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EITHER at home nor abroad do the financial markets warrant the scare that has been witnessed here this week, founded apparently on the belief in some minds that war is the inevitable outcome of the investigation now being made into the loss of the battleship Maine. The bonds of our government have not been affected by this outcry, nor have Spanish bonds in the European markets, and both would undoubtedly have suffered severely if it was at all probable that war would break out between this country and Spain. London, whose political information and instincts are generally to be trusted, has been a buyer, though not to so large an extent as is currently reported. The buying came from London undoubtedly, but Londoners were not always the buyers. The fact that London has been apparently a buyer on the top of all our advances of late is a suspicious one, suggesting too much manipulation from this side by those who want to keep up an appearance of activity on the bull side while realizing. Nevertheless, speculative interests abroad have interested themselves in our securities to some extent on this break. The New York selling itself has been largely from margin accounts and it would only be characteristic of the speculative brokerage business if the selling was encouraged by brokers anxious to make the accounts in their offices more active. Yesterday's market showed that the scare has been checked, and that the market is preparing to take on the phase it usually assumes after excitement. This phase is a sharp reaction followed by dullness and drooping quotations. It takes some time to revive a speculative movement and meantime it does not pay to attempt to keep up prices.

UR inference that Britain had got all she asked for from China is being supported by the facts as they transpire from time to time. Looking back at the controversy, as well as at the West African Anglo-French dispute, one thing that comes out with striking prominence is what may be called the new dodge in diplomacy of arousing one's public. The success of this depends upon how far all the different governments are united in their dread of war and in this there really seems to be a European concert, which not even a party in opposition would question. The French foreign office has worked this dodge pretty effectively to obtain concessions from Britain, and now Britain works it in its turn. We can imagine a Foreign Minister of either power saying in effect to the representative of the other. "You see how I'm fixed, there's Parliament or the Chamber of Deputies, a writhing struggling mass on the floor of the house or chamber, and outside a howling mob who cannot put its dirty finger on the map at where the place we are contending about is indicated, and what am I to do. I cannot recede, and unless you do we must fight. Do me a favor now and I'll do you one next time." Then the concessions come. The successful minister brags of the victory he has achieved, and everything goes smoothly until a new hitch arises and the one who "arouses his public" first has the best chance of winning. In fact there really does not seem now to be anything any one power can claim, and maintain if obtained, that is worth fighting about. The trade of China is in British hands and for commercial and financial reasons must stay there for a long time to come. The malarial swamps of West Africa even have been parcelled out and all that France or Britain could obtain from one another would be very small advantages, not worth the bones of a cooley, to say nothing of those of a Grenadier, who costs considerable before equipped for the field. Consequently, while there is a good deal of talk of war; war becomes more improbable than ever, and enterprise more encouraged. From Cairo to the Cape has had a fine sound as the route of a railway, but it is now beaten in alliterative magniloquence by "from Havre to Halifax," by way of Behring Strait, which has been

suggested as a result of the Alaska-Klondyke movement. By the way the Deutsche-Asiatische Bank, which is to take part of the Chinese loan is a sort of committee of leading banks and bankers in Germany. The Vienna Creditors' Society, in its report for 1897, reports depression in every line of business, except building. The cutting off of Hungary from the Empire by a customs' tariff which is threatened, would, if carried out, increase the depression in the industrial states. The question of Indian currency and exchange is being urged on the government. Meantime the bazaars are handling silver ingots of various denominations to relieve the stringency brought about by the closing of the mints five years ago, and the consequent restriction of the issue of the rupee, and the rates for money are rising daily to panic figures.

THE DEADLOCK ON IMPROVEMENTS AND THE RELIEF.

THE check that our municipal improvements have received is a matter that is not receiving the attention it deserves from the public of this city. There is, in our opinion, too ready an acquiescence in the policy of the administration to defer all improvements, except those already begun, until a margin of credit has been created, by increased tax valuations presumably, in order not to overstep the constitutional limit of debt. The debt being what it is and the legal restrictions upon it being what they are, it is only fair to state at the outset, the administration had no other course to pursue than to be guided by these two facts in the amount of obligation they assume on behalf of the city. What is singular is that the position we are in has not before this raised the question whether the provisions created by law for the carrying out of public improvements are all that can be obtained?

Municipal history has proved conclusively that there ought to be a safe legal limit set to the debt-raising power of a municipality, and there is no reason to quarrel with the limit set by the Constitution of this State. This is a wholesome condition which, considering how it has been governed, has most probably saved this city from bankruptcy. Admitting then that there ought to be a limit to the city's debt, and that ten per cent. of the assessed valuation is a proper limit, ought not the work the city has to carry out financially and physically be in some way made proportionate to the means at its disposal; or, if those means are inadequate to supply its need for development, ought it not be enabled to seek other assistance whereby it can obtain the improvements called for by its growth, if it can do so without taking upon itself the financial burdens belonging to them? Must the city itself finance and build all the docks, bridges and viaducts; lay out all the new thoroughfares and provide all the supplies of water? And more important still, if the city, by reason of the legal bar to its incurrence of debt beyond a certain point, is unable to obtain such of these things as are absolutely necessary to fullness of growth, must it simply go without them and lose the benefits that their possession would bring?

There can be enumerated a long list of improvements, each of which is crying to be made. We need municipal buildings to house our homeless departments, an extension of the Riverside Drive to arouse from death an important section of territory, more bridges, increased water supply, modern in the place of antiquated docks, a main highway to open up another important section in the annexed district, improved sewers, new schools, and above all, transit facilities that are in the proper sense of the term rapid. Not only can none of these be obtained now because the city has already availed itself of its powers for issuing bonds, but they are placed in a future so remote as to be invisible for practical purposes if they are only possible under an expansion of credit through increased tax valuation and the operation of the sinking fund. We may take it for granted, too, that not only will the wants already named become more and more pressing and greater in individual bulk as time goes on, but they will be supplemented by others equally as pressing. What our means will be to supply these demands with the lapse of a few years it would be unwise to attempt to estimate, but there is no reason to suppose that they will be adequate. If, to make an improbably high estimate, the assessed valuations are raised \$100,000,000 a year for the next ten years and the debt limit thereby increased \$10,000,000 a year, and to the latter the annual benefits from the sinking fund are added, they would be insufficient for what there is to do.

