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MERCHANTS in several lines, particularly in dry-goods, have been agreeably surprised by the contents of their mail in the past week. Many of them who expected, if anything, cancellations of orders already given as a result of the prevailing railroad troubles, found instead an encouraging number of new orders. In the iron trades wage-scale settlements have been achieved without either the strikes or the lockouts that had been threatened, and those trades are so much benefited. Blast furnaces are producing more pig, while the stocks on hand show a tendency to decrease. Railroad managers are to be congratulated on the results of the strike, not, be it understood, because of anything they did to end it, but because an inevitable struggle has been closed on terms so much to their advantage, and it has been proved for them that they can manage their own business without dictation from the Unions; the latter have also doubtless learned that it takes two to make any kind of a bargain. The combination of railroad employes that has just been broken cannot be put together again for some years to come, and meantime it is to be sincerely hoped that both sides will have found a more sane way of arriving at what should from time to time be due from one another. The stock market has taken both good and bad news very coolly. Manipulation keeps the Industrials in the front, but the public is in too critical and cautious a temper to accept such kind of bait. Besides the investment issues in this class do not move with the speculative. Cordage common goes up while the 6 per cent bonds go down to a 7¹₂ per cent basis. Similar movements are to be detected elsewhere. The securities which show such discrepancies are just objects of suspicion. Probably the wisest buying is found in the stocks and bonds of railroads which have seen their worst and have had not only the water but also a good deal of the substance squeezed out of them. This statement is borne out by the strength of the speculative bond list. The outlook is encouraging even though the signs of improvement be

SIR WILLIAM HARCOURT in presenting his budget showed that the fall in the prices of articles used in brewing in ten years had been something like 30 to 40 per cent, while the retail price for beer had remained unchanged. The brewers paid income tax on profits of about \$31,500,000 in 1884-85, and lately on about \$50,500,000 of profits. This was a very effective argument for securing from the beer interests larger contributions to the public revenues. Prices of commodities in Great Britain continue to fall, the average on July 1st reaching the lowest limit yet known. Capital applications for the first half of the year were 20 per cent better than they were in the same time in 1893. The number of failures were 6,118 for the half year against 5,837 for the corresponding period of last year. Drinking champagne may seem a peculiar result of hard times, yet it is apparently what France experienced. Recent figures, covering the period since the Baring failure, showed that the exports of champagne dropped from 21,699,000 bottles in 1890 to 17,359,000 bottles in 1893, while the home consumption in the same time increased from 4,077,000 to 4,876,000 bottles, so that 800,000 more bottles were consumed in France in the bad year of 1893 than in the good one of 1890, while foreigners drank very much less. Austria-H ngary proceeds with much deliberation in carrying out the agreed currency reform. It has been decided that the obligation of the public to receive the one florin notes shall cease on January 1, 1895; the public offices will take them for six months longer. In the meantime, government, post and banking offices will hold back the notes coming to them and replace them with silver coins. The latest date for their redemption will be December 31, 1899, so that the new century will see this reform practically only begun. Reports of the rye crop of the dual empire are very unfavorable. Prices are firm in all the European security markets, and there are indications that money will soon begin to flow away from London, where it has been accumulating at such a rapid rate for some time past, which will mean that there is growing up a new use for it.

The Business Depression and the Eastward Movement.

HISTORY, of course, always has the advantage of hind-sight, and by and by when History comes to review the events of the last eighteen months certainly it will comment upon the fact that the popular estimation of the financial depression that commenced in 1893 was from the very first remarkably insufficient. One has only to recall the judgments upon the situation delivered from day to day during the last year by commercial men, even those well informed, or turn to those diurnal newspaper effusions that dealt with Wall street affairs and the conditions of the different mercantile markets, to be im_p ressed strongly with the fact that the people of this country have had all along a very inadequate conception of the nature and the extent of the crisis through which they are still passing.

People have persisted in regarding the depression as the effect of a sudden, violent and arbitary cause. In the beginning of trouble it was supposed that the nation had unexpectedly but avoidably slipped upon its silver policy. "Repeal the Sherman act" was the cry last summer, and "that done," said everybody, "the nation will speedily resume its hale and prosperous condition." Unquestionably this was the popular diagnosis. The Sherman act was repealed, but, as we all appreciate, contrary to prophecy prosperity did not return. Indeed, far from it. Business in the Fall of 1893 was in many respects more discouraging than it had been in the summer. The industrial machinery of the country was rather slackened than accelerated in pace, and as month after month went by without bringing in any improvement, people relinquished those glowing expectations which they had attached to the repeal of the silver purchasing act. A revision of judgment was necessary. Clinging still to the notion that the depression was the result of some single accidental disturbance, it was declared that the tariff agitation was really the effective cause of the prolonged commercial stagnation. This idea has been disseminated so volubly that it is now accepted without objection, even by those who at first opposed it for political reasons. A few persons, perhaps, hold that the evil that the Sherman act did lives after it, but the majority, beyond doubt, are of the opinion that but for the Tariff revision in Washington something approaching a normal condition of business would have been restored ere

The disturbers at the Capitol of the economic peace of their country are now, in all probability, nearing the end of their riotous proceedings, and it will be interesting to witness whether popular expectations of a commercial revival will follow the settlement of the tariff controversy. We believe there will be a large measure of disappointment for the country, not because it was not a wise step to repeal the Sherman act nor because it will not be positively beneficial to end for a time the wearisome and selfish bickering about the tariff, but because, in our opinion, the mercantile inactivity of the last year is not primarily the consequence of crude experiments with silver or political wrangling over schedules of duties. Silver and the tariff undoubtedly have played their part in producing bad times; but they were at most what the doctors term "contributory" causes; they were not the efficient causes. For the latter we must look elsewhere.

