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Record and Guide.



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THE stock market has been dull and irregular throughout the past week. Both business and speculation are waiting for the beginning of the new year, and waiting with no very confident feeling. It is not an easy matter for business men to recover from the effects of such a shaking-down as the one which recently occurred. The very strong can, of course, take advantage of a market like the present; but those who have been weakened by losses or discouraged by the lack of immediate recovery take ime to regain confidence. There does not seem at the present time to be any very threatening clouds on the financial sky. Money ought to begin to return from the West; and the rate situation, whatever the croakers may say, never looked brighter. There may be some significance in the fact, also, that the past season has not been a good one for retail shops. Expensive lines of goods, which were laid in to meet the Christmas demand, have frequently proved to be almost unsalable. Another circumstance which indicates a lack of ready money, is the disastrous theatrical season. More than a hundred combinations which started out on the road this fall have been obliged to break up, owing to poor receipts. Such facts do not speak well for the ability of the people to spend much surplus money. The rise in prices under the McKinley tariff may partially explain the matter.

**F**REQUENT references have been made in these columns to the threatening condition of the relations between labor and capital in Great Britain. During the past week a strike has been started which, if it spreads, may have the same disastrous consequences as that of the dock laborers. About nine thousand men employed by the various railroads in Scotland have quitted work, and the trade of that country has already been unfavorably affected. The cabled reports have so far been too meagre to judge of the full extent of the disagreement, the amount of bitterness manifested on both sides, and the possibility of the strike spreading; but coming as the strike does immediately after a most unfortunate contest between the Scotch ironmasters and their employes, the result may be worse than is at present anticipated. In 1889 the strikes in Great Britain were twice as numerous as during the previous year, 1,145 having been recorded. Of these 476 were successful, 368 partially successful, 207 unsuccess ful, and 94 of unknown result. Such facts as these must tend to give employes confidence in their ability to force their employers into acquiescence with their demands. The stock market in London, although affected by the strike, has been like that of this citydull, but firm. Argentines still remain the principle instruments of speculation, and their price varies with the prospects of an agreement among the various classes of security-holders. In Paris, also, the market has been dull. M. Rouvier, after considerable conces sions to the Chambers, has managed to make the two ends of his Budget meet. The French wine interests have been more prosperous in 1890 than in 1889, the production having risen from 23,233,572 hectolitres of twenty-two gallons each, to 27,416,327. The latter, however, is still below the average of the five years past, which was 29,677,095 hectol'tres. In Berlin and Vienna the condition of affairs has not varied much. Speculation is moderate the world over, and the tendency of prices rather upward than downward. Everywhere, however, the future is regarded with distrust rather than with hope.

**E** VEN the bitterest opponents of Tammany have not been able to find fault with Mayor Grant's new Rapid Transit Commission. Ordinarily our chief magistrate, in contemplating his appointees, is obliged to rest satisfied with Touchstone's observation respecting his lady love, "an ill-favored thing, but mine own." It is encouraging to notice, however, that both the Mayor and his opponents are coming to the conclusion that the time for trifling is over. Tammany probably appreciates the fact that a welldevised rapid transit system will be an excellent record wherewith to go to the people in 1892, and the Republicans must see that there is more loss than gain in pursuing a policy of factious

opposition. The new commission, which, presumably, is the one which have the carrying out of the provisions of any bill which is sed, possess all the requirements insisted on by Senator Fassett in his interview with a reporter of this paper. This bill, according to the latest information, is not simply a copy of the Mayor's bill of last session, but will contain the best features of the Fassett bill. Furthermore, the Mayor is said to have received the assurance of earnest support from many Republican Senators and Assemblymen to the measure, as outlined. It would thus seem as if the promised land was fairly within sight. Our experience in this matter does not tend to make us hopeful; but this much can be said-that never were the prospects fairer. Senator Fassett, it is true, may differ with the commissioners as to which are the "best features" of his bill which the Mayor's bill will retain. He will be right in insisting upon a provision for the ultimate reversion of any system to the city. There can be but little doubt that the city ought to own, if not to operate, any new lines of transit; but if that is impossible, the next best thing is the establishment of a sinking fund, which in time will return to the public a franchise which a private company will use without risk. Senator Fassett will also be right if not popular in stipulating that provision should be made for an immediate extension of the Manhattan system. The need for increased facilities is so urgent that real estate values in this city would be seriously hurt by the postponement of any relief until the new system is constructed and is in operation. We do not say that Senator Fassett would be justified in prohibiting the passage of any bill which did not contain provisions bearing on these points, but he should make an earnest effort to have them incorporated.

THE passage of a bill, however, as Geo. S. Lespinasse recently said in an interview with a reporter of the Evening Post, will not give us rapid transit. The new commissioners must be sufficiently skilled in financial matters to know that no company or set of capitalists would assume the present responsibilities of the Manhattan Company for the sake of its emoluments. If any part of the system is to be elevated, the question of damages to property must be settled in some equitable manner. This is one of the greatest difficulties still remaining to be overcome. The treatment which the Manhattan Company has received alike from private individuals and public authorities has been outrageous. Already the cry is being raised that Jay Gould will use his money at Albeny to prevent the passage of any measure looking towards increased facilities, in face of the fact that it is obviously to his advantage not to oppose but to control the construction of any new system. We have faith that men like Frederic P. Olcott, Samuel Spencer and John H. Starin have too much sense to participate in the silly abuse which is being showered on the Manhattan Company. They must know what the real attitude of its managers is, how far it is necessary to assist Mr. Gould in providing the immediate increase of facilities needed, and how far it is necessary to limit by public supervision his control of any future system. The curse of this city is a parcel of silly newspapers and senseless officials who will not see how far they themselves are responsible for the evils against which they so vehemently protest. Mark the following most wise utterance which appeared in the Tribune of December 26th:

As the miserable victims of the present system are violently propelled by impatient crowds through passages so narrow that the walls almost burst from the strain of compressed humanity—as they are shot out by the force behind upon scanty platforms covered with struggling, writhing forms, many in danger of being pushed over the edges upon the rails—as some hang wearily upon the straps in the cars, while others, unable even to get the support of a strap, are trembling with exhaustion, and are only saved from falling by the fact that they are so wedged together in the insufficient space that there is no room for them to fall—as our citizens are daily subjected to such annoyances and sufferings, they are not inclined to favor any further grants to the elevated railroads.

