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T home the business situation is influenced by the fact that the season is drawing near when operations are rather curtailed than extended. Consequently, advices from the different trade centres generally report quiet markets. In iron and steel and copper especially dullness prevails, and this may be taken as an indication of a pretty general slackening of activity to come, consequent on this year's contracts being nearly or wholly completed and a natural tendency arising to wait for further developments before making engagements for 1898. Naturally, the low price of cotton is the subject of considerable remark. The estimates that come from quarters best entitled to credence, place this year's crop at a figure considerably below that of last year, and it is only about a month ago that we had to record a large shrinkage in the Indian crop for the current season, following one, also of no small proportions, in the season of 1895-6. In spite of its strong statistical position cotton has declined, a fact that can only be explained by a falling off in the demand. While this reflects present conditions of trade, it cannot be possible that it will be continued for very long. At present quotations there cannot be much, if any, profit in raising cotton, and growers are likely to hold their product until they can get better prices, and by so cutting off the supply give a better tone to the market. On the Stock Exchange prices have been better this week, but it is noticeable that the advances have only been good in securities of merit, the purely speculative ones having rallied only moderately and having had difficulty in holding their gains. Bonds participated in the rally only to a slight extent, and there have been no signs of a resumption of the investment buying which was so pronounced this summer. Part of the strength displayed by the market was due to the covering of shorts and to the usual buying that a sharp decline always brings, and part to buying in the belief that the next congress will pass a railroad pooling bill. We have it on good authority that a pooling bill will surely be passed. Postponement of the decision of the Supreme Court from Justice Peckham's ruling in the "joint-traffic case," probably had no connection with the intentions of the administration regarding railroad legislation, but it has served to strengthen the belief that something will be done to avert the evil consequences that would follow a confirmation of Judge Peckham's view of the law by the Supreme Court, if such should be its decision. Without a legal buffer to protect them from its effects, an adverse decision would work havoc among values of railroad securities, but with one, especially if it take the shape of law permitting pooling, there is not only nothing to be feared but much good to be expected. Railroad building has been so restricted for ten years past, that the country has grown up to its facilities for transportation. With legal authority for pooling business, and so securing good maintainable rates, the railroad business would be in excellent shape and the securities based upon it the most desirable to hold. While the hope of the passage of a pooling bill holds good it will do much to check declines in the railway share and bond lists, and the prospects of its realization would be about as good a thing to start a bull movement upon as could be imagined.

BROAD, the condition of the several money markets occupies the most attention in financial circles. The hardening of rates has its usual effect in rendering business on the Stock Exchanges dull, but a rise has long been anticipated, and therefore works only a minimum of harm. The British government has rejected the proposals of the United States Commission on silver, whatever they may have been, but at the same time expressed a willingness to consider any new ones that may be made. Whether the last-mentioned offer is merely intended to soften the refusal to enter into negotiations on the basis named remains to be seen. That that it is so, is the opinion of the press

generally, which has overflowed with articles on the final disposition of the silver question in this way. But it is rather remarkable, in view of the position of the press toward it, and of the rise that took place in silver while the proposals were being considered, that there has been so small a decline in the price of silver, although a week has passed since the decision arrived at by the British government was known. If we put aside the idea of diplomatic courtesy and take the answer in so far as we know it, at face value, it would indicate that in the opinion of the British government there is ground for discussion of the silver question, though it was not reached in the proposals of the Commission. The refusal to re-open the Indian mints was based on a doubt of the proposals offering a steadying base for the value of the metal and not on an opinion that no such base could be found. For the reasons given before in these columns, the condition of the Indian currency must give anxiety to both the home and the Indian government. It is admitted that the closing of the mint to the free coinage of silver, while not without its temporary advantages, has not been a success. Such a state of things cannot continue forever, but must eventually enforce reformatory action. There is a wild idea in some minds that India can go upon a gold basis, though it has no gold, nor any means of getting it, except by creating a scarcity of the rupee, a not very practical way as a moment's consideration will show.

The New Lien Law.*

VI.

THE ENFORCEMENT AND TERMINATION OF LIENS.

MECHANICS' lien only arises on the actual filing of the notice of lien in the County Clerk's office; until that is done the possible lienor stands in the same position as other creditors, and has no preferential rights. It may be filed after the work is done and within 90 days, after completion or before all the work is done or all the materials are furnished, provided the contract is afterward completed. And it is now provided that the ninety days shall run from the last item of work performed or materials furnished. A lien filed after the 90 days is utterly void, but, of course, the contract right remains.

Priority is the rule, and the lien first filed will be fully paid before anything is applied on a subsequent lien, provided, however, that laborers for daily or weekly wages have preference over all other claimants, without reference to the date when their liens are filed.

Liens are enforced on the equity side of the court by a procedure similar to that for the foreclosure of a mortgage on real estate, in which all persons who have claims upon the property are joined as parties and the rights of all are examined, adjusted and enforced. If when these rights have been determined and the liens found good, they are not paid, the court will order the owner's interest to be sold and the proceeds applied to the payment of the liens in the order of their priority.

The notice of lien is an important paper, yet it is generally drawn in the greatest haste in the mad rush for priority, when all sub-contractors and material-men are hastening to file liens, because the action of some one among them, in filing his notice of lien, has destroyed the credit of the contractor in the minds of all connected with the job.

The law prescribes a number of statements which must be embodied in the notice, and without entering into details here, let it be noted that the form and substance of these statements is materially changed by the new law which takes effect Sept. 1, 1897. In general it may be said that the lienor is limited to the amount he claims in his notice, and that a false statement wilfully or intentionally made, will render void the lien. How far the courts will permit a lienor to go in explanation of an apparently false statement is still undetermined, but care should be exercised to avoid the need of such explanation. The form of verification has been changed in the new law.

There are three ways of terminating a lien on the part of the lienor and three on the part of the owner. The lienor may

- 1. Give a satisfaction of lien.
- 2. Neglect to prosecute it after notice to do so.
- 3. Fail to begin foreclosure within a year or to obtain an order of renewal.

The owner may

- 4. Deposit in court before suit begun the exact amount with interest to date of deposit.
- 5. Deposit in court after suit begun such sum as the court shall determine.

6. Give a bond, before or after suit begun, to be fixed and approved by the court.

Of course in these last three instances the lien is only terminated as far as the land is concerned, and is transferred to the deposit or the bond.

The lienor's acts:

If the lienor give a satisfaction, it will be his voluntary act, and if he fail to begin action of foreclosure within 30 days after notice served on him it will be because he elects to abandon his lien. But the failure to begin foreclosure within the year is often unintentional on his part. He may forget the passage of time until it is too late, or he may think that his lien is protected by action in other ways which involves him. Thus if foreclosure be begun on another lien against the same property, he must be joined as a party; but the mere joinder as a party defendant will not obtain for him a determination of his rights, unless he sets up his lien affirmatively in the suit and demand pretection. If for any reason which satisfies the court he does not wish to begin foreclosure within the year, he can obtain from the court an order extending the lien one year from the date of the order. But the time limit runs only against the lien on the land, and when this has been replaced by a lien on a deposit or a bond, the latter runs indefinitely and until discharged by legal proceedings duly had.

