that some of the principal contractors were compelled to temporarily suspend work for want of brick. Of course, prices have shown some irregularity, as the requirements of buyers would occasionally induce them to name a premium, but on the average, cost appears to have enhanced about 25 per cent since our last writing, and closes with a firm tone on all grades. Choice stock naturally meets with the most favor, but the eagerness of the demand for "some kind of brick" has induced extreme bids on very ordinary quality in a few instances. Of Pale Brick the sale has been fully up to supply, with prices very firmly supported. Fronts are in demand, and, as a rule, quoted steady, but figures may be considered to some extent nominal. We quote Pale, 30 M. \$2.87@3.00; Hards, Jerseys \$5 00@5.37 1/2; Up-Rivers, \$5.37 1/2@5.75; Haverstraw bay, \$6.00@6.25; favorite brands, \$6.50@6.75; Fronts, Croton—Brown, \$7.50@9.00; dark, \$8.00@9.00; red, \$9.00@9.12 1/2; Philadelphia, \$26@28; Trenton, \$24@29; Baltimore, \$34@38. Yard prices, delivery included, \$2.00@3.00 higher on ordinary and \$5.00@6.00 on fronts.

GLASS.—On all kinds the amount of wholesale business is small, and importers and manufacturers, as a rule, complain of the condition of trade. There is to be found some exceptions, who speak in glowing terms of the market, but it is mostly what they expect in the future rather than anything they can accomplish now. Our local jobbing trade keeps up very well, and dealers who make this a specialty really seem to have a claim for a fair volume of operations. Stocks on hand are equal to the call, but are

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becoming reduced, and the prospect for early additions is said to be rather poor. On prices much irregularity is shown, but as the majority of quotations are given "about as before," we make no alterations in our figures. Advices from the interior indicate small accumulations in the hands of distributors. At a convention of Window Glass manufacturers recently held in Cleveland, it was agreed to keep the factories closed three months instead of two this year, and to advance the price to 75  $\frac{1}{2}$  cent. for car lots, and 70 and 10 for smaller parcels.

**HARDWARE.**—The general volume of operations continues moderate, but is apparently slowly on the increase, and dealers feel correspondingly encouraged. There is almost positive assurance of good, full local wants, and the advices from the interior seem to indicate that the assortments are reduced, with every reason to believe that deficiencies will be made good at an early day. The changes made in the line of valuations are few and of moderate character, with the average undertone pretty steady. The manufacturers of Bolts and Nuts have issued a slightly higher price list, from which a discount of 70  $\frac{1}{2}$  cent. is allowed on Machine Bolts, Bolt Ends, Forged Set Screws and Tap Bolts, Wood or Log Screws and Slein Screws. It was also agreed that hereafter all Machine Bolts and Log Screws up to twenty inches should be sold by the 100 instead of by the pound, as formerly.

**LATH.**—The market has again shown a little irregularity but, on the whole, the general undertone was encouraging and the average tendency in buyers' favor. Quite a full supply came to hand but all appeared to find custom and bids were afterward making on parcels to arrive with receivers not much inclined to negotiate. Indeed, the actual consumption of lath has now commenced and as jobbing dealers see the impression made upon their accumulations they become more anxious for renewals of stock, and some who were heretofore very indifferent have crept up to, or more per M. on bids during the week. The demand has been both from local and out-of-town sources. Taken altogether, the present position looks promising for the selling interest and receivers entertain great expectations of the advantages they are to gain "as soon as the present fleet is out of the way." As we write \$1.40 is asked and sellers say they are very firm at this.

**LIME.**—No new developments have been made up to the writing of this report. Former figures are generally named when a quotation is asked for, but the entire situation at the moment is nominal, and really no basis exists for close rates. Stocks in yard commence to show animation in some cases, but only small quantities are ordered forward from primary points, either Eastern or State.