In other words, they are not inclined to consider a proposition which, if carried out, would alone give them immediate and satisfactory relief. The present condition of things is bad enough, in all conscience; but childish over-statements such as those contained in the above extract suggest that the writer must have been under the influence of too much plum-pudding. Everything indicates that the Manhattan Company is not able materially to increase its facilities; but is obliged to put on only such extra trains as will prevent an absolute congestion of traffic. We should not be in favor of giving the company its "loop," unless under certain stipulations as to an increase of trains in proportion to the number of passengers. The Manhattan Company would have every reason to assent to such a proposal.

BEFORE THE RECORD AND GUIDE is again issued, the Block Indexing Bill, passed by the Legislature of 1889, will have taken effect. We give in another column the new land maps of the city, on which the operation of the act is based. The maps, as explained elsewhere, do no more than show the thirteen sections into which the city is divided, and the number of the

blocks in each, forming the introduction to the map of each block contained in the rest of the volume. Propertyowners have every reason to feel gratified at the efficient and economical manner in which this part of the work has been accomplished. The preparation of the maps has been completed under the supervision of Frank J. Bell, of the Tax Department; and credit for the result is due to him and to his assistants. These maps will cost the city practically nothing, for they will be sold for a sum which will reimburse the Treasury for all outlay. Furthermore, as the contractors who made them lost money on the job, the purchasers of the maps will be getting them at less than cost. There are no obstacles in the way of the operation of the act. The Register has not as yet prepared his index books, but as he is allowed to be three months behind in this matter he will have until April 1st to get them ready. People intending to record deeds and mortgages must remember that the instruments must be indorsed with the section and block numbers of the land affected by the record, and that any mistake in that respect may have serious consequences; for an instrument wrongly indexed will be as void against subsequent purchasers as an instrument recorded in Kings County. In Jersey City, Baltimore and elsewhere they index by blocks, but the area of search remains in the county, and a paper wrongly indexed would still legally affect the title to the property. This will be the great improvement of the New York system over that of any other city in this country.

NATURALLY the papers representing the interests of the creditor classes are now maintaining that the late stringency in the market was the direct result of the Silver Bill, which went into operation over four months ago. The Nation "knew it all along" that a pinch in the money market would be the sure outcome of the passage of the bill. This prognosticator of financial events admits, however, that the pinch came sooner than even it expected it would come. It "knew" that the passage of the Silver Bill would weaken confidence in our standard of value and lead to the hoarding of gold, but it did not look for so great a decrease in the visible supply of gold so soon after the bill went into operation-that is, it would have us understand, it did not look for so great a hoarding of gold-as official figures seem to indicate. The official figures which the Nation gives in support of its predictions, show that during the period July-December, 1890, the visible supply of gold in the United States Treasury and the specie in the New York banks decreased \$31,061,000. Now, any one with an ordinate amount of common sense—which faculty, by the way, the Nation does not credit its readers with possessing-knows that a decrease in the visible supply of gold does not mean necessarily that gold to this extent is being hoarded. A decrease in the visible supply of gold during the month of August and September may mean, and probably does to a considerable extent, that during those months our merchants, anticipating the passage of the McKinley bill, were drawing heavily upon the banks for gold to use in the importation of goods upon which it seemed likely that duties would be imposed or raised. During October and November especially there was a heavy call, as there usually is during these months, upon the banks for coin and legal tender notes to serve in moving the crops. Considering the uneasy state of the money market during the last four or five months, it is safe to assume, on merely general principles. that more than the usual amount of gold was then hoarded; but it by no means follows, especially when there are other probable causes to account for the decrease in the visible supply of gold, that the thirty million dollars-the Nation's figures-or anywhere near that sum represent "hoarding." Nor does it follow because a stringency in the money market followed the passage of a new Silver Bill that the bill was the cause and the stringency the effect. On the contrary, there are strong grounds for the belief that the recent disturbance in the money market was produced, in spite of the enlargement of the silver circulation, by other causes, two of which have already been suggested.

A RE we to suppose that the Nation also forecasted the failure of Baring Bros.? Are we to suppose that in predicting a stringency in the money market this paper "knew" that a certain large banking firm would fail, and that through the general disturbance of credits created by this failure the visible supply of gold in our banks would be diminished. How else, since the pinch came exactly as it progressed, can its attempt to represent the visible supply-which the Baring failure undeniably helped to bring about-as the result of hoarding be justified. Any one who will take the trouble to trace the steps leading up to the recent stringency cannot fail to perceive in the decrease of the visible supply of gold in the United States Treasury and the New York banks a partial result of the failure of the Baring Bros. Yet the Nation, in support of its prediction regarding the Silver Bill, does not hesitate to denounce the bill as the sole cause of the stringency, when a great part of the stringency was caused by a

failure of which it could have had no previous knowledge, but of the influence of which upon our visible gold supply it cannot now be ignorant. Remembering that the Nation's point of view on all money questions is always the creditors' point of view its bitter opposition to the recent silver legislation is easily accounted for.