This being the condition of affairs, is there anything that can be done to remedy it? The only answer to this is, let the city call in the aid of private capital to execute some of the work required. This suggestion will doubtless raise a host of objections, there are some that occur at once, but it is a proposition that deserves debate. If found impracticable it can be dismissed and something else substituted for it; but let us debate until we get out of the stagnation or dead-lock into which we have

come. There are some improvements that from, not so much their nature as from the nature of necessary preliminaries only the city can carry out, but there are others, which hitherto it has only been thought the city alone can carry out and which may very well be entrusted to other hands working under municipal control and supervision. At any rate the position of New York to-day proves that existing provisions for development are not equal to the requirements of the times and our business should now be to make them so.

HE several organizations in the city connected with the building industry have long been in the habit of appointing committees for the purpose of protecting themselves and the community against injurious legislation at Albany. The effectiveness of the work of these committees, however, has been minimized by want of concerted action, and some two weeks ago, after about a year of preliminary discussion, which began in the Architectural League, a Joint Committee on Legislation was organized, composed of representatives from the leading professional and technical societies. The object of the joint committee is somewhat larger than that of the several committees out of which it is composed, being not only to influence the State authorities, but the Municipal authorities as well. Thus, at the meeting of the joint committee, held at the rooms of the Architectural League, Wednesday evening, the chairman, George Keister, appointed six sub-committees to take charge of and report, as occasion arises, on the following subjects: Legislation at Albany, in the Municipal Senate and the Municipal Assembly, Parks, Docks and Bridges, Rules and Regulations. The sub-committee on rules and regulations, which consists of John Cooper, F. S. Lamb and W. S. Harrison, will report to the larger body on March 9, when the relations of the general committee to the several organizations will no doubt be more clearly defined, and forms of proceedure determined. The organizations represented on the joint committee are: The Building Trades' Club, the Mechanics' and Traders' Exchange, the Architectural League, the Mason Builders' Association, the Master Carpenters' Association, the New York Chapter of the American Institute of Architects, the National Sculptors' Society, the Society of Architectural Iron Workers, the Real Estate Exchange, and the National Society of Mural Decorators. With such solid backing as this the committee should be able to wield a powerful influence, both at the Capitol and the City Hall, and the use which it makes of its opportunities will be watched with interest. A feature of this movement that strikes us as full of promise for effective work is the association of the artistic with the technical and mechanical associations, through their representatives, into one body. Hitherto there have been too many lines drawn between these various associations and as a consequence the work and influence of each has been weakened, if not neutralized by opposing views. All this can be remedied by an organization representing all interests and working with one object. The good that can result from this to the community must be very great.

HOUSE NUMBERING.

The matter of securing a uniform system of house numbering in this city has been taken up by the Municipal Council. It will be remembered that an ordinance was passed by the late Board of Aldermen to secure this, but it was vetoed by Mayor Strong, and therefore fell to the ground. Early this year steps were taken to have the matter considered by the Municipal Council, and the following draft ordinance was introduced into the Board of Aldermen and referred to the Committee on Streets and Highways, which gave a public hearing on it yesterday:

Add to Article XIII. (p. 40) a new section, to be known as section 230A, to

Section 230A, Subdivision 1. The owner or lessee of each and every building in the City of New York shall cause to be placed or affixed thereon the proper street number or numbers of said building, and shall have said numher or numbers kept and retained or renewed thereon; and such number or numbers shall not be less than three inches in height, and they shall be upon a plate at least three and one-half inches in width and of sufficient length to accommodate the numbers upon the same, with a longitudinal margin on said plate of at least one inch before and after the numbers thereon; and such plate shall be fixed to the outside of the building near the entrance and such plate shall be fixed to the outside of the building near the entrance thereto, and so that the same shall be plainly legible from the sidewalk in front thereof, and where practicable said plate and numbers shall be at the right of the entrance to the building; and said plate shall be not less than four feet nor more than six feet above the floor of the stoop or entrance of said building; when for any reason it is impracticable to place said plate as above provided, the Commissioner of Public Works, upon application to him, shall designate the proper position for the same.

"Subdivision 2. If the owner or lessee shall fail to provide, place and keep such number or numbers upon such buildings, the Commissioner of Public Works shall send by mail to such owner or lessee a copy of this ordinance, and if the same is not complied with within thirty days after said notice has been mailed to such owner, lessee, agent or other person in charge

ontice has been mailed to such owner, lessee, agent or other person in charge of the building, the said Commissioner shall cause the proper number or numbers of said building to be provided, affixed or placed upon said building in the manner prescribed by this ordinance, the plate upon which the num-

bers are placed to be of blue or black coloring and the numbers thereon to be

"Subdivision 3. Every owner or lessee of any building in the City of New York, who shall fail or neglect to comply with the provisions of this ordinance within thirty days after the notice above provided for has been mailed to such person, shall be fined twenty-five (\$25) dollars, which shall be duly sued for and collected in addition to the cost.

"Subdivision 4. The Commissioner of Public Works is authorized to determine what the proper number or numbers of each building are.

'Subdivision 5. This ordinance shall take effect immediately."

LAST YEAR'S BUILDING.

It is only from completed statistics with their possibilities of comparison, that we can know just what the building industry of one year has been, and what were its contributions to the supply of new buildings in the various classes. Thus, for instance, the report of the Department of Buildings for 1897, which was recently published by the official municipal organ, gives us a correct idea of what was done in the development of the city during 1897, and by comparing the results shown by that report with those for other recent years, it can be seen what measure of progress has been made and in what directions. The Record and Guide's own tables do this as completely as unofficial compilations can do, and, although the general conclusions to be drawn from last year's operations were fairly presented some weeks ago, the departmental report makes it possible to supplement and support them, by publishing further interesting details.

