HERE is little if anything to say of the speculative and commercial conditions beyond what has already been said. The movement that took its incentive from election results, is making satisfactory progress in all directions, so that if nothing of an obstructive nature arises meantime, the spring should find the country in a state of universal activity. In the stock market the reaction is welcomed by brokers who feared that the pace was becoming too fast. Judging by the past, there ought to be a considerable reaction, but the present situation is so different to any the market has been in before that precedent counts for nothing at all, and on the general movement one man's guess is as good as another's. There is, however, profit still to be made in securities whose prices have not yet risen to the plane of their prospects. Besides that, so long as money is cheap speculative operations can be engineered in nearly all sound paying issues, which will return good interest on the margin employed and may, in addition, yield a handsome bonus through advances in prices. In other words, there is still profit to be obtained on money sensibly and scientifically employed in the stock market. From now on until spring money should move towards this centre. The money market is helped further by the better news from Europe. Both in London and Berlin there has been this week an easing of rates which has been reflected by increased speculative activity, and there are some reports of a renewal of industrial activity under the stimulus of revised schedules of manufacturers' prices and the drop in coal. British and German makers have both reduced prices of iron and steel, the latter more considerably than the former, and American export prices were cut this week to meet the action of the European makers. Mail advices say that the success of the American Bridge Co. in placing a thousand tons of structural iron with the North German Lloyd in competition with Westphalian concerns has dispirited the German iron industry considerably. But until the new year has been reached the European money market is likely to be uncertain and a deterrent of business revival.

O far as an outsider can see, the principles which have guided the management of the terminal facilities of the roads running into the 42d street station are something as follows: "Never make an improvement until it becomes acutely necessary;" "in planning improvements, always put up with temporary makeshifts as long as possible;" "do not take too much trouble to make your passengers comfortable, because they have got to use your trains anyway." In pursuance of this policy, the passengers on the Central and New Haven roads, particularly the commuters, have been subjected so continually to discomforts, and so frequently to delays that the development of the whole territory tributary to the roads has been retarded, and the latter have never succeeded in taking adequate advantage of the magnificent situation of their terminus in the heart of New York City. At present the running in and out of more than four hundred trains every day puts such a strain upon the available facilities that a small accident causes very considerable disturbances, and some decided dislocation of the machinery will result in an amount of inconvenience and exasperation of the patrons of the roads which is not any more tolerable because it has frequently happened before. But apparently the situation has finally become so critical, and the necessity of arranging for future expansion so immediate that plans for a really important improvement of the service are being seriously proposed. It has been announced that a plan has been prepared providing for a large tunnel under the present station, and a loop, which will permit the trains to run in, around, and out without getting into one another's way. This

would seem to be the only comprehensive solution of the problem, except one that carried with it some very considerable enlargement of the space occupied by the terminus. But there is one obstacle which must be overcome, according to the President of the Central road, before such a terminus can be built. The management has not succeeded in securing an electric motor which meets all its requirements. It wants an electric engine which is capable of hauling express trains from Albany to New York, for a motor used to shift in the yards and to pull a train in and out of the tunnel would be useless. The time required for coupling and uncoupling would make it more trouble than it was worth. All the patrons of the road will piously wish that the needed motor will soon be secured, that the upper tunnel will be cleansed of the fumes which now make a passage through it so disagreeable, and that the plan for a loop will not remain too long an object of study in the President's desk. The necessities of the present situation are small compared to what they will be ten years from now, when the Bronx is well built up; and unless some such comprehensive plan of improvement is adopted, the transit situation at the Grand Central Station is likely to become intolerable.

#### Home Rule for the Boroughs.

ERY little is known of the intentions of the Charter Revision Commission, although we are only a week away from the day when they have to report to the Governor. Evidently they regard themselves as advisers of the Governor and responsible to him only, and believe that he only can decide whether publicity is to be given to the findings of the Commission. None would have a right to quarrel with this state of affairs if the reticence had been complete; as it is, reports have come out from time to time of the Commission's intentions, which by their uniformity seem to be true, but which for want of official confirmation cannot be confidently accepted.

Among other things, it is said the Commission have decided upon recommending that the several boroughs of the city be given considerable powers to regulate their own internal affairs, but unfortunately nothing has transpired to show how they propose to do this. The importance of this particular point lies more in the method proposed for carrying out the principle involved than in the principle itself. The demand for a measure of boroughal self-government was mainly to secure two things, namely: (1) To remove the obstacle standing in the way of local improvements, and (2) to make each borough responsible for its own expenditures. If these two things are not obtained it will be much better to remain as we are, or to increase the degree of centralization of the city's affairs inaugurated by the Consolidation Act under which we have all moaned and groaned for three years. If it is simply proposed that the boroughs shall each attend to its own development, or that each shall carry out of itself those improvements only which are now paid for by local assessments, without checks on extravagance, the cure will be worse than the disease. It cannot be too strongly insisted upon that resulting pecuniary responsibility must accompany any measure of home rule conferred upon the buroughs.

Upon the desirability of securing this power the boroughs are unanimous. All have felt the evils of the existing system; Richmond so much so that an agitation is afoot there to secure separation; the Bronx found its development suddenly cut short, and Manhattan groans under a double grievance of having to support its impecunious partners while unable to provide for its own wants. The experience of the Bronx illustrates not only the obstructive influence of the Charter, but its accompanying extravagance also. When that borough was run by a Commission of its own its salary expense was \$25,000 a year, and from 125 to 150 contracts for street openings, sewers, paving, grading, etc., were given out annually, each directly and immediately beneficial to tax values. The Charter extinguished the Commission that had worked admirably, raised the expense for salaries to \$125,000 a year and, until a very short time back, operated to prevent the making of a single contract for an improvement in the borough. The local view now is that the borough was better off under the Park Department who had control until 1892, than it is now under the Charter of 1897.

A similar story could be told of any one of the other four boroughs, and it is obvious that development can only be revived and other administrative details efficiently carried out if the work is done locally. At the same time any measure intended to secure this freedom of action will be nullified, from the same causes that clogged the machinery of government provided by the Charter, if pecuniary responsibility does not accompany power of action, and each borough be compelled to carry the burden of its own extravagance or permitted to enjoy the benefits of its own economy, as the case may be.

FTER all Thomas J. Brady will remain at the head of the Department of Buildings for some time to come yet. His resignation was not presented, although prepared and although Mr. Brady's preference for private over public business was as sincere as it was pronounced. The influences that withheld it are said to be political and complimentary to Mr. Brady's standing with his party, and contradict reports to the contrary made when his intended resignation was first announced.

### Population and Expansion.

E XPANSION is founded on a condition; anti-expansion is founded on a theory. Such as the conclusion which is forced upon one, when the attention is removed from current controversies, and fixed upon the large movements of industry and population. How can a nation of 76,000,000 people, which in less than half a century will be a nation of 150,000,000 people, how can such a nation help overflowing its boundaries and expanding over seas? It is bound to do so under the influence of precisely the same conditions that compelled an ever-increasing tide of people to cross first the Alleghanies, then the Mississippi and then the Rocky Mountains. Expansion across the water brings with it a different kind of opportunity and responsibility from expansion on this continent, but it is coming about from precisely the same need of new sources of production, and new fields of activity. It is granted, of course, that the present territories of the United States are quite capable of supporting several times its present population, and that it is not any pressure of population upon means of subsistence which makes expansion so inevitable—any more than it was such a pressure which moved England to expand when her population amounted only to 5,000,000. But when the industrial opportunities offered by countries abroad are in any way greater than those offered at home or different from them, men of a vigorous race cannot help seizing those opportunities, and after they have been seized an energetic government cannot help assuming the responsibilities which such action involves.

