BUSINESS AND THEMES OF GENERAL INTEREST

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Prices of railroad stocks for the past week have ruled firm and there is a good outlook of a continuance of this feeling due to a generally good crop prospect, good business throughout the country, a continuance of large railroad earnings and a cessation of gold exports. The Treasury shows an increase of over \$16,000,000 in gold coin during the past year, and a remarkable exhibit is made in relation to the steady increase of its holdings of gold for some years. For instance, on the 1st day of June, 1888, the Treasury held of gold coin \$195,000,000; on the 1st day of June, 1889, it had \$236,000,000, which amount was increased by the 1st day of June, 1890, to \$253,750,000. It is estimated that there is of gold coin in the country, in the Treasury and in circulation, \$629,000,000, in addition to which there are over \$155,000,000 of gold certificates; then, further, we have \$366,526,266 of standard silver dollars, \$299,592,106 silver certificates and \$76,818,427 of small silver coins. Then add to this \$346,681,016 of U.S. legal tender notes and \$187,549,848 of National Bank notes, making a grand total of \$2,064,459,896, and it will be seen that there is no legitimate reason for any fright about there not being money enough in the country. What we need to be more concerned about is that we shall have as much corn, cotton, wheat, provisions, oil, etc., as we had last year, and of this it can only be said that at present the outlook is all that we can expect. We look for a gradual hardening of prices during the coming month, and in some stocks for a decided rise.

The bill passed by the House, concurred in by the Senate, and now in the hands of the President, providing for the building of a bridge across the Hudson between New York and New Jersey, is fraught with great consequences for this city. The plans for the proposed structure have been prepared by Gustav Lindenthal, and call for a suspension bridge having but one span between the established pier lines of New York and New Jersey. The plans of the bridge and the methods of its construction must be approved by the Secretary of War; and the bill contains provisions for securing the rights of the public and the railroads to its use under The great span will be fully 2,860 feet equitable conditions. long, or 1,265 feet longer than that of the Brooklyn Bridge. Added to this will be 1,500 feet for the end spans on each shore, so that it is estimated that with the two approaches the bridge rannot well be less than 6,500 feet long. The towers will be double on each side; they will rest on enormous masonry piers about 25 feet above high water, and will be 500 feet high, of wrought iron and steel, containing sixteen smaller piers each. The single cable of the Brocklyn bridge will be doubled in the Hudson River bridge, each being 4 feet in diameter, 50 feet apart, and braced. A Board of Engireers have approved the plans and the unanimity with which i. 'assed Congress is an indication that valid objections against the scheme are difficult to find. According to the Washington dispatches, Mr. Lirdenthal estimates the cost of the structure itself in the neighborhood of \$16,000,000. This is about the cost of the Brooklyn bridge, but in the case of the latter there is included the expense of purchasing the land necessary for the approaches, For the Hudson River Bridge it is estimated by the engineer that no less than \$30,000,000 will be needed to condemn the land required for this purpose on either side of the river. It has not transpired as yet where the projectors wish to locate the bridge; but if \$30,000,000 will be used for the purchase of the land, it is obvious that it must be in some quarter in which property is already of considerable value. When we consider, furthermore, that some ten railroads will probably use the bridge, and all of these may need storage and terminal facilities either on one side of the bridge or the other, some idea of the immense importance of the structure, not only to the city at large, but to the immediate vicinity in which it is located, it is not too much to say that the proposed bridge will have more effect on the future of this city than any single improvement since the Erie Canal. There is still much to be done, however, before the scheme can be brought into the sphere of immediate action. Two Legislatures have to be consulted, neither of which can be regarded as abnormally solicitous about the interests of the public; and there is already a corporation

in existence with a charter from this State which may have to be dickered with before any action can be taken.

The so-called Force Bill is a most obnoxious measure. It would not be a very great exaggeration to say that, South or North, there are few thoroughly "square" elections. Cooking the returns, ballot-box stuffing and similar devices for obtaining the suffrage of the free and sovereign people, are among the common evolutions of political tactics. An honest ballot is, undoubtedly, something to be striven for, night and day, in season and out of season, but to endeavor to secure it through a Federal election law would be, it seems to us, little more than bargaining with the Devil for the exchange of one evil for another exactly like it. Elections, local and general, are so corrupt, as they are such vulgar travesties of what it is pretended they are, because they are so completely affairs of "practical politics." But what would the machinery of a Federal election law be run foo? Righteousness or "politics?" There can be no doubt as to which. Any such law would be nothing but another entrenchment thrown around whatever party should be in power in Washington. One of the great political evils of the times is partisanship; partisanship, for instance, of the Ingalls type, which deliberately places the ascendency of party before morality; openly declares political reform to be an evanescent dream, and ranks the politician with the pirate by asserting that there is no place in his career for the Decalogue. While the present conditions exist it would be folly unspeakable to expect that a Federal election law would be anything else than another piece of machinery for partisanship to run for political advantage. In truth, have we not already quite enough of this? The Force Bill should be summarily dropped. It is time Congress should give a little of its expensive attention to measures other than those of merely party importance. The National Legislature is fast becoming a political bear garden, and the interest the people have in what is going on there seems to be of the kind exactly suited to an ursine contest, the result of which could be of no importance except to the animals.

