HE advance in prices on the stock market has been maintained so a long time, has made such considerable and general changes in the prices of securities, and has been supported by such a volume of business that it is fairly entitled to be considered a genuine recovery from the undue depression of prices which took place in 1903 and early in 1904. Such a recovery was certain to come, but very few people expected that it would take place during the canvass preceding the presidential election. That it did take place so soon is striking testimony to the recuperative power of the business and finance of this country. Just as soon as money became easy and it was discovered that agricultural prosperity would continue, prices rebounded from the low levels of last winter and spring. Moreover, there is no reason to suppose that the gain which has been made will not be maintained. Prices have so far simply been returning to their normal investment level; and there is probably room for even a further advance without super-adding any considerable speculative margin to the value of securities. At the same time conservative bankers are likely to discourage any very considerable further increase during the coming fall. Financial conditions have favored a return to the normal level, but they would not favor too lavish a use of credit for an exclusively speculative movement. At the same time it should be added that the year 1905 should be a good year, both for the business and financial interests of the country, and many of the projects which were cut short by the slump of 1903 will be resumed and will make the year one of active and profitable trade.

HE volume of the current real estate business is very small; but it preserves a wholesome and promising character. Our news columns register the occurrence of about 50 transactions in Manhattan property against 42 for the corresponding week last year. The increase is unimportant, but the character of the business is on the whole better. An increasing demand for private houses is developing, and the news of the week includes some 14 buildings of this class against only 6 during the corresponding week in 1903. Lots for improvement with tenements and flats continue to be purchased; but the movement in this direction is the tail-end of the building operations of the current year, and offers no anticipations of what we are to expect in 1905. Of course there is no doubt that the Bronx will be even more active than it is at present, and its present activity is in the number of transactions consummated almost equal to the whole of Manhattan. More than 35 Bronx sales are reported in this issue of the Record and Guide against only 9 one year ago. There can be no doubt that during the coming year many important operators and builders, who have hitherto confined their attention exclusively to Manhattan, will transfer their interests chiefly to the Bronx, and will help to carry the activity in that Borough to unprecedented totals.

A CCORDING to all indications the streets of New York will be more than ever congested during the coming winter by the enormous quantity of slow moving vehicles, which will be obliged to use them. Already people who try to go up or down town in automobiles and cabs are complaining of the inevitable and exasperating delays of transit. Broadway during the busy hours is practically impassable. The Bowery which, because of its width was once comparatively available, is becoming more and more crowded-partly because of the traffic, which seeks the new bridge by that route. Hudson st., except along its lower end, still has a little room left upon it; but 8th av. is very much crowded because of its use by the carts carrying dirt from the excavation for the Pennsylvania station. The delays and money loss which this condition incurs upon everybody who uses the streets, but particularly upon business men, who do much trucking and carting is enormous; and it is absurd that it is not receiving more serious and insistent attention. Whenever Elm st. is restored to use one more fairly capacious thoroughfare will be provided; but another one to the west of Broadway is even more necessary, and it should be laid out at an early date by widening Varick st., cutting it through to Broadway on the south, and to extensions of 6th and 7th avs. on the north. The present administration has so far been inclined to limit the improvements which is carries along, to projects started by its predecessors; but in this matter of dealing with the congestion of street traffic, it has an opportunity of initiating improvements of its own of the utmost importance. There could not be a more flagrant piece of short-sighted improvidence than that which the City of New York is displaying. It is increasing and improving enormously its equipment for the transaction of business. It is building larger and better loft buildings and factories than ever before, and it is improving the means of communication with all the outlying boroughs. But the end of all these improvements is to facilitate the transaction of business on Manhattan Island, and this object will not be obtained unless certain improvements and enlargements of the street system are carried out at the same time.