Undoubtedly, new industrial opportunities are still more plentiful in the United States than they are in any European country. The absolute need of such expansion is at present much more imperative abroad than it is here, but the results of the present census are a warning that conditions are becoming equalized and that little by little the outward pressure will be almost as strong with us as it is with them. How much momentum that outward pressure has may be gathered from some figures recently collected and published by Sir Robert Giffen. A century ago the combined population of the Christian Powers in America and Europe amounted to about 170,000,000, and this was a very small number compared to the hordes of barbarous or semi-civilized peoples in Asia and Africa. During the past century the number of barbarous and semi-civilized peoples has remained almost stationary, while that of the Americans and Europeans has increased to about 500,000,000. In another century, unless some great internal change should take place in the European races themselves, this population will have increased to at least 1,500,000,000. In the light of such figures how can any one Power expect to keep very much to itself? The international social and commercial relations of all peoples will inevitably increase in importance. The different civilized countries and the individuals composing them will be brought closer and closer together by the mere fact of increased numbers, and the causes which have kept them apart in the past will be less and less important by means of improved land and water communication. Yet this international organization and politics will tend to increase rather than decrease national feeling, for a nation is essentially a political, social and industrial organism, which is developed in the stress of competition with other nations, and competition in the long run results in partial cooperation. The intensification of national feeling which has been going on during the past twenty-five years is consequently in some measure the result of more intimate international renations—just as a strong individuality finds its fullest expression in a highly developed society. The United States cannot help becoming part of this European system, for the industrial and political interests which go to compose it are not bounded by the Atlantic Ocean.

Nothing daunted by the figures of Sir Robert Giffen, an antiexpansionist journal is able to elicit from them an argument against colonial expansion. The argument runs that it is very foolish for the United States or the countries of Europe to spend money in building up Oriental markets when the markets which they offer each other are so much more valuable. Why bother with a few hundred million indigent Chinese when within fifty years we shall have a chance of trading with 1,000,000,000,000

wealthy Caucasians full of needs and resources. If it were simply a question of markets, there would be some truth in such a contention, although the fact that we do a big business with 40,000,000 Englishmen is no good reason why we should not try to do as big a business as we can with 4,000,000 Dutchmen. But it is not simply a question of markets. It is a question of utilizing the natural resources of the earth, so that the people inhabiting it can satisfy their needs both as completely and as economically as possible. The growing numbers of the European peoples and their increasing wants require for their economic satisfaction that all available land should be cultivated with the utmost care and knowledge, and that the earth should be searched for useful minerals with a like assiduity and skill. Just at present the pressure of population upon the means of subsistence is not a critical question; but when there are 1,500,000,000 white people inhabiting the earth, the question will become critical, and any neglect of accessible natural resources would mean just so much more misery and destitution. The land in Oriental and tropical countries must be worked just as thoroughly as the land in Europe and America; and if the native inhabitants of these countries cannot imitate Japan and do the job for themselves, they must be taught how, and must be put under effective European and American control until they have learned how. Such a program brings with it the chance of injustice, the necessity of occasional bloodshed, and unfortunately a good deal of sharp practice; but in the long run the Chinese and the Filipinos will probably adapt themselves to it. No doubt it is possible that they will stubbornly resist. In case they do the result is not pleasant to contemplate, but it is better that the resistance should be crushed than that such large and productive portions of the earth's surface should remain entirely outside of the economic system that would make it of the utmost use to mankind. The interests and needs of 500,000,000 Caucasians are of more importance than the interests and needs of 400,000,000 Chinese-if there are that many Chinese-and for the simple reason that the interests of the former are more dignified and humane and their needs more insistent.

WHEN one transit company improves its service, other transit companies are forced to do the same thing. It was becoming more and more evident that with the surface lines competing sharply for the short distance traffic, and the underground road prospectively competing for the long-distance traffic, the Manhattan company must either do something to meet this competition, or else see all the increase in business for many years absorbed by its rivals. Several years ago the company raised the money for the purpose of making necessary improvements, and since then it has been conducting experiments with a view to equipping the lines with electricity. According to the tests made during the past week the experiments have been successful, and the company is prepared to introduce electric motors which will increase the speed of local trains several miles an hour. It is promised that the management will then be able to run a local train from 155th street to the Battery in forty minutes instead of forty-nine minutes. What a relief such an improvement will be to the residents of the upper west and east side, and how helpful it will be to the residents of certain parts of the Bronx needs no explanation. It is safe to say that if the Manhattan company can succeed in making such an improvement in its service within the next two years that it will go far to regaining the ground which it has lost during the last seven years. A decided improvement in the demand for flats north of 100th street may be expected whenever the management of the elevated roads can redeem the promises they are making.

MONG the issues affecting the recent local elections in London, the housing of the poorer classes took a prominent place. It was stated that 90,000 people were living in Southwark—a district containing three only of the 56 parliamentary representative divisions into which the British metropolis is divided—"with smaller accommodation than the law gives in the condemned criminal's cell." This in the home of tenement reform and after the expenditure of millions sterling in model or improved tenements! It is by facts like these that we are able to get an insight into the dimensions of a question which some people on this side of the Atlantic think they can solve by minor variations in the building laws.

SUCH is the pressure of absolutely essential business that the shipping subsidy bills will not in all probability be seriously considered during the present short session of Congress. But if such a bill is not passed during the next session of Congress all the ordinary signs of legislative action fail. The

idea that subsidies are necessary in the interests of the foreign trade of the United States is becoming stronger and stronger, and as the foreign trade is increasing in such a remarkable way, the idea will be likely to explode into action. Whether or not the country at large will obtain any advantage commensurate with the cost from the expenditure of \$9,000,000 a year in subsidies may, perhaps, be open to question; but there can be no doubt that the port of New York will be much benefited thereby, and that foreign trade generally will be still further stimulated. The Commissioner of Navigation uses in favor of subsidies what is practically the old "infant industry" argument. Encourage the building of ocean steamers artificially, he declares, and you will so reduce the cost of their construction in the United States that thereafter the industry will be able to stand on its own legs. For instance, he asserts that the cost during the first year

of the operation of the Senate bill would be about \$4,500,000. The maximum of \$9,000,000 would be reached in four or five years and then, he thinks, a reduction of subsidy rates would be desirable because the cost of production would have been considerably lowered. Probably such a reduction would be desirable, but would it ever be made? The history of protective tariff legislation does not encourage such a conclusion. There can be no doubt that industries have been started under artificial stimulus, which otherwise would not have been started, and there can be no doubt that after having been so started, they are enabled to reduce the cost of production; but such an industry never thereafter foregoes the smallest fraction of its artificial stimulus without a bitter fight; and an industry which is strong enough to get subsidies in the United States will be srong enough to keep them.

# A COMPARISON OF ANCIENT AND MODERN MONOLITHS.

Showing that a Statement is not Necessarily True Because it has been oft Repeated.

"Modern builders cannot duplicate the works of the Ancient Egyptians."

How many times have you heard that statement, and how many times do you imagine it has been made since the days of Cheops, otherwise known as Suphis, and sometimes called Chembes?