That a nation advances through a series of impulses is a trite observation. The example of the pendulum as an illustration of the course of all human affairs is so old that it can be used only with a strong prayer to the reader for indulgence. Nevertheless nothing is more certain than the fact that a people do move along their career not in an unbroken steady progression, but in a succession of advances, each step forward being followed by retrogression as the force of each impulse is expended. The swaying of a pendulum does represent the character of the movement, with this important difference: the pendulum returns to its original starting point, whereas in the oscillation of human affairs the initial position is not again resumed. This vibratory action is observable in all the activities of mankind, but it seems to be particularly marked in the mercantile affairs of nations. Favorable conditions arrive to promote the industrial activity of a people. The forward movement at first is comparatively slow; it gathers force, enterprise creates enterprise, expansion is accelerated, each success achieved leads to larger enterprises, manufacturers enlarge their works, increase their machinery and the number of hands they employ, wages advance, storekeepers branch out, debts increase, all calculations are made on an enlarged scale. Society from high to low moves to a more and more extravagant measure, expansion is the order of the time-the entire commercial world orders its affairs as though continuous indefinite progression was possible. All this would go very well if expan-

sion could be carried on indefinitely. The trouble is it cannot, or rather it cannot at the high pace which prosperity soon promotes. People outrun themselver, outrun the circumstances of their condition, outrun the limit of the impulse that set them going. It is a common experience how strong the tendency in business is for prosperity to cause people to outrun the market. A firm has a demand for its goods that presses hard upon its productive capacity. It increases its machinery and its working force, seeks new customers, carries its enterprise into new fields. Additional enlargements seem to promise even greater returns. They are made and perhaps still others. The success of yesterday appears to promise and usually is taken to promise greater success to-morrow. It is easy to see, however, that each step forward is a step toward danger particularly as, despite the closest calculation, each step is necessarily more or less a step in the dark. For this reason: A firm may-though not many do it-take a conservative view of its own condition, but all its calculations must be more or less based upon the calculations which others make with whom it deals. At last our supposititious firm reaches the limit of expansion, usually to find that the limit is a point untenable for long. It can be touched, but it cannot be held. Retrenchment is necessary. A single firm in this position may save itself without great loss. Slow readjustment is possible. But the case is not so easily treated when the entire community is in the same condition. A part of the commercial fabric has been built out too far beyond the foundations. To change our metaphor and return to the pendulum, the backward movement must perforce be commenced and the return is usually so fast that readjustment is necessarily violent. This tendency of commercial enterprise to outrun the warrant of conditions is perhaps deplorable, but apparently it is unavoidable, for it springs from human nature, and from the fact that even if men would calculate wisely there is no method at present known by which they can measure their efforts with the general condition and discover whether they are or are not moving too fast.

So, to return. In our judgment, not Silver nor the Tariff is the fundamental cause of the present depression but the fact that this country has for a time outrun itself; consequently the final disposition of the Wilson bill will not bring about an immediate rapid improvement of business any more surely than the repeal of the Sherman act did. Improvement, indeed, will be a slow process. The commerce of the country must get back again to solid foundations. Economy, retrenchment, are in our present condition the only effective instrumentalities for creating better times again. A year or two, perhaps longer, will be needed for the process. Then we shall feel once more the pressure to move forward. Expansion will begin, slow at first, but as each tentative extension of enterprise succeeds it will be followed by others until business is again moving rapidly, sooner or later, as the circumstances may be, to outrun itself as in the past. All talk, to-day, of a sudden revival of business, of a quick resumption of activity in the fall is ignorant or malicious. Rigid retrenchment must precede expansion.

Retrenchment, however, will probably be less painful and destructive in the East than in the West. The expansion of the last few years like the course of Empire was, we all know, to a marked degree, Westward. The country has been pushing its commercial boundaries towards the setting sun. Capital, factories, population have for years been moving Westward and now, as many facts indicate, the inevitable retrenchment will be accompanied by a reverse movement, Eastward. It is easy to see that the last steps taken must be the first to be retraced. The return has commenced. Population has been retreating East rapidly since last year. Middle State cities have a great many immigrants from the far West. Factory hands are pressing into the older centres. Even in the real estate business here in New York there are new comers who several years ago were carried Westward by the expansion from the metropolis. For some little time to come New York and other big Eastern cities are certain to receive considerable accessions of population from the West. The activity of the nation will be more concentrated than it has been of late, and in this way the older centres will obtain an offset to the losses of bad times. It is a common remark that the East is not suffering anything like as much as the West is. Neither will it. But even beyond New York, Eastward the movement will be. Already we see immigration from Europe has fallen to small proportions and emigration thither has increased so greatly that it is equal to the immigration. The long cabin passenger lists reported recently by all the great steamers sailing to Europe is, in part, a part of this movement, and in part, too, the large exports of gold that have been made in the last year are undoubtedly due to the same Eastward trend (or pressure inward upon the old centres) of population and capital.

SECTIONAL feeling in the West is very strong, judging from a number of letters, published to a number of letters published by The Review of Reviews, though based on very little that is rational or reasonable. These communications are intended to account for populism and other

forms of trans-Mississippi discontent, and, though written by a number of well-known Western men of standing and position, taken as a whole, are no more impressive or logical than explanations which attribute all one's misfortunes and errors to the conduct of one's neighbors usually are. With one exception they are all full of abuse of the money power of the East, and while professing for the Westerner every intention to be honest, do not seem to understand that while he clamors for his cheaper dollar with which to pay his debts, those professions go for nothing. With the same exception these writers overlook all the trouble and distress that is present in the East, probably because the outcry is less from the Eastern than from the Western States, or perhaps because, as some Western men have put it, the East is more used to distress than the West, and therefore less entitled to sympathy. The one exception noted comes from Topeka and is encouraging, as it shows that there are men in the West who can take an honest and comprehensive view of the situation. The writer of this letter finds the true causes of Western distress in the rapid occupation of free land, overproduction and over-speculation. He sees, too, that the West has hardly as much cause of complaint as the East, but that it takes a less sensible view of the situation. He thinks, too, that populism, being the outcome of purely temporary conditions, will disappear when these conditions are removed. If such reasonable views as these were more prevalent and had more influence in the West the whole country would be benefited.

The Half Year's Record.

