WITH SUPPLEMENT.

PRESIDENT CLEVELAND'S sudden announcement of the issue of \$50,000,000 of U. S. 5's, has naturally had an unsettling effect. The people cannot imagine any reason for it. Announced, however, it has to be taken. Doubtless it is an intimation that the Treasury under the present administration will at any cost keep itself in a position to meet any and every demand for gold. At the present rate this cost is \$2,500,000 a year. Naturally people do not like this; they would prefer that some other means were taken to keep up the gold reserve until legislation can be obtained that will apply permanent support. Secretary Manning set a useful precedent in withholding gold in paying the government debts for a short time in order to increase the reserve, and the suggestion that customs be required to be paid partly in gold deserves to be considered. If the Administration thinks that its policy will change foreign opinion of the values of American credit and securities, it has mistaken European criticisms that have been made on the national finances. Those criticisms were wholly directed against the dangerous and clumsy currency in use here; the references to the gold reserve were merely incidental and as an illustration of the evils of the system. Not only are the benefits to be obtained from the new issue of bonds inadequate, but the last issue showed how very temporary they are likely to be in their effects. But the Treasury Department under the present administration has shown such remarkable capacity for blundering that nothing it does is surprising. Its latest effort is an effective example of its amateur financing. If a change in the head of the Treasury Department should be contemplated before March, 1897, Mr. Cleveland might find profit in remembering that the only Secretary of the Treasury he ever had who showed any comprehensive recognition of the powers and duties belonging to the office was his first, a practical banker of long training and experience. The election having failed at once to bring to business all that it was expected to bring there are on all sides now complaints where there were bright predictions only a few weeks ago, but the limitations natural to trade under the present condition of affairs will perhaps be better recognized as a consequence. The stock market is disturbed for the reasons given above and also because the position of some of the securities dealt in is not by any means satisfactory. Some reorganizations are unduly delayed and some which have been made do not appear to be satisfactory. This conservative qualification may be applied to the reorganization of Erie, but in the case of Cordage the reorganization is unsatisfactory without any qualification whatever. Being based on an increased capital and a decreased business it is easy to see how it fails to be effective. Moreover the capitalization is so out of proportion to that of other corporations in the same business that the position of the two junior stocks is a hopeless one in any circumstances. Liquidation in Manhattan Elevated continues and still threatens its price seriously. In the absence of improvement in business these things have a more than usual effect on the general list. Improved business might limit their injurious effects to the securities organically unsound, but, as we have pointed out before, the opening of winter is not the time to expect any pronounced improvements in trade.

UNCLE SAM as mediator between China and Japan will probably have no more success than other outside powers. No doubt China would be glad of help from any quarter that would stop the beating of the Jap's bamboo upon her stupid, unwieldy and helpless back, but in such cases it is the beater and not the beaten who chooses the right moment to stop.

Japan's ambition is to make itself a power, free from all Western tutelage. There is nothing that establishes any nation in such a position so much as the right to settle its own disputes. Having the game in its own hands it is hardly probable that Japan will listen to any proposals for peace that do not come directly from China herself. Unless she permits it there is no more reason why another power should arrange the terms of Japan's peace with China than there was for an intermediary between Prussia and France. The English journals are making comfort for the American iron manufacturer, though discomfort for the English one, in their deductions from the fact that prices of iron and steel declined more in the past three years in the United States than they did in England. They fear this evidence of the ability of the United States to turn out those metals cheaply will make it a powerful competitor in the export iron trade, and indeed admit that but for the land distances which materials and manufacturers have to travel the Alabama ironmasters would now be flooding the English markets with their common forge and foundry pig-iron. These fears find support in the placing of the contract for Tokio's gas mains in this country. The report of earnings on the great French railways for the first half of this year shows a small gain over those of the same half of 1893. Purchases of Rentes for the third quarter of the year were largely in excess of those for the same quarter of last year and sales very much less in a similar comparison, showing the continued tendency of money to go into investment rather than into trade. An eminent statistician, M. Alfred Neymarck, believes that the limit of low rate interest has been reached in safe investments, returning only from 2½ to 3 per cent. Further progress in that direction, he fears, would constitute a public danger. The idea is an original one, and it is easy to see how his fear arises. German imports for the first nine months of the year increased 7.5 per cent in quantity and 0.2 per cent in value; exports increased 6.2 per cent in quantity, but decreased 5.6 per cent in value. The balance of trade shows an excess of 984 million marks in imports, as against 566 million marks in the first three-quarters of 1893. In spite of the gloomy rumors circulated for some weeks Vienna markets and trade continue to be very active, with prices rising. The Bohemian State silver mines are now being worked at a loss and the Government is casting about to see how they can otherwise give employment to the miners if the mines are shut down. It is only rarely that any news of value relating to her financial condition comes from Russia, so that what does come is of especial interest. The last to hand is a summary of the definitive budget for 1893. From this it appears that the original estimate was: Revenue, \$480,610,000; expenditures, \$473,845,000; surplus, \$6,765,000. Actual results were: Revenue, \$522,845,000; expenditures, \$473,480,000; surplus, \$49,365,000. The receipts include \$76,265,000, repayment of Government loans for various purposes which ought to be charged to capital account, but even this allowed the results cannot be regarded otherwise than as satisfactory when the distress that afflicted Russia two winters ago is remembered, and even though it is a fact that disrespect to the authorities and failure to pay taxes are the two unpardonable sins in the dominions of the Czar. The budget also contains a statement of the gold belonging to the Government, which amounts to \$508,644,070, of which \$219,418,300 are held as a basis of note issue.

RAILROAD earnings for October show the sectional character of the improvement in the trade of the country and, inferentially, how slow that progress must necessarily be. On a total of 107 roads, distributed over the whole country, October earnings show a decline of 3.1 per cent compared with October 1893. The Southern roads, however, increased gross earnings 7.9 per cent, the Southwestern roads 3.7 per cent and the Pacific roads 5.4 per cent. The great losses were made on the Grangers and Trunk lines, being in the case of the first 16 per cent and that of the second 11.6 per cent. It is surmised that these losses are due to the lessened passenger income, October 1893 having been the last month of the Chicago Fair, and when consequently those roads had their carrying capacity taxed to the utmost. These are not, however, the most striking peculiarities of the returns. What is most conspicuous is the way adversity or improvement is spread over all the roads of the Southern and Granger sections. Of ten Granger roads only one, the Great Northern, reports an increase, and that a small one, while of fifteen Southern roads only one reports a decrease, and that for a very small amount. Of twelve Southwestern roads three only report decreases, Atchison, in fact, being the only great property in that section that has the unenviable distinction of a considerable falling behind October of last year. In the central Western section reports were received from thirty eight roads, of which twenty-one showed increases and seventeen decreases, conspicuous among the latter being the Wabash and the Louisville, New Albany & Chicago. Six Eastern roads reporting do not make a good

showing, as earnings decreased on four of them, and the increases shown by the other two were proportionately small. These results confirm the impression held for some time that the South and Southwest are making the most satisfactory progress toward renewed activity and that the Northwest has yet the most to do.