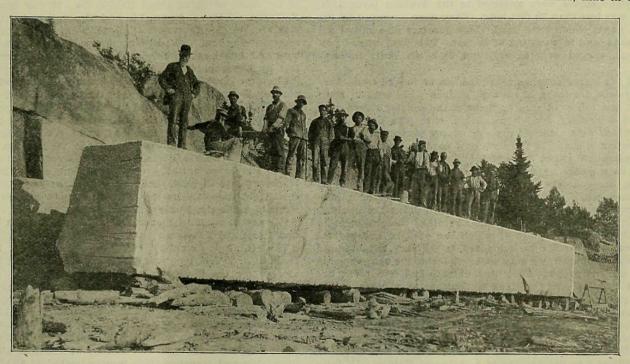
The works of man in Ancient Egypt naturally excite wonder, for in stupendous mass they have not been equa.ed, or even approached, but when some uninformed doubter shakes his head and says that the nineteenth century builders can not do the same work with stones that the Egyptian slaves or captives performed thousands of years ago, rise up in your "fin de siecle" pride and tell him he is talking without due consideration, and knows not whereof he speaks.

"What man has done man can do," as the builder of a matchfactory said when he sold out to the Diamond Match Co., at more than double what his plant cost him. But we are digressing.

Did you ever stop to compare the work of modern stoneworkers with the ancient? Do you know that monoliths have granite columns will be used in the construction of the cathedral.

After dressing off the corners roughly by hand the stone is placed in a monster lathe designed by E. R. Cheney and H. A. Spiller, of Boston, and erected by the Philadelphia Roll and Machine Co. An idea of the size of this lathe may be obtained by glancing at the second illustration. What would old Rameses have done if he had had a machine like that and a dozen or so of our modern derricks and cranes?

But just think what the Egyptians did with only the most primitive appliances, and nothing but man-power. Sir G. W.I-kinson, the famous Egyptologist, informs us: "The Temple of Karnak covers about 420,000 feet, or five times as much as St. Paul's, in London, and more than twice as much as St. Peter's, at Rome. The propylon is 370 feet long, or twice as much as that of St. Paul's. The hypostyle hall, a parallelogram about 342 feet long, and 170 feet wide, is the most wonderful apartment in the world. It has fourteen rows of columns, nine in each row,

been quarried in the United States very little smaller than the Cleopatra's Needle (70 feet tall)? And that the chief reason Americans and Europeans have built no Great-Pyramids or Temples-of-Karnak is that they have not had sufficient religious incentive, or did not have the money to invest in that form of "hi-larity?" It is estimated that the Great Pyramid, on which 100,000 men labored for 20 years, and which contains 85 millions cubic feet of stone, cost about \$42,500,000—a mere trifle.

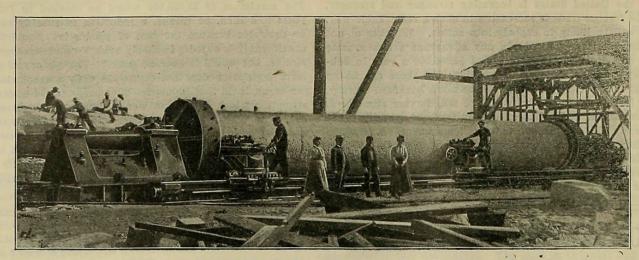
When we contemplate the work being done on the Cathedral of St. John the Divine, on Cathedral Heights, we can not help comparing it with the Temple of Karnak, and though the monoliths which will be used are smaller than the ones in Egypt, yet it does not take much stretching of the imagination to state that were they similar in size to the Karnakian pillars, modern engineers could handle them with comparative ease.

The accompanying illustration shows a block of granite cut from the quarry of the Bodwell Granite Co., at Vinalhaven, Me. It is 67 feet long, 8½ feet by 7 feet in section, and weighs 310 tons. This block, after being dressed, will be 54 feet long, 6 feet in diameter, and will weigh 160 tons. Thirty-two of these

and 43 feet high; and two rows, six in each, of the enormous height of 62 feet, 11 feet 6 inches in diameter, and carrying capitals which measure 22 feet across." He probably means that these capitals are 22 feet square, but he fails to inform us how thick is each block. This is very unkind of Sir G., and there seems to be a deep mystery regarding the thickness. The writer spent a whole day at the Astor Library searching book after book for this elusive bit of information, and every book in that institution was dumb. Even the Encyclopedia Britannica, that treasury of universal knowledge, says "carrying capitals which measure 22 feet across, which are to be compared with our modern theatrical posters only."

The Record and Guide rises to remark at this juncture that the stone on top of Mackay's tomb in Greenwood is 22 feet square; but emulating the example of Sir. G. Wilkinson, who no doubt wrote the article for the Encyclopedia, we shall positively refuse to say how thick it is.

The obelisks of Egypt are generally huge monoliths of red granite or syenite. The Egyptians first embellished them by working them to a fine face, and afterwards by covering them

with carvings. They vary in height from over 100 feet to 8½ feet. The tallest known now stands close to the Church of St. John Lateran, in Rome. It is 148 Roman palms in height, or a little over 108 English feet, is about 8 feet square at the base, and weighs, as is estimated, nearly 450 tons.

The enormous labor and care expended upon the obelisks may be judged from the fact that the largest one at Karnak, which weighs 297 tons, must have been lifted out of the quarry, lowered into a ship, raised out of this into a carriage, transported more than 100 miles by land, and then raised upright, and to a considerable height, to its pedestal.

History is almost entirely silent regarding the means of transportation used in getting the obelisks and other large stones from the quarries to their place of destination. It also fails to relate out of what material the roads over which they were carried were made. Herodotus says of Cheops:

"This king was a tyrant of the very worst kind; he closed all the temples of Egypt; forbade every sort of religious observance, and forced all his subjects to labor for him as he pleased. Among other whims, he determined to build this pyramid as a tomb for himself. The stones were quarried in the Arabian mountains, and none was less than 30 feet long. They were conveyed by the Nile to a newly-constructed road, three-quarters of a mile long, 60 feet broad, and in a cutting of 48 feet. This road was of polished stone, carved with figures, and took ten years to complete."

Some of the hieroglyphs, as nearly as can be judged from those perspectiveless drawings, show that sledges were used in some instances, and rollers in others. Some of the smaller stones were incased in a circular wooden sheathing, with pins fixed in the ends, to which were attached ropes or chains connected with iron braces similar in shape to the style now used on lawn-mowers.

One illustration shows a carved image of one of the kings mounted on a sledge. On the front of the sledge are two men with jars, the contents of which they are pouring in front of each runner, while another angular-flat-sided figure of a man marks time for the string of slaves who are doing the hauling.

marks time for the string of slaves who are doing the hauling. When it is remembered that the Egyptians had no steel to work with; that the granite of which the obelisks and several of the smaller pyramids are composed, is the very hardest kind of stone that is known, we may well wonder at the achievements of these ancient people. They undoubtedly had iron tools, but the hard granite offers serious difficulties to modern stone-cutters equipped with the best steel implements, and it would be difficult to compute the length of time it took the slaves to fashion an obelisk from the virgin stone and carve upon it the almost innumerable hieroglyphs.

Probably one of the most difficult single feats performed by the Egyptians was the hauling of a statue of Rameses II. from the quarries at Seyne to the court of the temple of Rameses II., called the Rameseum of El Kurmeh, situated about a mile to the west of Setheum. This colossal image is now broken in pieces, but when whole it was 60 feet high, and weighed, according to Sir Gardner Wilkinson, 887 tons and 5½ cwt. A similar feat of modern engineering would be the transportation of all the steel in the frame of the New Broad-Exchange Building, melted into one solid mass. This structure when completed will be the largest office building in the world.

