

DEVOTED TO REAL ESTATE. BUILDING ARCHITECTURE, HOUSEHOLD DEGORATION, BUSINESS AND THEMES OF GENERAL INTEREST.

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CONTINUED and increased improvement in trade and financial circles may be noticed this week, due in a large measure apparently to the hope that the difference existing between the Senate and House on the Wilson Bill may lead to the abandonment of tariff legislation for a time at least. The passage of the Bland substitute silver inflation bill has not been without effect, although the President is relied upon to veto it as a violation of the principle under which the purchasing clause of the Silver Act of 1890 was repealed if ever that measure reaches his hands, which from all accounts there is a considerable probability of its doing. This bill, as it passed the House, not only gives a ridiculous money value to the silver in the Treasury, but also makes the notes issued for its purchase redeemable by a part only of the bullion they were issued to pay for. In this way it is sought to give government a profit of over fifty-five millions of dollars. The result has been to expedite if not cause gold shipments, and to prove what has been said before here, that if foreign capital is to be retained in this country, there will have to be found a way to lessen the opportunities for irresponsible currency theorists coming into the great prominence and having the seeming importance that they now do. The outward movement of gold is never favorable to stock exchange quotations. Attention is attracted to the radical reductions in the operating cost of the great railroads in January and people are asking, if they can be operated at such a low percentage of cost, have not stockholders hitherto been defrauded? The explanation no doubt is that such extensive economies as have been instituted can only endure for a short time and are intended only to bridge over a period of poor business, which the railroad managers hope will not last much longer. There is no do doubt whatever that the proportion of cost of operating will increase and that soon, whether business does or not. In general trade there is the same conservatism on the part of buyers as has characterised them for some time, though mitigated enough to lead to the hope that a better demand is growing up at least in the lines of necessaries. This feeling is noticed in the boot and shoe, the wool and the cotton goods trades. The great furnaces have been large buyers of ores recently, though at low prices, and have thereby created a prospect of renewed activity in the iron trade in the near future.

NDOUBTEDLY the question of greatest commercial importance discussed in Europe to-day is the treaty petween Germany and Russia. Notwithstanding the announcement by the Emperor William that the treaty is a political necessity, the agrarian party is fighting its confirmation in the Reichstag tooth and nail. Outside, trading and commercial bodies all over the Empire have taken the matter up, the manufacturer being on one side and the farmer on the other. There is a belief that should the treaty be rejected by the Reichstag a dissolntion would follow and the appeal to the country would result in a triumph for the government, just as the same procedure did in the matter of the Army Bill a year or more ago. The failure of the treaty, taken in connection with the imperial statement, would probably be very mischievous. The probabilities favoring confirmation of the treaty, however, the business of Germany has improved somewhat and the shares of banks and manufacturing companies, particularly those of the latter connected with the iron trade have gone up. The commission appointed to consider the ways and means to rehabilitate silver is not expected to produce much good, the opinion being so general that an effective solution of the silver question is only possible through international agreement, the impossibility of which is shown by the recent official announcement that England had no intention of proposing the reassembling of the

monetary conference seeing no advantage therein. English financial papers are congratulating the trading community they serve on the results of their analysis of the trade returns for 1893. The differences in prices being taken into account the imports of foreign goods for home consumption were only 1.42 per cent less than in the previous year and the exports of British goods only 2.10 per cent less. This result, in spite of the malign influences of the collapse in Australia, the currency troubles on this side of the Atlantic and the strikes and other impediments to business at home, is naturally considered very satisfactory. Current reports of railroad earnings also show that business is picking up slowly. There is no break in the dullness of financial affairs in Paris, though the arrest of Baron de Soubeyan, the chairman of the collapsed Banque d'Escompte, affords an interesting topic of conversation. This gentleman was one of those financiers, apparently, who try to carry too many concerns at once, or rather try to make several concerns carry each other, and has consequently come to the ground under circumstances sufficiently suspicious to demand his arrest and placing under bail. native population of France diminished by 20,041 in 1892 according to the recent returns; this is the third year in succession that there has been a decrease. The demand of Hungary for a note bank independent of the Austro-Hungarian Bank is being resisted; a ministerial explanation of the refusal contained the statement that if anything rather too much credit had been given to Hungary and it might lead to dangerous speculation. Like their fellows in Germany, Hungarian agriculturists are opposing the conclusion of custom treaties with neighboring powers where any concessions from the present regulations for the import of cereals and live stock are contemplated. Vienna seems to be full of unemployed poor, among whom there are said to be daily suicides. One of the works of relief contemplated is the removal of the great barracks standing in the centre of the city, a relic of the time when the monarch feared the population of the capital. Italy's endeavors to relieve itself from bankruptcy do not meet with much success. The only resource seems to lie in additional taxation, and that naturally meets with opposition on all sides. The mere attempt, however, to bring order into its finances has put up the price of Italian rente in the foreign markets. In India natives and Indian born Europeans join in condemning the financial policy of the Engli h Government towards India, but in Calcutta and Bengal opinions have been expressed adverse to the reopening the mints to silver. The solution of the Indian part of the silver difficulty is still far away. While there is a great deal of protest, there appears to be no suggestion of the way in which the government can remove the evils complained of. The government proposes to meet the deficit by imposing a new 5 per cent tax on imports, except cottons, besides doubling the tax on petroleum. Whether this includes silver is not stated, but from the wording of the dispatch bringing this news it may be presumed that it does.

