THE next two weeks are not as a general thing marked by any great activity in the stock market; and the present year is not likely to prove any exception to the rule. Manifestly the public have no confidence in stocks at the present time. Neither is it likely that an easier money market-which to all appearances may soon be at hand-will prove to be of any material assistance in this respect. The importation of gold has not caused any immediate advances; neither has the new president's agreement been regarded with other than a cautious eye. It is safe to predict, however, that the improved conditions signalized by these events will have their beneficial effects. As Matthew Marshal says, the present panic, like that of 1857, has been mental; and hitherto, although serious fears have been discarded, faith has not returned. The continuance of failures in business for no other reason than that the merchants could not realize on their assets is but too unmistakable an evidence of this fact. But, as we have said, money will become more plentiful; and determined efforts will be made to stop rate-cutting in the West. Wall street, warned by the experience of two years since, is suspicious of the proposed pool; but, as we think, rather too suspicious. The roads who will not sign the agreement are few in number and for the most part unimportant; and as the chance of respectable dividends (in some cases of fixed charges) depends upon a better rate situation, the agreement, which has not been lightly made will not be lightly broken. Wall street is, perhaps, wise in waiting until the crucial matter of the division of the traffic is satisfactorily settled, and until the crop and freight prospects for the new year are less a matter of idle conjecture; but some day, it is not impossible that the operators will wake up to an improvement in earnings, and a return in confidence that will make stocks jump up with comfortable celerity. As to the legislation of Congress, if it comes at all, it will probably arrive just as there is no longer any necessity for it. President St. John, of the Mercantile National Bank, is of the opinion that the bill proposed by the Finance Committee will not pass, and that the squabble will result in legislation verging closely on the free coinage of silver. In any case, however, the immediate effects of the discussion will be more likely to disturb the money market than to assist it. Holders of Western mortgages, particularly in Kansas, will perhaps find something to think about in the way the Alliance are proposing to treat mortgagees who are sordid enough to foreclose a lien on a poor farmer's land. Several owners who come into possession of farms under sheriffs' proceedings have been removed bodily, and it is reported that this heroic way of getting rid of encumbrances will be continued. If

such methods as these prevail there will be an indisposition to send more money out West.

THE London stock market is suffering under a reaction from the excited recovery which took place immediately subsequent to the crisis. Speculation, however, has been dull, except in the case of the Argentine securities, which have exhibited a tendency to rise since the publication of the report of the committee. This report expresses confidence in the future of the Argentine Republic, provided its finances can be set on a sounder basis by the reduction of the premium on gold. In the opinion of the committee the country has a valuable asset in the customs duty which it is proposed to make available by the issue of a new loan, secured by this asset. The loan will amount to between eleven and twelve millions sterling, which will be sufficient to meet all obligations for three years, by which time it is expected that the country will have recovered from the effects of the inflation. That this report will result in anything is doubtful. The French government at the present time is engaged in an effort to fund the Sexennial Treasury bills with a loan of 700,000,000 francs. A return from the Ministry of Finance shows that at the end of 1889 the principal of the French debt aggregated 25,153,266,939 francs, and the annual interest charges to 856,444,770 francs, an increase in ten years of 4,761,913,393 in capital and 94,108,830 in interest. The revision of the French tariff appears to be taking the same lines as the McKinley bill, for the sub-committees having the revision in charge have voted increases on all the new duties proposed by the government. The conference between the governments of Germany and Austro-Hungary has a very different significance. The feeling is that the Protectionist policy of Austria has been a disastrous mistake, and that the interests of that country will be best served by a customs union with Germany. A wish to retaliate on this country is doing much to help the movement, but it is said that the Austrian government fears the domination of Germany. The results of the conferenca may have important bearings on the trade with this country,

ERTAIN daily newspapers apparently are greatly shocked because Mayor Grant has honored the city by appointing so eminent a rum-seller as Mr. Patrick Divver, to be a Police What we would like to know is: what was the election in November but a popular call for distinguished gentlemen like Mr. Divver to come from the retirement of their dives, rumshops and gambling places, and from among their boon companions, to a sphere of wider use fulness. The voice of the majority of the free enlightened voters of this city declared in the most emphatic manner on November 4th that they had no maudlin sympathy with "respectability," "decency," and a "government for business," and all that sort of thing, about which so much was said. They were evidently perfectly satisfied with the government which this city has "enjoyed" for several years past. Under the circumstances it is very illogical for anyone to blame Mayor Grant or denounce Mr. Divver, The former is carrying out to the letter the wishes of the majority of our voters just as Mr. Scott would have done if he had been elected, and then appointed to office men of business capacity and honorable character. Indeed, we venture to assert that if the principle of majority-rule is to hold good, Mayor Grant is bound by duty to put aside any personal preferences of his own and nominate to office good Tammany men, of which Mr. Divver is a notorious and shining example.

But in the meantime, what is that vast body of "respectable people" doing about which we heard so much in the Evening Post and other papers at election time? We were then told that they would go to the polls in their might, and banish from amidst us forever the corrupt rule of Tammany. Though they were called upon loudly enough, like the gods of the prophets of Baal, they must have been sleeping at the time they were wanted. High as is the estimation in which Mr. Divver is held in certain quarters, we hardly dare suppose that he realizes to the full the ideal of a police magistrate for the respectable part of this community. One can only with great difficulty imagine the appointment of Mr. Divver to a magistrateship in Berlin, Paris or London (because, we suppose, of the inability of an effete civilization to recognize legal ability in a rum-seller); but if, due to some freak of the appointing power, such a man should get into office there, we believe the respectable part of the community would not rest until he had been induced to resume, what in theological language is called the position to which God had called him. Is it not curious that that great body of respectable citizens amongst us are so backward in expressing an opinion at this moment on a matter of no little importance to them?

SYDNEY SMITH'S classification of the human kind as men, women and clergymen ought to be altered so as to include a separate class of politicians. Their ways are inscrutable. Appeals to common decency are as little regarded as appeals to common sense. If there ever was a reform which can be easily and cheaply

introduced, and which is demanded by every consideration of public welfare, by every gentlemanly feeling which can enter into a man's body, it is that matrons should be appointed to take care of female prisoners. It seems incredible that so much opposition should be offered to so necessary a change in the mere petty details of administration. The State law authorizes the appointment of police matrons without making it compulsory. Ever since this statute was enacted the charitable associations around the city have been endeavoring to persuade the local authorities to act as decency requires; but the Police Commissioners were obdurate, not being open apparently to considerations of that character. Failing in this attempt the charitable associations went to Albany and passed a bill through the Legislature making mandatory what was formerly permissive. But Governor Hill was well mounted on his home rule hobby and, although sympathizing with the purpose of the bill, passed an opinion that New York local authorities ought to "control the situation." Since then a renewed attempt has been made to pursuade the Police Commissioners to appoint the matrons, but they pleaded lack of money. Their earnestness in the matter was clearly betrayed by the fact that when the time came, they declined to ask the Board of Estimate and Apportionment for an appropriation for the purpose, and they have since refused to take any further action. If, then, men are to continue to take charge of the women prisoners, the Police Commissioners ought to take pains to select jailers particularly qualified for the task. The associations under the influence of which a turnkey lives are not such as would make him keenly sensitive to woman's feelings or wishes, and since the Police Commissioners have decided (contrary, it must be admitted, to a hitherto prevailing opinion) that men are better qualified than women, to act as attendants on female prisoners, perhaps it would be well to raise the character of the jailers.