The owner's acts:

As the lienor's object in filing his lien is to obtain payment, he can have no objection to the deposit of money in discharge of the lien, save that it behooves him then to proceed promptly to foreclosure for the small amount of interest allowed on such deposits is no inducement to dilatoriness on his part.

When the owner wishes to substitute a bond for the land as security for the lien, the lienor has more at stake, for there is the possibility that the bondsmen may not be able to respond when the time comes. He may examine them as to their means and object to them if not satisfied, and the court must then determine whether they shall be accepted or not, but the lienor is under no duty to examine the proposed bondsmen, and the owner who gives worthless sureties on a bond may be punished for contempt of court and fined an amount sufficiently large to indemnify the aggrieved lienor and imprisoned if the fine be not paid.

THE TWENTY-THIRD AND TWENTY-FOURTH WARDS.

Statistics relating to the realty and building interests of the 23d and 24th Wards make interesting reading to those who have helped, and are still helping to build up that extensive region, which in a few months is to lose its old and rather awkward title and become the Borough of the Bronx, one of the five great divisions of Greater New York, and whose familiar title will most probably soon be abbreviated to "Bronx" simply. The development of this territory above the Harlem is nothing short of remarkable and yet, its extent considered, it only seems to have acquired the proper impetus for much more. Although the first addition to New York City of transpontine territory was made in 1874, it was not until 1891 that it really took proper form for improvement. In the interval between those two years the Park Department had jurisdiction over it, and it being more than such a department could handle properly, especially secondary duty, carrying with it also secondary responsibility, the work necessarily preliminary to improvement lagged dreadfully. This was carried to such lengths that a body of enterprising property owners set to work and secured the creation of the Commission of Street Improvements of the 23d and 24th Wards, which, having ample powers, soon cleared the way for active operations. Streets were laid out, graded and paved, sewers built, and a new city began to arise with wonderful celeri-In 1895 the territory east of the River Bronx was added, and this has since been surveyed and a lay-out suggested. The showing this work will be ready for examination month. Hearings will be given and as soon thereafter as possible the final map of streets and avenues presented to the Board of Street Opening and Improvement for approval. This is a very important matter to the owners of the land affected, because until the final maps are approved it is not possible to definitely locate the lines of the streets and avenues that are to be. The dispatch with which the work of preparing the street map for consideration has been done reflects great credit upon the engineering force of the Commissioner. Since it was brought into the city limits in 1895 the new territory has shown signs of increased activity, and it doubtless only needs the necessary technical aids to become as active as the older annexed district.

In the following table there will be found the number of transfers, etc., in the 23d and 24th Wards in certain given years, from which a good idea may be obtained of the growth of realty activity in them since the year of their annexation to New York City. These figures show that, for the reason already given, the first seven or eight years made very little difference, the yearly volume being only slightly changed in 1881 from what it was in 1874. In 1891 it had much more than doubled; 1895 made a big gain, and 1896 another over that, while 1897 promises to make a high record for itself. With the increase in the number of

transfers, there is a falling off in the proportion with which the consideration is given; yet the totals reported show tremendous gains and represent a highly satisfactory yearly volume of busi-The average consideration per transfer shows a tendency to decline, due to a reactionary movement in prices and possibly also to the parcels traded in becoming smaller as improvement and settlement goes on. The figures to which reference has been made in this paragraph are:

The best idea of the enterprise that this annexation has called out is obtained from the figures relating to buildings which we They are even more satisfactory than those congive below. tained in the preceding table. Unfortunately we have no separate record of the building plans for the 23d and 24th Wards prior to 1881, but this does not prevent a satisfactory showing being made, particularly as it may be taken for granted that the causes that limited and delayed the movement in land also opprevent structural activity. In the ten years from 1881 to 1891 there was an increase in the number of plans filed of 169% and of 256% in their total estimated cost and 32% in their average cost. At the same time it must be pointed out that 1891 was not as good a year as some that preceded it. From 1891 to 1896 there was an additional increase of 111% in the number of plans filed, 116% in their total estimated cost, and 38% in their average cost. The current year is also making a 38% in their average cost. good showing, because while the figures are now too imperfect for fair comparison, the amount of work represented plans filed with the Department of Buildings is proportionally, that is, nine months as against twelve, greater than that for last year, as is also the average estimated cost per plan. The increase of average cost in 1897 over that of 1881 is 86%. From all these figures the main conclusions to be drawn are: That there is an increasing activity in realty in the 23d and 24th Wards, and that the number of buildings erected each year is not only increasing, but the buildings themselves are, as a whole, of better class. UNIFORM SAFE FLOOR LOADS.

The following is a summary of the conclusions arrived at by F. E. Kidder, architect and structural engineer, in a paper read before the convention of the International Association of Building Inspectors, at Detroit, last month, entitled "Uniform Safe Loads for Building Floors":

The floors of all buildings shall be designed and constructed in such a manner as to be capable of supporting in all their parts, in addition to the weight of partitions and permanent fixtures and mechanism that may be set upon the same, the following minimum live load for every square foot of surface of such floors:

Floors for ordinary stores, light manufacturing and light storage to be computed for not less than 120 pounds per square foot, and to sustain a concentrated load at any point of 4,000 pounds.

Floors constructed for the above loads shall not be used for heavier pur-

poses except upon permit obtained from the building inspector.

Any floor, or portion of floors, in any building intended for heavier loads or concentrated loads shall be constructed to support the loads for which they are intended.

For the unit strains for the strength of wooden beams and posts lieve those contained in the Buffalo Building Ordinance are as nearly perfect, all things considered, as can be laid down.

News in Brief.

Monday week, Nov. 1st, is the last day taxes can be paid to obtain the rebate allowed by law.

The new station of the New York Central and Hudson River Railroad, at 125th street, was thrown open to the public Monday.

C. W. Luyster has rented two of his row of five houses on 86th street, east of Columbus avenue; one was sold, leaving two which will be rented if not disposed of by sale.

A petition is being extensively signed requesting the Park Department to repave with asphalt or macadam the roadway of 86th street, from Central Park West to Riverside Drive.

Gen. Wilson, Chief Engineer of the War Department, is preparing an advisory report for the Government, to be used in considering the petition of the Harlem Chamber of Commerce that Bronx Kills be deepened to allow of navigation from Port Morris to the Harlem River.

The success of the pneumatic tube between the General Post Office and the Produce Exchange has suggested to some owners of big office buildings the idea that they can increase the attractiveness of their property by having pneumatic mail connection made between them and the Post Office. Mr. J. E. Mulholland, President of the Tubular Dispatch Co., has already been consulted by several on this subject, and it is possible that interesting developments from these conferences may come in a short time.

Secretary Gage has appointed James Knox Taylor, of Minnesota, to be Supervising Architect of the Treasury Department. Mr. Taylor's was one of the three names certified to the Secretary by the Civil Service Commission as having secured the highest percentages in the recent examination for the place. The other two were Howard Constable and George Martin Huss, of New York. Mr. Constable led the list, but Mr. Taylor's experience in the office overbalanced the very slight difference between their marks in favor of Mr. Constable.