FFECTIVE work has been done at Washington on behalf of West Side property-owners in securing amendments to the New York and New Jersey Bridge bill, now undergoing examination by the Committee on Interstate and Foreign Commerce of the House of Representatives. In the first place, instead of the Bridge Company being free to locate their eastern approach on a wide line reaching as far up as 71st street, as was contemplated by the bill as introduced, the committee has decided that this approach shall not be higher than 69th street nor lower than 59th street but at some suitable place between those two points, to be decided upon by the Secretary of War after examination. Should the bill become a law an endeavor will be made on the part of interested property-owners to have the choice fixed on 60th street, and failing that, on 65th street, as that would throw the approaches into the tenement district, where the least amount of damage can be done. The bill provided that two hundred and fifty thousand dollars should be spent the first year and a million dollars each year thereafter. This provision has been amended in one very important particular, namely, by the insertion of the words "in money" after the statement of each sum. This is better the original provision, though not all that can be wished as a proof of the good faith of the people acquiring the charter. the first view it does appear that a sufficient guarantee for the performance of the work would be obtained if a quarter of a million of dollars were spent on it with a forfeiture following if a million dollars are not expended each year thereafter, yet if the comparatively small sum required to be spent in the first year is put into the work it would probably for the promoters to gain an extension time if they were not able to raise the next required sum for a year or two. Moreover, once any considerable sum were spent in actual work Congress would be loth and perhaps would find it difficult to confiscate the work so created. No doubt people could be found who would supply the money for the first year's requirements in order to hold so valuable a franchise as a specu

lation from year to year under an expected indulgence of Congress until they could find a purchaser. Consequently to insure a reasonably rapid progress of the work and to prevent such speculative delays the money expenditure in the first instance should be larger, at least a million of dollars. Another important amendment in Committee is a change of phrase-ology from one that might be taken to mean that connecting railroads could build independent approaches to the bridge to one that restricts connection to the appreaches of the bridge itself. These amendments improve the aspect of the bill to the property-owners' view very much, but of course they are not final. The bill has still to go through the House and the Conference Committee, in either of which bodies the advantages that have been gained in the House Committee may be lost again, so that vigilance is still necessary on the part of the representatives of the commercial and property interests in this city in order that both the House and Senate may be kept informed of what is necessary to their protection.

The Metropolitan Club.

NEW YORK is getting bigger every year, but it is not yet so big that an organization which before it had any local habitation came to be known as the Millionaires' Club can move into a new club-house on the avenue without becoming the talk of the town for a day or two. The house into which the Metropolitan Club has moved is, moreover, of so stunning and surprising a kind that it is quite sure of being at least a nine days' wonder.

One of the surprises is the contrast that the exterior offers to the interior, for which it does not in the least prepare the visitor. The outside, indeed, has nothing to talk about and as little to look at as could possibly be furnished by so big a building, all in white marble. It is merely a great box and as nearly devoid of architecture as a factory. It shows no composition except in the proportioning of the stories to each other, no features and no detail, except that of the balconies and the cornice, and this is not noticeable or memorable. The one exterior feature is the gateway at the east end and this is a monument all by itself and not a feature of the building. The palace differs from a factory in that it has more wall and less window and that it is built of costly material.

Extreme plainness is by no means the worst characteristic a new building in 5th avenue can have. It is in fact a distinction, and the easiest and most obvious distinction. When one sees a millionaire's club-house that is marked by extreme plainness, and about which, architecturally, there is really nothing to be said, he is inclined to congratulate the millionaires. If they have built themselves a lordly pleasure house, wherein at ease to dwell, they have shown, he is inclined to say, good sense and good taste in abstaining from an ostentation that would excite envy. They require to be "on the avenue" because that is the appropriate quarter for a fashionable club-house, and for the better reason that the avenue opposite the Park gives the pleasantest look out of any place in town that is equally accessible, and a millionaire's club is necessarily a "window club." having got a site on the avenue and put up an enormous house because they needed an enormous house, they have made it as plain as possible that they may not seem to flaunt their riches in our faces, nor needlessly to provoke the Anarchist.

This is all very well, and at any rate it is quite intelligible, only, in that case, why white marble? Why make as inconspicuous a design as possible, and execute it in as conspicuous a material as possible? In brownstone the club-house would really have had as retiring an aspect as was possible to its dimensions. In marble it collars the eye and provokes the Anarchist from afar. When one passes the door, however, the plainness promptly disappears, except in the big hall, which is a kind of middle term between the prim and demure aspect of the outside, and the riot and debauchery of the decoration. The room has one very good feature, in the colonnade at the top of it, two stories up. But a hall of these dimensions does not explain itself in a club, except as a connecting link. It might, indeed, be explained in an evening stock exchange, which was meant to supplant the Windsor and the Fifth Avenue and the other former evening resorts of the operator in exciting times, and it would be an excellent place for the clubmen to assemble and read bulletins of elections. It seems to need a fringe of tickers, and dropping rivulets of tape. But it is a striking piece of architecture, and about the only example of that art in the club, apart from decoration, unless we except the corridor that leads into the main dining-room, a very justly-proportioned and welldetailed piece of work.

Everywhere else we lose sight of the architect, who is effaced by the decorator. In any of the big rooms it is quite impossible to get away from the decorator, or to see anything else than his decorations, so swaggering and insistent and noisy they are. Certainly the main rooms of the Metropolitan Club are the loudest works of art that have ever been presented to an astonished American public. If the millionaires are shy of flaunting their millions in the face of the public, they are not in the least

backward about flaunting them in each other's face, and really wallowing in their common wealth. The contrast between the severe outside and the profuse and barbaric and overloaded interior seems to have been deliberately planned. Perhaps it was suggested by a like contrast between the outsides and the insides of some Italian palaces, but in that case, in the famous case of the Pitti, the architecture and the decoration were a century apart, and appealed not only to a different kind of man, or to different sides of the same man, but to different generations. The great grandchildren of the architects were the contemporaries of the stucco-workers who furnished the prototypes for the decorations of the Metropolitan Club, and the difference between the architecture and the decorations betokens a very distinct degeneration. Although the styles employed in the club-house are called by French names, they are very plainly of Italian origin. It is Pietro da Cortona and his contemporaries of the sixteenth century that are the inventors of the system of decoration by projected figures in plaster and by violent color that is carried out here, and that has not been carried out with anything like the same completeness, profusion and audacity anywhere else in this country. wayfaring man, indeed, cannot help seeing that is what the wayfaring man would call Dago decora-tion. It is the Italian journeyman whom we know in the lobbies of theatres and other places of passage that we encounter here, unlimited in money and goaded to do his loudest in a place that is supposed to be a place of repose. The Dago journeyman murders repose. One might as well try to sleep in a boiler shop as take his ease in this confusion of shapes and noises. Restlessness, however, is not the first characteristic of the decoration. The first is ostentation. One visitor expressed a general impression when he said the place smelt of money, to which another rejoined that he thought he detected also the odor of patchouli. It may be added that the mixed fumes of garlic, Gorgonzola and olive oil pervade the place to the mind's nose of the visitor.