N the beginning the presidential campaign promised to be very exciting and interesting, but instead of that it has become increasingly dull. Of course the really lively part of the canvass is still ahead of us, but it has already become apparent that if any enthusiasm is provided, it will be a forced rather than a spontaneous enthusiasm. There is nothing in the issues of the campaign to arouse any particular interest. The whole logic of the Democratic position forced the leaders of that party to draw up a negative platform, and to nominate a candidate who would be safe rather than positive and assertive in any one particular direction. Judge Parker filled the bill, but he and his canvass are now suffering from the defects of his qualiters. He is an eminently safe and estimable man, who can proclaim in turgid sentences a sufficiency of safe and commonplace ideas. But the negative program of economy, and legal and constitutional righteousness which he proclaims, will not give him much strength outside a few lawyers' offices. carefully refrains from all references to the various reforms, in which independent voters are interested, and he apparently relies chiefly upon the opposition and dislike which the aggressive and positive poncy of President Roosevelt has aroused. We fear that he will be disappointed, in case he expects the dislike and distrust of Roosevelt to win him many votes, which he would not otherwise get. The American people like a vigorous, positive and aggressive man, even if he does make mistakes, and such a man, provided he keeps a level head, will always be preferred to the cautious lawyer, who makes a platform out of the Constitution and the Declaration of Independence. In the meantime the apathetic campaign has an excellent effect on business. For the first time since 1884 both the tariff and the money questions are not dangerous issues, and Wall Street is not afraid to carry on a bull campaign in the midst of the can-

URING the period of 1901 to 1903, the number of expensive buildings erected was so considerable that several large construction companies were organized to obtain a share in the business. These companies, together with the construction companies and building firms which date from before 1900, are now complaining of a scarcity of work. They, all of them, still have some good contracts on hand, which will take a year or more to finish; but they declare that there are very few big new building contracts on the horizon of trade, and they do not like the outlook. Well while we have every confidence that the outlook for new building contracts calling for large expenditures will be better some months from now than it is now, still it is improbable that at any time during the next few years will be as much business of this class offered as there was during 1901 and 1902. If the construction companies want to keep fully employed, they should adapt themselves to the times, and use their capital in erecting the kind of buildings, for which there is an immediate demand. For the next few years there will undoubtedly be a pressing demand for flats and residences, both on Washington Heights and in the Bronx, and there is no reason why this class of improvement should be left to builders with small capital. The large capital and the efficient organization of the construction companies should enable them to erect a-great many cheap buildings with as much profit as a very few large and expensive buildings. The appearance as operating builders both on the Heights and in the Bronx would be welcomed and should not be delayed.

The Value of the New Subway.

O the great majority of New Yorkers, the new Subway means merely a new and to some a quicker and more convenient method of transit. Those who live on the West Side and in the Bronx expect by means of the underground road to travel the length of the island in considerably less time than that journey takes at present, while even the neglected residents of the East Side expect to obtain some relief from the overcrowded condition of the elevated and surface cars, because of a certain diversion of traffic, which will occur at competitive points. That these advantages will follow from the opening of the Subway is undoubtedly true. Too much, indeed, should not be expected in the way of relief from overcrowding. Within a year or two the Subway, elevated and surface cars will all be packed as full of passengers during the rush hours as the elevated cars are now. But the people to whom it is convenient to use the Subway will save a good deal of time in their daily travels, and for this reason the Subway cars are likely to be more overcrowded than are the elevated cars. The consequence will be that the passengers on the West Side elevated can make a pleasant and useful choice between less comfort and more speed on the one hand and more speed and less comfort on the other. The point is, however, that whereas the service provided by the Subway will not be sufficient in quantity to handle even the existing overflow of traffic, its quality will be superior to any which is now offered and this merit will have far-reaching consequences.

The great fact about the Subway is a fact which New Yorkers do not appreciate as yet, but which nevertheless transcends in importance every other advantage which it will give in its train. This fact is that the quality of the service affored by the express trains of the underground road will open up to New Yorkers large areas of cheap land for residential purposes. That people should be jammed against their neighbors while traveling and should rarely be able to ride in seats is unpleasant; but one would not have to travel far to find worse evils even in New York City. That people should spend from a half an hour to an hour more than is convenient in reaching their offices and homes is an economic and a social loss; but the economy of metropolitan life seems to be able to afford the loss. What is much more serious, however, is the fact that the millions of people who elect to live in Manhattan are for the most part obliged to inhabit small, cramped and uncomfortable tenements and flats, which exercise a bad influence both upon the physique of their tenants and upon the character of their domestic lives. New Yorkers lack good air, good sunlight, and enough space for comfort, and the great want of the Subway is that it will begin the process of restoring to the inhabitants of the city sufficient allowance of habitable room, air and sun-