The classification of the plans filed, which will be found in the table given below, is of the utmost importance in showing the extent to which the market was supplied by buildings in their several classes, and by adding to the Department's figures similar ones for 1896 there is presented a most interesting comparison. It will be seen that the total of business presented to the Department last year was \$10,616,219 more than in 1896, or nearly 15%, which on so large a total is quite a considerable percentage. Neither the number of plans filed nor the number of buildings covered by them was so very much greater, and consequently it follows that last year saw a more expensive kind of construction than its predecessor. A reference to our issue of June 19 of last year will supply the corresponding figures for the year 1895, and it will be found that the tendencey of increased cost has continued from that year. The number of plans filed in 1895 were 2,183; the number of buildings included in them 3,870, and the total estimated cost \$85,528,017, or only \$1,129,853 or 1.4% more in cost, with 358, or something over, 10%, more in the number of buildings compared with 1897. This feature of costlier buildings is made all the more remarkable by the fact that there was a great falling off in the projected cost of office buildings, both as compared with 1895 and 1896. In each of the two last mentioned years the plans in this class contemplated expenditures of between \$12,000,000 and \$13,000,000, while last year the amount of office building work submitted to the Department was less than \$7,000,000. Before going into a comparison of the details, it is perhaps best to present the table containing the figures; it is:

The very first item relates to high-priced dwellings, of which there were in 1897 eight costing on an average something over \$94,000 each, as compared with two costing \$57,500 each; and in the next class, dwellings costing more than \$20,000 and less than \$50,000, there was also an increased average cost, though slight, with a lessening in number. In the next, low-priced dwellings, a largely increased number was also accompanied by a small increase in average cost. Plans were filed for three more hotels than in 1896, and three less than in 1895. The average cost under this head differed little from that of 1896, but was much greater than that of 1895. In high-priced stores, there was a falling off in number last year, but an increase in cost; and in low-priced stores, while the cost increased the number fell off. As pointed out before, there was a large falling off in the plans filed for office buildings, and a still larger falling off in total as well as average cost. The same remark applies to factories and workshops. School building was more effectively carried on, and there was a large increase in municipal buildings. The erection of flats and tenements is as much in favor as ever. In 1895, the expectation of the passage of the Gilder law caused the filing of an immense number of plans under this class. In that year 694 plans, calling for 1,472 buildings, to cost more than \$15,000 each, and representing a total of \$37,153,240, were filed, most of them

before the new law went into effect. In addition 93 plans for 175 cheaper buildings, with a total cost of \$1,648,100, were also filed. It was thought that these would supply the market for a long time to come. There was a falling off in 1896, as will be seen from the figures given above, but evidently the demand soon became greater than the supply, because last year 1,146 of the dear flats and tenements were projected at a total estimated cost of \$30,837,500, and 219 of the cheaper ones, whose estimated cost aggregated \$3,316,000, both being largely in excess of what were seen in 1896. It is important to note that this form of enterprise and investment does not lose favor in spite of much adverse criticism, and the fact of their plentiful reproduction is a most practical and effectual reply to the critics. There must be some way of securing a good return on these immense amounts of money that are yearly put into flats and tenements, otherwise the industry of constructing them would die out.

Another table to which attention is directed is that given below, which shows the work begun and completed in New York City within certain prescribed areas. From this table it will be seen that more buildings were begun but fewer completed in 1897 than in 1896; but both more begun and completed than in 1895. Consequently, it does not follow that the greatest number of plans in a certain year means also the greatest number of buildings erected in that year. Apparently a large amount of business was carried over from 1895 into 1896, and if this deduction is proper, there was also a considerable amount of the building projected last year to be done when this year opened, and presumably to form part of the work for which the trade is now making preparations. These figures in our second table, like all other statistics relating to the subject of building in New York City, bring out the extensive improvements that are going on in the northern section of Manhattan and in The Bronx, as well as other points of interest, which will repay careful examination and analysis. OUR ALBANY LETTER.

Albany, Feb. 24.—The policy of strangling the bills amending the charter of New York was continued the past week in the Legislature. No bills of importance escaped from the committees, or were passed by either the Senate or the Assembly.

Senator Grady was not here this week. When he returns it is said he will push a bill which he quietly introduced the latter part of last week, authorizing the issue of \$12,000,000 30-year stock for dock improvements, additional to that already authorized by law for the same work.

The Senate Committee on Banks yesterday decided to report favorably Senator Page's bill, authorizing banks in New York City to establish branch offices.

The Senate Committee on Codes reported favorably to-day Senator Cantor's bill providing for the appointment by the State Comptroller of an agent with authority to issue licenses to auctioneers in New York City, and to inspect the record of their sales.

A bill has been introduced by Assemblyman Bondy, of Syracuse, which it is suspected is intended to pave the way to the placing of the rails of a trolley line on some one of the bridges of the Harlem River. It has been suggested that the bill looks to the crossing of the Sedgwick avenue spur of the Central Bridge by the trolley lines on Jerome and Sedgwick avenues, which would enable the residents of the west side of the Bronx to reach the elevated station on 8th avenue. Another suggestion is that it is intended to link together the Third Avenue and the Huckleberry Railway, north of the Harlem River. The bill provides that "whenever a terminus of any public viaduct, bridge, or bridges, or public viaduct connected with any bridge or bridges, heretofore or hereafter constructed in any city of the first-class or town adjoining the same, is or shall be located at or adjacent to, or within one-half mile of the route of any existing street surface railroad the corporation owning and operating such railroad may, irrespective of any provisions otherwise applicable thereto contained in any general or local act, upon obtaining the consent of the local authorities and property owners as before provided, and upon complying with the provisions of the railroad law applicable thereto, extend its road or route and construct and operate its railroad to, upon, and across such viaduct, bridge, or bridges, and the approaches thereto, subject to the provisions of the railroad law, provided, however, that this shall not apply to any bridge over the Hudson or East Rivers.

The Senate Judiciary Committee favorably reported to-day the bill incorporating the New York Realty Bond Exchange and Trust Company.

The Senate ordered to a third reading to-day Senator Cantor's

bill, authorizing Bellevue Hospital to hold property to the amount of one million dollars.

The Senate ordered to a third reading to-day Senator Cantor's bill concerning the bonds of auctioneers.

The Senate Judiciary Committee reported favorably to-day Senator Ford's bill, declaring that "persons having liens under contracts for public improvements standing in equal degrees as colaborers or material men shall have priority according to the date of filing their respective liens, but in all cases laborers for daily or weekly wages shall have preference over all other lienors having liens arising under the same contracts, pursuant to this article, without reference to the time when such laborers shall have filed their notice of lien."

The Senate passed, on Wednesday, Senator Pavey's bill, permitting the Metropolitan Museum of Art to hold an unlimited amount of real and personal property.

The Assembly ordered to a third reading yesterday the bill of Mr. Weekes, relating to costs and charges of Commissioners of Estimate, given in this column last week.

The following bills were introduced the present week, each being preceded by the name of the introducer and its introductory number:

Senator Nussbaum (No. 494), authorizing cities of the first and second classes to expend \$50,000 yearly in the purchase of works of art by citizens of the United States for art museums.