ROM the latest reports it would appear that the prospects for the passage of a rapid transit bill by the coming Legislature are improving. Mayor Grant is of the opinion that a bill removing the restrictions which hamper any commission appointed under the present law has a fair promise of passage through the Senate; and those who opposed the Mayor in this matter last year have already intimated that the opposition will not be continued provided a satisfactory commission is guaranteed. Whether they will consider satisfactory the commission of last spring, with the addition of another member in the place of the late August Belmont, has not, however, transpired. It will be remembered that three routes were recommended by the commission. One of them extended from the Battery through certain streets west of Broadway to 59th street at Broadway, and thence along the Boulevard to Kingsbridge. The central system was to start from the Battery, run through William, Duane, Elm and Marion streets, Lafayette place and 4th avenue to the Harlem River, with a branch from 129th street along the Harlem River to 155th street, whence it would continue across the high ground to Carmansville. All that was decided about the East Side line was its terminus at the Battery and its crossing of the Harlem at Av A or B. In an article in the Times during the past week it was stated that the members of the commission objected to the provision in the present law requiring that but one corporation should be formed to construct and operate the entire system. They wish, according to this authority, to distribute the three routes between the two interests which will be likely to compete for the francaises—the Vanderbilt and Gould interests. This would be a foolish and a futile provision. Just as the different elevated roads which first undertook to rub steam cars through this city had practically to combine into one corporation, so in the future any separate companies which might be organized to construct and operate the various routes would inevitably consolidate. To some people experience is no guide. Competition is neither possible nor desirable in the operation of transit lines within city limits. The worst feature of all the rapid transit proposals which emanate from Mayor Grant and his party is that all of them entirely mistake the significance of the past in the relation of natural monopolies to municipal administration. The Fassett bill of last year contained a provision for the ultimate reversion of the new rapid transit system to the city; but no such sane idea seems to have entered the head of Tammany legislators. However, we must have rapid transit; and a badly-organized system will be better than none at all. It will be interesting to note the attitude of the newspapers who so virulently opposed granting to the Manhattan Company its "loop" in Battery Park toward these new proposals, which contemplate the situation of three extensive terminals with stations in that much-protected pleasure ground.

A TTENTION was called in these columns, some time ago, to the rent which the government paid each year for the use of private buildings occupied by its departments at Washington. The sum appropriated to this purpose for the year ending June, 1891, amounts to over \$120,000. Of this sum, \$107,004 is expended

for the use of private buildings occupied by permanent departments, the business of which is each year constantly enlarging. The estimates of appropriations for the fiscal year ending June, 1892, which Secretary Windom has just given out, increase the sum which the permanent departments will have to pay as rent for the coming year to \$143,000. There might be some excuse for this outlay on the part of the government if its finances were in a straitened condition; if, say, the annual revenue fell short of necessary expenditures. Though, even then, from an economic point of view, it would pay the government to borrow moneywhich it can at a lower rate of interest than private persons-and enlarge its department buildings to meet the demands of its growing business. But, with a surplus of revenues in the Treasury at its disposal, there is not so much as the shadow of an excuse for the governments renting private buildings. For the last three years or more our legislators at Washington have been trying to think out ways of getting rid of the surplus in the Treasury, while under their very eyes six of the permanent departments at Washington were being forced to move into private offices through lack of sufficient government buildings. The business of the government departments is gradually increasing, as a glance at the item sent in Secretary Windom's estimates of appropriations for the fiscal year of 1891-92 will show; and there is no way in which the surplus could be more profitably spent than in enlarging present government buildings or in constructing new ones to meet this growth.

Some Well Arranged Statistics of Railways.

A T a time when the work of the Federal Census Bureau is being generally criticised and discredited, and when "the almost pathetic longing of the American people for statistical information" leads to little more than the publication, by State and national authorities, of great volumes filled with ill-considered, ill-presented, and often meaningless or misleading figures, it is a relief to take up a work like the report of the Statistician of the Irterstate Commerce Commission for 1889. It is rather late in appearing, as it covers only the year ending June 30, 1889, and it is rigidly limited in its scope; but the collection of facts has evidently been conducted according to well-considered plans, and the analysis and presentation of the facts is clear and candid.

It has long been evident that only the Federal authorities could collect for us satisfactory information regarding the tangled railway systems of the country. State lines have been ignored in the construction and management of our railways, and one of the standing conundrums for railway accounting officers is how to apportion the business of their roads between the several States when reporting to the local authorities. When the half arbitrary apportionment has finally been made the resulting cross-section of facts is of small use except for purposes of State taxation. On the other hand "Poor's Manual of Railroads," and similar products of private enterprise, have usually been planned to guide the investor rather than to inform the general public.

This is only the second report of the kind issued by the Interstate Commission, and of course the value of careful observation is not fully apparent until it has extended over sufficient time to enable us to compare different periods and to trace developments. Besides this the field to be covered was so wide and the chaos at first reigning was so complete that only a few lines of investigation could be opened at a time. The twentieth section of the act creating the Interstate Commerce Commission gives a formidable list of subjects upon which information is to be collected. On some of these full and conclusive information can perhaps never be obtained. For instance, it may be impossible to discover "the cost and value of the carrier's property, franchises and equipment." The records of original companies are often not to be found, "the consolidated companies caring nothing for records except such as prove their right to the property absorbed. But of greater significance is the fact that in many instances the books of railway corporations do not go beyond settlements with construction companies; that is to say, the investigation demanded by Congress is pushed back into the realm of vest-pocket bookkeeping and a conveniently failing memory."

The first work of the statistician, Prof. H. C. Adams, was to endeavor to secure uniformity in the returns asked by the several States, and in the accounts kept by the various companies. The co-operation of the State Commissions and of the members of the Association of American Railway Accounting Officers was asked and largely secured; and the movement towards uniformity has gone on steadily, though somewhat slowly. A fiscal year ending June 30th has been very generally introduced, and the form of report recommended by the Interstate Commission is adopted by many of the States.

In the present report a record is begun intended to show the corporate history of the several roads by giving a statement of all corporate changes for the year. The most important classes of changes are found to be consolidation, merger and reorganization. Had we such a record for past years it would throw much light on

the history of the centralizing tendencies in railroad management. The present situation is that our 157,758 miles of roads are owned by 1,705 companies; but the operations of all these are controlled by 436 organizations that are independent of each other. It is further noteworthy that thirty-three systems control more than 1,000 miles of road each, and that these same systems control 49.09 per cent of the total railroad mileage of the country.

The railway capital of the country is divided into stocks 47.16 per cent, funded debt 47.94 per cent, and current liabilities 4.9 per cent. The proportion of debt to stock has increased slightly since the preceding year. It is a little startling to notice that one man or one syndicate by owning a majority of the stock, amounting to only 24 per cent of the railroad capital of the country, might, conceivably, control that entire capital amounting to more than nine billions of dollars. This consideration is further enforced by the fact that the roads of the country have made slight provision for the extinction of their mortgage obligations, and there is a marked tendency for new and consolidated mortgages to be drawn for long periods.

