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WITH SUPPLEMENT.

THE government bond sale has so far only proved something that needed no demonstration, namely, that all the gold wanted by the government can be obtained abroad if it is willing to pay the price. The effect of this operation will be probably to adjust payments for trade balances so that no more gold need be exported for some time, probably not until next year. Meantime, being a hopeful people, we can imagine no end of things occurring in our favor. When Congress was called together last December we pointed out the disturbing influence that its actions would have on prices. Now that it is soon to adjourn it is not unreasonable to expect that prices of securities will react from the depressed condition into which they have been forced for the three months that Congress has been sitting. We are now facing the more cheerful season of spring instead of the gloomy and dormant one of winter, which is a fact that is not without effect on the business of the country. While too much stress can easily be laid on the favorable features of the situation, it is fair to expect an improvement in prices as a result of the suppression, temporarily at least, of scare quotations in the exchange market, and on the prospect of the dispersion of the mischievous combination commonly known as Congress. The full story of the bad business that was done in 1894 has yet to come out through annual reports and other channels, and as it appears it will make its influence felt on prices, especially in particular cases. The Granger roads are making desperate efforts to keep up net earnings and the Coalers show no proper disposition to come to an agreement that will give them all a chance to do better, and until the prospects of these two classes of investment properties are brighter and more certain, their securities will continue to be objects of suspicion and liable to bear attacks on every fitting occasion.

CCORDING to the London Economist Japan is about to experience a financial crisis as a result of her war with China. The depletion of the specie reserve of the Bank of Japan has been steadily going on since the war commenced; the balance of trade is against the country, and large payments must continue to be made abroad for ships and supplies; government bonds are declining and in most instances selling at a discount. A little accentuation of these occurrences would make Japan as anxious for peace as she now appears to be for European advices contain more rethe prosecution of the war. marks on the amount and cheapness of money, on the increase in bank deposits and reductions in withdrawals, than on trade conditions, from which it may be judged that trade is as dull as ever. New loans of merit are over-subscribed many times. In Berlin a small South African railway loan brought out so many bidders that the allotment was only 15 per cent of the amount applied for. The Board of Trade returns for January show imports into Great Britain to have declined 4.4 per cent, the falling off being principally in raw cotton and wool, and exports to have increased 0.4 per cent, which figures support the supposition that trade is very dull on the other side of the Atlantic. The quantity of wheat imported from America was considerably larger than in January of 1894. Attempts are being made to form a combination at Prague to reorganize the sugar trade by limiting production of beet-sugar. New Zealand has passed an advances to settlers bill, and the government has promptly received application under the measure for \$5,000,000. United States loan is creating no end of interest, not only because the people in Europe are glad to get an opportunity to subscribe for any good bonds, but also because curiosity is excited as to whether the movement of which the loan is a part will have any substantial beneficial effect on trade and finance here.

Business Men in Municipal Government.

DURING the past thirty years many of our Mayors have been reputable business men, and so have some of the heads of departments; but it will scarcely be denied that on the whole the municipal government of this city has not been in the hands of the better class of business men. In England, on the contrary, the municipal administration of the great cities is wholly in the hands of the large local merchants. "The councilors," says Albert Shaw in his recent work on "Municipal Government in Great Britain," "the councilors, as a rule, are the representatives of the best elements of business life. They are men of intelligence and character, and of practical conversance with affairs." The position, he adds, is one of honor and the councils are almost universally in high repute. The reason that this example has not been followed in America is the necessarily absorbing character of business life in a new and rapidly developing community. The English cities have the benefit of their past. In the Middle Ages and later, the local burgesses were the local magistrates, because the political status of municipal corporations was unsettled, and the security of private interests demanded that the rights of the city should first be won from feudal superiors and then protected from feudal and royal encroachments. What was a necessity with the early communes has become a tradition with their successors of the present day. The business life of English cities has become adjusted to the necessities of municipal service. With us, however, not only was no such tradition ever deeply established, but the competition of our business life has been so intense and exhausting, and the opportunities of making money so many and various, that it has become customary with American business men to neglect municipal duties. An organization of politicians with no standing in the community has been permitted to "squat" in our City Hall: and now that the more conscientious business men are waking up to their public functions, they are confronted by the extreme difficulty not only of exterminating this political organization, but of substituting for the habitual indifference of their less enlightened fellow-citizens a persistent and intelligent interest in municipal affairs.

Unless such an interest is created there is no hope for permanent municipal reform. Business men are the natural and inevitable directors of local affairs. For maladministration of our State and national governments they cannot be held immediately responsible, because national and State politics require for their proper regulation the whole time and attention of a body of men especially equipped for the purpose; but the general management of municipal affairs requires no such training. What is needed is qualities like common sense, a knowledge of the city's interests, a "practical conversance with affairs," and the ability to handle large interests in a large way. Business men alone possess these necessary qualifications. In order properly to manage municipal affairs, they need the assistance of a body of competent experts; but experts are no more fitted for the general direction of city government than would the engineers of a railroad be fitted to manage, its finances. The chief business men of a city are substantially its largest stockholders, and their responsibility for its proper management is necessary and indisputable.