It is rather melancholy to contrast this decoration with what has been done heretofore for the same purpose and in the same way. The decoration of the Union League Club was by no means at all points successful, but it showed a serious intention, it was for the most part quiet, there was sobriety in its richness and harmony in its variety. The library is the only apartment in the Metropolitan Club that comes as near being successful. this new decoration would excite more than anything else in New York the fury of the Anarchist, and corroborate the social philosophers who preach of the essential vulgarity of a plutocracy is abundantly plain. It almost seems, indeed, to have been done cynically and to confirm their views. In that aspect the question how the members of the Metropolitan Club like it becomes of considerable social importance. Is the American millionaire the riotous, ostentatious and crude creature to whom these high-flavored decorations appeal? We are inclined to think not. The American millionaire for the most part takes his pleasure sadly and his millions seriously. In fact there is nothing more serious in American life than a million, except two millions. That, at any rate, is the ordinary view. Perhaps the esoteric view entertained by his decorator may be more nearly correct, and the enfranchised Dago is right in going to lengths to which he could not venture in his own land, and assuming the American millionaire to be of an uproarious and ostentatious crudity in determining to give him Italian Renaissance, as the vulgar phrase has it, "in the neck." We shall know which view is right when we learn whether the decorations are popular in the club.

THE Legislature obviously made a great mistake when it intrusted the distribution of the million of dollars voted for works to relieve trade depression to the Park Department. No doubt the insertion of the name of that department was a slip of the pen and that the Department of Charities and Correction was really intended. Some months ago, when great distress was pending over the city, practical people suggested that that was a good time to supply the city with a few of the many improvements it needed, and at the same time prevent distress by giving employment to a great many workingmen. There is no doubt that in these times of cheap materials money could be expended with great advantage to the city and with due regard to the right of the taxpayer to receive an honest dollar's worth for his dollar. However, the cheap politician, backed by the cheaper newspaper, has seized on this suggestion to win a sentimental credit for himself among the masses, and what was originally a good idea is becoming one of the very worst forms of-not of charity-but of almsgiving that can be conceived. Having the power, every official concerned in the expenditure seems anxious to spend this million as fast as possible, so as to earn the commendation of the noisy part of the press and the unthinking part of the community before whom they pose as philanthropists. In order apparently to make it impossible that no immediate or permanent good shall result to the city from

the expenditure of this large sum of money, a bill has been introduced into the Assembly to amend the act recently passed appropriating \$1,000,000 for park improvements, so that at least three-quarters of that sum shall be spent for individual labor and not more than \$250,000 for contract work. Any one who stops to think a moment will see at once that as a mere measure of charity the voting of this million dollars was unnecssary; the city is under no restriction as to the amount it shall spend in the relief of its indigent, and the Park Department has always hitherto found means to keep its walks clean and to do the other things that so far it has only been able to do in providing work for the unemployed. The idea that the city can secure some lasting benefits from the employment of this money spent in a period of low prices must be abandoned,the officials through whom these expenditures must necessarily pass, not having either the sense or spirit to see what the occasion offers or requires. This business, however, ought to serve as a warning to people not to expect anything rational from political action whenever occasion gives an opportunity for indulging in mawkish sentiment. A further warning will be found in the thought that a very ugly precedent has been set which may raise the question of the duty of the city to provide for its unemployed in any period of commercial distress and also the question of who are to judge of time for making such a provision, with very many other minor questions involved in these two.

Legislation at Albany.

ALBANY, March 1 .- Governor Flower signed yesterday the "Greater New York Bill," as it has been popularly termed. Previously, upon Tuesday, there had been a conflict over it in the Senate, owing to an effort of Senator Reynolds to incorporate an amendment giving the people of Brooklyn the right to vote upon the question of whether or not they desired that city in case of its consolidation with New York to have the same rate of taxation as the latter. Senator Saxton, the Republican leader, opposed this amendment upon the ground "that of course all parts of Greater New York would have the same rate of Senator Cantor, of New York, while also opposing the bill, made the interesting remark that it did not follow, as Senator Saxton had asserted, that Brooklyn and New York would have the same rate of taxation, and he declared that there were two different rates of taxation in Brooklyn now. To what he referred the writer does not know, but it is worthy of attention that the New York Senators, through Mr. Cantor, declare that New York may impose certain conditions upon Brooklyn and one of these may that the former city shall not assume the financial burdens of the latter, and, therefore, that there may be two differing rates of taxation in the consolidated cities if they are ever united. The Reynolds amendment was rejected, it may be remarked, and the bill passed in the simple form in which it passed in the Assembly.

The law provides that the voters in the metropolitan district of New York and its sister cities and towns shall be provided with ballots at the coming November election, reading "For consolidation," and others reading "Against consolidation." The territory mentioned in the act has a total area of 317 square miles and a population now of nearly 3,000,000. Chicago has 174 square miles of territory: Philadelphia, 120; and London 118, with a population of 4,000,000. The territory referred to in the law is thus described in the law: "The city of New York, Long Island City, the county of Kings, the county of Richmond, the towns of Westchester, Flushing, Newtown and Jamaica, and that portion of the towns of Eastchester and Pelham which lies southerly of a straight line drawn from the point where the northerly line of the city of New York meets the centre line of the Bronx River to the middle of the channel between Hunters and Glen Islands in Long Island Sound, and that part of the town of Hempstead which is westerly of a straight line drawn from the southeasterly point of the town of Flushing, through the middle of the channel between Rockaway Beach and Shelter Island to the Atlantic Ocean."

This provision is in the first section of the bill. The second section declares what the "aye" and "nay" ballots shall mean. It says:

says:

"The ballots cast in each of said election districts, except in the City of New York, shall be deemed and taken as an expression of the voter, as the case may be, in favor of or against the consolidation with the City of New York, of the city, county, village, town or part of a town mentioned in the first section, in which the said district is situated, and the bailots cast upon said proposition or question in the City of New York shall be deemed and taken as an expression of the voter, as the case may be, in favor of or against the consolidation of the territory mentioned in section one of this act under one municipal government."