FOLLOWING the lead of Mr. Atkinson, papers representing the creditor classes are at present laying great stress on the fact that only about 9 per cent of the exchanges in this country are conducted by means of actual money in its various forms. From this they deduce that people who clamor for more silver have "very little conception of what is needed to relieve the money market." This relief must come, according to the most ardent of these papers, chiefly through the extensions of the means by which exchanges for the greater part are conducted, viz., credit. It is well to consider here upon what basis credit rests. To quote the very words of Mr. Atkinson: "the volume of money which is legal tender is the basis of credit." If this is true it is difficult to see how credits can be extended to any great extent without first enlarging the circulation of legal tender money upon which credit is based. Surely no sane person would advocate the contracting of the present currency as a means of relieving the money market. But is not this what persons practically do who oppose the increase in the circulating medium in proportion to the growth of population and industry? According to Mr. Atkinson again, who invariably looks at the money question from the creditors' point of view, the average amount of money per capita in circulation at the present time in this country is within a fraction of \$22.00. In 1880 the per capita amount was \$24.00; in 1885, \$27.26, and in 1887, \$27.53. These figures, together with the probable partial causes given above, while they do not prove, at least furnish additional evidence to the belief that the late stringency in the money market was produced in spite of the passage of the Silver Bill.

### Railway Pools and Trade Unions.

T is a curious fact that, when compelled to compete with one another, railroads are as impotent as common laborers to obtain fair pay for the services they render. The reason is the same in one case as in the other; neither the railroad nor the laborer can afford to be idle for any considerable time, and small earnings are preferable to none. Whenever competition is unrestrained this imperative necessity of constant employment forces down the price asked for services below a living rate.

The managers of the roads between Chicago and the mountains have been trying for years to maintain rates, but all their devices have thus far proved futile, and the prevailing bel ef seems to be that if they are not allowed to pool, they must consolidate. Wars and rumors are endless while competition between them is possible. Rebates which destroy nearly all the profit on the traffic handled. and which make both givers and receivers criminally liable, are notoriously common. Where, as in the live-stock traffic, the rates are supposed to be better maintained, profits are curtailed by the enormous expenses incurred in soliciting traffic, and by excessive competition in the matter of facilities offered to shippers; palace cars, fast time and high-salaried agents are the means relied upon to divert traffic from rivals. The passenger traffic is rendered unremunerative by much the same methods, and in addition the scalper and the commission man serve as instruments of rate cutting.


The managers of the various lines feel that it is better to do work at rates which only pay operating expenses than it is to be entirely idle, and the large shippers at competitive points know so well how to play off one road against another that rates continually tend to this minimum. When roads are not actually cutting rates the shippers can often cause one or more of them to be suspected of doing so, and an imaginary cut is met by a real but secret one. So long as the corporations have no organization among therselves. all the shrewdness and all the far-sightedness of their able managers cannot prevent these artificial giants from accepting "starvation wages" for their services.

They are but repeating in this the experience of unorganized laborers who have found it difficult and well-nigh impossible to maintain their wages at a normal figure. When the individuals are played off against one another by shrewd employers, and when each man feels that idleness is impossible, wages surely tend to a minimum that is below the point essential to good health and vigorous progeny. As the railroad managers reduce rates below a point that permits a fair return on the capital invested, so the laborer is inclined to work for less than will suffice to maintain in its vigor the stock from which he comes. In the one case there is a progressive deterioration in the quality of the service the road can render, its track and appliances may cease to be the best, the value of its securities falls off, and everything tends towards insolvency. This comes whenever a specially acute attack of competition tries the weakened powers of resistance. With the laborer inadequate wages also mean inadequate nutrition, physical degeneration, comparative incapacity for work, and finally disease and death. The offspring of a bankrupt road is a "reorganized" road, while the offspring of a half-starved man is usually a brood of eak and incapable children.

We have pushed this analogy so far because there are many who see the evils of competition in one case, but are blind to them in the other; who think that combination of one sort is absolutely essential to the welfare of the community as well as to that of the class concerned, but who see nothing but the evils of the other kind. Without raising the question as to whether pools in the one case or trade unions in the other may serve as panaceas for the ills complained of, a certain helpful clearness comes from regarding the corporations and the laborers as both wage earners, subject to common temptations and common dangers. The socialists' arraignment of the competitive system as something tending inevitably to the impoverishment and degradation of the laborer, finds its

far from 235 feet. On 7th avenue it is not far from 170. With these dimensions it could carry the height of an apartment house or of an office building much better than most of those edifices with the area to which they are restricted. Nevertheless, it is but of five apparent stories in height, or of six counting as a full story each both the mezzanine above the ground floor and the mezzanine above the fourth floor. In color it is a monochrome of brown brick and brown terra cotta, slightly relieved by pilasters of polished granite between the arches of the main entrance, and the roof, which is of a pitch steep enough to make it visible across the street, is of corrugated black tile.

The northern and longer front is also the principal. It is triply divided, both vertically and horizontally, unmistakably yet not so strongly, as to give it the look of being composed either in horizontal layers or in vertical slices. The lower division, the architectural basement, is given to the entrances that occupy the whole



counterpart in such a work as Hadley's "Railroad Transportation" or Alexander's "Railway Practice"-works which insist continually on the tendency of rates to an unduly low minimum wherever competition has free play. It is no longer the fashion to abuse trade unions, but those who were the last to give up the earlier practice in this matter have been the very first to see the necessity of legalizing pools.

### The Carnegie Music Hall.

THIS edifice, at the southeast corner of 7th avenue and 57th street, has offered a very unusual opportunity, which an architect must have been particularly ill-inspired in order completely to throw away. In the first place it is unusually large; in the second place, for a large building, it is unusually low; in the third place it is, by the requirement of the plan and the necessity of the case, unusually solid. These are advantages that very seldom go together, and that may well excite the envy of architects "whose thoughts are mainly bent upon considering" how they shall increase the apparent magnitude of buildings that need, architecturally, to look bigger than in fact they are, or how they shall keep down buildings of which the altitude is the principal dimension, or how they shall give enough breadth and mass to give dignity to their r and wall spaces in buildings of which the requirements are hat they shall be magnified sash frames.

