OME outside buying came into the Stock Market at the close of the week as a response to reports of a better understanding among anthracite producers, new alliances or combinations in the railroad world looking to economy of management and some other features from which favorable deductions might be drawn. But it is not reasonable to suppose that a new bull movement can be started so soon after one, the greatest in the history of the street, has closed. It is always the case that particular securities move in a direction contrary to the general movement and this is likely to be more marked now at a period of reviving industrial and commercial activity than ever before, but the general tendency is and will be downward until the liquidation that naturally follows an extended speculative movement has run its course and prepared a proper foundation for a new advance. A fact that is likely to have a particular effect on railroad securities is the large proportion of the increased earnings now being reported that must be used to improve the plant of the companies. The annual report of the Pennsylvania Railroad just issued shows this conspicuously. On the eastern lines the increase in operating expenses was greater than the increase in gross earnings, and on the western lines the cost of operating practically absorbed all the gain in gross earnings. Pennsy, as it is called among railroad men, stands for the best railroad management this country can produce, and its example will be followed by other properties of reputation. It is noticeable, too, that a further reduction in the average ton-mile rate on freight is reported by this road, showing the apparent impossibility of keeping up rates under the system of unrestricted competition which has been forced upon the railroads by the law as last interpreted by the Supreme Court. What makes this most aggravating is that it would require such a very small contribution from the travelling and shipping public on the immense bulk of travel and freight that the country affords, to wholly change for the better the railroad situation. This contribution could be gained under authority to pool rates, and as an economic proposition to benefit the country as a whole, deserves consideration. This week the holders of St. Paul common have felt disappointment because the half-yearly dividend was not increased above the 21/2% it has lately been customary to pay, but the directors who decided to retain a good surplus in preference to increasing the dividend were moved to do so by the knowledge their experience must have taught them, that prosperity does not endure forever, and that its period is the one in which to put their property in a state of complete efficiency. They know also, and the knowledge doubtless had its proper influence in determining the amount of dividend, the uncertainties of the rate situation.

NOTHER catch phrase has been added to the political cant of the times in "the embodiment of the feelings of a peaceful, determined nation," of which Mr. Goschen, the British Chancellor of the Exchequer, is the author, and which he manufactured to explain the increased naval vote asked for from the House of Commons. Verbally, the difference is very great, but essentially it means just the same good old plan "that those shall take who have the power, and those shall keep who can." However, the new phrase pleased the audience it was addressed to, and now another huge addition will be piled on Britain's naval armament. Taken in connection with the news from China of another Russo-British clash there, it would seem to be anything but a peaceful measure, though determined enough in all conscience, if experience did not assure us that war is very unlikely, though the mailed fist may be very much in evidence in the next week or two-especially in the newspapers. Until one of the two great dominating powers at odds in China has been successful in its policy, these outbreaks are sure to occur with tolerable regularity and just as regularly alarm business circles. Next to foreign political complications the probabilities

of the money market form the most influential factor in the European business situation. Given the rule that cheap money is necessary to a continuance of the commercial prosperity that has been almost uninterrupted for six years, these probabilities point to a reaction, if not to a setback. Although only at the opening of the active season, money is already tightening in London, and Berlin may still be regarded with some anxiety. In the latter place relief is expected from the new banking bill, but the Reichstag is proceeding very deliberately with that measure, and the Imperial Bank has made reductions in its abnormally high rates of the winter with the utmost care and conservatism, as if it feared a recurrence of the stringency suffered for a good part of last year, and which will surely ensue on a failure of the Reichstag to pass the bill mentioned. The sudden decline in the British governmental receipts must also be taken into consideration in a review of the business situation. For the first three-quarters of the fiscal year there was a considerable surplus, but now with only half a month to complete the year the deficiency runs into millions, and this with the increased expenditures for the coming year makes heavy additional taxation necessary. The sources of decline, too, indicate relaxed manufacturing and commercial energy. According to a recent dispatch there was a decline of \$7,000,000 in customs, \$12,000,000 in excise and \$24,000,000 in receipts of income tax. Up to this time the increases in the naval budgets have stimulated business, in fact, the prosperous business Britain has experienced took its first impetus from government expenditures for new ships, but up to now these expenditures have been accompanied by surpluses, and it remains to be seen if their effect will be as satisfactory with the revenue falling off and the Chancellor of the Exchequer having to work to provide means that previously came spontaneously. An increase of burden on a body that is losing strength may not have satisfactory consequences.

WORTHLESS BONDS TO DISCHARGE MECHANIC'S LIENS.

T appears that the state of affairs which existed a few years ago in this City in respect to the discharge of mechanic's liens by giving bonds with worthless sureties again prevails to an extent which calls for great caution on the part of material men who may file mechanic's liens, and to whom such bonds may be presented. It is stated by those who are familiar with such matters that there appears to be practically no difficulty in finding individuals of no pecuniary responsibility whatever who make it a practice to become sureties upon such undertakings, and who for a consideration of from \$15 to \$25 execute bonds to discharge mechanic's liens, swearing to their sufficiency as such sureties and making cath to the ownership of real estate which they either do not own at all or else the mere title to which, after the property has been mortgaged for all that it is worth, has been transferred to them in order that they may become sureties for a consideration.

Owing to this scandalous practice material men, who have occasion to file mechanic's liens to secure moneys due them, are not only subjected to the uncertainty which attaches to any bond or undertaking executed by individuals who, though no fault of their own or through business reverses, may lose property of which they are possessed at the time of the execution of the bond, and be unable to respond when called upon to pay a judgment at the end of litigation in respect to the lien; but also are too frequently put to the far greater hazard of having their liens bonded by individuals who are of no financial responsibility at all at the very time of the execution of the bond.

The Mechanic's Lien Act provides that a lien may be discharged by the giving of an undertaking with two or more sufficient sureties, who must be freeholders, in such sum as the court, or a judge thereof, may direct, not less than the amount claimed in the notice of lien and conditioned for the payment of any judgment which may be rendered against the property for the enforcement of the lien; and further provides that the sureties must justify, upon oath, in at least double the sum named in the undertaking; and that after such justification, and upon the approval of the undertaking by the court or judge, an order may be made discharging the lien. In other words, the Mechanic's Lien Act provides that an owner may remove a lien from the real estate upon substituting a good and sufficient bond to secure the lienor for the amount of his claim.