THE following tabulated statement of the recorded transactions of the first six months of 1894 tells its own story. Compared with the first half of the two preceding years a great falling off is shown in the number of conveyances as well as in the average value of the parcels transferred. The deeds filed from January 1 to June 30 were nearly 1,200 less than those recorded during the same period in either 1892 or 1893; a reduction little short of one-seventh. The record of the second quarter indicates that less activity has prevailed than during the first three months and the lower aggregate consideration paid for the property conveyed since April 1 bears silent but expressive testimony regarding the general lowering of values that has taken place. In 1892 the deeds filed in the first six months numbered 8,070 including 2,471 in which considerations of nominal sums were expressed. The average amount of consideration was \$16,746. In 1893 the average was \$18,623 inclusive of 2,845 instruments containing nominal considerations. This year the average price paid was only \$13,130. A greater number of deeds containing nominal considerations were filed, however, there being 3,032 out of a total of 6,874. The summary of the transactions in the 23d and 24th Wards is fairly satisfactory in number at least, but shows the same reduced average consideration paid as property in the older sections.

The statistics of mortgage loans are hardly less instructive. The average amount of all loans advanced in the first half of 1892 was \$12,080, in 1893 it was \$13,331 and \$11,999 in 1894. The number of mortgages this year at 5 per cent or less compares favorably with those advanced at the same rates of inter-

est during the past two years, and were it not for the lower average shown that fact would be an indication of stability of values from a loaner's standpoint. As it is the mortgage table discloses nothing particularly discouraging, but at the same time it does not indicate any particular strength.

The building record is far from satisfactory. The table for the six months of 1894 shows a falling off of more than onesixth in the number of new buildings planned when compared with the record of last year, and more than one-fourth when subjected to a comparison with the figures for 1892. The estimates of cost for the various buildings projected average very little less than the approximate cost given for those of 1892, but are considerably less than the average of those of 1893. Still,

the estimated cost of proposed new buildings is so seldom to be relied upon that the figures in their entirety are usually unworthy of serious consideration. One section of the city only has attracted increased attention from builders. It is the one bounded by 110th and 125th streets, 5th and 8th avenues, which was formerly ignored while the district west of it was selected as preferable for improvement by many of the speculative builders.

The Elm Street Improvement

Corporation Counsel Clark is at last going forward with that Elm street widening and extension undertaking. During last week he had the preliminary maps and orders and other proceedings thus far taken critically gone over, to detect, if possible, any errors that may have crept into them. He admits that he expects a hard contest over the proceedings in the courts, and is taking special precautions against being tripped up on technical points. For a time he was disposed to yield to the ignorant clamor of a portion of the daily press against this improvement, assuming that there was not in fact any real public demand for it. But now, unless something unforeseen happens, he will in a few days advertise the required notice of his intention to apply to the Supreme Court for the appointment of Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment. When they shall have been appointed and have taken their oaths of office, the city will be empowered, under the new law, to take immediate possession of the property and go ahead with the improvement, leaving the question of awards to abide the findings of the commissioners and the decision of the courts.

In this Elm street improvement matter I have heard the opinion expressed that in their desire to make out a strong case for damages against the city the protesting property-owners have slightly overreached themselves. All of them are agreed upon the desirability of the undertaking, and there isn't one of them who doesn't know (and privately admit) that he is more likely to get more than less than the real value of his property if taken by the city under the extraor-dinary powers of the new law. They consent with pleasure to the argument that the authorities are likely to take into consideration the peremptory taking of their properties as a circumstance in aggravation of damages, and to deal with them more liberally in the matter of awards because of that fact than they would otherwise do. But they have been humored in their fears of insufficient awards by the hysterical attacks of a sensational press, and had carried their protests against the improvement so far that the Corporation Counsel was on the point of abandoning it entirely. A committee of these owners called upon John T. Williams, one of the largest owners on the line of Elm street, and asked his co-operation in their opposition. But he declined to enter the opposition, expressing bimself in favor of the improvement (as they did likewise in the end), and confident that whatever steps were taken by the city authorities, he could rely upon a fair award for the property taken. This seemed to impress the committee and open opposition to the improvement ceased from that time.

Changes in the Tax Numbers.

Owners of property between 14th and 40th streets will observe that their tax notices contain two numbers, an old and a new one. The explanation of this is that under 542 of the Laws of 1892 the city is required to prepare a new set of maps adopting the same numbers as exist on the land map adopted for recording deeds. Under this arrangement property will be known for taxes and assessments by the same number that it is known for transfer. The act, it will be remembered, divided the city into sections. Section 1 extends from the Battery to Grand street and Section 2 from Grand to 14th street. Chief Deputy Bell has recommended the Tax Commissioners to have these two sections surveyed to correct the inaccuracies in present maps. Pending the Commissioners' decision on this recommendation nothing has been done with them under the act referred to, but the maps have been prepared for Section 3, extending from 14th to 40th street, and are in use for this year's taxes, but for the information of property-owners both the old and new numbers are given on the notices; hereafter only the new numbers will be used The maps for Section 5, north of 40th street to 96th for that section. street and east of 6th avenue, and Section 6, north of 96th street to Harlem River, east of 6th avenue, will be ready for the taxes of 1895, and the assessments of this coming fall will be made by them. Probably the maps for Sections 4 and 7 will be ready by 1896. Wherever this act is put into force the old as well as the new number will be used for the first year, but the property will thereafter be known by

the new number and section instead of the old number and ward as heretofore.

Real Estate Indebtedness and Taxation.

Attorney General Hancock has written the following opinion in answer to an inquiry if indebtedness on real estate should be taken out of the personal assessment against the owner of the real estate:

He says: "Sec. 4, chap. 411, Laws of 1885, as amended by chap. 212, Laws of 1892, provides for the assessment of personal property liable to taxation, at its full value, according to the best information of the assessors, after deducting the just debts owing by the person or corporation so assessed; but no deduction shall be made or allowed for or on account of any debt or liability contracted or incurred in the purchase of non-taxable property or securities owned by him or held for his benefit; nor for or on account of any indirect liability as surety, guarantor, endorser or otherwise; nor for or on account of any debt or liability contracted or incurred for the purpose of evading taxation.

"All personal property not exempt by law from taxation, owned by any person or corporation, should be assessed, after deducting just debts, as above provided. Land is assessed regardless of debts. If the landowner has given his bond on a mortgage, or both, it is a debt and should be deducted from his personal assessment, providing he brings himself within the law as above set forth."—Law Journal.

