THE stock market has rarely if ever been so strong in the face of heavy gold exports as it has this week, and although it weakened somewhat yesterday when the amount to be shipped was actually announced, the fact did not detract from or make less apparent the real strength that underlies the market. Whatever tendencies prices display in the next week, or until the demands of Europe upon our gold supply are satisfied, it is quite obvious that there is a greater disposition to buy than to sell, and this, coupled with the light realizing of security holders in the past thirty days, argues well for better quotations with the incoming year. The chastened spirit in which Congress has received suggestious for the improvement of the condition of the railroads and of the currency has had a great deal to do with the strength of prices and the demand for railroad securities especially. Of course, the Railroad Pooling Bill, if it becomes a law, will not do everything for the railroads that is claimed for it, but it will do a good deal, and its passage will be hailed with no little satisfaction by kindred industries, notably the iron industry, which is languishing simply because of the policy of extreme economy to which the railroad companies are now compelled to resort because of the poverty of their returns. It has become an anxiom that when the railroad industry is depressed all business is depressed. That is hardly the case, because the railroads can only lose their business when other industries decline. But there can be no question whatever that as soon as the railroads feel justified in placing their orders for steel rails, equipment, etc., ahead of the time when they will be required, business all over the country will receive an immense stimulus. For this reason the attitude of the Senate and President toward the Pooling Bill will be awaited with the utmost interest in all the markets of the country. The immediate movement of prices will therefore, continue to hinge on action or inaction in Congress.

ONDON is not doing much in foreign securities, consequently home and colonial governments and municipals are receiving more attention than seems quite consistent with an expectation of the maintenance of prices of those issues. Consols make new records every week and some of the municipal 212s promise to touch par, one, of which \$7,500,000 were issued only eighteen months ago at 89, is now ten points higher. These prices will not stand when the time comes for large withdrawals of money into commerce. Speculation pure and simple has been almost wholly confined to South African gold mining shares, of which large issues have been made as a result of the increased output of the mines. The advance in the price of Consols, in which deposits in the Post Office Savings Bank are invested, and the automatic reduction that will take place in the return paid on them, may compel the government to consider the necessity for reducing interest paid on deposits from 212 to 2 per cent. Paris has not only taken to speculating in South African gold mining shares, but is also forming a company to work a number of claims under a concession from the East Rand Company. The French Chamber of Deputies has under discussion a bill to increase by 30 to 50 per cent. the duties on starch, exotic farinacea and their derivatives. The Bourse was kept strong for the floating of the new Russian loan. Germany reports the condi tion of the several iron centres in her midst as still unsatisfactory, business shrinking notwithstanding low prices. In Berlin a demand for American investments is springing up. Renewed friction between the Government and the Socialists is causing uneasiness in political circles. Vienna and Budapest have it seems both been thoroughly scared by their recent narrow escape from panic, and propositions have been introduced into the bourses of both cities to prevent increasing gambling in securities; it will be interesting to learn how they propose to

Austria is again in the market for gold; all the gold currency required for the reform now being carried out must be coined within two years. Bohemian sugar has fallen in value in advance of an increase in the output of the German refineries this year. The premium on gold at Buenos Ayres having risen again, Argentine securities have declined. Figures recently published show that exports of wheat, corn, etc., from the Argentina increased in value from \$16,800,000 in 1889 to \$29,000,000 in 1893, and exports of wool, hides, skins, etc., decreased from \$96,700,000 in 1889 to \$53,000,000 last year. The growing capacity of the Republic to ship wheat is shown by the fact that exports for the first half of 1894 were greater than those for the whole of the previous year, which in turn were double what they were in 1892. In 1882, 1,700 tons only were exported, and ten years later nearly 500,000 tons, last year, 1,000,137 tons, and this year, in six months, 1,029,546 tons. From June 30th to October 31st, the British market alone took about 300,000 tons, so that it is possible that the complete return for the year will show another doubling of the amount sold in foreign markets,

"Map-Making."

So many reforms have been suggested lately that one hesitates to add to the list. Such a great number of plans have been laid out for tinkering with the municipal structure without reconstructing it at the foundation, where the evil really is, that there is great danger that in the end we shall conclude to retain the old building with the addition of merely a few slight superficial alterations. However, while people are in so kindly a mood towards all schemes for reformation which do not include themselves, we cannot resist the temptation to point out a cer tain direction along which the zeal of the real estate body might travel for the benefit of all concerned.

It is obvious that as the city grows, the lines of individual interest and activity must, with increasing frequency, cross the lines of public or corporate interest and activity. All legal proceedings attending the opening of new streets, the widening of old ones, the creation of parks and public places, the acquisition of land for railroad and other similar purposes indicate where these intersections occur. Broadly speaking, the principle that rules in these collisions between the interest of the few and the interest of the many is that the lesser must succumb to the greater-public requirements dominate private convenience. This is all very well, and on the score of the principle one has no complaint to make. The evil, and hence the need for reformation, arises from the manner in which the principle is worked out. It is scarcely too much to say that the entire system of acquiring real estate for public or quasi-public purposes now in vogue, needs restriction if not reconstruction in order to insure a full measure of fair dealing to owners of realty which that class is very frequently deprived of to-day.

