ATISFACTION continues to be expressed with the condition and outlook for general business, with some considerable difference of opinion regarding the maintenance of the present high range of prices. Iron manufacturers particularly are very loud in their protestations that quotations will be maintained, but in spite of that the feeling will prevail that they must reduce their figures before the close of the summer, and perhaps still earlier. Recent events support this view, and it would be very remarkable if the boom of last year in the iron trade should not be followed by some reaction this. Sugar has moved with characteristic suddenness and violence, but that is a stock upon which the messenger boy's guess has ever been as good as the broker's. The present movement seems to be one to punish shorts, and as such is eminently successful. It would be very unusual if the real reason for a movement in this eruptive issue were ever given, so it is natural that reports of a settlement in the sugar trade war should now be used to secure all assistance possible in effecting the object of those who engineered this week's move, rather than the bald fact that certain parties found the stock oversold and saw a chance to turn a pretty big penny out of the circumstance. As was to be expected, the railroad list has kept very steady, owing to the faith that has been created in these issues by a long continued increase in earnings and the consolidations that have put railroad shares into fewer and stronger hands. The whole stock market situation is bettered for the moment by the smallness of the gold exports. The conditions at this time last week pointed to a much larger movement, and its partial failure makes one bear card less. However, the conditions at the European centres, whence the drain is expected to come, are not really improved, although larger cash holdings have come to the surface. The capitalization of industrial ventures goes on at an increasing rate and on a poorer basis, promoters becoming more venturesome as they are successful. The way in which industrial stocks are being watered for good will was recently the subject of warning in the London "Economist," and in Berlin domestic industrial issues have increased by about \$5,000,000 for the year, in spite of that centre's known weakness in capital holdings.

P at Albany there seems to exist a desire to take away, or nullify the constitutional power of the Mayor to pass upon legislation affecting this city. It would be very unfortunate if this desire, presuming that it exists, should be gratified, because this constitutional provision has a very great value in saving the city from many extravagant expenditures that the Legislature would like to have it incur. This year there was considerable feeling in the Legislature over this privilege of the Mayor, doubtless due to party considerations, so that with few exceptions, the bills disapproved by the Mayor before the adjournment were passed over his veto. Since the adjournment, of course, the Mayor's action has decided the fate of the bills be-There will be no trouble about the vetoes of the fore him. Mayor of New York whenever that office is held by a man in political affiliation with the party dominant at Albany, but whenever he is not, which judging from the several political sympathies of the city and state, is likely to be often, difficulties are sure to arise. The Charter Revision Commission, who have just been appointed, should see to it that this city is continued in its right to pass upon legislation affecting it, no matter what may be the party differences of the Capitol and the City Hall. Without the constitutional provision we are discussing, or a measure of home rule that would make it unnecessary, everyone who wants to carry through an improvement that is disapproved by the municipal government will be induced to go to Albany and there obtain what he wants. If, at the same time, we

should be living under a new tax law, like that proposed by Senator Elsberg, proportioning county contributions for state purposes on the expenditures of the several counties for local purposes, every rural legislator would have an object in granting such requests because he would know that the more he made New York spend the smaller would be the contribution required from his own county. It is remarkable that while the Legislature are continually compelling this city to incur large expenditures, as by the Davis bill for example, they do not afflict the smaller cities and towns in the same way, and this fact strengthens the necessity for an extension of our home rule privileges.

Tenement Reform.

THE TENANT MORE IN NEED OF ATTENTION THAN THE HOUSE.

T is gratifying to notice that what we have been preaching for five years, that the tenement-house question is not so much a question of bricks and mortar or of tenement plans as of individuals, is finding acceptance elsewhere. Our esteemed contemporary "The American Architect," for instance, has this to say in connection with the appointment of the tenement-house commission: "What tenements are and what tenements might be if the tenants chose to have them so is understood by every one who is at all likely to read the report of this new commission, and there really seems not much need of adding to the statistical tabulations that abound on every side. So long as the law allows grog-shops on every corner in the tenement-house districts and thus deliberately invites the heads of families, female as well as male, to spend their wages to the end that city and state may get their millions through liquor-licenses, just so long will children sleep in rags on cold floors in countless dirty homes and governors and tenement-house commissions cannot save them from suffering, disease and vice."

This expression of opinion is valuable because it indicates a desire to take a broader and juster view of the question than that obtaining hitherto and still too generally prevailing. When the lay press looks at the question fairly and ceases to be carried away by surface impressions and those that make the best "scare" heads, we may expect an honest and dispassionate discussion of the whole matter and probably the discovery of the true remedy for the evils that are presumed to be created by the tenement house simply because they exist in it. What is chiefly wanted is something that will make the tenant self-respecting. Neither increased air-space or the removal of grog-shops to a greater distance by legislation will do this. They would contribute something to the comfort and well-being of the tenement population, but they cannot be wholly regenerative. It is a very difficult thing to make a man or woman given to drink forgo it, or to make people indolent and dirty in their ways take on cleanliness as a habit. It would be still harder to make one set of people, landlords for instance, accept the responsibility of keeping another set sober and cleanly, even though there may be pecuniary dealings between them, for the simple reason that there is no power with which the law could endow them to enable them to meet it in a country in which the principle of individual freedom prevails to the extent that it does in this. law can enforce suitable building requirements, and it may be made so as to reach the tenant of the building and by discipline force him to a sense of decency and a due respect for his surroundings. How the latter can be done it is the duty of the Tenement Committee to discover. The regeneration of the tenements awaits this discovery.

Where paternalism prevails in government the people may be made to comply with minute regulations formed for their benefit. For instance, a friend of ours while residing in Switzerland was visited by an official who wanted to see whether he kept his matches in the place designated by the rules of the local fire department. Will anyone take this as a suggestion for a code of rules regulating cleaning, cooking and other domestic occupations in tenement houses? Yet it seems almost necessary that something like this should be done, if any speedy and effective reform of tenement-house conditions is to be effected. We do not suggest this, nor have we any hope that a Legislature could be got to overlook the popular outcry it would create if they imposed such regulations; yet the frequent presence of officials to see whether dirt was removed from floors and wash-tubs and other conveniences kept properly cleansed, and to impose small fines if they were not, would not only be followed by a lessening of the bills of sickness and mortality, but would be, also, a deterrent to that vice that germinates and spreads so rapidly in the tenement districts. The ultimate and beneficial result would be a reform of the tenement through the reform of the individual dwelling therein.