#### That Affair of "Consolidation."

THE vote upon the "Greater New York" project must be very disappointing alike to advocates and opponents of the scheme. Its chief significance is its insignificance. It cannot be said that the public, the people of the district involved in the plan, have recorded their preference. Legally speaking, Greater New York has been created, but the birth was in a sense an illegitimate affair, a side issue. Its paternity is doubtful. The unusual interest attached to the purely political contest this fall tended, of course, to withdraw the attention of the voter from what was, but should not have been, a subsidiary matter. Allowing, however, for obscuration, the fact remains that people evinced very marked apathy upon a question in which they were supposed to be keenly interested. The truth is Greater New York has been the idea of a relatively few enthusiasts. The scheme did not originate or take form under the stress of popular pressure. From the first it has been pushed and kept alive by the indefatigable energy of a well-meaning clique, who found a warrant for their activity in their own ardent personal convictions. In the absence of real public interest, unhampered by criticism and unhindered by popular restraints of any sort, they succeeded in bringing their scheme to an issue at the polls and a verdict by default was obtained in their favor.

We are, of course, far from saying that the community is opposed to consolidation. The trouble is nobody knows what the opinion of the community is. Perhaps a full vote would be merely a magnification of the smaller vote; perhaps it would reverse the actual result. Everybody may guess about the matter, but guesses are not decisive and it is a decisive judgment that is so desirable.

The real estate interests, particularly in New York, although so much concerned, gave practically no attention to the project. The Real Estate Exchange was mute. At the eleventh hour, indeed, the West Side Association took up the subject, but action was too late and too hasty to call out any deliberate expression of opinion. Those who attended the meeting recorded themselves as opposed to consolidation, but this record was challenged, we believe, as inconclusive for the whole organization.

Unsatisfactory, however, as all this is the community stands pledged to Greater New York. Even were it possible, retreat would be inadvisable. Having permitted themselves to be committed to the scheme there ought to be no hesitation now in pushing forward to a logical conclusion. Perhaps events are wiser than ourselves.

We should be done, however, with the policy of drifting. To consolidate the new districts of the metropolis, to make them and their diverse interests articulate well and form an efficient and harmonious whole will be no mean piece of work in municipal mechanics. Knotty questions of administration and finance face us. If we are not to have a hodge-podge, a mere agglomeration of parts fecund in waste and maladministration the community must take the trouble to place the problem in competent hands for solution. A clique, no matter how well intentioned, cannot manage the affair properly. With still less wisdom can it be confided to the racquet of popular clamor or to that queer body of inefficients and rascals known as the Legislature. The latter for years have done little else but muddle the affairs of the metropolis for the welfare of politicians, and there is nothing to justify belief that a larger field of operation will call out virtues and abilities not exercised hitherto. We would like to see the Real Estate Exchange interest itself actively in the details of consolidation. It might perhaps with advantage confer with the Brooklyn Exchange.

NEW YORK CITY exists to-day in a state of chronic suspicion of the honesty of each and every one of her governmental departments besides the police, in which suspicion has become conviction owing to the results of the work of the Lexow Committee. This is not an enviable nor a proper state to live in. Something ought to be done to give the suspected officials a chance to clear themselves or to justify the suspicion with which they are regarded and open the road for the reformatory treatment of their several departments. Here and there some one of the other departments has been charged with evil doing, especially in the way of raising illicit revenue for its members, but the evidence is not of the kind that justifies their condemnation. It is natural that people should assume that all the chickens of one brood are alike, but they may be wrong nevertheless. It may be that there is one righteous department to redeem this Gomorrah of municipal management. Admitting that that may be so, it is only right and proper that such a department should have

an opportunity of displaying its singular peculiarities. The proof of its sustained innocence ought to be received with more joy than the one sinner brought to repentance. The Lexow Committee cannot possibly investigate all the departments. It has already had the Police under scrutiny for months, and is not yet through with it. When incidentally a charge is made against members of other departments, as was the case with Commissioner Andrews a few days ago, they have no time either to investigate it or to give the accused person an opportunity of refuting it. If the charges are true this is unjust to the city; if false, unjust to the person against whom the charge is made. Sufficient has been brought out to make it clear that each and every one of the departments needs overhauling, as much in fairness to their officials as to the public. The task is too gigantic for any one committee to perform efficiently, and even inefficiently performed would occupy years. To have it done properly and within reasonable time a special committee ought to be appointed for each department and all sit concurrently. In this way the whole of this disagreeable business could be dispatched promptly and the remedies, where necessary, applied, probably by the next Legislature, and the men who are now suffering unjustly, if there are any such, be relieved of the implications that have been cast upon them.

THE "reformer" very frequently is the individual who brings discredit upon reform. It will be remembered that at the last session of the State Legislature, a bill was introduced and supported by the very members who had been quite noisy about the beauties of efficient and economical government, increasing the pay of the Police Force. This measure was publicly opposed by Mayor Gilroy, who uttered nothing but the cold truth when he said that the force was already very well paid for the character of the work performed, and that any increase in salary would be an injustice to the taxpayer. We know now from what has leaked out before the Lexow Committee what the influences were that produced the necessary legislation at Albany, but it is somewhat disheartening to remember that the bill was introduced and pushed and engineered by men who paraded their virtues as distinctly higher than those of the average Tammany man. Prior to the sad disclosures of this politically warm summer, there was perhaps some excuse for persons disposed to pamper the Police Force, believing that it was a particularly efficient body of men. No such excuses exist to-day. The force has been shown to be singularly corrupt and rather brutal than intelligent in the performance of even its most obvious duties. The first step that should be taken now by "reformers," if they really mean reform, is to put the pay of the Police Force back to where it was before last summer's reformer interfered with it. Everybody to-day is feeling the pressure of bad times, even worthy people who do not promote the interests of the criminal class. There has probably been an all around decline of 20 per cent. in profits, values and wages, during the past twelve months. Under these circumstances alone, but particularly as the increase in salaries was quite unwarranted, a reduction to the former standard in the pay of the Police Force is a proper measure of economy. In the financial affairs of a city like New York, too much scrutiny cannot be given to all propositions that aim at an increase of what may be called the permanent or recurrent expenses of the government. It is these—the outlay entailed for "administration" and services of the kind performed by the Police Department—that form the real burden upon the taxpayer. One hundred dollars spent in actual labor, say upon street opening, can be borne because usually it is profitable, far more easily than \$20 outlay entailed for inefficient, dishonest, circumlocutory "administration."