The railroad property of the United States gives employment to 704,743 workers, who, with those dependent upon them, make an army of probably 3,000,000 persons, or about one in twenty-one of the total population. There are 459 employes to each mile of line operated in this country, while in England the number of employes per mile of line is 1,748. One result of the small proportionate number of employes in this country is that the service of each is credited with a high degree of efficiency. That is, the number of ton-miles of freight, and of passenger miles in the transportation of persons is very large as compared with the number of employes. But the dark side of the picture is seen in the accident statistics. From these it appears that one was killed out of every 357 employes, and one was injured out of every thirty-five. Considering trainmen alone there was one death for every 117 employes, and one injury for every twelve employed. One passenger in every 1,523,-133 was killed, and one passenger in every 220,024 was injured. In England only one employee out of every 875 is killed, and one out of every 158 injured. Of English trainmen one in 329 is killed, and one in thirty injured. Of English passengers one in 6,942,336 is killed, and one in 527,577 is injured.

On the whole the volume reflects the characteristically American development of our railroads. They have been built and are operated with wonderful energy, but also with astounding recklessness.

MAYOR DAVIDSON, of Baltimore, has taken a stand in favor of municipal ownership of gas and electric lighting plants. He has announced that in his forthcoming message he will recommend the performance of the service of public lighting by the city itself. A business man, Mayor Davidson views the question of municipal ownership of lighting plants from a business point of view. In his opinion the City of Baltimore could save between \$50,000 and \$75,000 a year by supplying itself with light. The cost of gas and electric lights to that city during the last year was \$234,851. The Mayor has estimated that the city can furnish itself with the same light at a cost of \$170,000 a year. It now pays 35 cents per night for each arc light, and \$1.25 per thousand for gas. Judging from this excessive charge-excessive as compared with the cost at which gas can be manufactured and at which electric light is supplied by many of our cities—the Mayor's estimate, it would seem, is a safe one. It is conceivable that \$1.25 per thousand might not be an excessive charge for gas in certain locations, but it is not only an excessive but an extortionate charge in the City of Baltimore, as the accompanying fact will show. The plant of the Consolidated Company, the leading gas company in Baltimore, can be duplicated, it is said on authority, for, at most, \$5,000,000. Yet the present stock and bonded indebtedness of this company, upon which it demands a profitable return, amounts to \$17,000,000. Speaking of the danger of municipal gas and electric lighting works degenerating into political jobbery, Mayor Davidson said: "There is no reason why a gas board cannot be found as honest and as capable as our water boards have always been." Baltimore is at least fortunate in having secured a Mayor who regards the interest of the city above that of private influential corporations.

ROM Baltimore to New York is not such a very long step; yet, making it, we find the Mayor of the Metropolis at loggerheads with the electric light companies (on account of extortionate demands for their services) and unable to see any way out of his difficulty except by throwing the city back to the use of gas, with the dimly-lighted gloom of a quarter of a century ago. Why does not Mayor Grant follow the example of Mayor Davidson and a score of other Mayors, who have found out that a city can do its own electric lighting at a cost of one-half, or even less, of what corporations charge? Why doesn't Mayor Grant take the very obvious step before him? For a city to supply itself with either gas or electricity is no longer an experiment. In this

country and in Europe there are scores of cities lit by the municipality with gas and electricity. The results of their experience is open to anyone for inspection; and we believe there is not a single case in which it will not be found that the city has been able to do its own lighting cheaper than any corporation would do it, and with greater satisfaction to the citizens. Mayor Davidson is simply bringing Baltimore into line with a movement which New York, sooner or later, will have to join. If there were any doubt about these facts, Mayor Grant might be excused for hesitating; but there are none.

Where Do We Stand?

HERE was a time when our Republicanism, then of a coarser fibre than now, delighted in contrasting its own severely virtuous simplicity with the gilded and vicious despotism of Aristocracy. The spirit of the old-time Fourth of July oration has not. by any means, yet departed from amongst us, though perhaps it is not quite so tonguey as in former days. We read about the profligacy and tyranny of vicious kings and licentious nobles, how the people were downtrodden, treated with contumely, taxed and despised, and then our republican spirit turns away her face piously to the West and thanks God that she is not as others are. In reading about the period of the French Revolution, of a nation heavily taxed by a corrupt government which gave them little for their money except Petite Trianon, Parc aux cerfs, galas at Versailles, and the frivolities of Madame de Pompadour, it is sometimes hard for us to believe that the political millennium has actually arrived; and it seems to us that the rule of Charles I. and his favorite, Buckingham, is as far from the order of to-day as the civilization of ancient Egypt. Yet, in all seriousness, we may ask whether some future Carlyle will not be able to find material in our present condition for a history not so very different from that which the Sage of Chelsea gave us of the French Rovolution. Of course, if this generation could read it, all would declare positively that it was not an accurate picture of our times, but that is probably what the average Frenchman of 1789 would say if he could peruse Carlyle's history.

Yet could it not be said of us that we were a nation wherein every necessity of life was heavily taxed; that this taxation certainly inured to the benefit of a very small class-though about onehalf the people believed it was for the advantage of everyone—that the poor man's clothes and blankets were taxed very much more heavily than the rich man's diamonds; that while there were millionaires who spent a small fortune in the decoration of a single bath-room, there were, in the City of New York alone, 150,000 women working fifteen hours a day for the sum of 60 cents; that under the guise of national gratitude-but really for political purposes-\$132,000,000 (a sum more than sufficient to maintain one of the largest standing armies the world has ever seen) was taken from the people by taxation; that Virtue and the Golden Rule were scoffed at in the national capital as an evanescent dream; and that in the great metropolis of the country, to such depths had the sentiments of citizens fallen, that the chief magistrate dared to intrust to a rum-seller the administration of one of the most important departments of justice. Our republicanism sternly denounces Charles I. and Buckingham, but with how much pride can we place beside them Patrick Divver, Quay and Dudley, Hill or

Perhaps it will be said, "Oh, this is selecting the evils of the hour and grouping them together to form a dark picture." But this is what we do in our picture of Aristocracy; in our picture of the French Revolution. There was progress and virtue and happiness then as now, and much of the evil done, was done in the name of God, just as it is to-day. There is no doubt that most of us, could we hear it, would be unable to comprehend the harshness of the judgment which posterity, trying us by standards very different from our own, will pass upon us.

We all see the evils of to-day; the danger lies in the tendency to regard them as trivial, temporary and accidental, as though it were possible for them to run their course and pass out of existence without materially affecting the condition of the nation or checking its steady advancement towards a higher civilization. No one who reads history aright can despair of "the people;" but, on the other hand, History teaches nothing with greater certainty than that no community can treat the Moral Law lightly in its public affairs and not suffer. As Guizot says: "A corrupted and weakened community breaks down in immense catastrophes;" and the question for us is: Are we living on the debris of the exalted beginnings of our national existence, or within the fair temple itself still unimpared and undefiled?

The Opinions of Others.

Griffin B. Disbrow thinks that 23d street, between 4th and 3d avenues, is destined to become an important business part of that street in the near future. Two private houses have already been taken for business purposes between 4th and Lexington avenues. The row on the south side being for the most part boarding houses which do not pay the owners an adequate

rental on their market value, it is not unlikely that the latter will succumb to the tempting offers made to them by investors and business men who wish to turn these private houses into business buildings. The plan of alterations in such cases appears to be to change the first story and basement into stores, the top floor into studios, and the intervening stories into bachelors' apartments. Mr. Disbrow thinks that the New York College could well afford to sell its property and move further up town. This would place a handsome 23d street front on the market, and some large emporium would be built there which would very soon cause the entire south side of the street, between 3d avenue and Broadway, to be changed into store

Men and Things.