THE BRONX

Business Conditions Reviewed by Local Brokers

Real estate men beyond the Harlem think there is a period at hand of revival and renewed progress for the Bronx. The interviews with leading brokers and agents in that section given below, as will be seen, are all in the cheerful key that dominates the views of brokers in the outlying sections especially. However, there is an air of cheerfulness in the borough which was not apparent in the fall, and it is natural that the severe liquidation forced by last year's over-building should attract inquiries in that direction with a view to picking up bargains. This course always follows liquidation. The Legislature disappointed the borough in the efforts it made for home rule. The Bronx County project was frozen to death early in the session, and the bill to give the borough a separate building commissioner, while it made a strong struggle for existence, could not withstand the opposition, and consequently had to be counted among the slaughtered innocents at the end of the session.

The Governor was true to his promise, and appointed James L. Wells to represent the Bronx on the Commission, to revise the Charter of New York. Mr. Wells knows the borough and its wants, as the saying is, from A to Z. He was one of the speakers before the Charter Commission in 1897, and made the strongest plea offered for the retention of such powers as the 23d and 24th Wards possessed to make local improvements. He was not successful then, but is now in a better position to make the wishes of the borough known, and may be relied upon to secure everything possible for the borough he represents on the Charter Revision Commission. With this and the hopes engendered by the extension of the Elevated railroad, and the prospect for underground rapid connection with the City Hall, Bronx real estate men take a bright view of the immediate future. At the moment practical interest is centered on the matters in the Municipal Assembly affecting the borough of which we give a list in a form showing their several respective positions in that The changes in these positions may be ascertained from time to time by reference to our "Notice to Property Owners" column under heading of "Municipal Assembly." These matters with the interviews following indicate the lines of development likely to be followed in the borough in the near future.

IN THE COUNCIL.

Water Mains.—3d av, Spring pl, Riverdale lane, Loring pl, Prospect av, Gerard av, 168th st, 184th st, 186th st, 182d st, Featherbed lane, and Brook av, all on order of second reading; Aqueduct av, Southern Boulevard and Hunt's Point road, in Committee on Water Supply.

J. Clarence Davies; "Business up here 'n the last eight or nine months has been in rather a peculiar position, owing to the fact that the building loan operators were so optimistic last year that they made loans to anyone and everyone, with the consequence that there was a great deal of foreclosing, because owing to the rise in the price of materials and their poor credit builders were unable to finish their jobs. The loan operators had to take the properties, and complete them. The buildings are now about finished, and they are rapidly filling with tenants. The builders' failures gave a sort of black-eye to the Bronx, but it has now recovered from that to such an extent that loaners are beginning

to loan again with their usual freedom, and, besides, there has been a large inquiry for lots along the line of the Rapid Transit railroad, along the line of the Elevated Railroad extension, and in the neighborhood of the Zoological and Botanical gardens. It is good, substantial inquiry by people with one, two, three or four thousand dollars to invest. The people who are making this inquiry can see the effect the Rapid Transit railroad will have on real estate in this district, particularly along the lines of Westchester av and Southern Boulevard, in the direction of West Farms. The high prices recently obtained at auction for lots at 177th st, show that the public now regard Tremont as a centre; at the same time the extension of the Elevated Railroad to Fordham will make that as good if not a better centre than Tremont, because it will there join the N. Y. & Harlem Railroad and be a more convenient point for reaching the Zoological and Botanical gardens. Our business centres are becoming well de-The most important are: First, 149th st and 3d av, where the traffics from the 3d av and Willis av bridges will converge; where there is already an elevated station, and where there is to be an underground one; the second, 177th st, and the third, Fordham. There will also be another at 161st st, where the courthouse is to be. We also have a section corresponding to that known in Manhattan as the West Side. This is where the New York University, the Webb Shipbuilders' Home, and the Roman Catholic Orphan Asylum have located, which will be a sort of Bronx Morningside Heights. The reservoir will make an attractive section, too, and we have parks in every direction. In my opinion, we are just now going through an interval between two periods of activity. When the public fully realize what is going on up here in the extension and increase of our transit facilities, and the other great improvements, everyone will be jumping in and wanting to buy."

Wm. I. Brown (R. I. Brown's Sons): "As far as the conditions in this section are concerned, judging from what we have done in the first four months of this year, there is a steady substantial growth of business. It is not a movement like that over on Wendover av last year, where 90% was loaned on inflated values. Builders are holding back somewhat at the present time owing to the high prices of materials, but if we can get the city to move, where streets have been opened, with the work of regulating and grading, a man would know just what to do; he could then get a grade in a physical condition, where he has now only a street on a map and yet is required to pay taxes for a street. I refer to Morris av, legally opened, and now being regulated and graded; 105th st, legally opened, but not yet regulated and graded; Grant and Clay avs, legally opened, but not yet regulated and graded. One hundred and sixty-sixth st is a trunk sewer street, and yet title has not vested in the city. I mean that portion of the street between Webster and Morris avs. Application has been made and the opening has been recommended by the Board of Public Improvements to the Municipal Assembly, where the matter now is. There are twenty solid blocks depending upon that outlet sewer for sewerage. Doing that work would put all these blocks in the market. The land around them is built up, but building is not going on in them because of the want of that sewer. There are 120 acres to-day that one cannot sell because of that fact. I did sell one block last week, but that was exceptional."

W. F. Smith (W. F. & C. H. Smith): "Business is improving decidedly. In the last two weeks we have had at least ten inquirles for purchases. This section is working out of its troubles of last year and removing the bad impression they left. We find that people who had never previously invested money on bond and mortgage in the Bronx are sending us word that they are desiring good loans on good property. Cash buying has also been good in the past month. The renting inquiries this year are larger than they ever were before, particularly for small houses. Flats of six and seven rooms with bath are more wanted than we have ever known before. We cannot meet the demand for private houses. The people who are asking for private houses are mostly downtown people, who want to move into this bor-The extension of the Elevated Railroad is enlarging the inquiry, and while there is always a demand along 3d av, I think is doing more for the section north of Tremont. Fordham should get some of the increase due to that extension. The extension of the fire limits to 177th st should make the section north of that active under a demand for cheap lots, suitable for improvement with frame houses. On the whole, I look for a good summer and fall business."

W. J. Williamson (Bryan & Williamson): "Business is good in this section, not only in real estate, but in everything else. Trings generally are very pleasant and moving along all right. We have got over our troubles of last year, and builders are preparing to work again, having come to the conclusion that the higher prices for materials are here to stay. The inquiry for small houses, particularly 2-family houses, is good, both for purchase and rental."