**LUMBER.**—Everything appears to be progressing in a favorable manner on our lumber market, and few expressions of positive dissatisfaction are heard. Occasionally there is a little grumbling because values are not more on the "booming" order, but this is the exception, and comes from that portion of the trade who always appear ready to pull the market on the slightest provocation, and take no thought of the future. The great majority, however, feel convinced that the small margin they have accepted, staked and sustained the demand this season, which has already exhausted liberal quantities of dry lumber, and promises to sustain the average to the very close of navigation. A feature, which seems to be substantiated by ample testimony, is the small and poor assortments in second and third hands. This shows that the large amount of lumber already handled has found shipment or consumption, and beside what may be further required on the same outlets the dealer has also to secure his supply. The export trade has some uncertain features, but, on the whole, may be accepted as favorable. Taken altogether we find a very generally healthful strain throughout the entire market, with a feeling of confidence among the members of the trade, respecting the next five months, which would seem to indicate that 1879 is to be the hard-pan year so long looked for.

Beyond such ordinary variations as may occur under greater or smaller amounts seeking sale, the market for Eastern Spruce undergoes no change. Demand occasionally appears somewhat cautious, but still affords an outlet for all that comes to hand and receivers are in some cases sold ahead. Of desirable goods there is said to be scarcely any accumulation in yard here or in Brooklyn, and we understand that owing to the slow careful manner in which they have been operating dealers along the "Sound" are almost bare of stock. Arrivals have been fair but largely on contract. We quote at \$10.50 @ 11.25 for random, possibly \$11.50 @ 11.75 for choice lengths in small cargoes, and \$12.00 @ 13.00 for specials, the extreme for extra difficult.

White Pine continues without buoyancy but is sustained at former valuations and selling well. The export orders, as a matter of course, form a liberal portion of the basis of business, but a considerable amount is done on local account and we understand some of the largest manufacturers of boxes, etc., have this season purchased on our market with more than the usual freedom. Arrivals are fair but accumulations do not greatly increase. We quote at \$14.00 @ 15.00 per M for West India shipping board; \$18.00 @ 20.00 for South American do.; \$12 @ 14 for box board; \$15 @ 16 for do, wide and sound, and timber to order at \$33 @ 45 per M.

Yellow Pine has a firm and encouraging market in the various forms of contract agents continu-

to place quite a liberal amount of stock. Advices from the South report the mills as full of orders and freights firm with a not over-abundant supply of vessels available. We quote random cargoes at about \$18 @ 22 per M.; ordered cargoes, \$22 @ 24 do.; green flooring boards, \$20 @ 21 do., and dry do. do., \$20 @ 23. Cargoes at the South \$13 @ 14.50 per M.: hewed timber, \$7.50 @ 14.

Hardwoods have found about an average demand on all the leading styles, and a pretty firm and well sustained market. Supplies are not over full, and the assortment is somewhat broken, giving an advantage to holders of really fine stock. Parcels for export continue to pass through and an occasional order is filled here. We quote at wholesale rates by car-load about as follows: Walnut \$7 @ 85 per M.; ash, \$33 @ 38 do.; oak, \$35 @ 40 do.; maple, \$30 @ 35; chestnut, 1st and 2d, \$30 @ 35; do. do., culls, \$18 @ 20 do.; cherry, \$45 @ 75 do.; white wood, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$  and 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  inch, \$25 @ 27.50, and do. inch \$33 @ 35 do.; hickory, \$35 @ 45 do. for Western, and \$35 @ 75 for good nearby stock.

Among the yards there is a good, fair volume of trade, the distribution causing an ordinary run of goods, and the cost very much the same as for some time past, but the usual variations occur, according to amount, terms, etc.

B., to Marseilles, deals, 65s.; a schr., 265 tons, hence to Port Spain, white pine lumber, \$5.50; a schr., 327 tons, hence to Porto Cabello, white pine lumber, \$6.75; a schr., 126 tons, from Jacksonville to St. Pierre, Martinique, lumber, \$10.50, option of Fort de France 50c. extra, to discharge at one port; Br. barque, 600 M. lumber, from Pensacola to Rio Janeiro, \$18 net; a barque, 350 M. lumber, from Brunswick to Rio Janeiro, \$19 net; a schr., 275 M. dry boards, from Fernandina to Washington, D. C., \$6; a brig, 280 M. lumber, from Pascagoula to Danversport, Mass., \$9; a schr., 143 tons, hence to Charleston, stone, \$1.50, and back from Fernandina, lumber, \$7.25, free of New York lighterage; a brig, 300 M. lumber, from Pensacola to New York, \$9; a schr., 323 tons, from Fernandina to New York, 275 M. lumber, \$7.25, free of New York wharfage, out in ballast; a schr., 250 tons, hence to Savannah, salt, private terms, and back from Jacksonville, 290 M. lumber, \$7.81; a schr., 100 M. lumber, from Norfolk to New York, \$2.62 1/2; three schrs., same voyage, railroad ties, 7c. for juniper, and 15c. for white oak.