Senator Page (No. 523), authorizing every bank, savings bank, trust, loan, mortgage, security, guaranty or indemnity association to make good a deficit by a pro rata assessment of the unpaid subscriptions to the capital stock of such company to an amount not exceeding the unpaid sum due on said stock subscribed.

Senator Pavey (No. 526), amending Section 370 of the Code of Civil Procedure relating to proceedings of commissioners in proceedings for the condemnation of real property by providing that their compensation shall be increased from \$6 to \$10 a day, and "that in proceedings within the counties of New York and Kings such commissioners shall be entitled to such additional compensation not exceeding \$25 for every such day as may be awarded by the court.

Senator Page (No. 522), ratifying the action of the Board of Street Opening and Improvement of New York in opening Wadsworth avenue, from Kingsbridge road, near 173d street to 11th avenue, in the 12th Ward.

Senator Burns (No. 505), amending Chapter 49 of the General Laws (in relation to liens), by amending Section 2 of Article 1 by putting in the phrase: "the term 'owner' when so used includes the owner in fee of real property, or of a less estate therein, a lessee for a term of years, a vendee in possession under a contract for the purchase of such real property, a mortgagee having a mortgage upon such real property at the time of the filing of the notice of lien and all persons having any right, title or interest in such real property which may be sold under an execution in pursuance of the provisions of statutes relating to the enforcement of liens of judgment, and all persons having any right or franchise granted by a municipal corporation to use the streets and public places thereof, and any right, title or interest in and to such fran-The purchaser of real property at a statutory or judicial sale shall be deemed the owner thereof from the time of such sale. If the purchaser at such sale fails to complete the purchase pursuant to the terms of the sale all liens created by his consent after such sale shall be a lien on any deposit made by him and not on the real property sold."

Section 3 of the same act is amended to read as follows:

Section 3. Mechanic's Lien on Real Property. "A contractor, sub-contractor, laborer, or material man, who performs labor or furnishes materials for the improvement of real property shall have a lien for the principal and interest of the value on the agreed price of such labor or materials owing to such lienor upon the real property improved or to be improved and upon such improvement from the time of filing a notice of such lien as prescribed in this article."

Senator Daley (No. 509), providing that Section 241 of the Real Property Law shall have added to it the following sentence: "The record of every conveyance, the execution and delivery of which is attested by at least one witness, recorded prior to the first day of January, 1865, although not acknowledged or proved, so as to entitle it to be recorded, is confirmed and shall here have the same effect as the record of a conveyance acknowledged or proved so as to entitle it to be recorded."

Senator Daley (No. —), providing that an acknowledgment and proof of a conveyance of real property in this State may be made before a prothonatory, county clerk or deputy clerk in any other State.

Senator Ford (No. 532), amending the lien law, Article 9 of Chapter 418 of the Laws of 1817, by adding at the end thereof a new section, 119, to read as follows:

Section 119. Certain Sections of this Article to be Contained in Contracts. Sections 116, 117 and 118 of this chapter shall be inserted in full in all contracts hereafter executed for the conditional sale of the articles mentioned in sections 115 hereof. The conditional vendor shall not be authorized to retake and resell the articles so sold, as prescribed in this article, unless such sections are set out in full in the contract for the conditioned sale of such articles.

Senator Stranahan (No. —), amending Section 471 of Chapter 410 of the Laws of 1882 (the Consolidation Act), by providing that "if the front or other exterior wall of any building now standing in said city shall extend not more than ten inches (present law

four inches) upon any street, avenue, or public street, such wall shall not be removable unless action or proceeding shall be instituted by or in behalf of the Mayor, aldermen and commonalty of the City of New York within the period of one year from the passage of this act for the removal of said wall."

Assemblyman Roche (No. 886), making the 4th of May, "Charter

Day," a public holiday in New York.

Assemblyman Adler (No. 872), defining the rights, powers and duties of the Public Administrator of New York.

Assemblyman Crabtree (No. 817), providing that every street car shall be provided with fenders.

Assemblyman Finn (No. 818), amending Section 110 of the Railroad Law, Chapter 39 of the General Laws, so it-shall read, and doubtless referring to the 3d avenue bridge:

Section 110. Right to Cross Bridge Substituted for a Bridge Crossed for Five Years.—Should any street surface railroad company have crossed any bridge as a part of its route for a period of more than six years and should any other bridge be substituted therefor at any time, such company shall have the right to cross such substituted bridge and to lay and use railway tracks thereon for the transit of its cars and to make all changes and extensions of its route subject to all the provisions of this act as the convenient operation of its cars and public conveyance may require.

Assemblyman Murray (No. 828), providing "that hereafter all the mortar of whatever description, manufacture or kind to be used in the construction of any building must not be such as is made, manufactured or composed of any acid, chemical or other ingredient deleterious to the health of the people.

News in Brief.

It has been reported that the Manhattan Elevated Railroad Company are willing to give up their request for a Boulevard line if they are granted the privilege of constructing a loop at the Battery for the intersection of the Sixth and Ninth Avenue Lines, so that continuous trains might be run on those roads via the 53d street connection.

It is reported that the company operating the Brooklyn surface roads, now contemplate building a subway under Park row, Centre street and City Hall Park from the Bridge to Broadway and Warren street, thus making the latter point the actual terminal for such roads. The subway, it is claimed, presents no engineering difficulties, and it is estimated would not cost over \$100.000.

A new elevated railway station was opened to the public at 116th street and 8th avenue last Wednesday morning. The new platform is 200 feet long, and is a duplicate of the old one, which hereafter will be used as a stopping place for the 6th avenue trains, while the 9th avenue trains wil stop at the new station. While each platform is separated from the other by the stairways, which are between the tracks, both can be reached by the elevator, which was built years ago to carry passengers to the roadway, the station being on one of the highest points of the road

The Metropolitan Street Ry. Co. admits its intention of running electric cars in Columbus avenue, between 59th and 65th streets, and to make this change of motive power, or to add a new motive power on Columbus avenue. It now has pending before the Railroad Commissioners in Albany an application for the recessary permission. In the meantime work has been going forward for some time, and is still being continued night and day, at 59th street and Columbus avenue, so that when the expected permission is obtained from Albany the trolley cars can at once be put in operation. One of the results of this proposed running of the 59th street trolley cars around into Columbus avenue and to 65th street, and from there up the Boulevard and Amsterdam avenue, has been to make a curve at 59th street, which, it is asserted, will make this corner one of the most dangerous in the city.