EPOCHAL SALES

Fifth Avenue Hotel and Delmonico Building and Others Both Public and Private

Certainly the most notable single parcel of real estate ever disposed of at auction in New York City was that containing the Fifth Avenue Hotel and the Madison Square Theatre, sold for the executors of the estate of Amos R. Eno on Thursday by Peter F. Meyer, to William P. Eno, one of the heirs, for \$4,225,000. The bidding was started at \$3,000,000 by W. H. Morrell, acting for the estate, and, after an advance of \$250,000, and another of \$100,000, rose by \$50,000 additions, until \$4,160,000 had been reached, when the remaining advances were made in \$5,000 units. Among those who participated in the competition were Douglas Robinson, who is a trustee of the William Astor estate, and was supposed to be bidding for Col. John Jacob Astor; James J. Coogan, President of the Borough of Manhattan; John N. Golding, Irving Ruland, and, according to the auctioneer, a representative of John Wanamaker. The successful bidder, William P. Eno, at the Eno sale of April, last year, bought the 23d street triangle, opposite, for \$690,000, and a month later resold it to Samuel and Mott I. Newhouse for \$800,721. Mr. Meyer, in speaking of this week's sale, said: "William P. Eno got a bargain. Mark my words, inside of 90 days he will realize a profit of \$500,000 on that purchase." The net rental income of the Fifth Avenue Hotel, under an old lease expiring August 1, 1903, is \$180,000, which, on a 4 per cent. interest basis, represents a capitalization of \$4,500,-000. The rental income from the Madison Square Theatre is \$16,500, less taxes. The site of the hotel and theatre, including five lots afterwards disposed of, was bought by Amos R. Eno from John R. Monnot in 1855 and 1856 for an aggregate of \$260,-000. The story is going the rounds that, ten years ago, Amos R. Eno refused an offer of \$5,000,000 for the parcel sold this week, the offer, accompanied by a certified check for \$100,000, being made by W. M. V. Hoffman for amply competent clients.

That the Fifth Avenue Hotel property possesses extraordinary speculative value is conceded by all who profess to speak with any weight of authority. But there is no unanimity of opinion as to the special use for which the property is destined by the future development of the neighborhood. It is conceded that nearby tall office buildings have not met with pronounced success. The locality is thought to be the very best in the city for a retail store; for this reason, and apparently merely for this reason, John Wanamaker's name has repeatedly been mentioned in connection with rumored sales of the parcel, as it also has been mentioned in connection with the Hotel Brunswick. Perhaps, after all, the Fifth Avenue Hotel property may be for years to come most profitably employed as it is at present. The patronage of the hostelry has changed, new uptown competitors having come into vogue. But the change has been successfully met by clever management on the part of the proprietors. Stores have been introduced, which, together with other parts of the building not required for strictly hotel purposes, have been sublet for more than \$127,000 and a pro rata share of the taxes, the proprietors retaining control of the cafe, barber shop, and other profitable annexes to the hotel proper.

When Amos R. Eno died his real estate was roughly estimated to be worth \$12,000,000. Property has already been sold in partition proceedings aggregating \$10,721,850, and a considerable part of the realty belonging to the estate still remains unsold. improved property put up has been bought, for the most part, in severalty by the heirs. But most of the vacant lots, particularly in the Boulevard and in adjacent streets west of the Park, went at record-breaking high prices to operators and builders, who have improved them with costly and architectural elevator apartment houses. The partitioning of the Eno estate, because It threw quantities of the choicest residential building sites open for improvement at the proper stage in the development of the West Side, must be accounted an event of the first moment in the history of that very interesting end of the city. Four sales have so far been held for the Eno estate, the sums realized being as follows: February 21, 1899, \$2,305,850; April 12, 1899, \$2,091,-000; October 18, 1899, \$2,100,000; April 26, 1900, \$4,225,000-total \$10,721,850.

The Delmonico property, which was put up by Peter F. Meyer for the estate of the late United States Senator, Randall E. Gibson, of Louisiana, immediately after the Eno sale, was struck down at \$950,000 to Charles S. Brown, who was supposed to represent the parties in interest. Two years ago, the estate rejected an offer of \$1,000,000, made by Frank Work. Other important parcels sold at auction during the week were the Columbia College leasehold, at the northwest corner of 5th avenue and 49th street; the residence of the late Gen. Thomas A. Davies, which was put up by his estate, and was bought by Franz O. Matthiessen, the sugar manufacturer, for \$50,500; the 4-sty building, No. 27 Union Square West, between 15th and 16th streets, which was bought by C. G. Peters for \$157,500; and the Clipper Building, at the southeast corner of Centre and Leonard streets, bought from the stand of Philip A. Smyth by a combination of operators, headed by S. H. Stone, for \$46,500. In all of the foregoing, the

notable sales of the week, the prices obtained were below current estimates of market value. The Clipper Building, for example, brought \$3,500 less than it sold for to a firm of operators a year ago, when it was put up under similar conditions—in Supreme Court partition—which sale became invalid through the death of one of the heirs.

The statement as to low prices applied generally also to the sales that supplemented the star events, and which comprised an unusual number of attractive investment properties. Nevertheless, the net result of the week's auction business was distinctly encouraging. The small proportion of offerings bid in or withdrawn demonstrated a growing disposition on the part of investors to take property at valuations acceptable to owners. An agricultural journal recently estimated that, because of advance in prices, last year's farm products were worth to the farming community throughout the country \$1,600,000,000 more than they would have been worth a twelvemonth earlier. Real estate, excepting lots in certain districts within the building movement, is the only commodity which has not yet felt the sympathetic effects of the current prosperity in agriculture. But, with general and local influences pointing to a rise, the temper displayed by buyers and sellers in the Salesroom this week certainly must gradually make toward a movement in improved property, quite as impressive as the activity in vacant lots which subsided last summer as a result of increase in the cost of building materials and labor.