THERE is a remarkable appropriateness about the form in which it is proposed to put the thanks of the city to Dr. Parkhurst for the inestimable service he has rendered it. This is a memorial setting forth briefly the reverend gentleman's services and the gratitude of the community to be duplicated several times and bound up in a number of albums which are to be filled up with the signatures of the grateful. It is not anything in Dr. Parkhurst's character or in the work he has done that makes this so appropriate, but rather the character and conduct of the average citizen. Dr. Parkhurst himself would probably prefer that anything fulsome or sensational should be spared him. His motives can only have been of the best and highest; sustained by any other he must have failed. They alone suggest a better reward than any his fellow citizens can bestow upon him. If he desires the reward of notoriety he must know that his name is inseparably associated with everything that makes a good citizen, and as such will endure as an example to future generations. He has shown that there are ways of handling pitch without defilement, and thereby has broken down that great bulwark of vice, the dread of respectable people to attack dirt for fear some will attach to them and destroy the even whiteness of their robes. With his successful work as a

precedent immorality can no longer be left alone for the cowardly and politic reasons that have hitherto prevailed. Dr. Parkhurst is his own testimonial and his motives and the success of his work his reward. But with the other citizens of New York it is very different, and this is where the appropriateness of the testimonial will come in. What the albums will really be is a confession that a comparative stranger has come to the city, but could not look with indifference upon the evils which all saw, that he simply set about doing the work that it was the whole community's duty to do and did it with a courage, ability and success that all must admire, facing ridicule and contumely in doing it. Any one else might have done the same thing. His triumph is the condemnation of every other of the many prominent and, assumedly, public-minded citizens in our midst. These memorials should be numerously signed, and each signer say, repently, and with vows for a better future, "I might have done this work myself, therefore here I write myself down an ass."

### Municipal Rapid Transit.

#### WHAT IS THE OPPOSITION DOING? THE SUGGESTIONS MADE ON ROUTES AT THE PUBLIC HEARINGS OF THE COMMISSION.

Though nothing definite has transpired there is a strong belief that preparations are being made for a vigorous opposition to the carrying out of the rapid transit act in the interest of the owners of existing traveling facilities and franchises, which will, however, not be disclosed until the Commission has finally settled upon a plan of operations. Naturally this would have to be done before any rational form of opposition could be moulded. Then, too, this question may be affected by the attitude of the Commission toward those facilities, whether they include them in their plan or decide to build a system entirely independent of them. It would no doubt hasten matters considerably if existing facilities were used as much as possible and the new work devoted in part to supplementing them were useful, but principally to the creation of a great trunk line with a capacity to carry large numbers of people comfortably and expeditiously long distances. What is primarily wanted is a line which will relieve the congestion of the lower parts of the city by carrying directly the large numbers who live in Harlem and the annexed districts. This would afford the necessary measure of relief without unfairly competing with the capital that has already been put into city railways. The arguments against it are only such as would have weight in the case of a road to be built by private capital and to which immediate revenue was absolutely necessary.

The Rapid Transit Commission has given the two hearings announced last week to those who wished to be heard on the subject of routes. Ex-Mayor Hewitt, who was one of the speakers, was allowed more latitude than the others, in consideration of the fact that his long study of the question and the active part he has taken in the movement to procure rapid transit for the city made anything he might say of especial value and interest.

Mr. Hewitt, who advocated an underground system, said in substance there were two centres for the receipt and distribution of passengers—City Hall Park and the Grand Central Station. It was not possible to lay a four-track road under Broadway, except possibly on a double-deck plan. Two tracks were feasible. It might be possible to arrange with the New York Central Railroad Co. to run a four-track tunnel under its bed north of 42d street, or it could be built on one of the streets parallel to the Central's tracks, like Madison avenue. The great public importance of the subject might make it possible to obtain the removal of the present legal exemption of Madison avenue. Distribution below City Hall should be left to the surface lines. Broadway should not be used south of Union square, but some other parallel street instead. The commission should make arrangements for a consolidation of all the elevated, surface and rapid transit lines, so that it would be possible to transfer passengers from one to another. If this was done it would not be necessary to build any new lines on the east side, because that portion of the city was adequately served by the elevated railroads. The rapid transit system should be operated under one management. He hoped the commission would not allow themselves to be hurried in their consideration of the subject.

Very important statements were made on behalf of the 23d and 24th Wards by Mr. John A. Amundson and Mr. James L. Wells, representing the North Side Board of Trade. The former suggested that those wards required three lines. The line through the central portion might follow the route of the Harlem River Railroad. Jerome avenue was the most direct route to reach the territory between the Harlem River Railroad and the Harlem River. The lower end of this line should connect with the elevated railroad at 155th street, and there should be a spur to connect with the Harlem River Railroad at Mott Haven. There should be another branch through the centre of the territory between the Harlem River Railroad and the Sound, say along the Southern Boulevard.

Mr. James L. Wells said: "We now have in the 23d and 24th Wards a city, according to the returns of the last election, greater than any in the State, except four. We have 125,000 people, and manufacturing establishments with a capital of \$60,000,000. We want a line between the Harlem Railroad and the Harlem River. We want a road which will reach Mott Haven, Mount Hope, Fordham, Bedford Park and other towns in this neighborhood. By the routes suggested by Mr. Amundson the people can reach such parks as Claremont, Bronx and others in this section. When the section was annexed in 1880, the assessed valuation was \$22,000,000. It is now \$65,000,000. But the greatest increase has been since 1891, when we

went to the Legislature and secured the appointment of a Commissioner of Streets. Since that time our increase in every way has been enormous. The people in my neighborhood prefer an underground or elevated road, but would not object to an open cut if that seemed to the commission the most advisable. It is claimed that Jerome avenue should not be used, because it is now a great driveway. I do not believe Jerome avenue will continue to be a driveway. It is destined to be the great business street of that section, and as such would not be destroyed by a transportation line."

Mr. Ferdinand Potter raised an objection to the use of Broadway, but his objection was disposed of by the statement that the matter had been settled by the Supreme Court in the litigation instituted by the late O. B. Potter.

At the second hearing, on Wednesday last, a number of suggestions were made and plans presented: One for the laying out of the northern route along the ridge, near the Hudson River; another for a route up Elm street, Lafayette place and 4th avenue to 42d street, there to connect with the proposed elevated tracks of the New York Central Railroad. W. E. Worthen presented a scheme for a series of routes covering every section of the city, including both underground and elevated roads. The advocates of a number of other routes and systems of travel were heard or accorded the privilege of submitting statements and plans. The Commission adopted resolutions calling upon the Chief Engineer to report at its meeting, on Tuesday next, in regard to all sewers in Broadway; to furnish such information as he may obtain with regard to the objections to the present plan of construction, and also as to objections to the double-deck plan of construction; also, to obtain the estimated cost of the construction of a railroad on the present plan, both with limitations as to opening the surface and without limitations; also, that he obtain the estimated cost of a double-deck tunnel, both with openings only at certain specified points and openings at every point where making openings might lessen the expense, and that he make such other objections and furnish such other information upon the foregoing subjects as he may deem desirable; also on the extension of the East Side route.

