

WALL STREET, at present, seems determined to be dull. Certain specialties are active and fluctuating, but otherwise the stock market is most stale and uninteresting. News good and bad is received alike apathetically. The exports of gold were checked during the past week by raising the price of money in our own market, and, as affairs in the Argentine Republic have decidedly improved, and as the premium on gold in that over-financiered and financiering country has been largely reduced, we may expect that the foreign support given to prices in Wall street will be resumed, as, indeed, it has been during the latter part of this week. Railroad earnings continue large, but this is such an old story that it would scarcely be wise to depend on it to cause an advance in prices. The crop reports are contradictory but rather tend to the conclusion that we shall have enough for our home consumption, but very little for export. Meanwhile general business continues satisfactory, and in certain lines of trade phenomenally active. Altogether there is not much to fear, and a good deal to hope for in the prospect, for it is hardly likely that speculation can continue dull as soon as the fall season sets in.

REFORM, like a man, has seven ages, through which it must A pass from the time it is first born in the brain of some ingenious mechanic in ideas, until it reaches the steady and assured position given it by maturity and the friendship of our intellectual "leading lights." The principles of land transfer reform which we have been urging for so long in the columns of this paperprinciples which, in spite of their easy applicability and immense utility, are but meagrely understood and appreciated-are, we hope and believe, shortly to enter into a more advanced period of growth. A greater currency will be given to them by a man whose opinions, though not always readable, are generally worth reading. Prof. Goldwin Smith, who has had opportunities to observe the practical workings of the Torrens' system in certain of the Canadian provinces has, we are creditably informed, imparted some of the enthusiasm derived from these observations to Mr. Edward Atkinson. The latter is a cautious and shrewd gentleman-a piece of "slowburning construction," as it were-but he has, so we understand, been won over to the Torrens' system, and has in hand an article which will shortly be published in one of the leading illustrated monthlies, explaining the principles of this method of land transfer and advocating their application to the several States of the American Union. Some discussion will assuredly result from this article. There are certain of the newspapers who follow in Mr. Atkinson's wake and echo his opinions with persistence; the magazine itself has a large circulation; and the reform, when it becomes understood will, we are sure, commend itself to intelligent men whose interests do not lie the other way. Then, if a few executives will take it up and bring it forward as a popular reform, the different journals of the country, who pretend to lead, but in reality follow public opinion, will adopt a "policy" in connection with it as dictated by their various interests; and we shall have a state of things which will undoubtedly lead to an application of the system. It is particularly necessary to popularize the reform in this State. We have taken a first step in this city, one not so important in itself as in what it will pave the way for. The additions which must be made to this beginning should not be made piecemeal, but should be passed in a lump; and as there will be some opposition to this completion of the reform, its friends should be aided by popular support, and by an intelligent apprehension of the issues involved.

A^S the Block Indexing bill goes into operation on January 1st, and consequently as there are still but five months or less to elapse before that date, it may not be amiss to ask the Mayor and the Register why it is that money has not been appropriated by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment to pay for the making up of the books required under the provisions of the new act. There was enough delay last fail before the Board could be persuaded to appropriate the money necessary to prepare the maps, and if the same procrastinating policy is to hinder the preparation of the books, it will not, perhaps, be malapropos, to remind the Mayor that until they are prepared there will be no recording of conveyances and mortgages in this city after January 1st, for the present bill repeals former recording acts in relation to New York County. In view of this fact, it would seem wise that the money should be appropriated and the work begun immediately. Five months is little enough time to get up the thousands of books needed.