The brokerage business likewise shows a substantial gain over the past two or three weeks, although it by no means attained the proportions normal at this season of the year. Barring a relatively small number of exceptions, the transactions that became public affected improved property-factory and business property, tenements, and dwellings. Some plots in upper 5th avenue and on Murray Hill were bought as sites for costly residences. However, the larger part of the vacant or antiquated property that changed ownership was located in down-town store and loft sections, the distinctly tenement house neighborhoods, and in uptown districts where builders are active in the production of elevator flats. The trading was not large in volume, but the bulk of it was in investment property, particularly business property and tenements. The details of the Singer Company's purchase in Broadway, and the sale of Smith & McNell's hotel and restaurant, including real estate, are given elsewhere. They helped to engage popular attention for a solid but by no means brilliant brokerage budget. The sales reported from the Bronx, as a matter of fact, were of more genuine value to the market. Geo. F. Johnson & Sons are announced as the buyers, as intimated in this column two weeks ago, of the Spofford tract of 128 acres at Hunt's Point. This firm of builders already own a neighboring tract of about a thousand lots, which they are improving with small private houses as fast as they can build. Hardly a week goes by without one or more sales by them being reported, the price given in one this week being, perhaps, typical, namely, \$9,500. The buyers are for the most part Germans—that thrifty element which years ago made the Bowery and Grand street, and tributary property, the best investment realty in the city. The experience of Geo. F. Johnson & Sons is being duplicated by other builders operating along the rapid transit route and producing one and two-family houses. As has frequently been pointed out, the construction of 5-sty flats, particularly at Tremont, has been rather overdone. But the supply of inexpensive private houses for one and two families is far below the demand. Certainly, a small capital of from \$6,000 to \$10,000 can be invested in a home to better advantage in the Bronx than in any other part of the Greater New York, and this circumstance is perhaps the dominant fact in the market for low-priced real estate investments to-day.

BRONX BUILDING.

Speaking of the failure to secure a building commissioner for the Bronx, Architect Albert E. Davis, Vice-President of the North Side Board of Trade, and one of the promoters of the bill, is quoted as saying: "Fifty per cent. of the building plans filed last year at the Manhattan office were for the Bronx. Each of these, however small the building, required from three to six visits to the Manhattan office, which is six miles from the lower and thirteen from the upper end of our borough. Each visit consumes about half of a business day's time. It is a great inconvenience to subject us to this unnecessary loss of time, as much so as it would be to require Brooklyn architects to file their plans at the Manhattan office. We are not at all discouraged by the failure of the Legislature to pass the bill, for Gov. Roosevelt has promised to appoint a Bronx Borough man on the Charter Revision Commission, and we confidently expect relief from this quarter."

Architectural Iron and Bronze.

RECENT INVENTIONS AND PROGRESS—POSSIBILITIES IN THE COMBINATION OF METAL AND LIGNOLITH, THE NEW FIREPROOF COMPOSITION—A NEW ELEVATOR SYSTEM.

A visit paid to the large establishment of the Hecla Iron Works, located at North 10th, 11th and 12th streets, between Wythe avenue and Berry street, Brooklyn, by a representative of the Record and Guide, proved to be of unusual interest and very instructive. This concern is a corporation evolved from the firm of Poulson & Eger, and still retains Mr. N. Poulson as its president and veteran moving spirit. Their large plant is devoted to the manufacturing of all classes of steel, iron, bronze and other




FIG. 1.—FIREPROOF WINDOW CONSTRUCTION.

metal work for buildings, from the skeleton structure to the finest detail finishing touches, and from the designing to the erection of every part.

In his efforts to meet the ever-increasing demand for improved construction in the building trades, Mr. Poulson has long recognized the need of a material to be used in conjunction with metal work, that could be handled and moulded in a plastic state, and should be when set like a plaster or cement not only fireproof and inexpensive, but strong and capable of further mechanical treatment similar to wood. When lignoith was first put on the market as a fireproof flooring by the Franke-Jenner Co., Mr. Poulson investigated the material and became so convinced that he had finally discovered just the thing he had been so long looking for, that he explained his purposes to Messrs. Franke & Jenner, and forthwith entered into negotiations by which the Hecla Iron Works acquired a large interest in the Franke-Jenner Co.'s plant, and began experiments at once to put his ideas into practical shape.

Lignolith is a composition used primarily for flooring, is laid like cement in a plastic state and sets hard in about twelve hours; it adheres strongly to wood, stone or metal, can be cut with a saw, and will hold nails or screws, takes a high polish similar to wood or stone, is non-combustible and impervious to moisture; it can be made in any color and laid in any shape or design. A few of the uses to which the Hecla Iron Works have put this material, in conjunction with their metal work, are shown by the following illustrations and descriptions:

Fig. 1 illustrates a section of a window box in which all exposed portions of frame and sash are made of drawn and bent sheet bronze, brass, copper, zinc or other metal. The sash bars and guide channels are filled with lignolith while in a plastic state, and when set hard forms a solid reinforcement to the metal. The window box is moulded in one piece in perfect contact with the metal covering. For economy in space the sash weights are made rectangular in section, and two wires are strung between them for separators. These windows are also designed for either pivoted or hinged sash, and are substantial and durable, not subject to shrinkage or expansion from atmospheric changes, and when glazed with wire glass or electro-glazed plate glass in small pieces, form an excellent fire-resisting construction.





FIG. 2.—LIGNOLITH FIREPROOF STAIR TREADS.

Fig. 2 illustrates a section through the treads and risers of an improved stair construction, meeting all the requirements of the new building laws of Greater New York. The risers are of cast iron, with nosing and flanges in one piece complete. A wroughtiron plate is bolted to flanges on the risers forming a support for the lignolith tread which is filled in while in a plastic state, and when set hard is rubbed off to a smooth finish. Any desired color

may be obtained with plain or mottled effects. The wearing surface is much more agreeable than marble or slate, being more of the nature of hard wood in elasticity, but partaking of the nature of stone in wearing qualities and fire resistance.

Figures 3, 4 and 5 are sections showing the construction of lignolith doors. Figure 3 shows a door with plain surface on both sides and metal edges, the ornamental effects of which are obtained in the coloring and finishing, either with a high polish or a dull finish, as may be desired. Very handsome mottled effects in great variety can be had by the use of different colors and ingredients in mixing the lignolith. These doors are highly recommended for hospitals, as they are made in one solid piece without any joints or seams to harbor dirt or germs. Another and most practical use for these doors is in hotels and apartment houses, in which fireproof partitions are used; such a door placed at the entrance to each apartment or suite of rooms would form an effective barrier to the spread of flames in case of a fire originating in the apartment. These doors may be glazed with electro-glazed plate glass hereinbefore described, and still retain their fire-resisting qualities.