If we only had some reason to believe that business men would be as unable to escape this responsibility as were their prototypes in the Middle Ages we should have some promise that the present municipal reform movement in this and other cities would be permanent. It is very well for our citizens to rise in their wrath and turn the rascals out; but a wave of reformatory enthusiasm inevitably subsides, and the politicians are only biding their time. If the Good Government clubs want good government they can get it only by taking a lively interest in the positive problems of New York municipal government. The best promise for the future seems to be in the fact that these problems are becoming so important and so urgent that business men can no longer afford to neglect them. A proper disposal of the various questions of municipal economy, good water, cheap gas, rapid transit, plenty of park space, proper housing of the poor, clean streets, etc., call for the expenditure of many million dollars, and vitally affect the well-being of rich and poor alike. In the matter of rapid transit, for instance, nothing was accomplished until the Chamber of Commerce, out of patience with the dilatory action of muncipal officials, took the matter up and indorsed municipal ownership. If interference on behalf of rapid transit was considered unavoidable by our representative business men, it is reasonable to suppose that it will prove equally unavoidable in other important matters; and such interference can be made permanently effectual only through the permanent control by such interests of the regular machinery for the municipal government of the city. This will not all take place at once; but the tendency will undoubtedly set strongly in that direction, The English cities

have been obliged in recent years, not because of any socialistic theories, but solely as a matter of business vastly to extend their municipal undertakings. The following figures taken from Mr. Shaw's book give some notion of what they have been doing in this respect:

In 1893 there were in the United Kingdom 185 communities that maintained public gas supplies, the number having increased from 148 in 1883. The ordinary gross receipts of the municipal gas works in the United Kingdom have now reached an aggregate of more than \$30,000,000 a year, and the expenditures are about \$24,000,000. The local indebtedness on account of gas undertakings exceeds \$75,000,000, and this large investment is both safe and profitable. As for the street railways almost one-third of the mileage in Great Britain has been constructed and is owned by the municipal or local authorities. and public sentiment is evidently favorable to the further acquisition of private lines. The general tendency is also towards the municipalization of electric lighting. Municipal slaughter houses and burial grounds are becoming very general; there is a prevalent disposition to take advantage of the municipal housing act of 1890, which confides to the local authorities a wide range of power both as to the acquisition of private property in unwholesome areas, and its proper sanitary control. Finally, under the new technical education acts, there is growing up in every large centre of British industry a system of general and special instruction in all the scientific, artistic and technical principles and processes that pertain to standard lines of manufacture—a system supported in part by local rates and in still larger part by subsidies out of the royal exchequer.

All this will give some notion of the varied social activities of the municipal government in English cities; and the tendency all over the United Kingdom is toward a still further expansion in this direction. Our American cities cannot escape like responsibilities and functions; but as long as our heads of departments and local officials generally are as untrustworthy as they are at present, it is natural for conservative people to insist upon the slow and cautious beginning of these great undertakings. This is not merely a question of putting honest business men in chief official positions, but these business men must have the assistance of the best engineering and administrative ability which the country affords. A large number of expert officials must be attracted from like pursuits in the service of private corporations, and if this is to be done, the whole atmosphere of the municipal departments, not only in New York, but in the other large cities, must be changed. The present custom of selecting officials only from the locality in which they serve must be dropped, and the offices themselves must be made permanent and sufficiently remunerative to secure good ability. It is only in this way that a proper training school for municipal service can be developed. Here again English example is our best guide. Says Mr. Shaw: "It is almost the uniform practice to appoint as permanent chiefs or superintendents of departments the most thoroughly qualified men who can be secured, and to hold them responsible to the council through the standing committees for the ordinary operation of their respective branches of the municipal service. At the head of the different departments are to be found men of special fitness and training, who are selected for administrative ability as well as for expert knowledge, and whose security of tenure, for so long as they deserve it, adds to their faithfulness and usefulness." Local candidates for an office are not particularly favored. It is usual to advertise for a vacancy, and the committee most directly concerned make their choice from the applicants and then recommend to the full council for action. Such a system obviously conduces to efficiency. In order to introduce it into New York all our municipal departments would have to be reorganized so as to bring out clearly the distinction between the permanent officials who are paid experts and the "honor offices," which demand general rather than special qualifications, and may be filled by business men. Mayor Strong's difficulty in securing good officials is largely due to the fact that such a distinction has not hitherto been properly developed.