THERE are two matters in connection with municipal affairs in this city that are just now more desirable than any others that could easily be named, to wit: the election of a capable Mayor and the obtainment of efficient rapid transit legislation. The latter is perhaps the more important of the two, because, if the attempt to elect a good Mayor should fail, there will still remain an opportunity to try again; but if a political transit bill be passed next winter and the construction of some ill-devised system of roads be begun, it seems as if the opportunity which now exists to make a thorough an.l comprehensive revision of the city's transit system may be lost for years. The growth and general prosperity of the city depend so much upon the question of transportation, whether politicians and persons seeking to advance their own interests can control this transit matter or whether the people can control it, that to pass a righteous transit bill is, probably, of more importance than has yet been realized. The transit bill outlined in THE RECORD AND GUIDE of July 12 begins by asking the public what transit facilities they need, then provides for the appointment of engineers and commissioners under conditions which guard these appointments from improper influences, and when the technical plan has been made, affords the people full opportunity to say in what form they wish to have the enabling legislation framed. Furthermore, the commissioners who draw up the enabling legislation will be stimulated to do their work well, by knowing that if they do it badly it is likely to be condemned by public opinion and fail to pass. Under the act of 1875, or the Fassett act, the commissioners might betray their trust at pleasure, and no power exists to undo their work. Under the well-considered measure proposed, the work of building an adequate transit system can be entered upon just as soon as work upon an inferior system, authorized by a political bill, can be. It would be an honor for any representative body of citizens to take the initiative in announcing their intention to draw and popularize the suggested transit bill. Were we to say definitely who might gracefully and fittingly take the initiative in adopting this non-political transit bill, which considers no other interests than that of persons who want cheap, rapid and convenient facilities for traveling about the city, we should be inclined to specify the People's Municipal League, the Bar Association, the Real Estate Exchange, the Stock Exchange, the Chamber of Commerce, or several or all of these organizations acting in unison.

T is the easiest thing in the world to locate some short pieces of imaginary road here or there and say that it will serve a certain part of the city with transit facilities; so easy, indeed, that the town is full of ignoramuses who are given to making these slapdash locations; although every sane man knows that to work out a transit system in this piecemeal way would produce an expensive and cumbersome arrangement of railways. To start at the begin ning of the problem, by ascertaining what transit facilities persons in different parts of the city want, and then to devise a system to meet this general want, is a very complex work, and has never been done thoroughly and never will be done until a board of engineers is appointed and given time and money with which to make surveys and investigations. On the merits of the case, the propositions of the numerous Ignoramuses-with-a-plan, who are not railway experts and are not possessed of the information to be obtained only from surveys and expert investigations, are mostly trash. And yet whatever such men say, "goes," or appears to. In preparing a plan for extending the boundaries of the c.ty, in codifying a system of laws, in changing the character of capital punishment, we appoint commissioners to make a preliminary examination and people pass upon it at the next legislative session. That is a sensible and business-like way to deal with every complex and weighty public question. But to jumble up the plan-making, and the carrying out of the plan in one bill, to consider the advice of politicians and the suggestions and plans of merchants and lawyers, as though they were well-informed and disinterested railroad experts, is ridiculous in the extreme. What would we say if the Pennsylvania Railroad, in building a new line, should follow the advice of a number of politicians, storekeepers and merchants. This class of men would be silent for their reputations' sake before the officials of the company. They would recognize that the matter was one for experts, engineers and others to pronounce on. But because the rapid transit question is in a sense a political matter, lots of men are vain enough to imagine it is proper for them to drop their pens, get from their desks and from behind their counters and dictatoria y lay down what kind of road the city needs, how

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it should be built, and so on ; but the funniest thing of all is, there is even a greater number of people who pay attention to what is said, as though an oracle were speaking. The sooner we get to the end of this folly the better. It bodes no good. Though a man reads the newspapers and travels up town and down once a day it does not make him an engineer and an expert. Now, it is from these properly-qualified men that we need to hear. It is for them to consider the matter and propose the system best adapted to the requirements of the city and its conditions. This is the first point to be striven for; striven for, too, at first, to the positive exclusion of all other points. Ways and means can be considered afterwards and all other matters besides.

THE fiat of Postmaster-General Wanamaker that the "Kreutzer Sonata" shall not be transmitted through the mails, and the virtuous activity of a certain society for the suppression of vice, raise the question: how far the authorities in this free country of ours exercise a censorship over letters. The desirability and the efficacy of such a censorship are, we believe, matters of doubt. It is possible, of course, to prevent the production of a play which violates public decency or the more settled religious opinions; but, as we all know, the placing of a book under the ban of the law helps rather to increase rather than diminish its circulation, particularly at the present time when the newspapers give wide currency to an adverse decision. It is simply the old difficulty of a law, the parchment authority of which is not actively supported by public opinion. Books of gross indecency, of course, no one can read or sell without incurring the contempt of by far the larger part of the public. Although it is well that a law is in existence under which men can be punished who traffic in such scrofulous stuff, yet no law is really necessary for its suppression. Books, however, which shade into the indecent, which sometimes may be written by a sincere person, and which may be read by pureminded people, but which just as frequently are written with a bad intention for the delectation of the foul-minded-it is these books with which it is difficult for a censor to deal, and almost impossible to deal effectively. But if there is to be any censorship at all, it should at all events be intelligent and persistent. These spasmodic eruptions of virtuous suppression, after long intervals of neglect, only serve to encourage authors to write and publishers to publish books, which, to put it mildly, may be called questionable. At present this censorship is exercised practically by men who may be sincere, but who are not competent judges of what is and what is not fit for public circulation. Nothing could be more ridiculous than the attempted suppression of the "Kreutzer Sonata." However we may criticise Tolstoi's thesis, his only object in writing the book was to protest with all the power of which he is capable against the very passions which the book is said to inflame. It is no more a piece of prurient writing than is a physiological treatise. But as he deals with the psychic instead of the physical aspect of the subject; and as he uses and necessarily uses plain words in so doing, his book is placed in the same category with the filthiest stuff that any guttersnipe has ever written.

