STAGNATION and depression have dominated Wall Street throughout the week. There is at most no outside buying, and the professionals are getting discouraged in their efforts to create a market. If they put stocks up they have to buy more than they want. If they put stocks down, they meet with stiff resistance below a certain point. The news has been bad; but it appears to be worse than it is. The declines in gross earnings have been due chiefly to weather conditions; and they are counterbalanced by certain notable increases, which continue to take place on the Western and Southwestern lines. Rates have been disturbed, but no very exhausting warfare of this kind is to be expected among such responsible railroads as those concerned in the cutting. The most disastrous event, of which there is any danger, would be an upheaval in the near East during the coming spring; but such a contingency is extremely improbable. Altogether it pays an observer at the present time to keep his eyes away from Wall Street and fixed on the general business situation. That situation is not all that can be desired; but it is decidedly better than Wall Street is at present in a position to realize. If it were once freed from the pressure exerted upon large enterprises by the apprehensions created during the past six months, and by the lack of loanable capital, busines men would find themselves in a tolerably prosperous condition again.

AYOR McCLELLAN has acted with the greatest good sense in vetoing the grant made by the Board of Aldermen to the Westchester Railway Company. The message in which he explains his action, is a model of what such a message should be-brief, weighty and pointed; and if he applies the principles enunciated in the message to the city's dealings with corporations, throughout his administration, his action will enormously strengthen his hold upon popular confidence. It is apparent that Mayor McClellan, like his predecessor, Mr. Low, proposes to give us a sound business administration, and that the city's interests are so far safe in his hands. The approval by the Board of Aldermen of the Westchester scheme was apparently backed by such a strong element in the Mayor's own party that one could not help fearing that it would be allowed to go through, and the veto naturally provokes wonder as to what will be the next move of the opponents of the Portchester Road. Through their control of the Board of Aldermen, they can undoubtedly block all action upon the project, if they want to do so; but it is to be hoped that owing to the Mayor's influence, better counsels will prevail. The Portchester project deserves the consent to cross streets in the Bronx, for which it asks, provided it will satisfy the city authorities that it will pay for the city property it uses, partly because it has obtained the other consents necessary to the construction of the road. partly because it can offer the assurance of good connections south of the Harlem, and partly because it gives every evidence of acting in good faith. The people of the Bronx and Westchester County are unanimously in its favor, and will feel deeply aggrieved in case their interests are trifled with any further. What is more, the Board of Aldermen should recognize the dislike and suspicion with which its action in this matter has been regarded by public opinion. If it wishes to keep the authority bestowed upon it, under the new charter, it will

de well to show more descretion and anxiety for the public interest in its exercise. Why is it that our executives are as a rule so superior to our legislative bodies?

HE real estate market during the past week has been characterized by a continued revival in the purchase of private dwellings, by a noticeable subsidence in the speculation in vacant lots; and by the usual large amount of trading in flats and tenements. The better demand for private dwellings is the most encouraging aspect of the situation, and it is likely to be continued throughout the spring. The increased cost and the comparative scarcity of apartment-house accommodations will doubtless have their reaction upon the cheaper dwelling house districts of Manhattan, and will cause a quickening of the demand for the cheaper private residences which still exist. Many of the residences have undoubtedly been bought recently upon the upper East Side for the purpose of erecting flats in their place; but this very fact should improve the demand for the remainder. Another encouraging sign is that there is more money being loaned on real estate than formerly. The January figures were very low indeed; but they represented the business consummated in December. The February figures representing the business done in January, make a better showing. Doubtless, however, a good deal of business is being postponed at present in the hope that the borrower may possibly obtain later the benefit of the enactment of the mortgage tax exemption bill. New building projects of all kinds are slow to develop. During the past week only two of any interest have been announced-one a loft building for the corner of Fifth Avenue and Sixteenth Street, and the other an apartment-hotel for Sixty-second Street and Broadway. The building, however, when it comes, will come with a rush-and come it will.

A Practicable Scheme.

HE report of the Committee on Thoroughfares of the Municipal Art Society has the great advantage of being a conservative document, and of recommending no change of the existing street lines which could not be completed at a comparatively small expense. Of course, in any case the expense will be large, but most of the changes in street lines proposed by the committee are concerned with streets on which property values are not high and the improvements themselves are, considering the resources of the city, its other responsibilities, and the laws under which it must act, entirely practicable. Furthermore, most of the changes recommended, while they will benefit wagon traffic, will have the additional value of being of enormous assistance in providing better lines and more room for the surface and sub-surface railway traffic. This is an aspect of the matter which should not only be not neglected, but should be kept absolutely at the very top of the discussion concerning a revision of the street plan. It is of prime importance, both because of the actual value of the new streets in the transit system of Manhattan and because the need of the new streets for the sake of improving this transit system constitutes an effective and popular motive for the earnest and immediate consideration of such projects.

The proposed new and wider streets which seem particularly desirable to the Record and Guide, may be described as follows: In the first place the changes in the street lines which will unite more effectively the old Greenwich village with the rest of the city, north and south. These changes include (1) the extension of Seventh Avenue to a prolongation of Varick Street, and the widening of Varick Street itself. (2) The extension of Sixth Avenue to Varick Street. (3) The extension of Christopher Street to Union Square. The first two of these proposed changes have frequently been proposed before; but their revival is particularly appropriate at the present time because the prolongation of Seventh Avenue and the widening of Varick Street would constitute an excellent thoroughfare along which to carry the West Side subway, while the outlet afforded for the street railway tracks would be equally desirable. As to the extension of Christopher Street to Union Square, that is necessitated by the trolley tunnel terminal at Christopher and Hudson Streets, which most assuredly needs a direct connection with the shopping district.