The evils connected with the altogether too common practice of bonding mechanic's liens with worthless sureties have recently been the subject of consideration in the courts of this county, as will be seen by a report on another page, to be followed, it is to be hoped, by action on their part and on the part of the District Attorney to put an end to a shameful practice. At the same time the attention of the material trade is called to this state of affairs in order that lienors may be alert to see that undertak-

ings which may be served upon them for the purpose of bonding liens really furnish the security which they purport to give, and that too much reliance may not be placed upon the fact that two individuals, who give their names and residences, swear that they are freeholders and worth double the amount of the proposed bond. In altogether too many cases such sureties are not of sufficient responsibility to warrant their acceptance, and unless the sureties offered are known, personally or by reputation, to a lienor he should cause them to be investigated in time to raise an objection in court against their approval if they be found irresponsible.

N a timely and well-considered address, President John F. Doyle, at the Board of Brokers' discussion. Doyle, at the Board of Brokers' dinner, last Saturday, dwelt, among other things, on the desirability of a revision of the general property tax. In his picturesque phrase our system of taxation remains substantially the same as it was when the city's popuation was 200,000, when the road to Albany was by stage coach, and when water was still drawn from wells in the City of New York. That is to say, we are living under an antiquated system of taxation that was framed when the wealth of the community was chiefly agricultural, consisting of land and tangible personalty-before the industrial revolution and the era of complex credits had enormously increased the body of intangible personal property. The best authorities are agreed that personalty to-day equals, if it does not exceed, realty in value. Nevertheless, about eight-tenths of the burden of taxation is borne by real estate. Personal property, so far as it is intangible, escapes the detection of the tax gatherer. Furthermore, economic necessity has compelled the legal exemption of whole classes of personalty, as imported merchandise in original packages. United States bonds, notes, checks, and certificates, property in transitu, goods produced in another State and sent on commission, deposits in savings banks, etc.; and these exemptions facilitate fraudulent evasion on the part of property legally taxable, so that, according to the saying cited by ex-Tax Commissioner Wells, on Saturday, nobody pays the personal property tax except estates, widows and orphans, and damphools. As early as 1832 the New York City Comptroller complained that "a portion of our business population escapes enrollment on our tax lists." The State Comptroller made a similar complaint in 1849, and since then numerous financial officers, State and municipal, have called attention to the impossibility of reaching more than a mere fraction of the taxable personalty. Four special State tax commissioners here denounced the personal property tax as they found it, namely, the commissioners of 1861, 1871, 1881 and 1893. Nevertheless, this fiscal anomaly remains, not only in New York, but in the other American commonwealths, although it has long since been abolished in Great Britain, France, Belgium, Prussia, Holland, and other commercial states. That the general property tax has been allowed to exist to the present day in the great commonwealth of New York, despite the fact that a generation and more of experience has demonstrated it to be unscientific, hopelessly outgrown, and shamefully unjust, can be explained only on the assumption that the public schools have neglected to instruct our youth in the fundamental principles of taxation, with which every intelligent voter in a representative democracy should be familiar. It is to be hoped, on the ground of expedience and justice, that the Board of Brokers will follow up the suggestion of President Doyle to secure the appointment of a new legislative commission to investigate the existing tax law, with a view to the substitution of a rational system of taxation. Indeed, the board might well consider the idea, struck out by Hon. Alfred at. Conkling, of submitting to the legislature a bill of its own drafting, for such a measure would be morally sure of the undivided support of at least one interested body which would know how to make its influence felt at

HERE exists in London at the present time a very extraordinary state of things, namely, that with neither wages, materials or land abnormally high, there is a dearth of tenements amounting almost to famine. This is the more remarkable because London is the primary home of the improved dwelling for the working classes, except that we asume, as is undoubtedly the fact, that the agitation for this form of improvement has been carried beyond the true economical point. It is this consideration that makes the condition of industrial housing in London of peculiar interest to us in New York, where the philanthropic demand for better homes for the poor is each year being pressed with more insistence, and sometimes without regard to those economical principles that make the production of any kind of housing, cheap or dear, possible. Since the public authorities began putting up tenements for the laboring classes of the British metropolis, private capital has withdrawn from

that particular field of enterprise, and even the great combinations of business and philanthropy, like the Peabody Trust and the Waterloo Company, have, we believe we are right in saying, transferred their efforts to suburban sections, so that the supply of new housing for the working classes has correspondingly lessened. Another cause for this state of things is the building requirements prescribed either by public example or precept embodied in the law. Capital has further been confirmed in its refusal to exploit the field of tenement construction by the agitation in popularistic circles to secure the provision by the public authorities of homes for the poor to meet their limited ability to pay rent rather than to obtain a return upon the cost. In a country like Great Britain that limits socialistic progress to the economo-commercial stage, this agitation is, of course, futile, and it only injures those whom it is intended to benefit. It will be seen, therefore, that municipal interference with the housing of the working classes, whether by building at the public cost, or by the enactment of unreasonable building regulations, will do harm instead of good whenever it checks private enterprise in the same direction. It should also be borne in mind that rapidlygrowing populations, like those of London and the city of New York, require for their proper housing, annually, an amount of work that neither the municipalities or the philanthropy of the communities can undertake in the present state of things.

A FORGED DEED.

The announcement of the discovery of a forged agreement not to convey or mortgage a certain piece of property, and to secure a note for \$20,000, through the Record and Guide, illustrates once more in a striking manner the value of the legal record of real estate, as published by this paper, and its value to all propertyowners in enabling them to keep informed in regard to their holdings. The story just brought out is, in brief, that Mr. and Mrs. Harry E. Phyfe own No. 38 Dey street and No. 198 Fulton street. About January 1st last, Mrs. Phyfe received from her attorney a copy of the Record and Guide of December 31st (mark the dates), marked on page 1,004, where the following entry appeared under the head of mortgages: "Phyfe, Harry E to H. C. Bennett & Co. Dey st, No. 38, and No. 198 Fulton st. Agreement to secure notes. Dec. 24. 20,000." Mr. Phyfe, when consulted, declared the agreement a forgery, and proceeded to the office of H. C. Bennett & Co., dealers in commercial paper, at No. 56 Wall street, where he examined the note referred to and said it had been forged. The man who is said to have committed the forgery does not seem to have been arrested yet. The point of this story that ought to interest property-owners most directly is, the prompt way in which the wrong-doing was exposed through the Record and Guide, without which serious complications affecting the property mentioned might have arisen before the note matured in June next.

OUR ALBANY LETTER

Albany, March 9.—Legislation for New York made some progress this week, although chiefly in the matter of important bills escaping from committees.

But the Rapid Transit bill is still delayed. There was to have been a hearing on the bill before the Committee on Cities of the Assembly to-day, but Alexander E. Orr, President of the Rapid Transit Commission, asked that this hearing be postponed until next Tuesday, he desiring to be heard that day also by the Senate Committee on Cities on the same measure. The hearing was therefore postponed and thus a precious week of time has been lost in the Assembly. But the Senate Committee on Cities did report the bill favorably yesterday; the Democratic members of the committee, Ahearn, Grady, McCarren and Rice, dissenting. The Committee on Cities of the Senate will listen to Mr. Orr next Tuesday, but, as already stated, the bill is out of their hands.

