THE stock market has shown its dependence on European news for its moving influences. The engagement of gold for export, with accompanying rumors of trouble in one or the other great capitals of the Old World, has been tollowed by selling and a decline in values, while yesterday the expectation that the export movement of gold was near its end caused an advance which had some of the features of a healthy bull movement. In this connection the most encouraging feature probably is the movement of gold from London to Russia, as it helps to remove one of the most threatening features of the situation. There could be no satisfactory condition of the money market abroad so long as the great centres-especially those belonging to nations upon which the powers at St. Petersburg looked with disfavor-were the depositories of Russia's large gold supply, which could be used as a means of disturbing their finances at any moment. Any movement toward the lessening of London's and Berlin's debt to Russia to within reasonable limits is, therefore, as encouraging abroad as is the decline in gold exportations on this side. While the financial atmosphere is clearing, it must be remembered, however, caution is still a virtue. We have this year shipped over forty millions of dollars gold, and may have to send more this year, and cannot hope for a return movement for some time; meanwhile the home demands are likely to increase, with a tendency to create stringency in the money centres. This probability will tend to limit the advance, and while there may be in the immediate future a rise in values, consequent upon the more cheerful condition of things at home and abroad, it is not likely to be great. The real bull market everybody hopes to see is doubtless postponed until the effect of our recent auriferous sacrifices has more certainly passed away, to be followed by the more pleasing results of good harvests, or the certainty thereof, accompanied by an increased European demand for American cereals.

SINCE the interests involved in the rehabilitation of Argentine finance are so enormous, and the bankers and others representing these interests so powerful, it might have been supposed that the action taken to secure the creditors would have been far more energetic and effective than it has been. But those whose business it is to move in the matter have been extraordinarily timid. Months have now passed since the failure of the Barings and the constitution of a committee to negotiate with the Argentine government; and nothing but chaos still reigns in all that appertains to Argentine finance. Signs are not wanting that many of the creditors are beginning to chafe under this tantalizing and possibly disastrous inaction. Some of them are proposing that a commission of financial experts from Europe, duly authorized to investigate all the conditions of the problem and propose a well thought out scheme by which Argentina could be placed in a condition to make a fresh start unencumbered by the worry and annoyance incidental to the tinkering policy which has been adopted. Others, particularly in Germany, advocate a more vigorous line of action. They want a committee appointed to assume charge of the finances of the Argentine government for the purpose of working them in the interests of the creditors—thus putting the country practically into the hands of the receiver, and they want the European governments, if necessary, to exert their influence in favor of such a plan. Which of these measures will be adopted, if any, it is impossible at this distance to make a plausible but unless some decided action is taken the Argentines will continue to flounder along until such remedial measures may be too late. It will be remembered that the London Committee did not propose to attempt the adjustment of any part of the debt except the funded debt of the national government. The bonds of the provinces, the Cedulas, the water-works company, the railroad guarantees were all to be left to take care of themselves. If any scheme could be proposed which would help to secure the payment of these obligations also much future trouble will be avoided and the country will be left far more free to develop without artificial hindrances.

THERE seems to be, at all events, one practical method of doing this. All contracts with Argentina have been made in gold, and the premium on that metal in the Republic approaches 300 per cent. Now, as most of these debts were incurred when there was little or no premium on gold, the calculations of all the borrowers in the Republic have been thrown all awry, and their debts are practically three times as heavy as they were expected to be when the money was borrowed. Thus, suppose a corporation sold \$10,000,000 of 6 per cent bonds in the London market for the purpose of building a railroad. The company had calculated that they were able, when the line was in good operating order, to earn their expenses and some \$700,000 a year—sufficient, that is, to pay their fixed charges. But, meanwhile, the premium on gold has risen to 300 per cent. If the company can earn the \$700,000 that they expected to earn the money they will receive will be, of course, the circulating medium of the country; but since the interest charges must be met in gold, this \$700,000 will mean only \$230,000 in London. The company would have to secure \$1,800,000 in Argentine money, or nearly three times that which they counted upon earning, in order to meet its liabilities in gold. The main difficulty of the situation lies obviously in this premium on gold; and no practical method of removing it has yet been suggested. The European creditors will certainly force Argentina to the wall if they stick to the letter of the contract and try to coerce the country to pay just what it bargained to pay. The Republic cannot do it; the debt must be scaled down in some way. The most practicable method of accomplishing this purpose would be to permit the debtors to pay in silver, which they can obtain much more readily than they can gold. The demand for silver thus created would so raise its price in the markets of the world that the difference which the creditors would lose would be very small. To this it may be answered that our own experience in borrowing, when gold is at a premium, and repaying it when the premium had partially or wholly disappeared, would seem to testify that the Argentine Republic can do likewise. This analogy is fallacious. The United States is a country of far more varied resources than the Argentine Republic; and its inhabitants possess far more vitality and energy than do the impulsive but lazy and unenterprising South Americans. The latter would become discouraged in endeavoring to cope with their enormous debt; when they find it very onerous, they will be more likely to make efforts to repudiate than to pay their obligations. Since the crash, immigration to the country has almost entirely ceased. If it is to begin again, and if the natural resources of Argentina are to be developed, as they must be developed in order that the load of debt can be carried, the Argentine government and people must be granted more of a chance and treated more leniently than the creditors as yet seem disposed to treat them. It may be that the delay which has occurred and for which the Rothschild committee is responsible has been allowed to take place in order that weak and small holders might be discouraged into selling-thus permitting insiders to buy for the purpose of averaging up. However that may be, the large bankers will reckon without their host, if the Republic is not treated tenderly. The final result of the experience will be to popularize American securities abroad. As one prominent financier puts it, London has practically made an assignment to J. S. Morgan & Co. Of the largest banking houses in that city, all or nearly all, except J. S. Morgan & Co., with their followings, have been involved by the crash; and they have made their assets over to an American house for it to realize upon the resources as best it can. Hence, it is that John P. Morgan, in spite of the enormous interests demanding his presence in this country, has been forced to go to London. The prestige of the firm and its following will thus be greatly enlarged, while its main interests will still be in this country. American securities will find increasing favor on the other side,

WHEN we speak of the population of a city we mean, of course, the number of people dwelling within its municipal boundaries. Yet since the municipal boundaries of a city do not by any means include all the people who are dependent on its trade for their living, its shops for their goods, its theatres for their amusements, and who contribute to its prosperity and progress, this must always be a very arbitrary method of calculation and one which will surely produce false impressions upon those who take lists and tables at their face value. To give but a single instance; a city like Chicago, which has incorporated all of its suburbs and some prairie lands besides, obtains in this way a

position prestige which the facts do and a the influence and the trade Since community are not dependent on its position in tabular lists, the importance of the question is entirely speculative, but as such it may have some interest, and consequently we present the following table, which has been going the rounds of the papers, and which is an attempt to arrange the largest cities in the country in the order of their real population. New York, Brooklyn, Long Island City, Jersey City, etc., are all classed together; to Boston is added Cambridge, Somerville, Charleston, Roxbury, etc. Pittsburg includes Alleghany City, and so on. Chicago is the principal large municipality that does not make material gains from this method of estimating and comparing.

How accurate this is we do not pretend to know; but it appears "plausible," so we let it pass without any attempt at verification. New York it will be noticed by this wholesale eradication of municipal boundaries gets a population of over 3,600,000, some two and a-half times more than that of any other city in the country. Boston, Pittsburg, Minneapolis and St. Paul also gain largely, while Philadelphia and Chicago make comparatively small increases. So far as the percentage of augmentation goes the "Twin Cities" have largely the advantage, with Chicago a poor second and Kansas City a fair third. Then follows Pittsburg, then Milwaukee, then Cleveland, then Buffalo, then Detroit, with New York as ninth. Albany fares most poorly with only 7 per cent increase for the decade.