The following resolution, moved by Alderman Woodward, was adopted on Tuesday by the Board of Aldermen: Resolved, That centre parkways be laid out and improved, and that trees be planted thereon where necessary, on the Western Boulevard, from Manhattan street to 158th street, to conform in dimensions and character with the parkways now on the Western Boulevard, south of Manhattan street, under the direction of the Commissioner of Public Works; and that the Board of Estimate and Apportionment be requested to make the necessary appropriations.

The fight against four tracks on Amsterdam avenue and the laying of tracks four feet apart is being vigorously maintained. The question of the power of the State Railroad Commission to withdraw their permit for the change of motive power is to be argued in the courts, and L. Horton, a property-owner, has obtained from Judge Truax an order on the Metropolitan Traction Company to show cause why an injunction should not issue restraining them from proceeding with the work of laying their tracks, which order is returnable on 25th inst., but does not stop work meantime.

The Long Island Railroad Co. has applied to the Brooklyn Board of Aldermen for permission to construct a tunnel from the depot in Flatbush and Atlantic avenues, in Brooklyn, under a portion of that city and the East River to New York. The petition was referred to the Railroad Committee, and arrangements were made for a public hearing on the scheme on Nov. 12. A similar petition will be presented to the New York Board of Aldermen. Mr. Baldwin says that the plans for the tunnel have been completed and that work will begin just as soon as the necessary consents have been obtained.

The first caisson for the pier foundation of the new East River Bridge, on the Williamsburg side, was launched on Wednesday afternoon from the foot of South Fifth street. The caisson is not yet completed. When it is its total weight will be 2,140 tons. It measures 79 feet by 62 feet, and has an elevation of 53 feet. When completed it will contain 58,900 cubic feet of Georgia pine. The second caisson is in course of construction in the same place.

Mayor Strong, having returned without approval an ordinance passed by the Board of Aldermen, requiring houses to be numbered, it has been submitted to the board in the following amended form and made a special order for Nov. 9:

An ordinance to amend the General Ordinances of the City, as follows: Add to Article XIII. (p. 40) a new section, to be known as section 230A, to wit:

Subdivision 1. The owner or lessee of each and Section 230A. building in the City of New York shall cause to be placed or affixed thereon the proper street number or numbers of said building and shall have said number or numbers kept and retained or renewed thereon; and such number or numbers shall not be less than three inches in height, and they shall be upon a plate at least three and one-half inches in width and of sufficient length to accommodate the numbers upon the same, with a longitudinal margin on said plate of at least one inch before and after the numbers thereon; and such plate shall be fixed to the outside of the building near the entrance thereto, and so that the same shall be plainly from the sidewalk in front thereof, and where practicable said plate and shall be at the right of the entrance to the building; and said plate shall be not less than four feet nor more than six feet above the floor of the stoop or entrance of said building; when for any reason it is impracticable to place said plate as above provided, the Commissioner of Public Works, upon application to him, shall designate the proper position for the

Subdivision 2. If the owner, or lessee, shall fail to provide, place and keep such number of numbers upon such building, the Commissioner of Public Works shall send by mail to such owner or lessee a copy of this ordinance, and if the same is not complied with within thirty days after said notice has been mailed to such owner, lessee, agent or other person in charge of the building, the said Commissioner shall cause the proper number or numbers of said building to be provided, affixed or placed upon said building in the manner prescribed by this ordinance, the plate upon which the numbers are placed to be of blue or black coloring, and the numbers thereon to be white.

Subdivision 3. Every owner or lessee, in charge of any building in the City of New York, who shall fail or neglect to comply with the provisions of this ordinance within thirty days after the notice above provided for has been mailed to such person, shall be fined twenty-five (\$25) dollars, which shall be duly sued for and collected, in addition to the cost.

Subdivision 4. The Commissioner of Public Works is authorized to determine what the proper number or numbers of each building are.

Subdivision 5. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.

INTEREST ON AWARDS IN THE 23D AND 24TH WARDS.

The claim of 23d and 24th Ward property-owners to interest on awards for property taken for street openings has just been sustained by the Supreme Court-Appellate Division. The question arose in the matter of acquiring title to Wales avenue, the facts as stated in the opinion handed down by the Court were: On the 18th day of June, 1896, the report of the Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment in this proceeding was finally confirmed Among the awards made by those commissioners was one of \$22,000 to William F. Brugman, as trustee of Francis S. Brugman, deceased. On the 29th day of July, 1896, the petitioner demanded payment of the award of \$22,000, which had been made to him; but it was not paid, and on the 25th day of May, 1897, this motion was made for an order requiring the Comptroller to pay to the petitioner the amount of his award and interest. The Special Term directed the payment of the award without interest, holding that the petitioner was not entitled to interest on his award. From the order thus made the petitioner appeals. His contention is that he was entitled to interest on the award, and that the Court of Special Term erred in refusing.

The Appellate Division, in reversing the order of the lower Court, stated that the petitioner was entitled to interest from the date of the confirmation of his report. The premises in question in these proceedings were situated in the 23d Ward. The award of damages as to premises in the 23d Ward is controlled by the provisions of Section 958 of the Consolidation Act, by the express terms of which damages are made due and payable at the time of the confirmation of the report. At that time, then, the landowner becomes entitled to the payment of damages which are awarded to him. It is quite true that by Section 992 the term of four months is given to the city, after the confirmation of the award, in which to make the payment, but this extension of time given to the city does not make the award of damages for land taken in the 23d and 24th Wards any the less due and payable. The effect of the provision is simply that the landowner is mentitled to his money, but during four months he is not permitted to take any steps by way of enforcing its payment, and the city is allowed to detain the money from him during that time for its own purposes and to suit its own convenience. When money becomes due and payable, the party to whom it is due is entitled to have it paid, and if the money is not paid, interest is allowed to him by way of damages for its detention. The fact that the payment is postponed after the debt becomes due because the debtor does not choose to pay it, and that the law does not give the creditor any right to enforce payment, does not take away the right to interest during the time for which payment is postponed. In this case it appears that the title to the premises vested in the city at the time of the confirmation of the report. Such is the express provision of Section 990 of the Con-The award became due and payable at the same We have then this state of affairs: That the city had the right at once on the confirmation of the report to take possession of the petitioner's premises, and he had the right at the same time to insist that his award was payable; but, for the convenience of the city, his right to take steps to enforce the payment of the award was postponed for four months. This is clearly a case where the interest on the award should be given as compensation for the use of the premises, the right to which was taken away from the landowner by that confirmation.

REAR TENEMENTS-POWERS OF THE HEALTH BOARD.

The Health Board has decided to take the rear-tenement case recently decided against them by the Supreme Court—Appellate Division, to the Court of Appeals.