The bill of Senator Ford and Assemblyman Fallows, which is intended to prevent the Third Avenue Railway Co. from placing its tracks near the curb along Amsterdam avenue, had a queer fortune to-day. Eleven carloads of people from New York, who came here to hear the first debate on the measure in the Senate saw that body refuse to eliminate from it an amendment added last night by the Senate Committee on Railroads, which gives both the Third Avenue and the Metropolitan companies damages if their tracks are disturbed. But in the Assembly they saw the original bill, unamended, pass by a unanimous vote. Whether this is a device to have the two houses have irreconcilable differences, and not pass the bill, cannot now be told.

The Assembly had a long debate to-day over the bill of Mr. Mazet, empowering the Astoria Power, Light and Heat Co. to build a tunnel beneath the East River in which to place gas mains to convey gas from works the Consolidated Gas Co. contemplates constructing in Astoria for the supply of its New York customers. Then the Consolidated company, so stated Mr. Elihu Root here last week, contemplates abolishing all its present gas works in New York.

The Senate Committee on Cities reported favorably to-day Senator Marshall's bill permitting the Long Island Railroad Co. to construct a tunnel from Flatbush avenue, Brooklyn, beneath the East River to Cortlandt street, New York.

The Senate passed this week, after a long debate, Senator Ahearn's bill increasing the salaries of all school teachers in the city. If this bill becomes a law it will add largely to the city's expenses.

Assemblyman Meyer's bill for the establishment of a Board of Notification in the Department of Linance of New York, has been so amended as to apply only to New York.

The Assembly has passed Assemblyman Costello's bill giving the Factory Inspector authority to close "sweat-shops." The bill prohibits the altering, repairing, or finishing of any garments other than those to be subject to a laundry process before being offered for sale in places not licensed by the Factory Inspector for their manufacture.

A hearing was given this week by the Senate Committee on Cities on Senator Grady's bill restricting the use of the Speedway to light vehicles.

The Assembly Committee on Cities has reported favorably Assemblyman De Graw's bill providing that lateral sewers shall be constructed by Sewer Commissioners upon the petition of a majority of the property owners of 30 acres; and Assemblyman Bulkley's bill repealing the law of 1898 requiring iron guards shall be placed before the windows of tenement houses.

The Assembly passed to-day Assemblyman Gherardi Davis' bill cancelling uncollected city taxes, uncollected for a period of ten years.

The Assembly Committee on Taxation reported favorably today Mr. Ware's bill exempting from taxation corporations whose whole capital is invested in improved real estate.

The Assembly passed to-day Assemblyman Gallagher's bill directing the Commissioner of Street Improvements to divide the city into sections to be improved; and Assemblyman Grossmann's bill limiting the compensation of Commissioners of Taxation and Assessment to \$10 a day.

The bills introduced this week, with the names of their movers, and their introductory numbers, are given below:

Senator Munzinger (Intro. No. 740) exempting from taxation the capital stock of incorporated building and mutual loan corporations, co-operative loan associations, corporations formed under the laws of this State for the erection and construction of buildings to the extent of the capital employed in respect to buildings situated in this State.

Assemblyman Fallows (Intro. No. 1185) providing that the iron work of new buildings shall not at any time be set up more than three tiers ahead of the flooring and filling in.

Assemblyman Grossmann (Intro No. 1188) to repeal Sec. 106 Chapter 294 of the laws of 1891. The section repealed provides that an elevated road which has built and operated six-tenths of its route in New York City, may declare relinquished and abandoned any portion of the route which it may deem no longer necessary for the operation of its road. There are 18½ miles of franchises in the Borough of the Bronx which have not been built up. The residents want them annulled, because the roads would run through the centre of the blocks and touch the streets only at the crossings.

Assemblyman Heller (Intro. No. 1133) providing that in the settlement of accounts of an executor nothing in the statute is to be construed to suspend the running of the statute of limitations against a cause of action existing in favor of an executor or administrator as a creditor of his decedent against the heirs, devisees, legatees, or next of kin of such decedent to recover upon an indebtedness existing in favor of such executor or administrator against such decedent pursuant to article two of title three of chapter 15 of this act.

Assemblyman Wilson (Intro. No. 1142) providing that upon the expiration of any existing contract for cleaning the streets in the Borough of Brooklyn, and every three years thereafter, the Commissioner of Street Cleaning is to make a contract for cleaning the streets and removing the ashes.

Assemblyman T. P. Sullivan (Intro. No. 1166) and Senator Sullivan (Intro. No. 749) requiring that goods manufactured wholly or part in tenement houses be labeled "tenement made" in small pica capitals, the label to be four inches long.

Assemblyman A. F. Schmidt (Intro. No. 1177) providing that any person or corporation who shall ask, receive, demand, require or allow any statement, agreement, contract or written instrument or verbal agreement or understanding to be made or executed by any employee to refrain from joining or becoming a member of any labor organization or from withdrawing or severing his connection with a labor organization as a condition of securing employment or continuing in employment, is guilty of a misdemeanor. The maximum penalty is six months' imprisonment and a fine.

Assemblyman Seims (Intro. No. 1213) providing that the fare and toll for every foot-passenger upon the ferries plying between 10th and 23d streets and Greenpoint avenue, Brooklyn, is not to exceed two cents between six and eight o'clock a. m., and one boat is to be run from either side every ten minutes.

Assemblyman Sprague (Intro. No. 1215) amending the tax law to provide that no corporation or association other than a corporation or association organized for cemetery purposes, is to be entitled to exemption from taxes on more than 50 acres of land.

CONDEMNATION PROCEEDINGS.

The report of the Corporation Counsel for the year 1898, Issued this week, contains an important summarized statement of the standing of the principal proceedings for the condemnation of land for public uses from which the following has been taken. Corporation Counsel Whalen states that no special effort has been made to conclude many of these proceedings on account of the debt limit:

Addition to the Speedway, provided for by Chapter 894 of the Laws of 1895. Title vested in the City on the 19th day of January, 1896. The awards are to bear interest at six per cent from that date. The Commissioners have made a partial or preliminary report as to Parcels Nos. 4, 5 and 6, and a hearing for the presentation of objections is being advertised. As to the value of the remaining parcels the case is with the Commissioners, awaiting their preliminary report.