WE in the United States are deriving some little satisfaction from the fact that the plan of government of the new Commonwealth of Australia was patterned largely after our own Federal Constitution. Australia, on the other hand, is not without governmental methods of its own which we, in turn, might with profit adopt. In the administration of affairs of municipal concern, Australians show far greater tact and ability than Americans, Our "antipodal cousins" not only believe in the theory that local authorities should govern in all matters pertaining to the community as a body, but they also believe in the practice. The method of controlling street railways employed by the City of Melbourne and its eleven suburban towns may be given as an example of the good sense and consummate ability of Australians in ordering their municipal affairs. These twelve municipalities, having been given the option under an act of Parliament of constructing their own street railway, decided to exercise the privilege. A Tramway Trust, composed of representatives from the councils of the several cities was accordingly formed in 1884 with power to borrow one million and a-half dollars on the security of municipal property. The lines on completion were leased by the Municipal Trust to a private company for a period of thirty-two years, the company to provide the rolling stock, keep the streets-to the width of seventeen feet-occupied by the tracks in thorough repair, return the lines in sound condition to the Trust at the expiration of the lease, and to guarantee to the Trust the annual interest on the sum borrowed to construct the lines, besides to pay a yearly installment to go toward a sinking fund for the final extinction of the loan. In less than twenty-five years Melbourne and the outlying suburban towns will come into possession of a complete street railway system fifty miles in length, which will not have cost them a cent. Over forty miles of the total length of the line to be constructed have already been opened to traffic. The amount of fare which the company may charge is regulated by act. The regular fare on the Melbourne and suburban lines is at present six cents. The company is required, however, to run morning and evening cars for workmen at a fare of three cents. Considering the possible distance which may be traveled on the lines connecting Melbourne and its suburbs, the fare charged would seem to be a reasonable one. In regard to the control of street railways, at least, we have much to learn from the Australians.

THE lately distributed bulletin of the Census Office containing the results of an inquiry into the relative cheapness of cable, electric and animal power as motive forces for street railways has a manifest utility at the present time. All over the country pay-

ing lines are discarding horses and substituting either cable or When a company decides to make a change, we electric traction. may be sure that the comparative cost of the various motive powers is very carefully estimated, and their comparative suitability to the conditions of its service rigorously determined; but the public also have an interest in the matter, for its representatives are often called upon to authorize these changes, and information apart from the interested testimony of officials should be available. The census bulletin has not been framed to meet the requirements of municipal or state officers with jurisdiction over such matters; but when the inquiry is completed, it may be of some utility for this purpose. Of course, the first care of these officials should be that life and property are not endangered by the introduction of any new system; and upon this aspect of the matter the inquiry does not touch, and, so far as we know, will not touch when fuller returns come in. It will be useful, however, for such officials to know the relative economy of the different systems. Thus far, all over the country, the authorities, owing to ignorance or something worse, have allowed the streets of their cities to pass into the hands of companies without exacting any sufficient payment therefor. There are many indications that this fact is beginning to be appreciated, but it is seldom that any method can be found of again getting such a grip on the earning power of the companies that they are willing to pay increased sums in order to shake it off. Their disposition to change their traction offers a limited opportunity to secure for the municipalities a certain share of the return to which they are entitled for the use of their streets. If the authorities had reliable sources of information as to the extent which the companies would be benefited by a change, they could determine how much they could demand for their authorization. The Sinking Fund Commissioners of this city were able, for instance, to get the Broadway Railroad Company to pay \$150,000 a year more into the municipal treasury as price for their assent to the change. The circumstances were doubtless exceptional. Probably no other company in the country, except some of the largest in the largest cities-most of which have already discarded horses-could afford to pay as much, but they could afford to pay something. The good Mr. Richardson, for example, in Brooklyn has become dissatisfied with the plodding horse, and would doubtless increase the munificent sum which he pays for his franchises in return for the acquiescence of the authorities in his plans for improving his motive power. It is a pity, however, that the general railway commissioners have jurisdiction over the matter in New York state. So far as we know, it has not yet occurred to them that any company wishing to change should pay for the privilege.

F the Census Bureau wishes to perform a service to the com. munity, it might undertake an inquiry something like the following: It should ascertain the mileage not only of the street railways in the fifty-six leading cities of the country, but of the 476 cities and towns in which such railways are located, and the capital stock, bonded indebtedness and gross and net receipts of the companies operating them. It should further ascertain what proportion, if any, of these gross or net receipts the companies pay to the municipalities for their franchises, and upon what terms these franchises are held-that is, whether any conditions as to the kind of service required, the length as to which the franchise is granted, the fares permitted to be charged, and so forth enter into the contract. Furthermore, for purposes of comparison, similar statistics might be obtained as to the tramways of England and the Continentwhere public interests are far more rigorously protected than in this country. There is as much if not more need for complete and accurate information on these points as upon those covered incompletely by the last bulletin. It is of the first importance now that the municipal expenditures are increasing so rapidly and our cities are growing with such phenomenal speed that every available source of revenue should be worked for all it is worth, and at the same time, of course, that private capital—if it be economical to allow private capital so to employ itself-should not be discouraged in making needed improvements. Every State ought to have a sound general law covering these matters, and its provisions should be sufficiently elastic to meet the varying conditions of large cities, small cities and suburbs. The Cantor Act, under which franchises are granted in this State, and which is one of the few examples of this sort of legislation in the country, has operated in a manner far from satisfactory. The measure was passed just subsequent to the commotion produced by the Broadway "boodle" grant; and so badly has it worked that under its provisions but one street railway has been built. The company which succeeded in obtaining the franchise west of the cross-town road, on 28th and 29th streets, offered such a large percentage (over 30 per cent) that it now declares itself unable to operate the road on a paying basis. A bill was introduced into the Legislature at its last session to permit the Sinking Fund Commissioners to reduce the percentage, but it failed to obtain executive approval. We think it but right that this company should be held to its contract, the full requirements and incidence of which it ought to

have comprehended and probably did comprehend when it bid for the contract. If it will not do so its bond should be forfeited. But the experience shows that the Cantor Act is a failure, just as similar experiences in Brooklyn show the same thing. Either the successful competitor should be put under such heavy bonds that the bidding will be more discreet, or the principle of competition should be abandoned, and as Simon Sterne has suggested, a commission should be instituted, which could arrange satisfactory terms of grant with the corporations. What we are insisting on just now, however, is the need for a flexible system based upon complete and accurate information. Certain principles are already practically determined. Writers, for instance, pretty well agree that no franchise should be granted in perpetuity and that allowance should be made for changing conditions, so that the company should pay more as its gross income increased. But for the arrangement of details the information mentioned is necessary; and since the Census Bureau is investigating street railways, it might well throw the necessary light on the problem.

Theological Difficulties.

RELIGIOUS controversies like the one now waging around Dr. Briggs are unfortunate affairs for the Church, whatever results they may have for theology. Though they may lead to the readjustment of creeds in conformity with the latest pronouncement of Science, though they may bring Inspiration and Logic into closer terms with one another, their effect upon the public mind is always and inevitably unsettling. The world, which holds so little of itself, which in religion as in the greater part of all its other affairs follows this guide or that, can scarcely be sure of a Faith which does not seem to be quite sure of itself, or believe in creeds which are interpreted in many ways even by the faithful, who maintain harmony among themselves only by repeated revisions and readjustments. Dissent is the Devil's representative in Ecclesiastical Councils. Should the formal part of the Christian religion ever pass from the hearts and conduct of men, as the religion of ancient Greece has, Martin Luther will be regarded as the first great destroyer of the Faith. Louis Napoleon said that an institution doomed to perish, perishes by the very means it adopts to save itself. And so the Church will perish if perish it Faith can make no concessions with safety. Its progress towards a more logical position is necessarily illogical. It can never question. It should know of no reason why it should account for its own existence or justify itself. It knows that It is, and in the fullness of that knowledge is its vitality. Probably Dr. Briggs, like the shaker of the pagoda-tree, marvels at his own moderation, and if the indirecter consequences of the controversy he has raised were not immensely more important than the directer ones he would be right.