Governor Flower is beginning to sign the important New York statutes. This week, for instance, besides the Greater New York bill, he has signed Mr. Lawson's bill, appropriating \$200,000 for the completion of the Cathedral Parkway, and also Mr. Lawson's bill, putting the trees upon West End avenue in charge of the Park Department. He furthermore signed Mr. Butts' bill, appropriating \$450,000 for the completion of the Harlem Ship Canal Bridge. Senator Guy's bill, for the creation of a new park in the 12th Ward of New York, and Senator Robertson's bill appropriating \$200,000 for the completion of the building of the American Museum of Natural History. It should be stated that this new park in the 12th Ward will have as its boundaries 145th street, Bradhurst avenue, 155th [street and

Edgecombe avenue. Previously to signing these bills, Governor Flower also had signed the bill appropriating \$1,000,000 to be expended upon the parks, for the rel'ef of the unemployed poor, the bill appropriating \$30,000 yearly for the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children, and the bill declaring that the Harlem River Speedway should have two sidewalks. Governor Flower now has in his hands another important city bill, namely, Assemblyman Lawson's bill appropriating \$750,000 for the completion of the Riverside Park and Driveway.

Mayor Gilroy is opposed to Assemblyman Sheffield's bill appropriating \$600,000 for a new site for the College of the City of New York and yet, notwithstanding his objections, the Assembly this week passed the act. Now it is supposed that Senator Cantor will fight the act in the Senate. The Board of Estimate and Apportionment have sent here a protest against the bill, declaring that public schools ought first to be built.

Assemblyman Sheffield this week intended to bring up his bill for the transferrence of the legal sales of property from 111 Broadway back to 67 Liberty street, but Mr. Thornton, the chairman, was absent on that day and therefore the committee held no meeting.

The Senate passed to-day Mr. Butt's bill in regard to the cancellation of assessments for improvements in New York.

Assemblyman Butts to-day introduced a bill abolishing the present Rapid Transit Commission of New York.

Senator Cantor has introduced a bill exempting public baths in New York City from water rates and taxes.

Assemblyman Lawson presented a bill to-day providing that the civil service laws shall not apply to laborers and that in cities the applications of laborers for work shall be placed on a list, all appointments to be made from such list in their order.

The Assembly passed to-day Mr. Butts' bill providing for the completion of the paving of 3d avenue, and also his bill in relation to the construction of sidewalks and cross-walks; and Mr. Sulzer's bill providing for the government of the New York Botanical Garden.

Senator O'Donnel introduced a bill extending for three years the terms of office of the Board of Electrical Control of New York; and Senator McMahon presented an act prohibiting the construction of an elevated railway upon 14th street, between University place and 7th avenue.

The Senate has passed Senator Sullivan's bill, giving the city authorities power to supervise the opening and grading of streets in building the New York and Long Island Bridge.

Assemblyman Lawson has introduced Senator Coggeshall's bill, increasing the yearly salaries of the New York policemen. Mr. Lawson also has introduced a bill, providing that the doormen and acting doormen of the park police of New York City shall receive \$1,000 per annum.

Assemblyman Marrin has introduced a bill, providing that of the \$1,000,000 appropriated for park improvements three quarters shall be used in the employment of laborers.

THE "LEGAL SALES" CONTEST.

ALBANY, March 2.

The Assembly Judiciary Committee gave hearing yesterday on Sheffield's bill to have the legal auction sales transferred to 59 Liberty street. Arguments in favor of the bill were made by Elihu Root, H. H. Camman, Richard V. Harnett, Mr. Wickersham and Assemblyman Sheffield. Another hearing will be given to the bill on Thursday next, when Assistant Corporation Counsel Blandy says he will appear in opposition to it.

A New Rapid Transit Movement.

THE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE TAKES UP THE PLAN OF CITY OWNER-SHIP AND CONSTRUCTION OF AN UNDERGROUND ROAD AND WILL PUSH IT THROUGH AN ABLE COMMITTEE.

The Chamber of Commerce, on Thursday, resumed the consideration of the report of its special committee on the R. T. Wilson rapid transit proposition. The meeting was very well attended, showing the deep interest taken in the subject by the commercial community. Ex-Mayor Abram S. Hewitt presented as a substitute for the report of the committee approving the Wilson scheme, the following:

"Resolved, That, in the judgment of the Chamber of Commerce of the State of New York, additional rapid transit facilities are so necessary to the growth and prosperity of the city of New York that the use of its credit would be justifiable, in case it is not found possible, after careful investigation and liberal concession in regard to taxation and right of way, to secure the construction of a proper system of rapid transit by private enterprise.

"Resolved, That in case the credit of the city is used, the ownership of the rapid transit system should be vested in the city, but its construction and operation should be intrusted to such responsible corporation now existing, or hereafter to be formed, as may, in addition to the interest on the city bonds, pay the largest annual rental, such excess to be used as a sinking fund to retire the bonds of the city, and when the bonds are so retired the lease to be terminated.

"Resolved, That thereafter the lease should be sold to the highest bidder, upon such terms as may be prescribed by the city authorities, for periods not exceeding thirty years, in the same general manner as the ferries are now sold, with the stipulation that the successful bidder shall purchase from the previous lessee the rolling stock and other personal property at their fair valuation, to be determined by arbitration.

"Resolved. That proper safeguards and conditions ought to be provided by appropriate legislation in reference to the issue of the city bonds and the construction and operation of the rapid transit system, under the general supervision of a board of engineers, so as to secure

economy of cost and adequate accommodations for the public use, and that the committee be continued, with power to add to their number, to confer, to co-operate with the authorities of the city in reference to the general plan of the needed legislation."

These resolutions were seconded by Morris K. Jesup, following which Mr. Hewitt made an interesting and instructive argument in their favor. The sentiment of the Chamber, which on the first reading of Mr. Wilson's proposition a week before was largely in its favor, had manifestly changed in favor of the Hewitt plan, and after some further discussion even Mr. Wilson made a graceful surrender in favor of the Hewitt proposition, of complete ownership in the city. The vote on Mr. Hewitt's substitute was almost unanimously in their favor.