This decision turned upon the powers of the Board to destroy buildings under the Gilder act of 1895. Suit was brought by the Department against Frederick Dassori for the condemnation and destruction of the four tenement houses owned by him in the rear of Nos. 308 to 314 Mott street. Judgment was given in favor of the Board, and commissioners appraised the value of the materials of the buildings, and they were ordered to be destroyed. Appeal from this order was taken to the Appellate Division, which holds, by Justice Rumsey, that the referee was justified in his finding that these houses were unfit for human occupancy, but the testimony was far from establishing that they were not capable of being made fit for habitation, or that the nuisance upon them could not be abated in any other way than by their de-

struction. The unsanitary condition was caused to a very considerable extent, if not entirely, by the filthy habits of the persons who inhabited them, and grew out of the fact that they were used for human habitation. It did not appear that after the buildings had been vacated they might not easily have been put into a sanitary condition by proper repairs and the removal of the offensive appurtenances.

"Even if it be said, however, from this testimony," Justice Rumsey said, "that the referee would have been justified in finding that the buildings could not have been made fit for human habitation, still, the necessity for their destruction was not made to appear. A thing is a nuisance when, because of its inherent

qualities or the use to which it is put, it works an injury to people who live in its neighborhood. The right to abate it arises from the necessity of the case, exists only because of that necessity, and is to be exercised only so far as the necessity requires. A thing which is a nuisance because of the use to which it is put cannot be destroyed. Although the buildings may not have been capable of being made fit for habitation, still, if they were so put in repair that the evil smells should be removed and the sources of contagion taken away—as it is claimed from the evidence might be done—the buildings would cease to be a nuisance; and the fact that they might not thereby be made fit for human habitation would not authorize their destruction."

Building Material Market.

BRICKS.

The strength of the market for Hudson River brick has continued most pronounced, and a further advance in prices of $12\frac{1}{2}$ @25c. per M. has been established. The results for the past week have shown a slight falling from those of last amounting to 59 barges, as manufacturers generally have shown a disposition to hold back their supplies. Demand has continued active, and the supplies received have found a quick sale at full The suspension of work for the season is now becoming general among manufacturers, and the fact that the market is turning in their favor, after the long period of unremunerative prices, is not inducing freer shipments, with the result that some dealers who have made contracts with builders for their coming supplies at the lower costs recently ruling are now finding the market working against them. The close was quoted firm, with ordinary up-river brick at \$4.50@4.621/2; good do. at \$4,75; Haverstraw at \$4.75@5.00, according to quality, and specials at Light hards have had a fairly good call, and have \$5.121/2@5.25. sold at \$3.50 to \$4.00. The offerings of pale brick from up the river have been small, and at the close shipments of this qualtity of trick were reported as stopped for the season, as manufacturers had no additional supplies for sale. The offerings from Jersey have also been light, and manufacturers state that they have only a very small stock remaining on hand which they cam offer. The prices at which business has been transacted show advances of 25 to 371/2c. per M, and at the close \$3 was obtainable for all offerings of merchantable grades. Jersey brick has received considerable attention. The features of the trading were sales made early in the week to go to Newark of 16 barges of the best grades, and the price paid was \$5.25. Subsequently this price was paid for about 150,000 brick by a Brooklyn dealer. The lower grades sold at prices ranging from \$4.50 to \$4.75, and the close was quoted at \$4.75@5.25. Hackensack brick continued to be received slowly; prices were quoted nominally at \$4.75@5.00, according to quality.

CEMENT.

For Rosendale cement the market has shown a fairly good tone. The offerings have continued large, as manufacturers have been free sellers, supplies having come forward with considerable freedom. The improvement in demand, however, which has been noted for several days, has continued, as with the more active conditions existing in the building trade dealers have been experiencing a decidedly better distributing business, and they consequently have been decidedly better buyers, the demand for supplies being well up to the offerings; prices have not changed, holding steady at 70c. for round lots, and 75c. for smaller par-The talk of a combine of manufacturers continues a feature of the market, which is watched with considerable interest by the trade. No changes have occurred in the general situation, it being learned from those who are in a position to know that gradual and satisfactory progress is being made toward the com-The demand for the domestic makes pletion of this scheme. of Portland cement has been active, the manufacturers of leading makes reporting that they have sufficient orders at hand to keep them busy for some time, and positively refuse to accept further orders for supplies ahead; prices have ruled firm, with \$2.00 the inside quotation for round lots. Imports of the foreign makes of Portland cement have been fairly large, amounting the past week to 12,500 bbls. The call for supplies has been fairly brisk, as buyers, owing to their inability to obtain domestic makes, were purchasing foreign; prices were steady.

GLASS.

Advices received from Chicago stated that at a meeting of the Western jobbers, held in that city on Wednesday, an advance in prices for window glass of 5 per cent., to take effect at once, was made, and it was decided to instruct the trade that another advance of at least 5 per cent. will be made to take effect in November. Stocks of all the more popular sizes were reported as being at quite a low mark. Local jobbers have been having only a very moderate run of orders, and no changes have oc-

curred in prices, which range from 60 and 10 and 5 to 60 and 20 per cent. discount.

LATH.

No supplies of Eastern spruce lath have been received the past The tone of the market has ruled firm, and a further adweek. vance in prices have been established. It was stated that some of the large local dealers were working on limited stocks, as the continued brisk consumptive demand has materially depleted their holdings, and they were in the market for supplies. have had only a small amount of lath to offer, as not only have the receipts at this market been nil, but the supplies on the way are small, owing to small shipments both from the provinces and Maine. Naturally they have taken advantage of the turn of affairs in their favor, and they have advanced their prices with the result that sales have been made of supplies to arrive at \$1.75, the price paid at the opening of the week, and later \$1.80. At the close it was stated that there was only a limited supply on the way to this market, for which their buyers, were willing to pay \$1.80, but sellers were firm at \$2.00, and seemed to be quite confident that they would get this price before the close of the

LIME.

The feature of the market for Eastern lime was the stopping of their fires on the 20th inst. by the manufacturers at Rockland and Thomaston, and they will not be again started until November 8th. It was estimated that at the time of the stopping of the fires the amount of stock held a the two points was about 30,000 bbls., and as this supply will be taken inside of ten days, it means practically another suspension of shipments for about a fortnight. The arrivals at this market the past week have been small, amounting to only six cargoes. Owing, however, to the fact that the supplies received last week gave dealers fair stocks, sellers have found that their offerings this week have been taken rather slowly; still, now that another suspension of shipments is in sight, they have shown no disposition to hurry business, and the moderate supplies they have on hand have been held for full values, closing at 75c. for common Rockland, and 85c. for finishing do. State lime has had only a very limited demand, but as sellers have continued to bring supplies only as called for, there has been no surplus stock offering in the market, and values have held steady at 70c. for common. Jointa has been unchanged and steady at \$1. No supplies of St. John lime have been received, and the market has continued nominal.

LUMBER.

Trading has been on a moderately extensive scale, and the general undertone of the market has been firm, the tendency of prices having generally been towards a higher basis, although no advances of an important nature have been established this week, sellers have experienced little difficulty in marketing their offerings at full quoted values, buyers as a rule evidently having confidence in prices doing better as the season advances, and in some instances were quietly stocking up in anticipation of this improvement. The export business has shown no general improvement, although there has been something of an increase in the call for supplies for shipment to Argentina in anticipation of the proposed higher tariff on lumber by that country. The yard trade has been, as a rule, on a fairly extensive scale, as the consuming trade has been taking supplies with a fair show of freedom and have paid full values.