THE joint committee of the Citizens and Taxpayers' Association of the 23d and 24th Wards have issued an appeal to the voters of that district requesting them to consider seriously the duty which will confront them this fall. Ever since its annexation to New York the district has suffered from the incompetent, procrastinating, and wasteful management of its streets at the hands of the Park Department. The residents have now obtained the privilege of selecting an official who is to devote his whole time to the task of vigorously pushing street improvements. This is their opportunity, and this their responsibility. The Park Department failed to give satisfaction to the property-owners within the district because they knew little about the needs of North New York, and generally cared but little also. The function became theirs, not because it was justified by either reason or precedent, but because Governor Dix refused to sign the bill unless the street management of the district was given to his friend Andrew H. Green, at that time in the Park Department. The Park Commissioners are, as we all know, selected generally on political grounds. With one exception they are not paid for their work, and consequently give only a portion, and a small portion of their time to its duties. The thorough mastery of detail, the unceasing interest in their work and attention to it-thes qualifications, so necessary in an administrative officer, they did not possess. If the new Street Commissioner does not possess them, all the labor of the Taxpayers and Property-owners' Association to pass the bill will go for nothing. This association deems, and rightly deems, that they need an " honest, competent, fearless, independent man," which means that they do not want a politician, who, though he may be honest, is less likely to be competent, and is sure not to be independent. There is no necessity for party lines entering into the matter. We sincerely hope that the citizens of

the 23d and 24th Wards will give their support to the association in this the final step in their labors towards securing for North New York the administrative groundwork for the better management of their streets.

Mr. Richards Objects.

A SSISTANT General Passenger Agent Richards of the New York Central Railroad apparently is chagrined, because in the statistics of commuters to and from New York, within twenty miles of the city, published in THE RECORD AND GUIDE of July 19, the Vanderbilt roads occupy a quite inferior position. It was shown therein (by figures obtained from the railroad companies) that whereas on the Pennsylvania Railroad there are 21,288 commuters, on the Central Railroad of New Jersey 13,479, on the New York, Lake Erie and Western Railroad 5,500, on the Delaware, Lackawanna and Western 4,086, on the Long Island 2,373, on the Staten Island Rapid Transit 2,884; on the New York Central, the Harlem and the New York, New Haven & Hartford combined there are but 3,137, of which, by the way, as many as 1,693 belong to the New York, New Haven & Hartford road alone.

The New York *Times* republished our figures on Sunday; and on Monday supplemented some comments thereon as to the surprise of people in finding that New York is growing much more rapidly westward and eastward than northward, by an "Inquiry at the offices at the Grand Central station," which, according to the *Times*, puts a somewhat different meaning upon the figures from that which would be commonly accepted by the "casual newspaper reader." The vagaries of the casual newspaper reader in dealing with "print" are, no doubt, many, and difficult to anticipate or devine; but the matter is so plainly stated in the article and statistics which we published that we believe intelligent mistake is absolutely impossible.

In discussing the subject with the reporter of the *Times*, Mr. Richards makes the following statement:

It seems that when application was made [by THE RECORD AND GUIDE] for a statement giving the number of commuters upon these various lines, it was understood that the information was sought in regard to the number of persons who made use of commutation books. Such information, and only such, was accordingly furnished, and the totals given in this connection are alleged to represent actually the number of persons to whom commutation books are regularly sold. If the officials of the road had chosen to give, instead of the number of persons, the number of passages which were sold by the roads, the total as given would have been multiplied largely. Every commutation book contains fifty tickets, and in computing the number of passengers carried over the roads within a given time each book of this kind is counted as fifty, although the book is used by only one person. The roads that leave the Grand Ceutral Station are in the habit also of issuing strip tickets and of making other reductions in rates for special occasions, but no account was taken of such sales in the figures that were furnished for publication.