Figure 4 shows a door with plain lignolith finish on one side and a galvano-bronze plate or panel on opposite side. The galvano-bronze plates are made in one piece the full size of the door without any joints; they are made of copper by the electrotyping process by which every detail is perfectly produced, and can be finished in brass, bronze, or any of the usual artistic metal finishes. These doors are recommended for entrance doors, the outside showing the metallic finish, and the inside lignolith to match other inside doors.

Figure 5 shows a door with galvano-bronze plates on both sides, with lignolith backing and filling to reinforce the metal and prevent buckling in case of fire. These doors are recommended where highly ornamental and artistic effects are desired, and are especially suited for outside or entrance doors, withstanding all kinds of weather without warping, shrinking or swelling.

Figure 6 is an illustration of a galvano-bronzed-faced door used in the Merchants' National Bank, of Baltimore.

Figure 7 illustrates a section taken horizontally through a partition made as follows: Lignolith slabs of a light and porous mixture about two feet wide and long enough to extend from floor to ceiling, are erected, as shown, with alternating joints, and blocks of the same material used as separators are spaced about one foot apart on the line of the joints. The slabs are nailed to these blocks from both sides, thereby bracing each other, and are secured at top and bottom, according to conditions in the building. The finish plastering is laid directly on these slabs, no scratch or brown coat being necessary. The space between the slabs gives ample room for pipes, wires, etc. This material can be cut with a saw, and will hold nails or screws the same as lumber, providing a secure fastening for trim, wainscotings, etc. Another style of partition is made which may be termed portable, any or all the parts of which can be taken down without damage and used again. This partition is constructed of slabs about three feet square and %-inch thick, finished on face side before The slabs are erected back to back with two-inch

cubes of lignolith as separators, and so placed as to bring the joints of the slabs on one side on a line with the centre of the slabs on the opposite side. The joints are covered with ornamental metal strips, which impart a handsome paralleled effect. The advantages claimed for this partition are portability, mini-

mum time required for erection, no wet plastering, and consequent waiting for same to dry out, and its handsome appearance.

Many modifications of the foregoing and other distinct uses and combinations of this material may be made, and are being developed continually. These are only a few of the interesting things shown to our representative. In their large and beautiful showroom, over a hundred feet long and about half as wide, are to be seen, besides a great variety of samples of work executed, many experimental models of all kinds, one of the latest being an electric passenger elevator of an entirely different construction from



those in present use. The system is very much similar to the ordinary trolley railroad, applied vertically instead of horizontally, in that the cars are run up one shaft and down the other, each car having its own independent electric motor, which is hung to the bottom of the car. The motor has a simple gear connection to two screw-formed wheels, which work up and down in a threaded guide on either side of the shaft. This arrangement secures absolute safety, as the car cannot drop or run away in case of accident to power or machinery, but is brought to a standstill at once. The cars are transferred from one shaft to the other at the top and bottom stories by an ingenious shifting arrangement which works automatically. The whole shaft being provided with an automatic block system which prevents any possibility of collision or accident. A storage place at the top or in the basement, or both, is included as a part of the scheme into which unnecessary cars may be run during the hours of small traffic or for repairs, without disturbing the general service. The principal advantage of this system over those in present use is the immense saving in space, as only two shafts are required in place of eight, ten, or more, as are now required in a high building. The higher the building the greater the number of cars that can be accommodated, whereas with the present system a building of small ground area is limited in height because of the great amount of space required for the elevator service. By the substitution of this system many buildings now erected could be increased in height, which at present would be impossible because of lack of room for additional elevator shafts. Many other important advantages can be claimed for this system, among which are simplicity and economy of installation, no new mechanical problems being involved. No special and complicated power plant in the basement is required, as the power can be taken directly from the electric service now so generally established. A more frequent service and more comfortable rate of speed can be maintained, no expensive and heavy cable and equivalent counterweights to wear out and renew, a minimum of inertia to overcome in starting and stopping cars.

Many other models in full size, as well as small scale, are on exhibition in the Hecla showroom. All manner of elevator doors and enclosures, can be seen, showing the progressive stages of improvements up to the present time. After many years of experiments and trials with elevator door fittings, having tried all the known devices on the market and many of their own invention, they have finally evolved a simple, strong and durable equipment for elevator doors that can withstand the continual strain and hard service required, and which is now being used extensively. The door hangers are made of wrought steel in one plece, so as to encircle the steel track, thereby preventing any possibility of the door coming off and falling down the well hole. The wheels are extra strong, provided with bearings of a pattern

which has been in continual use for over fifteen years, and are still in good working order. The latest arrangement consists of a polished hard wood rod, %-inch diameter, extending vertically the full height of the door, held in bronze brackets, and provided with a bronze tip at the bottom, which engages with a beveled stop secured to the sill. The door can be opened by the operator or closed while the car is approaching or leaving the story without waiting for the car to come opposite to a small knob or latch, thereby saving time and facilitating the service. Rubber bumpers of special design are provided which can be adjusted by screwing in or out, so as to present even striking surfaces at top and bottom, preventing all jars and vibrations, which are so destructive to this class of doors.

In the line of metal window construction, several models are on exhibition, one of which in particular illustrates a method adapted to large windows to be operated by a crank handle, with concealed screw gearing, for raising or lowering the sash. This window is finished in brass and has a very handsome appearance. A unique stair construction is used in their office building, extending from the ground floor to the roof, which is exceedingly economical in space and cost, and at the same time very handsome in appearance, the chief feature of which is the platform construction and the position of the face strings, which are placed one above the other in the same vertical plane and bolted to each other, the railing of one string terminating at the underside of the return string next above, thereby shortening both strings and railing, and making practically a truss arrangement of the whole stair from top to bottom.

For fine castings the Hecla Iron Works have always had the highest reputation, their leading specialty being exquisite undercut work and fine detail, not equalled by any other concern, and supplementing this are the handsome finishes given to their work by the electro-plating processes and Bower-Barffing. In this again they were the first to introduce the beautiful metallic finishes to architectural work, and have at the present time the largest establishment in this country for plating in the various metals, such as bronze, copper, brass, nickel, tin, silver and gold, with all their various shades. In the process of duplex plating work, wrought or cast iron is coated with a heavy deposit of copper sufficient to resist all atmospheric actions, and when toned to any shade of copper, bronze, or other metal, cannot be tinguished from solid work in that metal. As to the Bower-Barff process previously mentioned, the surface of the metal itself is changed by oxidization into a beautiful ebony black finish, and is not coated in any manner, thereby preserving the original surface and fine detail. This finish is perfectly durable either for inside or outside work.