If there are any students of Grecian History in the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church now in session in Detroit it would be well if they would recount to the Convention how the Grecian religion met its doubters 2,300 years ago, and The Christian Church to-day is answering with what results. those who question it after precisely the same manner that the believers in the ancient faith did theirs. The Mythopceic Age in Hellas terminated long before the Greeks were in possession of any considerable body of exact geographical or scientific knowledge. Quite naturally then, with the increase of navigation, the advancement of philosophical and scientific research, there was found to be no place in human experience for the Hyperboreans and other mythical peoples; for gods, demi-gods and divinely created heroes, and the multidinous extra-natural events which formed the greater part of their history. If no ship, by ever so venturesome a voyage, could reach the shores where the Hyperboreans dwelt; if the black dove at Dodona ceased to guide Man and declare unto him the ways of Fate, if the gods who found the world once so pleasant a place to sport in with the daughters of men had departed, if the nymphs and dryads no more revealed their presence in stream and wood, if Triton no longer blew his horn over sunny seas, if Pan had ceased to make music on his pipes, was it because the old things had passed away suddenly for unknown reasons, or was it because they had never existed? How did the Greek religion answer the questioning of the new science, the new Geography, the new Philosophy? It answered them, as we have said, the Christian Church for a hundred years at least has been answering the questions which perplexed and doubting people have put to it-by reading new meanings into old words, by "revising" creeds, by dropping this article or that, by placing new interpretations in the place of the older ones which the Church held previously for centuries.

When the Christian fathers set about to overthrow the old Pagan religion they were quick enough to see that the "Revisers"—the Euhemerists as they have been called-had done one-half of the work for them. The Fathers placed the different interpretations of myths one against the other and asked which was the one the faithful must accept and why any one more than another. They brought forward History to prove Faith inconstant, and by reason of her inconstancy they made Faith testify against herself before Reason.

The result, of course, is that a great deal of property is sacrificed because it is not really put upon the market, and thereby someone's interest suffers. will be puzzled to understand why there should be any dispute over the matter. Since all legal sales there are held in the Liberty street Exchange everyone knows how much better that plan works than the old fashion of "sell where you like." Nevertheless, there is a dispute about the matter in this city; and certain officials go so for as to say it does not make any difference where property is sold, whether it be at the heart of the city or the uttermost ends of it-a statement which makes real estate men smile, However, the Secretary of the Exchange, Mr. C. Augustus Haviland, has written to the Registrar of Arrears, drawing his attention to the fact that the Evchange is the proper place where sales should be held, and it is not improbable that the directors will not drop the matter till they have won their point and common-sense business methods prevail,

By the way, the Arrears sale, announced to take place on Wednesday, has been adjourned until June 17th at 2 o'clock. These adjournments happen every year, and are very annoying to the crowd who attend to buy the advertised invitation of the city. If property is to be sold, why not fix a day and stick to it. The appointment of the date is entirely in the hands of the city.

"The Awakening on the Upper West Side."

THE CAUSES WHICH HAVE LED TO IT AND THE PROSPECT OF ITS UNDER-GOING AN ACTIVE SELLING AND BUILDING MOVEMENT IN THE NEAR FUTURE.

It is not so very long ago that the West Side, as it is now known, did not boast of a single modern building. And when speaking of the "West Side" everyone now understands the term. Twenty years ago it signified anywhere west of 5th or 6th avenue, and more particularly between 6th and 10th avenues. But the appellation would not have been expected to include any of the territory north of 59th street. There the West Side stopped, as far as the public mind was concerned. But now no one would mistake its meaning. The West Side takes in any part of the large section of the metropolis between 59th and 110th streets, Central Park and Riverside Drive. North of the Central Park, and up to about 138th street, is generally considered to be Harlem.


But now we are confronted with what may be termed the "Upper West Side," We are growing, and we are ever growing northward. Our population is increasing, and more ground must be found whereon to build the homes that our people are seeking. As costly houses are built on the "West Side," so do the lots around which they are built become expensive. People are on the lookout for something less costly, and they are finding it in the "Upper West Side," on Washington Heights, on Washington Hill, and even beyond.

Thus it has come about that properties so long neglected, acres which our fathers have held intact for generations, are now being placed on the market. The Upper West Side received its first great impetus when the Jumel heirs resolved to place their property in the market in the summer and fall of 1882. Many will read these lines who were present on those memorable days in May, June and November of that year in the old Merchants' Exchange Salesroom, Trinity Building, when a crowd of brokers, speculators and investors jostled against each other in the effort to purchase same part—no matter what—of the large and historic property which was being divided up for the first time. Every one who purchased knew that to buy meant to make profit, and considerable profit at that. That they were not disappointed the past eight years have shown. Directly the sale was over lots jumped 25 per cent in value, and since then they have increased in value from 400 to 600 per cent.

It is a curious fact that wherever a large sale takes place of property that is being divided up into lots for the first-time the improvement of the locality is assured. Certain purchasers are pretty sure to build, either for their own occupancy or for for the purpose of sale or investment. It gives life to a neighborhood previously dead. It creates a community of interests, where before the interest was individual. Besides, buyers at such sales always make profits, as they not only obtain property at low figures but because, after having bought it, each buyer will not sell until he receives a profit.

The sale of the Morton-Bliss property, which is to be undertaken by the Morgenthan syndicate on the 26th inst., is an illustration of the point just made. There can be but little doubt that a number of improvements will be undertaken by many who will purchase of those lots next Tuesday. It is very clear, also, that the distribution of this property will mark a new era in the development of the Upper West Side. When improvements begin to show themselves on that property, surrounding values will naturally increase. Owners of adjacent blocks long held for a rise, will thus feel tempted also to place their real estate on the market. This will result in a further distribution and in further improvements, so that within a few years we shall most probably see a not inconsiderable development of the section immediately south, and possibly north, of Washington Bridge. There are hundreds of people in New York City who will eagerly catch up lots at low figures in the Washington Heights section. These people are anxious to build their homes where lots will cost them three to four thousand dollars, knowing well that in order to build on lots on the West Side proper, or on the East Side, they will have to pay three or four times as much for their ground.

The Upper West Side is to be the next scene of building activity and

enhancement in real estate values in New York City. The cable road along 10th avenue has only just commenced to have its effect on property on the Heights. The only section that appears to have had a large rise is North of that street, especially that in the neighborhood of 155th street. between 165th and 200th streets, we are only on the eve of higher prices, and this is particularly so with the streets and avenues not yet opened.

The causes which have led to this advance northward are quite apparent. Lots are too high and houses cost too much, south of 125th street, for many people. Hence, they must either go to the 23d and 24th Wards, or to New Jersey or Long Island. Those who prefer to live in New York, who have their business, family and social ties here, will remain on Manhattan Island if they can get homes at anything like a reasonable figure. Washington Heights and Washington Hill, or any of the territory along that high ground, is going to be the place where they will settle, as it is the only extensive part of Manhattan Island left where values are moderately low and where a chance exists for houses of medium cost to be built.

The cable road, Highbridge Park and Washington Bridge form a trio of combinations in beauty and utility which will have their influence in helping this section. Should the Rapid Transit Commissioners lay out a route along 11th avenue or Kingsbridge road we will witness a very decided advance in values and an important movement in building.

PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS.

Among the causes which are bound to have their effect in increasing values on the Upper West Side are: 1. The cable road, which gives quick, cheap and pleasant communication along Amsterdam (10th) avenue, between points near Fort George down to 125th street, and gives rapid communication with the elevated road stations at 125th street, connecting with the 6th, 9th, 3d and 2d avenue elevated roads. 2. The superb Washington Bridge, erected at a cost of some \$3,000,000 and said to be the finest bridge of its size in this country. An illustration of this bridge, taken from a recent photograph, appears on another page. 3. The Highbridge Park, the lines of which, as established by the Board of Street Opening and Improvement, run from the old Highbridge Park, near 170th street, up to Washington Bridge, and which gives added value to all property fronting on or near Amsterdam avenue, between about 170th and 181st streets. 4. The viaduct at 155th street, which will, when completed, obviate the necessity for climbing the stairs at the bluff at St. Nicholas avenue, and give easy and level access to the elevated road station at that street, besides creating a new drive at that point. This viaduct will be finished at the end of the year and will be a handsome and ornamental improvement to the locality.

In addition to these improvements it seems probable that the Rapid Transit Commissioners will lay out some route along Kingsbridge road or 11th avenue. Whether this rapid transit will be carried out by the Manhattan Road, as proposed by Mr. Gould, or whether it will be carried out by others, remains to be seen, but in any case it will largely increase real estate values between 155th and 200th streets and beyond.

RECENT SALES ON THE HEIGHTS.

A search of the files of THE RECORD AND GUIDE shows that quite a number of sales of vacant property in this section have recently taken place at auction. The character of the properties sold has varied. In some instances it has been finely situated, while in others it has been somewhat out of the line of direct improvement. We give below a number of these sales, which, it must be remembered, are by no means a criterion of values in other localities on Washington Heights. The individuals named were the purchasers.