Reports from the West state that the Menominee boom shuts down for the season with the close of this week. The number of logs put in this season, it is estimated, will be about 230,000,000, against 337,000,000 last year, when the season did not close until November 15. It is stated that the shortage in the amount of logs turned this year out of the Menominee River is due to the fact that the lumber companies in that district had many logs left over last season, and accordingly did not log heavily during the winter of 1896-97, and also because about 40,000,000 feet of logs were brought in the past summer by rail. The prospects are that in the neighborhood of 400,000,000 feet of logs will be put in the coming winter in the Menominee district, which will insure lively times at the Menominee mills next year,

Advices from the interior markets have continued to report a healthy condition of affairs. At lake points the offerings have been fairly well cleaned and the tendency of prices has continued upward, although it is stated that some of the interior mills hold large supplies, but with the present favorable condition of the market show no disposition to hurry trade. In the Southwestern district business has continued active, although in some sections trade has been seriously interrupted by the quarantine measures against yellow fever. The position of the market for shingles has continued to attract considerable attention. The offerings of white pine shingles at Western points by first hands has been small, as the bulk of the supplies are controlled by second hands. Shingles from the Pacific Coast have had a good call, but owing to the scarcity of freight room deliveries have been interfered with materially.

Locally, offerings of Eastern spruce lumber have been only limited as shipments from Eastern points have continued light, the low prices ruling having a tendency to make mills hold supplies back. The call for supplies has been moderate, and in some instances sellers have obtained a shade better prices, but no general improvement has occurred. West Virginia spruce has had a fair sale, but at low prices. White pine has received considerable attention from buyers and business has been transacted at full values, but no advances have been established. Yellow and North Carolina pine have both had a good sale and at firm prices. Cypress has been in moderately active request at steady values, and hemlock has received some attention and has sold at unchanged figures.

Business in the market for hardwoods has been moderately active, and prices have generally held to a steady basis. ter grades of oak, both plain and quartered, have had a fairly good call, and as supplies have been limited, sales made have been at full values. Poplar has had a moderate sale, but offerings have continued large, and the prices at which business has been transacted have been low. Cherry has received slightly increased attention and values have been well maintained. Black walnut has had a fair export demand, particularly for shipment to Germany, and it is stated that a representative of a syndicate is in Beaver county, Pa., purchasing all the black walnut timber he can obtain. The market for mahogany and cedar has been firm. Receipts have latterly shown a falling off, practically nothing having been received from Cuba, and the shipments from Mexico have been small. From Panama there have been increased receipts of the medium grades, but as it has been the better grades only that have been wanted, they have sold rather slowly. Business has been fairly active and supplies in first hands have been materially reduced; prices have ruled firm.

NAILS.

While the volume of business transacted shows something of a falling off from that latterly noted, the market has continued in a healthy position, there having been a fairly good call for supplies and prices have been well maintained. Mills have shown no anxiety to obtain orders, as they have been as a rule behind in their deliveries, and the close was quoted firm at \$1.50 for carload lots f. o. b. mill, and \$1.65 for carload lots on dock at New York, and \$1.70 for small lots from store. Cut nails have had a moderately active sale, and prices have been maintained to a steady basis, closing at \$1.28 for carload lots from store. Quotations to the East have been well adhered to, the close showing prices unchanged as follows: New York, \$1.43; Philadelphia, \$1.41; Boston, \$1.45; Baltimore, \$1.40; Albany, \$1.43; Buffalo, \$1.37½. The New York price for small lots from store is \$1.53.

NAVAL STORES.

A further reaction has occurred in prices in the market for spirits of turpentine, reflecting the advices from the South, where the course of values has been controlled largely by the operations of a large export house. Latterly its purchases have been less free, with the result that the tendency of prices has been towards an easier basis. Locally the volume of business transacted has been very moderate, as the demand has been comprised almost exclusively of small hand-to-mouth orders from the jobbing trade, neither canners nor varnish makers having shown a disposition to make purchases. The close was quoted quiet, with regulars at 32c. and machines at 32½c. Savannah has been less active, and prices have declined to 30c. The market for tar has been largely a nominal one, as the supplies in first hands have been exceptionally small, at the close being less than 250 bbls. The call for supplies has been quiet, only small puddling sales having been made and higher prices have been paid, closing with regulars quoted at \$3.25 in pine or Wilmington barrels, \$3.75 in pork barrels, and \$4.121/2@4.25 in oil barrels. Pitch has been dull and unchanged at \$1.80@1.90.

OILS.

A fairly steady tone has dominated the market for linseed oil. The volume of new business transacted has been only very moderate, as buyers have been slow in placing orders for supplies, having shown a disposition to take only such stock as has been needed to meet their immediate wants. In the way of deliveries on contracts, however, there has been a fair amount of oil moving, and as the prices for flaxseed have been well maintained, neither city nor out-of-town crushers have shown a disposition to hurry business, with the result that values have been advanced 2c. per gallon; in fact, it was learned that State crushers have refused fair-sized orders at under 35@36c. Western crushers, however, have continued to keep their doings very quiet, but

there have been no indications of their having been willing to shade prices to make sales. The prices now quoted are 37c. for American city crushed, less than five-barrel lots, and 36c. for five-barrel lots or more. Boiled and refined were 2c. per gallon above these prices. Calcutta has been quiet and unchanged at 54c. State and Western crushed oil are quoted at 35@36c.

PAINTS.

Only a small volume of business has been transacted, the number of new orders coming to hand have been few and they have been almost exclusively for peddling lots, as buyers have shown no disposition to purchase beyond their immediate requirements. The decline in the base material, probably, having some influence, as has also the general reaction in business activity. In the way of deliveries of contracts there has been a moderate amount of paint moved, and as sellers have shown no disposition to hurry business, values have held to a steady basis.
White Lead.—In the way of new business the call for supplies has been on a small scale only, as buyers have been taking only such supplies as were needed to meet their current wants, the easy tendency to prices for pig lead being against a healthy condition of the market. Deliveries on old contracts have been fair, and as corroders have not been attempting to force trade, prices have ruled steady. The foreign makes have had a limited sale in small lots at full values. Red Lead.—The tone of the market has held steady, but the volume of business transacted has been small. There has been a limited amount of stock delivered on contracts, but new orders have been few and then they have been for jobbing lots only. The range of prices has been unchanged at 51/4@6c. The demand for foreign makes has consisted of a limited number of peddling orders, but prices have been firmly maintained, reflecting foreign advices. Orange Mineral.-Business has been quiet, both in the domestic and foreign makes, the sales made having been almost exclusively of the hand-tomouth character. Prices, however, have held steady for domestic at 61/2@7c., as manufacturers have not been anxious sellers, and the foreign makes have been well maintained in response to firm foreign advices at 61/2@9c., according to grade. Litharge .-The run of orders has been small, as buyers having been limiting their takings to only such supplies as were wanted to meet their early wants. A moderate amount of stock, however, has been marketed in the way of deliveries on contracts, and the tone of prices has held steady at 51/4@6c. Zincs.-Concerning the demand from the home trade, there has been a further shrinkage in the call for supplies, the demand being principally for peddling lots; the export business, however, has been on a fairly active scale, fair-sized orders having been received and prices have been unchanged and steady at 4@41/2c. Foreign makes have been quiet but steady. Colors.-Demand for both dry and in oil has been quiet, buyers having shown no disposition to purchase beyond their immediate wants. Prices have been unchanged and generally steady. The prices as last announced by the National Lead Co. are as follows: In lots of less than 500 bbls., 6c. net; in lots of 500 bbls. and over, 51/2c. OBITUARY