St. Nicholas Park, between 130th and 141st streets, Convent and Amsterdam avenues. Proceeding begun in July, 1894, still pending before the Commissioners of Appraisal. There has been no change in the status of this proceeding during the year.

Colonial Park, between 145th and 155th streets, Bradhurst and Edgecombe avenues. Commissioners have made their preliminary report as to all of the parcels sought to be acquired, and are at present engaged in considering objections for the purpose of making their final report.

Riverside Park Extension (Chapter 152 of the Laws of 1894), includes lands between 72d and 129th streets, westerly of the roadway of the New York Central & Hudson River Railroad Co. Proceeding was begun in 1894. Commissioners have made their first separate report, embracing a number of parcels sought to be acquired, and testimony has also been taken during the year as to the value of the other parcels.

Little Italy Park (Chapter 746 of the Laws of 1894), embraces all of the land on the East River between 111th and 114th streets, east of 1st avenue. As to the water fronts extending from the northerly side of 111th street to the southerly side of 114th street, and bounded on the west by Pleasant avenue, and on the east by the East River, the Commissioners are ready to make their preliminary report. They are also prepared to report as to the remaining property, which is owned by the Consolidated Gas Company.

Fort George Park (876 of the Laws of 1895). Proof as to value on behalf of the property-owners has been completed, and the City is ready to submit its testimony.

Eleventh Ward Park; the proof as to value of part of the property-owners has been completed, and the City's case is ready for presentation to the Commissioners.

West Side Park, bounded by 9th and 10th avenues, 27th and 28th streets. This proceeding was discontinued by resolution of the Board of Public Improvements, adopted March 30, 1898, and the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court has held that the Board possessed the power to discontinue the proceeding.

Division St. Park. Proof as to value on behalf of the claimants has been completed as to two of the three blocks sought to be acquired.

Seventeenth Ward Park or playground, comprising nearly all of the tenement-house block bounded by Houston, Essex, Norfolk and Stanton streets. In this proceeding it was not considered advisable to make a motion for the appointment of Commissioners of Estimate, and, accordingly, such motion was not made.

Twenty-second Ward Park, comprising the two blocks bounded by 11th and 12th avenues, 52d, 53d and 54th streets. Application for the appointment of Commissioners was made and granted, but nothing further done.

College of the City of New York.—During the past year two parcels embraced in the site to be acquired were purchased from the executor of the estate of Ira Shafer, for the sum of \$23,000.

MISCELLANEOUS PROCEEDINGS.

Hall of Records' site, property-owners nearly completed their proof as to values. Armory for 1st Battery of the National Guard, 7 lots on 66th street, between Columbus avenue and Central Park West; city ready to present proof as to value. South Third Avenue Bridge approach, property-owners' proof as to value nearly completed; Lexington avenue approach, commissioners appointed, but no further proceedings taken. New East River Bridge, three proceedings, two in Brooklyn, in one of which title has vested in the city and in one notice has been given of application to confirm report of Commissioners; one in Manhattan, in which property-owners have nearly completed proof as to values. For the Police Department Commissioners have been appointed to acquire title to No. 135 West 30th street, but nothing further has been done.

THE COMMISSION ON BUILDING CODE.

The first public hearing of the Commission on Building Code took place on Monday in the Aldermanic chamber of the City Hall, and was principally, according to the statement of the Chairman, Commissioner Brady, for the purpose of receiving requests for hearings on particular points relating to building construction and law, so that a programme of hearings could be arranged. It was announced that the permanent offices of the Commission were Rooms 728-731, Nos. 13-21 Park row (Ivins Syndicate Building), and communications could be addressed to the Secretary, R. L. Daus, there.

Requests for hearings on particular subjects were made by the following: Isaac J. Brown, President of the Master Plumbers' Association, plumbing, etc.; C. F. McCann, George Hill and others, for fireproofing; J. A. Bensel, Engineer Dock Department, Dock Department buildings: Henry Davidson and L. Viellier. representing the Builders' League of New York, dwellings.and ganization Society, tenements; Clarence True, dwellings; Charles Buek, the necessity of prescribing distinctions between the firstclass apartment houses and the cheap tenements against which the Tenement House Act is specially directed; Judson Lawson, representing the Tenement House Committee of the Charity Orapartment houses; Samuel McMillan, height of non-fireproof buildings; John Donnelly, foundations and construction of apartment houses, hotels, factories and private houses; James J. Daly, representing bricklayers' unions, brick construction and amalgamation of materials.

The Chairman in his opening address stated that as hearings were arranged, the gentlemen wishing to be heard would be noti-Besides the public hearings, there would be private hearings in the office of the Commission. Several gentlemen delivered themselves of their views as to the particular requirements they wished to see in the new code, or as to what the general nature of the code should be.

Geo. L. Morse, representing the Department of Architecture in the Brooklyn Institute, addressed the Commission on these points: First, cumulative loads in tall buildings. He thought in warehouses and storehouses the loads should be cumulative, but that in a tall office building, the rule was unjust and oppressive, and he hoped the new code would have diminishing loads. Second, the capacity of dirt bottom to carry superincumbent loads. The present law limited the load to 1 tons perfoot. That was unnecessarily severe. A good bottom could foot. That was unnecessarily severe. A good bottom could building it was dif-The present law limited the load to 4 tons per square carry a good deal more than 4 tons. In tall buildings it was difficult and expensive to construct a bottom that would comply with the law in this regard. He knew that 4 tons per square foot on the best kind of soil was far below what the soil is capable of carrying without a particle of subsidence. He thought the law should be silent on that question, and that the responsibility of determining the matter should be left to the Building Department.

George Hill addressed the Commission in substance as follows: The building law of New York City, as it stands, has probably been the basis of all building laws of this country. This law has many features of extreme merit; it has also many other features of great demerit. Its principal lack seems to be of harmony between its various provisions, with some well defined fundamental plan. That is to say, we find in one section the greatest latitude given to the Commissioner of Buildings to determine elements of strength, or other important matters relating to the stability of buildings; in other sections most explicit provisions made for