The frontage of the new music hall on 57th street is not

of the central portion, a fine arcade of five ample doorways, the effect of which is enhanced by the admirably solid treatment of the pavilions by which it is flanked. Over this basement runs a modillioned cornice much heavier and of much greater projection over the centre than over the ends.

The feature of the second division is again a central arcade, much taller than that below, since it includes two stories and a-half. The intermediate floor-lines are marked by emphatic transoms in terra cotta. At the spring of the arches, on a line with the capitals of the pier, and continuing them, is a broad frieze in terra cotta, strong belting where such a belt is needful, and covered with very good ornaments. The sides are unbroken below the springing of the arches. except for two small and inconspicuous openings in each. Above, at the level of the mezzanine floor, the walls of the pavilions, otherwise solid, are decorated with pairs of pilasters resting on the upper moldings of the frieze and supporting the string-course that marks the completion of the second division of the front.

The fifth (or sixth) and crowning story is the third division. At each end is a group of tall round-arched openings, not symmetrically arranged, for there are two on one end and three on the other. The wall of the centre is slightly raised, so as to detach the ends and clearly to convert them into pavilions, properly so-called, while the plane of the main wall is preserved by a range of freestanding columns, in pairs, continued across the front, and supporting the main cornice, so as to form a shallow loggia between them and the raised wall. Either the space between the columns of each pair should have been diminished or else the columns themselves should have been stouter, for they have now an undeniably and unfortunately weak aspect. The wall behind this feature is pierced with pairs of perfectly plain round-arched openings between the pairs of columns, and above a broad frieze and deep cornice, apparently in copper, complete the front, which it is a pity should be crowned by a construction in sheet metal that mimics the forms of masonry, and that differs from the ordinary and abominable zinc cornice only in that its surface does not emulate stone, and that if it were masonry it would be well designed.

Nevertheless this is a very satisfactory front. The architect did not create the advantages of which we have spoken, but he not only has done nothing to nullify them, he has availed himself of them to the utmost. His composition is harmonious, animated without restlessness, and quiet without dullness. The arcades and, in spite of its shortcomings, the loggia of this front are large and impressive features, and the treatment of the flanking walls, though less noticeable to the casual observer than the treatment of the centre, is equally admirable and conduces quite as much to the worth of the general impression. He is much to be congratulated on the addition he has made to our street architecture.

After what has been said of the longer front, the shorter does not call for much notice, since it is a variation upon the same motive, although it is virtually but a great blank wall, but for the entrances, which are subordinate to those on the other front, and for some small and evidently utilitarian openings at the south end.

#### Investments Good and Bad-Five Bonds to Buy.

Among the mass of securities which have been steadily marked down in market value in Wall street during the last six months by forced sales are many new issues of bonds caught out in loans. Older issues which have long since found lodgment in the strong boxes of investors, where they are paid for, go through such a financial storm without much abatement in price and often without sales except where an owner is shrewd enough to realize so as to take advanage of great bargains among the shares and bonds thrown overboard because of insufficient margin. In such a case, if the holder of the old bond does not want to sell too many, there may be enough old orders unexecuted to absorb them, otherwise they may be as difficult of quick sale without sacrifice as anything else; but in the case of new issues, particularly under recent reorganizations, the bonds having been in many cases held on margin in large blocks, they have to be sold for what they will bring, and as they keep falling the lower price in turn forces the sale of other large lots at a lower point.

It is to a selected few of such bonds selling for much below their real value that we would call attention, because it is not in the nature of things that they will long be allowed to range at present ruling quotations. As time goes on their merits will become understood, and shrewd speculators first and investors afterwards will see that they are much better than older issues of not as great intrinsic merit and selling twenty to thirty points higher.

John H. Davis & Co., in a recent circular say very shrewdly, that "a fundamental fact which is not always borne in mind is that no bond can be better than good; in other words, no bond will pay more than one hundred cents on the dollar when its due date arrives." When that time comes a New York Central first mortgage bond for \$1,000 will be worth just \$1,000 and no more, and is intrinsically not one dollar better than a \$1,000 bond of an insignificant branch road in Nevada, provided the latter has the \$1,000 ready with which to take up its obligation. Meantime, it is a question of confidence in the ability to pay which makes the current difference in price. People will pay 130 for the New York Central 7 per cent bond and decline to buy the bond of the other at 80. This may be right and proper, but (supposing the two mature at the same time in 1963 and that both are paid) in the one case the buyer will have paid \$300 out of \$200-a net difference of \$500.

Peoria & Eastern R. R. first mortgage fifty year bonds, interest 4 per cent, are guaranteed by the Vanderbilt system known as the Big Four, the corporate title being the Cleveland, Cincinnati, Chicago & St. Louis Railway Company. The Peoria & Eastern is the reorganization of the I. B. & W., of which Austin Corbin was president, the former bonds of the I. B. & W. having been 6s. The reorganization was under the care of Drexel, Morgan & Co., and the present rate of interest was based upon timate of what the road under any circumstances could a arn; so that the interest would seem to be absolutely sure without the guarantee, but in addition to that the holder is guaranteed by the Big Four Company, which is paying dividends on both its preferred and common stock; its own 4 per cent bonds have sold at about par not long since. A prudent judge of mortgage bonds would naturally; prefer the Peoria & Eastern's 4s at th same price; yet the latter has been so depressed by forced sales as to be quoted now about 75, which includes three months accrued interest. It is an unusual opportunity to take up such a bond at any price below 90.

Another bond of like merit is that of the Chesapeake and Ohio secured by a first mortgage on its Richmond and Alleghany Division, the best portion of its line. This property was also reorganized by Drexel, Morgan & Co., and the bond has 100 years to run. Under the terms of reorganization the interest is to be but 2 per cent for four years and 4 per cent for ninety-six years thereafter. The 2 per cent period has three years more to run, and thereafter the bond becomes 4 per cent. The Chesapeake and Ohio Company, it is claimed, is earning 7 per cent on its preference shares, all of which at present is being put into equipment and additions to the property. The mortgage security of the Chesapeake and Ohio and Richmond and Alleghany Division is good beyond all question, and there can be no doubt about the interest. The bond can be bought to-day at about 66, and may be expected to ultimately range about 90.