At the meeting of the Board of Public Improvements, held last Wednesday, several petitions from property holders in various parts of the city, chiefly from the West Side, asking that certain streets be resurfaced with asphalt, were referred to the Commissioner of Highways, pending an opinion from the Corporation Counsel as to the power of the board to take the initiative in such improvements. Louis A. Risse, Chief Topographical Engineer of the Borough of the Bronx and Engineer of the Concourse, made a report to the board with respect to the laying out of Lind avenue, where it crosses the Croton Aqueduct at High Bridge, in which he said: "The proposition to change the westerly line of Lind avenue in order to save the house (the gatekeeper's) would practically ruin the avenue as a residential street, and a projection of sixteen feet would entitle every property owner to damages because the view would be cut off. The gatekeeper's house can be moved southwesterly. The heavy retaining wall over the aqueduct would certainly be relieved by constructing an arch over the aqueduct. And I would recommend that the petition of the Commissioner of Water Supply be not granted, but that the Commissioner of Highways be requested to modify the plan of construction of Lind avenue where the westerly line crosses the aqueduct, and build an arch or lay an iron girder over the same in order to relieve the pressure on the aqueduct." Resolutions were proposed to carry out the recommendations of Engineer Risse. President Haffen of the Bronx said the board had no authority in the matter, as the contracts had been legally entered into and were nearly completed. The board, by interfering would only make the city liable in heavy damages.

Chief Engineer Birdsall gave the board distinct notice that nothing must be done to disturb or destroy the aqueduct. "If you try it," said he, "I'll stop it." The matter was referred to the engineer of the board with instructions to report to the next meeting.

REAL ESTATE IN ATLANTIC CITY.

Atlantic City, N. J.,

I have been down here for a few days, and I am astonished to find what a large sum of money has been put into real estate improvements during the last few years. Comparatively little New York capital has found its way here, most of the money coming from Philadelphia, whose citizens make this their great summer and winter resort. I thought it might interest the readers of the Record and Guide if I gathered some information for them on the selling and renting values of properties here, and about the general real estate features of the place. For most of this information I am indebted to Mr. Clement J. Adams, of the firm of J. G. Adams & Co., who are among the most prominent real estate brokers of this city.

The most valuable real estate is on the ocean front, along the line of the Board Walk. This is not to be wondered at, for the Board Walk practically makes the city. It is a very well-puttogether structure, 40 feet wide and three and a-half miles long, and an addition is now being made to it of another mile and a-half, so that it will in about a year hence give the citizens and visitors an uninterrupted promenade of five miles in length. This promenade is lined almost the entire distance with stores of every conceivable character, from a Saratoga drinking fountain to an astrologist's. There are a number of piers running out hundreds of feet into the Atlantic Ocean, which are mainly used by the summer crowds, which sometimes number over 150,000 visitors per diem.

REAL ESTATE VALUES.

The most valuable parcels are the hotels fronting the Board Walk. They are about twelve in number, beginning with the Rudolf at the one end, and the Dennis at the other. The average value of the ground on which they stand is about \$1,000 per linear foot, the lots being about 300 feet deep. These hotels have anywhere from 200 to 300 sleeping-rooms. The value of the Rudolf is estimated at about \$300,000. It has about 200 sleepingrooms, and would rent for about \$27,000 per annum furnished The Dennis, which has about 235 sleeping-rooms, is valued a \$350,000 to \$400,000, and its annual renting value furnished is \$35,000. Haddon Hall was purchased six years ago for \$85,000. and six months later \$125,000 was offered for it and refused. Since then it has been considerably enlarged and improved, an l it is now the largest hotel in Atlantic City, containing over 300 bedrooms. Two first-class judges told me in conversation that it was worth in the neighborhood of \$500,000. The so-called "swellest" hotel here is the Brighton, but by far the finest and most modern hotel is the St. Charles. It is practically the "Waldorf" of Atlantic City. The place is new, bright and cheery, and has all the modern improvements, including elevator, heat, hot and cold fresh and salt water baths, and electric bells, while the sun parlor, which is also used as a ball room, fronts the ocean directly, and is the most delightful place for a lounge, the upper floor of the Brighton Casino, possibly, excepted. Casino, by the way, is a treasure to visitors, principally because of its warm salt water, enclosed swimming pool, heated to a temperature of 80 degrees, with the air at 70 degrees.

The side avenues leading to the Board Walk average \$175 per front foot, lots being 100 to 150 feet deep. This is mostly suited to residence property, the most expensive of which is found on Pennsylvania avenue, where it brings \$275 per front foot. Other good residence property can be secured at \$100 per front foot, lots being, on an average, 125 feet deep. The Chelsea cottages now being erected by a land company are in a very pleasant section, and the lots are all set back and they bring about \$5,000 for 50x100, corners 60x125, bringing about \$8,000.

Some of the residences bring \$20,000 to \$30,000, and there is one residence for sale at \$50,000. However, good cottages with modern improvements can be had from \$7,500 to \$15,000 each.

Business property is the most valuable on Atlantic avenue, and can be purchased at anything from \$150 to \$200 per front foot, lots being 100 feet deep and over.

The city recently paid \$23,000 for a plot 50x175 on the nor'h side of Atlantic avenue, 80 feet east of Tennessee avenue, and the corner adjoining is valued at about \$800 per front foot.

The rents of business property are highest on Atlantic avenue, near the Pennsylvania Depot. Stores bring from \$500 to \$1,0°0 per annum. The owners of properties seem to procure good interest on their money, for I discovered a store and dwelling rented at \$600 which, I was informed, the owner would sell for \$5,000. The percentage of profit on real estate investments seems to be considerably higher here than in larger cities, and yet Atlantic City property generally rents well.

Residences valued at \$10,000 furnished can be rented for \$1,000 for the summer season of three to four months, while fair cottages can be rented all the way from \$300 upwards for the summer season. A New York family could precure a house for the winter season—and this is a great winter resort—for a mederate figure, as a number of the houses are idle during the winter, while they are overcrowded during the summer. In addition to the twelve large hotels on the Board Walk, there are something like fifty to sixty smaller hotels, and about 400 boarding-houses,

and literally thousands of cottages. The summer population inhabiting the hotels and cottages is said to be 50,000 or more, and at certain periods in the hot season it is difficult to procure This is not the case, however, in winter, when the population is something like 25,000.