In another column our readers will find a story of how the City has, unwittingly, no doubt, and perhaps through the force of the defects of the system under which the authorities work, trifled with a vast amount of property of its citizens to no advantage to any one. It is an ordinary example of how, whenever real estate is wanted for municipal purposes a crude antiquated inefficient piece of machinery is set in motion at an unnecessary cost to everybody-except, be it never forgotten, to the few who are "working" it. In this Concourse or Boulevard matter beyond the Harlem, to which we allude, the Departments have gone to work in a random way to plan on the maps of the city a new thoroughfare of quite unusual dimensions. By the estimates the improvement calls for an expenditure of from fifteen to twenty millions of dollars. It affects, of course, a very large amount of property directly as well as indirectly. We have nothing to say about the improvement itself; what we wish to point out, in the interest of property owners, is that it and other similar improvements should not legally considered until the authorities have fully determined that the improvement is necessary and practicable and particularly have ascertained that the means for carrying it out promptly to a successful conclusion are positively at their command. As matters run to-day, the Department "go it blind," as the saying is. A few ambitious, or perchance public-spirited citizens, make their appearance, lift their heads for a moment above the enormous level of popular indifference to civic affairs and demand that the Great Multilinear Boulevard extending for miles, from —th street to —th street, to cost \$50,000,000, more or less, be undertaken, as it is an immediate necessity if New York City is to retain its supremacy as the chief city in the Union. The authorities are convinced. It is hard to be disobliging in so small a matter. It is comparatively easy to delineate the proposed improvement upon the city maps and, too,

the action has an air about it of official activity and enterprise. This essay in map making, however, is a really serious matter for the real estate owners whose property is touched by the cartographers' lines. The only reality in the proceeding up to this point is the effect which it has upon real estate. Months certainly, and most probably years, will go by before the "improvement" is advanced to its second stage, the map-makers having done their work quite irrespective of the plans of the city government or the finances of the municipality. The precious idea, however, has been committed to paper. It is on record. Let it take its course. Who cares?

It is not possible for real estate owners to share this indifference. The proposed improvement is henceforth in reality a lien upon their property. Theoretically they should suffer no pecuniary loss and frequently, no doubt, in such cases there is no loss occasioned. In a very large number of instances, however, there is loss of one kind or another. The owner himself hesitates to improve property the possession of which he holds upon an uncertain tenure and this uncertainty affects everybody to whom he might endeavor to sell his land. By these conditions the owner is needlessly damaged, the property lies fallow, the city receives less taxes from it, the entire neighborhood is unsettled—and no one is a bit the better off. The question at once suggests itself. Why not lock up the map-maker and restrain his pernicious activity until the city is ready to actually begin work. Then commence the formalities.

But the evil of the ruling system does not end here. Real estate remains between the upper and nether grindstone (the former being official incompetency and the latter official rascality) even after the city determines to acquire title to the land it needs for a given improvement. The scheme is transferred from the peaceful repository where it has laid for-years, in fact since the map-makers finished it, to the hands of certain Commissioners of Estimate and Apportionment who, practically speaking, control their own actions in the premis s at the rate of ten dollars a day. Politics, of course, are mixed up with the business, and even without politics human nature works slowly on municipal affairs at ten dollars a day. Perhaps people are given to exaggerating the dilatoriness of these commissioners, but it is said that expectancy of a decision in certain proceedings has become an hereditary possession. Certainly all these transactions are unnecessarily long. They are unjust. They damage real estate. The city, in whose interest presumably they are undertaken, gains nothing.

Real estate is subject not only to injuries such as the foregoing, inflicted upon it by the municipal authorities, but it is also subject to the assaults of private speculation. It is not very long ago that some imaginative mind conceived a railroad that was to run right through the centre of this city and thence to Boston or some other irrelevant point. A company was formed to fertilize this idea, offices were taken on Broadway, and then, of course, the map-making began. A lot of splendid drawings were turned out with a broad, red line running through, no one knows how many millions or tens of millions dollars worth of property. This property, it was said, was to be summarily condemned. Of course, along with these stories went the usual one, that the company had lots of money and wou'd begin operations at once. The scheme, naturally, was impossible, but the public is timid when it comes to putting its money into real estate or building, or anything else, indeed, of a permanent character. It would not, perhaps, take much stock in any of these stories if the exact facts were published. The exact facts, however, never are given to them. There is always brag and bluster about these enterprises so that people become doubtful and prefer to invest their money in property that is not affected by possible schemes, imaginary or otherwise.

The New York and New Jersey Bridge Company's scheme is of somewhat the same order. It is true the company has accepted conditions which fix a term to its enterprise, but we all know how enterprises dawdle along despite charter provisions. The company is already in hot water about the form of bridge to be built, and we understand it declares that it cannot proceed with work unless it can build a structure which the authorities at Washington and the shippers of New York object to. The future course of events it is pretty easy to see. In the meantime, however, this company has been map-making, and has been busy with other people's real estate in quite a wholesale way.

It seems to us that real estate owners might fairly protest against all of this map-making by both the municipal authorities and private corporations and speculators. It is a reasonable demand that no City Department should entertain any improvement directly affecting real estate until it is ready and has fully determined to push the improvement without any delay to its completion. Of course, the dilatory system at present in votue for acquiring title to property, assessing values, etc., should be completely reformed. As to the operations of private individuals, they should be prohibited or at least the incorporation of a company should not be permitted until the promoters have given bonds not only for the completion of the work contemplated within a stated period, but for all damages their transactions may cause to real estate. In short, the whole system, under which we are at present working, should be reconstructed.

THE Amendment to the Inter-State Commerce Act, repealing the section inhibiting pooling arrong the railroads which passed the House so quickly and with so large a majority in its favor, while of very great importance to the railroads has a larger and more general importance in showing the trend of feeling among our legislators. Before the last election no legislation favoring railroad corporations would have found any favor among them because of a mistaken notion they had that the people were opposed to anything that favored corporations or the making of combinations to put up prices or rates of service. But public opinion has so changed that the House has seen fit to accept a measure which, if it becomes a law, will result in the creation of combinations greater than any yet seen. While the railroad companies of the country may in the main preserve their identity as at present existing, they will be united into groups to control the business of great divisions of the country and to maintain the rates of their remuneration. The House having surrendered its position in this matter has increased the hope of a favorable and speedy outcome to other suggested measures bearing on the business situation. Congress, as a whole, shows and maintains the reasonable disposition which so obviously animates the House it ought, in addition to securing this measure for the relief of the railroads, to be rossible to secure the passage of another to relieve the currency situation and also to prevent the exhibition of the whims and notions of cranks or any disturbance of tariff conditions. time at the disposal of Congress does not warrant an expectation of a thorough and permanent reform of the currency, but it is sufficient for removing some of the most glaring deficiencies, pending an exhaustive discussion of the whole question and the adoption of a comprehensive scheme. If this is done and the railroads are put in a position to better their finances the effect on the business of the country will be immeasurably good, and the present session of this Congress will result as advantageously to the country, as its previous sessions have resulted mischievously.