The fact of the matter is, the same application identically was made by this journal to each railroad company, and the object which we sought to attain, viz., to discover how many *persons* commute between places in the suburbs and New York City, was clearly explained. Mr. Richards made 10 mistake as to what was needed, and, under the circumstances, what reason is there to suppose the officials of other railroads did, except Mr. Richards' notion that the figures they have given are, in some instances, too large? In the interview, however, Mr. Richards admits that the returns from the Erie, the Delaware, Lackawanna & Western, the Long Island, the Staten Island, the New York, Susquehanna & Western, and even the Central Railroad of New Jersey (13,479 commuters), are either accurate or not improbable; so that only the Pennsylvania's figures are really questioned. Of these Mr. Richards said:

A simple calculation would show that it would be impossible for the Pennsylvania Railroad, for instance, to carry to and from the city 21,288 commuters each day. Mr. Richards took a pencil, and allowing sixty persons to a carload and ten cars for a train, he figured out that it would be necessary for this road to run thirty-five local trains into Jersey City during the three busy hours of the morning and to run the same trains outward again during the three busy hours in the afternoon. For six hours a day, accordingly, it would be necessary for trains to be dispatched from the Pennsylvania station at the rate of twelve per hour, or one in every five minutes. This would need to be done while through trains were coming in and leaving, and Mr. Richards says positively that it is an impossibility.

It is his opinion that the Pennsylvania officials to whom application was made for these figures did not construe the application in the literal sense in which it was construed at the Grand Central Station, and that in figuring up the totals not only were commuters counted, but also holders of strip tickets, of excursion tickets, and of all other special rate tickets. He was also inclined to think that probably the Pennsylvania officials may have counted passengers rather than persons in making out their totals.

The original copy of the statistics from the Pennsylvania Company clearly shows that Mr. Richards' supposition about "*passen*gers rather than persons," etc., is a mistaken one. The table reads. "No. of commuters"—of whom, traveling on *annual* tickets, about which the question of tickets and strips cannot be raised, there are fourteen thousand one hundred and forty-eight. If to this be added the commuters using quarterly and monthly books, does Mr. Richards think the total should be less than twenty-one thousand two hundred and eighty-eight? But, putting aside the fact that the Pennsylvania Company says they have over fourteen thousand annual commuters, and accepting Mr. Richards' idea that they meant 21,288 passages, then dividing this number by 600 (a trip each way for every working day in the year), the Pennsylvania has the equivalent of only about thirty-five annual commuters, which is palpably nonsensical. Or, on Mr. Richards' other supposition that the 21,288 stands for the number of books sold, with twelve books to the year, the commuters on the Pennsylvania would be less than 1,800, which is also ridiculous, when the Jersey Central carries 13,479 commuters.

To make sure, however, we submitted the figures with Mr. Richards' criticisms to the Pennsylvania Company, who fail to find in them the "impossibility" about which Mr. Richards is so positive. Only on the supposition that Mr. Richards is judging the Pennsylvania road by his own can his statements be explained. About 200 trains enter and leave the Jersey City station daily, exclusive of those of the Lehigh Valley, New York, Susquehanna & Western, and West Shore companies; and as, in many hours of the night and early morning, traffic is naturally light—at times quite suspended—it will be seen there must be hours when trains must be moved almost as rapidly as Mr. Richards says it is impossible to do.

But-and surely this was an unintentional "slip" on the part of Mr. Richards-is it not a very gratuitous calculation to make all the commuters of the Pennsylvania line travel within three certain hours of the day? Nothing of the kind happens. Undoubtedly a large proportion do travel between, say 6.30 and 9.30 A. M. and 4 and 7 o'clock P. M., but, during other hours of the day, in the afternoon and late in the evening, the commuters who travel are by no means few, as anyone can see who travels on the trains. A large number of tradespeople in Newark, Elizabeth and other places, as well as women, commute and travel, not daily at certain hours but irregularly as necessity arises. Besides, on the Pennsylvania road, many commuters travel on other than purely local trains to Newark and other important stations. If Mr. Richards will carefully consider these facts we do not think he will have any good reason to doubt the figures we have published, even though they be unsatisfactory to him. We are not, however, the attorneys of the Pennsylvania, or of the New York Central, or of any other line. The statistics we have published are official figures given to us in writing by the several railroad companies-in good faith, we believe. That the figures stand for the number of commuters, or persons, and are intended to do so by the companies, there can be no doubt.