SOME IMPROVEMENTS.

Among the largest improvements under way is the new iron pier, which is being erected largely by citizens here, aided by This pier will shortly be finished and will cost nearby capital. about \$300,000. There are something like fifty new cottages under way at present, costing from \$3,000 to \$10,000 each.

THE LOANING RATE AND OTHER ITEMS.

Mortgages on all real estate pay 6%, with possibly a few exceptions. Most of this money comes from Philadelphia, with a sprinkling from New York and other cities. The security seems to be fair, as loans are made on a basis of one-half, the estimated value.

The tax rate is \$1.26 on a valuation of 50%. The water rent is \$10 per house up to 57,000 gallons. Beyond that figure it is 12 cents per hundred gallons. The city charges \$7.50 sewerage tax for an ordinary cottage, but the rate for a 12-room cottage is \$9. Gas is 2 per thousand, with a rebate of 25% off if paid in ten days after presentation of gas bill.

Most of the insurance companies are represented here and do There are three banks-the First National, a large business. with a capital of \$50,000, and a surplus of \$150,000; the Second National, with a capital of \$100,000; and the Union National,

with a capital of \$100,000. There is also a Safe Deposit and Trust Company. There are about twenty churches, three Methodist, about five Methodist Episcopal, two Protestant Episcopal, three Presbyterian, two Catholic, and one each of the Baptist, Lutheran and Quaker denominations, and also one synagogue. There are schools attended by something like 5,000 children, and there is a new school building under construction to cost about \$30,000. The city debt is \$1,038,436, the bonds selling on a 5% The assessed valuation on all the real estate in the city is \$12,773,603.

The Pennsylvania R. R. is building double tracks from Camden to Atlantic City, and when these are completed the distance will be made between New York and this place in about three hours, which is about half an hour quicker than the present best scheuduled time.

Brokers here charge 2% on sales of property, 5% on renting, and 2% on procuring mortgage loans. They are about to organize a Real Estate Association.

I have one strong complaint to make, and that is about the roads. These can be described as nothing else but disgraceful. They are dirt roads, and after one or two rainy days recently, were in an impassable condition. The only oasis in this great desert of bad roads is St. Charles Place, with its beautiful brick pavement. I learned that those in authority have been discussing the question of macadamizing the streets. It is high time that they should do so. It would largely increase the assessed valuations and make Atlantic City what it is to-day—bad roads excepted—the Queen Watering City of the United States.

BRICKS.

No pale brick is in the market, although the inquiry continues strong and the price nominally at \$4.00. The demand for New Jersey brick is not very good. Value is at \$5.50.

CEMENT.

In the market for Rosendale cement there is no change in the conditions which have prevailed for several weeks. Demand is only fair and but a small supply is being put forward. Prices continue firm at \$1.00. Domestic Portland has been in unusually brisk demand for some time. large orders are being placed at present, but there are a number of bona fide inquiries, and the outlook for a busy season is good. Value remains steady, but a month or sconer will see a change in price.

LIME.

Scarcely a barrel of Rockland lime is here at present, and there is but little on the way. The strike of the kiln workers for higher wages is still on, with no prospect of an immediate settlement. As no kilns are going and it is impossible to say when the fires will be started again, no prices are being made for supplies to arrive. The last quotations were, 75c. @80c. for common, and 85@90c. for finishing. Jointa lime shows no change from the conditions which have held for some time. There is a fair insuring from the conditions which have held for some time, There is a fair inquiry for the season and value remains firm.

LUMBER.

The New York market continues to be rather quiet, and it will be some weeks before any noticeable activity occurs. In the West the signs of reviving trade are more apparent. The "Mississippi Valley Lumberman" viving trade are more apparent. The "Mississippi Valley Lumberman" speaking locally, says: "The trade of the year up to the present has just about doubled the figures for the early weeks of 1897, and as there has been a fair demand for lumber throughout the winter, prices have held firm. Already there are indications that the market is stiffening, and it is safe to say that before the month is finished the prices for lumber from this market will be fully half a dollar higher than the point at which trade closed last The condition thus portrayed will doubtless be reflected more or less perfectly in the local market. LATH.

About 1,200,000 Eastern spruce lath have arrived this week. Sales were made at \$2.00, and more is being asked for lath to arrive. The demand is not particularly good, but the tone of the market is firm.

NAILS.

A meeting of the wire nail manufacturers will be held in this city the first of the week, and it is possible that some action will be taken concerning the 5c. advance, which has been established for March and which will otherthe 5c. advance, which has been established for March and which will otherwise go into effect on Tuesday. The demand at present is not very good although reports from the West announce a good trade in that section. There are rumors of difficulties having arisen in financing the recently formed combination. Quotations are for carload lots f. o. b. mill, Pittsburg base, \$1.45; for carload lots on dock, New York, \$1.60; and for small lots from store, \$1.65. Cut nails have eased a trifle in price, as there is only a fair call. Values are, for carload lots on dock, New York base, \$1.25, and for small lots from store \$1.2001.35 lots from store, \$1.30@1.35.

PAINTS.

A storm and a holiday combined to make the paint market for the week very slow and without feature. There was very little call and the amount of business transacted was quite small. White lead shows no change from

the prices last quoted, namely, $5\frac{1}{2}$ @6c. Red lead is steady and unchanged at former prices. The prices as last given by the National Lead Co. are as follows: In lots of less than 500 lbs., 6 cts. net; in lots of 500 lbs., and over, $5\frac{1}{2}$ cts. There was a steady advance to 35c, for regulars, and 35½c, for machines, and the market closed with value held firmly at these figures. At the close of last week the demand was good, but it subsequently fell off somewhat, and this week only a moderate amount of business was transacted. Tar has weakened a trifle, and continues dull. Quotations are \$1.60 for regulars, and \$3.00 for oil-barrels. There has been no change in pitch. The market remains quiet with prices steady at \$1.80@1.85. GLASS.

The window-glass market has undergone absolutely no change. is an abundant supply, but the inquiry is very moderate. The bad weather, combined with strikes, has had considerable effect on the New England demand. Discounts are 80 and 10 and 5% for the French and 85 and 10% for the American. The plate-glass market has been quiet this week. Little has been going on and no change has occurred in prices. The demand, con-Little sidering the season, is very fair, and there is no occasion to decrease the output, something which often occurs at this time of the year.

