THE stock market is disturbed by news from abroad and by some events occurring at home, but most particularly from the fact that some people who burned their fingers in the coal deal and upon unfounded expectations have them still cooling in their mouths. In other words, there is some liquidating to be done, as a result of injudicious overbuying. The sign that liquidation is necessary is found in the dullness and stagnation that has maintained for more than a week past in all things financial; the sign that it is taking place will be decline in prices. The promise for a new advance will come when that has taken place, and when the outlook for some of the staples, which directly or indirectly affect the prices of securities is better than it is now. Cotton threatens to reach its minimum, and the iron trade is full of complaints of the impossibility of getting good prices. While Southern and Northern irons are competing against each other complaints about returns come from all manufacturing sections. The imminence of further discussion in Congress on the Bland Silver Bill is having its influence against security values, and the passage of that bill would be used by the bears to depress prices, no matter how firm President Harrison and his cabinet may be known to stand against any measure forcing this country to experiment alone further in the bi-metallic line. The publication of the Richmond Terminal plan has also had its influence directly against the prices of the securities therein treated and indirectly against the of the market. The submission of this long-for plan and the action of the securitylooked upon it, which must be seen soon, will help holders to clear situation a good deal. E^{NGLISH} investors are to be congratulated that they are not large holders of continental securities. In 1875 it was estimated that the British holdings of the stocks of foreign governments were nearly, if not quite, as large as those of home railways. Nowadays, in spite of the past South American boom, there is no such comparison to be drawn, for continental securities have passed wholesale out of British hands, and are held mainly on the continent itself, where the prices, too, are chiefly controlled. Since the close of 1891 there has been a fresh fall in Greek, Spanish, Portuguese, Bulgarian and Italian stocks; and this fact must be as one of the causes of the depression in Paris and in the other continental markets. taken ruling Just of late the English what comforted by a visit investor has been somewhat comforted by a visible tendency towards recovery in colonial stocks. The trouble with the Australian colonies was that they required additional funds at an inconvenient time; and while they were always pressing fresh issues on the [market, it was natural that some depreciation should be shown. There has likewise been an expected collapse in the great land speculation, which afflicted some of the leading Australian colonies, though there was little need to regard the position of the government creditors as materially affected thereby. But now they have in one way or another obtained the funds they most urgently required; and lately both New South Wales and Victoria have officially intimated that they do not intend to apply further to the English market for the present.

There can be no doubt that the check administered to unlimited colonial borrowings will in the end prove a salutary one,

IT is very much to be hoped that some compromise can be reached in the matter of the new railroad bridge over the Harlem River at 4th avenue. The legislative authorization of the improvement should not be postponed for another year. The great and growing suburban business on the New Haven & Harlem Railroads, not to speak of the general traffic, should not be longer hampered by a continuance of the present exasperating delays at the draw-bridge. Fortunately some progress appears to have been made. The New York Central has agreed to give up its solid masonry approach, and substitute in its place an open viaduct which will not close any of the cross-town streets. turns upon the question whether property - owners shall share the exp dispute new the with the railroad company. The owners claim that the improvement is general in its nature and should not be assessed on the abutting property. This claim we believe to be substantially just. The residents of North New York will obtain the chief benefit from a higher bridge; and it is to be hoped that the city authorities will come to see that the most equitable method of apportioning the cost to the public is to have it paid out of some general fund. . But under no circumstances should some bill fail of passage. We suspect, however, that, at best, the matter is going to be very much bungled, and that a great deal of unnecessary money will be spent and trouble incurred before all its bearings are finally settled. The New York Central is preparing to spend some millions of dollars in building a bridge and approaches. Just one block to the west the plans of the Rapid Transit Commissioners prov ded for another structure, higher and somewhat more elaborate and expensive. Both of these bridges are practically going to be devoted to the same purpose, and there is no present necessity for two bridges to accommodate the traffic. Yet scarcely a word has been said and not a single effort has been made to unite the two projects. True, one of these projects is very far from realization, and the other of these plans is very near to it; but in the end one is just as necessary as the other, and both can be carried out most economically by means of bination of interest and a sharing of expense. economically by means of a commore it is evident that the 4th avenue bridge is not the only part of the New York Central's traffic facilities in this city which need improvement. Before many years are out the Road will have to spend a great many millions on its terminus at 42d street; and if any increase of capacity is to be made at this point, it should be made with reference to the running of city rapid transit trains to the lower part of the city. The notion of using Madison avenue for rapid transit purposes is on the face of it ridiculous. The only remaining East Side avenue adapted to the purpose is 4th avenue; the new road can be constructed thereon cheaply, and with the greatest convenience to the East Side population.

O far as we know all this is admitted by every sensible person who has studied the problem. But if it is true, why in the world is not some effort made to bring about a union of the two interests? At present the management of the corporation and the Rapid Transit Commissioners are simply sitting and awaiting developments. Neither will take the preliminary steps necessary to the beginning of negotiations. Yet there are reasons to believe that neither is immovably opposed to a conference. Ever since Commodore Vanderbilt proposed to extend the New York Central down town the Vanderbilts have been entirely willing to construct a good southern connection. The storm of abuse, however, with which the Commodore's proposition was received has naturally made his successors very circumspect about making any similar advances. Whenever Chauncey M. Depew is interviewed on the matter he refers to the treatment which the Commodore received in a way that shows how the outrageous abuse levelled against the founder of the family still rankles in Vanderbilt bodies. Unless all indications fail, however, a similar proposition would be received at present in a saner and more gentlemanly spirit; but under the circumstances the initiative ought to the Rapid Transit is in danger of Commissioners. from come being wrecked, plan cause of the natural and justifiable opposition of the Madison avenue property-owners. No doubt commissioners would have long ago been appointed by the Supreme Court, and by this time the legal requirements very nearly satisfied, if the only impediment which had to be met was the small share of active antagonism which property-owners along the other portions of the route advanced. So as to have this aspect of the matter finally settled we believe that the bill introduced into the Legislature exempting Madison avenue from all rapid transit plans should be passed. Then the Rapid Transit Commissioners would have to build another East Side route, and what could they do but enter in some negotiations with the New York Central. Of course they also dislike to take the initiative in opening such a conference, for they would lay themselves open to the reproach of

being called a "Vanderbilt Commission;" and, indeed, they have no power under the act formally to confer with the representatives of any road. But they could publicly point out the necessity for such a conference, and prepare the way for any legislation needed. In time it will have to come to that or something very similar. All that healthy and delightful suburban territory along the New Haven & Harlem Railroads can never be adequately developed until it is possible to take a train near the City Hall and reach, say, Larchmont, in thirty-five to forty minutes. No sensible person would think of paralleling existing lines for this purpose. All that is needed are extensions; and they must come. Many obvious difficulties exist in the way of the proposed arrangement, but they are small compared with the difficulties of the present plan.