The great Sphinx, which stands, or rather lies, near the great Pyramid, seems to have been cut out of the solid rock. It has the body of a lion crouching close to the ground; the height from the platform on which it lies to the top of the head is 100 feet; the total length is 146 feet; across the shoulders it measures 34 feet. The head, from the top of the chin, is 28 feet 6 inches, and is 40,000 times the bulk of an ordinary head.

A tablet is said to have been discovered in which Suphis records some repairs he had done to the Sphinx. If this reading is correct it proves that the Sphinx antedates the pyramids by many years.

The riddle of this ancient, colossal and mysterious figure was

solved many years ago by Col. Vyse, an Englishman. After some deep and heavy thinking, wrought to a state of frenzy by the steady refusal of the idol to answer his questions, he se'zed a drill and attacked the Sphinx's shoulder, believing he would thus get at the very heart of the monster. After boring 27 feet, to his astonishment he found that the object was made of stone, and presumably was solid.

History is strangely reticent about the roads of ancient Egypt, with the exception of the road built by Cheops mentioned above. But we know these immense weights could not be moved over any except the very best.

The problem of transportation in modern times is much simplified by the railroads, special trucks being built for each case if necessary.

Probably the tallest shaft ever put up in this country quarried from native stone is the shaft in the cemetery at Troy, N. Y., erected to Gen. Wool. It is 60 feet tall and 5 feet square at the base.

Greenwood Cemetery contains three large monoliths. One, erected in memory of J. Stemme, is 51 feet long and 4 feet square at the base, weighing about 100,000 lbs. It was quarried by C. E. Tayntor & Co., at Barre, Vt., and 82 people were photographed standing on the undressed stone as it lay in the quarry. The second Greenwood shaft is Wm. Henry Hall's monument, 42 feet long and 4 feet at the base, and the third the Hearne shaft, 50 feet by 4 feet and 2 inches, weighing 120,000 lbs. net.

The first large stone that was quarried and handled in this country is the Washburne monument at La Crosse, Wis. It is 40 feet by 4, and was dressed at Westerly, R. I.

The West Point monument is a notable stone also, the polished surface being 41 feet 6 inches long, and 6 feet in diameter. It is of Branford red granite, and was put in position by Norcross Bros. This shaft was loaded on the car at the quarry, and was not removed until it arrived at the summit of the hill, being transported to Fishkill, thence on a float to West Point. A railroad track was laid up-the-hill, and it took two weeks for the stone to make the journey.

The new Rockefeller monument at Cleveland, O., is 54 feet long and 4 feet and 4 inches square at the base.

The Mt. Hope Cemetery, in the annexed district, has a large shaft also, 50 feet long and 4 feet square, weighing 100,000 lbs., erected for the Confederate Association.

Probably the longest block of sandstone ever quarried in America was gotten out by Fred. Prentice, of the Prentice Brown Stone Co., at Ashland, Wis. This block was originally intended for use by the State Historical Society at the World's Fair in Chicago. The length was 110 feet, the base 10 feet square, and gradually tapering to 4 feet square at the top. The cost of quarrying and transportation was estimated at \$90,000, but the Society had only \$60,000 at its disposal, so the stone lay in the quarry and was finally cut into fragments.

The Southern Marble Co., of Marble Hill, Ga., recently furnished a lot of pillars for the State Savings Bank, at Detroit, Mich. These were 27 feet 2 inches long and 4 feet 4 inches at the base. Each block contained 500 cubic feet, and weighed 100,-066 lbs.

A recent achievement of the Forest City Stone Co., of Cleveland, O., is worth mentioning. They succeeded in quarrying 16 blocks of liver rock 24 and 27 feet in length by 3 feet 6 inches and 3 feet 2 inches, weighing about 28 tons. These pillars now stand in front of the Court-House at Washington, Pa.

There are two very large flagstones on 57th street, New York. One, in front of Cornelius Vanderbilt's residence, is 25 feet long by 15 feet wide, and just across the way the other rests in front of W. C. Whitney's house. It is 26 feet long by 13 feet 6 inches wide.

The largest block of stone ever blasted in Derbyshire has been raised from the Ashover quarry. It measured 33 feet long by 31 feet wide and 23 feet deep, and contained upwards of 23 500 cubic feet. It was lifted by 40 lbs. of powder in one bore-hole.

# A Bright Idea in Apartments

Felt & Livingston Follow up their First Successes with Three more on the same Plan.

Felt & Livingston, the enterprising firm of builders who are working on an original line in the construction of large apartment houses for tenants who pay moderate rents, have just completed two more of these buildings, and have another nearly completed.

Their first effort in this line was the Lucile, on the southeast corner of St. Nicholas avenue and 114th street, which contained 53 five-and-six-room apartments, both with bath, all of which were rented before completion, and the building itself promptly sold to ex-Governor Morton, after careful inquiry and examina-

to meet the wishes of tenants of small means by giving them the outward appearances and interior comforts of the high-priced flats.

The illustration of the Le Roy, accompanying this article, will serve to show how these buildings look from the street. The materials of the facade are Indiana limestone and grey brick. Though the monthly rents range from \$40 to \$60, there are provided handsome entrances, through wrought-iron plate glass paneled gates, into a hall floored and wainscoted in marble, like all the public halls; elevator service day and night, colored glass

decoration, steam heat, hot water, gas and electric light, as in the high-priced apartments. In laying out the floors care has been taken to make each apartment perfectly complete and self-contained, and to secure the best possible light and ventilation. The trim is hardwood throughout and the furnishings of good quality, including earthenware tubs and sinks. Each apartment consists of a parlor, dining-room, kitchen and maids' room, bedrooms, in number according to the size of the apartment, and sometimes a library off the parlor.

Looking at all three buildings, it will be found that the builders have improved upon their first idea in order to attract a wider class of tenants, by including both smaller and larger apartments than were constructed in either the Lucile or the Constance. Thus there are on each floor of the Le Roy one 5, one 7 and five 6-room apartments, and on the ground floor three stores; in the Harold there are 4, 5 and 6-room apartments, and in the Grantly there are one 6-room and five 7-room apartments, all with baths.

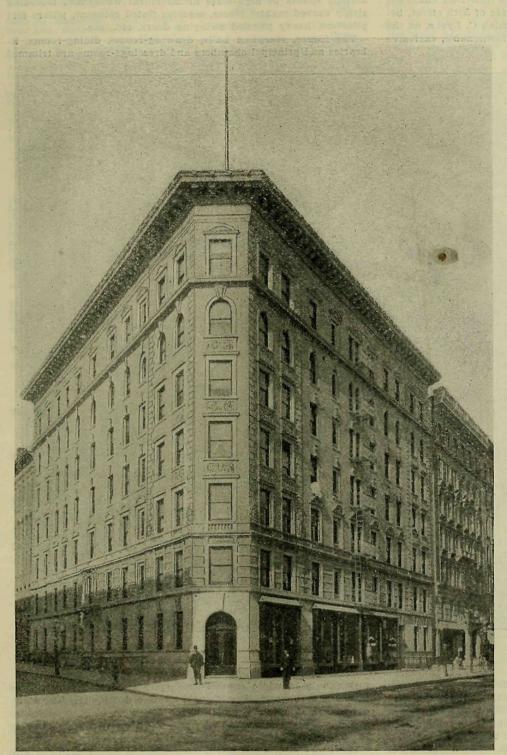
A feature that attaches to each of these houses is the careful selection of a site in a good apartment section, with easy access to stores, schools and churches, and the elevated and surface transit facilities that give access to every other part of In building Felt & Livingston the city. follow the plan of buying all materials themselves, and overseeing the workingup and placing, which is done by day's work, in preference to the contract or lumping system. They claim that by this, while they do not save money, they command the situation and secure better work and results generally.