David Fletcher Porter, who has been a power in uptown realty circles for many years, died on Sunday last, at his home, No. West 77th street, in his 53d year. For many years he carried on business as Porter & Co., whose office is No. 159 West 125th street. This business was originally known as Porter & Randall, and afterwards became Porter & Dingee. It was founded by John H. Porter, at whose death his brother, David F. Porter, took hold and made a great success. Besides carrying on this real estate business, David F. was connected with several uptown financial institutions, and at the time of his death he had been for seven years president of the Hamilton National Bank. Mr. Porter took an active interest in politics, being twice a member of the electoral college, once during the Blaine campaign, and again in the first campaign of ex-President Harrison. He had also served on the Rapid Transit Commission. He was an active member of the Harlem Republican Club, and one of the best known and most popular men in Harlem. His widow and a son and daughter survive him.

Charles N. Moody, a well-known broker of Brooklyn, and brother of Leonard Moody, died at his country home, East Pittston, Me., aged 65 years. Mr. Moody came to Brooklyn from Boston in 1886; later he formed a partnership with S. Coykendall, under the firm name of C. N. Moody & Co. He was a successful business man and well liked by all with whom he came in contact

John W. Moran, the well-known bluestone dealer, and brother of the Rev. M. J. Moran, died at his home, No. 31 3d place, Brogklyn, or Wednesday last. He had been in the stone business since 1852, when his father took him into partnership. Mr. Moran was a member of the Mechanics' and Traders' Exchange, and of several riding and driving clubs. His death, which was unexpected, will be mourned by a wide circle of friends and acquaintances.

OF INTEREST TO THE BUILDING TRADES.

Plans for the viaduct to carry the Riverside Drive over 96th street have been approved, and the Board of Estimate has been asked to appropriate \$145,000 for the work.

Preliminary plans for the bridge to City Island have been accepted by the Park Board and sent to the Secretary of War at Washington for approval. The Board of Estimate and Apportionment has been asked for an appropriation for the bridge of \$250,000.

The Board of Examiners recently passed the following resolution on motion of Mr. Moore: "That the footing courses used in the construction of frame buildings may be of such size and thickness as shall meet the approval of the Superintendent of Buildings."

Commissioner Peaslee has suggested to the Board of Education that elevator shafts and an elevator service be put into all the school buildings which have playgrounds on the roofs, and that in the summer these be thrown open to the general public. The suggestion is now being considered by the Board's Committee on Buildings.

The Executive Committee of the Zoological Society reports that the final plan for the Zoological Park and the preliminary plans for ten of the most important buildings for animals are now practically complete. It is necessary, however, that at least \$60,000 more of the building fund of \$250,000 shall be secured before the plans can be submitted to the Board of Park Commissioners, which sum the society will make an effort to obtain without delay.

Octave Whittaker, Manager of the Burlington Venetian Blind Co., reports a successful season for the firm. Their new Venetian blind was specified by the school board for use in seven of the schools which have recently been completed. The screening of Washington Irving's old house, now occupied by Mr. A. D. Irving, was completed by the Burlington Company; among other contracts secured were the placing of 450 Venetian blinds in Mr. F. J. Schnugg's houses, on 111th street and 7th avenue, and 330 blinds in another of Mr. Schnugg's operations, at 117th street and Lenox avenue.

Gillis & Geoghegan, No. 537 West Broadway, steam and hot water filters, etc., find that the business of the present year has been steady, with evidence of future stability. "We will always be busy while the building industry is in progress," said Mr. Gillis, "and I do not think New York will be overbuilt like Chicago. There are thousands of old structures which will have to come down, or else be refitted with modern improvements, for, at the present time tenants demand them, and if these improvements are not in a building, the owner, as a result, has few tenants, or receives a rent roll that does not pay."

While at the present time the lumber dealers up the State are stocking up and enjoying their busy season, the local dealers find trade normal, with a tendency towards improvement. The American Lumber Co., 27th street and 1st avenue, found the demand this season greatly exceeded that of any year for several years past. This company was successful in securing a large quantity of Canadian lumber before the new protective tariff went into force. Since its passage the price has been forced up \$1 per M. by some of the Albany dealers, with the result that the local dealers find prices not so flat as was the case when lumber was imported free.

A pamphlet has been published by the Trustees for the Phebe Hearst Architectural Plan of the University of California, inviting architects to submit plans for a group of twenty-eight university buildings to be erected on a site comprising 245 acres at Berkeley, California. About \$5,000,000 have been pledged for the projected buildings, and additional funds will be forthcoming as required. The architectural competition is made possible through the generosity of Mrs. Phebe A. Hearst, who provides ample inducements to competitors in the way of prizes. Particulars may be had on application to the trustees, at No. 217 Sansome street, San Francisco, California.

The formation of the Window Glass Association, which was completed last week, will not in way interfere with the Plate Glass Association; the two associations are distinct, with altogether different commercial relations. The local plate glass dealers report that the steady demand which has been a characteristic of the glass market this season, still continues, with the prospect of a much better season next year, especially in the

Metropolitan district. In fact, a prominent wholesale man has made the remark that New York City has not in ten years presented such a field for plate glass dealers as at the present time. This assertion was based on the fact that the erection of large buildings will be carried on to a great extent in the ensuing year.

By the fire which destroyed the Trinity Corporation building, on the corner of Spring and Varick streets, last Sunday, Bradley & Currier Co., the well-known dealers in mantels, grates and tiles, suffered a loss of \$65,000, which is partially covered by insurance. The Bradley & Currier Co. occupied five lofts of the building in which were their finishing room, polishing room, storehouse, stock-house, and the finished goods department. Fortunately the fire will not interfere with the filling of orders. The factory, which is in the next block, was not touched by the fire, and all goods that were destroyed will be replaced with the utmost dispatch. The firm are making arrangements to occupy a building in the immediate vicinity, for the purposes of utilizing it as a stock and finishing room, but as yet no decision has been reached.

The fireproof clothes-drying frame manufactured by Mr. Leo Oppenheimer, No. 521 East 11th street, is rapidly acquiring favor among the architects and builders of apartment houses, so manifest are its advantages over the old style and sometimes unsightly wooden frames. In the latter kind the slat-work covered the roof, excluding light, and offered a lodging place for any refuse matter floating in the air. Mr. Oppenheimer's device entirely obviates these disadvantages, and the cost of erection, compared with that of the wooden frames is not greater. Among the apartment buildings which have been fitted with the iron frames are the Chelsea Court apartments, 21st street and 9th avenue; apartment houses located at Tompkins avenue and Quincy street, Brooklyn; Riverside Drive and 81st street, 79th street and West End avenue, 77th street and Madison avenue.