The Root of the Evil.

STIRRED by the recent utterances of Dr. Parkhurst concerning the misgovernment of the city, our good friend, the Evening Post, has been prompted to disclose to us what it calls "the root of the evil." No reader of that eminently enlightened journal needs to be informed of what the Post's spade throws up when it commences to dig in our municipal field. There is nothing there for it to find but Tammany dirt of a particular noisome and unwholesome kind. "The root of the evil," says the Post, is Tammany; and then it goes on to show that the city authorities and the criminal class in this locality are in reality one, and consequently that morality and decency have very little chance of a hearing to any purpose in the Departments or in the Courts or in the avenues leading thereto.

We wish, however, that the Post would go a little deeper into this matter and tell us exactly what Tammany is. course, have in memory the valuable and entertaining information which the Post has disseminated, concerning the character and career of certain of the leading lights of Tammany Hall; but that is not the information we want; for we cannot adopt, and we do not think many common-sense people find they can adopt, the wierd opinion which underlies so much of what the Post and some others say about our city government, to the effect that this municipality is not only controlled by a few unscrupulous politicians, but is controlled by them despite the dissatisfaction and disgust of an overwhelming number of "decent" but retiring citizens. In fact, for some years past, the Post has been calling upon this "decent majority to come out of their retirement, to show themselves, in order that corruption and misgovernment may be banished. But, although that journal has very ably made plain the need for this "coming out," has over and over again declared the arrival of the opportunity and the hour when Decency could go to the polls and vote with advantage to itself, the general morals and the welfare of the people, Decency has remained torpidly indifferent; indeed, so far as we can find out, has not for a long period been seen politically. Is it to be wondered at that people ask where is this Decency so constantly appealed to, so much relied upon; where is this vast number of respectable, order-loving citizens, whose fine "moral sense," we are told, only needs to be aroused to do away completely with bad government? This question should be answered. We believe that a real public service would be performed, that many good persons would be made comfortable, if the Post, or any one else, would take the trouble to make it plain beyond peradventure, that these respectable, decent people do exist with us, and are in the majority, or nearly so.

In the recent elections for Supervisors in this State, when so many Hill candidates and other Democrats were defeated, the Post assured us that the people thereby bad rebuked Hillism and machine Democracy. In other words the elections, according to the Post, were the outward and visible sign of an inward and spiritual grace. In these elections we were called upon to recognize a manifestation of the public mind. So with the last Congressional election, when the Democrats obtained a large majority in the House of Representatives, the Post regarded it as a reflection of the opinion of the country at large on certain matters: and asked all its readers to regard it as such. And, not only in political affairs but also in all other matters, the Post takes it for granted, and we think quite rightly takes it for granted, that the mental and moral condition of a people or a class of people is reflected accurately enough in the broad aspects of their affairs. The state of politics, of the drama, of literature, of art, of charitable institutions, and so forth, is, the Post repeatedly acknowledges, an index of the moral and mental tone of society, of what people are thinking about and what they are doing.

In New York City, however, in dealing with the municipal government, the Post summarily reverses all this. The state of politics here with us does not represent the mental and moral tone of Society in political matters. The city is governed, it tells us, in a manner alien and distasteful to the majority of the people. Now is this position one that common sense can approve of, or one that facts support? So far as we can see, and a great many people, we believe, are being forced to accept this view, Tammany does represent the average of the mental and moral tone of the people of New

York City in political matters. In other words, Tammany is a government of the people, as all governments are in reality governments of the people. To say that New York could have a better government than it has, is to repeat the words of the young man who said he could be a gentleman if he wanted to. The majority of the voters of our two great parties are not enlightened, cultivated people; a number of them have never seen really clean streets or been under the influence of really refined surroundings. Without being vicious or unworthy people they are in much closer sympathy with the *Post's* "Mikes" and "Barneys" than with, let us say, Mr. Seth Low or Mr. Abram Hewitt. And even well up the "social scale," to speak in the manner of Ward MacAllister, how much more enlightened in political matters and really desirous of intelligent and progressive government are a great number of our tradesmen and merchants and the multitude who fill our club-houses, theatres, fashionable restaurants and other resorts? One finds fealty to party, but how seldom fealty to reason and morality and advancement. Can we forget that it is not so long ago that a certain wellknown banker, a great merchant, and a judge of repute strongly indorsed the appointment of a saloon-keeper to a police justiceship! Let the Post talk with the average man for fifteen minutes and tell us how much good government it can get out of his ideas. It will get Democracy, or it will get Republicanism, but little else. And as to the Indifferents, those who do not go to the polls, but whom we are told are really enlightened people and much enamoured of good government, is it not straining the ordinary measure of things to ask us to believe that they are much better than their neighbors?