calculations of strains, or for the execution of work. In many cases these explicit provisions are absolutely wrong in the light of present practice. It would seem that the first thing for this commission to do would be to determine on a fundamental, underlying general principle which would govern the formulation of a It is my belief that such a principle would be clearly to define the limits within which fireproof and each other class of construction may be executed; the limits of the heights of buildings of the various classes, the creation of a department for making and enforcing the rules and regulations regarding the erection of buildings, clothing that department with all the necessary power to enforce its rules; and, finally, provide a board of expert advisers, whose duty it should be: First, to pass upon the regulations of the department. Second, to sit as a board of appeal to determine the probable merit or value of new constructions, new material and new methods not covered by the regulations. That board of examiners, it seems to me, should be comprised entirely of members of the American Society of Civil Engineers, with a percentage who are also members of the American Institute of Architects. You would then have a court of last resort composed of men whose entire professional training fitted them to pass upon every one of the different questions involved. The plumbing law covers a few hundred words providing for the registration of plumbers, and giving the Department power to make regulations; these regulations are brought up to date. In regard to matters of light and ventilation, part are embodied in explicit provisions, and subject to constant change and tinkering on the part of those who have a pecuniary interest involved, and part are found in the regulations of the Department. regulations of the Department are good, as applying to general cases, but do not, and cannot, apply to particular cases, and are at times a source of great hardship to owner, builder and architect. The requests for hearings on specific provisions presented here to-day show that it is impossible to construct an explicit law or code dealing with all the thousands of interests involved in the erection of buildings; it must at times fail to cover all of the cases, and either require modification or work great injustice. If, on the other hand, regulations are framed by a body of men specially trained, as the examiners of the Building Department are, which regulations are approved by men of national, and even world-wide reputation, their decisions as to new materials, methods, etc., would be received with respect.

J. W. Moulton presented two subjects that he thought should be treated with detail in the new code. The first was the protection of the iron and steel embedded in masonry from destruction by corrosion; and, the second, the protection of the high building from danger of destruction by fire.

Oscar Lowenson said: I believe the less law there is on the question of our buildings the better it will be. The building arts are progressive; it is an extremely difficult matter to cause a building law to progress. In my opinion, the code ought to specify such matters as are not of a nature that progress, such as the formation of a department, the appointments and arrangements for examining plans and passing upon them, and principally, the establishment of a police system for the purpose of seeing that such laws and regulations as exist are properly carried out.

A hearing was given at Albany by the Senate Committee on Cities, on the Ford bill, to substitute a building code commission to be appointed by the Governor for that recently appointed under authority of the Charter by the Municipal Assembly. In support of the bill there were present Richard Watson Gilder, Anson Phelps Stokes, Alderman Homer Folks, and Lawrence Viellier, secretary of the Tenement House Committee of the Charity Organization Society. The support of the bill was based on a fear that the Commission on Building Code would serve the pecuniary interests of builders too much, and not do sufficient justice to the tenement population of the city.

Opposing the bill there appeared: Charles Buek, Chairman of the Joint Committee on new Building Code: J. Crombie, Judson Lawson, Frank E. Wise, T. C. Edmonds, Lawrence Buckley, J. H. Havens, and John P. Leo, president, from the Builders' League; Samuel McMillan and Moses Ottinger, from the Real Estate Exchange; John Cooper, president, from the Society of Architectural Iron Manufacturers. Mr. Buek, who acted as spokesman for this delegation, presented a memorial recounting the events that led up to the appointment of the Commission on Building Code, from the spontaneous movement in the building trades two years or more ago, to secure the amendment of the building laws; describing the intervention of consolidation, and the Charter provision dealing with the matter of the New York building law as a domestic concern pure and simple, and the agitation begun last year to secure the operation of the Charter provisions in that regard, etc., and, finally, supporting the Commission already in office.

The following resolution, passed by the Brooklyn Chapter of the American Institute of Architects on Feb. 18, was also presented:

Resolved, That in our opinion the Building Code commission, as now constituted, is qualified to codify the Building Laws of the City of New York in a manner to serve the best interests of the community. From assurances given us, we believe that the Commission is desirous and willing to listen to, and to take into account all suggestions presented to it by professional societies of architects and engineers which will

tend to improve the existing building laws. The chapter emphatically disapproves of a building code commission created by the State, as being in direct violation of the home rule principle.

Mr. McMillan and Mr. Leo, on their return to New York, agreed in their opinions, formed after careful and independent canvasses of the situation, that the bill to appoint a new commission had no chance of passing the Legislature.

THE REAL ESTATE BOARD OF BROKERS' DINNER.

The timeliness of the post-prandial discussion at the dinner of the Board of Brokers, last Saturday, is sufficiently attested by the publicity which this, the third annual function of the board, has received in the daily press. The discussion developed the sentiments of a representative body of real estate men on the questions that for the moment most vitally affect realty interests. The public, no doubt, anticipated the resolution in support of the Amsterdam Avenue Anti-Grab Bill, and, possibly, also the endorsement of Senator Ford's bill looking to the taxation of public franchises. But it had no means of divining the prevalent opinion in the board as to the effect of the augmentation of the local tax on the market for real estate. The discussion disposed of all doubt on this head. The fairness of the increased assessments made inevitable by consolidation, and the brightness of the outlook in the real estate market, were the burden of the leading addresses of the evening. A period of advancing values and broadening prosperity was foretold by competent observers, and it was this expression of well-informed opinion as regards the prospect in the realty market, no less than the speech of the president favoring a revision of the personal property tax, which justifies the importance which has been popularly attached to the meeting.

The speakers were President John F. Dovle, Senator John Ford. Thomas G. Shearman, Jefferson M. Levy, Meyer S. Isaacs, and Alfred R. Conkling, The discussion was opened by President Doyle in a paper on Taxation, which read in part as follows: When we consider that the present extraordinary valuations of real estate in Manhattan and the Bronx are the direct result of consolidation, and then look over the levy to see how the valuations have been made, we find that the Commissioners of Taxation have exercised a wise discretion within the law to meet the present exigency. In looking over the tax levy, I find that every commanding and valuable piece of business and residential property in the city has been raised; that theatres, clubs, hotels, apartment houses, gas and electric light companies, and steam and surface railroads have also been raised; that inferior properties have been slightly raised, and that the poorer classes of property in dead sections of the city, already proportionately overtaxed, have been permitted to remain at the assessed valuations of 1898. This is what you see in taking a hurried glance over the tax levy. I do not doubt, however, that the deputies may have erred in certain cases, which may be remedied upon appeal to the Commissioners, but the levy will stand substantially as it is, notwithstanding the public clamor against it.