JOINT GOMMITTEE ON BUILDING CODE.

A sub-committee of the Joint Committee on Building Code, whose names were given in our last issue, waited upon the Board of Buildings, on Wednesday last, to obtain their views upon the initiation of a movement to secure from the Municipal Council the appointment of a Commission of Experts to prepare a Building Code for The City of New York. Commissioners Brady and Campbell, who only were present, Commissioner Ryan being prevented from attending the meeting of the Board that day, received the sub-

committee courteously and listened attentively to the statement of the objects of the organization which the sub-committee represented. The Commissioners expressed themselves gratified to find that such an organization had been formed, and advised that it should be held in readiness to take an active part in the matter of the proposed building code. However, they said, at the present time the Board was too busy to take it up, their time being fully occupied in organizing the Department, especially as regards the Boroughs of Richmond and Queens, in which there were really no building regulations, and which were being adapted so far as was possible to the regulations prevailing in the other boroughs. As soon as they felt that they could take up the matter of the Building Code without interference with the conduct of the ordirary departmental business, they would communicate with the Joint Committee on Building Code.

OF INTEREST TO THE BUILDING TRADES.

Real Estate Market.

After the exceptionally good return of last week, a falling-off in reports was to be expected, and the change in one week is without significant bearing on previously-formed conclusions regarding the condition of the market.

The auction market this week had a satisfactory appearance when judged from the attendance and bidding at voluntary sales; the sales in foreclosure, however, were as a rule prefunctory, and resulted in the property sold going to plaintiffs in most instances. 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OBITUARY.

AMOS R. ENO.

Death has removed a prominent figure among large owners of New York City realty in the person of Amos R. Eno, who died on Monday last, at his home No. 32 5th avenue, in his 88th year, he having been born November 1, 1810. Mr. Eno was a successful merchant, and, over 40 years ago, having retired from other pursuits with a large fortune, turned his attention to real estate. His operations in this field were very extensive and successful. He is best known by his extensive ownership of property at the junction of 23d street and Broadway, which he developed so far in advance of the times as to be condemned by the business minds of the day, but the results of which have more than approved the correctness of his judgment. He built the Fifth Avenue Hotel in 1854-5, on what had previously been vacant property, and has owned it ever since. Another important holding of his was the triangular plot at the junction of Broadway, 5th avenue and 23d street. Mr. Eno was also one of the organizers and principal stockholders of the Second National Bank, also a most successful concern to him in spite of the misfortune that befell him in connection with it in 1884.

THE COMPARATIVE LITERATURE SOCIETY.

The Comparative Literature Society has commenced its third season under the direction of Prof. Chas. Sprague-Smith, who has conducted this excellent institution with such marked ability and success. The Comparative Literature Society is a corporation, founded under the laws of the State of New York, for the purpose of "deepening the understanding of what has already been accomplished in literature and stimulating to higher literary production. The Society conducts Conferences, Lectures, Readings, Discussions and Classes, and publishes books containing the results of its work. The Society rests its entire work upon the recognition of the unity of all literature, and that only through the comparative study of its supreme monuments can the truths, as to life and as to art which the literature interprets, become known. Upon this foundation it aspires to build a Literary Institute, adapted to American needs and conditions.

Of this year's lectures or conferences in Carnegie Hall, which are part of the programme, four have already been held. On February 5th, Dr. Thomas Wilson, Curator of Prehistoric Anthropology, United States National Museum, lectured on "Man and his Wanderings." On February 12, Prof. N. S. Shaler, of Harvard University lectured on "Nature and Man," and on February 19th, Prof. C. H. Toy, of Harvard University, on "Dawn of Literature in Babylonia and Egypt." The first evening conference was held on February 8, and dealt with the contemporary drama in France.

The membership of the Society is now large and increasing rapidly, and its work it will be seen is of a very high character.

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Questions and Answers.

LIGHT IN THE HALL OF A FLAT.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

Kindly answer in your columns whether a landlord of a flat house can be compelled to keep one or more lights burning in the main hall after ten o'clock p. m., and what department has jurisdiction over same?

Answer.-He cannot. Neither can he be compelled to carpet the stairs. The private department of finance has jurisdiction. If the tenants are not satisfied with the way things are run they are likely to move out .- Law Editor.

FILING OF CHATTEL MORTGAGE.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

Will you kindly state in your questions and answers: (1) the proper place to file chattel mortgages under the new city charter; (2) should a chattel mortgage covering goods in South Mount Vernon be filed in the Register's office, City of New York, or in White Plains?

Answer.-The charter contains no provision concerning chattel mortgages. (2) Colton's map of the City of New York shows that South Mount Vernon is not within the limits of the city. The law concerning the filing of chattel mortgages requires that they shall be filed in the town where the mortgagor resides, except in the cities of New York and Brooklyn, and cities and towns in which there is a county clerk's office. Consequently, file your chattel mortgage in the office of the clerk of the town of Mount Vernon. There can be no objection to filing a copy in the office of the Register of New York, and also in White Plains. The law we have referred to is Chapter 418 of the Laws of 1897. Colton's map is our only authority for the statement that South Mount Vernon is without the limits of New York City.-Law Editor.

ARCHITECT'S PLANS-COMPETITION.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

(1) Would you kindly inform me whether it is legal for parties who are having competition plans drawn, and to be handed in at a certain date, to take some other architect into the competition after the date stated for plans to be handed in, and have him draw plans for the same work at the late date, without the consent of the other architects whose plans conform with all the instructions of the said parties, in all respects, and which were acknowledged to be perfect and as required, by the said parties? (2) Also kindly inform me whether it is proper for the committee to take in as consulting architect, an architect who had originally drawn plans for the present competition, but had withdrawn them as he knew there was no possible chance for him to get the work as architect and builder, as he had once before done some work as architect and builder for this same society, and the work collapsed? I was then selected as expert and made a statement in regard to the work which had fallen apart and was improperly made under his supervision, for the committee, the result of which was that we had a hot discussion. The present committee who selected him as consulting architect, for the competition, were perfectly well aware of the poor work he formerly made, but it was chiefly through a few of his friends, who are on this committee that he was selected. (3) I also wish to ask you whether the committee has the right to deface competition plans by cutting and scratching out names and different parts of the drawings, or whether they can be held responsible for such defacement? (4) I would also ask you to let me know whether competitors for competition plans are not generally permitted to look over all the different plans after the competition is closed?