The Le Roy's 47 apartments and 3 stores were all leased and occupied within four weeks of the completion of the building; the Grantly's 36 apartments are rapidly filling; the Harold's 61 apartments will not be ready for occupancy until December 1st, but are already being sought, and the one store has been already leased to a druggist.

It must be taken for granted that this success has not been obtained without merit. The apartments erected by Felt & Livingston evidently supplied a want, and this fact, as well as the results of expert examination of the buildings constructively and financially, must have impressed itself upon the minds of two such shrewd business men as the buyers of the first two. It must be so, because it is human nature to desire a good thing, even if one cannot get so much of it as

others. Many of those who saw and admired the large expensive apartment-houses, with their many conveniences, and could not afford them, must have regretted that there were not small and less expensive ones, with similar advantages for travel, of location and interior comforts and conveniences of which they could avail themselves.

It was in following out this idea that the Lucile and Constance became such successes, and as it appeals to the very largest class of urban tenants, it is capable of almost endless development. Messrs. Felt & Livingston's office is located in the Le Roy, on the northwest corner of St. Nicholas avenue and 113th street.

This success encouraged Felt & Livingston to continue along the same lines, and produce the Le Roy, on the northwest corner of St. Nicholas avenue and 113th street; the Harold, on the northwest corner of Manhattan avenue and 118th street; and the Grantly, No. 557 West 124th st. The first two are 7-story, and the last one a 6-story building. Each stands on a plot actually, or equivalent to  $100 \times 100$ , and each is built with the same purpose as created the Lucile and the Constance, namely,

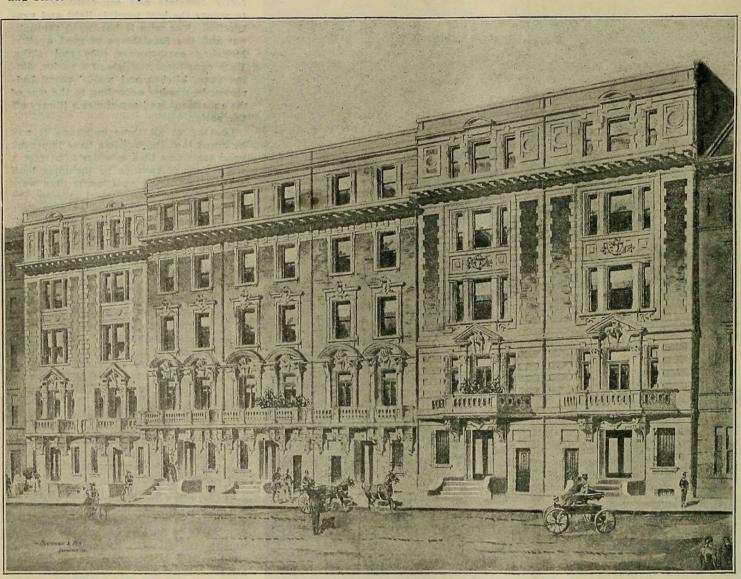

Two of the seven houses are 23 feet in frontage, one 22, one 21, one 20 and two 19. All are 63 feet in depth, in the main, with 21-foot extensions. They are architecturally very ornamental and attractive, and the materials used are a pleasing combination of selected Roman red pressed brick, Tiffany brick and a superior grade of skilfully-treated Indiana limestone. The houses differ in exterior design, and present a pleasing variety of style and finish. They show remarkable solidity of construction, and have evidently been built to last for many generations. Heavy iron beams have been liberally used, the stone and brick-work is very substantial, and throughout massive strength is

The interior divisions are practically the same in all of the houses. The basements, which are light and dry, contain the laundry, clothes dryer, wine cellar, furnace, coal bins, etc. The first floor has a handsome vestibule, richly furnished in rare marbles, artistic mosaic, ornamental, skilfully wrought-iron and polished plate glass, an entrance hall, store room, kitchen, servants' sitting-room, etc. The latter extends 16 feet beyond the kitchen, and is a new and most commendable feature.

On the second floor is a parlor, opening into a foyer hall; that again into a spacious dining-room, at the rear of which are the butler's pantry, dumb-waiter, etc. On the third floor front is the

The kitchens have white enameled brick chimney breasts, with walls tiled to a height of about 6 feet, and all the door frames, window casings, etc., are of choice Italian marble. They are equipped with the best culinary appliances. The laundry is also beautifully tiled, and contains up-to-date conveniences. The plumbing is exposed, sanitary and ornamental.

Of these houses, Nos. 48 and 50 have already been sold while in the workmen's hands; there remain in the market the five westerly houses of the row, regarding which intending purchasers may obtain all necessary information from the owner at No. 38 East 50th street, or of their own brokers.

The brokerage business reported this week, while lacking features of popular interest, was nevertheless of essentially the same character as that of last week. The bulk of the dealing was made up of sales of private houses, many of them to intending occupants, and of trades between professionals, supplemented by purchase of lots by builders for improvement. Among the recognizedly speculative deals, the only one of any importance was the purchase by Daniel B. Freedman of a plot on Riverside Drive, on the crest of the hill overlooking Manhattan Valley. The plot will, of course, be resold to a builder, and will undoubtedly become the site of a large apartment house. The best items contained in the week's Gossip, refer to the sale of two mercantile buildings to bona fide investors. The four-story warehouse at No. 118 Warren st, which is under lease for five years, was bought by a client of E. A. Recently, in a proceeding instituted on behalf of the City of New York to acquire title to land included in Fox st, or 150th st, which corresponds to Uncas st, on the Gouverneur Morris map, filed in 1853, an award of \$7,200 was made to the executors of John McConville. In their final report, however, the Commissioners reduced this amount to \$4,200, on the ground that the public had an easement or right of way over the land in the street claimed by the McConville estate. The Supreme Court, at Special Term, refused to confirm the report, holding that the owners were entitled to have the value of the real estate free from right of way of the public, or of the private owners, awarded to them. The Appellate Division has affirmed the order below, in an opinion by Justice McLaughlin. The court holds that though Morris intended to dedicate the land covered by these streets to the public, nothing was done toward the acceptance of that dedication until 1857, when the proper authorities discontinued the streets. Even though it be conceded, Justice McLaughlin says, that the dedication made by Morris was accepted by the public, it nevertheless lost whatever right it had in such land by its failure to open and work the streets within the time specified in the statute of 1861, which declares that a road not opened and worked within six years from the time of being laid out shall cease to be a road. An award of \$8,100 made to the Mount Morris Real Estate Association, was reduced by the Commissioners to \$1,180 in their final report. The Appellate Division holds that the Special Term was right in confirming the report in that respect, as upon the map of the land of the association bordering on Fox st, was shown an open street, so that it should be held its grantees acquired a right of way over that street, and the city could only deprive them of that right by awarding to them full compensation.