#### GENERAL LUMBER NOTES.

##### STATE.

##### ALBANY LUMBER MARKET.

The Argus reports for the week ending July 22, 1879:

The trade in pine lumber is reported good at unchanged and firm prices. Stocks are well assorted, but the steady drain thereon keeps all kinds at a moderate figure.

Within a few days an active trade has sprung up for sycamore for Petersburgh, Va. On Saturday three vessels left here for that port with about 500,000 feet on board; six vessels are now on their way to Albany to load for Petersburgh, and it is estimated the entire shipment will reach 1,500,000 feet.

For coarse lumber there is a continued good demand. Spruce boards and wall strips are advanced in price; the low quotations for pine lumber alone check any general advance in coarse lumber. The general opinion of the coarse lumber receivers is that the district cannot be stocked this season.

The most recent trading done at East Saginaw is 1,500,000 feet for Albany at \$5, \$10 and \$25, and in choice lots thereof an advance was obtained. To Erie, Pa., 1,300,000 feet at \$5, \$10.25 and \$25; to Eastern parties, 400,000 feet at \$5, \$10 and \$24, and 500,000 feet at \$5, \$10 and \$25. All conditions of the market, the scant supply of logs and low water stiffen prices, and sales of lots to be cut have been made at \$5.25 @ 5.50, \$10.25 @ 11.00 and \$25. Also sales 1,000,000 feet green lumber to West Troy parties, prices not given, and 275,000 feet dry stock at \$5, \$10 and \$25. A large lumber operator at Saginaw stated that he never knew of so many orders for lumber being received during July as in the present season. The stock at East Saginaw at the mills and in dealer's hands on the river are comparatively light while some of the largest manufacturers have sold out their season's product.

The Montreal Herald reports an auction sale on Thursday last at Sorel, disposing of all on hand, amounting to 5,000,000 or 5,500,000 feet of sawed lumber. There was a good attendance of American and Canadian buyers. The prices obtained fully realized the expectations of the sellers.

The receipts of lumber at Chicago from January 1st to July 12th are 548,016,000 feet, against 430,987,000 feet for a corresponding period in 1878. The shipments, 327,322,000 feet, against 277,591,600 feet. The stock on July 1st was 282,283,000 feet against 225,746,000 feet on June 1st, and 310,043,000 feet on July 1, 1878. The stocks at the principal ports on

July 1st, 1,348,326,000 feet against 1,333,758,000 feet a year ago, covering Mississippi Valley, Lake Michigan, East Michigan, Lake Erie and Oshkosh and interior points.

The receipts of lumber at Tonawanda so far as we have seen them reported during the week, have been 5,182,000 feet; the shipments therefrom by canal, 6,020,000 feet. The receipts at Buffalo by Lake, 8,288,000 feet for the week, and 49 cars by the Lake Shore Railroad for the week.

At Oswego the week's receipts of lumber by lake are reported at 3,683,000 feet; the shipments by canal were 3,822,000 feet.

Freights from Bay City to Tonawanda are placed at \$1.50 per M. feet; from Tonawanda and Buffalo to Albany, \$2.00; from Oswego to Albany, \$1.45. Lake Ontario freights to Oswego, 6c. From Ottawa to Whitehall, \$1.90, and from Whitehall to Albany, 8c.

#### THE WEST.

##### Special correspondence of THE REAL ESTATE RECORD.

CHICAGO, July 20, 1879.

The week just ending has been a remarkably quiet one at the wholesale docks. The offerings have been very light and the competition for them not nearly so sharp as might reasonably have been expected under the circumstances. Monday's fleet numbered less than fifteen vessels, yet it required nearly a day's labor on the part of the commission men to find purchasers for them. Since then, the market has been practically bare of cargos, and no business worth mentioning has been transacted. There are but few buyers about, and the demand, which usually improves with any falling off in the receipts, is apparently no better than it has been. In fact, if the market was receiving its regular supply of stock, sellers would probably have considerable trouble in placing it to advantage.