A MONG the evidences of an improved industrial condition the returns of the savings banks in this State for 1894 should have place. Some weeks ago we published the statements of the managers of the great bureaus, public and private, for the relief of the indigent in this city and in Brooklyn, and figures showing that there was less demand upon public and private charity at the beginning of this year than there was at the same time last year. These were satisfactory, inasmuch as it was reasonable to conclude therefrom that there was more employment offering, to the lowest grades of workpeople particularly. Now the reports of the savings banks come to confirm that view, and a little more by indicating that the better classes of workmen, small tradesmen and others were able to save more money in 1894 than they were in 1893. Not only were the deposits greater in 1894 than in the previous year, but the withdrawals were very considerably less. In fact, whichever

way these returns are looked at the view is gratifying. Last year the withdrawals were \$14,400,922 less than in 1893, and the deposits \$7,383,785 greater. In 1893 the withdrawals exceeded the deposits of that year by \$17,602,559, while in 1894 the deposits exceeded the withdrawals by \$4,182,148. Comparison being made with the panic year, some allowance must of course be made for the heavy withdrawals that were made under fear of disaster to the banks, and the return of the money, or at least a large part of it, when the confidence of depositors was restored. But the great point to bear in mind is that the 1894 figures are favorable whether compared with those relating to the amounts of deposits or withdrawals in the preceding year or the proportions of deposits to withdrawals. Such a result could not be obtained under any but better conditions of business and fuller confidence.

The Income Tax and Real Estate.

THE RETURNS WHICH OWNERS OF REAL PROPERTY HAVE TO MAKE.

March 4th next, being the day when the returns under the Income Tax Act must be filed unless the time is extended as proposed by Congress to April 15th, there is of course a good deal of anxiety to know how the returns are to be made up, the basis upon which income is to be computed and deductions to be allowed, because income and deductions claimed are to be separately stated. Owners and dealers in real estate have their anxieties on these heads like other people and the occasion has given rise to several interesting questions

relating to real property.

Before dealing with these it may be as well to state that the tax must be paid on all incomes amounting for the year to over \$4,000. but that returns must be made by all persons having an income for the year of more than \$3,500. The language of the act relating to the persons who are to pay and the sources of income is as follows: "SECTION 27. That from and after the first day of January, eighteen hundred and ninety-five, and until the first day of January, nineteen hundred, there shall be assessed, levied, collected and paid annually upon the gains, profits and income received in the preceding calendar year by every citizen of the United States, whether residing at home or abroad, and every person residing therein, whether said gains, profits or income be derived from any kind of property, rents, interest, dividends or salaries, or from any profession, trade, employment or vocation carried on in the United States or elsewhere, or from any other source whatever, a tax of two per centum on the amount so derived over and above four thousand dollars, and a like tax shall be levied, collected and paid annually upon the gains, profits and income from all property owned and of every business, trade or profession carried on in the United States by persons residing without the United States. And the tax herein provided for shall be assessed by the Commission of Internal Revenue and collected and paid upon the gains, profits and income for the year ending the thirty-first day of December next preceding the time for levying, collecting and paying said tax." Only one deduction of \$4,000 is to be made from the aggregate income of any one family, composed of one or both parents and minor children, or from the income of any trust of which more than one individual are beneficiaries. Penalties are provided for failure to make return within the specified time and for making fraudulent returns. Taxes imposed are due and payable on or before July 1st in each year, and to any sum or sums annually due and unpaid after July 1st, and for ten days after notice and demand thereof by the collector, there shall be levied in addition thereto the sum of 5 per cent on the amount of taxes unpaid, and interest at the rate of 1 per cent per month upon said tax from the time the same becomes due, as a penalty, except from the estates of deceased, insane or insolvent

To return to the relation of the act to real estate: The question has been raised as to whether "rents" are in the meaning of the act identical with the term rents in real estate law, when the latter is used to denote the continuing right to collect a certain profit on land. or simply a sum of money accrued—the income or profits in the way of rent actually received by the person taxed, The latter is the generally accepted meaning of the act, and being the common sense one it should be adopted by property owners in making their returns. If there is very little doubt on this point, it is not so easy to determine what deductions shall be made relating to rents. The act is not clear as to what allowances will be permitted. It says, however: "In computing incomes the necessary expenses actually incurred in carrying on any business, occupation or profession shall be deducted, and also all interest due or paid within the year on existing indebtedness. And all national, state, county, school and municipal taxes, not including those assessed against local benefits, shall be deducted." Applying the reductions allowed in business to real property, it might reasonably be supposed that this would include all expenses for taxes, repairs and cost of collecting From an amendatory resolution which has passed both Houses of Congress, it has appeared to be necessary to make this clear because one portion of the amendment reads: "In computing incomes under said act, the amounts necessarily paid for ordinary repairs upon any real estate shall be deducted from the rents accrued or received fram such real estate." If this resolution is approved by the President, as it is believed it will be, there will be three distinct deductions from gross rents permissible, viz., national, State, county, school and municipal taxes, ordinary or necessary repairs, and fire insurance premiums. If this amendment does not become a law the only clearly specified deductions will be, national, State, school, county, and municipal taxes, and such expenses as the owner can convince the collector are necessary.