But although President Doyle saw no good cause for adverse criticism of the local assessments, he suggested that the time was opportune for an attempt to secure a general revision of the tax law. He called attention to the fact that there had been no comprehensive revision for over half a century; the scheme of taxation remaining the same as when the population of New York was 200,000, when the road to Albany was by stage coach, and water in New York was drawn from wells. The following were the lines along which the speakers suggested that the revision should be made: (1) Equality of values of real estate throughout the State—property to be assessed at its market value, as required by law. (2) Cutting off improper and unjust exemptions. It was questionable in his mind whether the line should not be drawn to exclude everything except public property. Were exemptions confined strictly to absolutely charitable institutions, properly conducted, such as asylums for the aged and infirm, and for orphans, hospitals where free treatment is granted to the poor, dispensaries, public libraries, educational institutions and churches without their cemeteries, the exemptions would beinline with the policy of the State, and would meet with universal approbation. (3) Taxing corporations upon their gross earnings, and letting none escape their just and proper share. (4) Amending the personal tax law, or replacing it by a law taxing incomes. If we continue to tax personal property, then let us legally define the word "resident" in order that those who can best afford to part with their surplus revenues may not escape to Newport or Lakewood on pretence that they live and pay taxes there, whilst their time is occupied chiefly in New York City for six months in the year. (5) Placing trust companies in line with the banks; they are competitors of the banks, and their earnings are vastly In conclusion, the speaker uttered a note of warning greater. against the attempts constantly being made in the Legislature to grade the collateral inheritance tax so that "the richer a man may become, the greater shall be the confiscation before his heirs shall enjoy his property." It was a law which never should have been enacted, and should be abolished.

Senator Ford next explained his bill to tax public franchises. The bill, he said, had nothing to do with corporations as such. It was not based on the theory that corporations were undesirable. Private corporations are already overtaxed. Much capital has been driven out of the State by the inconsiderate and injudicious tax on private corporations. It was against public cor-

porations that the bill was aimed. A public corporation has two franchises: (1) The ordinary corporation franchise, or right to transact business under the laws of the State, including, in most instances, the right of eminent domain. This franchise, like that of any private corporation, bears a tax. (2) The public franchise, consisting of a grant from the municipality, by consent of the State, of the right of way in public streets, for the purpose of supplying transportation, water, gas, electricity, etc. This franchise is property-intangible, but real. It is real estate, an incorporeal hereditament. Since the judicial interpretation of 1891, which found that the law does not provide for a tax on public franchises, this species of real property has been exempt from taxation. Mr. Ford's bill merely enlarges the interpretation of the term real estate in the tax law, so as to embrace franchises in the public streets. The right of collecting wharfage and dockage is already included, so that Mr. Ford's bill merely amplifies existing principle of the law. It would be an easy matter, he said, to discover the value of a public franchise. The value of the franchise would be the difference between the market value of the stocks and bonds and the cost of duplicating the plant. If the bill becomes law, said Mr. Ford, it will mean an increased income of many millions of dollars to the city. In Glasgow, he said, not a cent has been raised by taxation in two years, the entire city budget being defrayed by the income from public franchises, which the municipality owns and operates.

Mr. Shearman's brilliant argument in favor of abolishing the tax on personal property was listened to with interest and evident sympathy, eliciting much applause. He took the ground that land alone, including public franchises, should be taxed. Mr. Levy maintained that there is no city in Europe or America where real estate values are so low as in New York, and he foretold a marked and increasing advance in prices during the next ten years. Mr. Wells dwelt chiefly on the desirability of establishing an appraising plant in the Department of Taxes and Assessments, so that the deputy assessors, few of whom are real estate men, might have proper means at hand to assist them in forming an intelligent judgment as to the value of property which they were to assess for taxation.

WAR TAX ON BOND AND MORTGAGE.

The Collector of Internal Revenue at Washington recently received a communication stating that an internal revenue collector had notified the Title Guarantee and Trust Co., of Brooklyn, that a bond given with a real estate mortgage must have affixed thereto a 50 cent stamp, and in addition 2 cents per \$100 of the amount of the bond. The Internal Revenue office had previously decided that a bond secured by a mortgage given by a private person in lieu of a promissory note, was taxable as a promissory note, and not as a bond. An explanation of these inconsistent rulings was asked for.

In reply the Collector stated that the ruling mentioned was the ruling of the office of the Collector of Internal Revenue, until a few days ago, when the Attorney General advised them that a bond secured by a mortgage, said bond and mortgage being executed by a private person, was subject to a tax of 50 cents. Since the rendering of the Attorney General's opinion Congress had passed, and the President had approved, the following amendment to Schedule A, which must be taken into consideration in connection with the ruling of the Attorney General: "When-ever any bond or note shall be secured by a mortgage or deed of trust, but one stamp shall be required to be placed upon such Provided, that the stamp tax placed thereon shall be the highest rate required for said instrument, or either of them." Therefore, when a bond is executed by a private person, and is secured by a mortgage, the tax is 50 cents on the bond. There is no tax accruing on a mortgage if the sum secured does not exceed \$1,000. The tax on a mortgage securing a sum exceeding \$1,000, and not exceeding \$1,500, is 25 cents. Therefore, in any case where a mortgage and bond is given by a private person for a sum not exceeding \$1,500, the greater tax would accrue on the bond, and under the above amendment the bond should be stamped. After the secured sum of \$1,500 is exceeded, and the excess is not greater than \$2,000, the taxation on the bond and on the mortgage is equal, being 50 cents on each instrument.

Whenever the tax is equal, the Department requires that the mortgage, and not the bond, shall be stamped. The instrument that is relieved from taxation under this amendment should have endorsed upon it that the other instrument is duly stamped according to law, as prima facie evidence that the requirements of the law have been complied with.

WORTHLESS MECHANIC'S LIEN BONDS.

Justice Beekman, last Tuesday, in Special Term, Part II, of the Supreme Court, took occasion to express his opinion very strongly in regard to the practice of offering worthless or "straw" bondsmen on undertakings to discharge mechanics' liens, and stated that it was becoming altogether too common in this city, and announced from the bench that he proposed to do what he could to put a stop to it. These remarks of Justice Beekman occurred in the course of the hearing before him in a proceeding upon an application of Emil Green, as owner, to discharge a mechanic's lien filed by Traitel Bros. & Co. against property in East 117th street. Application was made to the Justice to approve an undertaking executed by Green as owner, and Samuel W. Adams and George P. Kinne, as sureties. The application was opposed by Phillips & Avery, attorneys for the lienors, who presented and filed affidavits showing the worthlessness of the sureties, who had justified under oath.

Judge Beekman, after expressing his opinion, sent to the District Attorney's office for a representative, and stated the facts of the case to him, and the representative of the District Attorney said steps would be taken looking toward a prosecution of the proposed bondsmen.