Subsequently the committee, consisting of Alexander E. Orr, J. Edward Simmons, Cornelius N. Bliss, John Harsen Rhoades and John A Stewart, was increased by the addition of Mr. Hewitt and the President of the Chamber, Mr. Chas. S. Smith, and was continued with instructions to confer with the city authorities and to take the necessary steps to procure the legis'ation necessary to put the plan proposed into practical operation.

Mr. Simmons said yesterday that in his estimation the plan was ideally perfect, and if it could be carried out as contemplated by Mr. Hewittit would be the best thing that could possibly be done for the city. Whether it could be so carried out depended altogether upon the strength and heartiness of the support the committee would receive from the public. Selfish interests would be sure to oppose the seheme—that was to be expected—and they must be beaten down. The committee would doubtless meet very soon and formulate a plan of procedure. What that would include he could not foresee.

Mr. Harnett, Chairman of the Real Estate Exchange Committee on Rapid Transit, expressed hearty approval of the position taken by the Chamber of Commerce. It was substantially the same as that taken by the Real Estate Exchange last year. He thought the Real Estate Exchange would take the earliest opportunity to indorse the action of the Chamber of Commerce. It is not necessary to tell the readers of The Record and Guide that the plan proposed by Mr. Hewitt and indorsed by the influential Chamber of Commerce, is the plan which this paper has advocated and urged for two years and more, and which has been generally indorsed by the real estate interests of the city.

Burlington's Showing for 1893.

The showing of earnings and expenses made by the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy, for 1893, has an importance outside of that always pertaining to the results of operations on a great railroad property, inasmuch as it gives one instance of how the railroads are grappling with the difficulties of lessened earnings. The decision of the Board of Directors last Friday, to make no reduction in the rate of dividends, would indicate that earnings for the current fiscal year show no more serious declines than have already been seen, though not much can be based on this, because no board of directors can gauge the future from a situation so perplexing as that in which the trade of this country is now in. It is enough, and the fact should be a source of satisfaction to the holders of Burlington & Quincy, that the dividend is for the present to be maintained at the comparatively high rate of five per cent 'per annum. It stands to reason that such a result, considering the condition of business for the whole of last year could have been obtained only by the most rigid economy, and the question will consequently arise whether expenses can continue to be reduced so that stockholders need not suffer loss of income if business does not improve. The monthly reports made by this company show something more than the results on Burlington & Quincy proper, as they include also the earnings on certain controlled properties; but the general results apply to the condition of Burl:ngton & Quincy pretty accurately, because about four-fifths of the several amounts mentioned in those monthly reports relate directly to it. As the Chicago roads benefited so much from the World's Fair in July, August and September of last year, in order to know actually what have been the conditions of business with the Fair left out it is necessary to look at the results for the last three months by themselves. The figures for last year and for the last three months of the year compared with similar preceding periods are as follows.

The fact that operating expenses were reduced from 69,68 per cent in 1892 to 63.91 per cent in 1893 would be very satisfactory except for the additional fact that the whole and more of that reduction was made in the last three months of the year when the percentage of operating cost was reduced to 55.14. A low rate of operating expenses seems usual to these three menths of the year, judging by the figures for 1892 ss well as those for 1893. It will be seen that while in 1892 the operating cost for the whole year was 69.68 per cent of gross earnings, in the last three months it was only 60.39 per cent. Still 55.14 is an unusually low rate for operating a great railroad system in these times, and suggests that if the economies have not been too excessive they have been very rigid indeed. As a result, net earnings, though showing a falling off for the whole year, increased in the last three months of last year. To pay 5 per cent on the Burlington stock for 1893 requires an amount in the near neighborhood of \$4,000,000. It is, therefore, easy to see payment must create a deficiency for the year, and even taking into account the income which will be received from investments, etc., not included in the monthly reports, it is highly probable that unless business improves considerably before the time comes for declaring the next dividend the rate must be reduced. This is supported by the policy of the Burlington management in the past. People who are familiar with the history of Burlington will remember that a 5 per cent dividend was maintained all through 1890, resulting in a deficiency; and that in the following year only 4½ per cent was paid, rising again to 5 per cent, at which rate it was maintained for the next two years, in each of which a large surplus was made. The surplus is not available for dividends having been put into the property.

The Greater New York.

THE CONSOLIDATION QUESTION NOW BEFORE THE PEOPLE IN PRACTICAL FORM.

At last the consolidation question is before the people. The Senate at Albany, on Tuesday, passed the commission bill as it came from the House, shorn of the amendments which Senator Reynolds procured in committee, with only two votes against it, those of Senators Bradley and Reynolds. On Wednesday Governor Flower signed the bill and thus it becomes a law. The amendments sought to be imposed by the Brooklyn senators went beyond the purpose of the present measure and as such have generally been considered premature. The votes of these senators against the measure in its final shape, it is certain, do not express the sentiments of the people of Brooklyn.

In framing the present act it was the desire and purpose of the present commission to obtain only an expression of the general wishes of the people of the several communities involved on the main question: "Do you wish to form a consolidated municipal government?" The commission purposely omitted from the question all reference to the conditions and details of the contract of consolidation. These they reserved for consideration and action after the main question should have been decided. The amendment of the Brooklyn senators intruded one of the main points in these conditions and shifted the question from the general form to the special one: "On what terms do you want to form a consolidated municipality?" The commission was perfectly right in reserving the details of the compact for more deliberate consideration after it shall have ascertained whether the people are favorable to the general proposition.

Although the question will not be voted on until the general election in November, it will naturally be the subject of extended discussion between now and then. Much has already been said about it, but there is a widespread misunderstanding of the purport of the present law; some of the people, as has been noted from their utterances, having the impression that by the enactment of the law the consolidation is an accomplished fact. For the purpose of starting right, THE RECORD AND GUIDE will restate the proposition: The act requires that at the next general election the voters of New York; Brooklyn and all the towns and cities embraced in Kings County; Staten Island; part of Queens County, embracing the towns of Newtown, Flushing and Jamaica and part of Hempstead, taking in Rockaway Beach, Far Rockaway, Isle of Wight, Ocean Point and Hinsdale; and part of Westchester County, embracing the town of Westchester and enough of Eastchester and Pelham to take in Woodlawn, Pelham Bay Park and Hunter's Island, shall be given an opportunity to vote "for" or "against" consolidation.