Why September is a Dull Month.

In a recent conversation Richard V. Harnett talked freely of the reasons that, to his mind, have caused real estate transactions to be fewer in number of late years during the month of September than in July or August. He claimed that most of the sales closed during the later months of each year had been in process of negotiation before the owners or buyers had left for summer vacations, but for one reason or another their consummation had been delayed. Frequently there would be hesitancy on the part of either principal to agree to conditions or terms and the sale sought by the broker left in abeyance, with the prospect of his work having to be done over again in the fall. One party to the transaction having left town, it sometimes happened that the one remaining in the city suddenly concluded that he had been unwise in not yielding to the demands of the other, and proceeded to notify the broker of his readiness to close the pending sale. The out-of-town principal was then communicated with and if he had not undergone a change of mind could telegraph his consent or send it by mail with instructions to forward the contract for his signature, and in a few days at most the sale would be completed. Again, it is often the case that an investor before leaving town will instruct his broker to advise him in the event of any parcel being offered in a particular section of the city. Should such be put upon the market the broker ascertains the lowest price and other particulars, conveys the information to his client as soon as possible, and the result is often an immediate sale. there has not existed the same possibility of successful negotiation in September was explained by Mr. Harnett to be due to the custom of summer sojourners indulging in short visits just before after the beginning of that month to friends in distant localities or to resorts other than the one they have spent the summer in. These visits are frequently prolonged when the weather continues hot are supplemented by others, The consequence is the address of the prospective seller or buyer becomes for the time being no longer a reliable one for the broker, should be seek an immediate answer in reference to a real estate possibility. Summer prices for realty are not usually low ones and in the case of the investor who returns to the city on September 1st, with his faculties made keener by a change of scene and rest for a month or two, he is unlikely to feel any great desire to invest or speculate until he has had ample opportunity to discern how the market is likely to go, higher or lower. The result is the actual opening of the active fall market is delayed until October.

Mr. Harnett's explanation of the reasons for September dullness appears all sufficient in the light of the experience of recent years.

The market might, however, open early this year in the event of September being distinguished by the bracing autumnal weather that was the most delightful feature of that month previous to a decade or so ago. Our September weather has for several years been equally as sultry and enervating as that of the month preceding, and that fact, no doubt, has had much to do with the inactivity that has been noted in real estate transactions. There is no reason why a month of seasonable weather, immediately following August, should not be accompanied by a revival of interest in realty and followed by an immediate resumption of a condition of active buying, selling and trading.

Nationality and Promptness with Rent.

Rent-paying as a race or national characteristic may seem at first blush not a matter that would repay examination. Most people believe that the prompt payment of rent is merely a question of individual ability and honesty. The New York rent collector whose business lies in the poorer districts of the city has, however, another opinion, and one confirmed by his books for the past six or eight months, in which the credit of both high and low has been tried so severely. In recent conversations with agents and brokers on the subject of tenement property it incidentally came out in every quarter that the Italians in the tenements paid their rents as a body more promptly than tenants of any other nationality. Negroes had a good record and Germans stood well. The most dilatory were the Hebrews and the Irish. These two latter people were also unfavorably esteemed for their knowledge of the intricacies of the law between landlord and tenant, particularly wherein it gave the tenant opportunities to worry the landlord or to avoid his just demands. One agent, whose tenants were either Hebrews or Italians, said while among the former there were, owing to the bad times, omissions and delays, the Italians had their money ready on the first day of the month. It may be that the Italian's freedom from trades unions and his readiness to accept any work at the current wages of the time being, makes him richer and consequently better able to pay his debts than the men of other nationalities who are more particular about what they do and how much they get for it. It may be also that as the newest comer he is not yet initiated into ways that are the terror of landlords and is only more honest because more ignorant, and that his character for prompt payment of rent will be lost when the process of sophistication is developed in him. However, there is no gainsaying the fact that to-day the Italian, above other races in the tenement enjoys the respect of the rent collector as one who can be relied upon to pay promptly for what he receives.

The Third Avenue Bridge.

The old 3d avenue bridge is rapidly being demolished, and now, even in the dullest season of traffic, the temporary bridge is proving a more than temporary nuisance. It was built so low that nothing bigger than a rowboat can pass under it and it has to be opened for every little insignificant craft that comes along. The delays are consequently long, frequent and exasperating. More than a few months of it the people of the North Side and Harlem cannot in patience endure. More expedition will have to be employed in the construction of that new bridge or some one in authority will wake up some morning before long to find himself exceedingly unpopular.

Correspondence.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

As a member of the West End Association and on behalf of the other members of the Association, I desire to enter an emphatic protest against the effort which some persons are making to saddle the responsibility upon the West End Association for the stable proposed to be built for the Street Cleaning Department on the south side of 90th street, 100 feet east of Amsterdam avenue.

So far as I am able to learn, through the papers and from statements made by the city officials, the responsibility of the West End Association begins and ends with the fact that Mr. Cyrus Clark, President of the Association, and Messrs. Jacob and Skinner, members of the association, are pushing this matter. Mr. Clark's interest in the matter I do not understand, as he has always seemed to have the *improvement* of the West Side thoroughly at heart. Messrs. Jacob and Skinner are of course interested in the profit they will make in the construction of the stable. I am, however, surprised that these gentlemen should give any aid or assistance to a scheme that will work as great [damage to surrounding property as this. I am aware that on the north side of 89th street there are already stables, but the other owners of vacant property on the south side of 90th street have repeatedly refused to sell for stable purposes. The north side of 90th street and the south side of 91st street are still vacant, with the exception of a few houses on each street. Let the proposed stable be built and the certain result will be two blocks of similar structures set amid one of the most attractive portions of the West Side.

The owners of improved property on 90th and 91st streets surely have some rights, and the certain result of the erection of this stable will be the depreciation of their property fully one-third.

Mr. Andrews' expressed wish to have the stable along the water front adjoining the dumps should certainly be acceded to as there can be no doubt that less harmwould result than if it is put anywhere else.

I am certain that if a meeting of the West End Association should be called to consider this matter that its members would without hesitation condemn this proposed terrible damage to the section of the city they are organized to look after and protect.