The Record and Guide has frequently pointed out the gradual change in the domestic habits of well-to-do New Yorkers. The poor of New York have, of course, almost always lived in some kind of tenements, as they do in other large cities, the only difference being that the Manhattan tenements have become higher, deeper and more crowded than they are elsewhere. But the process whereby people whose rents were \$500 a year or more have gradually been forced to move from private houses into flats has taken place pretty well within the life of one generation. It began about 1870, and it has continued with increasing momentum until the present day. From 1870 to 1889, an average of from 1,000 to 1,100 private houses were built every year in Manhattan, and were bought or rented by people who wanted to live in that way. During the following years the same average was reduced to about 600. In 1904 plans will be filed for not more than 50 dwellings to be built in Manhattan. These figures tell the story better than do those of the increasing number of tenements and apartment houses built, because the typical tenement and apartment house has increased considerably in size as well as in number. It is evident that had existing transit conditions continued, the building of private houses would have been restricted to the demand, derived from very rich people, and that the enormous majority of New Yorkers would have been housed in tenements of a constantly increasing capacity, or else would have had to sacrifice more and more time and energy in traveling from their homes.

The Suhway is the first rapid transit railroad built in New York, which is really adequate to the exigencies of the traffic problem created by the shape of Manhattan Island. It will enable people who work south of Chambers st. to ride to the middle reaches of the Bronx in a comparatively short time. It will begin the process of restoring cheap residential land to the Manhattanites. But, of course, it will oon be suffocated by the

traffic it creates, unless it is promptly supplemented by other tunnels; and the most important condition to be observed in relation to these supplementary subways is the condition that no concessions must be made in the quality of the service provided. Every subsequent rapid transit road must do as well, if not better, than the one soon to be opened in the amount of space given to the express service, and in the speed of the trains; and no route should be considered which does not supply space for two express, as well as two local tracks. Indeed eventually it is probable that-a deep four-track tunnel to be used excluviely by express trains, will be necessary to give the millions of people who will live in the Bronx the service to Manhattan which they need, and in the meantime the necessity of more and quicker express trains must never be forgotten in planning extensions, connections or parallel routes with the new Subway.

THE labor troubles in the New York building trades are nearing their end, and apparently will be settled within the week by what is practically the complete surrender of the unions. This was bound to be the result, and one cannot but wonder at the perversity of the leaders of these unions in provoking a contest, the chances of which were all against. They had little to gain from breaking the agreement, and very much to lose, but nevertheless they preferred to go out and bring down on themselves a lockout, which will keep them poor throughout the winter and perhaps longer. Now at the end of a long tie-up ninety per cent, of the mechanics are very anxious to get back to work and will make any ordinary concession to that end. What these ninety per cent, should do is to make sure that they will not be forced to suffer a similar loss again. When laborers are ill-paid, or are obliged to work excessively long hours, they are wise in making as troublesome as possible for their employers until the grievances are redressed; but the mechanics employed in the New York building trades are better paid than any in the country and work under exceptionally easy conditions. All they need is steady employment to make them prosperous and thrifty, and this is the one thing which they throw away-and for no apparent reason. It is time for the mechanics who want to work to assume and to keep control.

Defiance of Law in Attorney Street

The loss of life by the fire in the 5-story tenement house at 164 Attorney st, on last Sunday morning, is directly ascribable, it would seem, to defiance of the law and the legally constituted authorities. The two lower stories of the building had been almost entirely torn out to make an arcade which was to run through the lower part of the building to Ridge st on the east. The fire-escapes from the third story down had been removed, and the means of exit for tenants in this emergency were inadequate, so that the victims, who were mostly children, were trapped in the top stories. The lower walls having been removed, the rest of the building was supported on needles and spur braces. The stairways had been taken down also, and the only means of ingress and egress was a common ladder in the backyard, to the first story. It was found, furthermore, that even before the makers of the alterations in the building had torn away the fire-escapes the original builders had attached fireescapes that were little better than death-traps.

Leon Sobel, the owner of the Attorney street house; Morris Lavine, the lessee, and Henry Breiterman, the foreman in charge of the alterations, were arraigned before Magistrate Whitman in the Essex Market Court and held to await the result of the Coroner's inquest.

Coroner Scholer says: "The District Attorney will aid me in my investigation. I have visited the building and found that the fire escapes were not bolted to the walls. It stood to reason that they would stand no unusual strain. I have also had a talk with a fire-secape manufacturer, who tells me that this same condition exists in many parts of the city, and that the accident might happen again at any time."

A report on file at the Building Department shows that no permit was ever obtained to make the alterations, and though a violation was filed against the building, the builder proceeded in defiance of the authorities.