Taxpayers are required to include in their income for the year

profits realized on sales of real estate purchased since December 31, 1892, and are allowed to deduct actual losses on sales of real estate purchased since December 31, 1892. In the Treasury regulations the following further reference is made to the point under deductions to be made: "Debts ascertained to be worthless, but excluding all estimated depreciation of values and losses within the year on sales of real estate purchased within two years previous to the year from which income is estimated. "No deductions are to be made for improvements. The instructions are specific on this point, the language being: "Provided, that no deductions shall be made for any amount paid out for new building, permanent improvements or betterments made to increase the value of any property or estate." They also emphasize by repetition the inhibition of deductions of taxes paid for assessments for local benefits in Article IV, paragraph 4, by the following sentence: "But assessments made upon the real estate of a particular locality on account of street improvements, sewerage, street grade or other improvements, intended to benefit the particular property included in said locality, are not considered as taxes which may be deducted from income." The question has been asked us whether taxes and interest may be deducted from profits from the sale of unimproved property, bought within the limit of two years prior to the year when return is made. We are informed that taxes and interest are a proper deduction in all cases being in the nature of necessary expenses.

The mention of losses suggests a number of circumstances in which they may occur and be deductible from income. The one referred to above refers to the difference that may exist against any particular person as a result of an operation in real estate, begun after December 31, 1892, and concluded within the year 1894. For instance a man may have purchased a piece of property and disposed of it again within the time mentioned for less than he gave for it. In that case the difference as well as the taxes and interest he may have paid may be construed as proper deductions from income. In returning profits made in a similar transaction, he may also include among deductions the taxes and interest that he may have paid and which, of course, reduce the net result to him. Another loss allowed as against income is that by fire; this, however, is limited to loss not compensated for by insurance or otherwise. That is to say the loss in the case of fire where insurance had been effected and maintained is the difference between the amount of insurance received and the extent of the injury done. In case of injury to uninsured property by fire it is the whole extent of the damage done. There is no requirement that the amount of any insurance policy received shall be returned as part of the income for the year in which it is received, though, of course, if that money itself becomes interestbearing, the interest so received or accrued must be included in the return.

Another interesting point is whether uncollected and uncollectible rents of any year should be included in the income for that year. By referring to the quotation from section 27 of the act, given at the opening of this article, it will be seen that the tax is to be assessed, levied, collected and paid upon the gains, profits and income received in the preceding calendar year and later, "whether said gains, profits or income be derived from any kind of property, rent, interest, dividends," etc. The words italicised by us indicate that only the amounts actually received from rents need be returned, though as the general tenor of the Treasury instructions indicate that gross income and the deductions must in every case be returned separately, it may be well to include rents accrued with those received and claim deduction for those unpaid in the proper place. It should be borne in mind that the returns of income for a particular year are required as a basis for fixing the tax for the next year. Thus, the tax for 1895 will be levied on the basis of the income for 1894.

The Rapid Transit Route.

The Rapid Tran it Railroad Commission on the 16th inst. formally decided upon routes as follows:

A route, the centre line commencing at a point under the westerly side of Whitehall street, distant along the same 62.5 feet north from the northerly line of South street produced, thence by diverging lines under Whitehall street and Battery Park and State street, forming a loop line, the tracks converging to parallelism at a point at or near the westerly side of State street and the southerly side of Battery place; thence under Broadway and Union square to 59th street; thence under the Boulevard to a point at or near 93d street; thence by viaduct along the Boulevard to a point at or near 111th street; thence under the Boulevard to a point at or near 123d street; thence by viaduct along the Boulevard to a point at or near 151st street; thence under the Boulevard to a point at or near 151st street; thence under the Boulevard to a point point at or near 151st street; thence under the Boulevard to a point at or near 156th street; thence by viaduct along the Boulevard to a point at or near 159th street; thence under the Boulevard to 169th street; thence under 11th avenue to a point at or near 185th street.

Also a loop from Broadway, under Mail street, City Hall Park, Park row and Chambers street, and again connecting with the

Broadway line.

Also, a route, the centre line of which shall diverge from the Broadway line at or near 14th street and run under Union square to 4th avenue; thence under 4th and Park avenues to a point at or near 98th street; thence by a viaduct along Park or 4th avenues to the Harlem River; thence turning to the right by bridge across the Harlem River, and thence to the left until it shall coincide with the centre line of Walton avenue produced at or near its intersection with 138th street; and thence along the line of Walton avenue to a point at or near 146th street.

The said routes shall, upon the same being consented to as provided in section 5, chapter 4, of the Laws of 1891, be and be deemed to be in lieu of the routes heretofore adopted as aforesaid by this

Board and its predecessors, and that thereupon such portions of the said routes so heretofore adopted as are not coincident with the routes by the present resolution adopted be and be deemed abandoned.

The Legal Sales.

Adrian H. Muller & Son, E. H. Ludlow & Co. and James L. Wells have prepared a statement of the grounds on which the Real Estate Auctioneers' Association oppose the bill now in the Senate of the State Legislature, after having passed the Assembly, to remove the legal sales from No. 111 Broadway to No. 59 Liberty street. This statement gives a historical account of the several movements of the legal sales between the two auction rooms and charges that while at the latter address the policy of the Real Estate Exchange toward the auctioneers was one of annoyance and oppression, and that as a consequence the auctioneers formed their association for mutual protection. A committee of the association which waited on the Board of Directors of the Exchange with the object of adjusting differences was treated with "contemptuous indfference," and as a result they returned to No. 111 Broadway and with the knowledge of the Exchange petitioned the judges to change the place of holding legal sales to their room, which petition was granted by a vote of sixteen out of nineteen judges. The auctioneers also claim that the move was not a political one and that Tammany Hall and Richard Croker did not control it for political or pecuniary advantage. The association was composed purely and simply to promote real estate business and is free from either commercial or political connection with Mr. Croker. Further they claim that the room in which the legal sales are now conducted is superior for auction purposes than that on

ANOTHER UNIMPORTANT DISPUTE TO PARALYZE GREAT UNDERTAKINGS PENDING ITS SETTLEMENT.