EMINENT DOMAIN.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

During the last week's session of the Legislature a bill s'id through which was not printed. This bill gives authority to the Park Board to take, when they like and if they like, any of that land lying between the Washington Bridge and Dykman street, and the 10th avenue to Harlem River, for park purposes. The bill is not mandatory, i. e., does not command the board to take the property or any part of it, but gives them a sort of fast and loose option on it. Before the bill had been signed by the Governor, and before I ever heard of it, I had ordered plans for some brickapartment houses which I proposed to build on the easterly side of 10th avenue, north of 185th street. The question now is, does the passage of this bill and its signature by the Governor in any way jeopardize my building the houses, or rather, does it jeopardize my chances of getting paid for the value of my improvements in case the Park Board should ultimately conclude to take this property for a park? This is a very serious question to property-owners and one on which there is a diversity of opinion on the part of lawyers. From a common sense standpoint there can be no question that owners have a perfect right to improve their property with the certainty that they can collect for such improvements in case the City concludes to take it, and that there is no risk until the City actually elects to take it. Will you give the public the benefit of your opinion in the premises?

Answer.—We regret that you do not furnish us with a copy of the Act referred to, as it is impossible to answer the question definitely without first having read it, and we have not been able as yet to obtain a copy. We will do the best we can, however, under the circumstances.

We are of the opinion that if, as you say, the Board is clothed with an absolutely discretionary power to take the land, which they may never exercise, you may without risk make your improvements; and in the event that the land is finally taken, may recover their value. But courts have frequently decided that "may" in an Act of the Legislature is to be construed to mean "shall" or "must." So that an Act of the Legislature which by a layman might be considered to be permissive, would be construed by the courts to be mandatory. If the Act referred to should be so construed, we are of the opinion that you could not recover the value of improvements made after it took effect.—LAW EDITOR.

FIXTURES.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

I bought a house from T R and took title to it. Now this T R wants to remove the gas-pipes and the chandeliers which he had put up after he had bought the house, as there were only gas-pipes and fixtures in hall and store when he, T R, took title, and he, T R, had gas-pipes and fixtures put into the upper floors. Can he remove pipes as well as fixtures in upper floor?

Answer.—The question what are fixtures, arises in four classes of actions—between executor and heir, vendor and vendee, mortgagor and mortgagee and landlord and tenant, and in these various classes of actions the rules differ somewhat and the distinctions drawn are very puzzling. A treatise could be written on the subject covering many pages. But your question is answered by one of the most recent cases (1880) in the Court of Appeals, McKeage vs. Hanover F. I. Co., 81 N. Y. 38, Rapallo, J., says, in his opinion: "Gas pipes which run through the walls and under the floors of a house are permanent parts of a building, but the fixtures attached to these pipes are not. They are not permanently annexed but simply screwed on projections of the pipes from the walls left for that purpose and can be detached by simply unscrewing them." If there was no agreement between you and TR concerning the chandeliers and gas fixtures, and no representation or act on his part that induced you to believe that they were to go with the house, he may remove them.—Law Editor.

Steps Toward Rapid Transit.

The Rapid Transit Commission at a meeting on Tuesday, all present save the Mayor, informally adopted the plans of the Steinway Commission for an underground electric road through Broadway and the Boulevard to the Yonkers line, as a necessary preliminary to getting the question of city ownership and construction properly before the people at the November election, as provided for in the act. In the resolutions by which this was done, the legal advisers and engineer of the board were asked to report by next Tuesday whether there were either engineering or legal obstacles to the construction of the road as laid out by the Steinway Commission, and a preamble was adopted asserting the authority of the commission to alter the route or system and to provide for additional lines, after the vote of the people shall have been taken. Final action on the adoption of the Steinway Commission plans was deferred until Tuesday next.

Seeking Damages for the Third Track.

The Manhattan Railway Company is not going to be permitted to lay its third track in 9th avenue without a legal contest. Thomas A. Maitland, a large owner along the line, has sued for an injunction in the Court of Common Pleas, alleging serious damage to his properties, in addition to the damage caused by the original structure. Counsel for the company contended that the additional injury to the property would be purely technical and inappreciable. Judge Bischoff took the motion for a preliminary injunction under advisement,

Persistent application on the part of the brokers who remain in town has resulted in the transactions of the week involving an aggregate investment that will stand comparison with that of any similar period of July for several years back. The sales, it is true, have not been of special moment in any instance, and perhaps if the trading feature were eliminated from the business of the last six days it would yield not an atom of encouragement to even the most uncompromising of real estate optimists. Be that as it may, the market still gives evidence of being very much alive despite the near approach of midsummer. Prices to be sure continue low, and are really lower than the reports of sales disclose, purchasers and brokers alike showing a not unfamiliar disinclination to take the public into their confidence by giving out the actual figures contained in contracts. Private dwellings are still changing hands, although they are said to be a drug in the market. There are some select sections of the city to which such a statement may not apply, but it is no exaggeration to say that its general application is warranted by existing facts. Purchasers of residences are only secured at present when the inducements offered are such as to leave no possible doubt in the minds of buyers that bargains can be obtained. An improved demand has been felt during the week for flats and tenements and a number of them are slated to change hands. Vacant lots on lines of improvement are still being sought in small parcels and when sales have been made former quotations have been maintained Unimproved plots not eligibly situated seem to be in no demand whatever either for investment or improvement.

Little interest was taken in the auction sales held since Monday at the Broadway salesroom. The operators and professional bargain seekers who have hitherto been accustomed to lend their presence to the daily sales were not on hand during the week in any appreciable number. A single sale-one by James L Wells on Tuesdaywas the only public offering. It comprised twelve lots at Belmont, in the 24th Ward. They were all sold at fair prices. On that day B. L. Kennelly again adjourned for one week an executor's sale of Nos. 1137 to 1141 Madison avenue, and owing to legal complications in which the estate has become involved the sale is likely to continue to be adjourned weekly for an indefinite period. Ruland & Whiting bought on Wednesday for a client Nos. 246 and 248 Cherry street, at foreclosure sale, for \$27,500. The price is considered a low one. Of Thursday two adjournments sine die of sales were announced, one by Geo. R. Read of property on 12th avenue, 130th and 131st streets, and the other by John T. Boyd of a foreclosure of Nos. 8 to 14 East 110th street. D. P. Ingraham on the same day adjourned until September 20th a foreclosure sale of Nos. 304 to 310 East 95th street. On Fricay L. J. Phillips & Co. adjourned to the 24th inst. a foreclosure sale of the property on the southwest corner of Madison avenue and 89th street.