Annual Meeting at the Real Estate Exchange.

The eleventh annual meeting of the stockholders of the Real Estate Exchange on Monday aroused little interest among the members of whom there were but twenty present when the call to order was made promptly at 1 o'clock by President George R. Kead. The usual resolution dispensing with the reading of the minutes of the previous annual meeting having been adopted, Secretary Douglas Robinson read the balance sheet, published in The Record and Guide of last week, showing the financial condition of the Exchange at the close of the fiscal year, ending on November 15. President Read's address was as follows:

"The report and balance sheet, a copy of which has been sent to each stockholder, must be a matter of satisfaction to all well wishers of the Exchange. During the past year the building, which had been somewhat neglected, has been put in thorough repair, involving an expenditure of \$3,631 44. The pumps which had run for eight years and were somewhat worn have been put in order. The plumbing in the basement, which has been a source of great annoyance to the members and to the staff, has been torn out and renewed. The building, both in and out, has been painted and all dilapidations made good, at a cost of \$1,314.02. The roof has also been renewed. These, with other minor improvements, have placed our real estate in excellent order. You will observe that the cost of the running expenses, so far as the Exchange itself is concerned, have been reduced by the sum of \$2,465.74, the amount this year being \$8,576.05, as against \$11,041,79 last year. We bave, I think, carried the principle of economy as far as expedient, and some of the members have complai ed of want of attention in the Bureau, caused by the smallness of the staff. But we have met hard times by economy, and I am sure that the members will not regret this, although it may have been possibly at some inconvenience to themselves. I am glad to notice that the market price of the stock is beginning to approach more nearly to its intrinsic value. And it should be borne in mind that the value of the stock is based on the value of our building. If that were sold enough would be realized to give stockholders at least \$125 for each share. The movement for the formation of a Brokers' Board, referred to in the annual report, is no new effort on the part of this Exchange to meet the requirements of the brokers' business; but it differs from the attempt made in 1885, principally in this, that was an attempt by the Exchange to provide a system for the brokers, whereas, the present is an attempt by the brokers to provide a system for themselves. During the past year we have bad some serious losses by death; particularly that of Mr William Cruikshank, to whose honorable and eminent character the Board have paid a fitting tribute. And now, gentlemen, there remains but little more for me to do than to thank you for the consideration I have received at the hands of the members of this Exchange during the four years I have occupied the position of your President. It was my wish to have resigned last year, but under the circumstances of the case and at the request of the Board I consented to retain the presidency during the past year."

Some discussion followed of the time-worn suggestion of forming a plan to substitute for the \$73,000 mortgage on the Exchange building bonds to bear interest at 3½ per cent. or less, which would be a saving to the annual expense account of at least \$730. The President, however, explained that such a proposition had been made several years ago and had, after full consideration, been rejected for the

reason that the Exchange was not authorized by its charter to issue bonds. He advocated the appointment of a committee of two to devise, if possible, some other plan to secure the desired lower rate of interest on the indebtedness, and a resolution to that effect was adopted, with instructions that the committee report to the incoming Board on January 2. In referring to the subject, President Read stated that it would have been possible at any time within the past few years to secure a mortgage at a lower rate of interest, had the Directors of the Exchange been permitted by the charter to give their bond to insure its payment.

The election of Directors followed, the polls opening at 1:30 and closing at 3 P. M. As there was no opposition to the regular ticket the voting on the cumulative plan proceeded in humdrum fashion. The inspectors were A. B. Ashforth, F. R. Houghton, who filled the position as substitute for Irving Ruland, candidate for Director, and E. C. Martin, representing Henry W. Donald, of Richard V. Harnett & Co., who was unable to be present. The election resulted as follows, the figures given being the number of votes cast for each can-

The Board also decided to continue in power the recently appointed brokers' Committee of Fifteen.

The Plan for Revivication.

In connection with the question of increasing the usefulness of the Real Estate Exchange to its members a gentleman well versed in all matters relating to the passing of title to real estate, sends us the suggestion that on account of existing laws and usages it would be a good plan for the vendor of real property to offer with it a liberal policy of insurance or guarantee from a title guarantee company. "What I mean by liberal," he says, "is that it shall not terminate in a short term and shall be assignable and transferrable to each new owner upon payment of a nominal fee. Title companies would make a contract with the Exchange to furnish such policies at a reduced cost. The policy could be held in readiness for the prospective purchaser and could be delivered at short notice, perhaps in an hour and certainly in twenty-four hours. The Real Estate Exchange should keep a register of all titles that have been thus guaranteed for future reference, so that when a piece of property is offered again the policy may be reissued to the new buyer. It must be conceded that with a copy of the records relating to real estate, the facilities of the title company for performing this work are complete and it would be useless for the Exchange to undertake to do more than I suggest, unless it made its own abstracts of the public records. This would entail an outlay of capital that some of the conservative members would not approve, and further, in order to do it the organization of the Exchange would have to be changed because, I believe, it is beyond the scope of its charter to engage in the business of title guaranteeing. In buying real property an agreement and memoranda in writing are made. A lawyer is then engaged to examine the title. He examines or pretends to do so, no matter how many times the same title has been examined before. In making his searches he ignores those made for prior owners, giving as a reason that they would be useless in case a mistake had been made by a previous searcher. The result is that the same expense is incurred over and over again. So it will be every time the property is disposed of until a plan of liberal insurance (the policy transferrable to each succeeding buyer) is adopted. Purchasers at first may not have confidence in this method, but if real estate men will wake up and get out of the rut in which transfers are made, it will not be long before they can sell and transfer real property in an hour. How often brokers are told by buyers of real property that they have been buying for so long and have never made any loss, a fact which they attribute to the ability of their lawyer. Yet at times questions of law arise affecting or clouding a title to real property which has been passed several times by qualified lawyers. Doubts or quibbles are raised by lawyers frequently to enable a client to back out of the bargain he has made. All possibilities or doubts in a title should be insured against by a title company. It is a risk, of course, but they are paid for taking it, and chances of entire loss are so small that the premium should be correspondingly low. If I insure in a life insurance company the risk is taken and that, too, in defiance of the fact that I will die at some time. The company does not require me to submit to periodical examinations to see if they will continue the policy. There are but few defects that arise in any title but what can be remedied and the cloud removed."