Owing to the apathy of buyers and the sluggish character of the demand which results therefrom, the falling off in the supply has failed to produce any marked improvement in prices. Piece stuff is claimed to be firmer and a trifle higher, but there has been so little sold this week that any prices made are but little better than nominal. One sale was reported yesterday at \$6.37 1/4 for green dimension stuff, but inquiry discloses the fact that it was considered rather better than an average cargo, and contained a pretty liberal percentage of long lengths. The quotation which is made of \$6.12 1/4 @ 6.37 1/4 should be taken merely as the prices which occasional offerings bring; with a fleet of fifty or sixty vessels on sale, no doubt \$6 @ 6.25 would be the outside range. Boards and strips remain as last quoted. Common stuff of this kind continues to form the bulk of the offerings, and as there is less inquiry for it than for most anything else, it naturally rules dull and weak at bottom figures. Lath and shingles are fairly steady, without any change. The list of cargo prices as corrected looks something like this:

The decrease in the arrivals noted above is said to be caused mainly by the manufacturers who are holding back their lumber at the mills, in the hope that something will turn up to impart a firmer turn to prices. That many of them object seriously to the prices which have ruled so far this season at the cargo market in this city, is evidenced by the fact that there is now more lumber piled at producing points on Lake Michigan than was ever known at this time of the year. Whether they will ultimately make anything by so holding back their mill product is just now an open question. There has, as yet, been nothing done towards an advance, and, though lumbermen are beginning to discuss the matter with some show of earnestness, it may be some time yet before they decide to take definite action.

At the yards, both pine and hardwood, there have been no new developments in the trade. There are no complaints of the volume of trade, which is certainly much larger than it ordinarily is during this month. The outlook for fair business is regarded as excellent, and lumbermen are all looking forward hopefully to the balance of the year. Prices are very low, of course, and the dealers all say that profits are exceedingly small, but they are in hopes that in this particular the business may by and by

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improve somewhat. There is certainly room for improvement, and the impression is every day becoming stronger that lumber is unnecessarily low all over the Northwest. With such a brisk demand as we have had, and are likely to have, it does seem unreasonable that neither manufacturer nor dealer should get any profit to speak of.

## SAGINAW VALLEY.

It is the general expression of those engaged in the lumber trade that never before in their experience has there been so much lumber sold during the month of July as during the current month, and not for years has there been so many buyers in the market, so many orders received, or such a buoyant feeling as at the present time. Lumbermen show cheerful faces as they see buyers manifesting an interest in transactions and rather anxious to close sales for fear that offers will not be repeated. The market has taken on a decidedly firm tone, with a tendency toward an advance, and in some cases better figures have been secured. One commission dealer reports having been refused a lot of lumber at prices he would not have thought of offering last month. The inquiry is for good stock, which is quite a change from the past few years, when the poor stock sold the more readily.

The eastern buyers now in the valley report the sales of lumber in their districts as very large, unprecedentedly so, with no prospect of a decrease.

The outlook is decidedly encouraging. There has been a good deal less lumber cut this year to date than last, and there is no certainty that the supply of logs will be as full as has been anticipated. The streams are low, and although the logs may all come out on the fall floods, they cannot be relied on with any certainty to get down in time for cutting. It is raining to-day (Tuesday) but a long drought preceded the present shower, and the lake and river being low the water runs off quickly, affording but poor running capacity for logs. Lake freights remain firm at the quotations, but an advance may be looked for within 30 days.

The sales of the week have been very large, some of the heaviest purchasers having been in the market. For common stocks the prices generally have been \$5, \$10 and \$25, at which rate sales of 2,000,000, mostly  $\frac{1}{2}$  and  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch, are reported by one firm. Selected stocks have sold at \$5.50 and \$11. Other sales have been made at \$5.25, \$10.50 and \$25, and the figures given indicate the range of the market, the prices depending on the quality of the stocks, none selling below \$5, \$10 and \$25.

The comparative tables given below show that the shipments of the season now surpass those of last year by some 12,000,000, although navigation opened some three weeks later this season. This is itself a convincing argument in favor of the revival of business and the greater consumption of lumber which we have always maintained.

The shingle trade is fairly active, and prices remain as before.

The following from the *Lumberman and Manufacturer*:

MINNEAPOLIS, MINN., July 17, 1879.