It will be observed that there is a remarkable variation in the prices obtained in the several localities. It is reiterated that the values presented above are given principally as an evidence of the recent activity and of auction values in certain sections. The value of lots varies with almost every street, and a lot sold on 187th street would be no sure criterion as to the worth of a lot on 184th or 182d street.

As showing the remarkable changes which have taken place in values on Washington Heights during the last eight years, it may be stated that at the Jumel sale in June, 1882, on Jumel terrace, lots sold for \$900 and \$950. The southeast corner of Kingsbridge road and 167th street brought \$1,010, and inside lots brought from \$650 to \$850 each. Benj. P. Fairchild secured four lots on 159th street, near St. Nicholas avenue, for \$4,600. A lot on that avenue, 25.5x117.4x25x112.8, 178 feet north of 160th street, sold to H. Sonn for \$1,475, and in June, 1886, J. McCallum paid \$6,000 for the same parcel, an advance of \$4,525, over 300 per cent in the four years, and this, too, before the cable road was in operation. Men like John D. Crimmits, L. J. Phillips, John Callahan, W. J. Barnes, Patrick Fox, Henry J. Carr and others bought lots on St. Nicholas avenue at about \$1,500 to \$2,500 each, including corners, which are now worth many times as much. Douglas Campbell purchased 50x112.6 on 162d street, east of St. Nicholas avenue, at \$960. Lots on 10th avenue, near 162d st, were bought for \$1,500 to \$2,265 each, which could not be bought at less than \$9,000 or more to-day. while the northeast corner of 10th avenue and 163d street was secured for \$3,050, its value to-day being about four to five times greater.

These instances are given as showing what large profits have been made in the Washington Heights section during the past eight years. Nor would such profits have been realized had not the estates been cut up

As to building, there has been comparatively little done during the last year or two. What there has been may be said to be of an unimportant character. The history of Washington Heights during the next three or four years will undoubtedly tell a different story.

The Lumber Difficulty Settled. HOUSESMITHS AND FRAMERS STILL OUT.

The lumber difficulty was settled yesterday afternoon. It was settled, too, in a very sensible manner, namely, by the creation of an Arbitration Committee to adjust the differences now existing between the dealers and the men. Both organizations have taken a leaf out of the book of the Mason Builders' Association and the Bricklayers' Unions, who never fight over anything without first submitting their differences to a Joint Board of Arbitration.

Thus ends the lumber trouble for the present. Whether the committee will arrange the difficulty for which they were created to cope remains to be seen. Both sides are now on their good behavior. If the bosses insist on allowing men to be underpaid by members of their organization they must expect that the men will be dissatisfied, and they will have no reason to complain if their fellow members, who are paying decent wages, will refuse to stand by them; if, on the other hand, the men demand too much, or break their agreement with the dealers, then there may be an end to future chances of arbitration, for the "bosses" once bit will not be likely to be caught again. For the present, however, it is satisfactory to be able to chronicle that the yards are to be opened at once and the hundreds of men enabled to make their bread and butter, while contracts can be continued in all the vards.

The settlement of the lumber difficulty yesterday is a victory for the great principle of arbitration. There is only one weak spot in the agreement, and that is, that this Joint Arbitration Committee is only to exist till July 6, 1891. It ought to have been made, and should be made, a permanent committee. It will be better for masters and men that it should be so, for these disturbances of business are intolerable, and should be avoided by all means.

The terms of the settlement are shown in the original agreement, of which the following is a copy:

Rogers with power to act in behalf of both bodies, and those they represent, it is agreed; First—That all the lumber yards now closed shall be opened at once, and all strikes shall be at once taken off.

Second—An Arbitration Committee having been agreed upon, to consist of six members, three of whom shall be chosen by the Board of Delegates from the New York Lumber Trade Association, and three shall be named by the New York Lumber Trade Association from the members of the Board of Delegates, and the Board of Delegates having named and chosen Alonzo T. Decker, Abraham Steers and James B. Dill as three of such committee, and William H. McCord, Charles P. Rogers and Thomas McCracken having been chosen in behalf of the New York Lumber Trade Association, it is agreed that this committee shall act until the 6th day of July, 1891, and shall have power by a majority vote to settle all difference which shall arise between the New York Lumber Trade Association and the members thereof and between those represented by the Board of Delegates.

And it is further agreed, that in case of a tie vote of the said Committee, the Committee shall have power to name an additional member, who shall act for the time being as a member of said Committee upon the question as to which there may be a tie vote.

No strike shall be ordered or allowed, and no yard shall be closed until after a complaint shall be made to this Board of Arbitration and shall have been acted upon by them.

This Board shall have power to entertain and hear all complaints, and the same shall be made to them as hereinbefore provided before any action shall be taken, and the action of the Committee of Arbitration shall bind the parties to this Agreement.

THE HOUSESMITHS AND FRAMERS.

The situation, as it affects the housesmiths, has changed only in one Until Wednesday of this week the particular since our last issue. employers had kept their foundries closed, preferring to shut down on work completely. As there seems to have been a disposition on the part of the unions, as a whole, to hold out, the employers on Thursday resolved to open their foundries and shops, with the result that a small number of union and non-union men have returned to work.

Inquiry at the offices of the J. B. & J. M. Cornell Iron Works elicits the information that only a few score are now at work in their shops and foundries out of a thousand to twelve hundred men. At the Jackson Architectural Iron Works only about thirty men are at work ont of 600 to 700. Other shops make a similarly small showing, so that up till yesterday there was not much weakness in the union organizations. Important measures are, however, on the tapis, and it is not improbable that the Board of Delegates of the Building Trades may resolve next week to order a general raising of the tie-ap and striking along the line. This holds good, also, as to the framers, who are in the same position as they were a

What may help an early termination of the strike is the fact that the treasury of the Housesmiths' Union cannot possibly hold out more than a few weeks longer without help from other labor organizations. receive \$7 each weekly while on strike, and this means at least \$6,000 or \$7,000 per week, there being over 900 in receipt of union money. This is not a very adequate sum for men who have been steadily earning \$18 to

One thing is clear, and that is, that the employers wil make no concession, except, perhaps, to reduce the hours of labor from nine to eight, with eight hours' pay. But this the men do not want; they demand eight hours' work for nine hours' pay. The employers say they will hold out till September and longer rather than accede to this.

Some of the employers are for holding out until the treasury of the unions is depleted, through payments to the men on strike. This, they say, will break the backbone of the unions. The feeling is not, however, shared by the majority of the employers, who do not wish to do anything that would hurt the men and who prefer to deal justly with them.

"Get back to work and don't make fools of yourselves," is the terse statement of one of the employers.

On Thursday six moulders were arrested in Hoboken for an alleged intimidation of an ex-shopmate who had declined to go out on strike. Yesterday the case was dismissed on insufficient evidence, and the men now say they will sue Mr. Fagan, the owner of the yard, for false imprisonment. The incident was reported at the housesmith's session yesterday morning. A similar case occurred with some framers at 1st avenue and 7th street. The men were acquitted.

UNION LEADERS TALK.

Delegate Warner, Chairman of the Housesmith's Union, said: "We have four thousand men in our organizations, inside and outside. Out of these about 3,000 are owners of real estate in some shape, not a few owning their homes in New York City. One of our men owns six houses. We are not a poor organization and we can afford to remain idle, most of us, for several When our treasury becomes depleted the unions throughout the city will stand by us as per agreement. The marble cutters have offered us a day's work (\$3.59) per weeh for each of their members, while there are 30,000 men in other trades who will pay an assessment of \$1 per week, and in some trades even more. Out of our 4,000 strikers only about 900 are asking for the \$7 a week from the union."

A committeeman of the Framers' Union said: "The bosses are trying to frighten us by arresting our men on charges of intimidation. This is poor kind of work and will only make us fight the harder. We are not going to give in."

There are still over 300 framers out of work, nearly 1,000 men having gone in on the union terms.

THE RECORD AND GUIDE suggests, as the most desirable thing for both employers and employees, as well as for the owners of buildings under way, vast business interests affected, that the housesmiths and framers, both appoint joint committees of arbitration, work to be resumed all along the line until the committees announce their decision.