The present Congress has probably been as purely partisan a body as any which has ever sat in Washington. From the first it has turned its attention almost to the exclusion of everything else to the passage of measures out of which the Republicans expected to make political capital, or which were framed simply for the purpose of perpetuating Republican rule. Some of this legislation is good and some of it bad. But whether good or bad, it has been just of the character which would naturally arouse heated opposition. In consequence there have been many stormy debates in the House, and that august assemblage has been continually engaged in squabbles that were undignified and frequently petty. But the queerest aspect of the whole matter is that during the last five months, when bills of the utmost importance have been under discussion, there has been no appeal of any description to the people. The Republicans have held no mass meetings of any consequence to place their views before the electors; and the protests of the Democrats have been made on the floor of the House or through the columns of the newspapers. The Republicans are making changes in our tariff laws of considerable importance, changes in our financial system that are of still more importance, and changes in our election laws that reverse the precedents of century, and, as some believe, are unconstitutional in letter and spirit. They are committing the country to pension legislation of the most unwarrantable and extravagant description legislation that may in the end involve the practical subsidizing of every man who took part in the war, no matter how little he deserves or needs the assistance. All these things are being done, yet the public either takes so little interest in the proceedings, or else the politicians allow the people such a small portion of selfgovernment that no public meeting, general in character, has been held to cry aloud for or against these important and far-reaching The apathy of the public is as singular as it is unfortunate. It does not speak well for free institutions when the electorate are so indifferent to their most vital interests that they will not organize meetings, of their own accord, if the polititions will not take the initative, to raise their voices either on one side or the other. Of course, when Congress adjourns and the fall nominations are made, there will be meetings in plenty, and the opinions of the electorate either one way or the other will be declared. But then it will be too late. In Great Britain the meetings are held at all times when Parliament is in session, and we have recently had an illustration, in the failure of the license-purchasing clause in the Excise bill how a vigorously expressed popular disapproval will be felt in the House of Commons. The Democrats can get but small comfort out of a victory next fall. The Republicans will still have another session in which to complete their plans, and they can rely on the Senate both to prevent the Democrats from repealing any of the partisan legislation and from passing similar bills of their own.

We publish elsewhere a letter from a New Yorker now journeying in the West. It appears from his remarks about Chicago that a visit to the Western metropolis has completely changed his views as to the wisdom of Congress in giving Chicago the World's Fair. The truth is, it is nothing but ignorance or a petty local spirit that inspires the newspapers of this city to prophecy failure for the Columbian Exposition because it will not be in New York. For the last few days they have been vociferating about the hot weather in the Western States as though summer in New York was an ideal season wherein the thermometer never by any chance ascended to 86 or 90 degrees. Chicago is suffering now as New York almost invariably suffers some time during the summer, but with delightful candor the papers ply their readers with the question, "What sort of a place is Chicago for a World's Fair?" No doubt later on there will be an opportunity of asking the same question concerning New York, but it is hardly likely it will be made very much of. Journalism nowadays apparently is conducted on the principle that the public is a parcel of ignorant asses willing to be stuffed with any hay that may be given to them; and, indeed, evidence is not wanting that this is not altogether wrong. We have no doubt that the Fair in Chicago will do credit to that city and to the country. There is very little hope that either there or in New York City it could be made a great International Exhibition, or a great artistic success comparable to the last Paris Exposition. But, that it will be merely a country fair on a large scale, an exhibit of pumpkins and hayseed visitors, unworthy of the nation or the event celebrated, is arrant nonsense. Readers of the daily newspapers should take no stock in the biased opinions, expressed mainly because it is imagined they will be pleased with them. The dear children!

The Citizens Committee has put another foot forward during the past week. The seventy-five gentlemen, who have committed themselves to the great and difficult task of purifying our local politics, have been reduced for working purposes to eleven. These eleven will be the chairman, vice-chairman, secretary and treasurer of the larger committee, together with seven other gentlemen, to be appointed by the chair. All resolutions will be referred to this body; and it will doubtless have to perform the hard, shabby work of the campaign. The necessity for some such sub-committee has been sufficiently indicated by the meetings which have already taken place. There have never been seventy-five men on earth who would approach the same topic in the same way, and consequently while seventy-five men may constitute a good deliberative body, they would be sure to be a failure as an executive body. It will be the task of the Executive Committee to reconcile the differences of the major committee, to cut off, as it were, the edges of the many-headed organizations, and allow it to present to its enemies the even surface of complete unity. There are already signs that such edges exist. One gentleman wishes to commit the committee to his hobby, another to his own particular little idea; but Cornelius Doody, for instance, who is, as it were, the vox populi of the movement, has demanded that a rapid transit plank be put in the platform upon which the proposed People's ticket is to stand. He declares himself in favor of rapid transit (O! excellent young man), but he wished the city to own and operate the system, that it might not fall into the clutches of the wicked Mr. Gould. We believe, probably, as much as does anyone, in the municipality assuming the control of natural monopolies; but the question is, should the committee for the present take its stand on any platform except that of political purification? Would not the advocacy of any specific financial and economic reform make the committee enemies among those who should be their friends. We recognize among the names of the seventy-five gentlemen a number, whom we have been informed. believe as we do, that the control of public functions by private corporations is bad in principle and most wasteful in practice. These gentlemen will probably have a good deal to do in shaping the policy of the committee, but we should regret to see them laying too much stress on such reforms at the present juncture. As Mr. J. Noble Hayes said at the meeting last Tuesday, the moral issue is the one which must be put in the foreground. The line should be sharply drawn at that point, and all other reforms should be kept for a later, and, let us hope, more auspicious moment. To the Executive Committee will fall the duty of emphasizing this fact. If they fail to emphasize it the result will be most unfortunate.