HOUSES THAT WILL SOON BE READY FOR OCCUPANCY AND SALE.

Messrs. Lindsay & Johnsen are completing seven three-story and basement dwellings on the south side of 71st street, between West

End avenue and Riverside Drive. They present a handsome appearance, three being of brownstone, two of redstone and two of limestone. Six are each 18x55, and one 17x55. Features have been made of the plumbing and the interior trim in order to secure work above the usual to be found in such houses.

On the same street, opposite the Lindsay & Johnsen houses, the Horgan & Slattery Co. are at work on eight buff brick American basement houses which are now inclosed.

B. S. Levy are finishing six four-story American basement houses on the north side of 80th street, near Riverside Drive. Three have frontages of 16, two of 17 and one of 18 feet, all are about 78 feet deep with kitchens on the parlor floor. For small houses they are very roomy, each having seventeen rooms.

TROLLEY ROADS IN YONKERS.

Before the Yonkers Common Council on Monday came the North and South Electric Railway Company and petitioned for leave to build and operate a street surface railroad in Shonnard place, from North Broadway to Park avenue; in Park avenue from Shonnard place to Ashburton avenue; Ashburton avenue, from Park to Palisade avenue; Palisade avenue and Getty square, and South Broadway to the New York City line; on Lawrence street, from South Broadway to McLean avenue, to Parkbill avenue, to Linden street, to Elm street, to Palisade avenue. Devitt, James S. Fitch and Leslie M. Saunders.

Gossip of the Week.

SOUTH OF 59TH STREET.

Henry C. Bryan has sold for David Frankenberg, No. 214 West 42d street, a five-story stone front flat, 25x93x100. The broker's price is \$47,500, but we understand that a smaller consideration has been agreed upon. The property was purchased by the seller in July, 1885, for \$41,000.

Builder Amund Johnsen is the purchaser of No. 79 4th avenue, the sale of which was reported last week.

Drought & Carew have sold No. 9 Christopher street, a five-story flat with stores, 31.6x90x irregular, to Aaron Altman, for between \$45,000 and \$50,000. The consideration is said to be all eash.

The contract entered into in May by S. & H. Corn and Harry Chaffee for an exchange of the "Corndiac," a new business structure on the leased lot No. 139 5th avenue, for nine houses on 70th street, west of Sherman square, has been cancelled. Mr. Chaffee, it seems, was unable to carry out his part of the agreement and secured a release by paying the Messrs. Corn \$5,006. The broker who negotiated the trade was paid his commission by the owners of each of the parcels.

A sale was reported a few days ago of the dwelling No. 62 West 55th street, by Origen Vandenburgh, for \$35,000. The title to the property stands in the name of John Hayes, who bought it at fore-closure sale in May, 1891, for \$27,000, and afterward recorded a conveyance from the referee for a consideration of \$12,000, subject to a mortgage for \$15,000. Mr. Vandenburgh was the previous owner of the house, having purchased it in October, 1886, for \$39,000.

REVIEW AND RECORD.

BROOKLYN, JULY 14, 1894.

The Record of the Last Six Months.

COMPARATIVE TABLES OF THE SALES, MORTGAGES AND PRO-JECTED BUILDINGS THIS YEAR AND LAST, WITH AN ANALYSIS OF THEIR MEANING—A MANIFEST IMPROVEMENT IN ALL QUARTERS.

W E publish with this issue, in tabular form, the statistics of conveyances, mortgages and projected buildings in Kings County for the first six months of this year in comparison with the corresponding period for 1893. These are the official record evidences of the progress of these important industries for the periods named and, with reasonable allowances, contains the most accurate and reliable data from which the course of the

real estate market may be judged.

It will be remembered that the first five months of 1893 were among the liveliest in the history of Brooklyn real estate. Then came the panic, and within a month the big loaning institutions had all sealed their treasure boxes against Brooklyn loans. From this time on for more than six months Brooklyn realty was under a serious depression—a depression that has exhausted the last bit of inflation there was in Kings County realty and left it down on bed-rock. In the meantime, however, a necessary and profitable reform was worked out in the municipal governmental system, after which the tone of the realty market began to improve.

What will strike the observer of these figures as the most prominent fact is that the volume of business, measured by money value, was a third less during the first half of this year than in the corresponding period of the previous year, both in real estate sales and in building, and about a fourth less in mortgages. The next most conspicuous fact is that the downward tendency ceased early in the spring, since which there has been a clearly-defined improvement in all branches of the real estate industry, more particularly in the building branch. It will be

noted also that there is a considerable increase (over 15 per cent) in the number of conveyances for nominal considerations. If the facts were known they would doubtless minimize the apparent difference in the money value of lands sold this and last year.

In the matter of mortgages it is still apparent that money is commanding better rates of interest than it was a year ago, and that the loans are more conservatively made. The total number and amount of mortgages is so much larger than the conditions of the loan market would have led one to believe as to refute in large measure the aspersions of Brooklyn realty that were common during the panic. The whole number of mortgages is not a thousand less than in the first half of 1893, and the amount but \$7,000,000 less. Altogether it seems that Brooklyn real estate has actually manifested during this exceedingly adverse period a stability and buoyancy better than have ever been claimed for it, and that should go a great way towards commending it to investors and traders. There is no sort of doubt but that such changes as will take place from now on must be for the better. The figures in detail are subjoined:

Building Commissioner Bush has appointed John E. Conlon inspector for the 29th Ward, and transferred William A. Helwig, who was inspector there, to the 31st Ward.

Notice is given that the Common Council has declared by resolution its intention to repave Hooper street, from Bedford to Lee avenue, with cobblestone pavement, and to open Berriman street, from Atlantic avenue to New Lots road. Objections must be filed with the Clerk of the Common Council on or before the 6th day of August.