In connection with the plating department is a galvano-bronze department in which a high class of work is produced by the electro-deposit process before mentioned in the description of lignolith doors. This style of work is specially adapted to highly ornamental work, where sharp details and beautiful metal finishes are required, such as commemorative tablets, doors, panels, ornamental mouldings, statuary plaques, etc. Many handsome samples of this work may be seen, not only in their works, but in many of the finest buildings in this country.

Another more recent use to which the galvano-deposit process has been put is what is called electroglazing. This process of glazing was first introduced by the Hecla Iron Works, but has since become very extensively used in connection with prismatic lighting of stores, offices, etc. It has been discovered plate glass in small lights, about four inches square or smaller, when securely set into a metal frame, will withstand to a high degree a severe fire and act as a barrier to the progress of flames, even when subjected to the action of water thrown from the firemen's hose. The glass, after such a test, will be found to be full of small, fine cracks, but still retaining its position and rigidity. But in the construction of a metal frame a difficulty had to be overcome. Such a frame, to be practical, must strong, with the least possi-





FIG. 6.—GALVANO-BRONZE FACED DOOR.

ble amount of metal, so as not to be unsightly, and not exclude too much light. No such frame could be made light and strong enough in cast or wrought metal alone, and recourse had to be made to another method, which is as follows: Thin strips of metal, preferably copper or brass, about 1-16-inch thick and 5-16-inch wide, are halved together edgewise, forming spaces to receive the glass, which may be square, triangular or any de-

sired design, and the whole set into a frame of the required size. This frame, glass and all is suspended in the prepared solution, and a deposit of copper is made upon the edges of the thin strips of copper or brass, overlapping and firmly securing the glass in place, and reinforcing the whole frame. The panel thus formed is now ready to be put into place in the building.

These and many other interesting branches of the work too numerous to describe may be seen at the works of this establishment. The name of the Hecla Iron Works and their work is well known, but very few architects and others know the extent and capacity of their plant, and the great variety of work they are prepared at all times to execute. To such we would strongly recommend that they visit their works, every courtesy being shown to visitors who are always welcome and gladly shown through the many different departments. An hour thus spent will be found to be more instructive than a whole week's study of trade circulars or catalogues. It might here be mentioned that many thousands of dollars are spent yearly in experiments in the endeavor to solve the ever-increasing number of problems that come up in building construction, and to advance the quality of their output. This fact is most appreciated by architects and others interested, who have often called upon them to devise methods and means of overcoming difficulties they meet in planning their work. Having ample room, covering fully thirty-five city lots, and every facility in machinery, and a large force of men, representing no less than twenty-five separate trades, they are prepared to execute work of any magnitude.



With such a large force it is pleasant to state that the relations between the workmen and the employers are perfectly harmonious, and, while the men are members of trade unions, no strikes of any kind have ever taken place to interfere with the prompt execution of their contracts. Architects and builders will appreciate the importance of this.

Interesting Legal Note.

Surety Corporation's Right to be Relieved from Liability .-In October, 1897, Edmund G. Thurber was adjudged a lunatic and Fannie C. Thurber was appointed his committee upon giving a bond in the usual form for \$50,000. The bond was given on the 26th day of August, 1898, the American Surety Company signing the same as surety in consideration of \$50 paid down by Mrs. Thurber, and the agreement to pay \$25 annually thereafter while the bond was in force. In February, 1899, while the bond was still in force, an order was granted upon the petition of the company, requiring Mrs. Thurber to show cause why she should not furnish new sureties and render an account as committee or be removed from that position. She defended by presenting an affidavit establishing perfect regularity of procedure on her part as committee, and alleging that the company was acting through ulterior motives induced by the lunatic's relatives, who had refused to recognize her as his wife or their child as his legitimate son. She charged that their object was to prevent her from prosecuting certain actions to set aside contracts made by the lunatic, in which one of their number was interested.

The Special Term denied the application and the Appellate Division affirmed the decision of the Special Term upon the ground that the provisions of Section 812 of the Code of Civil Procedure providing for the release or discharge of sureties from further liability or liability for a subsequent act or default of the principal do not apply to this case, the surety here being a corporation organized for surety purposes, and having become surety herein for compensation and pursuant to a contract appearing upon the record.


The Court of Appeals has just reversed the Special Term and the Appellate Division, holding that a surety company has the same right as an individual bondsman to petition to be relieved from liability for the future acts or default of its principal, and to require its principal to file a new bond and settle his account. The opinion says that the Special Term and Appellate Division may in their discretion grant such an application as was herein made.

A Broadway Corner.

GROWTH OF VALUE IN A CENTURY.

It is not often that we are able to obtain the results of a century's possession of an important piece of downtown realty, as is the case with the northwest corner of Park place and Broadway, owing to the fact that it is the property of the General Society of Mechanics and Tradesmen, and has consequently figured in the reports of that Society from time to time.

It was in 1802 that the Society bought a lot, 25 feet on Broadway and 99 feet on Robinson street, now Park place, with buildings, of Richard Varick. The price asked was £2,600, and included buildings valued for material at £120, and 200 loads of lime worth £180; the actual price of the land, therefore, was £2,300, or \$5,750 in the currency of these times, taking the provincial pound at \$2.50. The Society also purchased 2 feet of the lot to the north for \$575, of one William G. Miller, and found themselves involved in a long litigation with the Eden family and Aaron Burr, which resulted in the finding that Miller had no title to bestow, and a settlement with the rightful owners. It was upon this land that the Society erected its first home in 1802, an

illustration of which is given herewith, though judging by the costumes of the figures in the foreground the drawing must have been made, not when the building was new, but of respectable age. The opening of this hall must have been a great event in Following the first annual meeting of the Society, held its time. in the building on January 4, 1803, a banquet was given, at which 200 members sat, and Mayor Edward Livingston was present, and no less than seventeen toasts were drunk. A year later the building committee reported on the cost of the new home. items were: Total cost of building, \$22,142.38; paid for land, \$6,500; paid Miller for land, \$575; total, \$29,217.38. In round figures the total cost stood at \$30,000. It was not until 1830 that the settlement on the 2-foot strip was effected. Title was purchased of Mrs. Eden for \$2,500 and other expenses, including an item "Aaron Burr's judgment vs. heirs \$965," and the \$575 originally paid to Miller, brought the cost of this strip up to \$5,510.72, or nearly as much as that of the corner lot, 25x99.