Later Mr. Avery, of the law firm of Phillips & Avery, Tribune Building, this city, attorneys for the lienors in the proceeding before Judge Beekman, told a representative of the Record and Guide that Adams and Kinne had been offered on a previous occasion as sureties on a bond to discharge a mechanic's lien filed by his office, and that an investigation of Kinne at that time had convinced him that he was utterly worthless as a surety, and had shown that he did not live and was not known at the address then given by him; the result of which investigation was that the attorney who offered the bond withdrew it, and that Adams and Kinne did not appear in Court; and that, in consequence of his previous information, after the attempted justification of Adams and Kinne on the undertaking, offered to discharge the lien of Traitel Bros. & Co., he had caused a careful investigation to be made as to the truth of the statements of the sureties on their justification, which had resulted in the filing of the affidavits submitted to Judge Beekman, and in the rejection of the bond by the Court, and the referring of the matter to the District Attorney for action. Mr. Avery stated further that it was a matter of common report that sureties on undertakings to discharge mechanics' liens may be obtained for a nominal consideration, and that it was his experience that it was only by the exercise of the greatest care, and by taking time to make an investigation in each case, that it was possible to prevent many liens from being discharged by undertakings with absolutely worthless sureties, and to avoid imposition upon attorneys and upon the Court. He fully concurred in the statement made by Judge Beekman that the facility with which liens could be bonded with worthless sureties was a practical wiping out of the benefits of the Mechanics' Lien Law in many instances, adding that where no opposition is made to an application to bond a lien the Court has no discretion but must approve the bond.

The condition of the private sales market remains practically the same as last week. The volume of business has been up to the weekly average during the past two months. As a theme for the reviewer, however, the list of transactions is decidedly unplastic, being composed wholly of commonplace items. nattan, elevator flats, and sites adapted to receive this species of improvement, led in the trading, the commodity next in demand being vacant land in Bronx. The feeling in real estate circles is unusually buoyant, being quite as noticeable in the talk of chiefs and subordinates in real estate offices as it was at the Board of Brokers' dinner.

The total number of transactions given below is 68, with considerations given in 11, and amounting to \$480,280; corresponding figures for last week were, 66, 17 and \$2,137,650, respectively.

Excepting the partition sale of the Schrady estate, by William Kennelly, on Wednesday, the offerings in the Real Estate Salesroom this week were exceptionally few in number, and comprised no parcels of more than average interest. Indeed, a majority of the properties belonged to the category of "dead stuff." The inference was natural that auctioneers had, wherever possible, avoided to date sales immediately after the week containing the Jacobs, Moss and Stepenson sales, a week in which the market absorbed over two and a quarter millions of dollars' worth of real estate at auction, besides nearly as much at private sale. This inference was supported by the many important auction

The week in Brooklyn realty has been a good one. Besides dealings in old residential property, there has been a renewal of activity in suburban holdings, and several large farms have changed hands, as set forth below. With the coming of warmer weather, it is anticipated that the outlying wards will prove attractive to the investor and the homeseeker. From now on the renting and sale of houses in these sections should boom.

The character of the auction sales of the week also show encouraging signs. For some weeks the offerings have been largely limited to judicial sales, most of which have gone to the plaintiff. Lately property outside of this class has been sold, and the prices realized have indicated a hopeful condition of the market.

The sale of the C. Kouwenhoven farm to a local syndcate was the important transaction in outlying property made during the week. This farm consists of about 190 acres, and is situated in Flatlands just south of Canarsie Lane. On the south it runs to Paedaergat Basin. Couwenhoven lane forms its westerly boundary, while to the east it runs almost to Bergen Beach. The stated consideration was \$1,200 per acre. This property has quite an interesting history. It has been owned by the Kouwenhoven family for nearly four hundred years and forms a portion of the tract originally acquired by the first Kouwenhoven settler, Wolphert Gerretse (Van Kouwenhoven). According to Dr. Stiles' "History of Kings County," Flatlands was the first settlement in the county, and this tract was the one on which the first settlers located. This was in 1624, and the town of Brooklyn was not settled until 1636.

The last farm fronting on Ocean avenue in the town of Graves-end has been sold to a Boston syndicate by Desmond Dunne and W. G. Gilmore, who purchased the property about a year ago. The farm consists of some 80 acres, with a frontage of 3,000 feet on Ocean avenue, which bounds it on the east. The farm runs from Kings Highway on the north to Avenue U on the south. It consists of about 1,215 lots, and is unimproved. As first announced, the consideration was stated to be \$2,500 per acre. From a trustworthy source, however, it was learned that the figure was \$2,275 per acre, and the terms of the contract allow sixty per cent. of the purchase price to remain on bond and mortgage. It was also learned that the sellers bought this farm for about \$1,525 per acre, which gives them a handsome profit, even at the lower figure. The syndicate is said to be Wood, Harmon

& Co., who have already made large purchases in this section. Although the property is unimproved, transit facilities are furnished by the Nassau Railroad Company, which runs along Ocean avenue. Many of the streets have also been partially improved at private expense. McNulty & Fitzgerald are the brokers in this sale

At the annual meeting of the Borough Park Real Estate Company, held on Monday of this week, the following officers were elected for the ensuing year: President, Wm. H. Reynolds; vice-president, William A. Nash; secretary, Colonel Robert B. Woodward; and treasurer, Thomas T. Barr. This company has now been in existence about a year, during which time the president reports the sale of over one thousand houses. There are about 200 houses now being erected. The Bensonhurst Company, which held its meeting at the same time, elected these officers: President, William H. Reynolds; secretary, William A. Nash; treasurer, Colonel Robert B. Woodward. The Bensonhurst Company was started last September, with the purchase of the holdings of James D. Lynch at Bensonhurst.

As an indication of values in Montague street, a deed recorded this week of three parcels bears \$75 in stamps, showing a total consideration of about \$75,000. These parcels are Nos. 102, 108 and 110, on the south side of the street, between Henry and Hicks streets. Each is a three-story building, on a plot 25x100, and two of them have been altered for business purposes. The third is still used for a dwelling. While too far west of the business centre to serve as offices, houses in this location which have been altered are readily rented to tailors, milliners, etc. A noteworthy fact in regard to this sale is that the purchaser is from Manhattan. Considering the uncertain future of this street, it is difficult to say whether the price paid was high or low. As evidence on this point, it may be said that No. 102, which is next but one to the Pierrepont House, was sold subject to a mortgage of \$14,000, at 5% interest.

The rapidity with which the outlying sections of this borough may be developed, and the large amount of work that development will furnish to contractors and others, may be judged from one item in the plans filed this week, which states that Thos. H. Brush, of No. 73 Vernon avenue, in the 29th Ward, will build eighty-four 3-story brick dwellings in the Vanderveer Park section, on Canarsie and Nostrand avenues, Beverly road, and East 29th streets. The total cost, according to the plans, is \$430,000.

LIME.—There is no Rockland arriving, and the demand is very large. Nearly every yard is short and dealers are unable to meet the pressing demands of the market. Manufacturers are not making any prices. Fuel, casks and tonnage are scarce, and one cargo on the way was lost by fire during the early part of the week. There is a seasonably good demand for State, with prices unchanged at 70c. for common and 90c. for Jointa.