Real Estate Notes.

Solomon Sayles, the Jefferson Market butcher, has taken title from Charles A. Hess to the four-story brick orphan asylum, Nos. 59 to 67 West

Theodore Moss has borrowed \$75,000 in gold, at 41/2 per cent, from Baroness Mary E. B. Von Zedtwitz, of Mexico, on the leasehold property on Broadway, northeast corner 30th street, known as Palmer's Theatre, etc.

The contract from Douglass W. and T. Brownell Burnham to W. Osborne Stoddard was recorded last week at \$450,000. The property embraces Nos. 124 to 128 5th avenue, and No. 2 West 18th street, size 92x175, with two fourstory and one five-story stone front dwellings on avenue, and two-story brick and stone stable on 18th street.

Theodore A. Havemeyer evidently does not intend to lose much time in the erection of his new building on Church street, between Cortlandt and Dey streets. The day he got possession a small army of men commenced tearing down the old buildings on the site and on Monday last the work of demolition on the Dey street front was completed, at the sacrifice, however, of the Church street sidewalk, which was impassable because of the debris. The Cortlandt street buildings were nearly all torn down.

The extension to the Western Union Building, on Dey street, and work on the four new stories which have been added to the old building, is progressing very satisfactorily and from present appearances it will not be very long before they are ready for occupancy. Two new elevators are to be placed in the remodeled building, and they are to be run by hydraulic power instead of steam, the substitution of the former power being made with the idea of securing greater speed.

An immense map covering the entire rear wall of the Auction Room of the Exchange, above the Exchange clock, was hung during the week. The map shows the 411 lots belonging to the Morgenthau syndicate, and which are to be sold on Tuesday. This large map is but one of the arrangements that the syndicate has made with the Exchange. Anticipating a great crowd and a long sale the Exchange and Auction Room Committee have ordered the Information Bureau to be closed at 1 o'clock on Tuesday, and this room together with the Board Room will be given over to the Building Material Exchange. Over in one corner of the Auction Room a space will be set aside for the reception of the money of those who buy early in the sale and may wish to leave.

The Site Committee of the Union Club, Clarence A. Seward, chairman, has been looking around for available property for the proposed new club house on 5th avenue, between 34th and 59th streets. Among other properties which they have had under consideration are the following: St. Luke's Hospital front, west side 5th avenue, 54th and 55th streets; west side 5th avenue, 43d and 44th streets; the Paran Stevens property on the east side, between 37th and 38th streets; southeast corner 5th avenue and 40th street; southeast corner 5th avenue and 44th street, and the east side 5th avenue, between 55th and 56th streets. The club desires to acquire a site about 175x100 feet in size.

Surveyors have at last commenced work at 66th street and Columbus avenue with reference to the new elevated railroad station which has been promised at that street for a period of three years or more. John D, Crimmins, who has charge of the work, will also build stations on 2d avenue at 99th, 117th and 121st streets.

In the condemnation proceedings begun by Secretary of the Treasury Foster against Patrick J. Roon to acquire the lots which Mr. Roon owns on the block bounded by Barrow, Christopher, Washington and Greenwich streets, there were some interesting developments this week. In answer Mr. Roon says that John A. Lindley made an agreement with the Secretary to secure this block for the Appraisers' Stores, for \$5,0,000, notwithstanding the fact that he owned no property there. He says that finally it was so arranged that Mr. Lindley made a profit of \$54,000, and Mr. Roon wants part of this profit in addition to the price which he says has already been agreed upon.

Some of the daily newspapers have had a "news" item this week to the effect that Cornelius Vanderbilt had purchased the southwest corner of 5th avenue and 58th street. Mr. Vanderbilt has owned the property since 1889.

John D. Crimmins this week broke ground for the new club house to be cated at 5th avenue and 60th street. The site is 100x200 feet in size. located at 5th avenue and 60th street.

The Reformed Low Dutch Church has been given leave by Judge Lawrence, of the Supreme Court, to mortgage, for \$100,000, its property on the northwest corner of 3d avenue and 122d street.

The Deutscher Verein have borrowed from William Steinway et al., as trustees, \$400,000 in gold on their club house on 59th street, south side, 125 west 6th avenue. The mortgage is given to secure bonds and has ten years

Joseph H. Cunningham, of Newark, N. J., has taken title from Oscar Hammerstein to the unfinished Murray Hill Theatre and office buildings, known as Nos. 107 to 119 West 41st street, running through to Nos. 112 and 114 West 42d street, at an expressed consideration of \$243,500.


WHERE THE BANKS, TRUST AND INSURANCE COMPANIES CONGREGATE.

The fact that the Franklin Trust Company have purchased a site on Montague street, and that they will erect a twelve-story building on the property at a cost of \$200,000 or more, calls attention to the fact that a great transformation is taking place in one of the most important streets branching out from the Brooklyn City Hall.

Montague street has, for a number of years, been the centre of office buildings containing the quarters of some prominent firms and institutions, who have concentrated on the first block west of City Hall. Little by little, however, the houses are being replaced by business structures. The erection of the Brooklyn Real Estate Exchange on Montague street gave a strong impetus in that direction, and now the second block has been invaded for business purposes by so important a fiduciary institution as the Franklin Trust Company, who will locate on the southwest corner of Montague and Clinton streets.

This gradual creeping in of business westward is inevitable, and it is bound to extend further west still. Brooklyn is only beginning her career as When it is considered that she numbers over half the a business centre. population of New York City, the wonder is that she is so slightly equipped in that direction contrasted with her great neighbor across the East River. It is only, indeed, because of that neighbor's proximity, and the tendency in the past to rely on New York in financial matters, that Brooklyn has neglected herself. But she is evidently girding her loins to depend upon her own resources, and we see this in her great dry-goods stores, in her large business structures, in her places of amusement, and in her increasing number of banks, trust and insurance companies.

Montague street seems destined to be the great centre for her moneyed institutions, many of which are concentrated between Court and Clinton

streets. Indeed, business has completely overwhelmed that block, with the exception of the Academy of Music, the Art Association and the Brooklyn Library. There are even offices in the two latter buildings, and the conversion of the Academy into an office building is said to be under consideration. Two brown stone houses are to be torn down to make way for the Franklin Trust Company's building. In this row General Tracy resided for many years before he was appointed Secretary of the Navy.

In the next block to the west are the Berkeley and Grosvenor apartment houses, as well as the "Montague," an eight-story semi-fire-proof structure, originally built by Wm. Ziegler, President of the Brooklyn Real Estate Exchange, and now owned by Frederick J. Stone, of Dobbs' Ferry, New York. This building is the finest of its kind in Brooklyn, and is located within a few hundred feet of Clinton street. It is said that the owner contemplates changing it at some future date either into a first-class hotel or into an office structure. The building has a facade of granite and brick, and occupies a frontage of 52 feet, with a depth of 96 feet, and adjoins the open plot on which stands the residence of Mr. Franklin Taylor.

The value of Montague street consists in its not only being the Wall street of Brooklyn, but in its being very near in time to the Wall street of New York, from which it is reached, via Wall street ferry, in about ten minutes, thus bringing it within about a quarter of an hour's journey of the Stock Exchange,

The advance in the value of property on Montague street during the last few years has been quite notable. No doubt the cable road on that street, which is to run from the City Hall to Wall street ferry, and which is to be in operation within a month or so, has had some influence in increasing values. The four lots which comprise the site for the Real Estate Exchange were purchased a few years ago for \$150,000, an average of \$37,500 each. The Fulton Bank has since paid \$85,000 for the single lot opposite, with the old building thereon occupied as a chop bouse, and for this lot they are credibly reported to have declined an offer of \$10,000 advance. Other improvements, both of a public and private character, are tending to make real estate in Montague street and the surrounding vicinity more valuable, not the least among them being

the forthcoming extension of the Brocklyn Bridge to within a few, moments' walk of the junction of Montegue, Court and Fulton streets, the plan involving an open plaza in front of the terminus of the bridge.

Bensonhurst Notes.

The establishment of Bensonhurst Park is no longer problematical; it is an absolute certainty, for Governor Hill has signed the bill amending the original act and rendering it operative. The Governor had vetoed so many county-town bills on the ground of being special legislation that he was forced to explain his reasons for making the Bensonhurst Park bill a law, which he did in a memorandum filed with the bill.