If our position be correct, that the government in this city is of the people and represents, broadly speaking, the average of their moral and mental condition, does it not follow that the criticisms of the Post and the denunciations of men like Dr. Parkhurst are aimed in the wrong direction? The "root of the evil" is not in the City Hall, but in the people. Does Dr. Parkburst or the Post believe for a moment that bawdy-houses could be kept open, or saloons on Sunday (by means of the side door), or gambling dens, if there was a pronounced popular opposition to them? In fact there is no such opposition to them. People may say "such places should be closed," but the statement is oftener than not a mere form of speech, an easy tribute to virtue. Who cares? Who under ordinary circumstances would give up a dinner to close one of the places? The matter is not one that is "at home" with people, as, for instance, their business affairs are, and consequently how ridiculous it is to regard this tenuous public morality as a real sentiment or one that can exert any force in our affairs. We have not the whipping-post, because public opinion is really opposed to it; many public decencies are enforced because people really desire them to be enforced, and in like manner we must have a vital public opinion, a real desire about the closing of our saloons, bawdy-houses and gambling hells before we can get rid of them.

THE proposed new building law passed the Assembly on Thursday of the current week. A final public hearing on the bill was given by the Cities Committee on Tuesday last, which hearing was more especially intended to consider the clause requiring public school buildings hereafter to be constructed fire-proof. The next day, Wednesday, the bill was reported favorably by the committee, and made a special order for the day following. Thursday, when it was passed. This was quick work, and shows the friendly interest of the members in the measure and towards the representatives of the building interests who prepared the amendments to the present law. The bill now goes to the Senate, and as the latter body is well up with its work, and as the most difficult task is now over, that of getting the bill through the lower House, within a fortnight or so the bill should be placed in the Governor's hands.

THE Mayor has not yet made public his conclusions in the matter of re-creating a separate Department of Buildings, as recently petitioned for by the various building trade organizations. The Legislature is within a month of its final adjournment, and there is not much time to be lost if a bill to divorce certain bureaus from the Fire and Health Departments and consolidate them into a new department is to be presented this session. Nearly every architect and builder of any prominence has signed a petition for the change, and it may be truthfully said that there is not an architect nor a builder opposed to the change. It does not often happen that Tammany is requested to enlarge its scope and patronage by creating a new department in the city government, but building operations have reached such vast proportions, and the saving in cost of making duplicate sets of plans for several bureaus, and the saving of time in getting out several permits, will be so great to owners, builders and architects that the political affiliations of those who would fill the offices is of small moment to petitioners who suffer actual loss of time and annoyance by the present system. For several years the building interests have been discussing the desirability of one department for the inspection of buildings. Finally the building trade organizations have unitedly

formulated their desires. If their wishes be granted they will naturally hold in grateful remembrance the man or the political organization who will effect the relief asked for. An opportunity has arisen for Mayor Grant and Tammany.

A "Rotten Row" for Central Park.

We present herewith a map of Central Park, showing the original and alternative routes for the proposed speeding track, or "Rotten Row," as President Gallup, of the Park Board, felicitously names it, in Central Park. The bill became a law on Thursday, and the Park Board has already begun the preliminary work looking to an early construction of the road.

No definite plans have yet been provided, nor has the route even been definitely located, at least any further than as provided in the bill, which directs its location as nearly parallel and contiguous to the west wall of the park as is feasible. By the route originally planned, which is indicated by the continuous parallel lines, the road would be built 70 feet wide between the west drive and the wall, crossing under nearly all the carriage and path entrances and over all the transverse road entrances to the park. The estimated cost of this road would be \$600,000.

By the alternative plan, which is indicated by the parallel dotted lines, the existing west drive would be widened and somewhat straightened, and raised or lowered as the case might be, to avoid crossing any of the intersecting roads or paths at grade, and segregated from the rest of the park—perhaps by a granite parapet or wall. This plan would save the construction of at least four bridges, estimated to cost nearly \$200,000. But it would do away with the west drive, which, the Park Commissioners say, is but little used. In either plan the bridle paths and foot paths would have to be changed to conform to the new topographical conditions. The speeding track is designed to be undulating, without any steep or harsh grades, and is to connect with the 7th avenue by the north extension of the west drive.

"The Mayor and those who are associated with him in the plan for separating a limited part of the park from the rest for the use and enjoyment of the large number of owners of thoroughbred trotting horses residing within driving distance of the park have come in for a good deal of newspaper abuse," said Park Commissioner Straus, "which has been altogether unmindful of the facts connected with the use of the park drives. In the first place we propose to use a part of the park which now has no distinctive character or use. For the most part it is a deep glade skirting the west wall, but in some places it is hilly and covered with shrubbery and small trees. The drive can be so constructed as to be an ornamental improvement of this section of the park and will in no manner injure the neighboring property, but will, on the contrary, make it more desirable than it now is by owners of good horses.

"The park has accommodations now for every class of riders and drivers except those who most keenly appreciate thoroughbred horses, and who have done the most to promote the development of that noble animal. Bicyclers, backs and fancy turnouts are allowed the indiscriminate use of all the drives, and the use of them has grown to such an extent that no person can drive out in a light vehicle without taking his life in his hands. longer allow my family to venture into the park in a carriage. Accidents are of daily occurrence, of which the general public hears nothing, because the daily newspapers pay no attention to them. I had a horse worth \$25,-000 permanently ruined by being run into by a bicycle only a short time ago. I cannot too severely condemn the ill-considered abuse which this measure has brought upon Governor Flower and the Mayor. had the support of such men as Robert Bonner, Cornelius H. Vanderbilt, John D. Rockefeller, Secretary of the Navy Benj. F. Tracy, Fred'k Vanderbilt, President Fred'k P. Olcott, of the Central Trust Co.; President W. B. Dickerman, of the Stock Exchange; Col. Lawrence Kipp, Joseph Agostini, Stephen A. Walker, Sherman S Jewett, Dean Sage, Wm. Rockefeller, Matthew Reilly, John G. Coster, Fred'k N. Lawrence, James Barclay, Courtland D. Moss, Oliver H. Payne, Charles H. Kerner, Frank Work, Newbold Morris, J. G. K. Lawrence, W. H. Schieffelin, D. H. Hammond, Henry Barclay, A. B. Claffin and J. C. Delavergne, and surely such men are entitled to some consideration. You may depend upon it that if the road would be an injury to the park, these men would be the last to approve of it."