### Trade Notes.

#### THE SUCCESS OF WOOD BLOCK FLOORING.

## A BEAUTIFUL SOLUTION OF A PROBLEM IN LOUIS XVI STYLE.

The Marie Antoinette deserves to be ranked among the remarkable buildings of the city, in that it is an example of strict fidelity to a principle adopted at its inception. When deciding upon the building its owner determined that in so far as modern requirements would permit it should typify the period of the unfortunate Queen whose name adorns it, and that the interior embellishments, adornments and furniture should be strictly Louis XVI. To carry out this determination, J. T. Hall & Co.'s plans were selected from among those of fifteen other prominent firms simply on their merits, the cost being a secondary consideration. This choice proved a wise one, as numerous critics of the Louis XVI period all praised the decoration as being absolutely correct in all its details. As a result Mr. Wm. L. Flanagan, the owner, and Mr. A. Eugene Kirby, the proprietor, determined to submit their selection of furniture, mantles, gas fixtures and wrought iron work to Mr. C. A. L. Stephens, who had entire charge of the decoration for Hall & Co., and who corrected all drawings and designs so as to make them conform to the Louis XVI style, the result being the production of a building said to be the most beautiful of its kind in the United States.

It is hardly necessary to say that the Marie Antoinette is the hotel which has just been opened for the use of guests under the active management of Mr. Kirby, whose name became familiar as an experienced hotel manager during his connection with the Hotel Savoy and the Gilsey House. The Marie Antoinette has been an object of much interest during the time it was building, by reason of the prominence of its site and the knowledge of what was being attempted in the way of interior arrangement and decoration. Since it has been completed it has been visited by not a few competent judges, who all pronounce it a success, both from the artistic and practical points of view. Its creators have every reason to feel proud of their work, because it is not possible that criticisms upon it can be other than favorable. They have every reason to believe also that the pecuniary results will be equally satisfactory. The neighborhood is one in which, for many reasons, the family hotel flourishes, and the hotel that has so much that gratifies the tasteful eye and is so fortunate in its management is sure to draw patrons. The location of the hotel is peculiarly and particularly good as to transit. There are no less than six surface lines within a short distance, and affording means, through transfers of the Metropolitan Traction Company's system, of reaching every other part of the city. These are the Boulevard and 42d street, the 6th avenue, 8th avenue, 9th avenue, 10th avenue and the Broadway Cable lines. In addition the Metropolitan Elevated Railway 6th and 9th avenue lines are within easy reach. It may be remarked, too, that the centre of population being at Bryant square, the Marie Antoinette is as near that centre as the Fifth Avenue Hotel.

The best idea of the outward appearance of the building can be got from the illustration that accompanies this article. It is only necessary to add that the materials are white limestone and pressed brick of a suitable light shade, and the area railing, lamps, etc., black wrought iron. There are entrances both on the Boulevard and on 66th street, but the principal is the latter. Here the guests first enter, through massive oaken doors, a small vestibule decorated in marble and mosaic tiling and ascending three marble steps come to great handsome doors of wrought iron. The design of these doors consists of strong square bars about a foot apart, filled in top and bottom by an elegant foliage design, and the vacancy of the centre broken by a myrtle wreath surmounted by a crown and inclosing the monogram M. A. in bronze letters. Double plate glass panels protect the interior from the elements without lessening the open effect of the doors. These doors are admitted to be the handsomest of their kind in this country. The main hall is paneled in polished oak for three-quarters of its height surmounted by a rich tapestry frieze, the floor is laid in mosaic of a simple but elegant design, while an immense oaken hood bestrides an open fireplace containing black iron furnishings, in keeping with the surroundings. Curtains in tapestry patterns divide this hall from a further one, on one side of which is the office and on the other the ladies' reception room. The office is peculiar, in that instead of the ordinary commercial looking counter and railing the clerk has an open desk, and besides other things usual and necessary it contains a large safe, in which there is a safe deposit box for every guest, at his disposal without extra charge. The ladies' reception room is chie. It is an accurate reproduction of a boudoir of Marie Antoinette, a fact which will no doubt be fully appreciated by its fair users when they see the dainty silk covering of the walls, the gilded chairs and table; but as they will do this with the assistance of electric light, though that is diffused from an electrolier patterned after the regal chandelier, they may congratulate themselves upon enjoying a brilliance of illumination that even the wilful daughter of Maria Theresa could not command.

Besides the halls and rooms already described and some apartments on the 66th street side, there are on the ground floor three great rooms each of which deserves special mention; these are, the dining-room, the restaurant, entrance to which can be had from the main hall on the 66th street side as well as through the Boulevard porch, and the oak room. The trim of the dining-room is of white mahogany relieved with gold, panels between the woodwork are painted an old pink, the ceilings are decorated with amourettes floating in an atmosphere of light tints among bright flowers, marbled pillars break the expanse of the room. The furniture is made to match the trim and upholstered in a brighter pink than the walls, while a steady influence is imparted among so much brightness by the deeper shade of the carpet and the middle green window hangings. The room is

set with quartette-tables to accommodate a hundred diners, though that is much less than its capacity. A unique feature is the lighting of each table by a large high-electric lamp, shaded with silk in color to match the tint on the walls. When these are lit the wall lights are turned down so that a very beautiful effect is produced when the twenty-five or more large lamps are throwing their rosy light upon the tables and their surroundings. The decorations of the restaurant follow the Louis XVI style perfectly, but the arrangement is entirely different from the dining-room, the trim and woodwork being in old ivory and gold and the upholstering done in deeper shades of color. The oak room is of a totally different character from the other two. It is entered from what might be called the elevator hallway, through an open arched entrance that surmounts a trio of marble steps which must be descended to reach the room. This room is entirely paneled in oak, except for a narrow tapestry frieze, and the room space is broken by oaken pillars and arches; these, with the nooks and corners that have been created out of the irregularities of the room space give a very quaint and at the same time imposing aspect to the room, which is considerably heightened by the subdued light that comes from a stained glass oval dome skylight. The furniture of this room consists of pieces of fine old woodwork, which are more particularly described later on. The great fireplace with its huge oaken hood suggests the burning of huge logs and times long past.

The seven upper floors are laid out in two or more room apartments, proper seclusion being provided in each case by means of private halls. The bath-rooms attached to each apartment are spacious, and in other respects the best of their kind and fitted for shower and other forms of luxurious bathing. The plan of the building is a sort of U and consequently all the rooms are well lighted, and the situation of the building is such that there is a beautiful prospect either of the Boulevard and Park or of the river and Palisades to be had from any of the front windows. In selecting the Louis XVI style there was more room for bright, tasteful, dainty effects in the decoration of the rooms and apartments than would have perhaps been possible in any other. It is essentially a style of light tints and effects. This is brought out strongly in the adornment of the bedrooms and parlors, because, while in the many apartments that the building contains, there is an endless diversity of adornment, the result is never heavy, a tasteful brightness being maintained from the ground to the roof. In the furniture even, while every desirable kind of hard polished wood has been employed, the makers have been kept true to the principle laid down for building, decorating and furnishing. In practical essentials no less than in aesthetic conditions nothing seems to have been forgotten, the apartments are not only supplied with all that is necessary in the way of moveable furniture, but they have, too, plenty of fixed closets, wardrobes, mirrors, etc., with which to make life worth living.