LATH.—There are none here, and few on the way. Dealers are asking \$2.25 to arrive. Last sales were made at \$2.10.

CEMENT.—The demand for Rosendale is very good, and a good deal is being shipped by rail, as navigation is still closed. The prices asked by manufacturers for early water delivery are 80c. @85c. Navigation will probably open the last of this month. Domestic Portland is very active with prices firm at about \$1.95 to \$2.00. Shipments are on order only. Prices on imported Portland are unchanged, and as the unfavorable weather has kept back the early spring demand, there is not much changing hands.

LEAD.—The demand is seasonably very good. Prices, as quoted by the National Lead Co., f. o. b. New York and subject to their usual terms, are as follows: White lead, dry or in oil; red lead and litharge in kegs; in lots of less than 500 lbs., 6½c. net; 500 lbs. and over, 5¾c.; red lead and litharge, in bbls. and half-bbls., ¼c. per lb. less than prices in kegs; dry white lead in bbls., ½c. per lb. less than price in kegs.

OIL.—Oil has advanced 2c. over last quotations, owing to the advent of new spring business, and the increased price of seed. Prices are now 43c. for raw city oil, and 45c. for boiled; Western oil is 41c. for raw and 43c. for boiled, and Calcutta is 54c.

GLASS.—Trade in glass is seasonably good, and the assortment of grades and sizes is adequate to the present requirements of the market. Prices remain unchanged with discounts as follows: Plate, 80 per cent.; French window, 80 and 10 per cent., and American window, 80 and 20 per cent.

NAILS.—There has been an advance of 10c. on cut nails over last week's quotations, and prices on these are now as follows: In carload lots, f. o. b. Pittsburg, \$1.50; on dock, New York, \$1.65, and small lots, New York stores, \$1.75. Wire nails have not advanced over last week's prices, but occupy a very strong position owing to the increased price on steel billets, which are now at \$26.50 in Chicago. Wire nails are: Carload lots, f. o. b. Pittsburg, \$1.90, with a rebate of 5c. to buyers of 1,000 kegs; on dock, New York City, \$2.05 and \$2.15, and \$2.25 small lots out of New York stores.

NAVAL STORES.—While the market for spirits of turpentine was quiet in general, there was a fair business going on, and the tone was firm. Buyers, although not active, were taking small lots and the early spring trade is beginning to show itself. Trade in this market was on the basis of 47c. for machines—one of the strongest features being the light receipts in Carolina turpentine. The market closed quiet and firm at 46½c. for Southerns and 47c. for machines. Trade in tar is a trifle more active and a better inquiry has prevailed during the last few days. Prices are: Regulars, \$1.65@\$1.70; oil barrels, \$5.10. Pitch ruled quiet and steady at \$1.70 and \$1.75.

LUMBER AND HARDWOODS.—The situation in the market is practically unchanged, with this difference, that stocks are going down and prices are advancing. Yellow pine has advanced materially and is now selling for from \$2.00 to \$3.00 more than last season. North Carolina is up \$2.00 all around over last year. Spruce has gone up from \$2.00 to \$3.00 over last fall's prices, and good wide cargoes are bringing from \$16.50 to \$17.50. Narrow widths bring from \$14,00 to \$15.00, and special bills in heavy sizes range from \$17.00 to \$18.50. Poplar is up \$3.00 all around, and there is a positive corner in brown ash, with strong indications of a similar position on other hardwoods. The general outlook for trade is excellent.

LANDLORD AND TENANT.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

In your issue of Feb. 18th, in "Questions and Answers," you say it is necessary to stamp renewal of a lease, etc. If no renewal is formally made, but landlord permits and tenant remains over term of expiration, is not such mutual act a renewal, just as legal and binding upon both parties as if written and stamped?

Answer.-Yes.-Law Editor.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

In your last issue you state that five days' notice is required to be given to a tenant to vacate premises on May 1 where no lease exists. I have always believed that no notice is required on May 1, as all terms expire then, unless stipulated to the contrary in writing. Will you kindly inform me if there has been an amendment made? Also, if same is applicable to tenants occupying apartments?

Answer.—Chapter 303 of the laws of 1882 reads as follows: "No monthly tenant shall hereafter be removed from any lands or tenements in the City of New York, on the grounds of holding over his term (except where the same expires on the first day of May), unless at least five days before the expiration of the term the landlord or his agent serves upon the tenant in the same manner in which a summons in summary proceedings is now allowed to be served by law, a notice in writing to the effect that the landlord elects to terminate the tenancy, and that unless the tenant removes from said premises on the day on which his term expires the landlord will commence summary proceedings under the statute to remove such tenant therefrom." There has been no amendment. (2) Yes.—Law Editor.

BROKER'S COMMISSION.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

I have a house in New Jersey for sale and put up a sign to that effect with my name and address on it. I gave the sale of the same house to several agents, two of whom put up signs for sale. A party comes along and wishes to look at the house. One of the agents shows it to him and tells him the price. Subsequently the same party writes to the owner inquiring the price, etc. In the interval the owner calls on the agent and happens to mention about this party's inquiring. The agent said he had shown the applicant through the house and told him the price, etc. Later the house was sold by the owner to this same party, the agent having been no more instrumental than stated here, not having introduced in any way the buyer to the owner. Now, having found the house was sold, he presents a bill for commission, as if he had sold it. Is such a just claim?

Answer.—I think the broker has earned a commission.—Law Editor.



PROJECTED BUILDINGS.

THE LAWS AFFECTING BUILDING.

There has not been any book on the market containing all the laws and regulations relating to building in New York City; yet the need of such a volume is plain enough, because a building from its foundation to its final demolition is subject not only to the building law, but to special regulations of the building department concerning passenger elevators, fire-escapes, light and ventilation and plumbing. There is also a law limiting the height of dwelling houses and another requiring temporary flooring. There are the tenement house and lodging house laws, laws relating to the extinction and prevention of fires and explosives, and the storing of combustible materials in buildings. Moreover, there are very important fire department regulations which must be observed in the installation of electrical apparatus, and there are, of course, all the regulations of the department of public works concerning Croton water rates and the use of water, the opening and refilling of trenches and restoring of street pavements; in addition to ordinances pertaining to the inspection of steam boilers. The architect, builder, building material man and real estate owner must be familiar with these laws and regulations; if he is not, he suffers. They are now all gathered together (with a directory of architects for the first time in one volume, illustrated, indexed and supplied for \$2.50. Record and Guide, Publishers, 14 and 16 Vesey street.

The first name is that of the owner; ar't stands for architect; m'n for mason; c'r for carpenter, and b'r for builder.