There have been house-breakers who composed very fair poetry, tavernbrawlers who wrote some excellent dramas, and at least one murderer who left behind him a most interesting autobiography. Wicked or even loose habits of life can hardly be considered a necessary prerequisite of successful literary or artistic work; but numerous examples show but too conclusively that the former does not absolutely inhibit the latter. The manifold of human life is full of contradictions; one man in his time plays many parts, and, like Walter Bagehot, I have struggled hard to detect the relationship between the price of tallow and our immortal souls. Certain critics have professed that their artistic sensibilities were shocked by an adolescent playwright, who in a recently-produced drama combined the relentless Nemesis and the comic lover in one and the same person. But Nemeses and comic lovers, in spite of certain diversities of temperment, are alike in that they are both fools, and your ordinary avenger is a lucky nincompoop if he does not fall into a worse bathos than that of making silly love to a silly girl. And so it is that a man's profession, being sometimes but a small part of his life, has no necessary effect on his manner of living.

"Does a baker live on pie?

Is the tailor man a swell?

Does the poet with the Muses in a lovely valley dwell?"

All these questions have been asked by a rhymster in a little lyric not as yet given to the public; and I am compelled, in simple truth, to answer them in the negative. Thus I get back to my original assertion, that there have been house-breakers who were poets.

Be it observed, however, that these gentry were not house-breakers because they were poets, or poets because they were house-breakers. But we are living in an age of surprises, and at the present time in New York City we are treated to the spectacle of a great daily newspaper offering to its readers the contributions of a rum-seller because he is a rum-seller. know nothing about "Steve" Brodie personally. I believe that he has achieved distinction by his ability to fall from high places without hurting himself-a fact that mystifies the inference that he is weightier in his legs than he is in his head. This, doubtless, is one way to attain fame, and it is at least as unobjectionable as that of Katisha, whose elbow people came miles to see. If, by reason of the renown thus obtained, he can become so popular as to start a successful saloon on the Bowery, no one need object, except those who run unsuccessful saloons on the Bowery-a class with which I do not sympathize. I do not believe, however, that it would occur to anyone, except the editor of the World, that the occupations of bridge-jumping and saloon-keeping are such as qualify a man for literary or even journal istic work. It is said that cobblers are of a sceptical bent, because their work gives them ample time for reflection, and reflection breeds corrosive doubt. In the same way I can understand that the bearded lady (for instance) at a dime museum might find opportunities for minute observation of the obtrusive, coarse and baleful curiosity with which the many-headed people regard the sorry creatures who, through one of nature's mistakes, have been left in a state of empty individ-uality. But bridge-jumping offers no chances for observations of even the most disgusting phases of human character; and though saloon-keeping has its advantages in this respect, the saloon-keeper is not the man to make anything of the opportunities. What a fine humor there is in the manner in which Mr. Brodie affixes to his signature the initials "B. J." Surely, never was there such a wonderful use of titular initials since Peter Pangloss signed himself " LL D. and A. S. S." Soon, we shall have John L. Sullivan, "P. F.;" Nellie Bly, "G. T.;" E. S. Willard, "E. The great literary ass has seldom brayed much louder than this. The story is told of the Mahommedan who pointed out to his son a Parisian dandy in full bloom, saying: "See, my son, what you may become if you depart from the ways of Allah and Mahommed, his prophet." example could not be offered of the depths of absurdity to which a journal may be brought by setting up the false god of slavish pandering to all the silly vanities and prejudices of the people.

There is another aspect of this case of Brodie's which is worth consider-Magazines and newspapers alike are fiercely competing to obtain articles signed by good names, and book publishers are animated with precisely the same idea. It does not make any difference whether the articles or books are wise or foolish, so be it that the name of some lion can be advertised. Every attempt is made to attract attention and none to repay it. A silly book like MacAllister's is the biggest prize of the season. The man is a consummate ass and had nothing whatever to say, but his name was well-known and that was enough. The consequence is that celebrities sell their names and not their articles. This selling may take the dishonest form of passing off the scribblings of some literary back as the bona-fide roarings of a lion; or it may simply mean that your celebrity, finding that his name is all that is necessary, sends in to the editor some wretchedly perfunctory performance. Among the magazines the North American Review is suffering from an acute attack of this celebrity-mongering disease. A monthly review, if it has any distinctive function, should furnish its readers with the opinion of experts, who are not actively engaged in the work of legislation or reformation. Qualifications should, perhaps, be made to this statement; but the complete disregard of the principle inevitably makes a magazine degenerate into a parcel of political pamphlets. We all know what Henry Cabot Lodge thinks of the Force bill, what Major McKinley thinks of tariff bills, and what Speaker Reid thinks of deliberative assemblies. Magazine articles from their pens are simply repetitions of their public addresses. But articles by Judge Cooley on Federal control of Congressional elections, by R. T. Ely on the McKinley bill, or by John Fiske on deliberative assemblies, would present the opinions of experts who, being unhampered by the political situation or electioneering necessities, could give a larger view of the subject, based on a less biassed insight. If the magazines make such desperate efforts to obtain mere names, quite apart from the ability of the writers to set forth a different "point of view," what more natural than that the newspapers, engaged in the same occupation of making display headlines, should also cast about for people celebrated in even a less desirable way than Reid, McKinley and Lodge. "Steve" Brodie is doubtless as well known on the Bowery as the American Bismarck, and personally I do not doubt but that the former's opinions about life in London are as edifying as are the latter's on deliberative assemblies.

Senator Fassett to Mayor Grant.

AN INTERVIEW ON RAPID TRANSIT WITH THE CHAIRMAN OF THE INVESTI-GATING COMMITTEE.

Senator Fassett was called upon by a reporter of The Record and Guide a few days ago. The Senator's attention was called to the fact that Mayor Grant had announced his intention of having a bill introduced in the Legislature to solve the rapid transit problem in New York City.

"Of what character should such a bill be in order to be successfully carried through the Legislature?" asked the reporter.

"It should be of a distinctly non-partisan character. In order that such a bill may pass it is absolutely necessary that the powers incidental to the carrying out of such an important measure should be placed in the hands of men of great ability and of the very highest integrity, men to whose hearts the interests of New York City is emphatically greater than that of any party. If Mayor Grant has a bill introduced on the lines laid down in the measure introduced by me last session-a measure approved by the press of both parties-it will have a chance of passing. The Republicans and Democrats were agreed as to the machinery for carrying out a rapid transit plan, the point of difference being that of giving Mayor Grant the appointment of commissioners, without his indicating to the public, beforehand, who those commissioners were to be. If he had told us who his appointees would be, and had selected men whom all parties would have recognized as being of the highest standing and integrity, irrespective of politics, there would have been no difficulty about passing a rapid transit bill last year. But not knowing who would be appointed, we were unwilling to place the power in the hands of Mayor Grant and his party of carrying out a great plan for rapid transit which might involve an expenditure of anywhere from \$60,000,000 to \$120,000,000 or more. If we can get an assurance that the commissioners who may be appointed under any rapid transit bill, will be men who will not use their office, by any manner of means, for political ends, that is all we will ask. I suppose I am as rabid a Republican as there is in the State; yet I think that the question of rapid transit is of such importance to the metropolis that I almost think I would be willing to see a commission of Democrats, provided I knew they were men of the highest integrity who would never think for a moment of using their office, or allowing it to be used, to further the interests of any party."