Answer.(1) There is nothing contrary to law in their so doing though it is evidently not fair play. (2) They have a right so to do. (3) They have no right to deface the plans and can be held responsible for such defacement. The plans of the unsuccessful competitors are certainly their individual property. (4) We are unable to say whether such is the usual practice. There could certainly be no harm in the permission of such inspection.—Law Editor.

BROKER'S COMMISSION.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

Kindly answer following questions in your next issue. A, being a broker, introduced B, being a builder, to C, being the owner of lots with loan, which lots A offered to B with loan, and finally builder and owner meet at the latter's office, but cannot come to an understanding, and leave the office without closing transaction. Several months later A notices that B has filed plans for the erection of tenements on the very same lots A offered to B, buying the lots direct from C, the owner. Is A entitled to his one per cent. commission, for sale of the lots, and also for commission for the amount of lcan furnished to builder by C?

TELEGRAPH WIRES AFFIXED TO CHIMNEYS.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

(1) Will you very kindly inform me through the columns of your valuable paper, if the telegraph companies have any right to fasten their telegraph wires to the chimneys on the roofs of houses in New York City where the owner of the house has given no such privilege whatsoever? (2) Likewise, if the law, nor owner has given no such right, would the law justify me if I send a workman to the roof and cut down such wires that are fastened to the chimneys of my house without notifying anybody?

Answer. (1) Telegraph companies have no such right. (2) Yes; but we would advise you to notify the company that you intend to remove their wires, and if they pay no attention to your notice then cut it down in such a way that no damage is done to other persons or property.—Law Editor.

LANDLORD AND TENANT.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

A leases premises from B, and being unable to pay rent, B disposses him seven months before expiration of lease. Can B recover judgment against A for the unexpired term of lease after dispossessing?

Answer.—No. The execution of the warrant to dispossess terminates the lease, and the liability of the tenant to pay rent then ceases.—Law Editor.

PREFERRING A CREDITOR.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

A certain party in business owes a large sum of money. He gives his place of business for wages earned by one of his employees to said employee, who has the bill of sale recorded. Now, can the first party's creditor's claim anything against present owner, and what is the best course to pursue?

Answer.—If the transaction was bona fide the other creditors can do nothing.—Law Editor.

WIFE'S RIGHT OF DOWER.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

(1) Why is it that when a man sells a piece of real estate and the title of same is on his own name that the wife must sign the deed he gives to the buyer? Is it a practice of the lawyers or is there a law to that effect; if so, kindly give the chapter number and the year? (2) A man wishes to borrow some money on a piece of real estate which he owns. Can he get the money loaned to him by giving his personal bond without his wife signing her name to the mortgage, or is it only a practice among the lawyers for the better security of the lender that the wife signs the mortgage given by her husband? If there is a law that the wife must sign the mortgage given by her husband kindly give the chapter number and the year?

Answer.—Section 170 of the real property law reads as follows: "A widow is endowed of the third part of all the lands whereof her husband was seized of an estate of inheritance, at any time during the marriage." This is but a re-enactment of a previous statute. It has been the law from a time whereof the memory of man runneth not to the contrary. Dower is the right of the widow to one-third of her husband's lands during her life. So long as the

husband is living the wife's right of dower is said to be inchoate, and the object of her joining in the husband's deed or mortgage is to release her inchoate right of dower to the purchaser or mortgagee.—Law Editor.

EXECUTION-MARSHAL'S DUTY.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

A, an owner, employed B, an agent, to rent his apartments. B let the apartments, deposit being paid to janitor. A took it and refused to pay B his commission. B sued A and got judgment against him for his commission. A did not settle with B, so B took out execution, put it in the hands of a marshal. Several weeks passed. The marshal told B from time to time he had not seen A. Said he went to his house one time and he did not think A owned the house, but he would wait for A to come to court to take out dispossesses as was his custom, and then call upon him to pay. Is that right for the marshal to do, or should I insist that he find out if A can pay up? Marshal said I cannot put judgment on record (\$14.96). Is he right? Should I put it on record against A?

Answer.—It is the marshal's duty to levy on any personal property belonging to A that he can find. If the marshal is derelict in his duty you can sue him for the amount of the judgment. You can obtain a transcript of the judgment and file it in the office of the county clerk.—Law Editor.

ASSESSMENT,

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE: -

Will you kindly inform a reader of your valuable paper on the following? In May, 1896, I purchased a lot at public auction fronting on Wadsworth avenue (as then proposed) in this city. Recently, they have confirmed and entered an assessment for opening Wadsworth avenue and assessed my lot \$475 for same. On inquiry they tell me they had to acquire the property for the avenue in front of my lot, and that they made an award for said acquired property to the owner of it. The owner of the property so acquired by the city is not my grantor but another. Am I, as an abutting owner on Wadsworth avenue to the property so acquired by the city, entitled to any of that award, and, if so, how must I proceed to get it? If not, have I any rights against my grantor, my deed merely calling for 25x75 feet on Wadsworth avenue (as proposed), all of which is still intact and none of which has been taken for avenue?

Answer.—You are not entitled to any portion of the award; neither have you any cause of action against your grantor. By your deed you acquired no portion of the land which has been taken by the city; you got exactly what your grantor conveyed to you—Law Editor.

TENANCY BY THE ENTIRETY.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

In your number of February 12, 1898, under the heading of "Joint tenants," the answer to second question is undoubtedly wrong. They do not hold as tenants in common, but as tenants by the entirety, which tenancy has not been abolished by the real property law of 1896. Section 56 of this law is simply a re-enactment of 1 Rev. Stat., 727, Section 44, and it was held in Bertles v. Nunan, 92 N. Y., 152, that this section did not abolish tenancy by the entirety.

Answer.—Our correspondent states the law as laid down by the Court of Appeals in Bertles v. Nunan correctly, and that is the law to-day. If a deed is made to husband and wife they hold as tenants by the entirety, and the survivor takes the whole property. Bertles v. Nunan was decided in 1883, but in the case of Meeker v. Wright, 76 N. Y., 292, decided by the Court of Appeals in 1879, the written opinion, by Danforth, J., concurred in by Judge Finch, laid down the doctrine that when real estate was conveyed to husband and wife they took as tenants in common. In writing the answer which appeared on the 12th of February we relied on the case of Meeker v. Wright, and overlooked the fact that the Court of Appeals had virtually overruled itself within four years.—Law Editor.