The object in publishing these statistics was just the one which we believe has been accomplished-to make clear to the citizens of New York what THE RECORD AND GUIDE has been insisting upon for years, that New York is not growing as it should northward; indeed, that in that direction development is stunted, cramped, and most unsatisfactory. Granting to Mr. Richards all that he contends for, admitting what is not a fact, that the Pennsylvania road has only the same number of commuters that the Jersey Central has, we see that 37,007 commuters go into New Jersey daily against 3,440 to the north of New York-ten times as many. This disproportion is not to be accounted for in the main by any other fact than the lack of quick, comfortable transportation northward from the City Hall. In a word, herein is explained what is meant by the need of adequate rapid transit facilities. There is plenty of choice building land in the upper wards to be had at from \$400 to \$800 a lot (witness the recent sales of first-class Bedford Park property), but decent people will not migrate there so long as they have to crowd like beasts into elevated cars, stand swaying on straps for half an hour or more and then change and ride for an equal length of time on the Vanderbilt roads. What the latter part of the journey means-and this is worth Mr. Richards' attention-is well told in the following letter which appeared in the Times:

I have just read your article entitled "How Commuters Divide," and would like to call your attention to a few reasons not given by Mr. Richards that I think will give you a much better idea why the swamps of New Jersey get so much more business than the country north of New York

Jersey get so much more business than the country north of New York. First, after going, say, about fifteen miles on the Harlem (I take the Harlem because I know about that road), you will come to a dirt roadbed, and after leaving White Plains, which is only twenty-five miles, it is a single-track road.

Second, they burn soft coal on all their engines. Then, while the cars are as good as on any of the New York roads, [sic] the windows can only be opened about six inches, which, by the way, is more than is necessary, as the passengers in almost all cases prefer the heat to the dust caused by the combination of dirt roadbed and soft coal.

Now, take either the New Jersey Central or the Pennsylvania Railroad (I take these as I have commuted on both), and you find fine double-track, stone-ballast roads, with the windows all open in hot weather, and yet the passengers are clean on their arrival at destination as against being ready for the bath. You would be doing the people of Westchester County a great service by looking up this matter and stirring the New York Central and Hudson River road up enough to make travel pleasanter over their roads, and you would also do the City of New York almost as great a service by keeping the people north of the city instead of sending them to New Jersey. This is not quite a fair statement so far as the present condition of the Harlem road is concerned. It was, in truth, bad enough, but the recent improvements have made it, in several respects, first-class, within twenty miles of the Grand Central.

It is said, sometimes, that it is not to be expected that people who go to New Jersey would go north of the city and into the upper wards, if transportation thither were improved, for land is so much cheaper across the Hudson. Now, land is not so very much cheaper in New Jersey suburban places. It is not at all cheaper in places like the Oranges; and, besides, to the class of people who compose a large part of the commuters the difference between, say, \$400 and \$600 a lot will not deter them in a choice, for the cost of building is the chief expense, and that is about the same in this city as in New Jersey. The upper part of New York City is in nearly every particular preferable to the average suburban place east, west or south of us. What is needed to reverse the figures that afflict Mr. Richards is rapid transit. But in the way of that, lies political trickery, dishonesty, and a vast amount of imbecility and wrongheadedness.

Mutual Insurance for Fire-Proof Buildings.


F^{OR} some time past a number of the owners of fire-proof buildings in this city have been considering the advisability and feasibility of co-operating in a system of insurance for their mutual protection against loss and damage from fire.