The third bond is of the Duluth, South Shore & Atlantic Railroad, which is controlled by the Canadian Pacific. The Canadian Pacific party are said to own substantially all the second mortgage bonds, and by the terms of the second mortgage the first mortgage is limited to \$4,000,000, which is at the rate of about \$10,000 per mile of road. This bond pays 5 per cent January and July, and because of the low rate per mile, and the practical guarantee of the Canadian Pacific, which pays dividends on its common shares, should be selling among the high-classed 5's in the market, or, say, 110. The quotation at present is about  $92\frac{1}{2}$ , which includes the coupon due January 1st next, so that the price may be more fairly stated as about 90 and interest. This bond may be expected under any change in the money market to go back at least to 105.

The Missouri, Kansas & Texas 4's is another bond of which favorable facts may be stated, being a new issue under a most conservative reorganization, the line being in a rapidly growing and developing country.

The fifth bond paying 6 per cent on its par and over 7 per cent on the investment, is that of the Toledo, St. Louis & Kansas City Railroad, now selling at 85.

The T., St. L. & K. C. Railroad was a completed and going railway before the present bond was put on it, and the old bondholders subrogated themselves to this bond, so that the entire proceeds night be available to reconstruct the line and provide it with modern equipment; so that it is for all practical purposes a new railway as regards works, buildings, equipment, rails, etc., but an old railway as regards the fact that it is established, that a large population has grown around it, and that the towns and villages through which it passes have grown, since its first creation, to places of importance. It is an opportunity to buy such a bond at 85.

#### Peck, Martin & Co.'s Affairs.

A private meeting of the creditors of Peck, Martin & Co. was held on Monday afternoon at the office of the assignee, Geo. S. Hamlin, No. 18 Wall street. About thirty people were present, and an announcement was made that the firm proposed to pay 100 cents on the dollar, in the following cash installments: one-third in sixty days, one-third in six months, onesixth in a year, and one-sixth in two years. Considerable discussion took place, during which it transpired that there

Considerable discussion took place, during which it transpired that there was an evident indisposition on the part of one of the firm to continue in the business under its present *personnel*.

A question put to Mr. Martin as to whether interest would also be paid to creditors with the installments, he said: "It is my disposition that interest shall be paid if possible."

The firm's offer to pay 100 cents on the dollar, though not quite unexpected, is received with considerable satisfaction by the creditors. There is a general hope expressed that Mr. Martin will continue as one of the conductors of the business, and that this would be one of the greatest guarantees which the creditors would have that the proffered payments would be forthcoming on time.

The meeting ended by appointing a committee of five, representing the creditors, and they will next week make a full report of the condition of the firm's affairs and announce under what *personnel* the firm will be conducted in the future. The committee is comprised of Messrs. W. K. Hammond, C. W. Nickerson, Courtlandt P. Dixon, of Dickinson Bros. & King, Hiram Snyder and Warren Ackerman.

# The Appraisers' Stores Location.

Mr. Erastus Wiman, in an interesting address on "Harbor Enlargement," delivered on Monday evening last, at Clifton, S. I., strongly condemned the selection at Christopher street of a site for the new Appraisers Stores, and asserted that Secretary Windom has made a mistake in changing his original selection of the Bowling Green site for an up-town site. Among other things Mr. Wiman said:

Among other things Mr. Wiman said: In the decision reached there has been no adequate comprehension of the magnitude of the commerce which in New York harbor, south of the Battery, has already taken its place, nor any proper conception whatever of the enormous development that in the next decade will occur along the shores of the great bay of New York. When it is recalled that within sixteen miles of the City Hall there is water front equaling 150 miles in extent, and that the Battery is the pivotal point of all, it seems a singular fatuity that would locate the appraisement stores so far away from the centre. The square of land, below Bowling Green, at the Battery, is almost a providential provision for the accommodation of the commerce of the port—custom house, survey or's office, the appraisement stores and all concerned with the governmental administration of the affairs of the port should be erected here. To scatter the buildings for the convenience of a few and make the location, such as has been chosen, near the foot of Christopher street, for a point of appraisement, is doing violence to the future, and creating inconvenience, aunoyance and expense for all time to ninetenths of the commerce of the port for the benefit of a few. If, therefore, Mr. Windom, who must be convinced of these facts, can recall his decision and come back to his original intention of locating at the Battery all these governmental edifices, he cannot, in justice to the truts which be so faithfully administers, hesitate any longer in choosing the Battery as the best point in all the city for so important a commercial and government centre.

#### The Columbia Building.

The process of transformation at the extreme southern end of Broadway continues apace. If the residents who occupied the buildings in the neighborhood of the Battery at the early part of this century could see the changes which have taken place since their day they would rub their eyes, indeed, with astonishment. Three and four-story buildings were then the highest erected, and had anyone at that time predicted that the quiet and genteel neighborhood of the Battery would, toward the end of the century, be largely covered with ten and twelve-story buildThe Columbia Building—for such is the name given to the new structure —is of fire-proof construction throughout. It has three frontages, one of about 30 feet on Broadway, one of 184 feet on Morris street, and one of about 84 feet on Trinity place, on which it fronts in the rear. It has there-

company will, it is understood, occupy part of the first floor and basement, and other tenants of equal importance are negotiating for quarters in the building.