"Do you think the chances favor the passage of a rapid transit bill dur-

ing the forthcoming session?"
"I think so," was the reply; "the chances are that the coming Legislature will pass such a bill. It is a shame that it was not passed last winter. If Mayor Grant had been as anxious for rapid transit as he was to appoint rapid transit commissioners, we would have had a bill passed. I am fully alive to the imperative necessity of rapid transit for the people of New York and I shall do all in my power to have a bill passed to that end. But the commissioners must be men whose names shall be announced beforehand, so that the public shall have a guarantee that there is to be no politics in it."

WHAT MAYOR GRANT SAYS.

A reporter of THE RECORD AND GUIDE called on Mayor Grant to get an outline of the bill which he is about to introduce in the Legislature.

"I am unable, at present," said the Mayor, " to tell you the character of the bill. I shall not be prepared to make any statement to the press for a week or ten days yet."

On being urged to state whether the bill would be on the same lines his bill of last year, the Mayor said:

"I do not wish to say this definitely, but I think it will be on the same lines. I may probably name beforehand the commissioners to go in the bill."

On being informed of Senator Fassett's statement that he wanted Mayor Grant to elect men who would not be likely to use their office for political purposes the Mayor said:

"I can only say that the men whom I will name as commissioners will be outside of politics, and they will be of the same character as Messrs. Steinway, Belmont and the other commissioners whom I appointed. When their names are given to the public I think everyone will be satisfied that they are men of the highest standing and that there will not be any likelid of their using their positions for political purposes."

"No one in this city is more anxious for rapid transit than I am," said the Mayor, in conclusion, "and I shall do everything in my power to have a bill passed this session that will give it to us,"

A Riverside Hom

(See Illustration, page 47 of Supplement.)

Although the Astors, Vanderbilts and others of important standing in the financial and social worlds have driven along Riverside nue time and again and have appreciated its value for residential purposes, the ties of local association on the line of 5th avenue have been stronger than the inducement of a superb outlook over park, cliff, mountain and water. It has been reserved for those of our citizens less wealthy than the magnates named to select for their homes the avenue which no Yorker will deny offers the finest outlook for a residence in New

York City.

The character of the homes erected on Riverside Drive is such that they would attract attention on 5th avenue, were they located on that thoroughfare. They are not only noticeable, generally, from an architectural point of view, but they have cost anywhere up to a quarter of a mill-

The residence referred to at the head of this article is one of the homes that stand out prominently along the Drive. It was built for Wm. F. Foster, on the corner of 102d street, and it is different, both architecturally and structurally, from the other houses on the Drive. In architecture it represents the Italian Renaissance, as will be noticed in our illustration. In construction it is peculiarly exceptional, in so far as it has a front of iron. Few who glance at the illustration would recognize this, and only

an expert would discern it on driving past the house.

The application of an iron front to a brick interior wall has rarely been attempted with a private house. Indeed, the writer knows of no other sidence of note in New York City where it has been tried. It is certainly a great success. Mr. Foster wanted to duplicate an Italian villa which he had seen and admired in Italy. The American climate would not admit of the same material being used as in Italy, and iron was the best substitute. The best business structures in this country are of iron, and Mr. Foster decided to use it. On account of the difficulty in getting good work in iron his architect strenuously opposed it, telling him that all architects would pronounce it a mistake. Foster's reply was, "I am not building my home to please architects, and if everyone in New York opposes it it shall be built of iron." He examined many business structures and found that the best had been erected by the well-known firm of Cheney & Hewlett, and to them he gave the contract. Experts pronounce it the best job of iron-work in the United States, and Mr. Foster is very enthusiastic in praise of the contractors. The wonder why so few people appreciate this beautiful location applies equally to the use of iron as a building material for residences. The best specimens of stone absorb , chip, crumble, and rapidly become imperfect, while the beautiful fluted columns and carvings of this house defy climatic affections, and will remain perfect for ages. There are other advantages. Between the iron and brick is a four-inch air-space acting as a non-conductor which keeps the house cool in summer, warm in winter, and always absolutely dry.

Mr. Foster has taken advantage of this feature, and by inserting a register in every room, connecting with the air-space, obtains the most

perfect system of ventilation.

The residence on the inside is very spacious and handsomely appointed.

On the south side there is a large parlor, with a library in the rear, while on the north side there is a reception-room, which leads into a handsome dining-room, adjoining which are the culinary departments. The central hallway divides the two sets of rooms and gives access to them all.

The second floor contains four large hedrooms, with dressing-rooms and bath-room attached, on the saloon plan. Here the full view opens upon us and makes us realize the beauty and picturesqueness of the scenery. Directly in front is the winding Riverside Drive, with the beautiful park, and the bridle and footpaths to the west. Then appears the noble Hudson with its ever-passing fleet of craft, both steem and sail. Beyond are the Palisades with their rocky heights dotted here and there with a solitary building, while in the distance the view merges on the horizon into the lines of the upper Palisades.

Ascending to the third floor we find, if anything, even a more extended view, taking in as far as the Orange mountains on a clear day. On this the arrangement of the rooms is similar to that on the floor below, with the exception that it includes servants' bedrooms.

The woodwork in the interior is of hardwood, the preponderating trim being of oak.

The approach to the house is quite imposing. It is accomplished by the cent of a handsome flight of stairs, at the head of which appears a spacious portico, surmounted by a balcony, which ought to form a delightful ng place in the cool of a summer's eve. Notable features of the front are the bay windows running from basement to roof, and the balustrade which surmounts the roof cornice. The lawn terrace in front of the house makes a pleasant foreground.

It is so much the custom in New York City to build houses "squat" upon et or avenue that it is a pleasure to see some houses surrounded by grounds. Mr. Foster, who occupies the house above described, has wisely set it on a large plot of ground, so that his home not only appears to advantage, but it makes it impossible for his view of the river and Palisades to be cut off one jot or tittle, either to the north or south. The house stands on eight city lots, and had the Vanderbilt, Tiffany, Huntington, Whitney and other residences been similarly situated their charm would have been greatly enhanced to all lovers of the beautiful and the appropriate.

The Increase in Traffic on the West Side Elevated Road.

The following table shows the rate of increase on the different roads on the East and West Sides. From this it appears that the increased traffic on the Sixth Avenue line was nearly as great as on all the other lines together, while the increase on the West Side roads was nearly double that of the East Side. The comparisons in the table are for the year 1890 as compared with 1889.

The Christian Brothers' Purchase at Irvington.

The forty-three acres at Irvington were sold by Cyrus W. Field and wife to John Jacob Astor, subject to certain conditions and restrictions, with a special covenant as a part of the deed by which Astor, for himself, his heirs and assigns, covenanted not to erect or maintain, or suffer to be erected or maintained, on any part of the premises any nuisance or anything objectionable to the neighboring inhabitants, or any school, asylum, hospital or public institution.