BUILDING MATERIAL MARKET.

NEW YORK.

BRICK.-Reports do not gain in cheerfulness and the market in the main continues barren of positively cheerful features. Arrivals have increased again somewhat and kept a plentiful supply of stock on hand, the surplus being always equal to a sudden expansion of demand which did not come, and sellers have found it necessary to accept all bids on a basis of former figures in order to secure custom. Of course there is the usual expression of hope of improvement to come, but when, or how, or where it will develop no one seems to have a clear conception. Manufacturers are understood to be generally complaining of unremunerative prices and threatening to cease production and stop shipments, but it looks very much as though each one was waiting for the other fellow to take the initiative. There has been quite a little special call for pales this week and just at a time when there did not happen to be much of that particular class of stock available, giving the position a so mewhat steadier tone. positively cheerful features. Arrivals have in-

CEMENT.-No one seems to have a particularly good word to say for the market. Manufacturers good word to say for the market. Manufacturers of some of the favorite brands of domestic are having a fair sort of trade with regular custom, and temporary flurries of demand now and then help the sale of the general offering, but on the average business is slow and improving. Those contractors who book orders direct with the mills have engagements about all entered up, and dealers are adhering closely to policy of investing in the smallest amounts likely to satisfy current trade wants. Prices stand as before. Imported goods of established reputation get reasonably good attention, and some agents report practically no accumulation, but stock that has not heretofore proven right up to the mark on new brands is difficult to place even at low rates, and it is said that some remarkably low rates have been offered on landing parcels. The imports at New York for six months ending June 30, 1894, were 83,947 bbls from Great Britain and 352,313 from Continent, making a total of 436,260 bbls against 591,997 same time last year. As we have before advised, a great deal of this supply went through to interior points on engagements, but there is a suspicion that more of it lingers in local accumulation than importers care to have known. Mail advices received a short time ago from London said in substance as follows: "Very little export inquiry is received, but English makers cannot now encourage it by any further concessions in price, indeed some of the London men are asking an advance of 3d. On the other hand Belgian makers are still cutting their prices. Freights from London and Antwerp are now very near the cost of handling the cement." The Canadian imports of cement for season to July 1st were 66,300 bbls, of which 12,750 from Continent and 33,550 from England.

GLASS.-Ill-advised writers in the public press, for political or other purposes, have been howling about the shut down among the window glass factories as an eyidence of hard times, etc., but as everyone properly posted knows when the fires were extinguished at the close of last month it was simply following out an annual practice. Nevertheless, trade is dull enough and the market as a whole lacks spirit all along the line and buyers talk indifferently. The flurry of demand several weeks ago satisfied wants of the small class of operators who were at that time compelled to get together a working assortment and the calls now are only for small parcels to make assortment. Jobbers, in consequence, invest carefully, and allow supplies to remain in first hands. The value line, however, remains firm on the dual support of the cessation of production and an unusually small stock in first hands, which is estimated at only one million boxes, or about one-third of an average accumulation. The present offering of imported stock appears to be small, but fully 100,000 boxes are said to be held in bond awarting the settlement of the question of revised duty. Plate glass sells fairly well and is steady at 70270 and 10 per cent discount. about the shut down among the window glass fac-

HARDWARE.-Dealers who make a specialty of builders' hardware and the various assortments of plumbers' goods report only a fair run of busi ness during the first six months of the year. For a while customers depended as much as possible upon the supplies already in hand and when finally compelled to enter the market limited their investments to invoices simply large enough to offset the most pronounced necessities, making a licht, unsatisfactory business. There is hopes of better conditions before fall, based upon small

accumulations in second hands and a belief in fuller general consumption. In the way of quotations it has for a long while been difficult to name really positive figures, for while lists have undergone no official change there was and is such constant cutting as to create great irregularity throughout. No revision can be made until trade gets into a more uniform channel.

LATH .- Since last writing the market has been subject to another knock-down blow and touched the lowest point of the season. A heavy fleet arrived, unquestionably a considerable portion of it unexpectedly, and although a great many of the carroes were in part or wholly sold, there was evidently a surplus that bothered receivers seriously. Most dependent custom was already fairly supplied and it was a delicate matter to seek market for additional amounts in the current condition of trade. Taking the bull by the horms, however, holders of some of the big lots dropped the rate to \$1.50 and promptly got out of the way the portion of supply likely to prove most trouble-some, and since then matters have foned up with indications at the close that \$1.60\omega 1.62\frac{1}{2} is about as low as would be listened to. There are some cargoes coming down the coast, but nothing extensive. It may be interesting to know that since January 1st the receipts of lath here from Maine and the Provinces are 15,300.000 in excess of same time last year. subject to another knock-down blow and touched

LIME.—The general conditions of the market remain about as last advised. The receivers of Eastern seem to be satisfied they are getting about all the trade possible and call the business fair, with former rates ruling, and although the supply is not plentiful it is quite full enough for all present wants and not expected to increase. The State stock is doing very well, getting at least its ordinary proportion of the going demand, probably a little more in some cases and prices remain steady for both grades.

LUMBER .- Local influences have not been of a character to infuse additional life into the market and reports of satisfactory business were a decided and reports of satisfactory business were a decided exception among both wholesale and retail operators. Even where the progress of work in hand serves to increase the actual consumption of lumber the effect is not felt through the development of new orders, because in the first place the quantity of stuff wanted is exceedingly small, and secondly the deliveries are very largely upon contracts that have been booked along from time to time and were not of sufficient magnitude to excite more than passing comment. Some stuff is coming along in an irregular manner and goes into yard, but the additions to supply are below the seasonable average, and the indifference toward random offerings before referred to is now supplemented by a light unsatisfactory demand for specials.

Yet no salesman at all familiar with the conditions that have prevailed during the past year assumes any thing of an aggressive attitude. It has been demonstrated over and over again that the indifference of demand is due solely to absence of use for supplies, and the apparent almost total annihilation of the speculative spirit, so that prices at an absolute slaughter level—as they have been in several cases—rarely meet response after a few of the leading dealers had eathered in the cream of the goods available. Within the past two weeks both buyers and sellers have been particularly indifferent over supplies dependent upon rail transportation in view of the obvious uncertainty in regard to deliveries.