The lower East Side imperatively requires similar changes; but the precise revision of the street lines which would be most useful and most practicable, is not so obvious. Delancey Street must, of course, be widened; and some street parallel to the Bowery must be enlarged from East Broadway to a connection with Second Avenue at Houston Street. Furthermore, with the increase of traffic which will set in toward the new bridges, it will be undoubtedly necessary to widen Park Row from the City Hall to Chatham Square. The Committee on Thoroughfares suggest also certain diagonal streets opening up the new bridges which would have obvious advantages, but their serious consideration will doubtless be deferred until after the more pressing improvements, already mentioned, have been completed or rejected. The immediately necessary street widening on the upper East Side is, of course, the opening up of Fifty-Ninth Street, which will probably be effected by means of the arcade plan. The cost of street widenings in that part of the city naturally inclines the committee to be very conservative in its recommendations. It insists, however, as the Record and Guide has frequently done, upon the necessity of widening the roadway of Fifth Avenue, and it suggests a viaduct over Park Avenue from Sixtieth Street to Fortieth Street, which could be advantageously combined with the terminal plans of the Central The only probable center of congestion in the near Railroad future with which the committee does not deal, is that which cannot help but develop at the Pennsylvania Terminal; but the expense of opening up any effective connection with that point is enough to stagger even the most hopeful reformers.

The committee makes a number of inner recommendations into which we cannot go at the present time; but the outline given above comprehends the most essential and practicable parts of the street revision plan proposed in the report. Its great advantage is, as we have said, that it is conservative. It makes no suggestion towards an impossible Haussmanization of Manhattan-that is towards the opening up of a series of streets and boulevards which would look well on paper, but which would be beyond the resources of the city and would not appeal to the honest business reasons which must determine the action in such matters of a collection of business men. New York is not the national or even the State capital. It is a commercial and financial metropolis, with a source of growth and prosperity which possesses the greatest intensity and momentum. The very intensity and momentum of its business life will necessitate in the end a better proportioned and more comprehensive growth; but for the present its action in such matters as those of street revision and the like must be severely utilitarian, and, for our part, we cannot altogether regret this condition. beautiful city is a most desirable thing, but it cannot properly be obtained by a sacrifice of the peculiar individuality which gives a city its distinction and vitality. We do not want New York to be a city that has tried to look like Paris and failed. Neither can a city be made beautiful merely by the fertility of good intentions, even when assisted by technical training. If New York can be made correct, convenient and comfortable, its beauty will take care of itself; and the Municipal Art Society would probably have more influence in case its name emphasized more the engineering aspect of the work that it is undertaking.

The Exhibition of the Architectural League.

HE speakers at the annual dinner of the Architectural League, which was held just previous to the opening of the current exhibition, all of them spoke on different aspects of the current movement in the direction of large public architectural improvements. The President of the League, Mr. A. W. Brunner, dwelt hopefully both on the work of the League and upon the prospects of realizing at an early date certain of the great schemes of municipal art and architecture which are now being discussed. He was followed by Mr. George B. Post, who described the methods whereby the rare beauty of the Chicago exhibition had been reached, and how much cordial co-operation it had demanded among the several architects who had participated in the designs. He was followed by Mr. John M. Carrère, who described the conditions which he himself, and his associates, Mr. Burnham and Mr. Brunner, had to face in designing a comprehensive scheme for the location and the architecture of the group of public buildings which are to be erected in Cleveland. Mr. Carrère insisted particularly on the great advantage which Cleveland had over a city like New York, in that it was going to start right, and upon the necessity of a spirit of unselfish co-operation among the different architects associated in such an enterprise. The next speaker, Police Commissioner McAdoo, addressed himself chiefly to the task of commenting on the artistic progress of the country, and upon the value of art as a civilizing agent. The Police Commissioner, however, like the good politician he is, was very careful not to encourage the architect to expect very much in the way of civic art at the present time. He pointed out that the municipal art movement, while strong and right in its purposes, did not control very many votes. If it did control votes, he said, the politicians would be jumping out of their clothes in their eagerness to become civic art reformers. He also pointed out the fact that Mr. Carrère and his associates had caught Cleveland young, and that New York was a tough and unruly subject for similar treatment. Altogether he left the impression that art was perhaps a better thing to talk about after dinner than it was to bother about during the day's work. The last speaker, the Rev. Mr. Rainsford, talked about art, morals, and other things.

The most prominent feature of the exhibition of the Architectural League is the number of designs of large public buildings which are to be erected throughout the country. Among the most interesting of these are the successful plans for the reconstruction of the Military Academy at West Point, of which Cram, Goodhue & Ferguson are the architects; the models and designs of the new Naval Academy at Annapolis, designed by Ernest Flagg; the scheme for grouping the public buildings at Cleveland, Ohio; the exhibition of the bridge designs, of which Mr. Lindenthal did the engineering part and Mr. Henry Hornbostle the architectural; the Army War College at Washington, D. C., by McKim, Mead & White; the new municipal buildings of Brooklyn, by Washington Hull; the new Pennsylvania Railroad Station at Washington, by Burnham & Co.; the new public library in Brooklyn, designed by Lord & Hewlett; the New York flower market, designed by Arnold W. Brunner; and the new De Witt Clinton High School, by C. B. J. Snyder. Among the notable buildings for private owners, which are illustrated in the exhibition, may be mentioned Hunt & Hunt's designs for the "Marble Twins," two Vanderbilt residences at 645-7 Fifth Avenue, New York City; the Van Norden Trust Company, of H. J. Hardenbergh; the "Madison Square," by Howells & Stokes, and the Brunswick Hotel, Hiss & Weeks.