In THE RECORD AND GUIDE of January 27th the areas and population of each of these communities was stated as follows:

The present population of this area, estimated by adding to the figures quoted the yearly additions since their last enumeration and allowing only the rate of increase shown during the decade from 1880 to 1890, would be 203,660 more, or 3,169,452. This would make the city the largest in area and the second largest in population among the cities of the world.

The election officers are to provide separate ballots for the next election, one set to read "For Consolidation," the other "Against Consolidation," and every voter will be supplied with one of each. He may vote or not, as he chooses. If the vote shall result in favor of consolidation, as seems to be the prevailing opinion, then the Consolidation Commission, of which Mr. Andrew H. Green, of New York, is the President, will formulate and present to the Legislature a bill expressing the terms and conditions upon which the consolidation shall take place. Necessarily there will be a good deal of argument over these terms, and it is still a question whether the Commission will hold public meetings for the purpose, or will trame a bill and submit it to the Legislature and allow the general argument and discussion to take place at Albany, where there will be sure to be a

repetition of all that would take place before the Commission

Please decide the following for me: In an exchange of properties, A (who owns a certain piece of property), after some negotiations. says to B (the broker in the transaction), if you will get C (the owner of the other piece of property) to pay me "so much" cash and leave "so much" on mortgage, I will make the trade and pay you "so much commission." B then asks A to put that proposition in writing, which A refuses to do, saying, "my word holds good" and something else to the effect that he would stand by what he said. Whereupon B induces C to do exactly as A desires, and furthermore, that same day, B brings A and C together, with a contract setting forth A's proposition and C's acceptance of same, whereupon'A, who has meanwhile received an offer of another piece of property from another broker, shows signs of "backing out." Seeing this new turn of affairs, B (the broker) turns to A and, in the presence of C, puts the question, "Did you not say to me that if C would do 'so and so' (stating the terms laid down by A) you would make the trade?" whereupon A answers "Yes." In the event of A "backing out," is B (the broker) entitled to his commission from A, especially since C is willing to pay him (B) his side of the commission? A SUBSCRIBER.

Answer.—Yes; B is entitled to his commission from A, whether A

backs out or not. And we think your case comes within the rule which permits a broker to receive commissions from both sides. LAW EDITOR.

Real Estate Market.

There is little in the condition of the real estate market this week to justify special comment. The auction sales have been better attended and have shown rather more life than usual, a sign, possibly, of reviving interest in the offerings of the auction market. The effort to set aside the sale of the Hotel de Logerot property has been the subject of much discussion, and the action of the application will be awaited with interest. The feeling is almost universal that a decision ordering a resale would, under the circumstances, seriously injure the market—that it would make titles derived through auction-sales unreliable. House buying has begun for the spring season, and may reasonably be expected to steadily improve until May. But in general business and investment properties, the attitude of the market is that of waiting to see what Congress does with the tariff legislation. The delay of the national legislature in the settlement of that question has already deprived two commercial seasons of their life, and will doubtless paralyze the spring trade also-for the season is already far advanced. The delay and doubt about the final outcome of the question are worse in the present emergency than any decision upon the pending measure could possibly be.

Permit me to thoroughly indorse your editorial note in last week' paper in relation to the proposed Willis avenue bridge.

For four years the people of the great North Side, embracing in territory one-half of the area of the City of New York, have endeavored to secure this great public improvement. During the whole of this period we have met with the increasing opposition of Tammany Hall.

Two powerful organizations have been formed, the one, "The Willis Avenue Bridge Association" of the North Side, numbering nearly 500 members; the other, "The First Avenue Bridge Association," with headquarters in Harlem, and with an equally large membership.

The present bill is a most unsatisfactory one. It provides for the commencement of construction in four years, and completion in eight

REVIEW AND RECORD.

BROOKLYN, MARCH 3, 1894.

Brooklyn, a City of Homes.

BROOKLYN is in the dawn of another era of prosperity. She has conquered the ills and enemies that for so long a time afflicted her, and has put them under her feet. From having been the most scorned of the sisterhood of great cities she is now the envied of all, the accepted example for their emulation. What she has done in the four short months to redeem herself, to recover the reins of authority from the venal crew who had her in their power, and later to humiliate and punish the principal malefactors, has placed her upon the pinnacle of fame among her contemporaries. They are making ready to follow her example. They may succeed in doing as well as she, but they can do

But Brooklyn having regained her estate finds that there is much to do to restore it to its former strength and beauty. spoilers, while they had the power, made waste where even it brought them no gain. Like miscreant tenants, without hope of further possession, and without sense of responsibility for their crimes, they converted everything moveable and salable to their own use and made no effort to keep up the main property. they could not steal the hills or the parks or the sublime views, nor could they make waste of her contiguity to the Metropolis-the greatest hive of industry on this continent. They could not rob her of her miles of commercial water-front, nor of her near proximity to the ocean beaches, nor of her capacity for growth and expansion. These are the permanent plants that can never be taken from her nor diminished. The rest was transient wealth, and it can be restored.