The word "fire-proof," when applied to a building, has a meaning in technical usage quite different from its literal meaning. It is simply impossible to construct a building adapted to ordinary uses that shall be indestructible when a raging fire is beating against it. But what is intended in a modern fire-proof building is that it shall be capable of resisting any ordinary fire that may arise within itself, and which in a general conflagration would not add in itself to the intensity of the fire that consumed it. Brick, as every person knows, resists fire better than any other building material; but a brick wall is not fire-proof. The mortar joints compose nearly one-fourth of the whole wall, and lime mortar is no more proof against severe heat than is limestone. Consequently, the bond by burning out allows the wall to fall, making the damage as complete as if the bricks themselves had been devoured by the flames. The manner in which brick are hurriedly and carelessly laid up in a wall, not slushed in on all sides with mortar as they should be, but with one inner side of each brick having little or no mortar at all against it, leaves countless air spaces within the wall and the air in these confined chambers is expanded during a fire. If heated air can run an engine, its expansion surely can and does aid in the bulging and overthrowing of a wall. The only way in which any one man's building, however carefully constructed, would be safe is to have the buildings of all his neighbors as reasonably fire-proof as his own.

Fire-proof buildings may be seriously damaged either from fires within or fires without. The Western Union building recently gave evidence of how damaging a fire from within can be. Happily no other fire-proof building in this city has so large an amount of combustible materials to make a huge bonfire on its several upper stories, but unfortunately a number have similar evils to a lesser extent. Room after room in such buildings can be found having not only the usual highly-varnished furniture of an office, such as desks, tables and chairs, but bookcases lining the walls from floors to ceilings, books and papers, wooden doors and door casings, window casings and wooden floor boards. The building itself may be incombustible in the main, but the heat generated by the burning of the contents of a single room quickly expands the air and cracks and forces out the window glass, letting in fresh air draughts to incite the flames, which latter mounting to the ceiling reaches, unless particularly well guarded, the wrought-iron floor beams overhead and twists them to snake-like forms. Tongues of flame dart out from the broken windows and lick up the ornamental stonework of the front as far as it can be reached.

On the outside of a fire-proof building damage may result from the burning of an adjoining or opposite building, and, in some cases, such damage would be very great. Take the Equitable building, for example; in the event of the burning of one or more of the comparatively low buildings opposite the sides fronting on narrow Pine and Cedar streets the heat would probably cause portions of the granite to fly into bits, and perhaps necessitate the taking down from the very top of a section of the side, in order to make good the damage to the stone work of the lower stories. Almost without exception the great fire-proof office buildings have fronts of granite, limestone or sandstone, or of brick and stone combined, and nearly every such building is surrounded by non-fireproof buildings of lesser height; so that adjoining flames would EXAMPLES OF



beat up against the high building with more or less disastrous effect.

No wonder that the owners of fire-proof buildings are coming to a realizing sense of the dangers that lie in wait for their structures, and are combining to mutually protect themselves by distributing amongst a number of owners the possible great loss that an individual owner might sustain from fire. Many of these owners have felt so secure that they carry no insurance. Although rates are low for fire-proof buildings, yet the amount of insurance that would ordinarilly be carried, proportioned to the cost of the building, would be very large, and therefore the yearly premium is no inconsiderable sum. Policies written on some of the fire-proof buildings have not always proved profitable to the insurer. The Produce Exchange, to cite one case, took out a five-year policy for a quarter of a million of dollars on their great building. Two fires occurred, one a small affair in a closet where odds and ends were stored away, arising, it is thought, from spontaneous combustion, and doing a damage of only a few hundred dollars; the other fire took place in the Board room, attributed to the lighted butt of a cigar carelessly thrown aside, and the resultant loss amounted to several thousand dollars to furniture and walls.

An association of owners of fire-proof buildings would conserve public interests in providing for the inspection of a class of buildings that now receive little or no attention to dangers from fire that arise from refuse matter allowed to accumulate in out of the way places, in fuel rooms, in engine and boiler rooms, dangers from electric light appliances, from too combustible furniture in rooms, and from other sources of danger either indirectly causing fire, or indirectly in making too great a conflagration when a fire does occur. A fire is not merely a loss to the owner and the occupants of a burning building, but the streets around about are taken possession of by the firemen and police, and the vocations of business and professional men in the neighborhood interfered with, entailing loss of time and money over quite an extended circle. Therefore any plan which will tend to prevent fires in high buildings, impregnable to the elements though fire-proof buildings seem, should be hailed with satisfaction by the public.

Seven Months of Real Estate.

In the first seven months of 1890 there have been 10,570 conveyances recorded at the Register's office, involving the sum of \$193,404,802. In the first seven months of 1889 there were 9,918 transfers recorded, involving \$180,375,119. This is an increase of 652 in number, or about 61/2 per cent., and \$13,029,683 in amount, or about 7 per cent. During the same period the number of conveyances in the 23d and 24th Wards decreased from the number recorded in 1889-not largely, but still significantly, the figures being 1,693 for 1890 and 1,802 for 1889. The number of transfers at nominal considerations also show a small decrease.