Ventilation and the proper lighting of a building are steadily becoming more important factors in the specification of a build-Among the successful contractors in this branch of the building industry is the well-known firm, Machwirth & Smith, No. 149 East 26th street. "During this season," said James Smith, "this firm has done one-third more work than last year, and has added to our list of employees, 60 names. The Cornice and Skylight Makers' strike interfered considerably with our work, but since its settlement, we have almost caught up and the work is now well under way." Machwirth & Smith were successful in getting the lighting and ventilation contracts for seven of the school buildings now in course of erection. During the past season the following large contracts were completed by the firm: The recreation piers at the foot of East 3d street and East 24th street; the west wing of he Museum of Naural History in Central Park, and the roofing of the east wing of the same building is now being finished.

There have been numerous methods tried to successfully light a window with the incandescent lamp, but the main disadvantage resulting from its use has been that while the window was, perhaps, properly lighted, the attention of the onlooker was directed more to the pretty row of lights than to the goods. A new device to meet this objection is manufactured by I. P. Frink, No. 551 Pearl street; it consists of a cornice placed above the win-The glass is dow, lined with silver-plated corrugated glass. placed in the cornice in such a way that the light is reflected both downward and inward in a manner similar to that adopted by art galleries for lighting pictures. The main advantage derived from Mr. Frink's patent device is that while the sources of light are entirely concealed from view, yet the window is thoroughly lighted with none of the dazzling effects of an improperly lighted window. Mr. Frink's device has met with unqualified success; at the present time he is placing it in the James McCreery stores, Broadway and 11th street, and Hackett, Carhart & Co.'s, 12th Mr. Frink was successful in securing the street and Broadway. specification of his cluster reflectors and other patent lighting devices for all the schools which are in process of erection in the city. The specifications of the Buffalo State Hospital and the new hospital at Binghamton require none other than Frink's patent reflectors.

The tendency to fireproof warehouses and the better class of residences is becoming more marked as the owners and builders become aware of the many advantages or fireproofing. "A fireproof house four or five years ago," said Mr. L. K. Prince, of the Prince & Kinkel Iron Works, "was a novelty, but I venture to say that in a few years to come all our good residences will be fireproofed." The Prince & Kinkel firm are at present working on the iron-work in the model tenements in West 68th and 69th streets, which will accommodate 375 families. The other contracts on which the firm is working are the power house of the Goelet estate, 45th street and Depew place, and the large residence, Nos. 15 and 17 West 54th street. In accounting for the rapid growth of the tendency to fireproof residences, Mr. Prince said: "The difference in the cost is very little, as the cost of structural steel and fireproof materials is very low at the present time. People are willing to pay the difference to occupy a building where life and property are more secure. The insurance rate is much less and the danger from the settlement of a building is obviated Again, there is the advantage in a fireproof building of its being Rats or vermin cannot make their way from one vermin proof. part of the building to the other, or even from room to room. Then there is the additional advantage in its being sound-proof, whereas in the case of the old style of buildings one can hear the movements of a person in the room above or beside you." Mr. Frederick Gebhardt's new residence, on the corner of 79th street and 5th avenue, will be fireproofed. The specifications which are now being drawn call for the most modern improvements in fireproofing.

Not every one who buys a home in a suburban district can have his street sprinkled free of charge. But this is a privilege which will be enjoyed by the residents of Homewood, the settlement organized in Brooklyn by the City and Suburban Homes Company. The company, in letting the contract for macadamizing the streets within the tract which it controls, stipulated that the contractor shall water the pavements for a period of three years. Sixty-five cottages are now under roof, and of these fifty-eight have already been sold. The cottages, most of them, are of brick and stucco work, and cost, on an average, \$3,000, with land in-The company's tenements, on 68th and 69th streets, between Amsterdam and West End avenues, in this city, are also under cover, and will be ready for occupancy in January. These houses contain 375 apartments and four stores. In the spring the company will begin the construction of similar houses on East 64th and 65th streets, between 1st avenue and Avenue A.

The preservation of marble and other stone exposed to the disintegrating influences of air and water is a subject, which, as people become alive to its importance, will demand widespread attention. Some years ago Robert Caffall, now chief engineer of the Florida Ship Canal, experimented and perfected a process by which the decay of stone is prevented by the filling of its molecular pores with a parafin solution. A patent was secured, and now the business of preserving monuments, exposed statuary and water-proofing buildings is carried on by Caffall Bros., sons of the inventor. The first work of importance that proved the utility of the process was the preservation of the obelisk in Central Park. Since that time, the firm has worked on many of the most notable monuments and statues in this country; among these are the Pabst monument, in Milwaukee, costing \$50,000; the Blatz mausoleum of granite lined with marble, also in Milwaukee; the large Firemen's monument in Chicago, and many of the public statuary in Baltimore and Washington. But the most interesting work of all which has yet been done is that on which the firm is now engaged. It is the restoration and preservation of the tombstones in the old Center Congregational Church, Hartford, Conn., whose existence dates back over 250 years. The records of the graves and the interments are still preserved in the vestry, and although in many cases the surface of the tombstone is entirely worn off, yet the stone is built up and made to appear as like as possible to its consorts. The preserving process is then applied and the stones, most of which are in the neighborhood of 200 years old, still maintain the appearance of antiquity. The Daughters of the Revolutions are spending thousands of dollars in the work of renovating and preserving this cemetery. Caffalls Bros.' process has received the endorsement of many foreign governmental departments, particularly that of the British War Department. In 1869 Prof. Abeil an expert employed by that Department, tested the process and, in a lengthy report, it was given his unqualified approval. Soon after Robert Caffall was the recipient of a medal from the British Society of Arts as a reward for his discovery.

CORNICE SKYLIGHT AND ROOFING CONTRACTS.

W. A. Werner, who succeeds the Manhattan Cornice and Roofing Works, which was destroyed by fire, is now re-established in new quarters at No. 353 East 78th street, with more room and better facilities than ever for making galvanized iron and copper cornices and skylights, etc., in a workmanlike manner and with despatch. Contracts now on hand include work for the "Renwick" store and business building now being erected at the northwest corner of University place and 10th street by Builder L. R. Treu; a business building at No. 7 Great Jones street, also for Mr. Treu, and Builders Robertson & Grant's flats on Eagle, near Westchester avenue. Mr. Werner also does tin, tile, slate and metal roofing.



Real Estate Market.

The private sales market has this week shown better tone. Not that the number of sales reported is greater than in previous recent weeks, on the contrary they are somewhat less; but because there are among them some of such bulk as to suggest that men of larger capital than those who have been buying for some menths are looking around for desirable properties, with serious intentions of buying should they meet anything that suits them. The sale of the Austin Building, on the southwest corner of Broadway and Houston street, is the first of an important character in the downtown business section this season. alone it might not mean anything, but it is accompanied by another sale on Greene street and by the considerable purchases on the Boulevard and elsewhere, all of which have important relations to the structural development of the city. We do not wish to create too sanguine expectations for the near future, but the satisfactory character of much of the business of this week ought to have a favorable influence. The Boulevard movement is especially noteworthy, as it is gathering volume. the past three or four weeks no less than sixteen plots have been disposed of by one interest alone, and represent a money total of over \$1,000,000. The same interest has closed contracts for the sale of twelve more lots, the details of which will be announced later.