Recently we gave a short account of some legislation under consideration in the French Parliament, affecting the sentencing of convicted criminals. This legislation was based on a sharp distinction between an old offender and a neophyte in crime. The former, of course, was treated with severity, while the latter was to be let off leniently. Other aspects of this question of criminal punishment are exciting an acrid and able discussion, both on the continent and in England. A case has recently occurred in

France which brought forward the problem of what ought to be done in the way of "making it up" to the victim of an unjust sentence. A convict named Borras has recently endured three years penal servitude—of herding with the vilest and most depraved men in the prison at Avignon-for a crime of which he has been found to be entirely innocent. This crime was a murder committed in Carcassone; and Borras was not only convicted but sentenced to death. This extreme penalty, luckily, was not inflicted; but he was at once sent off to the hulks, leaving a wife behind him. Three years he spent in prison, during which time his conduct was termed by his jailers to be "irreproachable," and after this long imprisonment he was suddenly released, told that he had been found to be innocent and was restored to society. In England, when such cases occur the man is "pardoned" for the fault he never committed, and then let loose with his life so far wasted and in a position that makes it difficult for him to obtain employ-In France, in case he is a poor man, there is some provision made for pecuniary compensation to a person thus unfortunately situated; but, in the opinion of the best judges, it is entirely inadequate. Consequently, there has been a strong feeling excited for a systematic plan of providing for a man in such a position. Unfortunately there is no possible way of compensating a man who has been unjustly hanged. In a Catholic country, doubtless, there might be some money expended in masses for his soul; but if the man was innocent his future life would assuredly be adequately provided for by a Justice which never makes error; and saying masses for his soul would simply be providing "more salvation" for a person already saved. Under the circumstances the people whose souls would be in danger would rather be those who framed a law that made punishment irretrievable. Among the many arguments in favor of the abolition of capital punishment there is none so strong, in our thinking, as that founded on the frequent miscarriage of justice. It is a good Johnsonian maxim that fallible men are bound to fail somewhere, and in view of the executions that have taken place during the last hundred years, in which the wrong man was executed, one may well pause to consider, whether it is wise to inflict a punishment in which no allowance is made for the possibility of error. A judge is only a man in a gown, who has read a large number of law books; and the twelve "honest men" in the box may be well-intentioned enough, without being in any way capable of weighing the niceties of evidence. It is better that many guilty men should remain unpunished than that one innocent man should suffer-irretrievably suffer for the sins of another.

#### The Menagerie and Central Park.

The Park Commissioners have been severely criticized for their action in voting to transfer the menagerie buildings from their present site at the 64th street and 5th avenue entrance to Central Park; to the North Meadow. It is denounced as a Tammany job. The organization, it is said, needs patronage for use at the coming municipal election. Consequently, Commissioners Gallup and Borden have adopted every means to hurry the matter through. The transfer, it is claimed, is neither necessary nor desirable. The North Meadow is inaccessibly situated. The crowds of children that would be drawn thither by the menagerie could reach the Meadow only by passing the drives on the east and west side of the Park, and it is quite possible that numerous accidents would occur in consequence. Every foot of Central Park is valuable. The people of the city find it their most convenient pleasureground; and the crowds which flock there on Sundays and Saturday afternoons are of wonderful size. Any curtailment at all of the open spaces would be robbing our poorer people of park room which they need and enjoy. The lawn-tennis players, too, have entered an emphatic protest against the use of the North Meadow for menagerie purposes. They point out the immense popularity of the field as a site for tennis courts. The number of these courts are at present entirely too small for the demand, and crowds are frequently waiting for an opportunity to play. The placing of the menagerie in the vicinity, would not only blot out of existence thirty-two of these courts, but it would cause the rest to be so overrun by the crowds which would be drawn to the menagerie that tennis playing and other sports would be impracticable. These, and other considerations, are urged against the proposed removal.

The truth of the statement that there is a Tammany job behind the matter will be easy of ascertainment. There is some doubt about the legality of the action of the commissioners, and it will fall to Corporation Counsel Clark to decide this point. If Mr. Clark concludes that the action is legal (Conmissioner Borden seemed to have little doubt as to what the decision would be) it will tend to strengthen the allegation. And if the Board of Estimate and Apportionment vote the necessary money in spite of the opposition that has been created, the suspicion will almost amount to a certainty. Whatever, however, may have been the original intention of our authorities, it would seem to be probable that they will ulti-