The premises and three acres (claimed to be unrestricted) were subsequently sold by John Jacob Astor and wife to William Clarence Martin and Charles Grayson Martin (Martin & Bro) by deed, containing a recital that the same were subject to the same conditions and restrictions contained in the deed from Cyrus W. Field and wife to John Jacob Astor.

It is rumored on good authority that the Christian Brothers (a Catholic institution) have purchased the forty-three-acre tract, the three-acre tract formerly Alex Hamilton's, and claimed to be unrestricted, with nineteen acres which Mrs. Laura B. Field sold and conveyed to John Jacob Astor during his lifetime.

It is understood that the Christian Brothers claim not to be a public institution, although, in view of the decisions of the Court of Appeals, the pure fact that an institution is sectarian does not alter its character as a public institution. Mr. Field claims that inasmuch as the advertisements of the De La Salle Institute and Manhattan College, both describe these institutions as schools and both have a primary department for small boys, and that both Webster and Worcester as well as other dictionaries define a college as a school and a school as a college, the attempted purchase is in defiance and disregard of his rights, which are clearly established by law and precedent.

Further than this, Mr. Field asserts, the institutions have not legal or corporate power to hold real estate or any kind of property, except for the strict uses for which they are incorporated. In other words, the institutions which propose to purchase the forty-three acres can only hold the same for certain uses, which uses are in express and direct and absolute violation and direct and of the restrictions and covenants contained in the deed from Field to Astor and Astor to Martin.

The claim that if no buildings are erected on the forty-three acres that the same can be used for park purposes, recreation grounds, etc., is a mere subterfuge. Surely one would be just as much use for "school" purposes and for a "public institution" as the erection of a sanitary school house or any other purpose.

We hear that the parties offered Mr. Field \$10,000 cash, which was refused, and were willing, if necessary, to pay \$20,000 cash for a release of the restrictions. Mr. Field notified all the parties in interest of the restrictions and that he would hold Mr. Astor and his assigns each and all responsible for any breach of the conditions and invoke the aid of the law to the fullest extent in support of his rights, legal and equitable.

IRVINGTON.

As a direct illustration of the damage and danger threatened to and expected by the neighbors, we learn that General Thomas has definitely abandoned the construction on two new houses, the stone for which had in large part already been carried upon the grounds of his estate.

The General has given up all idea of building anything at present. Merely the repairs on the interior of his house will be done.

Personal.

Edgar Williams, who has been with the Real Estate Exchange for six years, has been appointed to a position with the Real Estate Loan and Trust Company.

The Manhattan Road Sues the City.

The Manhattan Road has entered suit against the city to recover \$900,000 for failure on the part of the corporation to keep its contract to secure to the company's lines the unobstructed right of way to the streets. This sum represents the damages which the road has had to pay to property-owners.

The Society for the Protection of Police Justices.

The Society for the Protection of Police Justices held its semi-annual eeting as usual at O'Toole's rumshop in the basement of No. 1389 Bowery. Patrick Didder was called upon to preside, in honor of his recent elevation to the Bench. The meeting was a very "full" one, and great enthusiasm was manifested in the result of the proceedings. Taking the chair Mr. Didder said that during the course of his active life he had often found himself in higher society and, he had to confess, he had often been in lower society; but he declared he never was so congenially fixed as at the moment. The Mayor had "Honored" him, he continued; and now those present had honored him, though in a different way. He knew he was on the road to distinction-he had a good rumshop (though he wasn't seeking an advertisement on that score) and a strong organization behind him, so that in a word he was "boyed" to hope that greater things were ahead for him. He did not know what the subject before the meeting that evening was, but he took the liberty to suggest "the rumshop as a school for Judges and Statesmen." They taiked of churches and schools and all that sort of stuff in the last election; but he wanted to know who came out on top. (Tremendous cheering.) I don't think, he said, I am giving away anything when I say this city of New York can't be run without some little understanding with us. (Cries of "Guess not! Go it, Didder.") No, boys, said the speaker, we're here for business, and I'm not going to take up time; but I would like to say a word on a personal matter. A friend read to me out of some of those dude papers that I wasn't fit to be a Police Justice. I'd like to ask the dude that wrote that why I'm not fit. Haven't I served the organization? (Cries, "You have.") Haven't I put up the needful? Well, then, why ain't I fit.' (Cries, "You are.") Some fool says I ought to be a trained lawyer and a judge of character, as though I've got to judge character. I guess I know most of the toughs in these parts as well as any man here.

Two rather fine questions of ethics were then discussed by the meeting:

(1) Ought a Judge "send up" anyone who became intoxicated on his (the Judge's) premises? (2) Is it part of a Judge's function to settle old "scores" with a prisoner? The first of these problems was decided in the negative, the latter in the affirmative, but only if the "charge" had been on the slate for more than a month.

Police Justice Gallagher then addressed those present. He said: "In his opinion it was full time that some hadge or sign were adopted to distinguish Police Justices. Over and over again in his Court it had happened that he had been mistaken by lawyers and witnesses for the prisoner. He thought the Bench should be so marked that this could not occur. He would recommend that large signs be used with the words, 'This is the Judge;' and 'This is the prisoner' on them, and then he thought no confusion could very well occur. He didn't think he looked any more like a criminal than those around him at the moment. Yet several lawyers had mistaken him during the week."

Several members present confessed that their experience was similar to His Honor, Gallagher's, and after some discussion a resolution was unanimously passed, asking the Board of Estimate and Appertionment to set aside enough money to purchase the necessary signs. A resolution to add to the sign the address of the magistrate's saloon was also adopted. The meeting then adjourned to the bar.

One of the oldest operators in the market, whose judgment is held in the highest estimation, in a talk with a representative of THE RECORDAND GUIDE some months ago, said: "Lots are selling much lower now on the Boulevard than they will probably be selling for a few years hence. About thirty years ago I remember that a lot on a corner of the Boulevard and 71st street, I forget the exact corner, sold for \$32,500; now it would hardly bring \$22,500. Boulevard lots would be selling higher if New York had not been overbuilt. This has had the effect of keeping down the values of lots in many sections. It is curious to see how street lots near the Boule-

vard are selling as well as the Boulevard lots themselves."
"Do you think rapid transit along the Boulevard would help values?"
asked the writer.

"It wouldn't hurt values," was the reply. "Yet, rapid transit will not do everything. There must be the demand, and very few people are now going up that way. There ought to be a concerted movement on the part of Boulevard property-owners to restrict their lots. This would give security to buyers that no nuisances will be built next door to them, and would help to build up the Boulevard. The only thing that has kept up building elsewhere on the West Side is the plethora of money and the risk taken by institutions who have more funds on hand than they know what to do with."

"What do you think is likely to be the character of the Boulevard ten years hence?" ventured the writer.

"I can't tell that," was the reply. "I find that I am wrong half the time in my suppositions about realty, and I have learned to have little respect for my own opinions on real estate futures."

HOW NINTH AVENUE LOTS HAVE ADVANCED.

The following history of the sales of two 9th avenue lots within the last ten years will prove interesting reading. Some of our readers who do not pay much attention to values of various property will no doubt be surprised to find an increase of over 900 per cent in a period covering less than ten years. It may be remarked, however, that the lots quoted were sold in the year 1875 with four lots close by for a total of \$72,000, or an average of \$12,000 aplece. It will also be noticed that the increase during the last five years is greater than during the preceding five, for the sales show an advance of \$13,000 between 1879 and 1855, against an increase of \$24,250, between the years 1885 and the last sale made. In the City Departments.