In the auction market, too, there have been some good features this week which presented themselves prominently to notice. Charles Griffith Moses, referring to the Ward sale of last Tuesday, thought the results as a whole satisfactory. Going into detail he said the sale was "ordinary and extraordinary." Ordinary in respect to the prices paid for some of the lots, and extraordinary in respect to the bargains obtained by some of the buyers on the Boulevard. The territory, as a whole, he considered the coming section of the city for activity.

Engineer Webster, of the Department of Public Works, is putting the finishing touches to the map of the proposed extension of Riverside Drive, northward to connect with the Boulevard Lafayette. Under the terms of the law the Department of Public Works has six months in which to prepare the map for submission to the Board of Street Opening and Improvement. The time will expire on November 24. When the map is ready Engineer Webster will notify Mayor Strong, in order that he may call a special meeting of the Board of Street Opening and Improvement.

The Board of Education made appropriations this week as follows: \$21,435.56 for the purchase of a lot in the rear of Public School No. 70, on the south side of 76th street, between 2d and 31 avenues; \$213,318 for the purchase of a new site on the southeast corner of Market and Monroe streets, and \$13,787 for the purchase of Nos. 215 and 217 East 109th street, in the rear of Public School No. 83. It was also decided to acquire six lots in the rear of Public School No. 116, at Nos. 208-218 East 33d street, and two lots at Nos. 132 and 134 West 55th street, north of Public School No. 69.

Permission of the Board of Aldermen has been obtained to the selling of the site of the Roman Catholic Orphan Asylum, on 4th and Madison avenues, between 51st and 52d streets. The matter now goes to the Mayor. The Committee upon whose report permission was given said: "The locality affected is not properly situated for the uses of the asylum, and the sale of such property to individuals, who would improve the same and pay taxes thereon would bring a very considerable revenue to the city treasury, and at the same time enable the Orphan Asylum Society to acquire a location better suited to its needs, and where there might be no danger to the public from contagious or infectious diseases among the children under its charge."

David T. Kennedy writes us: "In looking over the Record and Guide of Oct. 16, 1897, I saw an article on the improvement, etc., on the Morningside Plateau. I was surprised to notice that you published both in the article referred to and in the table of building operations and descriptions of real estate on the Plateau, that on the north side of 117th street, between Amsterdam avenue and Morningside avenue, were seventeen "flats." Having built the property referred to for private houses only, and sold as such, and it being the intention of the property-holders to have no "flats" erected in that neighborhood, I thought it best to call your attention to these facts, for your printed and published statement may misinform parties desiring to locate in that neighborhood." Our description of Mr. Kennedy's improvements was wrong; it should have been dwellings.

Eugene Kirby, some time manager of the Hotel Marie Antoinette, is quoted as saying that a syndicate has been formed of English and New York capitalists to build an eighteen-story hotel on Riverside Drive, at a cost of \$4,000,000, the hotel to be known as the Hendrik Hudson. A plot, 200x250 is said to have been secured, but the exact location is withheld. This recalls the project for a similar hostelry originated by Robt. A. Chesebrough, of No. 24 State street, some years ago. Mr. Chesebrough, who owns nearly the whole of a block front on Riverside Drive, south of 93d street, had plans drawn by Clinton & Russell for a twelve-story and basement apartment hotel, to cost \$950,000: and his brother, Wm. H. Chesebrough, was making satisfactory progress in an attempt to interest English capitalists in the scheme, when the Venezuela war scare put an end to negotia-

BUILDINGS PROJECTED.

THE LAWS AFFECTING BUILDING.

There has not been any book on the market containing all the laws and regulations relating to building in New York City; yet the need of such a volume is plain enough, because a building from its foundation to its final demolition is subject not only to the building law, but to special regulations of the building department concerning passenger elevators, fire-escapes, light and ventilation and plumbing. There is also a law limiting the height of dwelling houses and another requiring temporary flooring. There are the tenement house and lodging house laws, laws relating to the extinction and prevention of fires and explosives, and the storing of combustible materials in buildings. Moreover, there are very important fire department regulations which must be observed in the installation of electrical apparatus, and there are, of course, all the regulations of the department of public works concerning Croton water rates and the use of water, the opening and refilling of trenches and restoring of street pavements; in addition to ordinances pertaining to the inspection of steam boilers. The architect, builder, building material man and real estate owner must be familiar with these laws and regulations; if he is not, he suffers. They are now all gathered together (with a directory of architects) for the first time in one volume, illustrated, indexed and supplied with marginal notes. The price, bound in cloth, is \$2.50. Answer.-The contractor is right. The excavation being less than ten feet deep you must protect your own property.-Law Editor.

MECHANIC'S LIEN.

Kindly answer the following questions: (1) How many square feet are there in an acre? (2) If I contract with a builder to erect a house on a lot which I own, agreeing to pay him in three equal payments, the last one upon completion of same, could any lien be filed against me after I had made full settlement with the builder, should he fail to pay for any of the materials used in the construction of house or for labor performed?

Answer.-43,560. Nine square feet make one square yard; 301/4 square yards make one square rod; 160 square rods make one acre. (2) The material man or laborer might file a lien, but he could not enforce it .- Law Editor.

BUILDING LAWS.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

Would you be kind enough to state in your next issue, if possible, how the building laws and inspection will affect us as regards strength of timber used in buildings and limit of frame houses in thickly populated districts, and oblige one of your sub-

Answer.-Your letter is written from Astoria, Long Island, and therefore, we preseume that what you wish to know is whether under the charter of the City of "Greater" New York, the build-

ing and fire limit laws at present in force and applicable to the City of New York, as it was before the passage of the charter, were by the charter extended to Astoria. To that question our answer is, no. The provision of the charter on the subject is as follows: "Section 647. The several acts in effect at the time of the passage of this act concerning, affecting or relating to the construction, alteration or removal of buildings or other structures in any of the municipal and public corporations included within the City of New York, as constituted by this act, are hereby continued in full force and effect in such municipal and public corporations respectively, except in so far as the same are inconsistent with or are modified by this act, provided, however, that the municipal assembly shall have power to establish, and from time to time to amend a code of ordinances, to be known as the Building Code, providing for all matters concerning, affecting or relating to the construction, alteration or removal of buildings or structures erected or to be erected in the City of New York, as constituted by this act, and for the purpose of preparing such code to appoint and employ a commission of experts; and provided further that upon the establishment of such code the several acts first above mentioned shall cease to have any force or effect, and are hereby repealed, but such repeal shall not take effect until such building code shall be established by the municipal assembly as herein provided. The provisions of such building code shall be in conformity with and be subject to all general laws of the State concerning, affecting or relating buildings or classes of buildings or other structures.-Law Editor.