mately bow to the storm they have raised, for Tammauy is ever willing to surrender a point—that is, one which is not deemed essential—at the bidding of the newspapers. And it is quite possible that they will consider the loss of patronage to be of less importance than the placing in the hands of their opponents a popular cause for complaint. Be that as it may, the newspapers are undoubtedly justified in protesting against the removal. It is better that the menagerie should remain where it is, until an adequate and convenient location can be found in one of the parks in the annexed district. It is obvious that the present site is entirely too small. The animals are crowded together in a space that cannot be more than 150 yards square; the tanks are small, and the cages inadequate in size and number. The crowds on a holiday that gather around the cages are of such a size that individuals can find no comfort in watching the animals. When one considers what a source of amusement and instruction a zoological garden might become; when one compares, for instance, the spacious, picturesque and interesting gardens devoted to the same purpose in London and Berlin, to the petty, stuffy and childish animal exhibit supported by the people of this city, one may well wonder that dissatisfaction with things, as they are, has not crystallized before this, and that some attempt has not been made to make the exhibit more worthy of the city. A removal, however, to the North Meadow would not help matters at all. It would at best be only a temporary expedient, and considering the expense it would entail, and the inconvenience it would cause, such a change would be simply asinine. The space would still be inadequate, and the situation would be difficult of access. We believe that there are contingencies which might justify the utilization of space in Central Park for other purposes than those of providing open places and fresh air. Our largest park south of the Harlem has not as yet become consecrated ground. But this contingency is not one of them, and the sooner our authorities appreciate the fact the better it will be both for them and for New Yorkers.

The menagerie should remain where it is until the parks in the annexed districts become more accessible and the surrounding country more closely populated. Some years from now, when the time comes to lay out these parks, ample provision should be made for a spacious zoological garden and for lawn tennis fields. It is worthy of consideration also whether these places of amusement should not be conducted on a totally different plan from the similar facilities which exist at present in the Central Park. A zoological garden may be a most interesting place in which some people can obtain a certain amount of instruction, and more people a larger amount of amusement; or, on the other hand, it may be simply a conglomeration of wild beasts (most of them looking as if their lives had been misspent) thrown into cages and stalls and emitting an unbearable stench. If the aximals are ever moved to one of the large parks, north of the Harlem, they should not be simply housed up there as they are now. The grounds devoted to the purpose should be carefully laid out in a picturesque manner, with a separate division for each of the various species of animals which the city possesses. The birds, of course, would have to be caged, and it would not be a bad idea to unite an aquarium with the exhibit. The whole place could then be leased under conditions restricting to a merely nominal sum the almission charges of the lessee, who would be required to keep the place in order. That he could afford to add to its attractiveness he ought to be permitted to sell light drinks, etc., and all the returns over a certain amount might be devoted to the improvement of the grounds. A similar plan might well be followed with respect to the lawn tennis field. It would be far more pleasant to the players if good facilities for dressing and bathing were at hand, which could be used by them for a small but adequate sum. Here again the facilities might be leased under restrictions, and a few cents which could be easily borne by the four or more people taking the court could be charged for maintenance. It is not the lawn tennis players would object to such arrangement, for the expense would be light and the attending advantages great. Even, however, if they did object, they would have no good reason for so doing. The sport appeals to only a limited number of people, who can well afford to pay for such special privileges. The tennis players in the Central Park have already formed an association. When the facilities are prepared in the new parks they could well be leased to some such organization, which would run the grounds in the interests of those who used them. Whether these changes can or will be made or not we do not know; but that they would be an improvement upon the present herding of the animals in the menagerie and the herding of the lawn tennis players in the north meadow, is very

#### A Broker's Commission.

The decision given by the Supreme Court this week in the case of Charles G. Martin et al. against Hattie W. Bliss deserves close attention from real estate brokers and real estate owners, for in it is set forth very fully and clearly, by high judicial authority, what must be performed by a broker

to legally entitle him to a commission; and furthermore—a point frequently overlooked—what acts committed deprive him of any claim on his principal.

ase referred to was an appeal from the judgment of the Circuit Court dismissing the complaint. The plaintiffs are well-known real estate brokers and the defendant the owner of No. 31 West 32d street. It appears, in brief, that Charles G. Martin called at the house of defendant and asked er whether the premises were for sale, stating that he had a purchaser. After some prelin inaries the defendant decided to sell and later on instructed Mr. Martin to find a purchaser at \$50,000. The purchaser Mr. Martin had in mind when he first approached the defendant was Dr. Bozeman, who, when informed that the house was purchasable for \$50,000, authorized the plaintiff to secure it for him at that figure. Instead, however, of directly reporting this fact to the defendant, the plaintiff offered his principal \$45,000, then \$46,000, then \$47,000, and subsequently \$50,000, tipulating at the same time that certain articles in the house should be handed over to the purchaser with the premises. This offer was accepted, but when the contract was produced for signature the defendant refused to sign it. The brokers sued for commission. Their complaint was dismissed and the appeal to the Supreme Court was for a reversal of this decision. Judges Van Brunt, Bartlett and Barrett sustained judgment of the lower courts and in their decision say:

the lower courts and in their decision say:

In order to entitle a broker to his compensation it is not necessary that a conveyance of the property intrusted to him for sale should actually be consummated between his employer and customer. All that is necessary for a broker to show is that he has been employed by the owner, and that he has produced to his principal, a customer who is willing to purchase upon the terms fixed by the principal, and who is able to comply with those terms. This being done, a broker is entitled to his compensation under ordinary circumstances. In the case at bar the broker shows employment and production of customer able and willing to comply with the terms fixed by the principal. It is claimed on the part of the defendant that not-withstanding the existence of these facts the broker is not entitled to recover, because in the course of his employment he has been guilty of bad faith towards his principal; that, instead of using his best efforts to further the interest of his principal, the broker in the case at bar worked against them, used his utmost efforts to induce the defendant to take less for her house than the price fixed by her when the defendant's terms had already been accepted by the proposed customer.