There are to be four Otis hydraulic elevators, capable of a speed of 500 feet per minute. One of these elevators will be utilized for carrying safes and furniture of a maximum weight of 5,000 pounds. The building is to be lighted by electricity throughout and will be supplied from three sources, to wit: from dynamos in the sub-basement, from underground connections with Aldrich Court, and from the street mains of the Edison Company. Thus the failure of light from one source will be supplemented, should the necessity arise, from two other sources. There will be steam heat throughout the entire building, and all the

There will be steam heat throughout the entire building, and all the trim will be in hardwood. There will be toilet rooms on each floor, as well




fore a total frontage of about 298 feet on the three sides, which is very unusual for an office building. In addition to this, so long as the old buildings exist that now adjoin it to the north, it will have an unimpeded light on the fourth side; that is, beyond the fifth story. Thus, in the matter of light and ventilation, it will probably be unexcelled by any of the great office structures down town.

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
The floor plans of the Columbia show that it will contain 273 offices. These are so arranged that they can be rented in single rooms, or in suites of as many rooms as may be required. A number of offices have already been rented by the agents, and among the lessees are several well-known firms of iron merchants, including A. R. Whitney & Co., Ed. Corning & Co., Warren, Wood & Co., and R. P. & J. H. Staats. A prominent steamship as a ladies' toilet room on the fifth floor. All these rooms, as well as the halls on each story, will have tiled flooring and marble bases. The building is to be thoroughly ventilated by fans operated by electricity, and there will be a public telephone in the basement. A United States mail chute will be provided which will run from the top story to the basement, thus enabling tenants on every floor to mail letters from their offices. The agents propose that no charge shall be made for electric light, steam heat and janitor's services.



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### Title Insurance-The Contrast Between Two Methods.

#### [COMMUNICATED.]

Every one dealing with real estate wants to know that the title thereto is just what he intends to obtain.

Every executor, guardian, director in a corporation, or other tr investing other people's money on the security of real estate must know that the title is good and unencumbered.

The investor wants the facts as to the title and a competent opinion on the law.

The facts as to a title have from time immemorial been pre ented in logical order in an abstract to which are appended certificates of the ohron result of a search for liens and encumbrances in all offices where they are required to be filed or recorded.

Any misrepresentation as to the facts would subject the party furnishing the abstract to punishment for fraud.

An opinion on title accompanies the abstract, and to be valuable should be given by a competent lawyer acting solely in the interest of and directly responsible to his client.

A policy of title insurance is not in itself an opinion on title nor a representation as to the facts; it does not advise that a title is good, nor profess to state all the encumbrances upon it, but is merely a contract to indemnify the assured against loss from such defects or encumbrances as may exist. It represents what a company is willing to insure, not necessarily what an investor desires or has a right to take.

Now, an individual investing on his own behalf does not as a rule want to take a title subject to defects or encumbrances, even with indemnity against loss—the loss may exceed the amount of indemnity, or the indem nity may not be paid—and he would never take such a title without know-ing what the defects or encumbrances were. A trustee has no right to take such a title, and cannot do so without violation of his duty and risk of personal liability. Therefore, prudence in the one case and duty in the other demand, as of the first importance, a competent examination of title. All systems of title insurance agree that the investor should first "get the most careful examination of title possible."

What is the "most careful examination of title possible ?"

Titles were examined for years, before title insurance was thought of. by lawyers of special training and known position in the community and among their professional brethren. Their record was open to rigid scrutiny, and their means of livelihood depended upon their public reputation for care, ability and honesty. Investors selected them from belief in their competency and integrity, founded on their own experience or the experience of others.

What were the results of this method of examination ?

That investments in real estate were, so far as titles were concerned, the safest of all investments, that losses from defects of title were so rare as to be phenomenal, and that these losses were generally the consequence of shifting decisions of the Courts which lawyers could not anticipate or facts which the most careful examination could not discover.

We find the following paragraph in an early circular of the first title company organized in this city, in full confirmation of this statement:

"All the money of all the savings banks, trust companies, life insurance and other companies, besides that of private lenders, is constantly loaned upon bond and mortgage upon the careful examination of faithful and honorable lawyers, and but seldom indeed, if ever, does any loss occur from mistake or oversight; it is probable that not one cent out of the \$92,000,000 so loaned in 1881 will be lost through any defect of title."

Retaining, then, this approved method of examination, the possibilities of loss are amply covered if there be added as collateral security the policy of insurance of a corporation of adequate capital and under competent management.

In accepting this collateral the investor does not surrender other safeguards, nor deviate in the slightest degree from the course which a prudent man ought to take in his own affairs, and which a trustee is bound to take in the affairs of others, he may get the opinion of competent counsel of his own selection, an abstract of title and searches and a policy of title insurance, in addition.

This is getting "the most careful examination of title possible" and getting "besides the protection of the insurance principle." This is the method of the Lawyers' Title Insurance Company.

#### THE EXAMINATION OF TITLE UNDER THE SYSTEM OPPOSED TO THE

#### LAWYERS' SYSTEM.

The examination of title under the other system is made primarily in the interest of the company, by its salaried employes, who assum e neith professional nor financial responsibility to the man whose title they examine.

Neither the extent and character of their experience nor their nam are known to the investor; they are not bound to make full report of the condition of the title to him, although his interest is not necessarily identi cal with that of the company. He might not deem it to his interest to take a title, if fully advised as to

its condition even with insurance which the company might be willing to take the risk of insuring.

The counsel whose names are advertised in connection with this syste and whose competency all will admit, do not examine the company's titles and are not responsible for the character or competency of those who do.

e counsel are not in the position that they and other lawyers are in their own offices in the employment of assistants where they are directly responsible for the errors and omissions of assistants and are therefore bound to exercise the greatest care in selecting them and in supervising their work. In such cases every title comes under the observation of the principal who assumes an individual responsibility in passing it; while the officers of a title company, in supervising the work of their examiners, some no such responsibility;

We think there can be little doubt as to which of these is "the most careful examination of title possible.'

If there be any, a very simple test will remove it. Compare the number of cases in which losses have been paid or claims made under either system, and the particulars of each case; compare the number of suits now pending, not against the companies but against the assured which the companies are defending.