The Park Board held a special meeting yesterday and formally ordered the preparation of the preliminary surveys and specifications showing the character and quantity of grading, blasting, excavating, bridge and culvert building, masonry and road building necessary to be done, and made a requisition on the Board of Estimate and Apportionment for \$25,000 to defray the expense of the preliminary work.

Mayor Grant, who earnestly favors the improvement, said that when the work was completed, so far from being an injury to the park would it be that those who were now loud in denunciation of the scheme would be equally loud in its praise.

Real Estate Exchange Matters.

The Committee on Legislation held its regular weekly meeting on Monday afternoon. There was a very small attendance, and the business transacted was of only slight interest.

The report of the Committee on Taxation and Assessment disapproving the Assembly bill to equalize taxation by making the holder of a mortgage a joint owner in the real estate so mortgaged for purposes of taxation was adopted. The report of the same committee approving the Assembly bill to prevent fraud in swearing off personal taxes was laid on the table. The Committee on Pending Legislation disapproved the bill providing that maps on file at the Register's office for over twenty years shall be accepted in evidence in a court of law as correct maps until proved incorrect. This report was adopted.

In and About the City-New York.

The "Huckleberry Railroad" bill appears to have struck a snag in the Assembly.

The Grand Central Hotel has passed into the control of Tilly Haynes, the well and widely known boniface of the United States Hotel, of Boston.

Mayor Grant favors the enactment of the bill to provide for the closing of Hall place, between 6th and 7th streets, just east of the Bowery, to admit of the enlargement of the 69th Regiment armory.

The Court of Appeals having maintained the right of the Suburban Elevated Railroad Company to the construction of its road over its original route through St. Mary's Park, the Park Board has had a bill introduced at Albany conferring upon it authority to exclude the proposed road from the park, and requiring the company to change its route, providing and that it shall be compensated for the change.

A bill to make a legal holiday of October 12, the anniversary of the discovery of America, has been introduced at Albany by Assemblyman Sulzer.

The bill to authorize the Park Board to connect the transverse railroads through Central Park with existing street car lines has passed the Legislature and gone to the Governor for his approval. Under its provisions the Park Board will arrange with the Fourth Avenue Company to build connecting links from 5th avenue with its line in Madison avenue; and will carry the roads across Central Park West to the west side of the street, where they can be connected with the projected Columbus avenue and the existing 5th avenue lines.

The Senate Finance Committee has fixed \$1,000,000 as the price which the city must pay the State for its half of Ward's Island, if it chooses to buy rather than have the property fall into the hands of private owners.

The bill authorizing the Municipal Euilding Commission to choose a site for the proposed building anywhere in the ci y—in the City Hall Park, in Bryant Park, or elsewhere—has passed the Assembly.

Jas. L. Wells has introduced a bill to make the rate of interest 5 per cent per annum on all taxes unpaid on and after a certain date after they are due, instead of 7 per cent per annum as at present.

The Lynd Houses on Madison Avenue.

The Lynd Brothers are among the oldest builders in this city. Far back in the sixties, when most of the prominent builders of to-day had been unheard of, they were in high standing among old New Yorkers. Scores of private residences on the East Side of the city exist to-day as a monument to their capacity as builders, and not the least important among these are to be numbered the elegant residences erected by them on the northeast corner of 72d street and Madison avenue, opposite the Tiffany mansion.

The latest improvement undertaken by them is that of the seven buildings just about completed, on the northwest corner of Madison avenue and 84th street. They comprise six four-story, high stoop, private residences and a five-story flat, the latter having a fronting of over 44 feet and the former having frontages ranging from 18 to 22 feet, and from 65 to 70 in depth. The plans were prepared by J. H. Duncan, the architect of the Grant Monument. Mr. Duncan is to be congratulated on his treatment of both the interior as well as exterior. The latter shows a facade containing pilasters running from the second story up to the fourth, marking the division between each house, the second stories containing recessed windows with classic columns at each side. The treatment is somewhat of the Renaissance order, with a tinge of the Græco-Roman. The materials used are Lake Superior red sandstone and terra cotta. The doorway of the apartment house has a porch surmounted by a pair of eagles carved in stone, that seem to stand watch and guard the entrance. The passer-by cannot fail to notice the vestibule hallways, with their walls covered in marble.

The apartment house contains ten suites, with seven rooms and bath per suite, all tastefully decorated and finished in natural hardwoods. The staircase is of marble and iron, and each room has direct light and ventilation. There are private hallways to each suite, from which every room can be entered. Mantels, mirrors, sanitary plumbing, steam heat and other modern accessories are provided, and the apartments are, as a whole, laid out to suit small families of moderate means.

THE PRIVATE HOUSES.

The residences are all of a superior character and are equal in construction and appointments to the finest of our modern city houses offered on the narket. They contain many novel ideas, which are easily discovered by the visitor. The vestibules are finished in beautiful selected marbles. The entrance doors have a central window, in front of which is a bronze grill, the window being opened at will and admitting air to the vestibules, thus possessing the advantages of a storm and vestibule door combined, while dispensing with the former. This feature has been referred to in a previous article in The Record and Guide in describing some first-cless West Side houses.

The first floor of each house contains a parlor, dining-room and butler's pantry. The two main rooms communicate. The entire floor is parqueted, with the exception of the parlor. The trim used in some of the parlors is oak and bird's-eye maple, others being in white and gold. They contain handsome mantels, mirrors and fireplaces.

The dining-rooms are finely appointed. They have a high wainscoting in oak panels, with sideboards in a unique design. The mantels are handsome, and contain rich marble fittings. Looking out on the rear is a square window in cathedral glass, set in a recessed bay. Attached to the diningroom is a butler's pantry, with rear stairs leading to the culinary department.

The second floor contains two bedrooms and bath-room. The former are in sycamore and are connected with two dressing saloons that are beautifully finished in bird's-eye maple, inlaid with numerous French mirrors. These saloons contain an abundance of wardrobe and closet room, and have all the toilet conveniences.