Certainly some good faith is required as between employer and employee. An agent owes some duties to his principal, and because a man is a real estate broker he is not relieved from the ordinary principles governing the relation of principal and agent. It is undoubtedly true that a broker may, in some instances, act for two parties, where they have conflicting interests, as in the case of exchange of property, which was the fact in the cases cited by appellants' counsel (Rowe v. Stephens, 53 N. Y., 621; Jarvis v. Schaefer, 105 N. Y., 289); but, even then, he is bound to fair dealing, and it has never yet leen decided, even in such a case, that a broker could conceal from one principal the acceptance of an offer by the other, and endeavor, with knowledge of that acceptance, to get lower terms from that principal and yet recover his commission as compensation for services rendered.

#### The New Federal Buildings Question-

There seems to be no immediate prospect of New York getting a new Appraisers' Stores and a new Custom House building. Under the Act of Congress passed September 14, 1888, two millions of dollars were appropriated to purchase land upon which to erect these buildings, and in addition six hundred and fifty thousand dollars were appropriated for the Appraisers' building. This money is ready to be expended any time. There is quite a common impression that such appropriation, if not used, lapses after a certain period of time variously stated to be two or three years; but, fortunately, this is not so, and the appropriation holds good for any length of time, until the Secretary of the Treasury, who has the power to expend the money, decides to move in the matter, or until Congress repeals the act making the appropriation.

It has been fully explained in our columns that by reason of the failure of the last Legislature to give the consent of this State to the United States to acquire the necessary land by condemnation proceedings, action must be postponed until next year or until such future time as the consent of the State is given, there being a clause in the Constitution of the United States restricting the general Government from acquiring land except by consent of the Legislature of the State in which the same may be.

In the present Congress several bills have been recently introduced relating to the proposed new buildings. In February last a bill was introduced in both branches of Congress, amending the original act by striking out therefrom the words "in the vicinity of each other," so that the Sec stary of the Treasury could locate the Appraisers' Stores far apart from the site for a new Custom House, if he should decide so to do. The bill also made an appropriation of seven million five hundred thousand dollars for a Custom House building, this sum being in addition to the amount already appropriated for the purchase of a site. It also provided for the appointment by the Secretary of five citizens of this State, to be selected by him from the two principal political parties—that is to say, three Republic ans and two Democrats—as Commissioners to have charge of the erection and struction of the new Custom House building, and at the completion of the building the present Custom House on Wall street should then be sold at public auction for a sum not less than three million dollars, and the proceeds covered in the Treasury. It is said that this bill met with the approval of the Secretary of the Treasury and the Supervising Architect. But the bill itself has been smothered in the House Committee on Public Buildings and Grounds, and in its stead, on the 23d day of May the Committee substituted a short bill of only some ten lines in length, amending the Act of September 14, 1888, "by striking out the words 'in the vicinity of each other' wherever the same occur, so that the Secretary of the Treasury may locate said Appraisers' Warehouse at any point within the collection district north of Liberty street, on t side of the City of New York." A few days after this bill was reported it passed the House, and went in due course to ihe Senate, which latter body also promptly passed it, and then to the President who signed his approval on Saturday, last, the 29th of June.

It is thus made mandatory on the Secretary of the Treasury to select an up-town site for the Appraisers' Stores—he must confine his selection to the west side of the city, and he may go north of Liberty street as far up as Spuyten Duyvil for a location if he has a mind to, but he must not go to Bowling Green, nor anywhere else south of Liberty street. This restriction is a revival of the very same feature that was rejected by Congress a little more than two years ago. It was deemed then that if the Secretary could be intrusted to make a proper selection north of Liberty street, along some eight miles of Hudson River frontage, he was competent to use his judgment as to the remaining half mile south of Liberty street to the Battery. Secretary Windom was for years a resident of this city, and prominently identified with her business interests. He is personally familiar with the city, and this fact, taken in connection with his knowledge and experience in the matter of customs business in this port, and the special study that he has officially made as to the proper location for the Appraiser's Warehouse, not only particularly qualifies him to make a wise selection of a site, but affords the strongest reasons why he should be untrammelled in making such selection. But the discretion that was vested in him has been removed, and he is no longer empowered to decide what is for the best interests of the Government and the business, community as to whether the Custom House and the Appraiser's Stores should be close together or far distant apart, and where either one or the other or both should be located, unless indeed the Secretary should decide to locate the new Custom House above Liberty street, which is not likely. It must be remembered that an Appraisers' Stores and a Custom House are for the Port of New York, which includes Brooklyn, Jersey City, Staten Island, as well as the City of New York, and that the growth of the snipping business in the future is more likely to be in a southwardly than in a north wardly direction. Therefore, the Customs buildings should be located in the most convenient and accessible place that can be selected.