The news of the possibility of a long and very serious conflict between the men and bosses in the building trade follows only a week after the announcement of what appeared to be the successful beginning of a movement to abolish strikes and substitute arbitration, which shows the delicate nature of the relations that exist at all times between employers and employed. The present trouble has been forced on the trade by the unreasonableness of the electrical workers, who demanded an eight-hour day, and though met by the bosses in a conciliatory spirit have gone out on a difference as to whether it shall be established now or on May 18th next, only two months away. In spite of the concessions offered by the contractors the men remained out, and having appealed to the Board of Walking Delegates for assistance that body on Wednesday ordered a sympathetic strike on several buildings already affected by the strike of the electrical workers; these were the Presbyterian Mission Building, at 20th street and 5th avenue, the American Tract Society Building, at Spruce and Nassau streets. Later the orders of the Board implicated the American Surety Co.'s Building, at Pine and Broadway, and St, Luke's Hospital. Meetings of the Board of Delegates were held yesterday for further action and the bosses in the several trades concerned were in conference last night at the Building Trades' Club, with a view to acting together in the emergency. The following are some of the trades which have received orders to strike in support of electrical workers: Carpenters, plasterers, steam-fitters, plumbers, gas-fitters, hod-hoisting engineers, elevator constructors, housesmiths, and tin and sheet-iron workers.

The situation is, of course, one that the contractors would have rather avoided, but at the same time one that they can regard with equanamity, because their contracts protect them in the case of strikes. A meeting of the electrical contractors decided to hold open places to permit the striking workmen to return until Monday next, when if they still remain obdurate non-union men will be taken on. The sympathetic strike does not appear to be very popular among the workmen, which is easily understood considering what the condition of the building trade in New York has been for some time past. When they leave their work it is with reluctance. Those at St. Luke's Hospital, in fact, disobeyed the order to strike and kept right along with their work. On the Presbyterian Mission Building there was sufficient obedience to the order to make it impossible to go on with work; the same was the case on the American Tract Society building and 400 men left the Surety Company's work. In all there were yesterday afternoon about a thousand men out. Should the dispute continue the Board of Walking Delegates has power to call out or paralyze the efforts of many men, estimated as high as 25,000.

The usual high talk of a fight to death is reported to come from both sides. The arrangement suggested last week between the representatives of the Master Builders' Association and the Board of Walking Delegates for the formation of a board of arbitration has not been ratified. It has met with great opposition in some of the building trades' associations on the ground that as things are now constituted there is no way of keeping the members of any individual association up to their agreements; the associations could not enforce penalties for violations.

(Page 23). Here follows form 369, which is a notice requiring the person to show cause why the penalty should not be imposed. The attorney or representative can appear for the party and show cause in response to such notice. There is no provision for delaying the filing of the report until the return to this country of the person to be taxed, but there can be no doubt that a reasonable time will be given to him to make it if his return will be delayed until after March.-LAW EDITOR.

West Side flats and apartmenthouses are in greater demand than ever for investment. Their sale has been an encouraging feature of the market during almost every week for some months past, and now buyers are showing a disposition to purchase long before such buildings reach completion.

The Board of Trade and Transportation has selected the following committee to formulate a general plan for municipal consolidation and advocate its passage by the Legislature, as authorized at the last regular meeting: Herbert Booth King, chairman; Andrew B. Rogers, Jr.; C. C. Shayne, James Talcott, John H. Washburn, Samuel W. Fairchild, Louis Stern, William McCarroll, E. A. Cruikshank and Silas M. Giddings.

The announcement that Mrs. W. K. Vanderbilt is the buyer of the residence on the southwest corner of Madison avenue and 72d street, adds emphasis to the claim that the [neighborhood is rapidly becoming one of the swellest in town. The example set by the building of the big Tiffany house on the northwest corner of the same avenue and street, has led to many investments and removals by former residents of sections lower down, until now the representatives of society and wealth form an uptown colony that has few rivals in the other fashionable residence districts.

The Third Avenue Railroad Company has filed with the County Clerk a notice of the proposed extension of its road eleven miles in the upper part of the city. It proposes to extend its tracks from Kingsbridge road and West 182d street, along the Kingsbridge road and across the proposed new ship canal; and thence northerly over Spuyten Duyvil Creek to the city line; also from the junction of West 125th street and St. Nicholas avenue, along St. Nicholas avenue to Manhattan avenue, and along Manhattan avenue to West 116th street; also from the junction of Kingsbridge road, along Riverdale avenue to the city line; also from the junction of Manhattan street and Boulevard, along the Boulevard to the junction of Kingsbridge road and Broadway to 169th street.