There are a great many beautiful objects scattered through the hotel, collected specially for the purposes to which they have been put and which are sure to attract the attention of visitors. Naturally Marie Antoinette has considerable representation. Her bust in marble, representing her best known portraiture adorns the high oak mantle of the oak room. A fine steel plate engraving has a conspicuous place in the ladies' reception room, and Mr. Flanagan has secured and arranged in the oak room a series of medallion portraits, showing the Queen at various stages of life from childhood to womanhood, besides a number of Louis XVI, too. The handsome clock which stands in the vestibule of the Boulevard entrance is worthy of attention as a good specimen of the horology of the time of Louis XVI; it may also have some further attraction in the minds of many because it at one time adorned the palace of Prince Frederick Carl of Prussia, the Red Prince and a hero of the Austro and Franco-Prussian wars. Unquestionably, however, the objects most deserving of interest are the remarkable pieces of old carved oaken furniture that are mostly found in the oak room, although one remarkable enough to engage anyone's attention has been put into the entrance hall. This latter is a high backed settee upholstered in tapestry, whose condition tells the story of its long life. It apparently belongs to a massive set with the two great armchairs of the oak room, which are adorned with laughing cherubim on the arms and back in the best style of the ancient woodcarvers' art. There are a number of other pieces—tables, chairs and chests—which might also receive description if space would allow. The chef d'œuvre, however, is an exceeding fine piece of work, a high settee, with tapestried seat, supported by carved figures of Apostles and having in the back panels representing the Annunciation and the birth and baptism of Christ, in all of which the figures are cut with the greatest fidelity and display most remarkable results in expression. The piece is fit to, and most probably did originally, adorn a monastery wherein art was appreciated. In the oak room, too, is an exquisite little clock in gold and blue enamel and once the property of Marie Antoinette. It came from the collection of Mon. M. L. Double, of Paris, France, and is of unquestioned authenticity.

It seems like dropping from the sky after entering into the elements that make the character of the Marie Antoinette to talk of plumbing and such commonplace things, but they are just as necessary as light and color, although they do not require such minute description. Among the practical things that have to be taken into account is the construction of the building. It is fire-proof throughout, the halls and stairways are entirely of stone and iron, while the floors are concreted throughout the entire building. The basement holds the billiard-room, which can be reached from the street, the kitchen and other offices in its line. If space would permit the table furnishing should have description, not only because of the generosity of its provision, but also for the elegance of the designs

which are in keeping of course with the rule that everything must conform to the style of Louis XVI. and is as pronounced in the little cream pitcher as it is in the stair railings or the decoration of any of the great apartments.

One item, the elevator car, must not be forgotten, because of the novelty and beauty of its design. The idea was to reproduce a sedan chair in crimson and gold. This, lit up brightly, is very dainty and pretty indeed. The elevator guard on each floor is of the same pattern and material as the iron doors of the main hall previously described. It is not possible to treat the whole of this building, its decoration and contents in all the detail that it deserves, but enough has been said to show that it is not only a commodious place of residence, replete with luxury and convenience, but also that the settings and surroundings of these things have been provided with the best of taste.

### The Eighteenth Street Speculation.

#### IS JOHN WANAMAKER TO BUILD THE BIG STORE TALKED OF.

The latest rumor regarding the purchases by F. Southack & Co., on West 18th and 19th streets, is that they were begun in the interest of John Wanamaker, of Philadelphia, who will build a mammoth retail establishment on the big plot acquired near 6th avenue, and endeavor to show our local merchants how easily their style of doing business can be improved upon. A broker informs us, however, that in a recent communication from Mr. Wanamaker any intention to locate in New York was disclaimed. At the auction sale of the A. T. Stewart property, in March, 1890, in the Real Estate Exchange, F. Southack was the only person who competed with the Tilton interests in the bidding on the dry goods store now occupied by Hilton, Hughes & Co. He ran the price up far beyond what the Tiltons had expected to pay, and it was pretty well understood at the time that he acted as the representative of Mr. Wanamaker. The latter may have again been taken with the New York fever, and his intention to locate in this block would naturally lead to other purchases and perhaps account for the extraordinary speculative buying that has been the most interesting feature of the real estate market for several weeks. Another report is that the project originally conceived by the American Lithographic Company was dropped, after plans for a proposed building had been prepared, owing to the discovery that the site selected would cost not less than double what had been anticipated. In the meantime it was learned that Park & Tilford had been inquiring about a site for a large building, in which could be consolidated the business transacted in their present stores at Broadway and 21st street and on 6th avenue, between 9th and 10th streets. Their lease of the former will expire on May 1, 1896, unless it has recently been renewed. Their attention was called to the 18th and 19th street property. One report has it that they considered it favorably and authorized the purchases, another that they refused to buy but agreed to lease a suitable building if one should be completed by a specified date. The story runs that a syndicate will erect the structure and that its members and others believing that the streets will become a great retail trade centre have been buying indiscriminately everything that could be purchased in the neighborhood. Many other reports are in circulation, but it seems reasonable to ignore them in favor of those that treat with the three big concerns mentioned, the American Lithographic Co., John Wanamaker & Co., and Park & Tilford.

Additional purchases by F. Southack & Co. that have come to light within a week are the following: A sale by H. S. Ely & Co., conjointly with that firm, of the four-story brick dwelling, lot 25x92, No. 27 West 18th street, for John Du Fais, trustee, at about \$55,000; a purchase by Southack & Co. direct, of the similar adjoining dwelling on a lot of the same size, No. 29 West 18th street, from Mrs. Morris J. Warmstadt at \$43,000; another, of the three-story dwelling, No. 26 West 19th street, lot 21.9x92, from E. Louise Smith at \$10,000; the two adjoining dwellings, Nos. 22 and 24 West 19th street, on lots 21.8x92 each, at about \$36,000 apiece; the two-story stable, on lot 25x92, No. 38 West 18th street, bought in 1864 for \$6,500, from Mr. Meyer at about \$42,000; and the four-story stable on lot 25x92, No. 40 West 18th street, from Emanuel Mansbach, for a sum not much less than \$50,000. The latter parcel was bought by the fortunate seller, in March, 1874, for \$21,500 and has since been repeatedly offered at \$30,000. Mr. Mansbach, it is said, even agreed to sell at \$29,000, two or three months ago, but the prospective buyer stood out for \$28,500, and the sale fell through. When first approached by a representative of Southack & Co., who, without beating around the bush, made an offer of \$40,000, the owner was amazed, but was sensible enough to decline the first proposition of an apparently anxious buyer. Possession of none of the parcels is desired by Southack & Co.'s customers until May 1st, but when necessary title is being taken at earlier dates. An offer of \$100,000, for Nos. 51 and 53 West 19th street, is said to have been declined by the owner, John Stewart, who bought the property in February of last year for about \$60,000.

P. J. Cuskley has sold for Mrs. Elizabeth C. Cryder to a Mr. Strickland, through F. Southack & Co., the four-story stone front dwelling, on lot 25x92, No. 35 West 19th street, for \$50,000. The house was purchased by the seller in 1880, for \$30,000.

The Board of Aldermen on Tuesday passed a resolution providing for the regulating and grading of College place. As soon as the resolution is signed by the Mayor the Commissioner of Public Works will begin to carry out the long-delayed work of widening that thoroughfare.