The bath rooms are examples of some of the most perfect work of its kind ever displayed in New York City. They were supplied by Mott. The floors are inlaid in an attractive color in mosaic work, with a border pattern. There is a curiously-designed fireplace in white enamel tiles, furnished with gaslogs. The walls are tiled in enamel, and the appointments are all of such a character that the room has the air of a luxurious lounging place rather than a bath-room. These appointments are well worth seeing.

The third floors are to some extent a duplicate of the floors below, the bath-rooms, though tiled, not being quite as elaborate. The trim used is ash.

The top floor has four bedrooms and store-room, all finished in hard-woods.

The basement contains a billiard-room, kitchen and laundry, all in ash trim, the fireplaces being lined with enamel brick tiles.

THE CORNER HOUSE.

The handsomest and most costly of the private houses is that on the corner. It is 22×70 in size, and has an inclosed porch on the 84th street side which forms a vestibule entrance, the flooring being in rich mosaic and the walls in marble.

On entering a grand stairway in oak is seen. To the right is the parlor, overlooking the avenue and chastely decorated in white and gold in Louis XVI. style. Passing from the reception hall to the left the dining-room is entered. This room is in mahogany and is very handsomely appointed. Passing beyond we come to a library, and on the other hand is the butler's pantry.

Ascending the staircase we reach the second floor, which is a superb suite of rooms partly overlooking the avenue and partly overlooking the Cen-

tral Park. The rooms are finely trimmed in bird's-eye maple and sycamore, the 'dressing-rooms fronting on the street and being unusually light and spacious. There are three be drooms and a bath-room on this floor, the latter being magnificently appointed and of similar construction, etc., to that described above as being in the other houses.

The third floor has three rooms and a bath-room, all trimmed in ash and sycamore, the fourth floor containing five rooms and a store-room, all in hardwoods.

The basement is entirely finished in ash. It has a billiard-room, with an ante-room leading thereto; a kitchen, laundry, etc.

This is but a running description of a row of buildings that deserve better mention. The houses are of the very highest workmanship in every detail, the construction having been entirely under the superintendence of the builders and owners from foundation to roof. They contain hardwood trim throughout, and the finest quality of bronze appears to have been used in the metal work. The floors are planed off, polished and varnished throughout, which is very unusual. The woodwork is exceptionally fine. The plumbing is nickel-plated and exposed, and is of the highest sanitary character, and the construction is mussive and substantial. The houses are now being placed on the market, and they will afford most attractive homes to those who may become their possessors.

A Very Healthy Barnacle.

Among the bills pending in the Legislature is one which seeks to extend and more firmly establish the exclusive powers of the Commissioners of the Federal Loan Fund. This is a concern which the Bar Association and the loan agents and title companies have for years stigmatized as a nuisance and tried to abate. The bill in question calls for an amendment of Section 45 of Chapter 150 of the Laws of 1837.

Some time previous to 1837, the United States Government, having a surplus in the treasury, apportioned it among the several States in the form of a loan, without interest, to be refunded when called for. In this State the money was apportioned among the several counties, to be laned at interest on bond and mortgage. The act above quoted provided for the appointment of county commissioners of this fund, who should have charge of its investment.

The portion of the fund falling to New York County was something over \$70,000. For many years Charles D. Iugersoll and Charles P. Latting have been the Loan Commissioners for this county. If the mortgages taken by this commission had been recorded as other mortgages are, in the Register's office, the operations of the concern would have interested but few people. But as described to a Record and Guide reporter yesterday, by J. B. Miller, of counsel for the Title Guarantee and Trust Company, the commission has so manipulated its office as to bring everyone who buys or sells real estate under tribute to it.

As stated by Mr. Miller, the commission has the \$77,059.60, of which the fund consists, invested in about forty mortgages, all of which are, in accordance with the act of 1837, recorded in books of the commission and kept by it in its own office. Section 55 of the act requires the commission to deposit these books in the County Clerk's office, except when the commissioners are in actual session for the dispatch of official duties, and there is a tradition that the books have been deposited there, at some time or times in the past. But the practice of the commission makes them accessible for inspection only in the office of the commission, at No. 32 Nassau street.

This condition of things imposes the necessity of searching the records of the commission upon every examination of a title to lands in this county, and as there are about 12, 00 conveyances annually, the mortgage records of the commission have to be searched about 12, 00 times every year. The present section 43 of the act of 1837 authorizes the commissioners to charge a fee of 12½ cents for each search made by an outsider, and requires them to permit any person to examine the books at reasonable times. But instead of making this convenient and feasible, as in the Register's office, the commissioners have made it so difficult that searchers and lawyers have preferred to come to the commission's terms, which are, a search by the employe of the commission at 50 cents each for the first two names and 25 cents for each additional name in any search.

According to Mr. Miller the average amount of this fee is at least \$1.50, and for the 12,000 cases annually the total amount is \$18,000, which is the perquisite of the commissioners. But the commission is not satisfied with this comfortable condition of things. It found some time ago that the Title Guarantee and Trust Company had obtained copies of all its living mortgages and thereafter did not come and pay its little \$1.50 for a certificate on each title it had to search. So it had this bill introduced at Albany for an amendment of the act of 1837, which seeks to increase the fee for independent searches from 12½ cents per search to 25 cents for each book examined or searched; authorizes the commissioners to adopt such rules governing the time and manner under which such personal search shall be made, and prohibits all persons from giving certificates purporting to be certificates of searches of the books of the commission without the authority and direction of the commissioners.

This act, Mr. Miller said, was evidently directed against the Title Guarantee and Trust Company. But, he said, in the general interest of the people the whole scheme of the commissioners ought to be abolished, and the commissioners required to file their mortgages for record in the Register's office. It was a pickayunish affair when considered with reference to the fee in each case, but it amounted in the aggregate to an unju tifiable imposition upon the real estate business. The Bar Association in 1886 adopted a report of its Committee on Amendment of the Law as to Proposed Bills to Improve Land Transfers, and had a bill introduced at Albany requiring the record of all mortgages taken by the commission in the Register's office, and requiring the commission to prepare copies of all of its mortgages and indices, and file them for record in the Register's office. Once before the Bar Association took similar action, but on neither occasion did it prevail against the commissioners at Albany.