Proceedings have been begun for the opening of Audubon avenue, from 165th to 175th street.

In the College Place improvement matter the commissioners have resumed their sessions, at 45 William street, with the taking of testimony on the part of the city as to the value of the buildings and lands to 140 taken.

Commissioners are trying to ascertain the cost of extending Manhattan street, from 12th avenue to the bulkhead line. The Fort Lee Ferry Company, whose lease of the property has less than a year to run, is endeavoring to secure damages for its interests.

The Board of Street Opening and Improvement referred to Commissioner Gilroy, of the Department of Public Works, the matter of street openings and improvements in the large Washington Heights district north of 165th street to Inwood and west of the Kingsbridge road.

The project for a small park at 53d street and 11th avenue, extending to the water front, was indshuitely postponed yesterday by the Board of Street Opening and Improvement.

A petition to open 150th street, from 10th to 11th avenues, was yesterday referred to the Commissioner of Public Works.

A resolution providing for the opening of 166th street, between 10th and Edgecombe avenues, was adopted by the Board of Street Opening and Improvement yesterday, the entire expense to fall upon the adjoining property-owners.

The wishes of Washington Heights property-owners to have the French Boulevard improved only 60 or 75 feet wide instead of 100, its full width, until such time at least as the district shall have been substantially improved, were stated to the Board of Street Opening and Improvement yesterday by Mr. Haven; but the board appeared to think that any change from the original programme would involve the city in legal and financial entanglements, and refused to favor the suggestion.

A strong delegation of property-owners from the Annexed District

appeared before the Board of Street Opening and Improvement yesterday and pressed upon the board the necessity of opening Tremont avenue, from the old McComb's Dam avenue to the Boston road. The scheme of improvement includes the widening of the avenue 30 feet. Fire Commiseioner Henry D. Purroy, Richard Hamilton and Fordham Morris were the advocates of the improvement, resolutions favoring which were adopted by the board of 1884, resulting in the practical tying up of the property ever since

The road is 11.021 feet—over two miles in length—and the board has heretofore refused to open it because the annexation act imposes half the cost of the necessary property upon the city at large. But because of the importance of this avenue, connecting as it does the old villages of West Farms, Tremont and High Bridge, and because it is the last avenue in the district over a mile in length that the board will be called upon to open and widen, the board resolved, by way of exception, to adopt the resolution. The improvement is estimated to cost \$200,000.



Bids on the Criminal Court Building.

The Commissioners of the Sinking Fund on Wednesday opened the bids for furnishing materials and performing work in the erection and completion of the steam-heating, ventilation and elevator work required for the new Criminal Court building. The names of the bidders and the amounts of their respective bids were as follows: The Q. N. Evans Construction Company, \$187,835; Enoch & Rutzler, \$193,832; Peter Backus, \$201,560. On resolution of the Recorder, the determination as to which of the bids, if any, should be accepted, was referred to the Comptroller and the Commissioner of Public Works, with a request that they examine the proposals and report to the board thereon as soon as practicable.

Amos F. Eno's Motion Denied.

Before Judge Andrews, in the Supreme Court, Special Term, Edwin Milchell, for Amos R. Eno, renewed a motion to waive all claims for past damages against the "L" roads, and for the assessment of the fee value of the property, owned by Mr. Eno, at Nos. 87 to 91 and 95 to 97 South 5th avenue, demanding, at the same time, that the Court grant an absolute injunction against the defendants running their road in front of his premises.

Mr. Gardiner, one of the counsel for the elevated roads, called attention to the fact that the elevated roads had been built past the property in suit in 1876, and had been in operation since 1878; yet, ten years after, in 1888, Mr. Euo deliberately purchased the property and improved it, and now, in 1890, brings suit to restrain the operation of the road in front of the premises.

Judge Andrews, in denying the application, said that he saw no reason why Eno's case should not take the same course as the other cases on the calendar. Mr. Gardiner offered, on the suggestion of the Court, to take the case to a referee, who might be named by his honor, to which Mr Mitchell agreed.

Real Estate Department.

The market generally remains dull but firm. This time of the year is usually a dull period in real estate and the prevailing conditions are not such as to alter the character of the month of December. The activity, where there has been such, has been confined mainly to trading, and some of these transactions are reported in our "Gossip" column. Others are not yet consummated, while the remainder have been kept so secret their full significance will not be known until the filing of the deeds. The opinions of those best informed in real estate matters differs as to the real condition and future prospects of the market. Some of the brokers seem to think that the present market has no bottom, and that foreclosure suits innumerable will be the order of the day, while others as positively assert that things never looked brighter and that the present dullness is simply consequent on the near approach of the holidays and the lack of confidence in all business, which they say is now rapidly passing away. In support of their position they point to the strength of the market, the inquiries which they say are being made and the easier loan market. At auction nothing of importance has been sold, and there promises to be no revival of activity until the latter half of

A lot in the 23d Ward sold in a partition suit was the only auction busi ness transacted on Monday. The two other sales announced were adjourned.

The attendance at the Exchange on Tuesday was very large, occasioned, doubtless, by the numerous interesting announcements. The property attracting the largest crowd was, of course, the five lots on which Oscar Hammerstein proposed to erect his Murray Hill Theatre, two of them on 42d street and three on 41st street, west of 6th avenue. Mr. Hammerstein took the lots in trade last year for his Kaiser Wilhelm flats, on 7th avenue, between 136th and 137th streets. The figures at which the lots were put in, mentioned at the time, was \$250,000. There is a mortgage now on the property of \$155,000. The lots are excavated and can be improved immediately. The first bid of \$175,000 was made by R. E. Dowling, representing Henry Morgenthau. The figure quickly advanced by bids of \$5,000 and \$2,500, until \$236,000 was reached, when the property was knocked down to E. L. Brown. It was generally believed on 'Change that E. L. Brown represented Mr. Hammerstein, and the lots were bought in for that gentleman. A partition sale, by order of the Superior Court, attracted considerable attention. It included No. 13 Barrow street, which sold at \$12,700; two five-story flats on 34th street, east of 10th avenue, which sold at \$24,100 and \$24,500, and a four-story tenement and stores on 10th avenue, south of 50th street, which sold for \$23,000. In the way of foeeclosure sales the southeast corner of 7th avenue and 121st street, a fiv story flat with stores, 23x100.11, sold at \$60,500, as against \$57,774, the

amount due on the property.

The offerings on Wednesday included nothing of particular interest.

One week ago to-day we announced the suspension of one of the largest material firms in the city, and since then a large brick manufacturer of New Jersey has succumbed, with heavy liabilities reported. The latter is a matter of no moment as an influence upon the market, but drew out considerable comment and criticism upon the methods that appear to have led up to the result. The sudden stoppage of the building material concern was alike a surprise and a blow of more or less severity to a large proportion of operators in bulk lots of stock as the liabilities were scattered pretty well around among the trade. The effect has been natural, and while no evidence of positive apprehension is expressed regarding other dealers, it would be folly to deny that a little nervousness and increased caution have dominated most negotiations since. Toward the firm in trouble, however, we find a remarkable unanimity of generous sentiment extended which inclines to take a very practical turn by expressing a willingness to listen to any reasonable basis for settlement. The firm evi-dently became tied up through impossibility of mak-ing collections and the difficulties in obtaining the banking accommodation necessary to help them, and the suspension therefore assumes the phase of an the trade we could hear no dissent from the opinion that if the creditors are lenient and afford the proper time not one dollar will be lost. Confidence in the firm has always been strong through its regular business methods, backed up by the general personal popularity of the individual members.