With the poor results of the immediate past, and disagrecable conditions of the present, operators naturally endeavor to make some sort of forecast for the turure and as a rule they continue to find basis for hopeful feelings. GENERAL LUMBER NOTES. STATE.

The Albany Argus says:

Following upon the Fourth of July and a semi-holiday sort of a week, more buyers appeared here for pine lumber. Prices and freights continue un-changed. In spruce and hemlock there is only a fair demand at unchanged quotations. The stag-nating influences of the strike have paralyzed western lumber markets.

There is but slight reason for specifying the condition of trade in any locality where business is paralyzed as it has been during the past week by the great railway strike. Except in the larger cities and manufacturing centres, where considerable consumption is steadily going forward and eating away local stocks, lumber movement has been nearly arrested by the inability of nearly every railway centering in this city, St Louis, Cincinnati. Indianapolis, Toledo and other Western cities to handle their freight trains. This has placed an embargo on the movement of stock to market, and the outward distribution of it from the yards by rail. It has affected the pine and hardwood business alike, and its stagnating influence has extended to the remotest parts of the country, even the entire Pacific coast feeling the lent form.

Since the outbreak had to come, it is well that it occurred in midsummer when trade is at low tide. The embargo on traffic will thus be less severely felt than it would have been in the spring or fall when there is urgency in the movement of lumber The demand was light at the best, and a check in distribution for a week or ten days will not be a great drawback on the season's business. When the traffic obstructions shall have been removed there will be an accumulation of orders to forward which will infuse some life into trade.

The cargo market on Lake Michigan, with this city as the principal point, is manifesting more vigor than should seem possible under the circumstances. Yard dealers have within the past month made numerous purchases of blocks at the mills and the lumber thus acquired is coming forward in heavy volume, receipts in late weeks having showed a notable increase. This measure of life in the Lake Michigan movement has more than a local and sectional influence. It reaches all around the lakes and favorably affects the entire white pine field and to some degree the yellow pine section of the South.

At Chicago:

Arrivals consist of common and cull boards and strips, pine and hemlock piece stuff, shingles and lath. The amount of piece stuff coming is scarcely

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equal to the demand, though a considerable quantity has recently been purchased by the yard men over the lake. At any rate, all that arrives sells without much delay. Short piece stuff continues to sell at \$9.25. There is a good call for long lengths at a range of \$10 to \$10.50 for slimjims, and \$12 to \$12.50 for wide stuff.

The suppy of hemlock is excessive, and the demand dragging, which renders prices anything but buoyant. Less than the usual amount of hemlock is this year being used in street work, which cuts off the demand for product. Flat common inch lumber is in fair demand and prices are maintained about at quotations. Only small lots of medium and good lumber are arriving. One lot of medium recently sold at \$15 a thousand.

The growing scarcity of dry stock is evidenced by a firmer feeling in the eastern markets as regards poplar. Demand has not materially improved, but the low prices which ruled earlier in the summer are being withdrawn, because it is evident that stocks cannot be replenished at such figures. At present the bulk of the dry lumber at mills is in the hands of the stronger operatives who refuse to make concessions on sales. Shipments are of course affect d by the railroad strike, but this does not injuriously affect prices. Logs are scarce, many of the mills having already cut to hold lumber already manufactured for higher prices.

It is fortunate for one thing that the great strike occurred at this time, for trade would have been rather light any way, so it will not be so seriously felt as if it had come during a season of brisk demand. This year there has been no accumulation of orders as is frequently the case at this season, and accordingly when the demand drops off, trade quiets down to almost nothing. Yet at the same time it is well known that country stocks are at a low ebb, and whenever there is an increase in the demand for lumber dealers will have to order from first hands.

NAILS .- Since the opening of the month there has been some increase of demand mainly from a line of custom holding orders over to secure more acceptable dates for invoices. Nothing like stimulating activity developed, however, and there was plenty of stock available at former rates. We quote Cut at \$1.00\tilde{w}1.10 per keg for car lots and \$1.15\tilde{w}1.25 per keg for parcels from store for iron, and add 3c. per keg for steel; Wire, \$1.00\tilde{w}1.15\tilde{v}1.25\tilde{w}1.35\tilde{v}1.35

ditional cause for complaint has been found in the disturbance of transportation facilities, but in any event consumption was not much inclined to broaden out and jobbers and retailers could meet all calls made upon them with liberality and dispatch. First-hand supplies, too, are a little fuller than manufacturers had intended to have on hand at this juncture, as it was a difficult matter to closely adjust the production to the outlet, but no more than a natural effort to secure custom is manifested. It is said, however, that of foreign goods, and especially zines, there has been considerable quiet pressure of offerings for some time, with a tendency that way in other lines likely to have a chance under proposed changes in duty. In the matter of prices pretty much the same old story is told all around, nearly every article undergoing some cut from list rates. For leads, corroders quotations stand as follows: Lead in oil in kegs and dry lead in kegs in lots of less than 500 lbs., 6½c net; in lots of 500 lbs. to 5 tons at one purchase, 6.94c.; 12 tons and over, one purchase, 5.94c. Lead in oil in 12½ lb. tin pails, add 1c.; in 25 and 50 lb. tin pails, add ½c., and in 1 to 5 lb. tin cans, assorted (100 lbs. in case) add 2½c. per lb. to keg price. Terms on lots of 500 lbs. and over, note or acceptance at sixty days, or 2½ per cent discount will be allowed for cash paid within fifteen days of invoice date. To make either of the above required quantities any assortment of packages of white lead, red lead and litharge may be counted. The above quotations are free on board cars or boat at corroding point. Linseed Oil meets with a fair sort of attention, but like everylhing else sells only as the immediate necessitics of custom arise, and the movement is somewhat erratic. On the general range prices stand about as before. We quote at 50 &52c. for Western, 53 &54c. for City from domestic seed and 54 &55c. for do. from Calcutta seed. Spirits Turpentune has again been very dull, and the influence of slow business is finall

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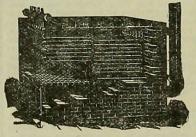
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