The unexpected always happens. The builder and owner did not mean to make their house into a death-trap, but they took a chance they had no right to take, to say nothing of their disre-

A well known manufacturer of fire-escapes, when interrogated for the Record and Guide, said he did not believe that the regulations were being violated in any appreciable degree, so far as boiting through the wall is concerned. The building inspectors were strict, and especially during the last ten or fifteen years he did not believe there had been any omissions in this respect among manufacturers of any account. He had heard of owners who had protested against the boils being put through the walls,

but never of a contractor or manufacturer who had neglected to do as the law required,

THE LAW AS TO RAILINGS AND BRACKETS.

The Tenement House Act reads as follows: (See "New York
Laws Relative to Apartment and Tenement Houses," edited by

Laws Relative to Apartment and Tenement Houses," edited by William J. Fryer, 1903, Published by the Record and Guide, page 9.)

"Railings.—The outside top rail shall extend around the entire length of the platform, and wall cases shall go through the wall at each end, and be properly secured by nuts, and four-inch square washers at least three-eighths of an inch thick, and no top rail shall be connected at angles by cast from. The top rail of balconies shall be one and three-quarter inches by one-half inch of wrought fron, or one and a half-inch angle fron one quarter inch thick.

"The bottom rails shall be one and one-half inches by three-eighths of an inch wrought iron, or one and a half inch angle iron, one-quarter inch thick, well leaded or cemented into the wall. The ends of all rails which go through the walls shall be worked out to not less than three-quarter inch bolts size for top rails, or one-half inch bolt size for bottom rails, and if constructed as separated pieces shall be properly secured to the rails with not less than two one-half inch rivets. The standards or filling-in bars shall not be less than one-half inch round or square wrought iron, well riveted to the top and bottom rails and platform frame. Such standards or filling-in bars shall be securely braced by outside brackets at suitable intervals, and shall be placed not more than six inches from centers; the height of railings shall in ocase be less than two feet nine inches.

"Brackets:—The brackets shall not be less than one-half inch by one and three-quarter inches wrought iron, placed edgewise, or one and three-quarter inch angle iron, one-quarter inch thick, well braced; they shall not be more than four feet apart, and shall be braced by means of not less than three-quarters of an inch square wrought iron, and shall extend two-thirds of the width of the respective balconies or brackets. The brackets shall go through the wall and be turned down three inches, or be properly secured by nuts and four-inch square washers at least three-eighths of an inch thick.

"On new buildings the brackets shall be set as the walls are being built. When brackets are put on tenement houses already erected, the part going through the wall shall not be less than one inch in diameter with screw nuts, and washers not less than five inches square and one-half an inch thick. If the end going through the wall is separately constructed, it shall be properly connected to the bracket with not less than two five-eighths inch rivets staggered."

The Labor Day Parade.

For the Building Trades, the public parade of organized bodies of workingmen last Monday had comparatively little interest. Compared with the encormous possibilities, the show of numbers was scarcely representative; and so far as the building trades were concerned, the representation was confined to only a few unions. The Housesmiths, the Architectural Iron Workers, Lathers, Waterproof Workers, Stone Masons, Cement Masons, and the Brotherhood of Painters, were there, but the Bricklayers, Carpenters, Plumbers, Amalgamated Painters, Steam and Gas Fitters, Sheet Metal Workers, Electricians, Plasterers, Stone Cutters, Marble Workers, and other prominent trades were not marching that day.

The exercises of the day were under the auspices of the Central Federated Union, and the procession was for all kinds of good workmen as well as mechanics. The pattern makers turned out several hundred strong, and the striking butchers made a good showing. A powerful body of teamsters and another of smaller dimensions, of dock builders in uniform, presented a fine front. Foundrymen's organizations from cities in New Jersey crossed the Hudson to march with the Metropolitan organization of their craft. Another feature was the participation of German labor societies, said to be strongly Socialist, and which for years had not identified themselves with any public demonstration of the labor organizations in the Central Federated Union.

Some unions named in the official program, caused disappointment by their non-appearance, and the total strength of the procession was, by actual count, about seven thousand.

With bands playing and banners waving, the head of the procession started from 50th st and Fifth av at 11 o'clock. The participating organizations formed on the streets crossing Fifth avone the tween 40th and 50th sits, and the route of the march was down Fifth av to Washington aq. Some of the organizations had floatis in the procession illustrating their methods of work. The absence of the principal building trades was generally remarked, and while a number of reasons might be given for it, all can be embraced in one,—general apathy. Dissatisfaction with the course of things this season and humiliation over the downfall of Weinseimer had something to do with it. Another year, after, a season of peaceable, uninterrupted work, we may yet see a truly representative procession of the Building Trades of New York marching down Fifth av under the banner of Arbitration, masters and journeymen side by side.