These facts, however, without which no satisfactory judgment can be formed as to the management and standing of any insurance company, which test the care with which titles are examined and bear directly upon the probability of success of this particular kind of insurance, are nowhere publicly reported by the larger of the two companies operated under the stem opposed to the lawyers' system. sys

The Lawyers' Company reports to the Insurance 'Department and is required to state every dollar of its losses, with the number and particulars of every pending claim. This information is also widely published for the benefit of its patrons.

#### INSURANCE UNDER THE "LAWYERS'" SYSTEM.

Although the examination of title be by a competent and responsible lawyer, whose money is contributed to the capital which is to pay losses, the lawyers' system requires the submission of his opinion with the facts on which it is based, and any question on which he is in doubt, to other competent and experienced lawyers before it insures, and the investor h benefit of this confirmation of the opinion of his counsel without additional cost. Being purely collateral to the opinion of counsel the insurance accords in all respects with that opinion and the representations made in the abstract of title and searches, and the policy contains the name of the counsel.

The as ured therefore always knows that his counsel has made himself onsible to the company, and that the title whose validity is guaranteed to him is just the title he intends to obtain. He knows also that he can rely upon the further facts: that the company never insures against an admitted defect, nor does it ever insure against an existing encumbrance upon being indemnified against it.

No special risks are taken, nor special rates charged. The rate of premium is always the same, and the company and its examining counsel are under no temptation to raise any question for the purpose of increasing the premium as a condition of insurance.

The Lawyers' Company either accepts the risk at its regular rate or declines it unconditionally.

INSURANCE UNDER THE OTHER SYSTEM, i. e., THAT OPPOSED TO THE " LAWYERS' SYSTEM."

As the insurance under this system is not collateral but the principal ecurity, the investor having neither the opinion of his own counsel nor any abstract of title and searches, his knowledge of his title will be derived mainly, if not entirely, from his policy, and the extent of his protection will be limited by its terms. Under this system insurance is sometimes issued at special rates, and in some cases where encumbrances exist if ecurity is given to the company, while at the same time the custom of furnishing abstracts of titles and searches is discontinued. In other words, if the policy is silent as to any such encumbrance there would be no abstract of title or searches to advise of its existence.

Let us see what might be the result of this method of insurance.

An application is made to the company for a lcan. One of the encumbrances referred to in the "Special Insurance Features" of the other system exist and the company takes indemnity against it on payment of one premium at a special rate. It offers to assign the mortgage to a trustee without any opportunity for examination of title on his part except at his own expense, without any abstract of title or searches, but merely on a policy of insurance. There can be no doubt whatever that the trustee would have no right to take this mortgage, and yet if the policy does not disclose the existence of such encumbrance, he can never tell whether he does take such a mortgage or not.

THE MANAGEMENT OF THE COMPANY UNDER THE LAWYERS' SYSTEM.

Intelligent management is an important factor in any business enterprise, but in the business of title insurance, which is professional in its nature, it is a necessity, particularly when the business is so conducted that the dealer is asked to rely solely on the indemnity of a corporation without the advice of counsel and without any abstract of title or searches. The Lawyers' Company is under the sole management of those familiar by life-long experience with the business which the company transacts, and can therefore deal safely and intelligently with the many questions which must arise.

THE MANAGEMENT OF THE COMPANY UNDER THE OTHER SYSTEM.

The management under the other system is, for the most part, in the hands of gentlemen who, holding high positions in financial or mercantile circles, are, nevertheless, not lawyers, have no knowledge as to the examination of titles or the many questions that must arise as to their insurance. These gentlemen, with the best intentions, must of course be absolutely dependent as to any risk which the company assumes upon the few law-yers, most of them unknown to the public, who are the real managers of the system, as lawyers must be of any title insurance system.

The contrast between the two systems may be briefly summed up as follows

The lawyers' system, adhering to a method of examination which has in all times past rendered the investment in real estate the safest of all investents, has reduced its cost, increased its safety, and, after reducing the risk to a minimum, furnished as security against that risk the capital of a corporation required by law to maintain a permanent guaranty fund of \$750,000, and which is under the management of lawyers

The other system, substituting a less reliable method of examination without furnishing abstracts of title and searches, or the confidential opinion of counsel in the interest of the investor, asks reliance solely upon the agreement of indemnity of corporations, the larger of which is not

obliged to maintain any permanent guaranty fund, and both of which are under a management principally of business men, and not of lawyers.

Which system one may choose who deals with his own money will be a matter of individual prudence.

Which system a trustee may select in order to be fully protected in his trust can be that only which is strictly within the line of his duty as defined by law, and there is no law authorizing his substitution of a mere contract of indemnity for the opinion of counsel.

The minutes of the meeting of December 19th were read and approved. Mr. Peter F. Meyer, as chairman of the committee appointed at last Friday's meeting to perfect a permanent organization, reported the nominations: for President, Geo. H. Scott; Vice-President, J. Thomas Stearns: Secretary, Jas. S. McQuillen, and Treasurer, Wm. M. Ryan. After some discussion the gentlemen named above were unanimously elected to serve until January 1, 1892.

On motion the president appointed as a committee to draw up a constitution and by-laws for the association, to be submitted at the next meeting, Geo. H. Scott, Jas. S. McQuillen, Peter F. Meyer, Jas. L. Wells and Jere. Johnson, Jr.

A motion was also carried adding the president to the committee of three appointed to confer with the board on Friday, and all the members of the association were also requested to attend the meeting of the board. The next meeting of the association was set down for Friday, at 3.30 P. M.,

The next meeting of the association was set down for Friday, at 3.30 P. M., when the result of the conference with the board will be made known, and action taken upon the same.