Municipal Rapid Transit.

Recent remarks by Mr. Claffin show that the Rapid Transit Commission, of which he is a member, anticipates that the constitutionality of the act by which the commission exists will be tested in the courts. However, the commission continues cheerfully at work. Engineers of the commission and the New York Central R. R. Co. are conferring on the plan of the former for developing the East Side, and if the stories which are circulating in Wall Street, with the alleged authority of Mr. Russell Sage, are to be believed, the Manhattan Elevated Railway Company will soon make further work of the com mission unnecessary by reason of the fine service they will give. Travellers on the L roads, however, are sceptical of these reports, as they do not notice any remarkable lessening of the jam to which they have been victims for so long.

Personal.

The building trade has been deeply concerned to learn that Mr. James Livingston, one of its well-known members, is dangerously sick as a consequence of the injuries he received last week when knocked down by a horse on the Columbus avenue crossing of 72d street. News of a favorable turn in his illness would be received with the greatest satisfaction by his host of friends in and allied to the trade. Late reports, however, indicate that Mr. Livingston is in a very precarious condition.

The Hudson River Bridge.

Secretary Lamont has refused to approve the application of the New York and New Jersey Bridge Company for a cantilever bridge with a pier in the river, and requires that the bridge to be built shall have a single span between the pier lines of New York harbor. This decision is based upon the findings of the government Commission of Engineers reported some time ago.

Correspondence.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

You extend an invitation to your readers to give their ideas as to whether the present Building Department can be improved, and if so, how best to improve it.

In response to this invitation, I would say that the present Building Department can be improved very much and very simply, too. In the first place, the Superintendent and Inspectors should hold office during good behavior. The head of the department, the Superintendent, should receive a salary commensurate with the importance of his position and the qualifications required to fill it, say, at least, \$10,000 per annum. The Inspectors should receive a salary of at least \$1,500 per annum, and more of them. The Department should be removed as far as possible from all political influence. With these simple changes, I am thoroughly satisfied that the Building Department will be as nearly perfect as we can expect a municipal department to be.

I think there should be a change in the law which prohibits the building of fire-proof apartment houses over seven stories high. There is no reason why they should be prohibited, while hotels and so-called "Family Hotels" may be built twenty stories high. So long as they are built fire-proof they should be allowed.

There are many amendments, no doubt, which might be made to the Building Laws which would improve them, and which the Superintendent of Buildings could suggest from his experience of the working operation of the present Building Law.

I think that no change should be made in the head of this Department, as we have in Mr. Brady, the present incumbent, a faithful, competent and painstaking superintendent and one who gives satisfaction to owners, architects and builders

MEDALS FOR ARCHITECTURAL DESIGNS.

The Chicago Architectural Sketch Club has published the report of the Adjudicating Committee for the Robert Clark testimonial, stating that the competition as a whole was a decided success. The draughtsmanship was excellent, with but few exceptions. Considering the age limit of 30 years, the same cannot be said of the main feature in a competition; that is, that a building shall look like and suggest what it is intended for. The great majority of contestants submitted designs too suggestive for art galleries, institutes, etc., too monumental in their arrangement of parts and the disposition of detail too lavish. The selections were finally narrowed down to four designs and awards were made by written vote of each judge: Medal, Willard Hirsh, Cleveland, O.; Silver Medal, Edwin R. Clark, Lowell, Mass.; Bronze Medal, Ernest F. Guilbert, Chicago, Ill.; Mention, Albert Kahn, Detroit, Mich. LEASE-FORECLOSURE OF MORTGAGE.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

A owns a piece of property which he gives in care of an agent to manage, and orally tells agent to execute leases, signing A's name thereto. A fails to pay his interest on mortgage and mortgagee forecloses his mortgage on property. B who has bought the property at auction then notifies tenants that leases executed by A's agent are void, Tenants were not made defendants in foreclosure suit, nor were the leases on record. Kindly inform me whether said leases executed by A's agent are valid and bind B.

Answer.-The leases executed by A's agent are valid, and so long as the tenants pay their rent during the term B cannot dispossess them. LAW EDITOR.

SIZE OF LOT.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

Has the size of a lot been defined by any law of the State, so that when a plot is spoken of as containing so many lots it is legally established what the area is? In other words, has a lot been defined, when nothing further is said, to be understood to contain 2,000 or 2,500 square feet. I have been told that an order to have a definite standard that the Legislature had established the area to be 2,000. Is it so?

Answer .- The size of a "lot" has not been regulated by the Legislature.—LAW EDITOR.