The electric plant of the new electric railroad from Thirty-ninth Street Ferry to Bensonhurst will be completed this week, so states the superintendent in charge of the power station, at 52d street and 2d avenue. A dozen cars are now in the stables of the company. They are larger than the ordinary cars and present a neat appearance. Five electric lights will illuminate each car at night.

Mrs. Fanny Culver Treadwell recently purchased from Mrs. J. Ketcham her handsome residence on 21st avenue, which she intends occupying all the year 'round.

Mr. Jno. F. Ambrose, of New York, President of the South Brooklyn Ferry Company, has rented Mr. West's beautiful residence at 22d and Cropsey avenues, overlooking the Bay.

Real Estate Department.

The dullness which makes its appearance about this time of year and which stays for three or four months has come upon the market. During the week few sales have been closed, the fate of others is still uncertain, a number have been put off until the fall, while the remainder, and they include some large transactions, have been broken up altogether. Improved property has been very quiet, and in city lots nothing has been done, and the building loan operators say that they think little will be done. Many good builders whom they would be glad to accommodate with lots and a loan, they say it is not safe to sell to now, because the building material men will not extend to them the credit which they so gladly furnished formerly. This will eventually help real estate, as it will crowd out almost entirely the "shyster" builder, whose dishonesty has done so much to discredit real property.

The great talk of the week in real estate circles has been the sale to be held on next Tuesday of 411 lots on Washington Heights, recently purchased by the Morgenthau syndicate. This is the largest sale of city lots which has been held since the Jumel estate sale eight or nine years ago, it has been extensively advertised, and extraordinary preparations have been made so that it may be a success. In a new and beautiful district, which has been rapidly growing of late, in the vicinity of a number of splendid public improvements which are now completed, and near others which are propose; with the talk of rapid transit in the air, and with the wage-earner's desire already manifested this year to own his own home, the syndicate can reasonably look for a measure of success. The talk as to the prospects for this success is on both sides, and nearly all of it is tinged with self-interest. Those who will not be affected by the sale and who can express an intelligent and reliable opinion prefer to remain quiet and watch the sale itself. The Morgenthau sale is not the only vacant lot sale to be held this week, however, notwithstanding

its magnitude. Some seventy-one lots at Morris Heights and over 100 lots at Lowerre, will be offered while to-day and all next week, up to and including Decoration Day, there will be numerous suburban lot sales held on the premises. It will be interesting to see how the market bears up under this flood of lots.

But suburban property is not the only real estate that will come under the hammer before the close of the month. Froperty located on lower Broadway, Grand, South, Wooster, Macdougal, Maiden lane and Wall streets, as well as that on less important thoroughfares, will be offered on the Exchange and sold, doubtless, unless the owners hold out for prices which are beyond the reasonable value of their properties, and, unfortunately, this is what they seem inclined to do just now.

In two out of the three legal sales which constituted Monday's auction business the properties failed to bring the amounts due upon them. The first of these was a three-story dwelling on the southeast corner of Madison avenue and 133d street, which sold to the plaintiff for \$10,000, and upon which there was due \$16,492. In this case the deficiency was not because the property was over mortgaged, for inside houses on the same block have sold for \$13,000 and \$14,000 apiece. The other deficiency was in the sale of a lot on 98th street, west of Central Park West, which sold for \$7,100 and upon which there was due \$7,804.

The most important and interesting sale on Tuesday was that of the estate of Sarah A. Mix or Sanchez, held under a decree of partition. The sale attracted speculators and investors well known in the market, but as the sale progressed it became evident that few of them were anxious to invest, and the property fell mainly to outsiders. With the exception of the house in West 92d street, nove of the property is located in good neighborhoods, and many of those most interested in the sale and most active in the bidding were either tenants in the houses or lived in the neighborhood. 50 West 28th street was, after some competition, sold to Ascher Weinstein for \$37,200. Comparisons with previous sales on this block show nothing particularly interesting. In 1880 No. 46 sold for \$25,000; in 1883 No. 44 brought \$32,250; in 1886 No. 42 sold for \$42,000, and in 1872 No. 40 brought \$52,500. No. 21 West 31st street, a house that was built and occupied for some time by the Spanish minister and which was purchased in 1875 by Mrs. Sanchez for \$48,000, was disposed of for \$49,600, Patrick Fox being the buyer. The most active bidding of the sale was when Nos. 111, 113 and 115 West 31st street were offered. The first house, No. 115, was secured by Jos. Genevier for \$18,800, and he made an effort to secure No. 113, but his competitor, Fred'k Southack, proved too much for him, and the house was knocked down to the latter for \$23,300. The remaining house was sold for \$18,750. The bargain of the sale was the "Chelsea" flats, six stories in height, covering a plot 80x100, on the south side of 27th street, west of 6th avenue, and occupied by colored people. These flats were the former site of the notorious "Cremorne Garden," and when that was torn down Mrs. Sanchez built the flats, at a cost of \$77,000. On Tuesday they brought The other sales of the day were generally uninteresting, but only \$78,900. the sale of No. 18 West 37th street, sold by order of the Surrogate, is worthy of remark. It sold for \$35,000 to Thos. C. Smith, who two weeks ago offered \$37,500 for it at auction, which bid was refused because it was too low.

The sales on Wednesday did not amount to much. The offerings were few, and when these had been diminished by withdrawals, adjournments, and by the owner bidding the property in, the result of the day's auction business was found to be small. Under decree of partition, No. 146 West 34th street was sold for \$39,250, and this price was deemed low by many of those present, but when the fact is recalled that No. 150 in the same block sold since the 1st of January for \$37,500, the auction price does not seem very far out of the way. A small lot on the northwest corner of Canal and Varick streets sold for \$22,700, and No. 422 Hudson, near Leroy street, 22x60, a four-story brick building, sold for \$18,400.

The offerings on Thursday included nearly all kinds of property offered under nearly all circumstances and conditions. Far up town on 10th avenue, just north of 183d street, and near the Washington Bridge, lots were offered and could have been sold at fair prices, but the ideas owners as to the value of the lots surpassed those of buyers and judges of neighboring values, and so the lots were bid in. This story was repeated when the northwest corner of the Boulevard and 104th street was put up, and the auctioneer could get a bid of only \$52,750 for over four lots when they were knocked down to a representative of the owner. That they could have been sold appears likely from the fact that when the adjoining corner of 105th street was put up real bidders came into tide competition and the property was finally secured by Francis M. Jencks at \$35,250. Over on Audubon avenue and 171st and 172d streets Auctioneer Richard V. Harnett succeeded in getting good prices for vacant lots. The two corners sold for \$3,600 and \$3,675 each, and inside avenue lots at \$2,500 and \$2,600. On the streets the prices were \$2,375 and \$2,400 each. But it was in the executor's sale of the estate of John W. Howe that most of the old dealers and speculators were interested. This included the northwest corner of 8th avenue and 17th street, 25x103, and two lots, each 25x92, on 17th street, in the rear, almost adjoining the corner. There are old buildings on the property. The 17th street lots were secured by Ascher Weinstein at \$16,100 each and the corner at \$49,000 by W. C. Willey. The foreclosure sales again showed a deficiency in the amount bid as against the amount due in two out of the three properties sold, as will be seen by reference to another column, and while the deficiency was in neither case a large one, it was none the less unsatisfactory.

BRICKS.—There has been practically no market of a regular character this week, and a fair epitome of the situation would be "dull and nominally un changed." On Monday morning last there were over forty barge loads of stock in receivers' hands seeking custom, and this number has not varied greatly since, as the arrivals about balanced such sales as could be perfected, with little chance of increasing the run of business even under pressure. The difficulty, it is hardly necessary to state, was in the suspension of building operations growing out of contest between lumbermen and the walking delegate nuisance, which had a more extended and pronounced effect than a week ago. Had it not been for this trouble, the chances are that a pretty nice sort of market could have been on fine stock as the opportunity for using them was just commencing to make a fair development and the proportion of supply quite moderate. As it is, while \$6.00 remained as an asking rate sellers were frequently found willing to listen to reduced bids and it is very doubtful if that figure could be made at the close. The great bulk of the offering has been poor and washed and available from \$5.00 down, some of the poorest going at \$3.50 per M, but even these rates were no attraction for investment. Buyers were not sitting down upon the market; they simply had no use for the brick and of course could not see the propriety of assuming proprietorship in an articlethey did not want. Pales of really fine quality remain at about \$2.75 per M, while on the poorer grades it is simply go as you please and catch a customer on the best terms possible. It is probably needless to add that manufacturers are grumbling seriously and generally with many threats to shut down at the earliest possible moment.