There will be a hearing on the bill before the Senate Finance Committee next Tuesday.

Real Estate Exchange Anniversary Dinner.

The Board of Directors of the Real Estate Exchange, at a special meeting held on Tuesday afternoon, decided to celebrate the seventh anniversary of the opening of the Exchange by a dinner to be given at Delmonico's on April 21st. The Exchange was actually opened on the 11th of April, 1885, but it was found impossible to complete arrangements for a celebration of the event so early next month.

About two hundred and twenty-five covers will be laid; twenty-five for guests and the remainder for members of the Exchange and their friends. The tickets, at \$10 each, will be disposed of to members as their orders are received, the principle to be observed being, first come, first served.

The toasts will be few in number, but excellent in quality. President Geo. R. Read, will, of course, respond to a toast, but aside from Mr. Read there will probably not be any speakers from among the Exchange membership. The committee have invited, among others, ex-President Cleveland, Chauncey M. Depew, Daniel Dougherty and H. C. Sulzer, to respond to toasts. Among the invited guests are Governor Flower, Mayor Grant, and all the Judges of the Supreme, Superior, Common Pleas and City Courts.

To Contest the College Place Assessment.

The Broadway property-owners who have been assessed for the widening of College place, together with some other owners within the area liable to the tax levy for this improvement, feel that the assessments placed upon their properties are excessive. With a view to having the assessments

reduced, these owners have retained Arthur Berry to take legal measures to prevent the confirmation of the assessments by the Supreme Court.

Real Estate Department.

The real estate market this week has not been altogether satisfactory in the number of sales actually consummated. The uppropitious weather, the brokers say, is almost entirely to blame for this lack of tangible results. The completed transactions are not as numerous or important as it might be expected they would be. But the tone of the market continues remarkably good and the prevailing feeling is one of decided cheerfulness.

On all sides are to be heard whispers of pending negotiations, some of them very important in character, and it seems only a question of a short time when they will be brought to a successful conclusion.

THE SALES OF THE WEEK.

The first three days were in miniature what the season has been. On Monday the bidding was spirited and willing, and the sales for the day were generally successful. Tuesday's longer list of offerings met with only half the success which attended the previous day's sales, owners finding it necessary to either buy in or withdraw many of the properties offered in order to protect themselves.

The auction market this week was practically closed on Wednesday with a job lot of city and Brooklyn sales. On Thursday the single parcel offered was to have been sold under foreclosure and it was adjourned, while Friday's few sales had no special interest for the general market.

Probably the most encouraging sale of the week, from the auctioneer's standpoint, was that of the annexed district properties belonging to the estate of the late Wm. Simpson, on Monday. This sale demonstrated one fact very clearly, and that was that North New York property is still very much in favor with small investors. The real estate speculators who were present at the sale were outbid in nearly every instance by the small outsider. This, of course, helped to swell the figures obtained for the property. For instance, the northwest corner of 3d avenue and 146th street, 19.9 on 3d avenue x100 on the street, and with a frontage of 9 feet on Courtlandt avenue, sold for \$29,500. There is a four-story building upon it.

The irregular plot, with a three-story brick bank building upon it, at the junction of 3d and Courtlandt avenues sold for \$25,750, a figure considered low when compared with the 146th street corner. This plot is 54 8 on 3d avenue x34 6 and 42.3 on Courtlandt avenue and a rear line that measures 52.6. Three one-story frame stores on 3d avenue, just north of the bank building, on lots averaging about 16.8x70, sold for \$7,900 each; while in the rear two lots on Courtlandt avenue, about 25x73, sold for \$3,150 and \$3,175 respectively. These examples give a very fair idea of how the sale succeeded. Auctioneer Jas. L. Wells conducted the sale.

On Wednesday Auctioneer Richard V. Harnett disposed of some interesting properties to the well-known politician, John E. Brodsky. After some competition Mr. Brodsky secured the west side of 4th street, between Grove and Christopher streets, a seven-story brick flat, having a frontage of 66.2 feet on 4th street, 59 8 on Christopher, 56 on Grove and 77.6 on the inside line. He paid \$105,000 for it. The same purchaser also secured a five-story flat, 26x82.2x27x86.10, running from No. 72 Christopher to No. 69 Grove street and the next house but one to the 4th street flat. For this he paid \$36,000. The other sales of the week were less interesting in character. They will be found in detail in the "Sales of the Week" column.

A. Hill. This house will be 35 and 40 feet wide by 65 feet in depth. It will have three stories, finished with slate roof. The materials to be used are light limestone, light brick and white terra cotta. The interior is to be abinet trammed throughout, and in all appointments will be one of the fine residences in the city. No estimate of cost has yet been made.

Danmar & Fischer have plans to draw for a four-story brick, stone and terra cotta office building, 40x60, to be built on the northwest corner of Eastern Parkway and Van Siclen avenue, for the German-American Improvement Company. work, including Oriental porcelains, enamels, jades, lacquers, swords, ivory earrings, old silver pieces, and so on.

The Labor Unions and the Astor Buildings.

The strike on the Astor Hotel buildings, the Hotel Waldorf, and the New Netherlands Hotel, has not assumed very great proportions. On Tuesday the carters of building material were ordered to deliver no more building material to either building, and they have since refrained from doing so. But Contractor John Downey says there is no scarcity of material and all the other men are at work.

An Invaluable Book

bers of the chapters and the sections of the main work have been retained. Some new forms have been given and a chapter added treating of the special liability imposed upon landlords by the Civil Damage Act. It is published by the Diossy Law Book Company, of No. 231 Broadway.

Organizing the Building Trades,
The movement for the organization of the building trades, of which intimations have heretofore been published, has at last taken definite form. The plan provides in general for a congress composed of delegates from the respective trades in the ratio of one delegate for each twenty-five members of the auxiliary trade association, but no association shall have more than three delegates in the congress. The congress will hear grievances and decide all questions relating to the terms and conditions of employment of all workmen employed in the trades. It will enter into formal agreements with the respective unions for the rates of wages and terms and conditions of employment for stated periods, and will hold its members to a strict observance of them, and will protect the workmen with whom it enters into contract relations against outside interference. Calls have been issued for several meetings to be held during the coming week, of firms and persons in the respective trades, for the purpose of organizing and selecting delegates to the organization meeting of the congress, which will be held early in April.