The natural endowment of this city is not exceeded by any other in the country. Founded by the overflow from New York City, she is but a natural expansion of the Metropolis and in every essential particular part and parcel of it. The distinction between the two cities-that of different names and separate governments-is unnatural. The city lies fair on the westerly end of Long Island, her boundaries washed by the waves of the Atlantic and its estuaries. These give her everlasting assurance of healthful and salubrious airs, tempering the rigidity of the northern winters and the heat of their summers. It is nearly always between ten and twenty degrees cooler in Brooklyn in summer than it is in New York. The formation is of drift, piled in scattered hills, and in its native state thickly clothed with timber. It is easily worked, affords good foundation for structural work and nearly always contains stone enough in the excavations to supply the foundation courses of all sorts of buildings. It also affords excellent drainage, building sand in quantity sufficient for all purposes, and cobble-stones for its original

Everything not upon the ground required for building purposes can be as cheaply procured in Brooklyn, also, as it can in New York, for one market is open to both of them on equal terms. Labor, if anything, is cheaper, some branches of the building trades working nine hours in Brooklyn against eight in New York, with no difference in daily wages. These are facts which explain in large measure the recent observation of an architect of large experience-that a dwelling of any kind can be built about ten per cent cheaper in Brooklyn than it would cost in New York. In the general expenses of living there is probably no difference between the two cities. The large grocery and dry-goods stores in New York deliver their wares as freely and promptly in Brooklyn as they do in their own city. Of theatres, concert halls, lecture courses, libraries, churches and clubs this city is also quite as well equipped as the Metropolis, and though we have to go to New York for grand opera the necessity is so rare that it heightens the enjoyment of the occasion rather than otherwise. In all other respects Brooklyn enjoys equal and in some cases superior advantages to the Metropolis.

One of these advantages is that the citizen of Brooklyn is really a citizen of both cities, and by so much more cosmopolitan than the dweller on Manhattan Island, for the Brooklynite goes frequently to New York and spends much of his waking hours there, either in business or pleasure, while the New Yorker seldom has occasion to visit Brooklyn, unless it is to attend a funeral (for we have the most delightful and popular cemetery in the world, except Pere la Chaise), or to take a train for the ocean beaches or the summer resorts in her suburbs. Another is that in the outing season the Brooklynite is always nearer to the beaches and to the water highways, where recreation is found; and if he wants a ride or drive a few minutes takes him to the best of country roads, while in Prospect Park

he can enjoy all the delights of riding, driving, cycling, walking, lounging or boating that are assured the New Yorker in his Central Park.

Another advantage, and one that places Brooklyn superior to the upper half of Manhattan Island, is that the entire city is within easier and quicker accessibility from the business district of the Metropolis than any part of Manhattan Island north of the northern boundary of Central Park, and most of it than the section north of 59th street. A resident of Brooklyn in business in New York anywhere below Canal and east of Greenwich street, will have less difficulty and lose less time in going to and from his place of employment, than the resident above 85th street on Manhattan Island. These are the facts which give Brooklyn the natural advantage over the upper sections of New York, and which account in largest measure for her more rapid growth in recent years. But if this were all, and if there were no great difference in the cost of homes in the two cities, Brooklyn would doubtless still have been a dubious village, comparatively, and the mass of her population would be living on Man-

It is in this enormous and inexplicable difference in the market values of real estate in the two cities that Brooklyn's chief advantage over the Metropolis as a place of residence for people employed down town in New York, consists. For with the great mass of the people who daily swarm into and out of the great hives of industry in the lower part of New York, the natural superiorities of Brooklyn would have little weight, if the matter of expense did not lie in the balance with them. Independent homes on Manhattan Island are already beyond the reach of any but the wealthy, and are yearly becoming more expensive. For many years the building of flats, family hotels and tenement houses has been rapidly on the increase, until now over half the population of the Metropolis is living in buildings containing seven or more families, and less than an eighth is living in singlefamily dwellings. Brooklyn contains 5,000 more single-family dwellings, though she has only 180,000 families, while New York has 320,000. The reason for this is that land is cheaper, so much cheaper, in Brooklyn, that a residence property can be purchased outright in Brooklyn, for what would pay only two years' rent of it in many parts of New York. The man who pays \$60 a month rent for a seven-room flat in New York, could, if he would, buy a two-story and basement brownstone house, well built, in Brooklyn, for the same money. And for a less or greater outlay a relatively advantageous purchase could be made.

Upon this important fact is the prospect for a new era of prosperity for Brooklyn founded. It means much for the city, but it means more for the individual. It means for the city a continuance through the near future of the phenomenal growth which has characterized the last decade, and it means an increase in proportion in the taxable wealth of the city. To the individual, however, it means, first, a home with all the advantages of residence in New York at from a tenth to a fifth of the original cost, and, second, a vastly larger annual increase in the value of his property and, consequently, a larger income upon his investment. It only requires the widespread promulgation of these facts to lead to a vast increase in the number of permanent residents and house-owners in Brooklyn. If beyond all this the consolidation movement should result in the removal of the artificial barriers between the two cities within the ensuing two or three years, then the last obstacle to a great future for Brooklyn would

It is not too much to predict for Brooklyn that the advent of another century will find her built up nearly solidly to Fort Hamilton and to Jamaica Bay, with transit facilities that will reach without a break from both those points to the Brooklyn Bridge -and thus to the centre of New York's business district. Matters are now at bed-rock for the city. Through many mutations she has settled down from every speculative level to the basis of solid substance and abiding values, and in our opinion any one now buying property in Brooklyn needs only to hold it a year or two to realize a handsome profit upon his investment, and in the meantime a reasonable income from the rent or use of the property. More and more as the years roll on New Yorkers who want to live in homes of their own will have to turn towards Brooklyn for them. It is the destiny of New York to grow vertically-her individual dwellings will give way to houses of many parterres. Brooklyn is bound by no such necessity. Her borders are wide enough for four times as many people as she now contains without such crowding. These are facts upon which the home-seeker and investor may depend.

BUILDING MATERIAL MARKET

NEW YORK.

There has been a slight change the market for Common Hards, inasmuch as rather more business was done indicating that some conmore business was done indicating that some consumption is going on. Where the best of combination controlled stock was taken full top rate had to be paid, but buyers showed a preference for under grade stock, outside lots, etc., and of course expected and obtained comparatively easy rates. A cargo of Staten Islands waiting here for quite a while has finally been worked off, some Jerseys came along and were disposed of, but no arrivals were reported from the Hudson River. In a general way operators did not appear to be in a particularly cheerful mood. They are naturally hopeful that as the weather becomes more open and better suited to out-door work consumption will increase, but the position of builders is yet too undetermined to form any definite conclusion. Meanwhile manufacturers continue straightening out their plans for the new season in the matter of form and extent of credits, the volume of production, etc., yet as they incline to take most action in secret sesion, it is not known exactly what conclusions have been arrived at, and arrangements made. The manufacturers of Fronts talk as though expecting very fair trade.