Henry Morgenthau purchased on Tuesday through Richard V. Harritt & Co., the ten shares of stock in the Real Estate Exchange held by Christian Sanders for \$820. This is a gain of two points a share on 80, the price offered last week. Among the recent transfers of Exchange stock have been ten shares each to Edward A. Cruikshank, of William Cruikshank's Sons, E. De Forest Shelton and Charles A. Peabody. Each of the four new owners of shares will no doubt be proposed for membership and elected before the coming annual election.

At last it can truthfully be said of the auction market that its patrons are showing some interest in the offerings. Up to Friday the daily attendance this week was surprisingly large, and that it included buyers is demonstrated by the fact that with hardly an exception every parcel put up secured a purchaser, many of those sold under legal orders going to outsiders. Prices varied, however, from good to bad. The property of the Thomas B. Tweed estate, sold under a partition decree, on Thursday, went off cheaply, but the extreme easterly location of the parcels on 48th street, near the river, was one that operators and investors were chary about buying in.

The most successful sale of the week was that of No. 21 Frankfort street, by order of the executors of the estate of the late Emma Parkinson, held by Peter F. Meyer & Co., on Tuesday. Auctioneer Meyer was in excellent humor and his conduct of the sale showed that he had lost none of the snap that has distinguished him as an auctioneer for many years past. Mainly by reason of his persuasive eloquence the bidding on the parcel was unusually good and prompt, and it was finally knocked down for \$25,000 to the owner of the property adjoining on the corner of William street. The price was considered a high one by several of the experts present.

L. J. Phillips & Co. followed suit on Wednesday by holding a satisfactory executors and voluntary sale of a Goerck street tenement and two parcels on Lexington avenue and 104th street. The selling of the three properties after spirited bidding in each instance was a surprise to the habitues of the Broadway salesroom who had not forgotten the indifference with which public offerings had for several months been viewed by speculators and over fastidious investors. An offering by the same auctioneers on that day of a leasehold lot and four-story building on the northwest corner of Houston street and Avenue B, met with bids so unsatisfactory that they were ignored and the property was withdrawn.

Geo. R. Read sold at No. 111 Broadway, on Thursday, under direction of the receivers of the Archer & Pancoast Manufacturing Co., by order of Judge Lacombe of the United States Court, the real property, assets and good-will of the company, to Samuel B. Lawrence, representing a reorganization committee, for the upset price of \$600,000. The real estate, which is located in Brooklyn, comprises a plot 150.3x45.4x100x250.3x112.3x217.2x40.10, at the southeast corner of Flushing and Carlton avenues; the plot 20.5x86.2x20.4x82.10, with building, on the south side of Flushing avenue, 20.5 feet west of Adelphi street, and the plot 39.6x42.5x39.6x42.6, on the west side of Adelphi street, 39.6 feet west of Flushing avenue. On the same day there was incorporated at Albany the Archer Pancoast Company, capital stock \$10,000. Directors: Archer V. Pancoast, Samuel B. Lawrence, John B. Summerfield, Charles A. Cheever, William S. Fearing, Gordon S. Howe, Byron Traver and Edward Connell.

Auctioneer William Kennelly had an unpleasant and unusual experience on Monday. He offered at public sale a vacant plot, 74.8x79x100x110, on the southeast corner of 167th and Tiffany streets, and after receiving several bids knocked it down at \$3,600 to a bidder who gave the name of Phillip Reville, but is said to have been recognized as Daniel Mitchell. A check for the customary 10 per cent. was given by Mitchell on a private banking house, but apparently having quickly tired of his bargain he sent word in haste to his bankers not to acknowledge the check. When the auctioneer's messenger presented it for certification he met with a refusal, and as the pseudo buyer is said to be irresponsible the sale necessarily fell through. Mitchell claimed to have been informed that the lots contained a great deal of rock that would greatly increase their cost when removed. Hence his refusal to carry out the sale.

On Monday B. L. Kennelly adjourned a foreclosure sale of No. 148 West 82d street until the 21st inst. On Tuesday D. P. Ingraham & Co. adjourned sine die a sale of the two-story building and lot on the east side of 3d avenue, 113 feet north of 188th street. Peter F. # REVIEW AND RECORD.

BROOKLYN, NOVEMBER 17, 1894.

## Notes Gathered Here and There.

Notice is given that the Common Council has declared by resolution its intention to grade and pave Stewart street, from Broadway to Bushwick avenue, with Belgian block pavement. Objections must be filed with the Clerk of the Common Council on or before the 17th day of December.

Notice is given that the assessment rolls for the cost and expense of constructing sewers in Map I, District No. 21, subdivision No. 18, has been completed by the Commissioner of City Works. The Commissioner will be at his office, room 15, Municipal Building, on the 26th day of November at 11 A.M., to hear objections and revise same if necessary.

At the meeting of the Board of Aldermen on Monday the Coney Island & Brooklyn Railroad Company applied for permission to run its trolley line on High street, between Jay and Washington streets. The cars now run on Jay street and the company wants an approach to the bridge. The application was referred to the Railroad Committee.

The Committee on Gas and Electricity reported favorably resolutions to place electric lights as follows: On Liberty street, between Sands and Tillary streets; Schaeffer street, between Central and Knickerbocker avenues, and in the Aldermanic Chamber and Committee Rooms of the City Hall. The reports were adopted. A report was received from the Committee on Lands and Buildings, with a resolution to sell property belonging to the city, at No. 136 3d avenue, to T. W. Budelman for \$3,500. This also was adopted.

At the meeting of the Bridge Trustees, held on Thursday, it was voted to rescind the resolution ordering the construction of an auxiliary storage battery system for lighting the bridge cars. The motion to rescind was made by Trustee Skinner, after Chief Engineer Martin had recommended such action. On motion of Mr. Skinner, Mr. Martin was authorized to solicit bids for two new locomotives, according to plans and specifications. The trustees approved plans for the pillars designed to support the new structure connecting the elevated railroads with the new bridge station. It was voted to order the removal of the pillar in front of the roadway, on the New York side of the bridge, at an expense not to exceed \$3,600.

A special meeting of the Board of Aldermen, called by Mayor Schieren, was held on Thursday in the Common Council Chamber, to confirm the tax levy. Alderman Wallace presided. Alderman Cary offered a resolution that the tax rolls be confirmed pursuant to the laws of 1888. It was adopted, and the Mayor and Comptroller signed the warrants for the collection of the taxes. The Supervisors also met and confirmed the rolls.

The City Works Department has decided to drive forty wells at Freeport on land that was formerly owned by Raynor R. Smith. They are to be 45 feet deep. The wells will be driven just south of the pond which was built to hold the East Meadow Brook water. They will connect with springs below the bed of clay and will not disturb the springs that supply the pond.

As a result of the discussion of the question of the establishment of parks throughout the city Mayor Schieren has appointed an advisory committee on sites for small parks as follows: Walter E. Parfitt, Theodore E. Dreier, H. B. Scharmann, A. D. Baird, Gen. John B. Woodward, J. William Creiger and W. W. Kenyon.