New Bronze Doors at Jno. Williams's.

Through the couriesy of the Trustees of the Boston Public Library and Daniel Chester French, the firm of Jon. Williams was permitted this week to exhibit Mr. French's sculptured bronze doors for the Boston Public Library, at its foundry, 556 West 27fh st, New York City, where the process of casting has just been completed. There are three sets of double doors, which diffec from the usual bronze doors of many panels in that they are simply large reliefs of separate figures. The subjects are Music and Poetry, Knowledge and Wisdom, Truth and Inspiration. These allegoric figures enveloped in graceful drapery are treated in a low relief, and as Mr. Lorado Taft has said in his new history of American Sculpture, they will rank among our choicest examples of that elusive form of sculpture, for it is recognized that low relief work is one of the final tests of a sculptor's skill.

Yellow and glistening like gold, they are indescribably elegant, even when seen on temporary hinges and in the dim of light of the foundry. On each door is inscribed beneath the figure an appropriate legend in characteristic letters; and above each figure, on a classic tablet with garlands, is, its name.

That is all. Nothing else is on the door; neither border nor panel. It is as if the figures in their almost ethereal draperies had been painted with some magical brush on these great sheets of yellow metal. True, the subjects are such as any artist might choose, but who else could have moided the figures so delicately and beautifully, and bestowed the sweetness and refinement that will impress every beholder?

But that other art, the one which took the fragile models from the sculptor's hands and wrought from them these forms of solid metal, should not be forgotten. The mechanical work that was necessary here must have been extremely delicate and patient; skillful, of course. American art is fortunate in being able to have its designs and models so accurately interpreted. Each door is eleven feet by six on the surface, four inches in thickness, and about fifteen hundred pounds in weight.

Obituary.

Mr. George W. Koch, who was long prominently known in the building trades of New York, died on Saturday, Sept. 3d, at his country home at Dillsburg, Pa., in his 78th year. He was born in York County, Pa., March 8th, 1827. His ancestors came to this country from Germany in the year of 1753. At the age of 18, after his father's death, he left home to learn the joiner In 1850 he went to Philadelphia, continuing in the same trade, and in 1852 he entered the city of New York with a capital of \$42. Having acquired the art of designing, as well as of being a master mechanic, he soon extended his business to fine cabinet work, and in 1874 laid the foundation of the present business of George W. Koch & Son, by laying the parquet floor in the Lenox Library on Fifth avenue. In a short time, by devoting his energy to this particular line, he gave it the impetus which to-day makes it one of the leading features of woodwork in fine residences, and placed himself at the head of the business.

Twelve years ago he retired from active business, and returned to his native town, leaving his son in active charge of his business, which has a factory in West 53d st and an office at 450 Fifth avenue.

Mr. Koch improved and beautified his home at Dilisburg, Pa, which is considered one of the finest homes in that section, and is noted for its hospitality. He was a consistent Christian, and thoroughly domestic in his tastes, and his greatest pleasure was in having his many friends enjoy his beautiful home with him. H: leaves, besires a widow, one son, Frank, who succeeds him in his well established business.

Rents on Eighth Avenue.

The following letter has been addressed to the Real Estate Department of the New York Herald:

Gentlemen:—In your issue of Sept. 4, 1904, relative to 8th av rentals, we find one item which especially concerns interests of clients of this office, you specify by street and number 223 8th av. What you say with reference to this property is absolutely false in every particular. We represent the entire block, of which this number is one. At no time within the last 20 years has said store been rented for \$1,200, or even as low as \$1,400.

If you will take the trouble to examine the record, you will find that the leases of record heretofore have been \$2,000 per year on this particular piece of property. Similar premises in the same row are under five years' lease at \$2,200 and Croton water charges. Such is the record in the register's office of this county. It is true that the last tenant refused, after having verbally accepted a new lease at \$2,200 on the day or two before the same expired, to renew at any figure. This was for reasons entirely extaneous to the matter of increase of rent. Family reasons, of which we are not at liberty to publicly speak, were controlling with the said tenant.