#### Recent Legal Decision.

Broker's commission not forfeited by execution of deed in name of third party-(Regina Koner v. Mary J. Anderson and others, 32 Misc. Rep. p. 511). This was an action in the Municipal Court to recover broker's commissions on the sale of real estate, and at the close of the plaintiff's case the complaint was dismissed. owing to the alleged insufficiency of plaintiff's evidence. appeal was taken to the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court and the judgment was reversed. Justice O'Gorman, writing the opinion, says in part: "The testimony satisfactorily establishes plaintiff's employment and the sale of the property in question. The purchaser procured by the plaintiff was one Weinstein. For reasons of his own, the contract was signed and the deed taken in the name of one Cohen, with whom Weinstein, who supplied the purchase money, was associated in the transaction. An agent cannot be deprived of his commission merely because the actual purchaser takes title in another's name. The gist of the action is, was the plaintiff the procuring cause of the sale? The details of the closing are but incidents of the transaction, which confer or destroy no rights. Even without resorting to the rule that the construction most favorable to the plaintiff must be put upon the testimony, it is clear that a cause of action was made out when the plaintiff rested, and it was an error to dismiss the complaint."

Sir: Referring to your editorial notice concerning the 69th Armory site in the issue of to-day, I am prompted to ask in what sense you have considered it "useful" to give the names of the Commissioners, of whom I have the privilege of being Chairman? course, you understand that the Commission is in no sense to blame for the condition of things which you very justly censure. So far as we are concerned, we have done everything in our power to expedite matters. Thus when the hearings were adjourned over the summer, after having finished so much of the proceedings as relates to taking proof of the various "titles" involved, the Commission met from day to day during the summer vacation and passed on the question of titles, in order to save the corresponding period of time at the conclusion of the oral proceedings, and to have its report ready so much sooner. And but for the fact that the resignation of Mr. Rea as a Commissioner necessitated proceedings for the appointment of another in his place, the Commission in this matter would have progressed sufficiently to have been warranted in believing that a new record would be made in the matter of completing proceedings of this nature.

In this particular instance the situation is not a very hard one for the city, because I understand that the rental income from the property under the present monthly hirings will not be much less than the interest which the city will have to pay on the ultimate awards.

As to the property-owners, while of course there may be cases of individual inconvenience, they can hardly complain of some delay when they are getting interest at the rate of 6% upon their investments. As to their occupancy of the premises, they have known long since that the city would become vested with the title on September 22d, and could have prepared accordingly.

In that respect it seems to me to be a distinct advantage to the owners that the city takes title at a fixed period before payment (rather than upon confirmation of the Commissioners' report). Thus the date of vesting is fixed for a definite day some time ahead, and the owners are enabled to prepare accordingly.

# WHY IS A P. M. MORTGAGE BETTER THAN OTHER MORTGAGES?

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

Please tell us all about a purchase money mortgage. Why is it better than other mortgages, and also tell us about the "equity of redemption" which a lessee has in a lease exceeding three years in case he is dispossessed?

"IGNORAMUS."

Answer.—A purchase money mortgage is better than a direct loan because it cannot be attacked for usury or with regard to the equities between the parties, and further, by statute no matter if the buyer of a piece of real estate has a lot of judgments against him before he buys, those judgments can not come in ahead of any purchase money mortgage he gives, and can not be collected out of the real estate ahead of that mortgage; the opposite is the case where money is lent directly upon mortgage, and there are judgments against the borrower before the money is loaned.

As to the "equity of redemption" of a lessee, it is not for a lease exceeding three years, but, as you may read in section 2256 of the Code of Civil Procedure, if a lessee holds over, after default in the payment of rent, and the unexpired term of the lease exceeds five years, at the time the warrant is issued, the lessee, or his legal representative, may at any time within one year after execution of the warrant, pay or tender all rent in arrears, with interest and the costs and charges, and get possession of the premises again. There are a few more details about this, too long to print here in full; they are contained in Sections 2255 to 2265 of the Code of Civil Procedure.—Law Editor.

#### ASSIGNMENTS OF MORTGAGES.

The Commissioner of Internal Revenue, in reply to an inquiry from New York, as to whether "revenue stamps are required upon an assignment of a mortgage, executed and delivered subsequent to July 1, 1898, the mortgage having been issued and recorded prior to that date, and therefore not taxable," has repeated a previous decision to the effect that "a tax accrues on every assignment of a mortgage, based upon the amount of money remaining secured thereby; on a lease, based upon the unexpired term; on a policy of life insurance, based upon the amount of insurance remaining in force under the assignment; on a fire, marine, and casualty insurance policy, based upon the unearned premium."

# The Building Frades

#### AN GPPORTUNITY FOR BUILDERS

The South Carolina Interstate and West Indian Exposition, which will be held at Charleston, S. C., during the Fall of 1901 and the Winter and Spring of 1902, will afford a good opportunity for builders and contractors who are familiar with or experienced in the erection of staff and wood buildings. A goodly number of structures of this character will be erected. In addition to the regular Exposition buildings, 12 States have already promised to put up suitable structures, and before many months have passed other States will doubtless fall in line. The United States Government will also have a handsome building there. The bill has not yet passed Congress, but Senator Depew is authority for the statement that it will go through both Houses before the close of the year. The lumber men around Charleston have agreed to furnish the necessary lumber at an already agreed upon price, and labor in that section is plentiful and reasonable.

The administration building is already under way, but contracts for the other exposition structures will not be let until between January 1st and 15th. Mr. Bradford L. Gilbert, of No. 50 Broadway, is the supervising architect for the Exposition, and will supply the necessary plans and specifications. The expenditure of one million dollars has been authorized by the Exposition Co.

#### Material Market.

The week just ended showed a continuance of the good feeling previously noted. Generally speaking, the market for building materials has not been active, but the demand is as good as was expected, being chiefly of the from-hand-to-mouth order, as is usual at this season. New buildings are rarely begun as the year draws to a close, and this fall has brought forth fewer building projects chiefly because of the unsettling influences attendant upon presidential elections.

No startling change of prices is noted, with the exception of the drop in linseed oil.

#### BRICKS.

There is considerable activity in the market for bricks, and prices are firm with an upward tendency. In fact, an advance of 25c. per M. has been fixed upon and will go into effect Monday.

Arrivals last week amounted to more than 20,000,000, all of which have practically disappeared, so that there are no supplies pressing for sale, and the market presents a fairly cleaned-up aspect. More bricks arrived and were sold last week than during any previous seven days of the year.

Indications are good from a seller's standpoint, though it is not anticipated that prices will be advanced higher than is indicated above for some time at least.

Hollow Haverstraw brick have been marked up 50c. per M. Some may probably be purchased a fraction cheaper, but it is understood that the quotations are for strictly standard goods. Manufacturers report an increasing demand from out-of-town, hollow bricks having been shipped as far east as Boston, and there has been some demand from Trenton.

#### LATHS

A further advance has been recorded in the price of laths, sales having been made at \$3.00. Arrivals are so few and far between and the demand is so good that dealers could practically get their own prices. There are very few on the spot, and as the season for shipment is drawing rapidly to a close, it is not improbable that prices will go higher. Even now \$3.25 is asked for spot and nearby deliveries.

#### SPRUCE.

The demand for spruce is excellent, and arrivals are sold off rapidly at firm prices. The papers announce a skim of ice on the Maine rivers and the St. John, which acts as a warning to sailing-masters to hasten clearance. An effort is being made to bring down a quantity of spruce, but vessels are hard to get. The freight rates have been jumping, and have advanced more than \$1.00 per M. within the past two weeks. This being the case, there is no indication of weakness in values, and prices are probably 50c. per M. higher than at the time of the last report. Random cargoes of narrow widths bring from \$16.50 to \$17.50 per M., and wide randoms range from \$18.00 to as high as \$20.50 per M., the latter figure being paid for a cargo which contained a small percentage of 9-inch stuff.