BROKER'S COMMISSION.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

I exchange two pieces of property, as broker, a flat valued at \$28,-000 for a house valued at \$25,000 and furniture therein valued at \$5,000, the usual commission of course 5 per cent on furniture and 1 per cent value of house, as there was no cash passed, the owner of house refused to exchange unless I accepted from him only \$150 commission, which I did. Above commission being paid; on passing title owner of house refused to accept the exchange claiming that owner of flat had misrepresented value and income and demanding a certain amount named in first exchange. Finally a compromise was made and a certain amount of cash was paid and properties transferred. I sent in a bill for the full commission to owner of house who received the cash payments, giving credit for amount paid, but be refused to recognize me or my bill and says the first amount paid settled the commission, saying that the lawyers arranged the settlement, but, not without my assistance as they required my testimony about the original exchange; am I not entitled to my full commission?

Answer.-No.-LAW EDITOR.

LEASE-OPTION TO BUY.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

If I lease a plot of ground to a tenant for a number of years, and if it is stipulated in the lease that within a certain period the tenant has "an option of purchasing said plot of ground" for a specified sum, and if, as the time of the option is about expiring, the tenant informs me that he will be prepared to purchase the property at the price specified, am I compelled to give him a clear title to same? In other words, does the law recognize an option as binding as a contract between buyer and seller. Does not an option mean simply a refusal until a specified time, and then comes the contract for the bargain and sale. Before this lease was signed there was an easement on said plot, and some lawyer claimed that certain quit-claim deeds from heirs of a former owner were necessary to make the title clear, which cannot be obtained. Now, when my tenant's option expires and he wants the property, won't he have to take it just as I have it or else refuse to buy it? Cases like this have certainly arisen before and I therefore ask you how the law decides it? Your opinion is de-

Answer.-A lease containing a clause giving the tenant the option to buy is a contract binding upon the owner, which he can be compelled to carry out or pay damage. He cannot be compelled to give a warrantee deed, however, unless it is so stipulated. If the stipulation is as quoted in the query, the owner can only be compelled to convey his interest in the property, whatever that may be .- LAW EDITOR.

SCHOOL TAX-CHILDLESS OWNERS MUST PAY.

Will you kindly answer the following in your next issue, as I would like your advice to the following case: I live in the little incorporated village of Patchogue. BROKER'S COMMISSION.

Will you kindly inform me by the next issue of your paper what is the legal rate of commission which a real estate broker can charge for effecting a sale of city real estate?

Answer.—There is no rate of commission established by law. broker may contract for any percentage. If there is no contract he is entitled, according to the custom of the trade, to one per cent.-LAW EDITOR.

AGENTS COMMISSION.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

A broker makes a claim for commission on the rental of an apartment—these are the facts: Broker gave party a permit—party saw apartment and decided to rent it. In A. M., broker was notified that party would sign lease at noon—party failed to materialize, and advised broker they had changed their minds—would not rent it. Owner then advertised, same as had been his custom for some weeks previous, later in week owner saw party and assuming that there was no commission to pay, he believing that the transaction as far as the broker was concerned was at an end, offered the apartment at a reduced figure, party deciined. After numerous visits, telegrams, etc., party appears at night, insists on closing lease with owner at once, owner rents apartment at the reduced figure. Does the giving of the permit entitle the broker to commission, irrespective of the fact that the apartment was refused, and the burden of the labor resulting in the subsequent renting of it fell on the owner?

Answer .- The agent is not entitled to a commission .- LAW EDITOR.

MORTGAGE-PARTY WALL.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

I ask you as a favor to answer this question. If a person holds a mortgage on a house can the owner selt his wall for a party wall without notifying the mortgagee, as it does affect the house and makes it much smaller and of less value?

Answer—If he can find a purchaser he may sell his wall without notifying the mortgagee.—LAW EDITOR.

The auction market is without change. Legal sales almost monopolize the attention of the auctioneers and though an occasional parcel falls to an outsider the great majority offered interest nobody but the parties to the various suits. Uptown builders were very much in evidence at the Broadway Salesroom on Monday, the attraction being a foreclosure sale of three of the Breen houses, on West 70th street. The action was a friendly one brought by the Bradley & Currier Co., which held a second mortgage. The result of the sale was evidently a disappointment, as two of the houses were bought by a representative of the plaintiff at very low figures. The remaining dwelling went to an outside bidder at a price a few

hundred dollars higher. A full lot, with old three-story front and rear tenements, No. 112 Suffolk street, sold for a stiff price at partition sale on Tuesday, notwithstanding that Weil & Mayer, wellknown operators, were the real buyers. On the same day a representative of the plaintiffs purchased at foreclosure sale the two dwellings, Nos. 144 and 146 West 119th street, remarkably cheap, \$11,600 and \$10,000 respectively. The generous buyer's opening bid on the house first offered was \$5,000, despite the fact that his principal had originally seen fit to advance on it a mortgage loan of \$14,500. The last sale of one of the houses was said to have been made at \$18,000. The tenement property, No. 1,402 3d avenue, offered under a partition decree, was the star attraction on Wednesday. The building rents for between \$1,500 and \$1,600, but that did not deter the bidders, of whom there were six, from running the property up to \$25.300, the price at which it was disposed of. At the Real Estate Exchange on the same day, Richard V. Harnett sold two out of three parcels offered at voluntary sale. Two foreclosure sales were adjourned sine die during the week, that of the southeast corner of 2d avenue and 65th street, announced for Monday, and property on Valentine avenue, south of 184th street, advertised for the day following.

We were in error when stating last week that the executors' sale on the 4th inst. of Nos. 91 and 93 Division street "was a failure, the ostensible buyer bidding in the interest of the heirs." The statement, however, was made in good faith, and was due to our having been informed that Hugh O'Donnell, the buyer at \$30,200, had said the property would probably remain in the possession of the present owner, the widow of Mr. Payten. The inference drawn was that he had bid in her interest. We have since learned that the successful bidder, on investigating the exact value of the property after the sale, had become so fully impressed that he had secured a bargain that, in a philantrophic mood, he had straightway called on the owner and assured her that he would not take title to the house if she desired to retain it. His chivalrous offer was entertained, but not having been accepted up to yesterday he expects to consummate the purchase at the expiration of the period agreed upon.