CEMENT.—The season for domestic cements opened CEMENT.—The season for domestic cements opened very propitiously this Spring, and for some little time the market has really been active on new orders, which in conjunction with the quantity called for on contract, has kept about all the leading manufacturers running to full capacity. A great deal of work in the building line in which cement was used was not at first influenced by labor trouble in other branches of the trade, but now construction has progressed to a point where lumber or iron are indispensable for continuation, and the market is influenced accordingly and must become even quieter unless dealers and manufacturers furnishing the two classes of structural material above mentioned come to an understanding with their workmen. Foreign cements have been very plenty for a coupie of months, the receipts running a little fuller than expected, and especially so from the Continent. Against that feature, however, may be recorded an excellent demand for all well-established and popular brands, which, together with a great deal of stuff coming in on contract, made a fair enough balance to maintain comparatively steady rates for the grades mentioned. Unknown makes, some of which may have excellent merit, were however unsettled, and more or less weak, with some pretty low sales said to have been made in order to catch custom; but if the goods prove satisfactory, they will in due time assert their position. There is a fair accumulation here, but no unusual amount, and importers assert that, being free from obligations in matter of freight room, they are cutting off shipments from abroad. On the Canadian position a Montreal paper remarks:

Arrivals of cement so far have been light, and as the demand was good they were picked up as soon as landed for distribution. Consequently at time of writing there is a shortage of supplies, but this difficulty will, it is expected, disappear upon the arrival of the steamers afready due. GLASS.—Locally the business in window glass has been checked and reduced by the labor troubles, with something of a similar character prevailing in other sections of the country. Whatever may be required for distribution most of the jobbers can supply from the liberal accumulations they have on hand, and some of them are believed to be doing so at a shading from the ordinarily named quotations. Outside of consumers proper there is said to be a great deal of

demand that does not appear upon the surface, principally from dealers who are impressed with the cheapness of supplies and willing to lay in all the stock they can conveniently store and possibly obtain credit for. The matter of credit, however, is a factor of growing importance owing to unsatisfactory character of some of the recent collections, and numerous would-be buyers find their desires cannot be indulged quite as freely as hoped for.

LATH.—Demand has been moderate, but arrivals also small, with the balance well preserved, and the

also small, with the balance well preserved, and the position about steady, at \$2.25 per M. for a cargo rate position about steady, at \$2.25 per M. for a cargo rate on Eastern. There does not appear to be anything really new. receivers having the usual story to tell about a reduced production, and the probability of small shipments for some time to come, with every reason to believe that consumption will be good as soon as the labor troubles are ended. There is, however, unquestionably a wholesome dread of Northern stock.

LIME.—Demand has been somewhat slower, as the enforced shrinkage of actual consumption naturally makes dealers more or less indifferent about adding to their stocks. The arrivals, however, have proven moderate and the market, if anything, is a shade firmer, especially on lump, the proportion of which in the supply is now of a more natural character and the necessity for urging it less pronounced.

LUMBER.—The suspension of business on the distributive outlet has been even more marked than last week. Not only has there been a prompt and willing response from every dealer in the city to cease negotations, but a large majority have simply put a padlock on their gates, pulled down the blinds of their offices and shut up shop entirely and as closely as though it were a holiday or a Sunday. They have done, in fact, exactly as forecast in this column last month, and when brought to the test stood shoulder to shoulder in the contest, not against labor or any reasonable demand of labor, but against the outrage-ous dictation of a gang of irresponsible demagogues who, clothed with the power given them by the trade unions, do no labor themselves but devote their time to the foundation of trouble between employers and workmen. Practically, it is the same trouble the brick trade had to encounter last year, and happily it looks as though it might have the same result.

Of course under existing conditions there has really been no market for any class of stock, both buyers and sellers striving to keep all deals down to the smallest possible compass, especially in a wholesale way. Arriving parcels had to be handled as momentary circumstances might suggest, and, not unnaturally, it was generally upon a pretty easy basis of valuation, but fortunately dealers and manufacturers at primary points were posted in regard to the troubles here, and partly as a method of safety, and partly through hearty efforts to co-operate with and assist our local trade in its difficulty; the shipments have been extremely moderate, from some localities withheld altogether. Some business has been done in placing special schedules and engaging standard runs of stock for future delivery; but it is not surprising that, for the time being, dealers have very little heart to negotiate even against almost absolute want.

Eastern Spruce by the time this reaches print may have a more pronounced market. At the present writing it is in a nominally steady position because there has been a fortunate absence of liberal arrivals, with a great deal of such stock as did reach the harbor either coming to hand on orders or finding custom with buyers in localities where it could be promptly handled. Cost can hardly advance much at the moment, and the extent of a decline would depend upon how much of an attraction dealers would require to make the attempt at handling cargoes. Mill men continue to talk in strong and confident terms, and until recently were expressing uneastness about the supply of logs on account of slow melting snows and low water, but within a week rains have fallen that alter conditions on many of the Maine Rivers, and the upper St. John is said to have risen rapidly enough to almost insure a clean run of logs. At localities doing an export trade some little improvement in foreign orders is reported.

Piling continues to drop in to some extent and finds a more or less unsatisfactory market. Some custom can occasionally be found making a natural call, but receivers as a rule find it necessary to decide between a slaughter on price and a floating of stock on chance of a more propitious period and they accept the latter alternative.

Hemlock has found attention on a few special orders, but is greeted with no general or pronounced demand and has simply a waiting market. Agents of Pennsylvania product appear to have faith in pretty good trade later on, and still assert that the mills are getting enough trade from other localities to keep them fairly busy. State stock is commencing to arrive at Albany, but it is claimed on that market that the cut is short with some of the logs hung up and chances favoring a good trade independent of this city.

White Pine is not making much of a figure in the general run of business at the moment. So far as local distribution is concerned the demand has been practically dead, and whatever dealers may be doing in matter of purchasing for stock is really of not much importance, a great deal of it, as noted last week, being of only a special sort of character. Some of the supplies wintered over at primary points are commencing to move forward and will for a while satisfy current wants. Albany reports a little more demand for shippers, but mainly to fill out assortments.

Yellow Pine has to suffer from the cautious tone manifested toward all other stuff, and therefore fails to recover lost ground as rapidly as has been hoped for, and especially on random schedules. There are, however, a fair number of specials under consideration, and when buyers become a little better satisfied regarding the labor question and general chances for business they will in all probability be more rapid in closing negotiations.

Carolina Pine, according to recent somewhat widely disseminated reports, is doing well at primary points and some big figures are given out to represent past and prospective production. Our market cannot afford much assistance at the moment, but when trade gets back into regular channels is likely to furnish a full quota of demand. About former valuations are current.

The London Timber Trades Journal says:

Nothwithstanding the large stocks of pine and spruce in the London and Liverpool markets, holders appear well satisfied with the present state of things. The large houses contemplate a recovery as certain to come, though they do not anticipate any sudden rise, but look more to a steady rate of progression, which the large dock delivery of spot goods affords very fair grounds for assuming. This we regard as a much more healthy sign than any attempt to inflate the market in its present enfeebled state. With regard to the f. o. b. trade, inquiries seem more plentiful, and in some instances have resulted in contracts being carried through. We hear that several of the leading Quebec shippers who have been paying their usual visit here have left for home, so as to be on the spot to superintend the shipments of the new season's sales.

Business in various hardwood trades is not reported to be very flourishing, ship building not much inquiry, furniture not very brisk, and building trades—the demands in this direction is not likely to be very continuous; it opened well when the long and dreary winter broke up, but labor is again manifesting its power for evil by withdrawing its services from those who have most employment to give, thus paralyzing an important industry during its active season, the summer months. In this trade the winter comes "when no man can work," and they do not seek to "make hay while the sun shines."

STATE.