#### YELLOW PINE.

The market is very firm under a fair demand and light offeregs. It is announced that plans are practically completed for the formation and incorporation under the laws of New Jersey of a new corporation, which will include most of the large companies dealing in North Carolina kiln-dried pine lumber. The combined capital is estimated at \$25,000,000. Its organizers are understood to be Charles R. Flint and August Belmont. The name of John Walter Smith, of Maryland, has been suggested as a possible President of the company.

The following is believed to be a correct list of the companies which have agreed to enter the combination: The Tunis Lumber Company, of Baltimore city, and with mills at Norfolk; the Surrey Lumber Company, of Baltimore; the Suffolk Sawmill Company, of Suffolk, Va.; the Roper Lumber Company, of Norfolk; the Roanoke Railroad and Lumber Company, of Norfolk; the Gay Manufacturing Company, of Suffolk, Va.; The Greenleaf Johnson Company, of Norfolk; E. E. Jackson & Co.; the Virginia Sawmill Company, of Norfolk; Wiley, Harker & Co., of New York; the Atlantic Coast Lumber Company, of Georgetown, S. C.; the Branning Manufacturing Company, of Franklin, Va.; the Cape Fear Lumber Company, of Wilmington, N. C.

#### LIME

There is little of interest in the lime market. Prices remain the same, and the demand is fairly good. The makers of State lime are very busy getting in their supplies for the winter in advance of the close of navigation, which has been advertised to occur on December 1st.

#### CEMENT.

Domestic dealers and importers both report an improved demand for cement chiefly in small lots. No change in values has been reported. Manufacturers are working so as not to increase their stocks before the end of the year. It is announced that the price of Rosendale cement will be marked up 10c. per bbl. after the close of navigation.

#### GLASS.

There is a slightly increased demand for American Window Glass, but it is so slight that it has cut no figure in the market. Buyers generally have large stocks remaining from their spring purchases, owing to the dull season, and jobbers also are well filled up. The latter report that the volume of business this fall has been about one-half of what it was last fall.

There is still talk of an understanding between the independent and trust manufacturers, and a conference was held this week at Pittsburg, the result of which has not yet been announced.

French glass is getting scarce and the end of the strike of foreign glass-workers is not yet in sight. One of the jobbers received a letter this week in which it was stated that the men decline to negotiate until their comrades are liberated from jail. Discounts on French glass have been revised. There is now a discount of 75% on first quality, and 75, 10 and 5% on second and third quality.

#### LINSEED OIL.

There was a sensational drop of 10c. per gallon in linseed oil within the week, and grinders have not yet recovered their breath, so little business was recorded either for spot or future delivery. Last week's review of the situation, as far as supplies of seed are concerned, is as near as the truth of the situation can be learned. The movement of prices of seed and oil has been largely forced by speculators, and there seems to be no warrant for current assertions that crushers will not have ample supplies of seed to meet their needs. The decline in the price of oil rapidly followed a drop in the value of seed, and the prevailing figures are more nearly the legitimate value of the products under discussion. One of the leading crushers expresses the opinion that oil will range between 60c. and 70c. during the next six months.

#### PAINTS.

The drop in linseed oil had the effect of lightening the atmosphere in the paint market, and a much better feeling was discernable. Trading still remains seasonably quiet, though the result of the week's business, as far as transfers are concerned, was slightly larger than during the previous week.

#### TIN PLATES.

As the time for deliveries previously contracted for approaches holders of spot stocks are loosening their grip, being willing to let go at slight concessions from their original idea of values rather than hold on for a week or two, and be compelled to accept considerably less as supplies become freer. Buyers find it easier to get what they want as the mills gradually catch up with their orders. There is some talk of a consolidation of the tin can manufacturers which may eventually have substantial results.

#### IRON AND STEEL.

The market for pig-iron has been active, several sales of large dimensions having been reported and numerous small transactions. For finished products there is an increasing demand, and the mills are still behind in their orders. Prices show a hardening tendency. Structural material also shows an advancing tendency.

#### FAILURE OF SUPPLIES - RECOVERY

A recovery by Patrick Gallagher, in his suit against Matthew Baird, founded upon the breach of a contract to furnish granite for the erection of the armory building, at 4th avenue and 34th street, in this city, was recently affirmed on defendant's appeal to the Appellate Division. The action was technically for the breach of the condition of a joint and several bond for \$5,000 executed by Mr. Baird, together with the Sargent Granite Company. A contract was made between Gallagher and the Sargent Granite Company, whereby the latter was to furnish granite cut, fitted and ready to set in the building which Gallagher was under contract with the city to erect. The granite was to conform to the contract with the city and its specifications. Gallagher's contract with the Sargent Company provided that before any payment should become due from him a certificate of the supervising architect should be furnished, approving of the quantity and quality of the material furnished "when set." Mr. Baird and the Sargent Granite Company executed a joint and several bond to secure the performance of the latter's contract with plaintiff, and subsequently, by an assignment, defendant succeeded to the rights under it of the Sargent Granite Company. After having furnished a quantity of the granite defendant abandoned the contract upon the refusal of plaintiff of a payment of several thousand dollars. Justice Hatch, giving the opinion of the Appellate Division, holds that the procurement and production of the architect's certificate as provided constituted an essential prerequisite to a valid technical demand on defendant's part for money due in order to place plaintiff in default; that the facts did not show a waiver of such production; that there was a breach of the contract, and defendant was liable upon the bond. The armory building, being partially constructed of a particular kind of granite, called for by the contract when defendant abandoned it, and there being no open market for such granite, cut and fitted ready to set, the measure of damage was held to be the amount (to the extent of the penalty of the bond) of the actual cost which plaintiff legitimately incurred in procuring it.

#### Large Exports of Copper.

SHIPMENTS DURING OCTOBER REPORTED AT 13,196 TONS.

The exports of copper during October were large, amounting, according to returns made by the Metal Exchange, to 13,196 long tons. This compares with shipments in previous months of the year as follows (all in long tons):

The total for the ten months of this year is 139,385 tons, against 93,450 tons last year, an increase of very nearly 50 per cent.

The figures given above, with the exception of those for October of this year, are those of the Copper Producers' Association, given out about the 15th of each month. The Metal Exchange returns, as a rule, do not vary widely from these.

#### CHARLESTON WANTS THE DEWEY ARCH

The South Carolina Interstate and West Indian Exposition Co. through Mr. Bradford L. Gilbert, the well-known architect, who is the company's New York representative, has petitioned the city government for the donation of the Dewey Arch and colonnade, so that it may be used as one of the architectural features of the Exposition. The petition is now in the hands of the Mayor, and will be laid before the Municipal Assembly on Tuesday. the meantime the work of demolition, which was ordered begun last week, has been held up pending the decision of the city Solons. Inasmuch as the Exposition Company offers to transport the arch and colonnade to Charleston, and erect them there at their own expense, it is hardly probable that the city authorities will refuse the petition. It is the intention of the Exposition committee, provided their request is granted, to erect a tablet

stating that the arch and colonnade are a gift to the sister city in the South. This donation would be another bond cementing the unity of the two sections, and there ought to be no doubt that the Municipal Assembly will turn the arch over to the Exposition, rather than dump it in the river.

DAMAGE BY ELECTRIC WIRE.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

I own a private house in Harlem, and recently finding my roof damaged, on inspection I find a heavily insulated electric wire directly crossing it and also fastened around my chimney, which has loosened the bricks, causing some of them to fall and the entire chimney to lean. How can I find out to whom this wire belongs and how can I recover damages? Can I cut down the wire without notice?