The gullibility of the daily papers when real estate transactions are misrepresented for a purpose was never better demonstrated than on last Saturday when a report was published in two or three of them, but omitted from THE RECORD AND GUIDE. of a sale by the Aldrich estate to Mrs. Rosina Vollhart. The property purchased comprised Nos. 235 to 241 West 43d street, two seven-story brick flats, 37.6x90x100.5 each. The price agreed upon was under \$125, 000, but the bait thrown out to the dailies was apparently swallowed without a moment's hesitation, the *Herald* quoting the price as \$225,000 and the *limes* as \$190,000. It is needless to add that the brokers, E. A. Cruikshank & Co., had no hand in the circulation of the false reports.

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Real Estate Market.

While less active than last week, the market has not lacked life, and a fairly good aggregate investment is represented by the many sales effected of minor parcels and the few involving \$100,000 and more. Dwellings have continued in greatest demand, a few lot sales have been closed, and with the others given below in detail, including some exchanges, show purchases amounting to a total of not less than \$2,250,000. That figure is not a big one, to be sure, but it looks to be satisfactory, in view of Friday, usually the busiest day of every week, having been a holiday.

The attention of auction buyers was centered on Wednesday's offerings by Bryan L. Kennelly, at the Broadway Salesroom, the attendance being the largest seen there in months. No. 16 70th street, a modern four-story dwelling, was first offered under the direction of the executors of the late Josephine L. Notes Gathered Here and There.

THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN.

At the meeting of the Board of Aldermen, on Monday, remonstrances were received against opening Utica avenue in the 29th Ward, and were referred to the Committee on Opening Streets. Protests were received against repaving Clifton place and against Jefferson avenue, between Reid and Stuyvesant avenues, with asphalt, and both referred to the Grading and Paving Committee. The Board has decided to repave the following streets with Belgian block: Schenck avenue, from Atlantic to Dumont avenue, cost \$52,500; Snediker avenue, from Liberty to Dumont avenue, cost \$29,500; Cleveland street, from Arlington to Atlantic avenue, \$7,600. With asphalt-Halsey street, from Bedford to Nostrand avenue, \$10,300; Macon street, from Ralph to Howard avenue, \$8,800; Monroe street, from Sumner to Lewis avenue, \$8,500; Macon street, from Lewis to Stuyvesant avenue, \$8.200; 4th street, between 6th and 7th avenues, \$7,400; and New York avenue, from St. Marks avenue to Park place, \$7,000. The City Works Commissioner presented a resolution rescinding the proceedings heretofore begun and for which contracts have not been awarded in the erection of lamp-posts, and a resolution that all moneys paid to the Tax Collector for assessments for the same be returned to the parties assessed. The proposed amendment was referred to the Law Committee. This proposed action will save considerable time. Under the present conditions applications for the erection of lamp-posts involved a round of references from one department to another and a delay often extending to several months. Under the amendment, the approval by the Board of an application will [permit the lamp-posts being erected inside of a

The Commissioners appointed by the Mayor to lay out the proposed driveway and parkway along Bay Ridge, show the estimate of cost for acquiring the necessary property at \$2,500,000. The act creating the commission provides that the County Treasurer be directed to issue bonds, at interest not exceeding 4 per cent, in series of \$50,000 each, the first series due in 1900, to provide funds for this shore road.

The Aldermanic Committee on Parks and Bridges on Thursday decided to report to the board next Monday a resolution to transfer \$35,000 from the unexpended balances to the Department of Parks for the following purposes: For a fence around Winthrop Park, \$5,000; for walks in the same park, \$5.000; for a fence around Bushwick Park, \$5,000; for a fence around the Twelfth Ward Park, \$5,000, and for a shelter at Tompkin's Park, \$5,000.

BUILDING MATERIAL MARKET

NEW YORK.

BRICKS.-It is still only a winter market, which of course, embodies narrow trading and consider able uncertainty in regard to value, as prices have able uncertainty in regard to value, as prices have to be adjusted to momentary circumstances ruling when deals are completed. It is, however, getting along now toward a period when operators commence to think about the next season, and in a general way the forecast inclines to hopeful views as to probable consumption. The private building operations projected are largely of a character to require liberal use of brick, and should some of the public enterprises be pushed forward the wants of the local market must be greatly augmented. As yet nothing of positive character has been heard from points of production, but there appears to be no notion that manufacturers will take any unusual action unless features arise differing radically from those at present prevailing. Since last writing the weather has permitted more work, and with that came some demand for for stock, resulting in sales of held barge loads, upon which we are assured top quotations were obtained for best quality. So far as learned no fresh arrivals came in from any locality.