In the matter of mortgages there have been 9,724 recorded up to August 1st of this year, involving \$169,829,432. During the same period in 1889 there were 9,072 mortgages recorded, involving \$115,806,675. This is an increase of 652 in number, and, subtracting the two general mortgages given by the Manhattan and the Edison Companies, of \$9,022,757 in amount. It will be noticed that there has been a decrease in the number of mortgages drawing interest at less than 5 per cent.

During the same seven months there have been 2,371 buildings projected in this city, the estimated cost of which is \$51,240,941. This shows a decrease in number and an increase in amount, for during the same period in 1889 there were 2,525 buildings projected, involving \$47,610,292. A further analysis of the figures shows the cause of this difference : South of 59th street the number of buildings projected has increased from 555 last year to 596 this, and the estimated cost has increased from \$17,268,970 to \$24,108,020. But this increase, so far as the number of buildings is concerned, is completely wiped out by a larger proportionate decrease in the figures for the section north of 59th street. The bearing of these facts on the rapid transit question is obvious.

BRICKS .- For Common Hards the market has BRICKS.—For Common Hards the market has scarcely varied a point since our last report. Possibly the demand was somewhat better as the heat has not been so continuously severe as during the preceding week and work has moved along in better form, but unvershave found available all the stock they required and the cost was just about the same throughout. Strictly fine goods might, under exceptional conditions, command \$6.00, but the bulk of trading takes place at a lower range, and thus far sellers have appeared very well disposed to keep business in motion without making an effort to secure an advance Pales have also sold very well and at about former range, though it must still be the very best of quality to command top rates and generally in small cargoes without other grades. The arrivals have come in from all localities tributary to this market with the exception of Long Island, and the run of quality was of a character to permit filling any orset finding no reason to suspend shipments, and probably some of them using a little extra effort to get stock forward against the chances of the early future. At the present writing the probabilities of asuspension of shipments to this market are a little doubt ful. The feeling in favor of such a course in support of the boycetted firms at Verplanck's Point is not only strong but practically unanimous, and if it seems proper in the interest of all will be carried out; but certain contingencies have to be carefullyconsidered before deciding upon positive action. LIME .- In an irregular way there has been a fair number of arrivals coastwise, and pretty well assorted, with demand enough to take them and maintain the with demand enough to take them and maintain the former general line of value firmly. Indeed, all in all, sellers have the market very well in hand, and do not appear inclined to make much complaint. Con-sumption has proven fair since the first of the month, dealers have taken hold of stock rather more willingly than was anticipated, and the supply offering at no time proved full or difficult to handle. It is expected also that the amount brought forward for some time will be moderate, as vessels are scarce, and even if so disposed manufacturers could not ship with freedom.

LUMBER.-Most operators are disposed to call the general volume of trade as quite up to an average general volume of trade as quite up to an average for this season of the year, and it looks as though business was not laxing in volume, so far as the dis-tribution into actual consumption may be concerned at least. The selection, too, is of a general character, and pretty much all standard woods obtain about their usual proportionate share of attention, with yard rates well sustained. Toward bulk lots attention turns in very fair form. Some dealers in view of the receipts of previous purchases in comparatively free are others ready to go ahead when a chance for favor-able negotiation presents itself, and for a great many custom here simply extend their field of solicitation to other localities and meet with very fair success in placing their offerings. 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GENERAL LUMBER NOTES.

CANADA

CANADA. A Canadian lumber merchant states that the reason for the present stagmation in the lumber trade is that the demand from South America, which used to take nearly all our stock timber, has fallen away to almost nothing this year. Trade there was very much inflated last year, and merchants invested recklessly. There was an unusually large cut in Canada last year, and, while under ordinary circumstances this would not have affected the market materially, combined with the depression in South America the merchants here find themselves with a stock of timber on hand which they cannot dispose of.

GREAT BRITAIN.