BRICKS.—It has not been much of a market apparently, and so far as natural influences are concerned we find very little that is really new. Arrivals have been irregular and not over abundant at any time, yet whenever a call developed there appeared to be plenty of stock awaiting it and sellers satisfied to accept former rates when bid. Probably, on the whole, demand was curtailed somewhat, the hard storm and its after influence retarding work, and dealers now investing only as they find an opportunity to turn stock over promptly. The failures in the trade have also proven a factor of more or less moment as an unsetting feature and possibly had a tendency to draw the

ine of dealing rather closer. So far as the suspension in the manufacturing division of the market was concerned it seemed to create only natural comment and discussion as to causes and the probable outcome, with an opinion expressed that production will eventually go right along under charge of the assignee at first, and possibly on resumption in the end; but in the matter of the large material concern forced to the wall contact with the market is more direct, as most dealers are affected. The expression of feeling is sympathetic toward those in trouble with an evident desire to act just as leniently as circumstances will admit, on the assumption that it is the surest way to obtain satisfactory settlement. However, the moral effect is a little disturbing and operators generally move with an increased degree of caution natural under the circumstances. From along the river advices indicate very doubtful shipments from any point above the "Bay," and the way the weather acts a chance that the latter may become shut off, but no doubt that so long as they have the opportunity manufacturers will continue to send stock forward. The offering of desirable quality of Jerseys is not very full and rates remain firm.

LATH.—The market does not appear to have chapged a particle. Arrivals were somewhat fuller, for negotiation found a prompt demand and commanded full former rates without difficulty. Offerings affoat are still of limited proportions with agents apparently indifferent about tendering them until reported here, owing to almost a certainty that value will go no lower and a good chance of getting some advance. but most of them under engagement, and those free

LUMBER.-Altogether it has been a quiet and uneventful market. Into the consumptive outlet some deliveries are made occasionally on new orders, but eventful market. Into the consumptive outlet some deliveries are made occasionally on new orders, but mainly in the way of meeting contracts, and the general line of calculations is based upon the assumption that demand will not amount to much until after the turn of the year at least. The same general features prevail in regard to bulk lots, a major portion of the moderate arrivals coming to hand under engagement, and very few really new deals taking place, probably as much for want of supply as anything, as the indications are that really attractive offerings of standard stock would meet with attention to some extent, and command rates well up to the figures for some time prevailing. Those features, however, most certainly represent exceptional conditions, as in the majority of cases buyers prefer to stand off during the balance of this month at least, and sellers do not feel over anxious to force them from that position, all hands having become more cautious than ever since the tide of financial distress has struck some of the apparent strongest operators in the building material trade.

Eastern Spruce is in demand. Buyers do not openly admit this and some claim to be altogether indifferent toward the cargo market, but there are evidences that anything in the way of a really standard character would secure attention and command at least the rates for some time current, a great many dealers having room for considerable addition to their accumulation and feeling more or less anxious to fill it on belief in a good distributive trade before any of the next cut can be marketed. The steam mills are understood to be sawing on special orders only and at an advance of 50c. per M since the close of navigation. Reports recently at hand assert that preparations have been made for very extensive operations in the Maine woods this winter, some concerns proposing to cut double the quantity of logs as against the product of last year.

Hemlock is not very active, but firm enough, as the cause of the quiet feeling is rather through scantiness of offering than actual absence of demand, Manufacturers are well sold up to present production, and some of them quite ahead and feel no great anxiety about entering upon new contracts, especially as the general indications regarding getting out logs and the production therefrom point to a somewhat higher plane of cost, both of Pennsylvania and State goods. The general spirit of caution prevailing in trade circles is also a factor to check negotiations to some extent.

White Pine has its natural proportion of such trade as may be doing on the consuming outlet, and also meets with more or less demand for shipment, with now and then an order placed for car lots. Generally, however, the market is only a moderately active one, and there is a sort of non-committal ambiguous expression among all classes of operators that for the time being makes the position a nominal one, and hardly worthy of any very extended notice. Sellers admit that it would be necessary to sell cheaply just now, and therefore the most natural and best plan is to wait and see how affairs shape after the turn of the year.

Yellow Pine does not change in any important particular. Now and then there is a demand either for cargo or car lots and some specials are under consideration, but as a whole buyers are not anxious and are inclined to figure closely both as to cost and quantity. Manufacturers are reported as retaining confidence and some such feeling is certainly reflected in the attitude assumed by selling agents here, but in common with all holders of merchandise at the present time they have a market upon which a reaching out for custom means a considerable sacrifice on the value of goods.

In a recent review of the pitch pine trade the London Timber Trades Journal says:

Things in the pitch pine trade appear at present to be rather quiet; buyers are few and far between, but the stocks in hand of sawn stuff being comparatively moderate we do not think they would turn a deaf ear to any favorable offers. It must be borne in mind that the stocks disposed of at the recent auctions have not generally gone into consumption, so that the market is actually not relieved of their pressure; this cannot fail to be an obstacle in the way of cargo buying. * *

We understand a few cargoes are in the market, but, as before remarked, there is little chance of their being snapped up except at very low figures. It is quite likely that shippers' agents here have instructions to offer them outside the London market; as most of the charters are at this time of year to order, there is not likely to be any difficulty on that head, and if they can find a better market at some of the large outports, we may be assured nobody here in London will regret it. The quantity of hewn and sawn timber shipped from the Southern States of America is fully up to the average, the stocks in hand of the former being somewhat heavier than the demand warrants. The sawn wood. coming as it does now in big sizes, does away with the necessity of importing such large quantities of the hewn, and, consequently, we must expect to see a decrease in the consumption of the latter. Nearly all the hewn that has been sold in the public auctions this year has gone considerably below the cost price.

We noticed a short time since a decided stiffening of values for this class of timber, but pitch pine seems to have been even more sensitive to the monetary difficulties of the past week or two than Baltic stuff. We suppose that, with respect to the latter, it has gone so low that it can hardly fi

Carolina Pine is generally held with steadiness and there seems to be a fair effort to adapt the offering to the somewhat reduced wants of the situation. It is of course not a season to expect much trade and a dull market may rule for some little time to come, though there seems to be a hope that this class of stock may be found useful in place of other descriptions that are a little costly through scanty supply. As all consumption of wood is limited at the present moment there is really no fair test obtained.

Hardwoods have very little new or natural demand at the moment. There would probably be an outlet provided for anything in the way of strictly choice goods, as dealers have never hesitated to lay away such stock when they can find it, but buyers are not in a waiting position, and for a while, at least, could get along without a really fresh offering. There seems to be just about as good figures as ever making on the distributive outlet, and over bulk lots a steady tone is also quoted for all leading or standard descriptions of stock, but that, of course, is only a natural position for sellers to assume and the market is m reality a mominal one awaiting a more thorough test. Reports from primary points develap nothing of a very decided character snd the hardwood trade is apparently quiet all over the country.