The exhibition is undoubtedly one of the most interesting which the League has had for some years; and this greater interest is partly due to the fact that a special jury was chosen to select from the exhibits presented. This jury was composed of Karl Bitter, Augustus St. Gaudens and Daniel C. French. among the sculptors; George B. Post, Chas. F. McKim and John M. Carrère, architects, and John La Farge, Edwin H. Blashfield and Kenyon Cox, among the painters. It would be difficult to select nine other men in the country more distinguished in their several lines of work, and better qualified to make a good selection among the miscellaneous mass of material submitted. The interest of the exhibition, furthermore, is by no means confined to the chance it affords the visitor to look at the designs for grandiose architectural schemes. The number of cartoons and sketches for mural decorations and glass is considerable, and possesses a high order of merit. Of particular interest are the cartoons for a stained glass window in a Massachusetts church, designed by Robert Reid; a carefully finished sketch of a stained glass window, for a Pittsburgh church, by Kenyon Cox; sketches of decorations in the St. Regis Hotel, by Mr. Sewell; a decoration by Frank Benson, peculiarly remarkable for its charm and its vivid coloring, and several theatre decorations by Mr. William M. L. Dodge. So far as the sculpture is concerned, Mr. Daniel French, with his impressive statue of "Alma Mater" for Columbia College, and his strong bronze figure of "Labor," is far and away the most conspicuous of the exhibitors. The rest of the sculpture consists largely of plaster models for groups of figures intended for the St. Louis Fair, of very different degrees of merit.

Busy Year for the Art Comm ion.

The report of the Art Commission for the year 1903, just issued, discloses that the matters submitted to the Commission during the period exceeded in number those submitted in any previous year and actually exceeded the aggregate of all former years, including 1902. In 61 submissions the designs were approved as submitted and in 55 instances the Commission disapproved in whole or in part. Of these last, amended plans were prepared and again, submitted to the Commission in 35 cases, and others are now being perfected. Without exception the new designs have shown marked improvement, and the Commission feels, therefore, that its work has been successful in securing a higher aesthetic standard for public structures.

The requirement of the Charter, that approval must be secured before structures may be erected, and the knowledge upon the part of the designers that plans would not be approved by the Commission which did not possess artistic merit, have also had an indirect effect, for those intending to submit designs to the Commission have naturally been desirous that their plans should be of such merit as to command approval without alteration. Consequently, greater care has been taken in the preparation of these designs than otherwise would be or has been the case.

As a submission is examined and reported upon by a special committee before it is considered by the full Commission, it is in committee work, of which no record is kept, that are found the more engrossing duties of Commissioners. Of the full Commission there have been called 18 meetings, at each of which, with one exception, a quorum has appeared. Action upon no submission has been materially delayed.

The Charter provides that expenditure of the City's funds without the approval of the Art Commission is illegal in such cases as come within the jurisdiction of the Commission. For instance, if the designs for a public structure costing several millions of dollars should be disapproved by the Art Commission, and the contractor should proceed to carry them out, or if the contractor should omit to submit them to the Art Commission, the payment of any money to the contractor under such circumstances would be illegal, and any City official doing so would be guilty of misappropriating funds. Whether a contractor is carrying out the plans approved by the Art Commission is, therefore, a very important question, and its determiantion must depend upon the facts shown by the records of the Commission. These should, therefore, be complete and accurate, and the certificate issued thereon so drawn as to preclude any misunderstanding.

The case of Sanborn vs. Lindenthal (41 Misc. 564, Nov., 1903), somewhat indicates how important may become the Commission's The case was one on application for injunction against proceeding with the erection of Blackwell's Island Bridge except on the original plans, and involved the legality of a proposed expenditure of above \$7,000,000. In its opinion, the Court said: "The ground of this action" (for injunction against the Bridge Commissioner) "is that under the provisions of law hereinbefore recited and the proceedings had the only lawful bridge that could be built was the one designed by the preceding Commissioner, and the plans of which were approved by the Board of Public Improvements and the Municipal Assembly; and that, as the specifications and plans and designs as they now exist differ from the plan so approved they are illegal. I cannot come to any such conclusion. * * * Furthermore, the Art Commission, called in by the Mayor and vested with the veto power by law, has rejected the original design. That disapproval disposed of it. The bridge could not thereafter be constructed in accordance therewith. * * * Injunction denied."

Reports from Baltimore.

FIREPROOF CONSTRUCTION STOOD THE TEST, BUT WINDOWS ADMITTED THE DEVOURING FLAMES.

Intelligible reports from a technical standpoint are beginning to be received from Baltimore. Some New York builders and architects are returning from brief tours of inspection. They agree in the assertion that Baltimore's great conflagration has proven a vindication of the steel skeleton type of tall buildings. The structures that were not of modern fireproof construction varied from the old two or three-story characteristic Baltimore house, built fifty to one hundred years ago, to the brick and stone and cast-iron structure, with its facing of ornamental cast-iron columns and pilasters, of the latter half of the century, to the most modern steel and masonry office building of fifteen stories or more in height. One would naturally expect that in an assortment of buildings varying so greatly in their construction and their supposed fireproof qualities, there would have been shown varying degrees of ability to resist the fierce heat of the fire; but it needed but one look at the wierd desolation to realize that the flames made a clean sweep of everything. In the first place, practically every building that was not of steel skeleton construction was level with the ground, the only evidence of its existence being a mass of bricks that showed signs of having passed through the most intense heat, and occasionally an angle of wall that stood swaying to the Occasionally, rising sheer into the heavens from amid the piles of wreckage, was seen through the mass of smoke the giant form of a modern so-called fireproof building. The steel skeletons are sound, and where thoroughly incased are excellently preserved. Such of the buildings as have been tested have been found to be in plumb and uninjured, so far as their main structural features are concerned.

Mr. Paul Starrett, of the George A. Fuller Company, returned last Saturday from a visit to Baltimore, where he spent three days. The Fuller Company had four buildings of their construction in the path of the flames, namely, the Union Trust Building (11 stories), the Calvert Building (12 stories), the Maryland Trust Building (10 stories) and the Alexander Brown Bank (1 story). Every particle of wood in these buildings was burned out, says Mr. Starrett. On the front exteriors, the stonework, the terra cotta and marble were found very badly damaged. But the steel frame and fireproofing had stood wonderfully.

"I don't think it would cost \$1,000 to repair the steelwork in any one place. The Calvert Building was the least damaged of any of these high buildings, and the Brown Building the least of all. The floors are all intact. But the only windows that stood were those having wire glass. Every one of these buildings can be repaired. I think the salvage will be fully fifty per cent. The great lesson of the fire is, protect the openings."