DOORS, SASH AND BLINDS.—The conditions of trade do not seem to prompt any pronounced expressions of cheerfulness, although local manuexpressions of cheerfulness, although local manufacturers and agents representing makers at interior points are hopeful, in common with dealers in all kinds of material, that the incoming season will prove satisfactory and profitable. Efforts to get price lists upon a uniform and remunerative basis will be continued, especially as many grades of desirable lumber are increasing in cost. Conditions of trade at the West are described in a recent market report as follows:

There is a good inquiry for car loads, and plenty of orders could probably be secured for April and May delivery, but that is playing too much into the hands of the buyers. Prices are practically certain to advance before that time, and therefore such orders are almost invariably turned down. In the meantime factories are running along at about :0 to 60 per cent of their capacity, and every precaution is taken against piling up a surplus of stock in the warehouses. And another report says: It is plainly evident that the discounts for the coming year will not reach the point that they did last year. The manufacturers have wearied of selling their stock at figures that leave nothing in it for themselves, and will see to it that they are not caught that way again. Even if they fail to get together and issue any new sheet, there is an individual feeling that each is going to get better prices, and that they will not sell at all rather than let go at former prices.

LATH.—While the market remains to a certain

LATH.—While the market remains to a certain extent nominal, and has a slightly doubtful outlook, in a general way the feeling is reasonably confident regarding the early spring trade. Even now it is claimed that there are several local dealers who could take care of quite a little bunch of stock, and quite a number of the outside points are calculated to furnish a good measure of custom just as soon as the reopening of navigation admits of deliveries. Much will of course depend upon the supply, and the manner in which it is sent forward. We could learn of no first-hand transactions during the week.

LIME - Consumption continues moderate and

LIME - Consumption continues moderate and LIME - Consumption continues moderate and irregular, with dealers in most cases apparently well supplied with stock for current trade requirements and making an indifferent call upon first-hand offerings. Parcels affoat therefore have to be cared for as well as circumstances will admit, and receivers cannot claim much advantage at the moment, atthough it would seem that any change in value must be for the better. Some sales have been made from stock in harbor during the week at old rates, but receivers will not negotiate upon parcels to arrive at current basis of valuation.

LUMBER -It has been a generally quiet market again, although business is gaining somewhat in matter of negotiating for car lots with now and then a deal made for supplies to come along after the reopening of navig tion. The latter naturally is almost wholly of staple stuff, and only where contracts could be closed upon basis of about last season's figures, buyers not yet feeling prepared to pay an advance unless necessity compels the securing of some particularly desirable run of stuff or other special reasons arise. There does not appear to be a direct contest against the market in any case or an idea that cost will be lower, but it is simply a continuation of the old careful spirit that holds in check all speculative tendencies, even where it would be difficult for the most pessimist to figure out a possible loss on goods bought at present prices. The attitude of agents representing manufacturers of all staple lines of stock remains quite as steady in talk as for some time past, although a few who started in a few weeks ago at a somewhat higher level have found so little attention they are down again to the old plane of value.

Spruce has remained quiet, neither buyer or seller making any special demonstration in view of seasonable drawbacks to trade. There has, however, been a slight increase in deliveries from yard in some localities and as the movement in that form is likely to further expand, receivers have an idea that by the time any Eastern stuff comes along again in search of custom there will be a market waiting for it, especially as no large quantity is likely to work down the coast at this season. All advices from primal markets are strong, and there is scarcely a doubt that manufacturers intend making a determined effort this season to maintain a better line of value. State and West Virginia products are held for full figures and continue to te offered with moderation and care.

Hemlock is selling to some extent and commanding former rates, apparently, but the business seems to be somewhat irregularly apportioned. Some operators speak well of the numbee of orders they are booking, while others complain and occasionally go so far as to express doubt that reports of good business accomplished could be substantiated. There is, however, no tendency to urge matters, and on all staple grades of stock former rates are quite generally asked.

Carolina Pine appears to be somewhat irregular and there is evidently disappointment over the volume of trade secured from the various lines of custom. Nevertheless conditions are looked upon as only temporary, and there seems to be an idea that the spring call for goods will be of comparatively full and satisfactory volume and manufacturers are calculating upon shaping matters for uniform and satisfactory prices.

Yellow Pine undergoes little immediate change, but there may be noted the same hopeful expression regarding the future to which attention has previously been called. It seems to be considered quite a sure thing that local consumption will run fuller during the current year so far as all natural local outlets are concerned and there is considerable calculation upon securing good contracts with outside custom ordinarily negotiating through receivers at this market. Ideas in regard to export trade are also of hopeful character and there is an intimation that quite a number of f. o. b. orders are now under consideration.

White Pine is spoken well of almost without exception. We have already referred to a scarcity of uppers admitted by buyers and sellers alike, and there seems no doubt that any pronounced change in conditions on that class of stock must be for the better. For box and shippers there is also a great deal of faith, and while operators do not take a particularly buoyant view of affa

out the country.

Hardwoods are without animation, yet there is

quite a fair trade running up in the way of car lot orders and the dealing of sufficiently general character to give all the thoroughly staple qualities attention. Poplar remains as the most difficult to work around into shape, as there is not enough of it handled to give sellers foundation for a positively firm position. When a quotation is asked for, \$32 is named on inch, but when deals are closed it is generally upon basis of about \$31 \omega 31.50, and intimations of still lower figures are still considered the most desirable offerings on the market, and sure to hold, as both the manufacturers of furniture and house trim will continue to work it up as a leader. Good Ash and Birch are also popular, and Mahogany continues in good favor, especially among buyers who are posted as to scarcity of the wood and its comparative cheapness. Local export trading is unimportant, and a fair run of clearances from week to week is made up in the main of through shipments, with additianal negotiations understood to be under way at interior points.

transacted was the adoption of a committee report on classification and grading, which involves a few changes from last year's standards. THE WEST.