Registrar of Arrears F. W. Hinrichs will sell at auction in Judge Neu's court-room, on December 12th, about 180 lots in the 28th Ward. When these are disposed of he will take up pieces of property in the 27th, 25th, 23d and 18th Wards. These would have been disposed of before, but the Registrar was advised that it was best to wait until the renumbering, necessitated by the changes of the ward boundaries, was completed. These pieces of property will be sold under the provisions of the charter and will be for the taxes of 1893 and prior taxes.

Justice Gaynor, of the Supreme Court, appointed Sanders Shanks referee to sell in the foreclosure suit of Peter Bitterman against Henry Lueck and Attalie Lueck. This has been done to test the constitutionality of Chapter 167 of the Laws of 1889, which provides that the Sheriff shall sell in all foreclosure suits unless the parties to the action, whether they appear or act, consent in writing to the appointment of a referee.

Sealed proposals will be received at the Department of City Works until Friday, November 23d, at 12 M., for erecting gas lamps and posts on Vernon avenue, between Sumner and Lewis avenues.

## Obituary.

Isaac D. Reynolds, senior member of the firm of I. D. Reynolds & Son, architects, died at his residence, No. 270 Hart street, on Sunday last. Mr. Reynolds was in his 63d year, and has been a prominent architect in this city for the past thirty years.

## BUILDING MATERIAL MARKET.

## NEW YORK.

According to figures obtained from official records the following imports were made into the United States for nine months ending September 30, 1894, and for corresponding period in 1893. Free of duty: Wood unmanufactured, \$4,178,647 against \$5,608,449. Dutiable: Cement, \$2,543,762 against \$2,770,988; tin plats, \$8,662,376 against \$13,366,229; marble and stone, \$906,004 against \$1,337,396; paints and colors, \$713,812 against \$1,088,524; wood and manufactures of wood, \$6,197,090 against \$11,202,481. Covering the same period the exports show, of marble and stone, \$793,944 against \$744,842, and wood and manufactures of wood, \$21,921,911 against \$20,827,858.

In conformity with orders issued by the Superintendent of Public Works, the State canals will be closed at midnight, November 30th, unless ice formation anticipates the official action.

**BRICKS.**—There seems to be just a little bit of improvement again on the market for Common Hards, and, while the prices current seem ridiculously low, the season of the year considered, it is nevertheless gratifying to find there is some stiffening of tone. Some receivers appear to think that possibly \$4 62 1/2 might be high enough to quote for an average top figure on cargo deals, but \$4.75 has been made in such form as would seem to justify it going upon record, and so far as can be learned there is now nothing that can be called merchantable available for less than \$4.25, the narrow limit between the extremes being accounted for by the general good average of quality. During the early portion of the week the arrivals were moderate, but of late have run up into fuller general volume, comprising the previously entertained idea that as soon as barges could be obtained they would be loaded and sent forward. Consumption has again been somewhat interfered with by unpropitious weather conditions, but any lase in demand for stuff to go to jobs has been balanced by the purchase of desirable loads which have been tied up in slip and covered, or will be, against winter requirement. Pales are much sought after and appear to sell at about former rate. There is nothing particularly new from along the river as the season is over so far as production is concerned, and further shipments will probably be comparatively light.

**GLASS.**—Business not only here but at interior points continues quite unsatisfactory, and the market is not a healthy or harmonious one by any means. Indeed it is just as well to look upon all quotations as somewhat nominal at the moment in view of constant evidence that sellers are leaving no stone unturned to place their goods, and while ostensibly endeavoring to maintain a uniform run of discounts it is generally suspected that desirable customers are secured by giving them extra allowances under secret agreements, both on lots from factories and from jobbers' hands. It is even asserted that notwithstanding the renewal of the compact between importers only two or three weeks ago there is reason to believe that secret cutting has already commenced again, although exactly where or to what extent no one is prepared to say. Altogether there is too much glass and too little demand,

LATH.—The market altogether has held in pretty good form. During early portion of the week conditions looked a little slack, and sales were made at \$1.65 under momentary pressure of stock, some of it thin cut, but subsequent moderate offerings gave receivers an advantage which was augmented by quite a little snap to demand and the range was raised to \$1.70@\$1.75, the latter apparently the latest figure. Taking the week through supplies have been moderate, and it is expected will continue so, while there are evidences of considerable stock wanted by dealers in this locality.

LIME.—A measure of irregularity continues on the general market for Eastern, but conditions are no worse than last week and probably a little better. We have reports of business at 85c. and 95c. respectively for common and finishing, and probably a larger portion of the trading was done upon that basis early in the week, but within a day or two quite a line has been placed at 90c. and \$100. less discount for cash, and a portion of the trade express a determination to stand out for those figures quite firmly. The unsold accumulation here is very large, said to be in excess of anything known at this time for many years, but against that there is the claim that pretty much all the vessels are regular and owned by shippers of the lime, who propose carrying for their price and letting the cargoes lay until they command the limit. It is also reported that manufacturers at Rockland are working in harmony in effort to sustain the market, although without any agreement. There are, however, a great many buyers who are quite willing to handle Thomaston, even at a very small difference in cost, and State and West Virginia products also have numerous friends.

LUMBER.—In the matter of distribution there has been rather more doing since our last, and of somewhat broader character as to variety of stock handled, but nothing up to a point of real animation, nor is anything of that sort expected this winter. Dealers are watching with some satisfaction evidence of a better feeling toward real estate, and while hardly likely to get much benefit therefrom before spring, are becoming hopeful that preliminary signs of returning healthy trade can be claimed in current developments. Against the present run of custom, supplies and assortments are sufficient to meet most calls with becoming promptness, and additions are still being made from late deliveries on contract, but there is considerable irregularity on prices, as each dealer makes a rate to suit the business in hand, and the range is pretty wide.

The negotiations over bulk lots are becoming somewhat irregular, with a tendency to diminish, especially on supplies from interior localities dependent upon canal navigation. A great deal of stuff will, no doubt, get worked through by that source of transportation, but it is considered a little late to start fresh lots, more particularly from distant points, and trading tends more to car lot form or such offerings as can be made by coasting vessels. Superintendent Hannan, of the State Department of Public Works, has ordered that the Erie, Champlain, Black River, Oswego and Cayuga and Seneca canals be closed for the season on Friday, Nov. 30, at midnight, unless sooner closed, by ice. A great many salesmen are hanging around the market yet, and seem to be quite willing to negotiate for rail delivery during winter upon terms apparently quite as easy as for weeks past, and with few exceptions values are too unsettled for close positive quotations. From foreign custom the demand is only fair, and generally met without difficulty at former cost.

White Pine has been coming in with some freedom from all points of supply, this State, Canada and the West, but not a great many new deals making of which immediate shipment is intended. Some of the stuff is of low cost and poor quality which is likely to cause receivers some difficulty on the attempt at a turn over, but there is a fair proportion of desirable quality to satisfy buyers who want first-class goods and are willing to pay a fair price for it. The mills are gradually shutting down, but preparations are making for about the usual amount of work in the woods.