BUILDING MATERIAL MARKET.

BRICKS.—The condition of the market for Common Hards changes in no important particular and the course of business since our last has brought to light nothing of special interest. The quantity of stock coming to hand was smaller, heavy floating ice in the river making navigation dangerous and preventing the return trip of empty barges, even had manufacturers felt willing to risk sending forward cargoes. It was probably just as well, however, that supplies did not present themselves for sale, as the condition of the weather was such as to retard consumption greatly and make a full balance against the shrinkage in first-hand offering, a great deal of held stock remaining, upon which dealers and contractors can draw to tide over immediate necessities. On price we find about former rates mentioned, but leading operators are frank enough to admit that \$8,25 is very extreme and not obtained with sufficient frequency to make it a very solid figure. Fales have been rather more plenty and found a fairish demand, at rates ranging along from \$2.25 up to \$2.75, according to quality, quantity, etc. As intimated in our last, the Manufacturers' Association is getting into working order, and this week held an important meeting at which a large representative attendance was present. The situation was generally and carefully discussed and a resolution finally passed that no moulding should commence until May 9th. That will allow, it is thought, ample time to work off old stock, clean up the yards and get everything in good shape and place manufacturers in a position to command better terms. Manufacturers in a position to command better terms. Manufacturers accleulate they will make a curtailment of about 180,000,000 in the output.

GLASS.—There has unquestionably been a considerable amount of disappointment over the market for domestic glass during the past three or four weeks. Demand did not prove by any means as full as calculated upon, and certain evidences have gone to show quite plainly that there was a great deal less harmony among manufacturers and jobbers upon the subject of prices than proclaimed just after the advance made at the February meeting. The New Jersey manufacturers did not go into the agreement with Western makers at that time, and there has since been a misunderstanding among importers that has placed foreign glass in large lots within reach of buyers at practically the same cost as domestic. Meanwhile, however, old quotations are retained, and while a little nominal are about as near a general guide to the market as can be given.

LATH.—So far as can be learned no business has been done above \$3 per M, but everything in the way of standard stock available at that figure was taken, with more wanted, and receivers now talk of \$2.90 as an inside figure for round wood stock. All general features remain just the same as for two or three weeks past, moderate supplies offering from all quarters and buyers appearing to stand ready for anything that may become available. Indeed it is thought that dealers are very much more generally reduced in the matter of supplies than they would have it appear, and receivers have confidence to believe that quite a little "fleet" could be disposed of without difficulty.

LIME.—The market has worked out thoroughly in accord with intimations previously given in this report. Without reaching anything in the way of a liberal supply fuller arrivals have taken place, so distributed among receivers as to give opportunity for proper trial of the position through chances of competition and the result is favorable to sellers. Common may now be considered as fully established at \$1.00 per bbl. and Finishing at \$1.10, with about all the arrivals sold out down to present writing, and apparently room for more stock, though it probably might not be altogether desirable to have much of a fleet come in together, and there is just a little whisper that a goodly number of cargoes are working down the coast. State lime continues to meet with some attention at former rates, but receivers do not appear very enthusiastic over the condition of trade.

LUMBER.—A somewhat extended look about among the yards this week discloses the fact that in a great many cases the lumber piles have undergone no serious shrinkage as yet. Exceptionally dealers have run down their accumulations somewhat and are looking for stock to replenish assortments, notably in the case of spruce, but the distributive trade is not of that general character through which an anxious demand for bulk parcels is stimulated. The prospects for consumption, however, are in no way abated. A glance at our weekly report of projected operations

showing what may be expected in the building line, and there is much faith that as soor as the weather occomes mild and settled an increase of demand will be manifested. Upon both the wholesale and retail line of valuation a steady line of figures is retained, and upon no class of stock is there any direct effort to realize.

Spruce still inclines in sellers' favor and the line of value is steadily creeping upward, with probably nothing now to be reached for less than \$16 in any position, and the more desirable random up to \$180, 18,50%, the latter being claimed on a very attractive schedule to arrive. Demand, in many cases, is inclined to show a somewhat greater degree of caution at the increase of cost, but receivers assert that when they have anything to offer they do not have to wait for negotiation and frequently encounter a considerable measure of competition among buyers that, of course, helps matters greatly. Most Eastern mills report an uncertainty about logs and that, of course, makes them more circumspect about entering upon engagements, even on the temptation of present full rates. According to present advices, the cut of Northern or State stock has not been extensive and there is a prospect for a scarcity of piece stuff during the coming season.

Piling more than justifies the promising reports recently given and is showing an excellent market with prices advancing, and 5c, now about an inside rate. A pretty good draft has been made upon the basin accumulation, so much so that buyers have turned their attention toward anything likely to become available in the way of new supplies, and one of our leading receivers reports that a few cargoes he has been enabled to offer to arrive are all sold.

Hemlock remains steady here, and a large operator who has recently returned from a visit to the Pennsylvania district reports a well-sustained market there, no cut on price known of among any of the manufacturers party to the recent compact, and the alleged collapse of the combination referred to last week in

be found firmly sustained values for all standard stock.

Hardwoods not selling with much freedom, and the market generally seems to be a trifle disappointing, though not discouraging or weakening, and holders generally asklformer rates. Poplar is selling in carlots to some extent, but no one seems to want large parcels of stock, although the latter might be obtained at a moderate shading on the line of cost. Quartered oak holds a very forward position still in attracting demand, but there is plenty of it available, and sellers willing to accept former rates promptly. Export orders are in fair volume, and there is thought to be a chance for some increase at no distant day.

THE WEST.