Charles I. Berg, the New York architect, who is making investigations for the Building Department of New York City, says the manner in which the upper stories of the tall buildings have been cleaned of all that was inflammable, shows that the heat was far greater there than below, and that the flames first flew over the tops of the buildings, making great torches of all they touched. The 12-story Calvert Building is completely gutted above the first story, but at the main entrance the revolving door is in perfect condition, and the elevators at the bottom of their shafts are uninjured. Several rooms on the first floor of this building remain unharmed. In one of the rooms on an upper floor of this building there was not a vestige left of the inflammable materials that were in it, but a theromometer on the wall was left in perfect condition. The Merchants' National Bank Building is entirely cleaned out, even to the fusing of chandellers in the upper stories, but the main floor is in excellent condition, the mahogany trim of the banking room not even being blistered by the heat. In the Equitable Building, where a light form of wide floor arches was used, the safes on the upper floors crashed through to the basement, staving large holes through the floors. This building, it is considéred, suffered worse than any of the other "skyscrapers," and it is feared that it may have to be taken down. It is the only instance, however, where such fears are entertained, thus far.

The Continental Trust Building, which is 14 stories high, has been examined by D. H. Burnham, the Chicago architect, and pronounced to be only slightly injured and perfectly in plumb. The Union Trust Building was subjected to a more intense heat than any of the others, and as a result the limestone facing was badly cracked and scaled, and will doubtless have to be removed. The steel frame and fireproof flooring are, however, in good condition. The iron and marble stairways were demolished. The stone facings of several other tall steel frame buildings will also have to be removed entirely or in part. The point is emphasized that concrete proofing did not obtain a good test, owing to the small amount of it. The absence of fireproof warehouses also prevents deductions along this line. A municipal commission is to be appointed to investigate the ruins for the benefit of new fire and building ordinances. The Maryland Trust Building is in good condition, and can be repaired.

Baltimore is now overcrowded with representatives of all branches of the building trades. An army of mechanics are stranded, having nothing to do. Superintendent Schonfarder of the Bureau of Industrial Statistics announces that as yet there is only enough work there to give employment to Baltimore workmen, and that the home workers will receive the preference in every instance.

The general impression is that of the surplussage of Baltimore construction work a majority will go to Washington, some to Philadelphia, but not much to New York.

Quartered in stuffy rear rooms, private dwellings, and in third and fourth story fronts of old buildings, as near the center of the new business district of the city as they can possibly get, are the leading architects of Baltimore. Most of them were burned out of comfortable offices and with few materials, but with increasing forces these men are preparing for the busiest season in their business careers.

A few architects saved some of the plans made for new buildings, and these are being placed on the market for estimates, or are being hastily completed in order that work on them may proceed before the rebuilding of the business begins in real earnest.

Many buildings being contemplated outside of the business district and over which the prospective owners have hesitated, will go ahead with all speed possible, and architects have been commissioned to prepare or complete plans which were checked last spring because of the uncertainty of conditions in the labor market.

Most of the building, which is going ahead at present is being done on a basis of percentage as the uncertainty of prices in building material makes it impossible to figure accurately on contracts.

A representative of the Record and Guide saw this week at the office of the Roebling Construction Co. many photographs of the Baltimore ruins. Space will not permit a more detailed reference, but it can be said that there is abundant proof that Roebling freproof construction fulfilled its mission. In the National Union Bank, which had Roebling floors and partitions, only the plastering is injured; the floors, furring and lathing are absolutely intact. The National Bank of Commerce, the Commercial and Farmers' Bank and other buildings tell the same story that Roebling construction is a complete protection. In one case a Roebling floor stood the shock of all the floors above falling on it.

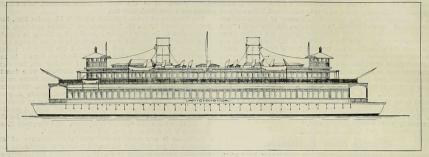
—The Board of Estimate will grant a hearing on March 11 in the matter of laying out as a public park the property bounded by Remsen, Joralemon and Furman sts and a proposed extension of Columbia place, in Brooklyn. Four petitions and one protest have been filed. The proposed park would include two large detached residences, occupying spacious grounds, while the frontage on Remsen and Joralemon sts and a portion of that on Furman st is solidly built up. The assessed value of the property which would be taken is \$349,000. The site is a commanding one, but the foreground is occupied by large warehouses of the New York Dock Company. Mr. Lewis, the chief engineer of the Board of Estimate, believes the advantages could be secured much more cheaply on a site south of Atlantic av, and where the need of such a breathing place is greater.

Plans for Staten Island Ferryboats

Largest Passenger and Team Traffic Capacity Authority Granted to Advertise for Bids.

Dock Commissioner Maurice Featherson has received authority to invite bids for constructing five boats, to be used for the first municipal ferry of the city of New York, plans for which call for steamers that will make the fastest trips and maintain an efficient service for the Staten Island people, such as the Mayor desires. The plans were approved and passed upon by the Sinking Fund Commission, and Col. E. A. Stevens, consulting engineer, on Feb. 15, being in accordance with the report by the

ideal relative position for engines and boilers has never before been secured in ferryboats, consequently smokestacks have not hitherto been placed where they ought to be. On the new boats the stacks will be on a fore and aft line equally distant from the pilot houses and the ends of the respective vessels. Some surprise will be occasioned by the announcement that the new boats will not have twin screws, but naval architects have learned that the twin screw was a step backward, in ferryboats at least, and are

Dock Commissioner, stating that these were the best boats that could be built for this service. The plans and specifications were prepared for the Department of Docks and Ferries by Cary, Smith & Ferris, of 92 Wall st.

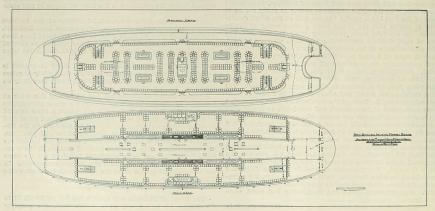
The boats will be 207 feet long, 70 feet beam over guards, 50 feet breadth of hull and 13.6 feet draught of water. They are to be of the two-screw, single shaft propelling type, equipped with high power triple expansion engines and efficient steaming boilers of the water-tube type, and they will be the largest and highest speed ferryboats in service in New York harbor, and will have the largest passenger and team traffic capacity ever yet afforded for ferry service.