Lately there has been lacking something like common sense in managing this question on broad, public interests. Instead of endeavoring to get an appropriation for a Custom House building, all efforts should have been concentrated in getting the present Congress to increase the appropriation of two millions of dollars to three millions, and so give to the Secre tary of the Treasury authority to expend a sum of money sufficient to acquire all three of the Bowling Green blocks, and provide for a group of buildings to include a new Sub-Treasury and new Assay buildings, as well as a new Custom House and Appraisers' Stores. It is not yet too late to remedy any unwise move that has been made to defeat the comprehensive and well-considered plans of the advocates of the Bowling Green location.

#### A Letter from the West.

STEAMBOAT SPRINGS, Col., June 23, 1890.

Editor RECORD AND GUIDE:

As I promised when I left New York, I send you a few jottings giving my impressions of one or two of the principal cities through which I passed on my journey to this spot.

When I arrived at Chicago I found every one full of the World's Fair. When Congress voted to have the Fair held in that city, I thought, with many New Yorkers, that it was suicidal. After having seen Chicago I have changed my mind. It is undoubtedly a wonderful city, and the visitors who will come to the Exposition will have their eyes opened as to the great growth and future possibilities of the "Windy City."

There is a great variety of material used in building in Chicago, and the contrast to New York in the designs of houses and business buildings is very noticeable. This is enhanced by the fact that the street lines are not all straight. There are no tenements, though there are many apartment In the outlying districts, made accessible by cable cars, mechanics and workingmen have their little homes, each surrounded by a plot of ground, so different from New York, where lack of proper transit facilities is stunting the growth of the city.

Among the large buildings just begun or soon to be started is the sixtee story fire-proof brick and stone office building, which is to occupy the block front belonging to the Brooks estate, on Dearborn street, between 4th avenue and Jackson street. This immense structure is to cost \$1,500,000. Then there is the Chicago Herald building, to be erected on Washington street; a hotel on Dearborn street, to occupy the block front opposite the

post-office, and other large buildings.

I found Denver a very busy place. What surprised me greatly was the great activity in building. Houses are going up on all sides, while in the business districts scores of fine office and business buildings are being They are largely of red sandstone and terra cotta, and many of them coat hundreds of thousands of dollars. The transfers of real estate from January 1 to June 9, 1890, amounted to \$34,284,922. Denver also has a live Real Estate Exchange, where, in addition to realty, stocks, bonds and corporation, county and municipal scrip are listed and sold.

At present there is a strike among the mill men, and the plumbers, stone cutters and others engaged in the building trades are going out in sympathy with the strikers.

Denver is an unfinished city. Although having a population of close upon 200,000 it has no street pavements. Bids, are, however, being received for this work. At present the streets are being torn up to permit of the laying of sewer pipes. There is one thing around Denver which I appreciated, and that is the superb drives with the magnificent scenery through which they pass.

And now a few lines about Steamboat Springs. This place is reached after a journey by rail from Denver of 325 miles, followed by a 70-mile stage ride over about the roughest road in this wide world. There is an abundance of game and good fishing. Just as the stage entered the town two spring deer scampered by on their way down from the mountains. Steamboat Springs is 7,000 feet high. It received its name from a spouting spring which emits a noise like a steamboat funnel. There are about fifty springs in all, soda, iron, sulphur and magnesia. Baths possessing great

medicinal virtues are also located here. Coal has been found in the vicinity in great quantities, some of it being an extra quality of anthracite, and it would seem that only a railroad is required to be built to this place to give it a boom.

Money here is scarce and prices of food and clothing are very high. Sugar is 12 cents per pound; kerosene oil, 70 cents per gallon. Meat is scarce and costly. Venison is plentiful, but not purchasable. It must be shot. We had a bear roast yesterday. Trout is caught in abundance in the Bear River, which flows by our door. The natives are plain and good-natured people and some are very companionable.

During the summer numbers of tourists stop here, and this year a greater number are expected than ever. Many of the latter come for the sulphur and hot mineral water baths, which are said to be very beneficial to those for whom they are prescribed. Taken altogether I think this is a great spot to regain that unpurchasable article Health without which none of us is of great account. JAMES E. O'HARA.

#### The Exterior Street at Last.

The Sinking Fund Commission, after months of delay, at last took up the question of the exterior street, East River, at their meeting on Wednesday. After considerable discussion and explanations by Engineer Webster, of the Department of Public Works, and Engineer Greene, of the Dock Department, the Commission passed resolutions ordering proceedings to be talen for the work to be done. The plans were accepted and have already been filed. The first step necessary will be for the Board of Street Opening to declare the street open, and proceedings will then have to be taken to condemn the lands required for the improvement.

The exterior street runs from 64th to 81st street, and the estimated cost will be \$1,645,190. Of this \$294,190 will be spent for regulating and grading, under the supervision of the Department of Public Works, the amount to be raised by assessment: \$441,000 will be required for acquiring title to the necessary lands, and the balance expended by the Dock Department, for bulkheads and other water front improvements.