Answer.—I cannot tell you how to find out to whom the wire belongs. It probably belongs to the telephone company. If you cut it, which you have a perfect right to do without notice, you will probably find out very soon, and that may be the easiest way to find out. When you have ascertained who the owner is, put in your claim for damages and, if it is not paid, sue.—Law Editor.

COMMISSION FOR RENTING.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

A, broker, rents a flat from B, landlord, by the month, at \$50 per month (tenant having 11 years' reference from last landlord). Is not A entitled to two and one-half per cent. commission on year's rental, no special agreement having been made?

Answer.—It is the custom of brokers in such a case to charge two and one-half per cent. on a year's rental, and the custom of the trade makes law. I know of no reported decision in such a case.—Law Editor.

#### MERGER.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

1. A is owner of a house. 2. B has a third mortgage on house A owns. 3. B buys house from A. 4. C forecloses a mechanic's lien which B bought after C filed lien. B's mortgage is made out on demand. Now the question is, can B foreclose after he buys said house which he owns mortgage on, or can the mortgage be on record against himself?

Answer.—Statement 4 is unintelligible. When B bought the house his mortgage "merged," was wiped out and, consequently, cannot be foreclosed.—Law Editor.

#### LEASE

Will you kindly inform me if I lease for one year or longer an apartment in an apartment house containing more than five families, that the owner cannot hold me to said lease? I am told that a lease is no good where more than five families live in one house. Is it so?

#### PAYMENT OF COMMISSION REFUSED.

#### To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

A parcel of real estate is for sale Owner tells broker to sell it. Broker calls the attention of various parties to it, among them C, and some time elapses, during which the property is foreclosed and owner takes title. After the foreclosure C comes to broker to obtain the address of some one connected with it, as he wishes to purchase a portion. Broker gives him a letter to owner's attorney and notifies attorney verbally that he has done so and mentions C's name to attorney. C does not deliver letter, but comes directly to owner and does not mention letter, nor does owner know that broker had anything to do with the sale. C buys a plot and receives deed, and upon notice being published in county paper, broker sends bill to owner for commission. Owner did not know that broker had anything to do with the sale, and broker did not know that a sale had been effected until he saw the record published. Owner refuses a commission.

Answer.—Owner is liable for commission.—Law Editor.

#### COMMISSION ON LEASE.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE.

What is the usual and proper commission to an agent for effecting a lease of a dwelling-house in this city for a term of two years?

Answer.—Two and a-half per cent. on first year's rental.—Editor Record and Guide.

#### NO CLAIM TO COMMISSION.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

A, a broker, is approached in 1898 by B, also a broker, for vacant property to offer to a client of B. A proposes a certain plot for which A and B negotiate, but are unsuccessful, and fail to close the deal. In 1900 B sells the property referred to above to another client, claiming that he need not share the commission with A on the ground that two years had elapsed since A gave him information regarding the property, and that the present purchaser called his (B's) attention to the fact of the lots being

still vacant and for sale. A claims that he is morally entitled to his one-half share of the commission. Will you kindly give your view?

Answer.—Neither legally nor morally is A entitled to a share of the commission.—Law Editor.

#### PROPERTY-OWNERS' COMBINATION.

The Property-Owners' and Agents' Protective Association (representing the Claremont section) held a meeting on Monday evening, and empowered a committee to organize another association for the district between 161st and 169th sts., Webster av. and Southern Boulevard (Westchester av.). This association was formed last summer to meet the free-rent evil and has been so successful in the limited section to which operations were orlginally confined, that there is a desire to extend the movement all over the Bronx, beginning with the district already outlined.

The meeting also took up the question of rapid transit for the borough, and were unanimous in the expression of the view that, if it was proposed not to carry out the plan as at present projected for that purpose, the attention of the whole East Side section of the borough ought to be called to the fact and public meetings held to bring out expressions of opinion from the owners and residents therein.

### Obscure By-Ways of New York.

It is one incidental, and perhaps unfortunate, result of the reconstruction which New York is continually undergoing that localities have rarely preserved their primitive character, and that consequently a man who likes streets with something of an old-time flavor to it, does not have much food for his appetite. Lower Manhattan, particularly, has been transformed again and again, so that even the memory of early conditions and associations has passed away. It is rare that the present occupiers of its streets know anything at all about its appearance and uses before the modern era of office building. Yet for all that each of the streets down-town has a history; and the nature of that history is often indicated by the names which it has sometimes retained, but more frequently discarded for others more appropriate, perhaps, to prevailing conditions, but for the most part utterly colorless.

There are, however, a good many short and narrow streets, which have retained names which suggest primitive uses, and which, such is their insignificance, will probably be entirely unfamiliar to the average New Yorker. Where, for instance, is Theatre Alley? No, it is not a slang name for any part of upper Broadway; it is a narrow passage running from Ann to Beekman street, between Park row and Nassau streets. At one time it was known as the "Mews," which suggests from English analogies that it then had something to do with stables. Exchange Alley has a more familiar and appropriate sound, but not every one knows that it runs from Broadway to Trinity place, and is below Rector street; and still fewer could tell why it was once called "Tin Pot Alley," or "Alley that leads to Oyster Pasty." Possibly, however, some reason for the latter name might be surmised. Equally obscure, if not equally suggestive in its nomenclature, is Benson street, formerly called Benson lane, which runs from Leonard street, just east of Broadway, in the direction of the North Pole, for the brief space of half-a-block.

Naturally many of these small streets have been utterly obliterated in the course of improvement, but many are still shown upon the present maps. There is a Jacob street, formerly called by the more expressive name of Leather street, which begins its career west of Pearl street, and runs from Ferry to Frankfort street. What is now Marketfield street has had quite a history. Beginning in Broad street, it goes west for awhile, and then, tired of such monotony, forms an L and turns a corner into Beaver street, in the rear of the Produce Exchange. It was formerly known, first by a number of Dutch names, then by Petticoat lane, Fieldmarket street, and Market Field path. names suggest that it adjoined the early markets, and if so there is an appropriateness not often found in the history of New York streets in the present location of the Produce Exchange. Liberty place, once known as Little Greene street, will probably be better known to the majority of real estate men, for it runs from Liberty street to Maiden lane, at the corner of the building formerly called the "Real Estate Exchange and Auction Room (Limited)." Albany street, at one time Swartwout's Dock, is a narrow passage making its way west from Greenwich street to the river. Pell street, known in early times as Penn street, runs from Chatham square to Mott street, through the heart of the Chinese quarter. More interesting is Shinbone alley, on Bond street, east of Broadway. This is more celebrated than some others we have named, for once of a time Dan Bryant's minstrels used to sing songs about it, to the huge delight of a local audience. These are a few of the many little streets which are scarcely noticed by the crowds that hurry along between the tall rows of modern buildings, for little streets are little used in such a city of high buildings and quick business. North New York has, of course, nothing like them.

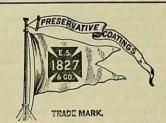

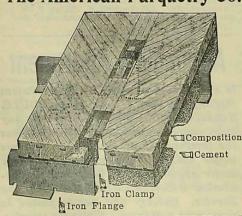

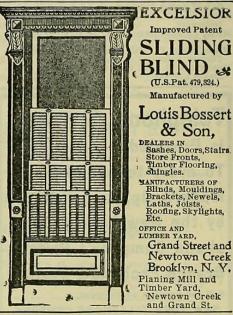