In accordance with a decree just entered in partition proceedings, the row of ten houses, Nos. 36 to 54 West 24th street, with a total frontage of 164 feet, will soon be disposed of under the hammer.

The General Term of the Supreme Court has appointed Abram Kling, Edmund L. Mooney and Richard V. Harnett as commissioners in proceedings under the act passed by the last Legislature, to acquire title to property to be taken for the new public park between 1st avenue and the East River, from 111th to 114th street.

Arthur Brooks, Hamilton W. Mabie and the other trustees of the Barnard College, at No. 343 Madison avenue, are considering the option of a plot of land suitable for their purposes, on Morningside Heights. An anonymous friend has given the college \$100,000 for a building on condition that it be within 1,000 feet of Columbia College.

The Real Estate Auctioneers' Association re-elected last year's officers at the annual meeting held at No. 111 Broadway, on the 7th inst. They are: President, James L. Wells; Vice-President, Morris Wilkins; Treasurer, William M. Ryan; Secretary, James S. McQuillen; Executive Committee, Morris Wilkins, William F. Redmond, Jere, Johnson, Jr., D. Phænix Ingraham and Peter F. Meyer.

At the regular meeting of the National Academy of Design, held on Tuesday evening, the question of a site for a new building to be erected as the successor of the Academy at 4th avenue and 23d street, recently sold to the Metropolitan Life Insurance Co., was considered. One hundred and fifty had been offered, from 17th to 146th streets, ranging in price from \$75,000 to \$1,500,000. Eight of these sites, lying between 23d and 114th streets, were considered eligible, and the Site Committee will examine them and report as to which is the most suitable. Two members were added to the Site Committee, which now consists of James D. Smillie, Chairman; J. C. Nicoll, Frederick Dielman, James N. Hart and Daniel Huntington.

Buyers of residence sites should not overlook the auction sale of twelve such, situated on Washington Heights and facing Audubon Park, which will be conducted by L. J. Phillips & Co., at the New York Salesrooms, No. 111 Broadway, on Tuesday, next, the 18th inst. These sites are on the Public Drive, or French Boulevard, 158th street and Fort Washington avenue, one of the choicest residential districts of that part of the town. Further particulars of the property, terms of sale, maps, etc., can be obtained of the auctioneers at their office, No. 149 Broadway.

Real Estate Notes.

A report is current that the as yet unknown buyers of the St. Ann's Church and rectory property on West 18th street, adjoining Chickering Hall, will begin in May or shortly afterward the erection of a business structure on the plot.

Owners urge as an objection to giving details of sales by private contract or trades in which tenement and flat property is involved, the probability of their being unable to collect rents overdue should tenants learn that a change of ownership is about to take place.

One of the Sunday papers made the following statement in reference to the business transacted last week: "The sales reported, which form only a small fraction of those actually made, foot up over \$3,500,000." What a lively real estate market it must have been in the estimation of the writer.

It is announced that Frederick Southack & Co. will give out for publication about January 1 the complete and "only original" details of the big deal involving the extensive purchases on 18th and 19th streets. Henry Siegel, of Chicago; Siegel Bros., and Augustus D. Julliard, of this city, are some of the largest buyers.

The names of the buyers of the Hotel de Logerot property, on the southwest corner of 5th avenue and 18th street, have not been divulged, but it is said to be their intention to tear down the avenue and street buildings adjoining the corner, erect new buildings in their stead, and make of the whole a connected structure that can be occupied for business purposes.

Edward Fitzpatrick has brought suit in attachment against Isaac Neuberger, of No. 363 Canal street, to recover \$50,000 damages. The facts are that after six weeks' negotiation Mr. Neuberger on November 22d made a contract to purchase the large apartment house, on the northwest corner of the Boulevard and 99th street, for \$200,000. He now declines to carry out the contract, hence the suit.

Somebody remarked in the Broadway Auction Salesroom on Wednesday that although the weather was unfavorable to the sale of suburban "building" lots, it was probably deemed advisable to let the sales proceed, in view of the increasing possibility of a heavy fall of snow, after which it might become difficult for buyers to identify their properties, or perhaps even to get within hailing distance of them until after the first Spring thaw.

Bryan L. Kennelly tried hard to sell the brick building, No. 383 Canal street, offered at voluntary sale on Wednesday. Among the arguments advanced by the auctioneer to induce more liberal bidding was one that the property had sold about two years ago at auction in the Real Estate Exchange for \$27,200. Argument did not avail, however, as the highest bona fide bid received was \$25,000. At \$250 more the property, was withdrawn.

In referring to the low price, \$22,350, at which the well-built dwelling, No. 5 East 86th street, was knocked down at auction on Wednesday by Richard V. Harnett & Co., and the detrimental effect on values of the stables on the Madison avenue front, a broker present remarked that it was an outrage for the city to permit a surface railroad or other corporation to erect a large stable in a residence neighborhood. His audience, a small but select one, individually well versed in everything pertaining to real estate, gave indorsement to his views.

A frequently announced executor's sale of Nos. 1137 to 1141 Madison avenue, owned by the estate of the late John McDonald, a former purveyor of blue stone for buildings, promises to break the record of adjourned sales. It has been bulletined to take place almost weekly since early summer, except when an intermission was taken for a few weeks, ending early in September. The repeated assertion of the auctioneer, that "it will surely be held next week," is now regarded by the regulars in the Broadway Salesroom as a standing joke. The last adjournment on Wednesday was, as usual, for a week.