The commissioners also considered, but laid over for action thereon, the plans for improving the water front on the south, between 49th and 53d streets and 59th and 64th streets. The estimated cost of the former work is \$305,203, and of the latter, \$500,999. The grand total cost of the entire improvement between 49th and 81st streets, a distance of about a mile and a-half, would, therefore, be \$2,451,392, of which \$564,500 would be for acquiring property, and the balance for street and water front improve-

Engineer Webster, when asked how long he thought it would be before the work would be commenced, said: "It all depends upon the time taken in acquiring title to the property. I should say work ought to commence in a year to a year and a-half."

#### Is This Rumor True?

THE BALTIMORE & OHIO RAILROAD SAID TO BE NEGOTIATING FOR PROPERTY ON WHITEHALL STREET ON WHICH TO BUILD A DEPOT.

A report reached the RECORD AND GUIDE on the eve of The Fourth to the effect that agents of the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad were endeavoring to acquire property on Whitehall street. A well-known property owner informed a representative of the RECORD AND GUIDE that he had been personally approached by parties representing that road for the purchase of some property which he owns on that street. The object in view was to obtain a site for the erection of a depot in conjuncwith the traffic conveyed over the Staten Island Rapid Transit Road, which is a leased line of the Baltimore & Ohio Road.

J. Frank Emmons, treasurer of the Staten Island Rapid Transit Road, was seen at the office of H. L. Horton & Co., bankers and brokers, of which he is a member. He said: "I have heard nothing about such a contemplated purchase. I am not in the confidence of the B. & O. Road, so that I am not able to say whether they are trying to buy any property at all. I think the Superintendent would be more likely to know

Frank S. Gannon, Superintendent of the Rapid Transit Road, was then seen. He said: "I don't think there is anything in the report; I have not heard of it. We now have four piers for landing freight from the terminus at St. George, Staten Island. These are Pier 20, North River; Pier 27, East River; the foot of 37th street, East River, and the foot of North 1st street, Brooklyn. This gives us ample facilities at present, and I don't think we want any more water front. Anyway, we couldn't buy any in the neighborhood of Whitehall street if we wanted to."

You said you thought there was nothing in the rumor "ventured the interviewer." Can you speak definitely?

"I know there's nothing in it," said the superintendent.

Then how comes it the well-known property-holder mentioned above was approached for the purchase of his property?

On 'Change the first two days there was a good attendance, but this fell off toward the end of the week when the auctionee were occupied only with foreclosure sales.

On Monday, notwithstanding the warm weather, there was a fair attendance on 'Change. The list of properties offered included all kinds of city and three sales of suburban property. The sales of city property were of a legal character. By order of the Supreme Court in a partition sale, the southwest corner of Rivington and Columbia streets was sold to H. Israel, for \$16,500. In a foreclosure suit the plaintiff purchased No. 56 East 69th et for \$39,000, as against \$36,329 due thereon. In a similar suit No. 457 West 35th street was sold after a lively competition, for \$26,600, to Andrew Kervan

The sale of the sixty-two lots on Greene and Washington avenues and 2d street, Westchester, belonging to Jefferson M. Levy, was evidently not a success, as about fifty lots were withdrawn. Eleven lots on Washington avenue sold at prices ranging from \$195 for an inside to \$300 for a corner One lot on 2d street sold for \$200.

On Tuesday there was again a large attendance on 'Change. By order of the executors of Bridget McGowan, No. 57 Mott street, near Bayard, was sold for \$26,050 to Isaac Marks, and a lot and two-story frame house on 120th street, east of 2d avenue, sold for \$9,200. #### BUILDING MATERIAL MARKET.

BRICKS.—It has not been a week calculated to add greatly to the consumption of brick. The weather was to some extent unpropitious, and with really only about four days when workmen could be counted upon, the number handled for actual use was naturally considerably curtailed, and there is at the present writing a liberal amount of stock piled around wherever a place can be found for it, or still on the barges awaiting unloading. Fortunately, however, the shipment thave been moderate from most localities, and this has kept the first hand offering in such a narrow compass as to prevent any serious surplus or oppressive push from the selling side and retained the line of values at pretty much the same figures, as last week, and really gives the market a steady sort of undertone through which a good outcome is hoped for after the holidays. There is nothing very decisive from along the river as to manufacturers intentions in regard to production, though it still believed many will shut down surely as rapidly as completements are filled, unless there be a much greater attraction in matter of price than at present. There is a story affoat that the labor organizations propose to boycott the brick from some four or five yards on east shore 'of the river south of Fishkill, unless the yards come in under union rules. This, however, cannot have much influence upon the general market. Pale brick continue in good demand with some of the best reaching \$325, and fronts are without any important change from the situation noted last week. upon, the number handled for actual use was natur-