We refused a number of applicants who were willing to pay the amount of rent asked, for the reason that the business which they proposed to carry on conflicted or falled to harmonize with the line of business conducted by our other tenants on the block,

Your representative must have some good and sufficient reason for depreciating values in that portion of 8th av referred to in your We had a client of this office some few months ago who was offering a premium to secure a vacant store of full width anywhere on 8th av, from 14th to 59th st, and in a legal proceeding, in which we represented him, several witnesses so testified in confirmation of the fact that no vacancies then existed, and that no lessees were willing to assign their leases even at a premium.

City, who prepared plans for a three hundred thousand dollar hospital in that city, has found it necessary to sue for his commission, of twenty-five thousand dollars, and the trouble that he has encountered ought to be a hint to all architects whenever engaged by a municipal board to have the terms of the contract explicitly stated under seal. Mr. Long was engaged by the City Hospital Board of Jersey City to

prepare the plans for a three hundred thousand dollar hospital, and did so, and, later, when it was found that an appropriation of two hundred thousand dollars only could be secured, he was required to make a new design, and did so. Unfortunately for him, a quarrel arose between the Hospital Board and the Mayor, in spite of which the Board awarded the contracts and attempted to go on with the work; but the Board of Finance sided with the Mayor and would not ratify the contracts or allow drafts to be

made on the appropriation. The Mayor procured from the last Legislature an act creating a new Board of Health and maintains that the new Board must provide the new hospital. The old Board asserts that in some way it was not legislated out of office, and is still competent to act; so the situation, so far as Mr. Long and his services are concerned, is a deadlock, and he has brought suit against the city for his commission on both schemes.

The WORLD OF BUILDING



The Labor Situation.

A meeting that is expected to have a very important bearing on the present regretable condition of affairs in the building trades was in session last evening. From the action which it was thought would be taken at this meeting,-the decision not having been announced at the hour of going to press,-it is confidently expected that the strikes and lockouts will be brought to an end within a week or ten days.

In contradiction of a report generally circulated, the Record and Guide is positively informed that the Bricklayers did NOT decide not to work in company with non-union men. the eleven unions in Manhattan voted not to work with men of that class, but the others voted to adhere to the Arbitration plan, and the majority rules.' This determination on the part of the Bricklayers was a great disappointment to the Stone Cutters and others who have been carrying on the fight against the employers' arbitration plan; for, as one of the Alliance leaders had said: "If the Bricklayers will help us, we will win."

Among the bricklayers, as in every other union, there is a party always eager to wage war against the principle of arbitration, but the majority, taking the advice of representatives tried and true, said, "No, we have made an agreement with the employers for eighteen months on the Arbitration basis, and we mean to stick to it. But we think something ought to be done to bring about a settlement of disputes in certain other trades, or else our trade

may have its work interfered with."

The meeting of Bricklayers last night consisted of the members of the Greater New York Executive Board, representing twentyone unions, two of these being stone masons' unions, which are now affiliated in the same national body as the Bricklayers. The question of first importance before the board was a resolution introduced at a previous meeting, demanding that the Board of Governors of the Building Trades Employers' Association convene a meeting of the General Arbitration Board to settle the present troubles. If this demand is granted it means peace within a few days, so far as the resumption of work is concerned.

The General Arbitration Board is made up of the representatives of every trade, including journeymen as well as employers, and is supposed to be all-powerful. One of its first acts would be to order all strikes and lockouts off, pending arbitration; then to proceed to a consideration of the matters in controversy, which are expected to include some revision of the fundamental law, whose processes seem in practice too slow to be satisfactory to all interests, and too easily disregarded for the good of real estate interests at large.

As the Employers' Association had already decided to call a conference to revise the Arbitration Plan, the request of the Bricklayers may not be disagreeable to grant. The only matter likely to interfere is that negotiations for peace are already in progress in all the trades, save one, which have been at war. These negotiations are being conducted on the part of the individual unions and the employers in each trade, and have been going on all this week, and are very likely to terminate successfully. On Friday a meeting between the plumbers and their employers was said to be in session. This trade has been one of the most persistent in fighting the employers, and the Governors have said they would never recognize the old union again. The latter has built a Chinese wall around itself by refusing to affiliate with any national body or recognize the cards of outside plumbers' unions, and now, unless its members car make terms, they may be slaughtered with their own weapon.