LATH .-- The market at the moment is only worth passing notice. Merely a small quantity of stock was available during the week and there has been no opportunity to test values, but receivers have reason to believe that at least old rates could be made, or say \$2.10\tilde{a}2.15, and possibly more. A number of local dealers, it is claimed, are short on supplies and it is believed that some out of town custom could be secured were there any stock to tender. tender

LIME.—Since the lately noted decline to 85c. for common and \$1 for finishing, there has been no further change in cost. Arrivals have been moderate, but quite up to the needs of the market, and the condition of business is slow and uneventful at the moment. Production is understood to be under control and shipments likely to be slow until the market really needs, more stock.

LUMBER.-About the best that can be said of the local lumber market in comparison with one the local lumber market in comparison with one week ago is that it is no worse. Distribution continues moderate and uncertain because of weather influences serving as a check upon building operations, and also the extreme caution of manufacturers who feel unwilling to go into production except upon basis of actual orders, and call for supplies accordingly. Prospectively there is talk about the filing of plans for buildings, the contemplated public improvements, including dock-

age, and there are even some people of strongly confiding nature who will still venture to suggest the possibility of a perfected rapid transit scheme, all of which upon consummation must help the lumber trade. But until something takes really tangible form in the way of positive operations dealers are not willing to buy lumber and carry it on the chance of getting custom later on, for even filing plans for buildings does not mean actual work, especially should the cred't line with contractors be drawn as taut as calculated this season. Even with the slowness of trade the already moderate local accumulations becomes more attenuated, which will of course hurry the demand when it does start up, and the start will come just as soon as dealers can discover the least real opportunity for catching custom among actual consumers. We do not believe there is a buyer who can pay for supplies who is holding off because he thinks cost of any of the standard grades too high, or who expects to obtain concessions through the adoption of such course, and the same remarks will apply to builders and manufacturers as well. The faults of trade are to be found in unusual economical consumption and uncertainties regarding financial legislation curtailing the circle of operations to the compass of most imperative necessity, and as advised in our last the settlement of the labor question upon a basis for the season must be reached to insure the starting up business in the structural line.

In the general conditions of trade now prevailing there is so mucn similarity of feature for the various grades of stock that detailed reports afford nothing of special interest. Eastern Spruce secures only occasional and really unimportant special orders, and the mills, according to latest report, were making no preparations to start up, especially as some of them had been getting returns on lumber sold in this market at a loss. Heavy snows have interfered with logging. State Spruce remains firm, and a larger quantity of 13-foot stock could be place

GENERAL LUMBER NOTES.

THE WEST.

Distribution from wholesale stocks has been going on all winter in a moderate way, but results, as expressed in figures, have been much less than for a corresponding period last year. As has been before set forth, the demand thus far this year, for all classes of mill product, has been strictly confined to the consumptive requirement. There has been little provision for the future. A few contracts for legs and lumber to be sawed have been made, but the amount of product thus transferred has been much less than last year at a like time.

Lumber carried over at the mills is still mostly in the hands of the mill operators. Slight interest in it has as yet been expressed by the dealers or consumers. Bulk stocks at Northern mills are being held at prices higher than dealers think is warranted by the present state of trade or the prospects for demand. It seems evident that there can be no early revival of interest in the pine lumber carried over from last season at the mills. There must be a waiting until consumption and distribution of yard stocks have become so voluminous and urgent as to call for new supplies from the mills. How long it will be before that state of things shall appear will depend on the activity of trade from this time onward. Last year at a like time yard dealers were more anxious to secure future supplies than to get rid of what they had on hand, which they considered as good as sold. Now the state of affairs is diametrically opposite.

The dealers are indifferent to further supplies, and are busy in the effort to work off lumber on hand. Besides they are selling at easy prices, which evinces no fear that they will not be able to replace their lumber at equally easy figures. Looking at the situation as a whole, it would be a stufification of good judgment to express the possibility that the market will be anything but weak during the succeeding three months. It is true that socks in the hands of retailers and consumers are low, but supplies in wholesale yards are equal to any emergency of the spring trade, and there are yet large blocks of unsold lumber at mill points. The log input, though somewhat restricted in lower Michigan, and probably in the Menominee district and in the Wisconsin valley, is generally rolling up a good average in the field at large, under favorable weather conditions. The mills will go to work on these logs by May 1, and thereafter new product will be a f

The Lumberman, Saginaw, correspondent says:
"The general situation in lumbering circles on
this river is practically unchanged. There is a
little more inquiry for lumber and a slight increase
in the movement by rail, but with 300,000,000
feet of unsold lumber on hand reported by manufacturers and a large quantity of unsold stock in

the hands of yard dealers, the sales make a small inroad, and besides there is a large sum of money tied up in lumber which the owners would like to have put in circulation."

There is activity in the poplar trade throughout the producing region. Recent tides in all the principal streams have brought down quantities of logs to mills, nearly all of which have started up. So far the supply of logs is not large, but there is considerable snow in the mountains and prospects are that future tides will bring out practically all of the logs hung up last season as well as those put in during the winter. Even then the season's supply will be short of the average, and with a normal demand for lumber dry stock will be scarce before the end of the year.

So far conditions are very satisfactory to the mill man, but when it comes to the distributing end of the market—well, that's another story. Prices were a little firmer the latter part of January, and some increase in the inquiry was noted. but the last two weeks demand has dropped of again, and in some quarters a disposition to cut prices is evident. With the mills starting up and a sluggish movement of lumber this is perhaps only natural, but the seller at a cut price now is likely to find himself without dry lumber when trade and prices begin to improve.

The Mississippi Valley Lumberman has the following logging information: From every logging camp in the vicinity of Menominee, Mich., comes word of big work being done and it is safe to estimate that over one-half the present winter's intended log cut is now at the landing. The freezing nights of the past two weeks have enabled the loggers to make excellent ice roads where needed. The logging season of the St. Croix and its tributaries will soon be at a close. A correspondent interviewed a large number of loggers yesterday on the cut, and nearly all of them believe that the cut this season will be nearly up to that of last year. True, some of the larger concerns have not cut so much this season as last, but the deficien