CEMENT.—The general tendency of the market for cements seems to be toward improvement, and while the present week shows no special animation, operators are calculating upon a positive gain in the vol tors are calculating upon a positive gain in the volume of distribution as the month progresses. Local work of all kinds, including the paving jobs, offer an increasing exhaust, while the call from the interior, especially for imported goods, is said to be of more pronounced character as relates to well-known and popular brands at least. Rumors have been floating of sales of domestic stock at very low rates, and investigation rather tends to confirm the report, but also shows that it was mostly ordinary quality of the product placed during a dull period and did not influence the majority of dealers who would neither sell on spot, or contract head for anything less than what may be considered regular rates. One point calculated upon to help the domestic product for some little time is the absence of supplies in local goods. Dealers have been so busy handling cheap brick and lime at the sudden drop in cost as to neglect cement, but now commence to feel the necessity for securing a supply of the latter. Two or

three times since the first of the year we have called attention to immense arrivals of foreign cements and there was not much abatement up to the end of the past month. A great deal of this stuff has been annoying and more or less depressing in its influence upon values, yet seems to have sold fairly close, and some importers claim to have never found enough unsold accumulation afloat to give them any trouble whatever. Prices at the moment range about as for some time past, but pretty steady and inclined to gain rather than lose in strength if anything, in view of the fact that after the first of August the lay down cost will naturally increase by the going into effect of the lately passed Administrative act. Under present rulings the duty on cement is paid only upon the actual cost of the stuff itself at point of production, but in the change the duty will be 20 per cent. ad valorem on f. o. b. price, which includes the cost of package and inland transportation to place of shipment. It will at least 15 cents per bbl. to cost of cement laid down here, and possibly more should ocean freight charges advance. Efforts to import freely during July are expected, but there is doubt about ability to obtain much cement or reom to transport it. Contracts made for fall delivery have generally been drawn subject to change in duty. "If" the McKinley bill passes, the duty will be specific at 8 cents per 100 M's gross, all cements alike paying 32 cents per bbl., and that will act detrimental to the lower qualities. They have been having a hard time with the cement market in Canada, and a Montreal report of a week or two ago said: "The cement market is roomed to store their stock. During the consigness are looking for sheds in which to store their stock. During the cement market will go to pieces. Up to the present not one solitary sale has shown a cent of profit. The best that sellers have done is to come out even, and if the ship's consignees are allowed to contrue to sacrifice their cement for any price they can get this s

The same report, however, speaks of a probable combination of cement dealers to work a remedy for the existing evil.

LATH.—Receivers quite generally claim present indications are promising. They insist that dealers supplies are moderate and broken with increasing umption developing, and repeat reports of modconsumption developing, and repeat reports of moderate quantities afloat and short production. In small cargoes and deck loads quite a number of arrivals have taken place since our last report, but between local and out-of-town custom'they found aplace without much difficulty and commanded about former rates. The entire range reported was from \$2.30 on Maine stock up to \$2.40 per M on Provincial stock, with possibly some Northern lath at somewhere around the inside figure.

LIME.—The open market, with receivers unre-strained by any obligation as to selling price, kept matters in somewhat uncertain condition all the while and leads to slightly contradictory statements at and leads to slightly contradictory statements at times. At the moment the tone appears to be pretty steady, however, for all good stock as the supply in hand is moderate, and some buyers not able to get in on the first drop are now exhibiting anxiety. Lump is sustained with the greatest ease because it is in the smallest proportion, but no first class brands of Rockland are known to be available for less than 90c. per bbl. Some St. John stock came to hand during the week and sold at 80 @ 90c. per bbl., a very good price considering the condition of the market.

LUMBER.—It has been a short and broken week, with probably no more really new business inau-gurated than was positively necessary. The turn into a new month and into the second half of the year as a new month and into the second half of the year as well were in themselves factors tending to restrict operations somewhat, and an additional quieting intuence was to be found in the national holiday, which, with the succeeding half holiday, practically reduces the working period to four days. Aside from the features mentioned, however, there were few variations from the general conditions previously prevailing and the market as a whole may be considered in a fairly healthy state, with a promise that present conditions can be sustained even though no further gain be made. There are chances that in a few weeks some grades of stock will, in the natural order of things, become more plenty, and buyers to some extent are hopeful that they will find advantage therein, but receivers of standard stock seem confident they can manage affairs and maintain a steady tone, with the possible exception of white pine, the numerous, irregular and unknown sellers of which who at times appear having a tendency to excite a little apprehension.

Eastern Spruce remains much the same. Receivers are the source and the effect that having placed

Receivers argue about as before, to the effect that having placed everything received thus far this season, a great deal of it even before landing, at the very full rates ruling, there will be no difficulty in handing the balance should prices drop away and the only evil effect will be upon those who may be caught with loads under high freight charges, and sellers of competing woods who have been filling so many orders from custom unable to handle spruce on the contracts in hand. Some of the trade doubt if the market should be supplied with two or three successive big fleets the drop in price would be very great, as there must be an immense shortage among all the dealers included in our local circuit. Some of the cargoes of late received here come in under charters at \$3.75 per M feet from St. John. Letters from New Brunswick received last week say that all the drives are coming out and bringing fifty to sixty million feet hung up last year.

Piling continues to receive favorable reports so far as the prospects of demand are concerned. Jobs under way and new work contemplated offer a very liberal outlet, and while there may be temporarily a surplus supply in first hands against immediate consumptive requirements there will, it is claimed, be no hesitation about putting it in chains to await a call expected to continue all winter unless the weather prove unusually severe.

Hemlock remains in good repute with a large and desirable class of custom, and there does not appear to be any fault to find with the market. Matters naturally are not so taut now as during the winter season, when chances for competition are not quite so broad, but the variations in cost on both joist and