The Board of Directors held a special meeting yesterday at 2 P. M., to receive a committee from the Auctioneers' Association. The directors present were Messrs. Cammann, Fromme, Harnett, Johnson, Luyster, Read, Schermerhorn, Leviness. Smyth and Warren. For the auctioneers Messrs. George H. Scott and Peter F. Meyer stated

For the auctioneers Messrs. George H. Scott and Peter F. Meyer stated that the old scale of knock-down fees was agreed to by the auctioneers on the understanding that that scale was to remain in force for five years; yet it was not more than two years that the old scale had been operative, and the directors now sought to alter that scale.

The directors then inquired if the five years clause was in writing. The auctioneers said that it was only a verbal agreement, but they regarded it as binding on the Exchange as a similar understanding between individuals.

The auctioneers then retired, and Mr. Fromme moved that the request to go back to the old scale of knock-down fees be denied. The motion, which was seconded by Mr. Luyster, was, after some discussion, carried by a vote of eight to two, Messrs. Smyth & Johnson voting in the negative.

The Auctioneers' Association met at 3.30 P. M. yesterday, to receive the report of the committee appointed to confer with the Board of Directors. Mr. Peter F. Meyer, as chairman, reported the facts as stated above.

It was then moved and carried to appoint a committee of five, including the president. to recommend appropriate action to the association. The committee consists of Messrs. Scott, Wilkins, Meyer, Johnson and Wells.

#### Convention Notes.

The committee from the Mechanics' and Traders' Exchange, together with the officers and members of the Building Trades Club, are actively engaged in preparing for the reception and entertainment of the delegates and visitors at the coming convention of the National Association of Builders of the United States. The secretary is engaged upon the details of the various matters on hand, which seem to indicate complete success in the undertaking of providing for the comfort and pleasure of the large number anticipated. He is not prepared to furnish at present a programme of the entertainment to be offered, but says that many pleasant features are contemplated; all will qualify to impress the delegates with the generous hospitalities of their New York brethren, as well as the honor they feel in being the host of the National Association. The convention will be held at the Masonic Hall, on the 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th of February next, and the subjects offered for discussion will be those of importance to the entire building interest.

#### Contractors' Notes.

Bids will be received at the office of the Department of Public Works, until 12 M., on Wednesday, December 31st, for taking up and relaying the pavement now in 6th avenue, from 57th to 59th street; for laying crosswalks across Amsterdam avenue, at its intersection with the northerly side of 155th street, and the northerly and southerly sides of 156th, 157th, 158th, 159th and 160th streets, and for repaying, etc., with granite-block pavement, the carriageway of 124th street, from Park to 5th avenue.

#### New Incorporations.

The Manhattan Lumber Co. filed a certificate of incorporation on December 19th. The objects of this company are the manufacturing and drying of lumber. The capital stock is \$2,000, divided into twenty shares of \$100 each. The names of the trustees are Sherwin C. Beckwith, H. M. Geer and Theodore H. Smith.

#### The Block Indexing Maps,

In this issue will be found three maps which are taken from the indexes of the maps prepared by the Tax Department under the operation of the new block indexing bill. Five sections are included in the first of these maps, three in the second and five in the third. The first section contains the blocks between Nos. 1 and 315, the second between Nos. 316 and 660, the third between Nos. 661 and 992, the fourth between Nos. 993 and 1256, the fifth between Nos. 1257 and 1592, the sixth between Nos. 1993 and 1256, the fifth between Nos. 1257 and 1592, the sixth between Nos. 1593 and 1819, the seventh between Nos. 1820 and 2148, the eighth between Nos. 2149 and 2259, the ninth between Nos. 2260 and 2542, the tenth between Nos. 2543 and 2781, the eleventh between Nos. 2783 and 3245, the twelfth between Nos. 3245 and 3401, and the thirteenth between Nos. 3402 and 3428. Thus it will be seen that there will be 2,259 blocks south of the Harlem and 1,169 north. Every foot of land within the boundaries of the city is included; even quite an area that is not within any ward lines. South of 155th street, except in some few instances, each block has a block number, but north of 155th, where property is less sublivided, larger areas are used as a basis. These maps are for sale at the office of the Comptroller for \$15. Everyone who is obliged to record papers at the Register's Office should have a copy.

#### **Opinions** of Others.

Fernando Wood, in speaking of the West Side Supplement of THE RECORD AND GUIDE of December 20th, and which, by the way, he remarked was worth a whole year's subscription, called our attention to a remarkable rise in values in that section of the city. He says that about forty years ago his father purchased fifty lots on the block bounded by the Boulevard, 11th avenue, 75th and 77th streets, for \$4,000. These same lots he sold in 1881 or 1882 to Stern & Metzger for \$303,000, an advance of 7,475 per cent. These lots are, of course, worth more to-day than they were ten years ago.

It is a great pity that the matter has already proceeded so far that ne revocation is possible. No good reason can be urged why Liberty street should be paved with granite block. ## **Real Estate Department.**

The depression which usually accompanies the Christmas holidays has made itself felt in real estate circles this week, and practically no business of importance or interest has been transacted. This is equally true of auction and of private sales. On 'Change most of the property sold was offered by order of the courts, and this state of affairs s eems likely to con tinue for some weeks to come. The holiday coming on Thursday and the severe storm which followed it on Friday cut week down to three working days, and during these the days the preparation incident to the celebration of Christmas seems to have prevented the brokers from doing very much. Next week we can reasonably look for the accomplishment of little more business than has been done in the last few days, and after that it will take a week or two to get things in proper shape for the spring market. As to what that market will be the opinions of good judges differ, but all hope for the best.

The business transacted on Monday lacked special interest, notwith-standing a fairly large attendance on 'Change. The property offered con-sisted of two up-town flats, at public auction, the sale of which is doubtful, and two uninteresting parcels sold under foreclosure.

The attendance on Tuesday was large, but the bidding lacked spirit, and it was evident that the largest part of the crowd were only interested as spectators. The down-town property, as usual, attracted the greatest attention. 