Thereafter the hall was carried on the books of the Society at \$35,000 until 1836, when the valuation was raised to \$50,000. In 1849 we find it figuring at \$60,000 in the balance sheet. In 1856 the finance committee were authorized to sell it at \$150,000; it was up at auction January 24th of that year at that figure, but there being no advance, it was withdrawn. Three years later a sale for \$150,000 was arranged, but it fell through. The building now standing on this corner was erected in 1870 at a cost of

\$100,000 under the terms of a lease to the Security Insurance Co., the annual rental being \$24,100, and the capital valuation was made \$200,000, and later, in 1876, the property stood at \$300,000 on the balance sheet, a figure at which its real value was placed by the then President, in 1869. For a good many years the Society has not made public their valuation of the property, but it may be stated that it is now held at about \$700,000.

These facts, while they give an idea of the troubles attending the ownership and management of real estate, are more eloquent of the rapid rise of realty in the lower section of New York City. The annual return from rentals on the capital expenditures of \$135,000 must average quite large, and the increment on those expenditures, represented by the difference between the sum named and any reasonable valuation that could be put upon a corner, 27x99, facing the City Hall Park, must be considered very satisfactory.

Dooner Watched and Chainad.

A number of Superintendent of Buildings Dooner's business and political friends dined and wined him at the Belvidere Hotel on Saturday evening, and presented him with a costly Jorgensen split-second, minute register timepiece in a richly ornamented hunting case, together with vest chain, diamond lock and gold pendant pencil. Commissioner Brady made the presentation in a brief felicitous speech. There were present, with others: Commissioners Thomas J. Brady, John Guilfoyle and Daniel Campbell, Councilman Thomas Foley, Alderman John T. McCall, ex-Assemblyman, P. J. Andrews, James Clark, J. C. Hankinson, George Just, Thomas Reilly, M. J. Hackett, Matthew E. Healy, Henry Coie, Matthew Donohue, Thomas Lamb, N. Reville, J. Farrell, F. McDonough, William King, Jos. Cassidy, William Shannon, Edward Carroll and J. A. Hyman.

Superintendent Dooner acknowledged the honor in the following words: "It has been my endeavor through life to win and retain the esteem and friendship of my fellow men, and particularly those whom business associations have brought together. The very handsome token which has just been presented to me, in its inception, tells of friendship and esteem for me which it will always be my pride to retain and to strengthen. While we are reminded by the token of the flight of time, which we hardly realize, it will enable me to have a good 'watch out' for my friends at all times. While it was exceedingly kind of you to 'watch' me, so that I could never go astray. I doubt whether it was necessary to 'chain' me as well, but as you have seen fit to do both, it becomes me to submit to your will, with the hope that our friendship will always be linked firmly together like the links of this beautiful chain, and be ever without end. In conclusion I can only add that the impulse of the mechanism of this magnificent watch can never respond more truly than my heart will to the kindly and friendly feeling which actuated you in its presentation."

The Tenement-House Committee.

Robert W. de Forest, President of the Tenement-House Committee, is quoted as saying that the Commission will not go over the ground already investigated. He said: "Some of the serious questions of tenement-house life to which the Commission undoubtedly will give attention are these: "The percentage of space which should be occupied by the building and the percentage which should be left for open court. The limitations of the height of tenements. The questions of whether closets should not be provided for each separate family; the question of providing bathing facilities of some kind; whether there should not be some limit to the number of persons who are permitted to occupy a given space, and the proper amount of air space required for each person. Whether more stringent provisions to prevent loss of life from fire are desirable. There are quite as serious questions relating to the enforcement of tenement-house laws as to their enactment."

The Commission held its second meeting on Thursday in the United Charities building, and appointed Lawrence Vieller, Secretary of the tenement-house committee of the Charity Organization Society, secretary of the committee. The Commission decided to begin personal inspection tours through the tenement districts. It was rumored this week that Otto M. Eidlitz had decided to resign his seat on the committee, but the Record and Guide's telephone inquiry was met by a denial by him of this story.

"LANDLORD AND TENANT"

(By Hon. David McAdam, Justice. New York Supreme Court.)

The first volume of the third edition of this valuable work on the law of landlord and tenant, has just been issued by Remick, Schilling & Co., publishers, of this city. When complete it will consist of two volumes and a supplement; the volume at hand contains 856 pages.

The continued changes in this important branch of the law, suggested to the author, the necessity of preparing a new edition of his former book, which would embody not only the law in this State, at present applicable to the subject of which he treats so well, but also a review of the authorities in almost all the States

of the Union on this important branch of law, and thus make it a valuable book for general reference in all the States.

The book is exceedingly useful, not only to the legal profession, but also to all persons having dealings in real estate, whether as owners, tenants, agents or brokers. The style of preparation is concise, but admirable. It is needless to state that the author, who is at present one of the justices of the New York Supreme Court, has had great experience in the subject of which he treats.

PROTECTION OF TENEMENTS FROM FIRE.

For the protection of tenements from fire the Fire Department has requested the Municipal Assembly to pass an ordinance compelling the owners of all flats and tenement houses occupied by more than three families to have lights burning on every floor from sunset to sunrise each day. The Committee on Law Department of the Council has the matter under consideration. In communicating the request, Commissioner Scannell said: am in receipt of a report from the Chief of Department recommending, as a result of an investigation by him of recent apartment and tenement-house fires, at which several lives have been lost, and also from the fact of the receipt by me of numerous letters from occupants of apartment and tenement houses, stating that the halls of said buildings are in darkness after 10 o'clock at night, and compelling tenants upon entering the premises after that hour to light a match in order to see their way, has, in my opinion, been the origin of many of these accidents, for, when a fire is discovered in such a building, the tenants rush to the hallways and when they are found to be in darkness a panic is invariably the result."

Commissioner Scannell has decided also to issue an order that all large apartment houses must be equipped with fire-alarm boxes, under powers given him by Section 762 of Chapter 378 of the laws of 1897, or the Charter of Greater New York. This section says that owners of tenement houses, meaning, of course, what is legally known as tenements, "shall provide such means of communicating alarms of fire, accident or danger, the police or fire department, respectively, as the fire commissioner or police board may direct. See page 357 of the Building Laws of Greater New York, published by the Record and Guide.

BILLS SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR.

Governor Roosevelt has signed bills, since our last issue, as follows:

Mr. Morgan's, authorizing New York City to appropriate \$50,-000 to aid in the erection of a monument in memory of the Prison Ship Martyrs.