Yellow Pine is tending toward greater steadiness. There is not at the moment any very large demand or apparent tendency toward pronounced improvement in values, but operators claim to already feel the influence of the movement making at various points to central supplies and insist upon living rates, and greater strength of tone is calculated upon for next season.

Spruce is salable without much difficulty because there is no excess of stock offering and very good custom can be found for about anything of desirable quality offered. Receivers appreciate, however, that it is not a season when the seller has positive command of the market, and can preserve advantage only through the comparative smallness of supplies. Unless accounts from the

eastward are erroneous, the offerings are likely to continue scanty, and from both this State and West Virginia the probabilities are that manufacturers will continue to restrict shipments to actual orders. There is more hopeful talk in regard to piling fair amounts are in stock, but arrivals moderate, and recent developments lead to an impression that before long renewed animation will be shown in dock building.

Carolina Pine has fair chance for improvement. It is not expected that any great addition will be secured for the demand right away, because the stock is generally found easy of access during the winter and buyers see no necessity for hurry, but the methods of manufacturers tend toward a more careful production and such other action as may seem most likely to prevent useless cutting on the line of value.

Hemlock does not get into settled condition as yet, and there are said to be too many small manufacturers compelled to seek a market to hope for immediate uniformity of values. Large operators, however, are becoming tired of working with no margin for profit, and stand out for reasonably full figures. The demand is fair but not what it should be at this time of the year.

Hardwoods are going into the hands of actual consumers with rather more freedom than a week ago, but cannot show a market quite equal to what was hoped for, even allowing for the dull times. For bulk parcels the inquiry is fluctuating, and while at times matters appear quite encouraging for a little vim in trade, there is apt to be a quick change in the situation. Such experiences, however, are easily traceable to attitude of buyers who, although negotiating promptly enough when determined to invest, confine their orders to positive and clear-cut necessities, and stop short the moment they have secured a supply to that extent. Offerings are ample for all current calls.

The first of the public auction sales under the newly incorporated association of Mason & Co. Limited was held on Thursday, Mr. Waldron Williams acting as auctioneer. The offering was made up principally of foreign woods, cedar, mahogany and satinwood, and attracted a good representative attendance of buyers from the local and out-of-town trade. Bidding appeared to be of a very general character, all hands showing interest and over specially desirable parcels competition at times proved quite keen. The prices obtained were generally claimed to be satisfactory and quite equal to figures ruling in open market. A luncheon was served by the auctioneers to all in attendance at the sale.

#### GENERAL LUMBER NOTES.

##### STATE.

The Albany *Argus* as follows:

Last week's trade showed improvement, and though bad weather interfered somewhat, houses handling white pine met a good fall demand and more lively times were reflected throughout the district. The usual November business is expected for the rest of the month. Canal freights have advanced to \$1.75, but general market conditions are otherwise unchanged. In spruce there was a good trade and stocks are getting down pretty fine. The supply to be wintered will surely be light. Dealers are taking no new trade at old prices, the quotations having stiffened up considerably.

##### THE WEST.

The *Northwestern Lumberman* reviews the general situation as follows:

Though it is too late in the season to expect a marked revival and a general swell in the lumber trade, the tendency should be a firmer tone in the market and higher prices after the close of navigation. Holders of lumber will be less eager to unload stocks at the low figures which have prevailed, for they will have confidence that values will certainly not go lower, while the strong probability is that an appreciable advance will be realized within ninety days.

It is now clearly seen and acknowledged that white pine stocks at lake points west of Saginaw Valley have been sold out closer to the saw than anybody thought possible early in the season. Though there is a good deal of unsold lumber massed at Saginaw and Bay City and at upper Mississippi River points, there has been such a clearing out at Manistee, Ludington, Menominee, Marinette, Ashland and Duluth, as well as at minor points on the lakes, that the surplus in the two extreme east and west districts can not be a serious menace to market or prices. Much of this surplus will disappear during the winter. It is a noticeable feature of recent trade reports that heavy sales have lately been made at Saginaw Valley and Huron

shore points of lumber to come to this market, showing that the demand has been unsatisfied in the west, and that it is reaching even to eastern Michigan for an adequate supply. Another notable thing has lately been witnessed, which is the visitation at Duluth of eastern buyers for the purchase of stocks for next season's trade. This movement is an unusual thing in the fall, and indicates restored confidence in the eastern trade, as well as a forelooking for an advance of prices early in the coming year. It need not be considered strange if heavy traders in lumber in the east and in the west shall during the winter contract for large blocks of stock to be sawed next season, in sharp contrast to the absence of such transactions last winter; for confidence in the future has been restored by the results of the late election, and experienced lumber dealers know that there must be reaction, and that within a few months, from the extreme depression of the past year. It is believed, and that with ample justification, that there must be a better condition of the lumber trade growing out of such reaction, and that he who would get into the market with a lumber supply, bought at low, or comparatively low figures, must be up and at it early in the coming year. It remains to be seen whether stumpage owners and mill operators will be willing to sell stuff to be cut next season at figures that will meet the views of intending purchasers.

It has furthermore been noticed by handlers of white pine stumpage in this city that inquiry for chances to buy standing timber are increasing, whereas a few months ago there was next to no demand. All things point to a revival of interest in pine, which is liable to culminate in many actual transactions during the coming three or four months.

Trade at wholesale points in the west has been slightly checked during the week by the elections. It is probable that henceforward there will be a subsidence of demand, for the season for distribution in the rural districts is nearly at a close. Reports from some points, however, indicate a continuance of a fair volume of trade. The movement from all wholesale points during October was larger than in September, or in October last year.

There is an increasing demand for dry poplar. Stocks on hand are comparatively light and prices consequently getting firmer, though the range is still considerably below the association list. Common and cull are both in abundant supply, with prices weak and the movement rather sluggish. The river mills are still without logs, but, as a rule, have sufficient lumber on hand to carry them through the winter, unless there shall be an unexpected large increase in the demand.

The Mississippi Valley *Lumberman* in reviewing general trade prospects, says:

The main danger appears to be from an excessive log cut the coming winter and as steps were taken by the white pine manufacturers at the meeting to curtail the cut of green timber this winter and devote all energies to banking the burned over stuff, it looks as if little need be feared on this score. The letting up of the political strain, at any event, will be a relief, and the knowledge of what is going to be done in the future in the way of legislation will tend to restore confidence and encourage proprietors of large industries, manufacturing plants and the investors of capital to go ahead with business ventures and start the wheels going in manufactures, thus giving employment to many and generally improving the situation.

The heavy rains of the past week over the timber area of the Northwest have filled swamps and rivers with water, which will put them in good condition for logging, providing cold weather comes at the proper time and there is sufficient snow for hauling. Operations are actively under way and the burned timber is being cut down in every section where the fires raged. From the present indications there will be a light log cut on the upper Mississippi and Chippewa Rivers, with about the same amount cut on the Black and St. Croix as last year.