President John A. McCall, of the New York Life Insurance Company, has recently demonstrated his confidence in New York realty by making two good-sized investments. He was the purchaser from Mandelbaum & Lewine, at about \$90,000, of Nos. 120 and 122 West 42d street, the sale of which, to an unannounced buyer, was a subject for considerable discussion and comment a few months ago, and has since consummated a purchase of a dwelling on East 78th street for a consideration of \$50,000. That title has been taken in the name of a relative to both properties is due no doubt to the natural modesty of the actual buyer.

Jefferson M. Levy, in attempting a few days ago to explain the making of his recent contract to purchase the southwest corner of

William and Liberty streets for a 'price alleged to be \$308,000, contended that investments in business property on the lines of narrow streets has always proved more profitable than those made in wide thoroughfares, even when the prices paid were about the same. As Mr. Levy had an array of facts and figures at his command that threatened to demonstrate that William street property was hardly less valuable than that on the east side of Broadway, our reporter thought it advisable to bid him a hasty adieu and thereby avoid becoming a convert to the gentleman's specious argument. In the event of the Mutual Life Insurance Co. purchasing the corner, and things more unlikely have come to pass, Mr. Levy's theory of values will no doubt be sustained.

BROOKLYN, DECEMBER 15, 1894.

Notes Gathered Here and There.

Notice is given that the Common Council has declared by resolution, its intention to repave Monroe street, now paved with cobble stones, from Sumner to Lewis avenues, with asphalt. Objections must be filed with the clerk of the Common Council on or before the 14th day of January, 1895.

At the meeting of the Board of Aldermen on Monday it was decided to pave Kingsland avenue, from Meeker to Maspeth avenue, with Belgian blocks, cost \$31,000; Barbey street, from Jamaica to Atlantic avenue, with asphalt, cost \$23,000; Rogers avenue, from Park avenue to Eastern Parkway, with Belgian blocks, cost \$16,000; McDonough street, from Sumner to Lewis avenue, with asphalt, cost \$9,000; Essex street, from Arlington to Atlantic avenue, with Belgian blocks, cost \$6,500; Hooper street, from Bedford to Lee avenue, with asphalt, cost \$6,500. The residents and property owners sent in a petition to have electric lights placed on Freeman street, between Oakland avenue and Provost street, and on Provost street, between Green street and Page avenue. The petition was granted, A resolution was introduced by Alderman Hess for leasing the premises, No. 93 Cedar street, for the 20th Precinct, at \$840 a year, pending the completion of a new station house. It was adopted. The City Works Commissioner was authorized to advertise for proposals and to award contracts for lighting the streets and public buildings with gas and electricity for 1895, according to specifications approved by the board.

Mayor Schieren has appointed George W. Head, of Sheepshead Bay, as assessor for the 31st Ward. The salary is \$3,500 a year, and the term five years.

On Tuesday, before Judge Van Wyck, of the City Court, the suit of Moses May, against the City of Brooklyn, was tried without a jury. May alleged that on February 23, 1887, he had purchased from the Register of Arrears a piece of property on Van Cott avenue, near Humboldt street, which was publicly sold for arrears of taxes. He paid all the indebtedness against the property and then discovered that the lot he bought was, by mistake, joined in the assessment list with the next lot, which cast a cloud on the title, and he wanted his money back. The city refused and suit was instituted, which was yesterday decided in favor of the plaintiff, giving him the full amount claimed and an extra allowance of \$200, in all about \$4,600.

Registrar of Arrears Hinrichs held a sale of property in arrears for taxes and assessments on Wednesday last, in the City Hall. Twentynine parcels were sold, realizing over \$30,000. A few lots were passed.

BUILDING MATERIAL MARKET

NEW YORK.

BRICKS .- On the market for Common Hards the conditions are somewhat less satisfactory than one week ago. Taking the general line of quotations we find operators in pretty much all cases maintaining former figures, but no one claims much animation to the demand, and some report a positively dull tone to trade. Poor weather and an accumulation of stock or jobs to about the extent of available storage room has curtailed the direct demand from consumers, but why a falling off in demand from dealers should develop is not entirely clear, especially as a great many could provide for accommodation of additional supplies without much difficulty. There is, however, just a suspicion that dealers through connectition having run the market up on themselves, have quietly come to an understanding to stand off a trifle, and receivers now find it very difficult to secure important negotiation. Still it is not discoverable that the selling side has weakened to any noteworthy extent, and while quite a number of cargoes remain available for negotiation there are also a great many now berthed and covered to remain until the owners conclude jt is time to seek custom, and naturally they calculate that range of value will be fuller. This move in matter of storing rather contradicts prognostications of a short time aco, but people, of course, are very apt to change their mind when new influences arise. Some very time pales have sold at \$2.50, but that is exceptional and more than the average quality would command.

advices indicate that as soon as manufacturers learned of the advancing tendency of values they shipped off about all the stock they had, and it is now difficult to make up additional cargoes.

LIME .- One of the frankest reports this week was from a receiver who confessed to not knowing anything positive about the market. The trouble he encountered, as well as many others, was in he encountered, as well as many others, was in the discrepancy of statements in regard to price. On the one hand was the claim for 90c., less 5 per cent, for the favorite Eastern makes, while against, many buyers were asserting they could obtain all the stock wanted at 85c, less 5 per cent, for both common and finishing, and there is no attempt to deny that dealers could get Thomaston for even less money, net cash, and availed themselves of the privilege with freedom. There is still quite a fair supply of Rockland here, but the production is suspended, and it is doubtful if the vessels recevily unloaded here and returning to the eastward will be given return cargoes from shed stocks right away. From interior points of production the arrivals are now of an unimportant character.