Senator Marshall's, amending the law relative to the erection of buildings fronting on Eastern Parkway in Brooklyn.

Senator Elsberg's, removing the limit of appropriation to be made by New York City for the Public Library in Bryant Park. Mr. Remsen's, authorizing the expenditure of \$500,000 to improve and finish the Brooklyn Hall of Records.

Mr. Doughty's, Barren Island bill, compelling the removal of the garbage works and abatement of the nuisance within a year. Senator Goodsell's, the so-called Fifth Avenue Stage Coach bill, which provides that stage companies having the right of way in cities for five years past may retain that right of way, extend their routes and change their motive power.

Senator Elsberg's, the Tax Appraisers' bill, which will allow the State Controller to appoint the inheritance tax appraisers in the counties of New York, Kings and Erle. It provides for five for New York County, three for Kings, and one for Erie.


Mr. J. J. Fitzgerald's, authorizing New York City to acquire additional lands adjoining the site of the Municipal Court, on 54th st.

Mr. Lewis', compelling the publication of lists of tax exemptions in the cities of the State by the local Assessors, which act takes effect immediately. The Assessors' statement must show separately such piece or parcel of real estate exempted, the name of the owner, its value, and the reasons for the exemption.

CLOSING EXERCISES.



The three purchases combined constituted a plot 57.9 x110.1x38.6x118.4, the aggregate price for which was \$944,500. Some of the leases affecting this property did not expire before 1893. The plans for the new Singer Building, by Ernest Flagg, The three 5-sty buildings, Nos. 85 to 89 were filed in 1897. Some things have occurred this week to infuse life and spirit into realty in this and the adjoining borough. The acceptance by Mayor Van Wyck of the bill for a bridge to be thrown across the Sound, via Hart's Island, to connect the railroad systems in the boroughs of Queens and the Bronx, is one of these things, inasmuch as it speaks of the development of business throughout Long Island, of which the most important and thickly settled sections are naturally the chief beneficiaries. The passage of the Barren Island nuisances removal bill over the Mayor's veto and its final signing by the Governor, will bring joy to the hearts of the owners and dwellers along Flatlands and Jamaica bays. It begins the work which will in the course of a year or two remove a great incubus from the property in these sections. With the Barren Island Works retained development was not possible, and while the land at present is not the most attractive for improvement, there is no doubt with the pressure of population from contiguous sections and the removal of the works that enterprise will take hold of it in due course and make it more valuable. Another piece of favoring legislation was completed in the signing of the Kelsey bill extending the powers of the Rapid Transit Commission throughout Greater New York and the subsequent discussion of the best point at which to make the tunnel connection between this borough and Manhattan.

Brooklyn is great on protective organizations, and it is admitted over the river that this fact has been of great assistance in improving the condition of this borough and secured it the favorable position it took in consolidation. This week another protective league was formed, but one with a somewhat local purpose. It is called the Local Protective League, and undertakes to look after the interests of 7th, 11th and 12th Wards, especially, and which, it was claimed, had not received their full share of improvements since consolilation was effected. Among those claimed to be needed were: The asphalting of De Kalb av, the repaving of Washington av from Myrtle to Atlantic avs, and the planting of trees under the direction of the Tree Plant-Society. Resolutions favoring such improvements were adopted. These officers of the league were elected: Robert Van Iderstine, President; Charles B. Lawrence, Vice-President; How-

ard McWilliams, Secretary; Morton D. Smith, Treasurer. The Executive Committee, on which the real work of the league will devolve, is composed of the following men: Frederick B. Pratt, Gardiner D. Matthews, Henry Batterman, O. F. Nichols, Paul E. Vernon, Fred. B. Forman, Dr. Charles H. Levermore, H. B. Hubbard, Robert A. Shaw and David P. Morse. The next meeting of the league will be held on Monday, May 7.

What is the limit of time for the recording of a mechanic's lien?

Answer .- Ninety days, dating from the last item of work performed or materials furnished .- Law Editor.

CHATTEL MORTGAGE-LANDLORD AND TENANT.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

A leases a store to B, and fits up the same with counters, fancy woodwork, mirrors, etc., and also puts in chairs and tables; the place to be used for a saloon. It being expressly stated in the lease that A is to have a first lien on all these things in case B defaults in the rent. A to at once take possession of the property, and sell it at public or private sale in order to get his rent A at once records this lease in the usual manner. But C. who furnishes the above-mentioned things, takes a chattel mortgage on it as security for what B may owe him, and the chattel mortgage is recorded in the usual way, but after the recording of the lease. Which party holds the property, and is C bound to take notice of the provision of the lease, and is such a provision in a lease just as good as a chattel mortgage?

Answer.-The query seems to me to be a little involved, as it first states that A "fits up the same with counters, etc.," and later says "C, who furnishes the above-mentioned things, takes a chattel mortgage on it as security for what B may owe him." These statements seem inconsistent. I presume, however, that there was an omission, and that the first sentence should read: "A leases a store to B, and B fits up the same, etc." Upon that pres mption I answer that C's chattel mortgage is a valid first lien, or rather the title to the fixtures is in C, until he is paid off.—Law Editor.

SALE OF LAND BY STATE FOR TAXES.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

When property is sold by the State for non-payment of taxes, and the State issues a deed for it according to law, does this deed give bona fide and absolute ownership to the buyer?

Answer .- Yes, if all the requirements of the law are complied with.-Law Editor.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

A rents to B a store and basement, in October, 1898, and B takes a lease for one year. In October of the following year, when the lease terminates, nothing is said of a renewal. In January, B expresses desire to take a lease for three years, from May 1, 1900, and after leases are drawn he withdraws from the deal. In April A commences dispossess proceedings against B for the possession of the premises; B contends that he is a tenant until October, 1900. Doe not his intention to take a lease from May 1st invalidate that claim?

Answer.-If B pays his rent he is entitled to remain in possession of the premises until the expiration of the second year. There is a special statute, applicable to the City of New York, which provides that "agreements for the occupation of lands or tenements in the City of New York, which shall not particularly specify the duration of such occupation, shall be deemed valid until the first day of May next, after the possession under such agreement shall commence," but this statute does not apply to the case in hand. "When a tenant for a year, or one or more years, holds over after the expiration of the term, without any express agreement, but with the assent of his landlord, the law implies that he holds the premises upon the former terms for another year." Park v. Castle, 19 How. Pr. R., 29; Schuyler v. Smith, 51 N. Y., 316.-Law Editor.