In order to maintain the high efficiency for running service, the boats will be expensive, owing to their thorough construction

returning to previous principles. The latest ferries in the harbor, namely, the West Shore Rallroad's "Syracuse" and "West Point," and the Pennsylvania's "Newark" have but two screws. The new vessels will have immense cabins, with windows so arranged as to give an unobstructed view for passengers. The estimated cost of each vessel is \$370,000, but there is an opinion that it will foot up to \$400,000 apiece. Chief Engineer Bensel of the Dock Department has charge of the matter.

In this connection it may be stated that plans for the Staten Island ferry terminal buildings await final action, but it is understood that those to be submitted by Commissioner Featherson will be less expensive than the plans approved by his predecessor. Mr. Featherson also has the plans for the municalization of the South Brooklyn ferry to consider, and now that

for safety and highly efficient propelling machinery; otherwise strictly business boats, and while the interior for passenger accommodations will be pleasing in appearance and neatly arranged, the plans and specifications eliminate unnecessary decoration and frills.

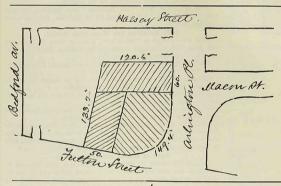

No widening will be necessary on the Bronx side, but the city will purchase land therefor construction purposes. The widening of 207th st is to extend from River st to Ninth av. A hearing on the matter is set for March 11, before the Board of Estimate.

The eighth annual dinner of the Real Estate Board of Brokers will be held at Waldorf-Astoria on Saturady, February 27, at seven p. m. Among those who have accepted and are expected to speak are Corporation Counsel Delany, Tenement House Commissioner Thomas C. T. Crain, Police Commissioner William McAdoo, Lawson Purdy, Edgar J. Levey of the Title Insurance Co., and Charles O. Maas; others who are expected to be present are Edward M. Grout, Comptroller of the City of New York, Frank A. O'Donnell, President Tax Department, Justice J. J. O'Gorman of the Supreme Court, Wm. Barclay Parsons and Clinton W. Sweet of the Record and Guide.

A Big Statement.

The annual statement of the Equitable is out, and will be read with close attention by all interested in the progress of this the yeungest but strongest of the big life companies. The present statement is the forty-fourth annual one, and the last preceding the forty-fifth anniversary, of the Society's organization, which will occur this year.

Large increases are shown in different items, and all the amcunts are stupendous when the length of time in which they have been accumulated is considered. The outstanding insurance amounts to \$1,409,918,742 and is larger than at the end of 1902 by \$117,472,147. This is the largest increase ever secured by the Society in any year. The new business issued amounts to \$322,-047,908, an increase over the largest amount previously written of \$40,708,024.

The assets are sound and conservative investments, and in amount are much larger than any other company possessed prior to its forty-fifth year. The amount is \$381,226,035.53, and the

increase during 1903 was \$21,830,497.81. The surplus amounting to \$73,354,138.03, is many millions larger than the surplus of any other company.

Income from premiums of \$58,637,889.63, from all sources \$73,-718,350.93, dividends amounting to \$5,682,295.55, and total payments to policyholders of \$34,949,672.27 are each larger than any previous time in the history of the Society. The total dividends and total payments to policyholders are larger than any other company has ever paid in a single year to its members.

Temporary School Buildings.

The locations, in parks, where the Committee on Sites of the Board of Education recommend that temporary school buildings be erected include Mulberry Bend Park, Seward Park, Hamilton Fish Park and Corlears Hook Park. It is proposed for the lastnamed to erect a series of temporary buildings on the easterly portion of the land,, to contain 64 rooms. In Hamilton Fish Park it is proposed to put up a building to contain 24 rooms, and in Seward Park a 15-room school building. In regard to the space under the Williamsburgh Bridge approach, the committee have plans for building a permanent school thehe, but the incomplete condition of the bridge structure has thus far prevented a decision in regard to the school plans. But as there is urgent need for temporary relief in that particular locality, the committee recommend that, if the Department of Bridges deem it safe so to do, that temporary schools be erected on the blocks between Mangin and Columbia streets, underneath the bridge. This would give from six to eight rooms on each block.

In School District No. 16 it is proposed to erect a 10-room building on hired ground; several pieces being suitably located, In District No. 17 it is proposed to erect a 10-room temporary building in the neighborhood of Public School 168, on hired land, and somewhere in the west end of the district it is proposed to erect a 20-room temporary building. At the lower end of District 19 it is recommended that a temporary school be erected. As there are no vacant lots near School 57, in District 20, it is urged by the committee that a permanent addition to the school by proceeded with immediately. In a number of districts of Brookyn and Queens it is also recommended that temporary schools be erected.

The construction proposed is to be of frame in those portions of the City where such be permissible, but within the fire limits it will be necessary to use brick exterior walls. All of the buildings to be one story in height, with the first floor lifted well up off the ground, so as to afford ample ventilation beneath. In carrying out the proposed scheme it will be necessary to obtain some concessions from the Bureau of Buildings in the several Boroughs, but as each has discretionary power in such matters, but little trouble is anticipated on this point.

Property Needed for Bridge Terminal Improvements.

The new administration in the Department of Bridges is bringing forward a new set of plans to relieve the crush at the Manhattan entrance of the Brooklyn Bridge and enlarge the terminal. For this the Commission needs the blocks indicated in the accompanying map. The boundaries of four of the



blocks are described as follows: Centre st on the west, Tryon row on the south, Park row on the east and Duane st on the north and the east, Also, a small block bounded by Centre st, Park st and Pearl st; the block bounded by Park row, the Brook-lyn Bridge property and North William st, and small parcels of land on the south side of Duane st, between City Hall place and Park st and in Centre st, between Pearl st and Worth st.