The lumber situation has materially changed since our last in the Mississippi Valley, so far as the supply of logs is concerned. The heavy rains of last week brought down 150,000,000 feet more logs to the market, which, in all reasonable probability, completes the stock of 1878, although still more may be driven out of the Black and Chippewa. We receive our figures of total supply of logs coming out of the various streams to the mills of supply of the valley:

To this might with propriety be added the product of the railroad mills, which may be set down safely at 150,000,000 more, or a grand total of 1,165,000,000

feet. This is an excess over the cut of 1877 and 1878 of some 325,000,000 feet. But in both of those years the lumber was all absorbed and the West forced to call on Michigan to supply the deficiency, besides the present and prospective demand is so much greater than that of the last two years that it is questionable whether the supply will equal the demand. Manufacturing progresses very slowly. One-half the sawing season has already passed and not more than one-fourth of the work done, leaving it probable that a great many more logs will be carried over than has been for several years, for want of time to saw them. It occurs to us further to suggest that a comparison of stocks on hand in the valley would probably show on comparison with same dates in 1877 and 1878 a deficiency equal to the surplus logs in sight. If we are correct in this (and we believe it correct) there will be no more lumber on hand at the beginning of the year than for the last two, even if there were no increased demand this fall and winter. Prices remain low. Special advices from St. Louis report the sale of one raft of low grade Black River lumber at \$7 in the water for boards, strips and dimension. One of the yards effected a large sale of fencing at \$10.99 to one of the Western railways. Chicago competition forced the figures. Very little lumber has been received except what the three great firms have bought in. Chicago continues to groan under a load of the poorest kind of lumber and sighs for a supply of good. Piece stuff by the cargo is down to \$6.00, and good dry strips and boards up to \$12.00 in that market.

## FOREIGN.

We take the following from the *London Timber Trade's Journal*:

LONDON, July 4th.

Some slight improvement in prices at market here is at length discernible, although the f. o. b. values apparently remain as last quoted. Shippers do not feel inclined to recede farther, though, when positive business is put before them, they make every possible concession in the way of specification to secure it, and unless it is in very large lines there is no disposition to give way in prices, which remain as last month. This apparent firmness, however, has as yet taken no definite hold on the trade, the badness of things generally rendering any faith in its duration very doubtful, while the action of some houses in pressing sales at a sacrifice has helped to create a suspicion that under more favorable circumstances would not have arisen.

If the supplies of timber in the docks furnished in the published returns give a fair index to the state of the stocks along the river-side, the deficiency of the present season as against last year is, if anything, more apparent now than on the 1st of May, and as our spring fleet of winter loaded ships from America are well home at the end of May, we think the falling off in the importations this year will represent a larger percentage than we were at first led to expect, which cannot fail to exercise a beneficial influence on the market. Certainly in the direction the trade is now going it would seem unlikely for prices to recede further, and if at the end of next month the returns do not show an absolute increase on the scale of importation, a favorable turn for the holder of timber goods may be reasonably looked for, as it would be against all experience that prices should continue to fall as the stock of goods gets thinner and the time for replenishing draws nearer to its termination. Of course, July has to tell its tale yet, and by this month, and what it brings forward, the fate of prices for the rest of the season will probably be decided.

\* GLASGOW, July 2d.

Several cargoes of Canadian and lower port deals and boards have arrived and are now landing, giving rather a brisk show of business on our wharf here, but we learn that the import for this season will be small, so as to bear some proportion to the actual wants of the trade. The new stock appears to be of various kinds, excellent in quality and large and medium sizes, which should meet with a fair demand especially as the deals of last season's import are nearly cleared out of first hands.

LIVERPOOL, July 2d.

We are yet without any upward movement in prices, and business continues to be in a depressed condition, with no signs visible at present of a change to a better state of matters. The consumption continues to be very limited, that of square timber especially so, the only articles which have shown any degree of life during the past month, being yellow pine timber and spruce deals, the unprecedentedly low prices at which the last named goods are selling having stimulated consumption to the extent of about 1,500 standards more than that of the month of May.

The auction sales during the past fortnight have been in a great degree unimportant, and as far as regards whitewood have been resorted to only as a means of selling importations which were found difficult to move off by private treaty.

Messrs. Farnworth & Jardine offered about 17,000 Quebec pine deals and boards, and a cargo of Miramichi deals, boards, &c.