The Timber Trades Journal as follows:

LONDON. American Woods.—Black Walnut, Whitewood, Oak, Cc.—The inferior qualities are dull of sale. Yard keepers and consumers generally are holding sufficient stocks for some time to come, and, in order to effect sales somewhat lower prices are being quoted by the brokers for entire parcels, but this is not the case with better class stuff, for which there is still a steady de-mand at maintained prices. Sequois.—The generally satisfactory prices obtained at late unreserved public sale, when a large quantity of planks was disposed of, has probably induced the importers to offer in like manner a con

THE SOUTH

The Southern Lumbern an says

The Southern Lumberman says: The Southern saw-mill owners are prosperous and in better financial scape than ever before, and the future is bright indeed. Southern lumber of all kinds is in better demand and prices are higher than for several years. Timber possessions were secured at low prices and are enhancing in value rapidly. New manufacturing enterprises of every character are starting up, old and new towns are growing at an astonishing rate, the farmers are building to an extent never before known, and the home demand for lumber is active. Oak, yellow pine, gum and many other varieties of hardwoods are plentiful and practically untouched, and the mills will continue in successful operation for a number of years.

THE WEST.

The Northwestern Lumberman as follows :

The Northwestern Lumberman as follows : On the Saginaw river it is noted that the cargo bnsi-ness is quiet, and shipping by lake less than in former seasons, while the car load trade is continually grow-ing. This shows a tendency to a more elaborate manip-ulation of stocks, with the view of getting all possible profit out of them. It also proves that the car load trade direct to consuming and trade is conts is usurping the movement of bulk stocks by lake. That is, while Eastern wholesale dealers have gone further up the lake for supplies, passing by the Saginaw mills, the opportunity has been seized by the car load dealers to handle directly to Southern and Eastern consumers and dealers. This activity may in a degree account for the slack demand at Tonawanda and Buffalo. While these markets have been discarding Saginaw lumber, it has reached their customers by a direct car load route. The report is circulated that sail vessel seamen on the chain of great lakes are about to strike for higher wages, and that the entire vessel movement will thus be stopped for an indefinite time. Should this be the case it will be a serious mat er with the lake movement of pine lumber, on the cargo market in some pronounced manner. On the cargo market at Chicago the price of piecc stuff is firm at \$10 a thousand for good cargoes with

the usual run of assortments. Shingle log piece stuff sells a quarter off from the regular price, but there is not enough of such lumber to make a market. It can be said that piece stuff is a little firmer than it was two or three weeks ago. Arrivals are so moderate that they do not burden the market. The inquiry for joists 22 feet long and upward is an especial feature of the demand. Such lumber in separate lots com-mands \$11.50 a thousand. Cargoes of short lengths have been sold to arrive at \$10.25, when the lumber was known to be particularly good. Goards boards are neglected. Cargoes containing a good percentage of strips are sought after. Boards of stock width are salable at steady prices. At the yards prices are tending to firmness, and dealers have generally stopped cutting. Predictions are made that values will advance on piece stuff, com-mon and better strips, and on boards of stock width. Good lumber is in especial demand. Dealers are buy-ing all they can get of such stock, and it is probable that next winter it will be found that there is plenty of it, and possibly a reaction in prices may then set in. That is generally the result when dealers all go on a string for a particular class of lumber.

METALS.—Coppers—Ingot has found a somewhat irregular demand, but altogeth r the movement was of fairly satisfactory volume, and the market held in shape without an apparent effort. Indeed, for spot lots of stock somewhat higher figures were obtained and some of the Lake companies are believed to have placed very good contracts for comparatively early ruture delivery. The spot stock in Europe decreased 1,170 tons last month, but an increase in the quantity affoat left the visible supply 72,600 tons, or 30 tons larger than it was a month before. The deliveries in England and France were 7,490 tons less last month than during June. Quotations are generally placed at 174/@1734c. for Lake, and 143/@16c. for casting brands. American Whitewood.—The market has been too freely supplied, and prices have given way even for the best shipments, and we think shippers would do wisely to suspend further exportations for some time to come. Several very large vessels, both steamers and sail-ers, have arrived with cargoes of spruce deals from st. John, N. B., but these have already been sold "to arrive," and a considerable portion will go into con-sumption up the country. Or, at any rate, whether it be really sold or not, it will vanish, as did a con-siderable quantity last year, from the Canada Dock, and form no part of the ostensible Liverpool stock. It has already taken place in the case of pitch pine, and spruce may follow in its wake before long. With regard to pitch pine, those who bought sawn wood a few weeks ago would be glad to repeat their operations to-day, but it cannot be done, and it is by no means improbable that, when the next cargoes are offered by public auction, we shall see an improve-ment upon the recent prices, though it may not be a very marked one.