A large terminal is to be constructed, extending along Centre st to Duane st, 140 feet wide, and a steel structure will be built to carry four tracks up Centre st to Worth st, with adequate provisions for switches. The assessed valuation of the property required is \$8,800,000.

Sale of a Historic Foundry.

J. Clarence Davies has sold for Henry E. Janes, to Thomas H. Butler, the former Janes & Kirtland Iron Foundry, on the south side of Westchester av, 100 ft east of Brook av, and running through to 150th st, being 210 ft on Westchester av, 102 ft on 150th st, and about 340 ft on the Port Morris Branch of the New York Central Railroad, about 15 lots in area, with the old foundry building. It was in this foundry the entire dome of the

Capitol at Washington was cast, also many of the bridges and castings for the Mall in Central Park, the outside iron for the Congressional Library in Washington, and during the Civil War, when it was expected that the rebels would take Washington, the iron shutters and doors were made on a week's notice for the capitol, so as to help fortify the building against attack, and many other castings of noted structures were made in the old foundry.

Building Operations.

Manufacturing.

The Goubert Manufacturing Co., S5 Liberty st, New York, manufacturers of feed water heaters, Augustus A. Goubert, president, which will build a large plant at Bergen Point, Bayonne, N. J., to cost between \$450,000 and \$500,000, have not yet selected an architect.

Automobile House for Andrew Carnegie.

Whitfield & King, 160 5th av, have prepared plans and are receiving bids for the erection of a 3-sty Harvard pressed brick and white marble automobile house, 25x30, with a 2-sty extension, 25x42, to be erected at No. 55 East 90th st, for Andrew Carnegle, of No. 2 East 91st st. Plans call for a fireproof structure in the Colonial style of architecture, steel frame, tile root, steam heat and electric light, the upper stories will be fitted up as living apartments for the employees. On the lower floor will be a storage, lined with white enameled brick, paved with red acid-prot brick. The estimated cost is placed at \$20,000.

Ovington Bros. to Build.

5TH AV.—Ovington Bros. Co. china dealers, 330 5th av., will erect a building on a plot 24.8½x100 at 314 Fifth av, adjoining the southwest corner of 32d st. Competitive plans are now under way, but no choice of an architect or of plans has been made. Possession of the property, now occupied by a 5-sty building, will be taken May 1st, when work upon the new building will begin. A business structure in this section of Fifth av has ceased long since to be a novelty. It will be recalled that Henry Corn is to erect a large mercantile structure on the corner north, the northeast corner of Fifth av and 32d st. plans for which are in preparation in the office of Robert Maynicke, 725-27 Broadway.

Foundations for Trinity Building.

The Foundation & Contracting Co., Franklin Remington, president, 35 Nassau st, have received the contract for the complete foundation work of the new Trinity building, at 111 Broadway. The foundation plan includes 50 calssons, which will have to be sunk by the pneumatic process. Of these 18 will be steel and the balance wood. The depth of the rock at this point is about 85 feet below curb. The material overlaying the rock is quicksand. These probably will be the deepest foundations ever put down in New York. The architect of the building is Mr. Francis H. Kimball; the engineer is Mr. S. C. Weiskopf; the general builder, the George A. Fuller Co. The same company has also received the contract for the excavation and foundation work for the twelve-story apartment house which is to be put up at the corner of 89th st and Central Park West. The owner is Mr. Peter Banner, 648 Broadway, and the architect Robert T. Lyons, 31 Union square.

Broadway Apartment Hotel.

BROADWAY .- The southwest corner of Broadway and 61st st will be improved with a 12-sty apartment hotel from plans by Mulliken & Moeller, 7 East 42d st. work to begin in the spring. The plot measures 81.6 in 61st st, 87.21/2 on Broadway and has a depth of 125.4 on its southern line. The U. S. Realty & Construction Co., 137 Broadway, sold the plot with a building loan to the Jermyn Realty Co, organized by Walter Jermyn of Scranton, Pa., and including Robert S. Finney and H. S. Houpt. The U. S. Realty & Construction Co. are to build a theatre on the northwest corner of Broadway and 62d st adjoining the Empire Ho-The theatre will not occupy the actual corner, however, that being reserved for a future improvement by them. Further, on the southeast corner of Broadway and 69th st a 12-sty apartment house has already been started for the Spencer Realty Co. from plans by Mulliken & Moeller, and it has been announced that the southeast corner of Broadway and 57th st is to be improved with a similar structure, plans having been prepared by Charles E. Park of Boston.

Publishing House to Move.

7TH AV.—Street & Smith, publishers, 238 William st, may erect a new printing plant on a plot 125x105 feet at the north-cast corner of 7th av and 15th st. Henry F. Kilburn, 156 5th av. is preparing plans. This is the second attempt of this company to remove from their old downtown location. In June of last year they purchased a site on East 33d st, on the line of

the Pennsylvania tunnel and had plans for an 11-sty building prepared by Mr. Kilburn, but the scheme was subsequently abandoned. For many years the vicinity of the post office was the center of the printing industry, but gradually the firms exattered and may now be found in various sections of the city. The Journal will move to the Grand Circle, the Times to Long Acre Sq. the Herald gave its name to the so-called square at 34th st and Broadway, and along lower 5th av may be read the names of many publishing firms. This new site of Street & Smith on 7th av is directly in line with the Pennsylvania terminal, having easy and short transportation to that assured improvement.

Baltimore Work.

Howells & Stokes, of 100 William st, say they will prepare plans and specifications for the new Baltimore Stoke Exchange Building, issue all contracts for its construction and superintend the work. The members of the stock exchange have formed the Baltimore Stoke Exchange Building Co., Francis T, Redwood, president, with offices in the temporary quarters of the exchange in the Hotel Stratford. The new building will occupy a plot 50x ST, on German st, near the Continental Trust Building and the Maryland Building, in the centre of the business section. The structure will be seven stories high and so planned that two more may be ultimately added. The exchange will utilize three stories and the upper four will be devoted to offices. The main facade will be of limestone in a classic style, an architectural order extending through its height. The other fronts, facing alleys, will be of brick. The construction will be of the most approved fireproof type, following the New York building code. If terra cotta is used to protect the steel columns it will be wired. All details have not been settled, Plans will be ready for figures on Saturday, Feb. 20, and the building is expected to reach completion by Sept. 1.