The Northwestern Lumberman says:

From all points comes the encouragement that the prospects for demand are bright. There is nothing now in sight that is likely to blast the hope of manufacturers and dealers, so far as pertains to the extent of requirement. But prices rule too low to satisfy producers and handlers, especially in the South and some portions of the Eastern field. In the White and Norway pine markets, while there has not been any considerable advance in prices, there has been some gain in solidity. Sellers can now realize a price without the necessity of making concessions, as was the case last year. This is an important point gained. The extreme weakness in respect to common lumber characteristic of late years seems to have passed away. This has resulted from a falling off in output last year, and the present knowledge that stocks on hand are measurably meager in comparison to current and prospective demand. Inquiry between markets for specials is unusually active. It is seldom that holders of wholesale supplies run so short of sizes and lengths of lumber as they have this year. Stocks are broken throughout the white pine districts and in all markets from Buffalo to Minneapolis. At the same time there are several kinds of unusual demand, notably that from the car factories, the railroads, the World's Fair, and especial bills for large manufacturing plants to be erected. The call for dimension and boards, such as the farmers use, is a special feature of demand on the wholesale yards, showing that the good crops of last year had an effect to stimulate improvement in the rural districts. What was anticipated last fall, in this regard, is being realized, and it is likely that but a slight measure of it has as yet been seen.

At the Chicago yards the shortage in piece stuff.

At the Chicago yards the shortage in piece stuff stocks is beginning to be felt by the larger shippers. There seems to be an especial lack of lengths, 16 feet and upwards, in 2x4, 2x6, 2x8, 2x10 and 2x12. The shortage of 16-foot lengths is particularly in respect to 2x4, 2x6 and 2x8. The supply of 18, 20, 22 and 24-foot lengths of the sizes named are also much inquired for. he supply of 2x12-12 is about gone, and 3x12-12. 14, 16, 18 and 20 is short.

It is stated that there is practically no 18 and 20-foot, 8, 10 and 12-inch boards to be had in any considerable quantity. Mississippi River and other markets are inquiring for stock boards of all grades, the supply appearing to be everywhere short.

The car factory demand has already absorbed nearly all the cutting strips that were saved out of

cargoes. Prices of short lumber are firm. B car strips have been sold at \$30 a thousand. Siding strips have been exhausted, and dealers are saving up their dressed siding for their customers. All good strips are excellent and firm-priced property.

The Timberman says:

Throughout the Northwest the weather has become very moderate, and it is next to impossible to conduct the logging business very much longer for this season. In many sections rains have continued for quite a length of time, and what little snow was packed away in the woods has yielded to the warm weather and in many sections of the Northwest there is every evidence that the cut of lumber has been greatly curtailed.

It is true that very favorable weather continued early in the season for skidding, but it was late in many sections when logging operations were set in motion, and our reports from the various streams in the Northwest indicate that there will probably be a falling off of from 10 per cent to 20 per cent in the log crop in many points in Wisconsin.

A warm rain will quickly finish the business of logging in many sections and greatly facilitate driving, but from what we have said, it must not be inferred that there will be a very great shortage of logs. It is not usual for a shortage of logs to occur, for it must be recollected that railroad logging is growing apace, and new logging railroads are being built continually; consequently logs can be poured into the logging centers all summer, if the demand for lumber should warrant it. It is, however, evideat that the crop will be materially less than was expected by the lumbermen.

As has been heretofore noted the cheaper hardwoods are doing relatively better than the high-priced onesthere being a very free movement of basswood cotton wood, low grade maple, etc. This activity is the more noticeable because the supply of these woods is light in comparison to what it usually is, and prices are some hat firmer in consequence, although not quotably higher. Manufacturers of moulding are heavy buyers of basswood, but there is also a good inquiry for this wood from other directions, making a lively trade in all grades. Box makers are the principal buyers of cottonwood and low grade maple, while the furniture manufacturers are taking considerable elm. In regard to oak there is little if any change to note. The supply of plain sawed red oak is just about sufficient for present requirements, with a growing tendency toward higher prices on this variety, especially among manufacturers. Yard dealers are offering the same old prices, \$24 to \$26 for inch, but are not searching very diligently for stock, as their immediate wants are not urgent, and the future of the market too indefinite for them to desire to buy heavily. Plain sawed white oak is only in moderate request.

Quarter-sawed oak, both white and red, continue quiet, but holders of this stock, and they include nearly every dealer in Chicago, are confident that there will be a decided improvement in both demand and prices before the summer has grown very old. Extra wide stock, as is usual, commands top prices, and is in fair demand.

There is about the average trade in cherry, with former prices ruling, and no over-supply of firsts and seconds. Common and cull cherry do not move off readily and prices on these grades are somewhat weak.

Ash is in moderate supply and there is a fair demand for thick.

The Mississippi Valley Lumberman as follows: The lumber woods are now being watched with interest by those who are anxious to forecast the

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future of prices. During the first of this week the prospect for a very short log crop amounted to almost a certainty. The sudden change from spring to midwinter weather on Tuesday night and Wednesday all over the logging territory has quite changed the probabilities as to the log supply. On Monday one-half the logging camps in Minnesota and Wisconsin had broken up. The remaining half were struggling between mud and snow, with prospect of three or four days more sledding at the most. The blizzard of Wednesday gives all loggers not yet dispersed at least a week more of hauling. A very sanguine estimate of the log crop now places it at the mark reached in 1891. This means a good fair supply, but the day has gone by for a glut this season.



PAINTS, OILS, ETC.—Demand fluctuates somewhat, but for the time being appears to be on the increase. The actual consumption bas been slowly gaining this month, especially in staple descriptions of painters' supp ies both dry and mixed. There is also more doing in specialties, some of which are decidedly active. Taken as a whole, however, the market cannot be considered as showing anything unusual and some operators claim quite positively it is not up to what it should be at this period. However, they try to be thankful for what they receive and manage very well with supplies, so that no surplus comes upon sale in either a slow or hasty manner, and for all leading articles prices seem to run about steady but without much inclination to advance, as that move would be very apt to still further strengthen the conservatism of buyers and narrow down the boundary of orders. White lead remains steady for all staple products.