The Albany market is reported by the Argus as fol-

lows:

The present aspect of the lumber district suggests a big holiday more than anything else, the result of the embargo on trade existing in New York City. There are practically no orders being booked from that locality. Even in the way oi filling old orders, which lack of stock has prevented heretofore, has been stopped and New York dealers have given directions not to forward anything either of old or recent purchases. This afternoon along the water front there were but three vessels receiving cargoes and these were for eastern points. Shipping is almost absolutely at a standstill. The district seems, however,

The trade situation is therefore not particularly encouraging at the present time.

The Northwestern Lumberman as follows:
A leading wholesale lumber dealer suggests to the Lumberman the fact that the shippers of lumber from American points to eastern markets are unjustly discriminated against through a combination between the Canadian Pacific and the New York Central Railways, to which the New York, Lake Erie & Western management has been forced to become a party. The case is stated thus:

The rate on lumber from Chicago to New York is 25 cents a hundred; to Boston, 30 cents. The rate from Buffalo and Tonawanda to New York is 13 cents a hundred, and to Boston 15 cents. Last winter the New York Central made a traffic arrangement with the Canadian Pacific, by which a pro rata rate was established, so that when lumber is shipped to the eastern points named the cost, east of Niagara River to New York, is but 9½ cents a hundred, or 3½ cents a hundred below the Buffalo and Tonawanda rate to New York. Thus, though the duty on Canadian lumber is \$1 a thousand, it is nearly offset by the discrimination in rates against American dealers shipping from Tonawanda, Buffalo or any point west of those markets, effected by the combination between the great Canadian railway and the American roads named. This is in keeping with the general complaint that has been made by American shippers, that the Canadian Pacific has for some time made rates on traffic entering United States' territory that resulted in diverting shipments from American roads, as well as operating adversely to dealers and shippers on this side the international boundary. It has been charged by the railroad companies, whose lines are exclusively in the States, that the Canadian Pacific makes rates on traffic between Pacific coast points and the East that cannot possibly be met by the complaining roads, owing to the restrictions of the national commerce law. It has also been charged that much traffic has been diverted to the Grand Trunk road by the advantage that it possesses in the respect named over the American lines.

And in revie

And in reviewing the Chicago yard trade, the Lumberman says:

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The state of stocks is rather peculiar. There are some sorts that are scarce, particularly framing dimension over 24 feet long, and some items in good strips. But as a general thing the supply is more nearly adequate to the demand than it was two months ago. All lumber put in pile last fall is now dry enough to ship or use. This renders the demand for sorts, though still active between vards, more easily met than a few weeks ago. Besides there have been considerable recepts by cargo of dry lumber, and that which remained in cross pile over the winter. Dealers took in such cargoes in the expectation of selling the lumber readily off the dock to their neighbors for sorting up. But such demand seems to have been glutted by a few cargoes, and dealers are now wondering why they cannot sell stuff off dock as readily as in former years. This state of affairs indicates a lack of vigor in the requirement better than anything else could. Last spring dry lumber could be sold off the dock very readily. If March and April trade had been as large as was anticipated, dry stocks would have been reduced to such a degree that there would have been an active requirement for lumber on dock.



The cargo market has shown more activity this week than last, with only moderate arrivals. Short piece stuff has dropped about 50 cents from the opening prices, but this fact is of little significance, as this drop always comes when all the mills get to work. Short green is now quoted at \$10.25, while dry brings from 25 to 50 cents more. Not a great deal of dry is being offered, however. In the longer lengths there has been no particular change in prices, as demand is still in excess of supply. Hemlock piece stuff is strong at \$8; cargoes with a fair percentage of long stuff bringing \$8.50.

On the hardwood market a few of the local dealers report good business for the first half of the month of May, but in the opinion of the majority trade is somewhat backward. A lack of orders from the furniture factories is noted, but demand from other quarters is about normal, and no weakening of prices is observable by reason of a lighter volume of trade than had been expected. Stocks on hand are about up to the average, aggregating probably 75,000,000, including all classes of hardwoods, but it is the opinion of several leading dealers that the supply of dry lumber is considerably less than a year ago this time.

At any rate dry stock in oak, cherry and ash is never allowed to go begging, and probably every dealer in the city is in the market for dry plain sawed red oak. In fact the oak trade promises to be heavier than ever this year, and in spite of the many tales of large stocks in pile at interior points, there is not likely to be an over-supply of either plain or quarter-sawed at



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any time during the season. It is true that opportunities for picking up round lots at an inside price are more numerous now than they were a few months ago, but the average prices paid to manufacturers are practically unchanged. Dealers are offering all the way from \$26 to \$30 for plain sawed firsts and seconds inch, with a slight preference for red oak over white. To bring \$30 stock must be bone dry and of a very fine quality, but for good, ordinary firsts and seconds it is seldom that less than \$28 is paid. Two-inch oak is not as ready sale as inch, but there is good demand for 1½ and 1½-inch.

It is said that the demand for cherry is not so pronunced as during the winter months, but dealers who make a specialty of this wood claim they have all, and, in fact, more trade than they can handle. Prices are fully as firm as ever, and good Pennsylvania stock commands the top figure.

There is some little inquiry for thick ash, which is not over plentiful. Inch ash is also scarce and meeting with fair demand.

Several good-sized deals in gum recently have stimulated prices on that wood somewhat, but after all it is only for certain special uses, such as curtain poles, that there is any great demand.

Higher prices had been predicted for basswood this spring, but they do not seem to have materialized. This stock is still being consumed in large quantities, but the supply seems almost inexhaustible, which forms a pretty effectual bar to higher prices.

The Mississippi Valley Lumberman says:

The Mississippi Valley Lumberman says:

There is evidence that unless the rains come to the aid of the farmers there will be much less lumber manufactured in the West than it was expected would be the case. Rain will be needed before many of the drives can be brought out. With 25 per cent of the log supply hung up, and the water low in the main lumbering streams like the Mississippi, there would be no more than a normal cut of lumber. Presumably, too, there would be from the same causes only a normal demand for lumber.

It is too early therefore for any man to attempt to foreshadow the future in the lumber trade. It is enough for the present to say that trade is normal in volume, prices no stronger, and possibly weaker, than they were in early March, and that the future is problematical. It is already evident that there is not to be a large railroad demand, that the Western cities, with the possible exception of Chicago, are not to be large consumers, and that the conditions in the South are not calculated, as they were last fall, to restrict competition with white pine in Northern fields of consumption. On the other hand, the railroad managers are predicting a heavy fall traffic. This opinion is undoubtedly based on the present sharp demand for all agricultural products and live stock. This demand is likely to be maintained, and farmers show a readiness to sell whatever they may have to offer, be it much or little. If later events justify the prediction there will be a demand for increased rolling stock, and therefore car material.

NAILS .- Disappointment is noticeable in most reports from the selling side. More or less demand comes from regular sources, but buyers are in no hurry, content themselves with parcels adapted to immediate wants, and will listen to no suggestions about increasing the line of cost. We quote Cut at \$1.65@1.75 per keg for car lots and \$1.75@1.85 per keg for parcels from store, for ircn, and add 5@10c. per keg for steel. Wire, \$2.10@2.15 at mills, and 2.30@2.40 from store.

PAINTS, OILS, COLORS, ETC .- The general movement of supplies appears quite satisfactory according to testimony of jobbers, manufacturers and importers. Demand has fallen off from some localities but promptly made good by a new representation of custom, and the aggregate deal loses nothing in volume. In previous years a more liberal trade has occasionally been found at this season, but the present steady character of the business makes it healthy and satisfactory. Prepared specialties, house painters' staples and goods of a kindred character are especially doing well, and no supplies allowed to accumulate in first hands. In colors the outside makers continue to shade association rates on Paris Green about ½c. per B., but along the res. of the line the tone is pretty steady, and intimations are given of a possible early advance on cost of Quicksilver Vermilion, owing to enhanced value of the metal. Zincs are finding a good general trade, and the outlet exhausts importations and keeps all domestic manufacturers closely sold up. White Lead has full proportionate demand, and retains a thoroughly steady market throughout. Association Corroders' rates stand as follows: Lead in oil in kegs and dry lead in kegs, in lots of less than 1,000 lbs. 7½c. net; in lots of 1,000 lbs to5 tons at one purchase, 6¾c.; 12 tons and over, one purchase, 6½c.; dry white lead in bils. ¾c. per lb. less than price in kegs.