LUMBER—Business appears to be gradually quieting down, and from the present trading basis nothing of special interest is evolved. Talking over results of the past season, the tenor of ideas expressed by the various lines of operators ranges good, bad and indifferent from a seller's standpoint, but rarely is there found anything of a positively cheerful nature. Even where there has been success attained in placing a good round of orders it was at an exceedingly narrow margin, if not, in some cases, at an actual loss, accepted under the necessity for turning stock into cash and in the face of keen competition. Of course, such conditions have been of benefit to buyer, and there is probably in some of the present accumulations a considerable quantity of staple lumber secured at lower cost than ever before experienced by the dealers who own it. Any respectable revival of trade can hardly fall to give them ample reward for their investment.

And the feeling seems to be quite general that the turn in the tide has come which is to lead on to more cheerful conditions. Possibly no one expects much animation in the distribution, for say a couple of months at least, but there is a strong belief that as soon as the new year is fairly opened a broader, fuller business will be found growing up on foundations already solidly laid. First of all, there is to be found the general growth of confidence in coming return to business prosperity, which must go a great way in removing the extreme hesitancy, and in numerous cases the greatly strained economy of consumers. So far as immber is concerned, there are undoubtedly a large number of manufacturers of wood consuming specialties who now not only carry unusually small stocks of goods, but are poorly supplied with material as well, and, therefore, if the increased sale of their products materialize, they must at once become buyers of something to make them from.

tions have been formed involving control of immense supplies, and the liberal capital necessary to carry out the project was available as soon as needed.

While confidence in an expanding movement is entertained, however, there seems to be somewhat conflicting views in regard to results on values, of course where rates have settled abnormally low 'recuperation may naturally be expected, and there is the usual element which may always be found, who expect prompt buoyancy the moment demand revives, but as a rule the idea seems to be that such gains as may be secured will come fraction by fraction and may not get fairly started until the season has fairly progressed and especially so on the coarse grades. This latter notion is based upon the belief that while not plethoric the general run of supplies is fairly liberal, and will be added to the moment there is an indicated market, because manufacturers will quite naturally compete for a while to secure a portion of the returning custom.

From sources of supply not much information of specially noteworthy nature is coming at the moment. The mills naturally are very generally shut down and shipments of lumber toward the large operating localities have practically ceased, with lumbermen generally busy in the tasks imposed in winding up the years' business and geting ready for the next campaign. The latter move, of course, includes work in the woods over which is already formulated the annual report of a light cut of logs to be made, but experience suggests it would be well to wait until a somewhat later date before forming a positive opinion upon the subject. One piece of news comes from the West in suggestions to agree upon a uniform standard for sawing in all the principal producing sections, and in view of recent experience with

receipts in this and neighboring markets the mov would appear to be a most judicious one.

The second auction sale of manogany, cédar and satinwood was held by Mason & Co. (Limited). Thursday afternoon, in the public salesrooms at 7th street and East River. About 200 buyers were present, and the bidding at times was quite spirited.

Prices compared favorably with those reached at the last sale on November 15, although the bidding was less active, owing probably to lateness of the season.

The average rate on cedar logs was 6c. per foot, Cuban and Mexican mahogany brought 7@8c. and 7½@10c. per foot respectively. The African mahogany logs were the feature. Prices on these ranged from 12@86c. per foot. The latter price was received for a log fluat measured 596 feet. C. H. Benton & Co., of Cincinnati, bought the log, which was opened and showed considerable choice grain.

GENERAL LUMBER NOTES.

THE WEST.

The Northwestern Lumberman as follows:

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While it is recognized that there will be a full, and perhaps increased input of logs in the western portion of the Lake Superior region, on account of the necessity of saving burned pine, it is also seen that the older districts, especially in Michigan, are likely to turn out less logs this season than heretofore. The supply of Canadian logs for the Saginaw and Huron shore districts can no more than offset the natural decline of input in the old fields which were heretofore a resource. Altogether the total input of logs in the field at large is not likely to amount to a burdensome surplus. Certainly if will not, should there be a rising demand for lumber, of which there is now a fair prospect.

Thus, while the conditions of the closing season may not indicate an abnormally increased requirement and high prices next year, it seems fairly certain that the extreme depression of the past eighteen months has entirely been left in the rear, and that henceforward there will be improvement. It is probable that it will be more promounced as the winter passes. Stocks are known to be certainly not excessive. A moderate winter trade will greatly reduce them, and simply a fair spring demand will render scarce many items in wholesale stocks. The only menace to a stronger market condition is the comparatively large stocks on the Mississippi River, which are being pushed eastward to an unnusual degree in the eagerness to reduce them before the first of the year. This aggressive effort east of the river is consequent on the failure of the crops to the westward, which has reduced the volume of trade in that part of the country.

At Chaego the market closes with short green piece stuff selling at \$9, and for year, Stages, and possibly at \$9,50 in some instances. The market for long piece stuff is stronger than a month ago, and late sales have been made at an advance of 50 cents a thousand. In other features the market rips of the season, by water, are about at an end. Several ca

The Mississippi Valley Lumberman as follows:
Lack of snow is reported from all logging districts, and hauling is made difficult. With a good fall of snow and then continued cold weather for a period logging conditions would be greatly helped. Operations were begun early in the woods this fall, owing to the desire to get at the burned timber ahead of the worms, and those who were in the field early are having favorable conditions under which to work, excepting that snow is needed nearly everywhere.

There are those who feel confident that next season will see bet'er prices prevail for lumber. The inventory of stock that nearly every manufacturing concern has recently taken has shown that certain grades are deplorably short in many justances, and this condition of affairs encourages an advance. There is a feeling that lumber can be bought cheaper this fall than it will be sold in the future. Another thing which looks encouraging for dealers of lumber is the signs of activity among architects and builders of the larger cities who are busy with plans for structures that will go up next spring. A good deal of building for next year is being gotten under way and the promise of it makes lumbermen feel better.