The Northwestern Lumberman as follows:

It is true that much of the trade that, under ordinary weather conditions, would have been spread through the winter, will now be crowded into March and April, and consequently business, when it does come, will have a degree of rush in it. But it is an old saying of lumber dealers that trade once lost in the season when it should have come is never fully regained; and hence we may conclude that the cold term has left a quantity of lumber on the hands of manufacturers and dealers which they will have to labor harder to unload than would have been the case if a portion could have been disposed of during January and the first half of February.

What effect the loss of winter trade may have on prices remains to be developed. Certainly they cannot go lower without serious loss to holders. Values have settled so far as to render it impossible for manufacturers or jobbers to go on doing business if there shall be a further decline. The situation is such that dealers say they must stop buying supplies at present prices unless they can get more for what they sell. Manufacturers say they must score an advance on lumber to be marketed in the future or lose money in their operations. Thus business seems to be approaching a deadlock, unless the spring demand shall swell to unexpected proportions.

In respect to white and Norway pine there is a pronounced shortage of the better grades in all the leading markets, and an industrious looking for supplies by the dealers and consumers in near and remote places. The av-rage opinion is that, while coarse stock this year will be plentiful and hardly higher of price than now, good lumber will not be over plentiful, and prices will be firm and may possibly advance. This should have a bracing effect on cypress and high grade yellow pine, which are rapidly supplanting white pine for factory use.

The oldest inhabitant can scarcely remember a period that has been more favorable to logging operations than the past month.

There is such a thing as too cold weather for good logging operations. For the past two weeks we have had this kind of weather. Without some moisture in the snow, heavy loads cannot be hauled, and when the weather is so cold, neither men nor beasts do as good work as when the temperature is more moderate.

If any one doubts that sufficient logs are to be put in this winter in the pineries of the northwest,

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a trip through the woods will change such an idea. Everthing is now active and every effort is being strained in northern Minnesota and Wisconsin to put in all the burned timber, which is making a good erop of logs.

The bureau of uniform grades of the Mississippt Valley Lumbermen's Association, together with Chief Inspector Warren and the sub-inspectors of the different districts, are holding a meeting at Rockland, Ill. The inspectors have recently thoroughly canvassed the different districts and made examinations of grades, and at the meeting at Rock Island it is expected that the work of the year will be outlined and grades will be specified for future use. The inspection committee will prepare a full and exhaustive report on their good work of the past few months which will be presented at the annual meeting of the Mississippi Valley Lumbermen's Association in Minneapolis February 26th. This work has been taken up in a more businesslike manner than ever before, and a more thorough knowledge as to the condition of grades throughout the white pine producing territory than ever before has been obtained by the members of the inspection committee.

"As Canadian timber can now enter the United States duty free, the effect is being felt in the English market. Yellow pine (white pine) was subjected to a duty of about 8 shillings a standard, and red pine (Norway pine) to one of 16 shillings a standard. The latter has always been a keen competitor with American hemlock in the American markets, and now that it is free of all tax the demand is likely to be very large, and the Canadian exporters have consequently raised the price of the wood to English shippers. They have also raised the price of pine deals, which during the last three years have gone up 15 shillings to 25 shillings a standard." This shows that the Canadians are quick to take advantage of the new situation to the extent of going one better in their business across the sea. If they have scored an advance on sales to their cousins in the United States, nobody on this side has found it out for a certainty.

Buyers, as a rule, are non-speculative and will not take hold freely on cut against future will not take hold freely on cut against future was ts, but do very well with wire, and the latter seems to be best fortified of the two makes. Production is, as a rule, closely graduated to present run of business, and manufacturers are understood to have no surplus to bother them. We quote cut at 90c.@\$1.00 per keg for car lots and \$1.00@1.10 per keg for parcels from store for iron, and add 3c. per keg for steel; Wire 90c.@\$1.00 for car lots and \$1.10@1.20 from store.

PAINTS, OILS, ETC .- The tendency of business PAINTS, OILS, ETC.—The tendency of business is toward steady increase without exactly running up to a point of animation. Buyers generally are cautious and closely adhering to the policy of find ing out exactly how much stock they are likely towant before opening negotiations, and rarely allowing themselves to invest beyond that limit. In matter of selection, too, they keep closely to staple runs of goods and low and medium cost qualities, the higher sorts getting only enough attention to perfect an assortment for ordinary working purposes. All calls have thus far been met right along steadily from available supplies, but some manufacturers now commence to feel the necessity for pushing production with greater freedom. In general ranges quotations stand about as before, but there is no positive firmness for any grade. Linseed Oil selling fairly well and most of the leading brands sustained in value. We quote at \$4@55c. for Western, \$6@57c. for City from donestic seed and \$6@57c. for do. from Calcutta seed.