Conferences are also being held between the striking stone cutters and their employers, though this trade is not a party to the General Arbitration Plan. Also, between the marble cutters and their employers, who are expected to reach an agreement so that work may be resumed next week. "I believe another week will show a considerable clearing up of the situation," said President Nason of the Alliance Board. It is understood that the Building Trades Alliance will not force itself as a body into any negotiations for peace that may be brought about.

The number of men actually thrown out of work by the lockout, and still unemployed, is hard to determine. A great many of the locked-out have found something to do, and somehow the owners in a number of cases have taken things in hand. A large number of mechanics have signed the arbitration plan individually, and have been put to work, including about seven hundred carpenters, a new union of electrical workers and a union of In spite of serious reports, the idea is general that the condition of affairs might be much worse. In Brooklyn and the Bronx work is brisk.

Those offices at present situated in Jamaica, will move into the new building. The plot of land is such that the building, in order to be large enough, will have to stand broadside to Thomson av, and will be in close proximity to the Long Island and Pennsylvania tunnel tracks. It is estimated that a suitable building will cost fully \$400,000. Nothing can be learned of the details of the plans, the character of the building and materials to be used until after the Art Commission has made a report.

Another 34th Street Change.

34TH ST.—Charles E. Birge, architect, of No. 5 West 34th st, has completed plans for a 12-sty mercantile building to be erected at No. 29 West 34th st for Mrs. Elizabeth A. Still further east the excavation is being dug for the new 11-sty Revillon building, and it will be recalled that Adolph Frankfield & Co., jewelers, have their new building under way opposite at No. 38. The Goldsmith building, the Thirty-fourth Street National Bank building, the Century building, and the Knickerbocker Trust Co.'s new structure complete the list of recent improvements for this block.

Tested-Test No. 1.

Last Week we spoke here of Tests in General.

Let us Now refer to just One Particular Test of "Hecla Fireproofing."

It was made at the Testing Laboratory of the Department of Mechanical Engineering, Columbia University, City of New York. Clearly there could be no better place, nor one more likely to guarantee, even to the sceptical, the Completest Scientific Confidence.

It was conducted by Professor Ira H. Woolson, E. M., and the following statement of facts is taken from his carefully detailed report:

Object of the Test .- To ascertain the effect of the continual application of fire to one side of "Hecla Fireproofing" for one hour, maintaining a temperature of 1700° F. or over for the last 30 minutes of the period, then removing the specimen and immediately plunging it under a 3/4-inch stream of cold water at practically 60 lbs. of pressure. At same time to note the transfer of heat through the specimen of conductivity.

Character of Samples Tested.-The test sample was a white block I foot square and 31/4 inches thick. The top or wearing surface of the block was composed of a layer 3/4 = inch thick of white "Hecla Fireproofing"; this was laid upon a 21/2 inch "Hecla Fireproofing" backing, and formed with it a solid block. The backing was composed of ordinary "excelsior" wood or fiber used for packing, combined with "Hecla Fireproofing" mixture, the whole pressed into a block and dried.

Method of Tests.-The sample was first laid with the smooth surface of the "Hecla Fireproofing" down over a 6-inch furnace with strong air blast, and directly beneath the sample was placed the couple of a Le Chatlier pyrometer by which the heat applied was accurately and continuously measured. The test was started at about 600° F. and gradually raised for 15 minutes, when it was about 1700° F. The temperature was maintained at 1700° F. to 1800° F. for 35 minutes, then rapidly raised during the remaining 15 minutes of the hour with a final record of 2485° F. No attempt was made to maintain a constant heat through the middle portion of the test. It sufficed if the average was between 1700 and 1800

To measure the conductivity of the material, a thermometer was placed upon the top side of the sample, directly above the furnace fire with the bare mercury bulb resting upon the sample, and suitably protected from the surrounding heat. A maximum of 60° was recorded.

At the end of the heat test the sample was removed from the fire, and the red hot portion plunged under a strong 3/4-inch stream of cold water.

Condition of Specimen after Test .- About 1/4 -inch of the "Hecla Fireproofing" covering was washed away by the force of the water on the calcined material. The remaining portion of the "Hecla Fireproofing" partially charred and softened, and about 1/8-inch of the backing was in the same condition, so the total depth to which the block was effected by the test was 7/8 of an inch. Beyond this burned layer, the material seemed to be uninjured. No cracks were produced.

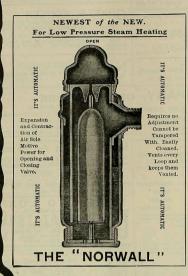