Jacob Rothschild to Build on Fifth Avenue.

57H AV.—An 11-sty loft building will be built on the southeast corner of 5th av and 16th st by Jacob Rothschild of the Hotel Majestic, from plans by Albert S. Gottlieb, of 156 5th av. The new building will cover a plot with a frontage of 38.6 on the avenue, 159 feet in the street with a southerly "L" 64.9x30, along the westerly line of which runs a narrow restricted strip; the plot including Nos. 2 and 4 Past 16th st. The floor space is over 8,000 sq. feet. The exterior will be faced with stone, through three stories, the superstructure with brick. It is to be a typical modern loft building, thoroughly fireproof, and furnished throughout with modern improvements. There will be twe freight and two passenger elevators. Wire glass will be twe freight and two passenger elevators. Wire glass will be used for the rear windows. A particular feature will be the lighting, each floor being an open loft, having windows on the avenue, in the street and along the west side of the "L." The plot was long the site of a 4-sty brick dwelling owned by the Parish estate and now being demolished by Byron W. Greene, L.T., Co., Av B and 18th st. The work of constructing the new loft will be let in separate contracts, the architect receiving all figures

Government Work.

The contract for the construction of piers 2 and 3 at the League Island navy yard has been awarded to Snare & Triest, of New York, at \$114,800.

Bids will be received at the office of the Supervising Architect at Washington, until 3 o'clock p. m. on the 16th day of February, 1904, and then opened, for the U. S. Post Office Building, Atlantic City, N. J.

The only bid received for the construction of the dry dock at the New York navy yard, that of R. G. Packard, has been rejected as excessive in amount and the plans and specifications will be revised so as to bring the design within the amount available, although it is still believed by the civil engineers that their original estimates which were within the appropriation are accurate and that had there been competition it would have been possible to accept a bid within the sum allotted. The specifications will be changed by the reduction of the sheet piling and other details of construction which will not impair the efficiency of the dock, the length of which may be lessened slightly. New bids will be invited in two or three weeks.

NAVY YARD.—The House Naval Committee has been far from liberal this year in its treatment of the Brooklyn navy yard. Only \$400,000 is allowed, the items being as follows: Prison on Cob Dock, \$50,000; paving and grading, \$10,000; railroad system, extensions, \$10,000; celectric plant, extensions, \$20,000; tools

for yards and docks, \$2,000; railroad equipment, \$10,000; cranes, \$7,500; underground conduits, \$30,000; sewers and drains, \$6,000; commandant's quarters, additions, \$4,500; locomotive and car shed, extensions, \$5,000; heating systems, extensions, \$10,000; latrines, additional \$4,000; extension of Building No. 10, \$2,500; granite and concrete dry dock, to continue, \$200,000.

New School for the Lower East Side.

Public School No. 66, which is to be erected on a plot 149.111/2 wide running through the block from East 3d to East 4th st, 212.11 east of First av, will have some interesting features, though it is to be but 4 stories high. The exterior is designed in adaptation of the Jacobean, and will be constructed of dark red brick, with gray stone and terra cotta trimmings. In the basement there will be an auditorium 83 feet wide by 109 feet long, the size being greatly in excess of any which could be obtained in the school building proper, and is the result of an effort made to afford a proper assembly room for the school and at the same time have it easily accessible to the general public. The first story will contain the Principal's office, library, one classroom, one kindergarten room, indoor playrooms, pupils' toilets, etc. The second, third and fourth stories will contain 16 classrooms each, a total of 48 classrooms, one of which on the upper floor has been set aside for a cooking room, having been made 28 feet square, with tile wainscoting seven feet high and terrazzo floor. The building will be supplied with eight stairways built of stone and iron, enclosed in fireproof partitions, the whole structure being of standard fireproof construction throughout. All walls will be laid up with cement mortar, the floor system consisting of steel beams and brick arches.

They have excellent locations for this purpose, being nearer to the building section of East New York than any one in their line, and in a central position to reach all points of Brooklyn quickly. To facilitate deliveries in the New Utrecht and Flatbush sections, they have also opened yards at Parkville. For out-of-town orders on Long Island they maintain that their con venience to the Long Island R. R. Station gives them a great advantage in making quick shipments. The recent cold weather according to their statement, greatly increased the sale of their plaster boards. Plastering on their board requires much less water than plastering on wooden lath, and so they claim as one of the many advantages of the "Duffy" Plaster Board that it saves time and coal bills, particularly in winter.

Legislative Digest.

A bill introduced in the Assembly by Mr. Callahan (introductory number 562) amends Title 2 of Chapter 17 of the Code of Civil Procedure relating to summary proceedings for the possession of real property, to the effect that when a copy of a petition praying for judgment for the amount alleged to be due from the tenant has been personally served with the precept, and the final order is in favor of the petitioner, then the court must award the petitioner, in addition to possession of the premises, judgment against the tenant for the amount alleged to be due, or proved upon the trial.

A bill in the Assembly by Mr. Monroe, (No. 570) provides that a statement of all exempt property shall be furnished to the State Board of Tax Commissioners upon blanks furnished by them. These lists shall be tabulated and published in cities in the official newspapers and the state board shall report the exempt real property to the Legislature. Lists shall be furnished on or before August 1 of each year. Reports shall be made on or before February 1 in each year.

Mr. A. E. Davis has introduced a bill (No. 572) to ratify the opening and extending of a new street (although not yet named by proper authority) to extend from Chambers street to Reade street in the Sixth Ward of the City of New York and to provide that the total cost of the acquisition of the said land shall be borne by the City of New York.

The act to amend the Greater New York charter, in relation to buildings in the City of New York, introduced by Mr. Adams, January 26, and referred to the Cities Committee has been amended to make it apply to projections of not more than six, instead of ten inches.

An act (introductory No. 380) has been introduced in the Senate by Mr. Elsberg, providing that where the grade of any street in New York has been changed to conform to the construction of the new East River Bridge, the Board of Assessors may allow damages to each owner of land fronting on such streets, sustained to improvements by reason of such change of grade. No award shall be made unless the improvements have been erected prior to such change of grade, and the damages allowed shall be limited to damages to such buildings or improvements.

To prevent fire insurance companies from entering into or maintaining pools, trusts, conspiracies or agreements, to control rates of insurance, was introduced in the Assembly by Mr. Nye on Feb. 16.

Any company entering into an agreement to regulate the price of fire insurance shall be deemed guilty of a conspiracy to defraud; shall forfeit its right to do business in this state, and be liable to a fine of not less than \$250 nor more than \$1,000. Persons violating this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor. The Superintendent of Insurance on July 1 of each

year shall inquire by letter from each insurance company whether they are parties of any such agreement, and require an answer under oath before the following 30th day of September. He shall also proceed against any corporation violating this section to annul its charter. It is laid down by the courts that the state may regulate the business of insurance companies to the smallest detail, but it is a question whether the state will do so in this instance.

Senator Hawkins has introduced a bill giving the Tenement House Commissioner authority to remit fines or penalties imposed for violations, providing the violations have been remedied.

Brooklyn Builders Dine.

An event of interest to operators took place Tuesday evening Feb. 16, when the annual dinner of the Brooklyn Builders' Association was held at the Montauk Club. Former Superintendent of Buildings William M. Calder presided and among the speakers were former Borough President J. Edward Swanstrom and Superintendent of Buildings Peter J. Collins. Mr. Calder was recently elected president of the Builders' Association. The other officers chosen with him were: Frederick W. Rowe, first vice-president; Frank Singer, second vice-president; Thomas Martin, treasurer, and John McGilligan, secretary.

Former Superintendent of Buildings William C. Calder opened his remarks by saying that not until the past year had an organization of Brooklyn builders been formed by a few energetic persons and that the spirit of co-operation and friendship had done more than anything else which could be accomplished. Then Mr. Calder read a part of the records of the Building Department, saying that during the past year 867 private dwellings at a cost of \$400,000 had been erected; 61 tenement houses at a cost of \$200,000 had been built; 371 brick tenements, 372 public buildings, 1,278 frame dwellings, 139 frame tenements, or a total of 3,999 buildings erected, at an approxi-

mate cost of \$24,000,000.

Mr. Swanstrom said: The enactment of the tenement house law was one of the most humane statutes ever passed in this state. You can readily see its importance to the welfare of two-thirds of the population of the City of New York. The only opposition to the tenement house law was that section which makes compulsory the wholesale remodeling of buildings erected before its passage. It takes enormous amounts of capital and only can be done by big corporations. I think that the state should exempt from taxation upon the capital stock corporations formed for the sole purpose of remodeling oid tenements which do not comply with the law. They should only be obliged to pay the tax upon real estate.

Questions and Answers.

INSURANCE.

To the Editor of The Record and Guide:

A holds a mortgage on a piece of property belonging to B. The insurance on same is payable to A. When insurance is due A notifies B. B tries to have premium reduced, but cannot. A, in the meantime, pays the premium direct to the insurance company. B forwards his check to C, who is his insurance agent. C finds that A has paid the premium and notifies B. B directs C to forward check to A. C replies that he has deposited check, but will forward his check to A. A called on C several times but did not see him. A notified B. B answered that he had paid insurance, and could not be held. Can A hold B and C? Has B actually paid insurance when C, his agent, has not paid insurance or has not compiled with B's request?

Answer.—Mortgagee has a right to maintain the insurance, protecting his mortgage, and in event of renewal not being furnished him, to pay for same, to be collected by him from mortgagor direct without having to pursue the mortgagor's agents for

its repayment.

THREE IMPORTANT ONES.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

(a) If lease negotiated by a broker for any term contains a privilege for the tenant to renew at expiration, and said tenant (without the broker) does renew under said privilege, is the broker entitled to a commission on said renewal, and, if so, on the basis of a new rental, or on the continuation of the old rental? (b) If a lease contains privilege to purchase, is the broker who negotiated the lease entitled to commission on the sale if the tenant buys under said privilege regardless of whether the broker does anything after execution of lease or not? (c) If only one bill "For Sale" is displayed on a building, and it can be proven that a purchaser was attracted to the building by said bill, and he buys direct from the owner, is the agent whose bill was displayed entitled to commission on the sale?

Answer.—(a) Yes, as a continuation of the old rental. (b) Yes, we think so. (c) Yes; this is why so many owners are refusing to allow agents to put bills on their houses.

LEASES.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

(1) Will you state whether leases are usually recorded by the landlord or by the tenant? (2) Will you state also what effect a recorded lease may have should it be desired to procure a mortgage on the property leased? (3) Also, to what extent the tenant is protected by reason of the lease being a matter of record? (4) Also, whether leases may be invalidated through foreclosure of a mortgage? (5) Would an unrecorded ten year lease be binding upon the purchaser of the leased property?

Answer.—Leases for three years and over should be recorded in order to protect the lessees from purchasers, mortgages, other leases, etc. (1) Usually recorded by tenant. (2) The mortgage would then be subject to the lease, and unless the lease is in its rent and terms desirable, it might affect the procurrence of a mortgage. (3) Tenant who records lease is protected from after recorded deeds, leases, mortgages and other instruments of record. (4) The mortgage would be foreclosed and the premises sold subject to the lease, the purchaser at the foreclosure sale taking the premises subject to the terms of the recorded lease. (5) Not without notice of the lease brought home to the purchaser or which he could ascertain from inspection of premises.

Answer. — The existing building ordinance of Baltimore, adopted in 1892, with some amendments since that date, scarce-ly refers to fireproof building construction. The usual outside fireproof shutters and doors are required on the openings of store and warehouse buildings when the same do not open on the street, subject to the approval of the fire underwriters.
